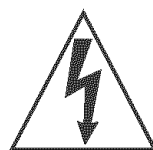
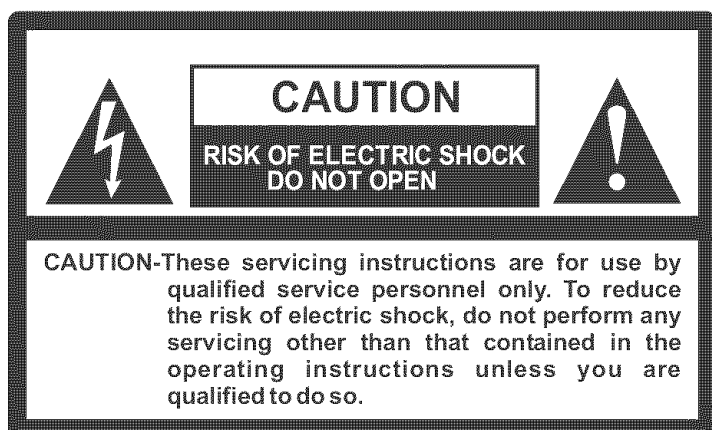

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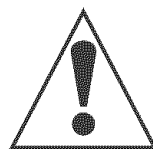

## Important Safety Instructions

### 1. READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

### 2. KEEP THESE INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

### 3. HEED ALL WARNINGS

All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

### 4. FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

### 5. DO NOT USE THIS APPARATUS NEAR WATER

Do not use this product near water (a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, wet basement, or swimming pool for example)

### 6. CLEAN ONLY WITH DRY CLOTH

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a dry cloth for cleaning.

### 7. ATTACHMENTS

Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.

### 8. ACCESSORIES

Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The product may fall, causing serious injury and serious damage to the unit.

### 8A. Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.

### 9. VENTILATION

**13. LIGHTNING**

Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.

**14. POWER LINES**

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

**15. OVERLOADING**

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

**16. OBJECT AND LIQUID ENTRY (C-UL standards)**

Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

**17. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING**

If an outside antenna is connected to the product, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge product, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge product, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for grounding electrodes.

**18. SERVICING**

Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.

**19. REPLACEMENT PARTS**

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or those that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock or other hazards.

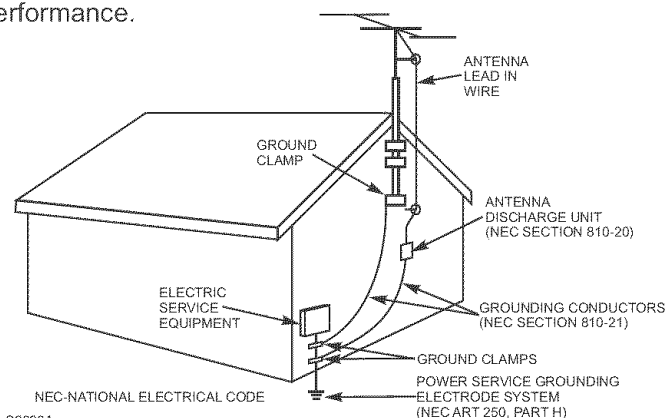

**23. HEAT**

**24. NOTE TO Cable SYSTEM INSTALLER**

This reminder is provided to call the Cable system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

