

Optional Accessories

External Functional Modules

This TV may have come equipped with optional removable functional modules, such as DVD and IPTV. The television is designed to allow simultaneous use of two different modules; the functional modules can be installed in three different positions.


Remote Control PD108-427

A remote control is required to perform all TV setup adjustments including programming channels and a password is needed to enter the setup mode. The remote is **NOT** included with the TV and must be ordered separately – one remote is capable of programming an entire hospital of televisions. Please order remote control part number PD108-427.



Battery Installation

1. Softly push the back cover to open the battery compartment.



 Insert two batteries (1.5V, size AAA), ensuring the polarity matches the marks inside the compartment.



3. Replace the battery compartment cover.



Note:

- Install two high-quality 1.5V "AAA" alkaline batteries. Don't mix old batteries with new batteries.
- Remove batteries when you won't use the remote controller for long time. Liquid leakage from old batteries may cause operation failure.

Using remote controller

Point the remote control unit from no more than about 7 meters (22 feet) from the television and within about 60 degrees of the front of the unit.




□ The operating distance may vary depending on room illumination.

Notes for using remote controller

- □ Make sure there are no objects between the remote controller and its sensor.
- Don't place the remote control near a heater or in damp place. Strong impact to the remote control may cause operation failure.
- □ Signal from the remote control may be disturbed by sun light or other bright light. In this case, darken the room or move the TV.

Left Side Panel



1. 📥 EJECT button

Eject the disc in DVD mode. Adjusts the volume. Adjusts menu settings.

2. STOP button

Stop the disc playback in DVD mode.

3. ►II PLAY/PAUSE button

Start to play the disc in DVD mode.

4. DISC Slot

Insert the disc.

- 5. SD/MS/MMC card slot Insert the SD/MS/MMC card.
- 6. USB Port Insert the USB device.
- TV/AV button Selects the video mode.
- 8. CC button Set the caption function.

9. CH ▲/▼ buttons

Selects a program or a menu item.


10. VOL ▲/▼ buttons

Adjusts the volume. Adjusts menu settings.

11. POWER button

Switches TV set on or off.


Accepts the IR signal of remote controller.

Rear Panel

Open the back cover on the left side of the unit's rear panel and all the jacks will appear, as shown on the figure below:



1. HDMI Jack

Connection for HDMI device.

2. COAXIAL OUT

Provides a digital audio output signal for connection to an external digital audio device.

3. COMPONENT IN

Connect the COMPONENT audio/video output sockets of the DVD to the COMPONENT audio/video input sockets of the set.

4. COMPOSITE/S-VIDEO IN

Connect the Video outputs of external equipment to this input. Connect the output of an S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO input.

Connect the audio cable from the external equipment or S-VIDEO VCR to the L & R IN of the set.

5. VGA IN


Connection to the video output jack on your PC.

6. ANT TV/FM Jack

Connection to TV or FM antenna.

Rear Panel

Open the back cover on the left side of the unit's rear panel and all the jacks will appear, as shown on the figure below:



7. CCI

Communication port.

8. MTI

Connect to MTI device.

Note: CCI and MTI can not be connected to the external public network, and can be used by the technician only.

9. VGA AUDIO IN

Connect the audio cable from the PC to the

11. PILLOW

Pillow speaker port.

Use the switch to select correct voltage.

- CZ: Zenith Compatible (+14V)
- CP: Philips Compatible (+5V)
- CR: RCA Compatible (-5V)
- Off: Pillow port disable (0V)

12. Power Supply Cord

! CAUTION !

Moving this switch changes the voltage supplied to the pillow speaker.

Make sure it is set correctly *BEFORE* plugging in the pillow speaker jumper cable.


Failure to do so WILL RESULT IN THE PILLOW SPEAKER BEING OVERDRIVEN AND POSSIBLE DAMAGE TO THE PILLOW SPEAKER.

Controls

The remote control (PD108-427) is also performed all setup operations for the television and a password is needed to enter the setup menu. The remote is **NOT** included with the TV and must be ordered separately – one remote is capable of programming an entire hospital of televisions.

Remote Control

Before you use the remote controller, please install the batteries.



1. POWER button

Turns the TV on or off.

 PLAY button Starts to play the disc in DVD mode.

3. II PAUSE button

Pause the playback or start step by step playback in DVD mode.