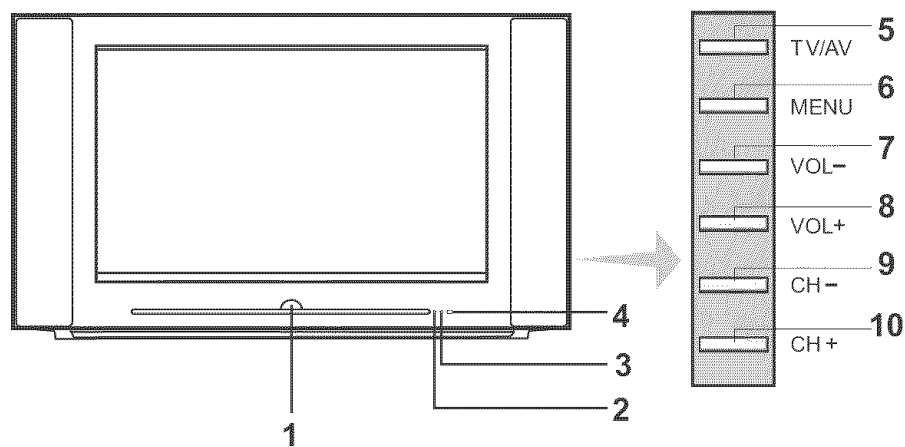

**7. VOL - button: volume down or menu adjust.**

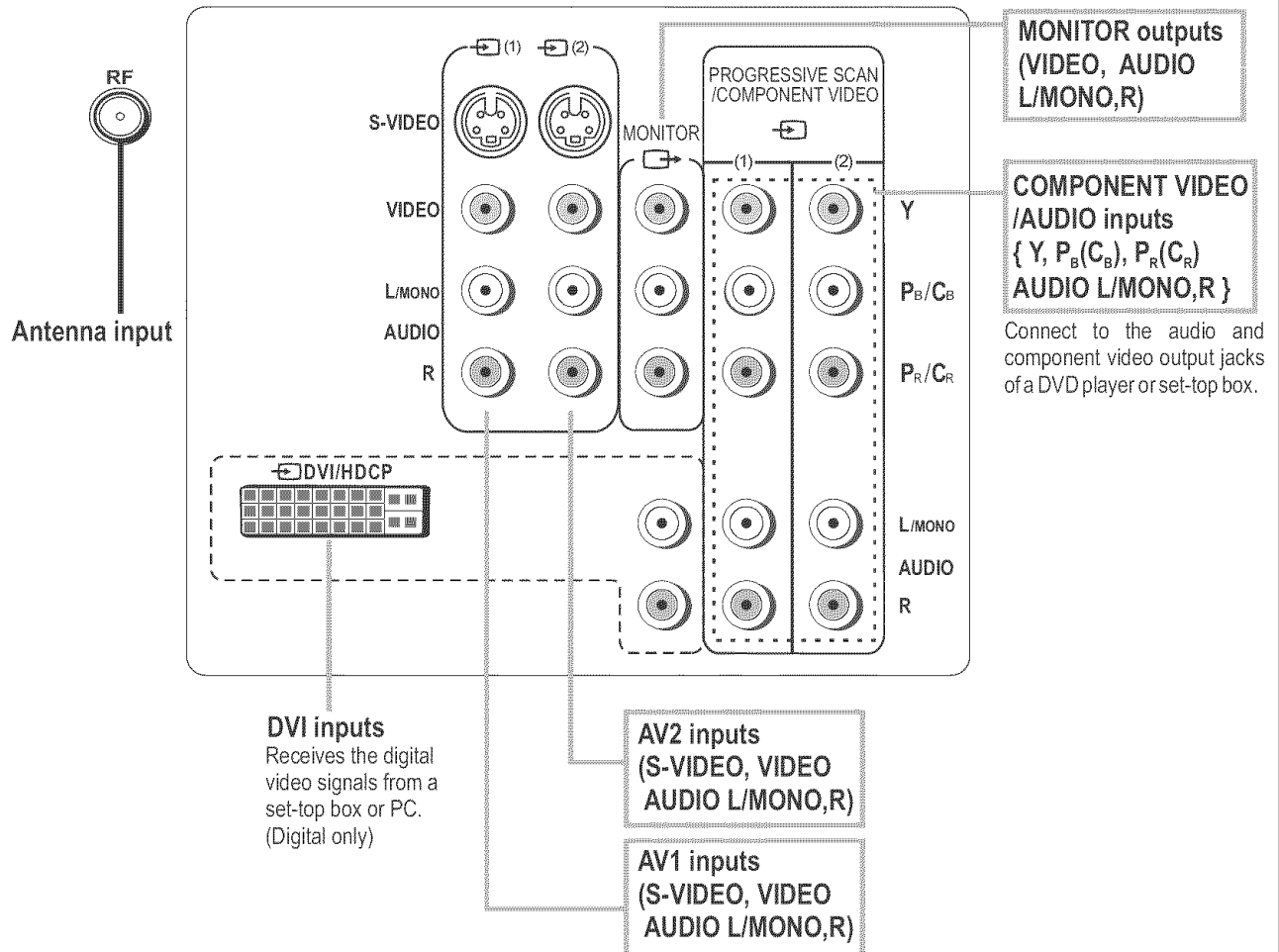
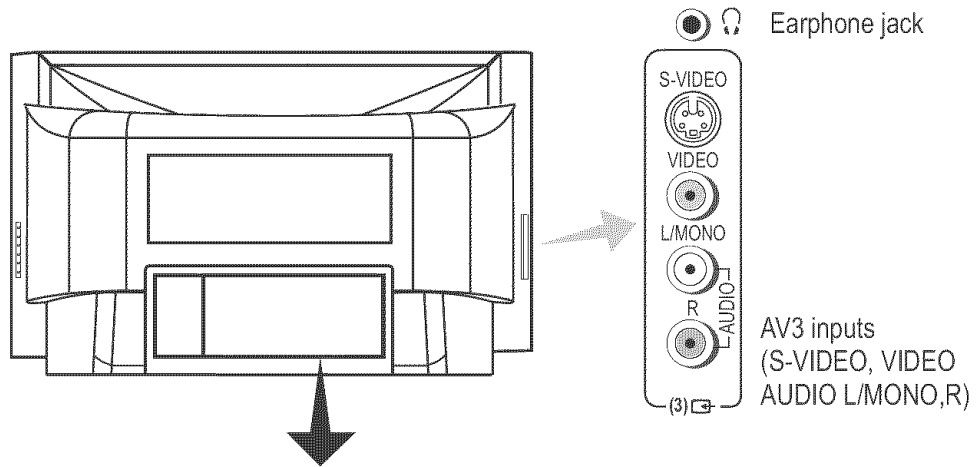

## ⚠ Important notes about the Remote Control Unit:

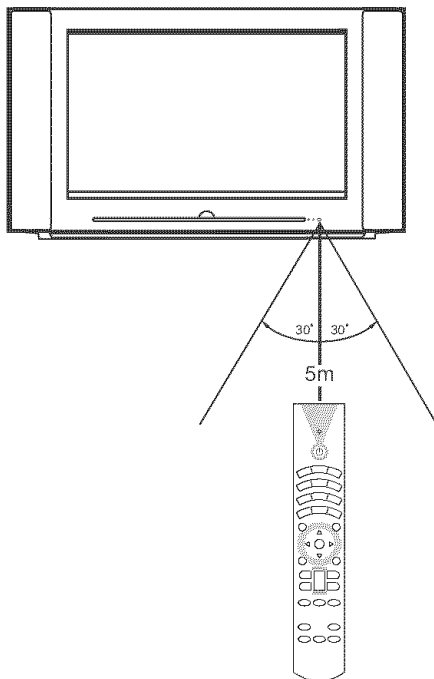
If your remote control does not work correctly, the code setting may be incorrect. Please try the following:

1. Press and hold the **SET** button and the **TV** button at the same time until the indicator lights up.
2. Press 1, 5, 3. The indicator of the remote control will blink twice. If not, please repeat the above steps.

## ⚠ Notes:

- When there is an obstacle between the TV and the transmitter, the transmitter may not operate.
- When direct sunlight, and incandescent lamp, fluorescent lamp or any other strong light shines on the REMOTE SENSOR, the remote control function may be unstable.
- Do not try to recharge batteries they are not intended to be recharged.
- Use only the size and type of batteries specified. Do not mix different types of batteries together or old batteries with fresh ones.
- When the remote control will not be used for a long period of time or when the batteries are worn out, remove the batteries.
- Do not throw the batteries into a fire. Dispose of or recycle used batteries properly.
- Do not drop, dampen or disassemble the remote control.



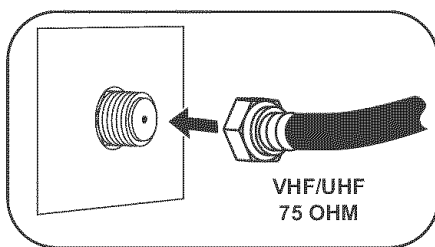
# Installation

## Antenna connections

INSTALL the unit in a room where direct light will not fall upon the screen. Total darkness or a reflection on the picture screen may cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.

### OUTDOOR VHF/UHF ANTENNA CONNECTION (ANTENNA NOT INCLUDED)

Follow the instructions for the type of antenna system you intend to use. If using Cable or satellite, see the next page.

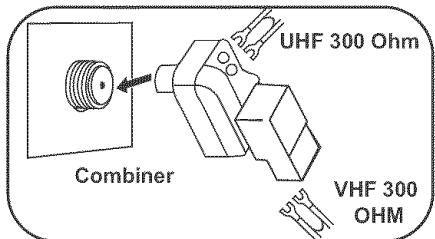


#### Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Single 75 ohm cable or 300 ohm twin-lead wire)

Connect the 75 ohm cable from combination VHF/UHF antenna to the antenna jack.

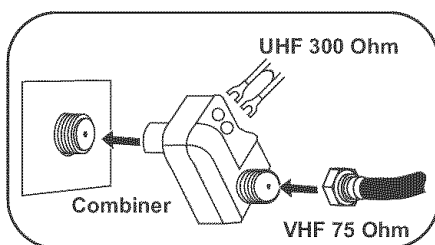
OR

If your combination antenna has a 300 ohm twin-lead wire, use a 300-75 ohm matching transformer (NOT SUPPLIED).



#### Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Separate VHF and UHF 300 ohm twin-leads)

Connect the UHF twin-lead wire to a combiner (NOT SUPPLIED). Connect the VHF twin-lead to a 300-75 ohm matching transformer (NOT SUPPLIED). Attach the transformer to the combiner. Attach the combiner to the antenna jack.



#### Separate VHF/UHF Antennas

Connect the 75 ohm cable from the VHF antenna and the UHF antenna twin-lead wire to a combiner (NOT SUPPLIED). Attach the combiner to the antenna jack.