4. 📢 button

Activate fast backward playback during disk playback in DVD mode.

5. 🕨 button

Activate fast forward playback during disk playback in DVD mode.

- 6. 0~9 Number buttons Selects numbers.
- 7. LAST button

Returns to the previously viewed channel.

8. MUTE button Turns the sound on or off.

9. VOL +/- button

Adjust the sound level or adjusts menu settings.

10. MTS/SAP button Adjust the audio mode for either **SAP**,

Mono, or Stereo.

11. TV/AV button Selects programmed external inputs.

Direction buttons (▲ ▼ ◄►) Selects a menu item or adjusts menu settings.

Controls

13. OK button

Confirms the current selection.

14. SLEEP button

Sets the sleep timer.

15. SETUP button

Displays the main menu. Exit current OSD menu.

16. MENU button

Displays the disc menu in DVD mode.

17. SUBTITLE button

Selects a desired subtitle language if the disc contains multi-subtitle languages during disc playback in DVD mode.

18. CODE button

The remote offers independent Bed A or Bed B selectable codes and independent control of a single television in a two television room.

Press this button for about 3 seconds to select Bed A or Bed B.

19. AUDIO button

Selects a desired audio language if the disc contains multi-audio languages during disc playback in DVD mode.

20. EJECT button

Ejects the disc in DVD mode.

21. STOP button

Stops the disc playback.

22. 🙀 button

Press to go to the next chapter/track during disc playback.

23. 🙀 button

During disc playback, press once to go to the beginning of current chapter/track; press twice repeatedly to go to the previous chapter/track.

24. +10 button

In TV mode, press to select DTV (Digital TV) channels.

For example, to select channel '54-3', press '54', then press this button and '3'. In DVD mode, press to select numbers greater than 9.

25. PSM button

Recalls your preferred picture setting.

26. CH +/- button

Selects next channel or a menu item.

27. CC button

Sets the caption function.

28. ARC button

Changes the aspect ratio. Repeatedly press the ARC button to select your desired picture format.

29. TV/FM button

Selects either TV or FM mode directly.

30. REPEAT button

Press to repeat a chapter or title in DVD mode.

31. TITLE button

Press to enter or exit the title menu of the disc during disc playback in DVD mode.

32. CARD button

In DVD mode, press to shift among disc playback, USB playback and CARD playback mode when an external USB device or card is connected.

33. GOTO button

Press to access or exit the search menu in DVD mode.

LOCATION GUIDELINES

The model PDI-P19LCDC Hospital Grade LCD TV is a specialized LCD television. This TV is intended for entertainment and educational purposes for use in a hospital, a nursing home, a medical-care center, or a similar health-care facility in which installation is limited to a non-hazardous area in accordance with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70. The PDI-P19LCDC is designed for mounting to PDi manufactured mounts. Installation of the TV on any other mount is not recommended.



WARNING: The TV's VESA mounting holes are designed for M4 metric screws only. Use of a non-PDi approved mount or SAE hardware could result in a condition where the TV could unexpectedly fall and cause injury or death.

The PDI-P19LCDC mounts at the foot of a patient's bed with the supplied bracket. Select a location that is near an AC wall outlet and that does not expose the TV to bright room lights or sunlight if possible. The LCD TV also requires connection of both CATV cable signal and across-room wiring for the pillow speaker.

OSHPD (State of California Only)

The combined weight of the PDI-P19LCDC TV and PDI wall mount totals less than 20 pounds. At the time of this writing, the involvement of a written, submitted, reviewed, and approved plan by OSHPD is not required to install the PDI-P19LCDC TV in the state of California.

CABLE SYSTEM GROUNDING


The coax cable system connected to the PDI-P19LCDC TV should be grounded in accordance with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70. The code provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of the cable entry as practical.

Wall Mounting on Bracket

 Refer to Figure 1. Select a location on the wall approximately 9 inches below the ceiling.

NOTE: Do not locate AC, Across-Room Wiring, and CATV Signal outlets below the Wall Bracket's location as it will cause clearance issues and interfere with the TV's cabinet when mounted to the bracket.

Position the Wall Bracket and locate two mounting holes. Secure the bracket to the wall (mounting hardware is not included).