**NOTE:** If your VHF antenna has a twin-lead wire use a 300-75 ohm matching transformer, then connect the transformer to the combiner.

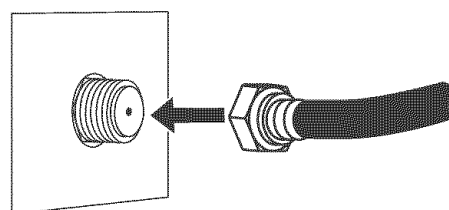
# Installation (continued)

## Cable (CATV)/satellite connections

This TV has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a Cable TV converter box. Some Cable TV companies offer "premium pay channels" in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.

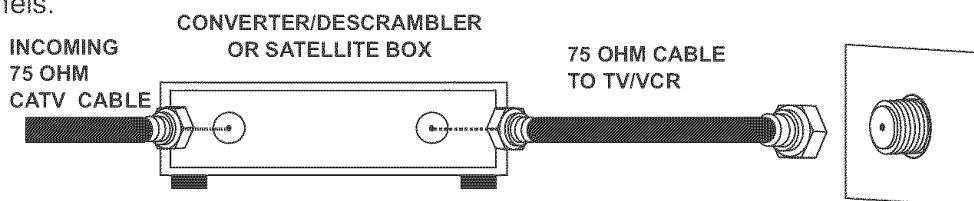
### FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE

For basic cable service not requiring a converter/descrambler box, connect the CATV 75 ohm coaxial cable to the VHF/UHF jack on the rear of the TV.



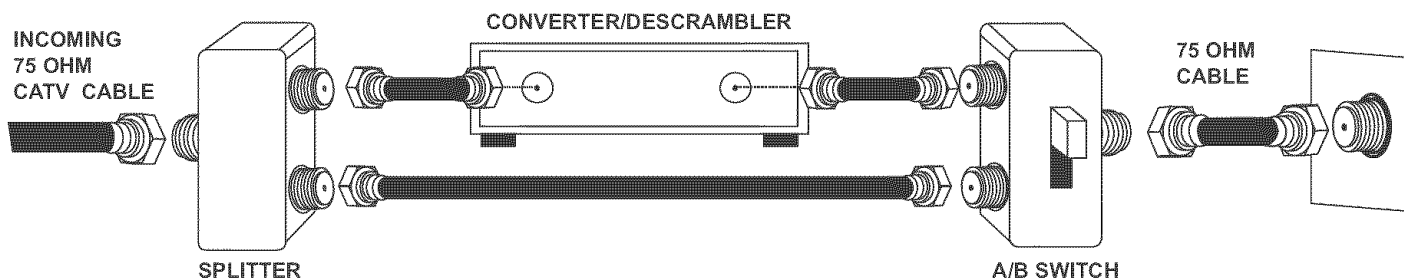
### FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO SCRAMBLED CABLE TV SERVICE OR SATELLITE

If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service which requires the use of a converter/descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm coaxial cable to the converter/descrambler box. Using another 75 ohm cable, connect the output of the converter/descrambler or satellite box to the antenna jack on the TV. Follow the connections shown below. Set the TV/VCR to the output channel of the converter/descrambler or satellite box (usually 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler or satellite box to select channels.



### FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO UNSCRAMBLED BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE WITH SCRAMBLED PREMIUM CHANNELS

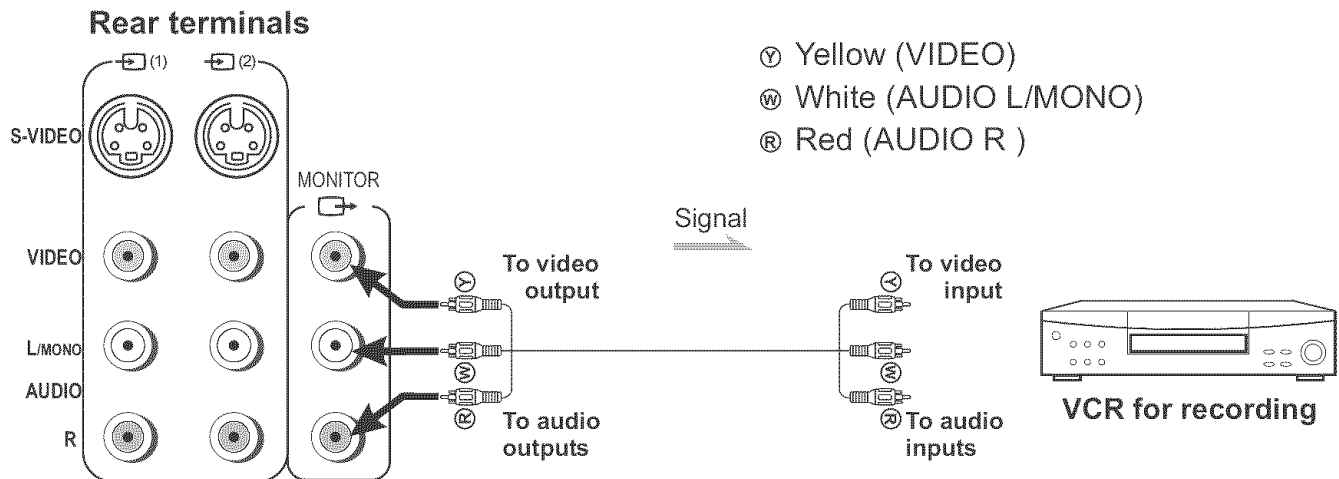
If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service in which basic channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a converter/descrambler box, you may wish to use a signal splitter and an A/B switch box (available from the cable company or an electronic supply store). Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any unscrambled channels on your TV. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your TV to the output of the converter/descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler box to tune scrambled channels.

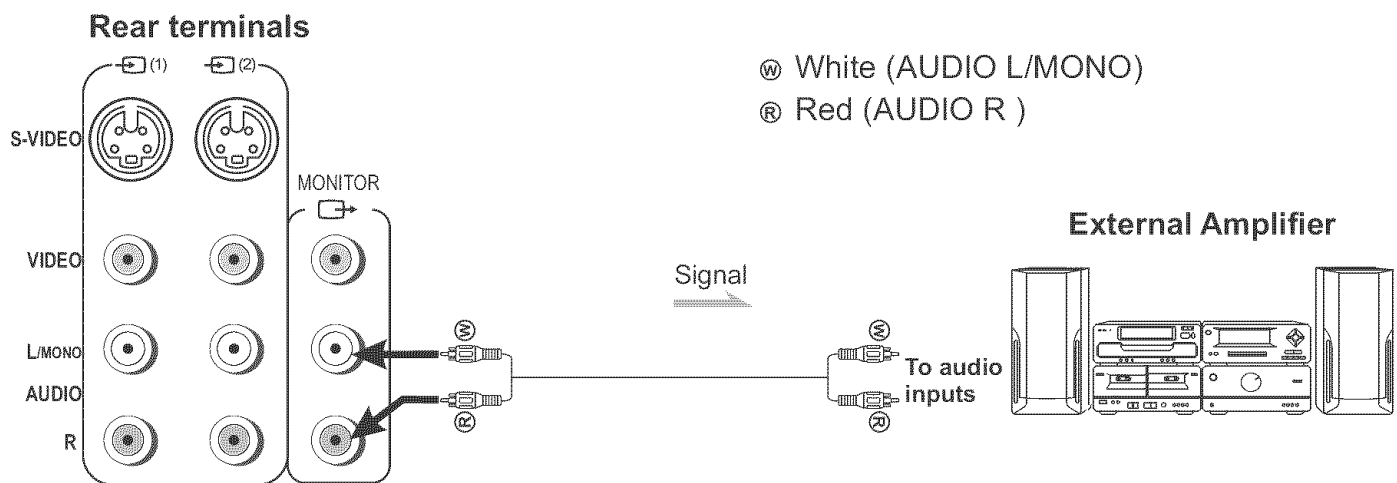

## Using MONITOR outputs



You can connect the **MONITOR** output terminals to the VCR to record the program you like.

**OR** you can connect a stereo system to the **MONITOR** output terminals on the TV set rear to enjoy a high quality sound from the stereo system.



### Recording TV program

- 1 Connect the MONITOR outputs to VCR as the figure above.
- 2 Select the desired TV program that you would like to record.
- 3 Press "RECORD" button of the VCR to record TV program.

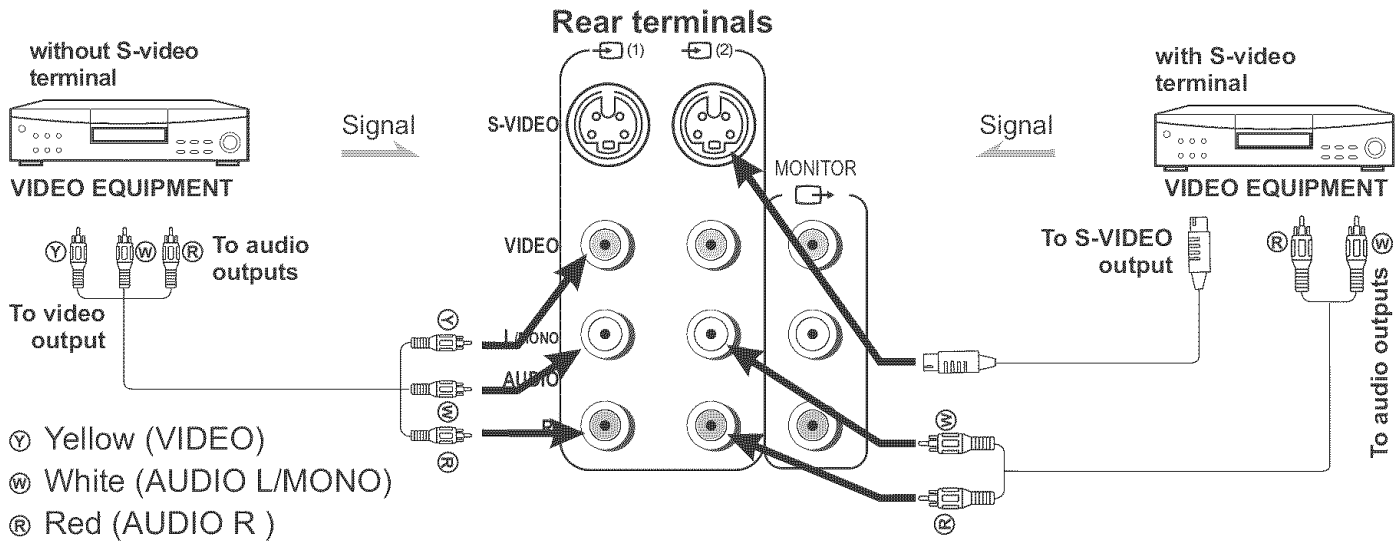
### Connecting Audio Amplifier

- 1 Connect the audio outputs to audio amplifier as the figure above.
- 2 Set amplifier volume to minimum.
- 3 Select the desired TV program that you would like to amplify.
- 4 Adjust amplifier to a proper volume.

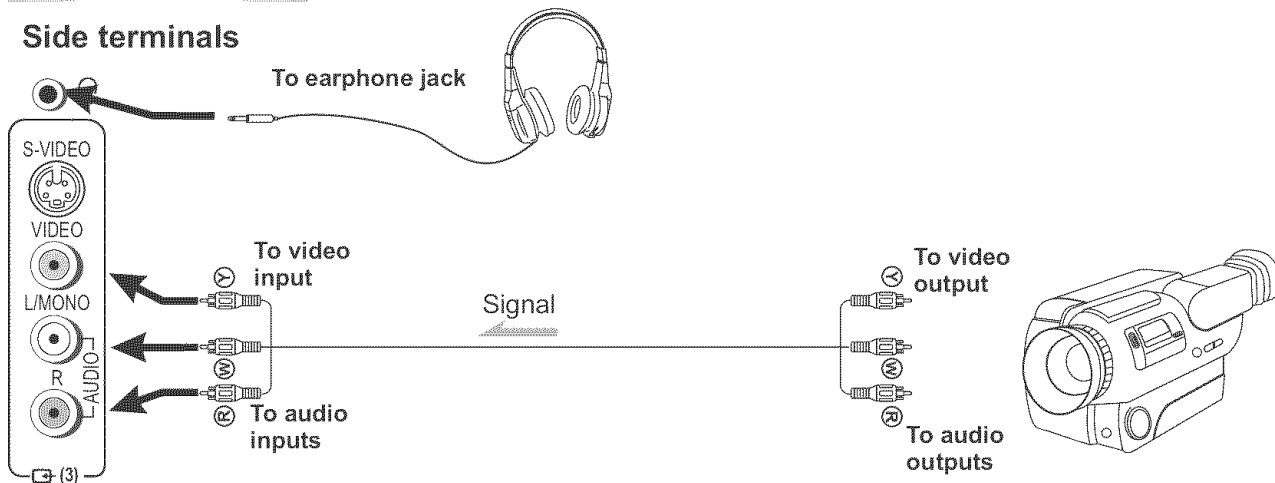

## To view video program from AV1, AV2 or AV3 inputs

- 1 Connect video equipments to AV inputs (**AV1**, **AV2** or **AV3**) as the figures above.
- 2 Press **AV** to display video input menu.
- 3 Select the corresponding video mode (**Video1**, **Video2** or **Video3**) by using **CH+** or **CH-**.
- 4 Press **VOL+** or **VOL-** to confirm.