- 2. Refer to Figure 2. Position the Back Mount on the LCD TV cabinet. Attach with four M6 screws provided.
- 3. Mate the Back Mount to the Wall Bracket making sure the pivot pins are retained in the "U" shaped slot. Using the pilfer security driver packed with the hardware, secure with two 10x32 pilfer screws.
- 4. Connect the AC line cord, Pillow Speaker Jumper Cable, and CATV Coax Cable.
- 5. The TV's tilt can be adjusted by loosening both Pilfer Screws, adjusting tilt, and then tighten.

-Wall Mounting on Bracket




A ¼" stereo style pillow speaker (pendant control) jack is located on the TV's connector panel on the backside. This TV is designed to work with either a digital pillow speaker that generates digital style control codes or a single-button analog (switch-style) pillow speaker. A rear panel mounted switch allows use of different brands of pillow speakers and supports the major brands; Zenith, Philips, and RCA pillow speakers. Please refer to the "Pillow Speaker" section elsewhere in this manual for details.



WARNING: DO NOT connect the pillow speaker circuit Common to earth ground. Grounding of the Common will defeat the isolation circuitry of the television and possibly expose the patient to harmful shock currents should a wiring fault occur.



External Functional Module

This TV may have come equipped with an optional removable functional module. The television is designed to allow simultaneous use of two different modules; the functional modules can be installed in three different positions. Please follow the procedures below to remove or install the functional modules.




Before removing or installing the functional module, ensure that the television is unplugged and turned off.

Functional Module removal:

Refer to the illustration below and follow the procedures below to remove the functional module from the TV.

- Step 1: Loose the screw on the functional module.
- Step 2: Carefully slide the functional module along the rails and unplug the connecting cord from the LCD TV.
- Step 3: Slide the functional module along the rails to fully remove the module.





Functional Module installation:

There are three different positions for installing the functional module and two slots for connecting the MGI connecting cord. Select one proper position for installing:

- 1. Plug the connecting cord into the functional module.
- 2. Carefully slide the module into the desired position and lock the module with one screw.

Connections


- Do not connect the power cord until all other connections have been made.
- Ensure that you observe and correctly connect colored cables when connecting audio and video cables.

Antenna "ANT" Connection

An "F" style jack is located on the TV's connector panel



CAUTION: Some hospital cable systems provide power voltage on the coaxial cable. This TV is NOT designed to be powered via a coaxial cable. Do not connect to a powered coaxial cable. Damage will result to the TV.




AC POWER

A right-angled AC power cord 1meter in length is supplied with each TV.

Select a location that is near an AC wall outlet and that does not expose the TV to bright room lights or sunlight if possible. Connect the AC power cord to a powered outlet.


CABLE ROUTING

Route all cables through the opening located at the bottom of the cabinet.



COAXIAL OUT

Provides demodulate audio from the TV's tuner for recording to an external audio amplifier.




1. Connect only the COAXIAL output to the input of an Amplifier. TV sound should now play through the amplifier system.

Connections

A/V IN


Connects composite video, and stereo or mono audio from devices such as VCR's, DVD's, and Game Boxes.



- 1. Connect the audio outputs from the device (L, R) to the COMPOSITE VIDEO IN L & R on the TV. Connections are color code.
- 2. Connect the video output from the device to the COMPOSITE VIDEO IN on the TV. Connection is color-coded.
- 3. Verify that the COMPOSITE VIDEO mode is enabled in the Source Setup menu. Please see "Source Setup" instructions elsewhere in this manual for details.
- 4. Press the TV/AV button repeatedly until COMPOSITE VIDEO appears in the lower right corner of the screen indicating selection of COMPOSITE VIDEO.
- 5. Activate the device.

S-VIDEO Connection

If the external equipment you connect has an S-VIDEO jack, you can use an S-VIDEO cable for improved picture quality (compared to an COMPOSITE VIDEO cable).




- 1. Connect the VCR's S-Video output directly to the TV's S-VIDEO connector.
- 2. Connect the VCR's L & R audio to the TV's L & R connector inputs.
- 3. Verify that the S-VIDEO mode is enabled in the Source Setup menu. Please see "Source Setup" instructions elsewhere in this manual for details.
- 4. Press the TV/AV button repeatedly until S-VIDEO appears in the lower right corner of the screen indicating selection of S-VIDEO.
- 5. Activate the VCR. The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

NOTE:

• COMPOSITE VIDEO and S-VIDEO share the L/R audio jacks and S-VIDEO is the priority.