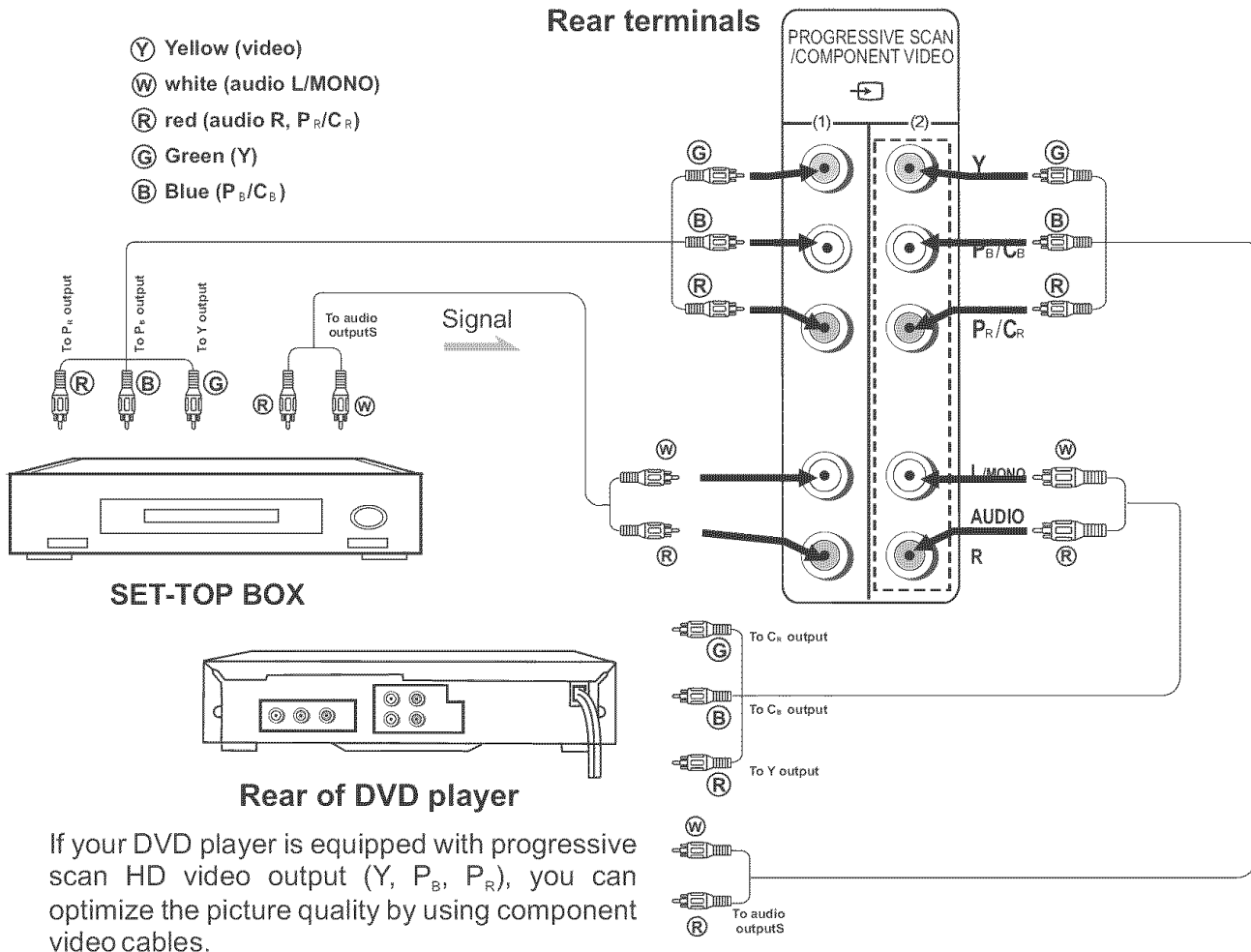
### ! Notes:

In AV1, AV2, AV3 inputs, the S-VIDEO terminal takes precedence over the VIDEO terminal. To view program from the VIDEO terminal, be sure to disconnect the S-VIDEO terminal.

## Using Progressive scan/component video 1 or 2 inputs



If your DVD player is equipped with progressive scan HD video output (Y, P<sub>B</sub>, P<sub>R</sub>), you can optimize the picture quality by using component video cables.

## To view digital TV program

- 1 Connect Set-Top Box(or DVD) to PROGRESSIVE SCAN/COMPONENT VIDEO (1 or 2) inputs as the figure above.
- 2 Press **AV** to display video input menu.
- 3 Select **Component 1** or **component 2** correspondingly by using **CH+** or **CH-** according to the terminals you connect.
- 4 Press **VOL+** or **VOL-** to confirm.

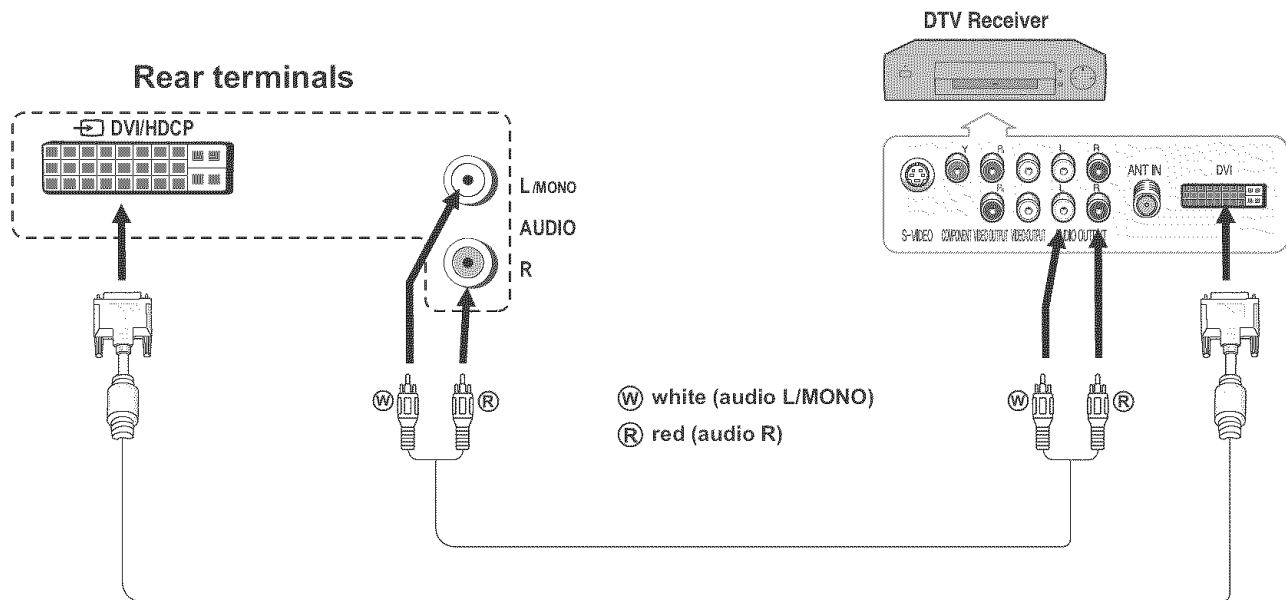
### ⚠ Notes:

The Y, P<sub>B</sub>, P<sub>R</sub> outputs on your DVD player are sometimes labeled Y, C<sub>B</sub>, C<sub>R</sub> or Y, B-Y, R-Y. If so, connect the cables to like colors.

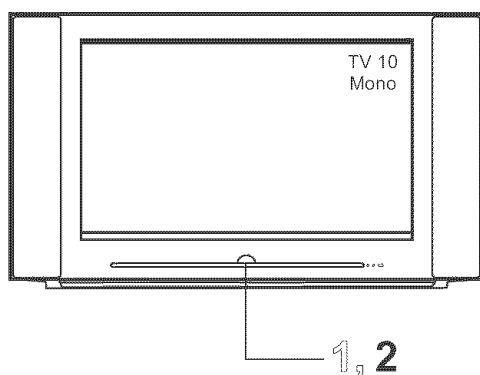
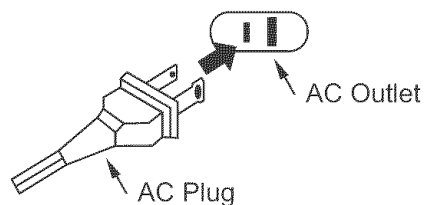

## To view digital TV program

- 1 Connect DTV receiver to DVI and AUDIO inputs as the figure above.
- 2 Press **AV** to display video input menu.
- 3 Select **DVI/HDCP** by using **CH+** or **CH-**.
- 4 Press **VOL+** or **VOL-** to confirm.

# Power on/off



## Power On

- 1 Insert the AC plug (with the 2 blades) into an AC outlet (120V, 60Hz)

If no picture appears and the indicator lights up, then the TV set is in STANDBY mode. Please refer to step 2.

### ! Notes:

The AC plug supplied with the unit is polarized to help minimize the possibility of electric shock. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.

**To prevent electric shock, do not use the polarized plug with an extension cord receptacle or other outlet unless the blades can be fully inserted.**

- 2 In STANDBY mode, press the power button on the TV set or on the remote control to turn the TV on.

### ! Notes:

If there is no input signal, a blue background will appear.

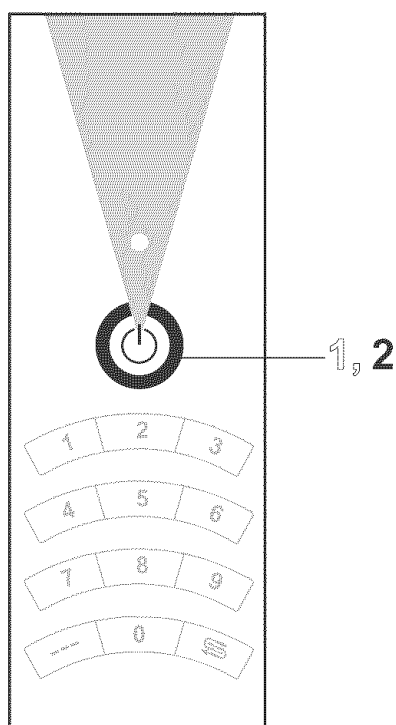
## Power off

- 1 Press the Power button on the remote control or on the TV set to turn the TV off.

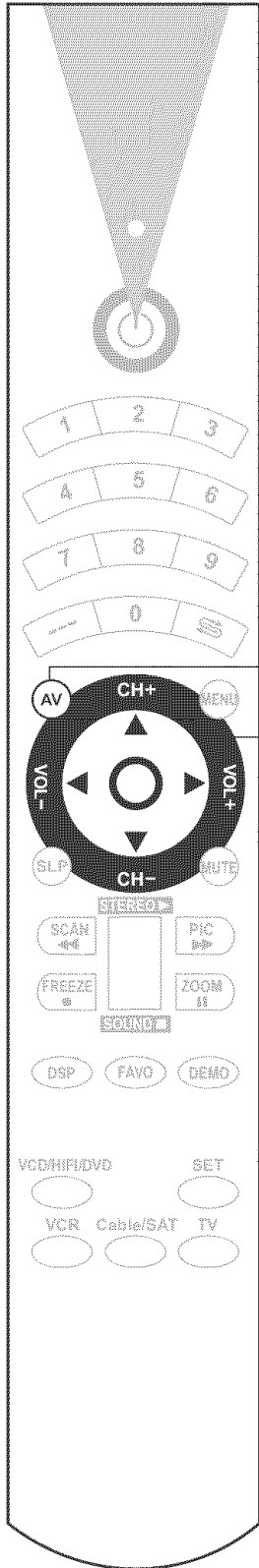
### ! Notes:

The TV set can turn off automatically with the functions of:

- Sleep timer (need to be set in advanced).
- Off timer (need to be set in advanced).

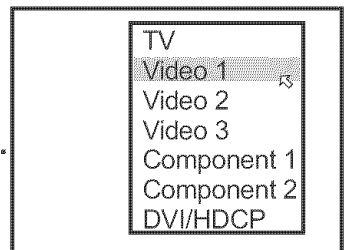
## AV Input Selection

This TV set provides AV input/output terminals and DVD (HDTV) input terminals for convenient connection to VCRs, DVDs, Set-Top Boxes or other video equipments, and to optimize the high quality picture from these video sources.

**1** Press AV to display the video input menu.

**2** Press CH+ or CH- to select a video input channel.

**3** Press VOL+ or VOL- to confirm.



## Switching from AV to TV

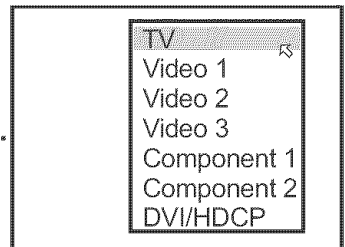
When the TV set is in AV mode, there are two ways to switch back to TV mode.

**1** Press AV button to display the video input menu.

**2** Press CH+ or CH- to select TV item.

**3** Press VOL+ or VOL- to confirm.

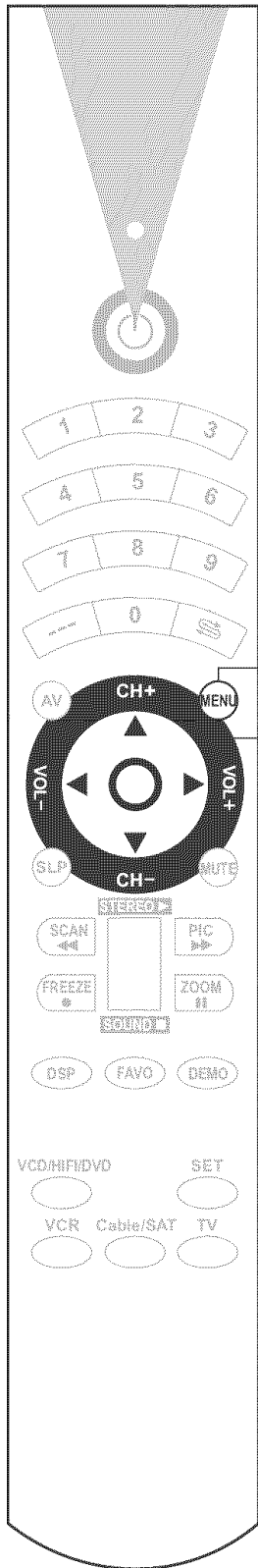

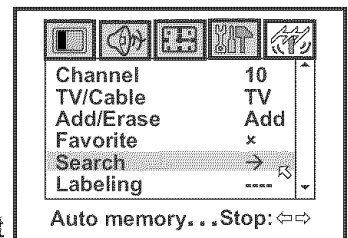
## Auto Search

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.
- 3 Press CH- repeatedly to select Search item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or VOL- to start auto search.