Component IN


The TV supports one input for devices such as a DVD that offer Component type signals.



- 1. Use a component video cable to connect the DVD player's Y/PB/PR jacks to the TV's component Y/PB/PR jacks.
- 2. Use an audio cable to connect the DVD player's Audio OUT jacks to the TV's Audio In jacks. Be sure to use the appropriate audio input adjacent to the corresponding video input.
- 3. Verify that the appropriate component input is select is enabled in Source Setup menu. Please see Source Setup instructions elsewhere in this manual for details.
- 4. Press the TV/AV button repeatedly until Component appears in the lower right corner of the screen indicating selection of the component input.
- 5. Note: The Y/PB/PR jacks on your external signal source such as DVD player are sometimes labeled Y/Cb/Cr or Y/B-Y/R-Y. If so, connect the cables to like colors.
- 6. Activate the DVD. The DVD playback picture appears on the screen.

Pillow Speaker

The pillow speaker (pendant control) jack is located on the TV's connector panel. Control of the TV using an external wired pillow speaker is possible.



1. Select the appropriate brand of digital pillow speaker suing the recess slide switch next to the PILLOW jack.

CZ for $\textsc{Zenith}^{\ensuremath{\mathbb{C}}}$

CP for Philips[©]

CR for $\mathsf{RCA}^{^{\!\!\!\!\!^{^{\scriptscriptstyle \mathbb G}}}}$

OFF to disable the pillow speaker.

For analog style pillow speakers set the switch to either CZ, CP or CR.

NOTE: The TV is shipped from the factory with the switch in the OFF position.





HDMI INPUT

Two separate inputs are available for High Definition Multimedia Interface (HDMI) style signals.




- 1. Connect the HDMI output from the external device to HDMI on the TV.
- The external device's audio may be connected via the HDMI port, PC audio or Component audio inputs. The audio input must then be set accordingly in the Sound menu using the HDMI Audio Port source setting.
- 3. Verify that the HDMI source is enabled in the Source Setup menu. Please see "Source setup" instructions elsewhere in this manual for details.
- 4. Press the TV/AV button repeatedly until the appropriate input HDMI appears in the upper right corner of the screen indicating selection of the HDMI input.
- 5. Activate the external device.

PC IN

The TV can also be used as a computer monitor.



- 1. Connect the computer's video cable to the VGA IN socket on the set.
- 2. Connect the computer's audio cable to the AUDIO IN jack on the set.
- 3. Verify that PC-ANALOG is enabled in the "Source Setup" menu. Please see "Source Setup" instructions elsewhere in this manual for details.
- 4. Press the TV/AV button repeatedly until PC-ANALOG appears in the lower right corner of the screen indicating selection of PC-ANALOG input.
- 5. Switch on the computer. The computer's screen should appear on the set.

- 1. The TV automatically switches to support the resolutions shown. Selection of a non- supported resolution may result in either a poor or missing picture display.
- 2. If possible, use the VESA 1024 x 768, 60 Hz video mode to obtain the best image quality. If other resolutions are used, some scaled or processed pictures may appear on the screen.

Turning the TV On and Off

- 1. Connect the AC power cord to wall AC Outlet. A front mounted indicator light will illuminate Red indicating the TV has power.
- Press the POWER button on the remote control, or the TV's POWER button, or the pillow speaker's TV power button. The TV's indicator light will illuminate Green indicating the TV is turned ON. The TV's screen display requires approximately 3 seconds to warm up and display a picture.
- 3. Press the POWER button again to turn the TV off. A front mounted indicator light will illuminate Red indicating the TV is off.

Channel Selection

You can select a channel number with the CH+/- or NUMBER buttons. NOTE: Not all pillow speaker models support direct entry of channels.

Volume Adjustment

Press the VOL+/- button to adjust the sound level. NOTE: Some pillow speakers contain only a volume wheel that may also require adjustment.

Last Channel

Press the LAST button on the remote control to view the last program you were watching. NOTE: Some pillow speakers do not support last channel viewing.

Sound Mute Function

Press the MUTE button. The sound is switched off and the mute display 🏼 appears.

To cancel mute mode, press the MUTE button again, or press VOL+ or VOL-.

NOTE: Some pillow speakers do not support the mute feature.