All active channels will be stored into memory automatically.

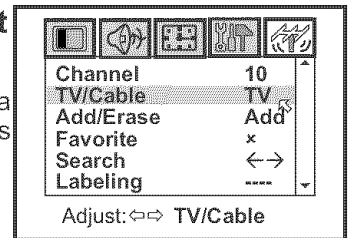

## Setting TV/Cable option

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.
- 3 Press CH- twice to select TV/Cable item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select TV or Cable.

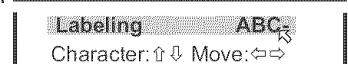
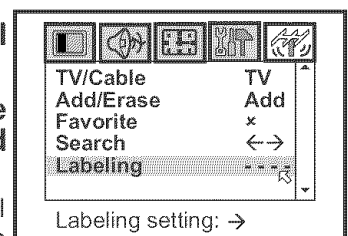
In TV mode, the set receives antenna signals. In Cable mode the set receives Cable TV programs. Please select:  
**TV:** If using VHF/UHF antenna.  
**Cable:** If using Cable TV.



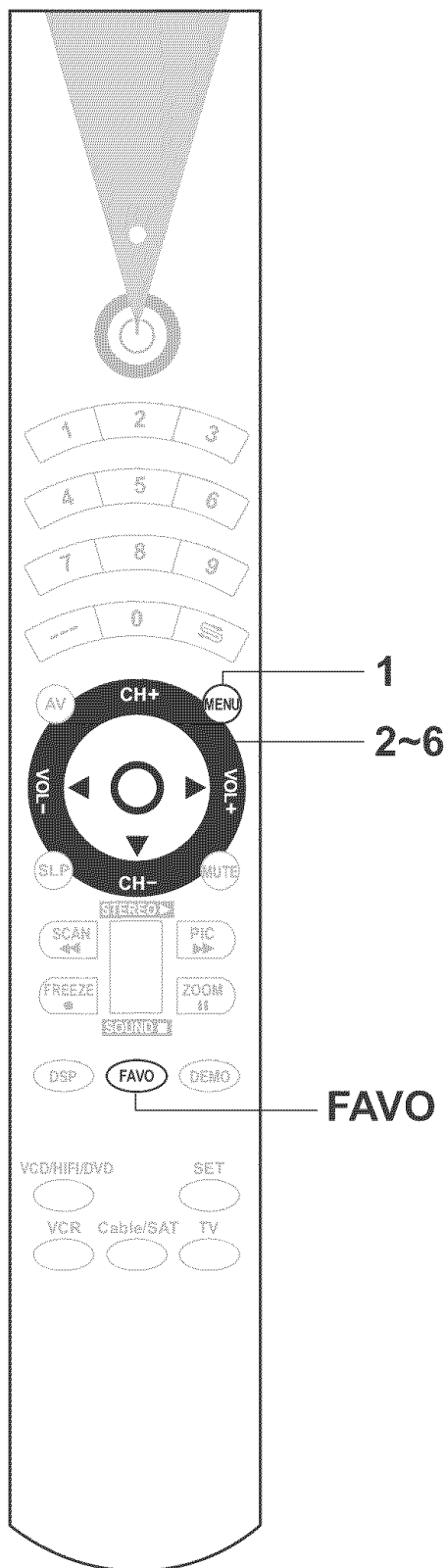
## Setting channel label

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.
- 3 Press CH- repeatedly to select Labeling item.
- 4 Press VOL+ to access label editing mode.
- 5 In label editing mode, use VOL+/- to move cursor and CH+/- to select character.


The unit allows you to set every channel respectively with a label no more than four characters.

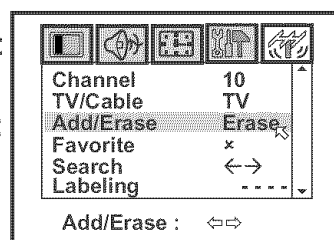

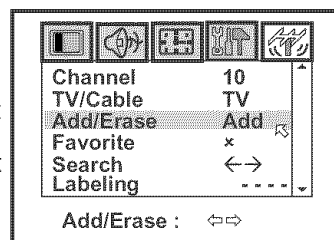
## Erasing an unwanted channel

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.
- 3 Press CH- to select Channel item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select an unwanted channel number.
- 5 Press CH- twice to select Add/Erase item.
- 6 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select Erase.




The "erased" channel will be skipped when you browse channels by CH+ or CH- button.

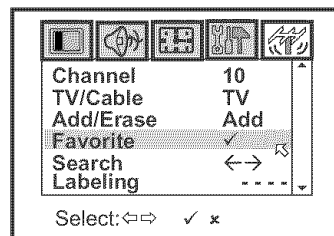
To view a skipped channel, use digit keys to select the "erased" channel. Then repeat the above steps and set the Add/Erase item to Add.



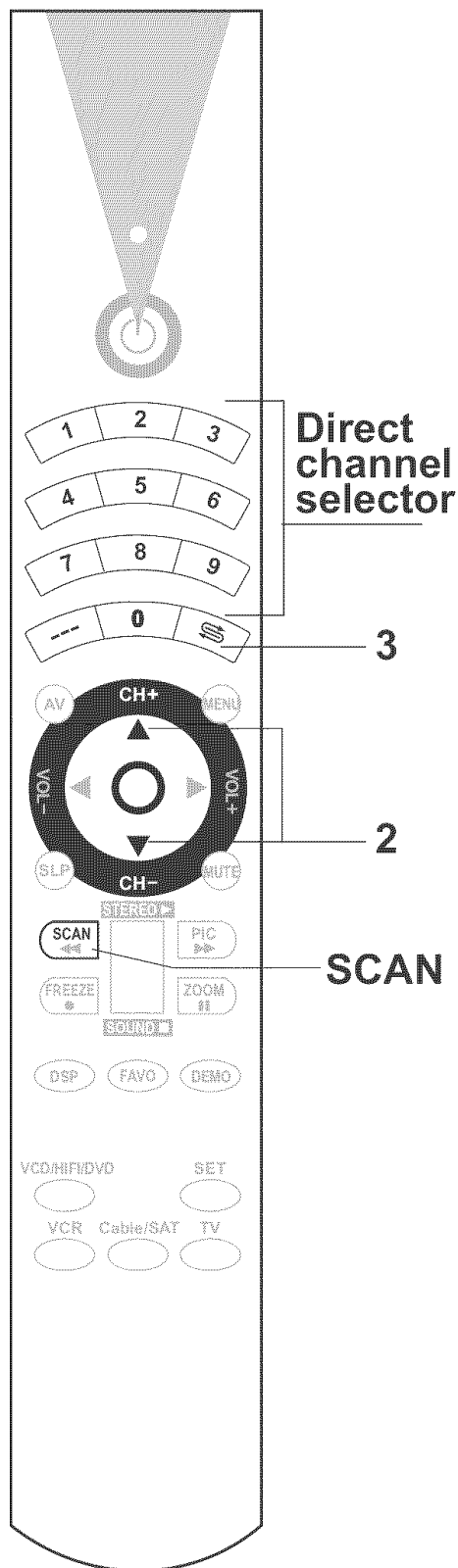
## Setting favorite channel

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.
- 3 Press CH- to select Channel item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select a channel number.
- 5 Press CH- repeatedly to select Favorite item.
- 6 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select ✓ or x.