Sleep Timer

The sleep timer turns the TV off after activation of a preset time limit.

Press the SLEEP button on the remote repeatedly to select the number of minutes. The time limit can range from 10 up to 120 minutes in value.

Basic Operation

Bed A/B Selection

The remote offers independent Bed A or Bed B selectable codes and independent control of a single television in a two television room.

Press the CODE button on the remote control to shift between Bed A and Bed B.

On Screen Menu Language Selection

You can adjust the language used in displaying the OSD on screen display.

- 1. Press the OK button on the remote control.
- 2. Press the CH+/- or ▲/▼ direction button to select the OSD language menu.

Changing the Source Input






Service Level

The TV can be configured with 3 different banks of channels called Service Levels. Each Service Level can be programmed with any combination of channels. For example, a hospital usually elects to dedicate one of the service levels for Pediatrics and another for Maternity since additional or banned channels may be found in either location that would not be normally shown to the general patient population. A DISABLED service level is also available that does not display any channels but rather a disabled message on the TV's screen when the TV is turned on.

To change a Service Level.

- 1. Press the OK button to display the SETUP menu.
- Press the CH+/- or ▲/▼ direction button to highlight Service Level menu item.
- Press the VOL+/- or
 → direction buttons to select the desired service level.
- 4. Press the SETUP button to exit.





NOTE: If a service level is selected that is empty, and has not been programmed with channels, a warning message will be displayed on the TV stating "No Channels Available, Please Contact a TV Representative." To eliminate this message switch the TV to a Service Level that has been programmed with channels.

Adjustment of picture Brightness, Contrast, Color, Tint, Color Temperature, Sharpness is available to customize the levels you prefer using the on-screen menus.



- 1. Press the OK button to display the SETUP menu.
- 2. Select the Picture menu item.
- 3. Press the CH+/- or \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown direction button to highlight the desired picture item.

Color Temperature

The color temperature menu appears only when the TV is in TV, Composite Video or S-Video modes. "Standard", "Reddish", "Greenish", "Bluish" color temperatures are available for selection, however the individual colors are not adjustable. The "User" setting allows individual adjustment of each of the TV's primary colors. The color temperature setting is best set using a calibrated signal source capable of generating a test signal containing both pure white and pure black picture components.



PC Analog/HDMI Picture

Adjustment of a computer's displayed picture can made only when the TV is in PC-Analog or HDMI mode.

1. Temperature

Temperature is a measure of the warmth of an image. You can select 6500K or 9300K.

2. Clock


Clock adjustment is used to minimize any vertical bars or stripes visible on the screen's background. Adjustment of the clock setting also changes the horizontal screen size.

3. Phase

The phase adjustment removes any horizontal noise and is helpful in sharpening text characters.

4. ARC(Aspect Ratio Control)

Select the ratio of the screen size (Horizontal: Vertical): 4:3,14:9 or 16:9.



5. H-Position (Horizontal Position) The H-Position moves the picture left or right across the screen.

6. V-Position (Vertical Position)

The V-Position moves the picture up or down across the screen.

7. AUTO

Automatic adjustment of screen position, clock and phase.

1. Temperature

Temperature is a measure of the warmth of an image. Two temperatures are available 6500K and 9300K.

2. ARC(Aspect Ratio Control)

Select the ratio of the screen size (Horizontal: Vertical): 4:3,14:9 or 16:9.

3. H-Position (Horizontal Position)

The H-Position moves the picture left or right across the screen.

4. V-Position (Vertical Position)

The V-Position moves the picture up or down across the screen.

The sound menu allows very precise adjustment of several sound parameters.

Balance

Adjusts the sound balance from the left and right speakers mounted in the TV.

- 1. In sound menu, press the CH+/- or ▲/▼ direction buttons to select Balance.
- 2. Press the VOL+/- or ◀/► direction buttons to adjust the sound balance from the TV.
- 3. Press the SETUP button to return to the preceding menu.

Minimum Volume

Sets the minimum volume level the TV can reach. Setting this to any value other than 0 guarantees that some level of sound will always be heard when the TV is operating.

- 1. In sound menu, press the CH+/- or ▲/▼ direction buttons to select Minimum Volume.
- 2. Press the VOL+/- or ◀/► direction buttons to select your preferred minimum volume with the TV turns on.