You can repeat the above steps to set more favorite channels so that you can cycle your favorite channels by pressing the FAVO button.



# Channel Selection



Before you select a channel, please select TV or Cable input signal. Please see the Tuning section to set the TV/Cable input. When you select TV, only channels received on antenna can be selected; When you select Cable, channels received on cable can be selected.

## 1 Use Direct Channel Selector (0-9 and ---)

To select one-digit channel:

- Press one of the 0-9 digit keys and wait for 2 seconds.

To select two-digit channel:

- Input the channel using the digit keys. Be sure to enter the channel within 2 seconds.

To select three-digit channel: (Available in "Cable" mode only)

- Press "---" to display "1--".
- Press two digit keys to input the remaining two digits of the channel. For example, to select channel 124, press "---", press 2, then press 4.

## 2 Use CH+ or CH- button

Press **CH+**, the channel number increases;  
Press **CH-**, the channel number decreases.

## 3 Previous channel ⇌ button

Press this button to switch between the current channel and the previous channel.

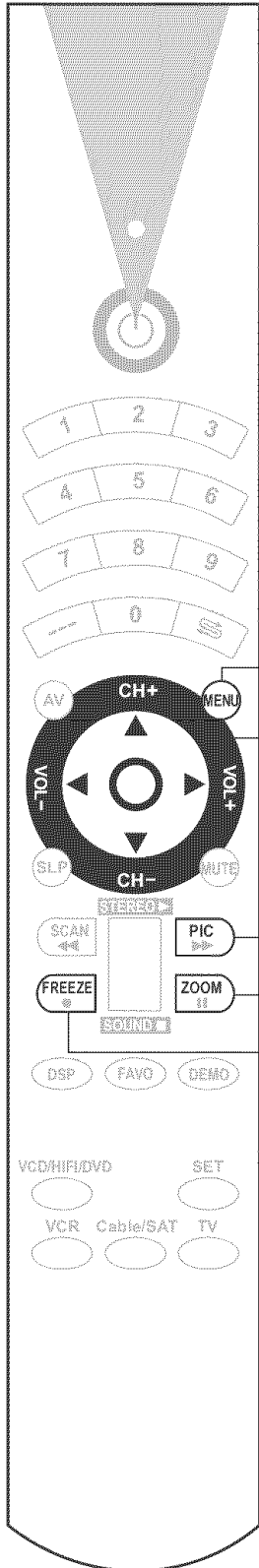
### Scanning channels

Press the **SCAN** button, the TV set scans all channels one by one. Every channel will be displayed for 2 seconds.

This function helps you to quickly browse all active programs. Press any button can stop **Channel Scanning**.

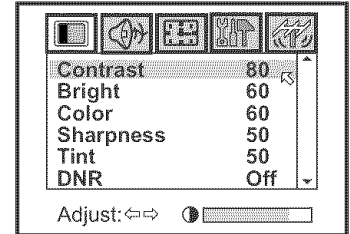

# Adjusting Picture



## Adjusting picture

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press **CH-** to select item.
- 3 Press **VOL+** or **VOL-** to adjust.

**DNR** ————— Reduces noise in the channel, commonly called snow.

**SVM** ————— Increase picture sharpness and provides crisp white to black transitions.

## Selecting picture mode

There are three preset picture modes (**Movie**, **Standard** and **Sports**) and one user-set picture mode (**Custom**).

Each preset mode has its own picture settings (Color, Brightness, Contrast, Sharpness and Tint).

Using **PIC** button can select picture mode.

**Movie:** Select for a finely detailed picture.

**Sports:** Select for a bright picture.

**Standard:** Select for a standard picture.

Adjusted settings are stored in **Custom** mode.

## Selecting picture aspect

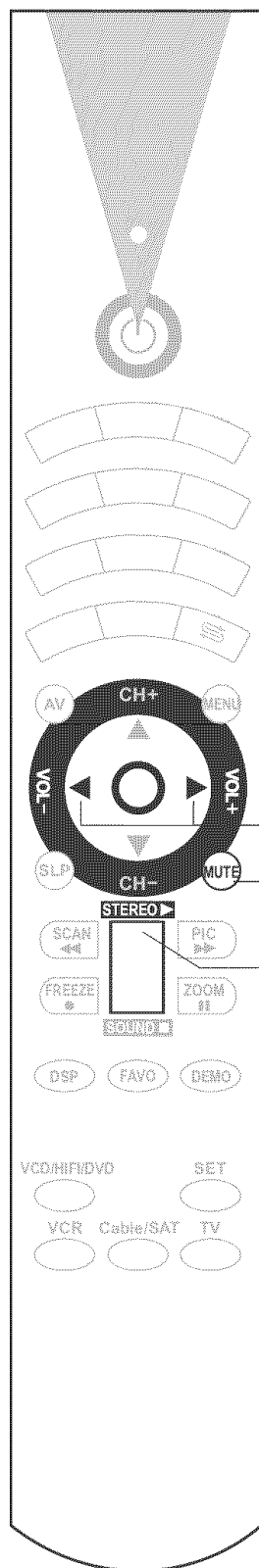
Press **ZOOM** to select picture size (ratio) between 16:9 and 4:3 according to your preference.

## Freezing picture

This feature is used to freeze picture, when the **FREEZE** button is pressed.

Press the **FREEZE** button again to restore.

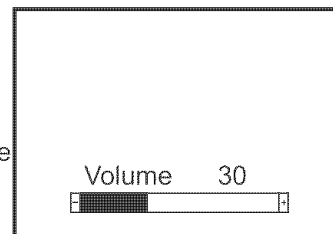
# Sound



## Adjusting volume

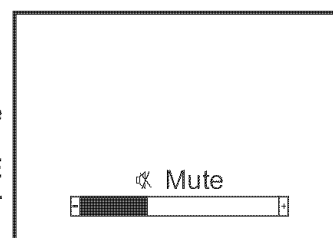
### 1 VOL+ or VOL- button.

Press **VOL+** to increase the volume.  
Press **VOL-** to decrease the volume.  
The minimum volume is 0 and the maximum volume is 100.



### 2 MUTE button.

To mute the sound, press **MUTE** on the remote.  
To restore the sound, press **MUTE** again, or press the **VOL+** or **VOL-** button.



## Selecting audio mode

If the program you are watching is "STEREO" or "SAP", you can select audio mode by using the **STEREO** button on the remote controller. The audio mode changes as follows.

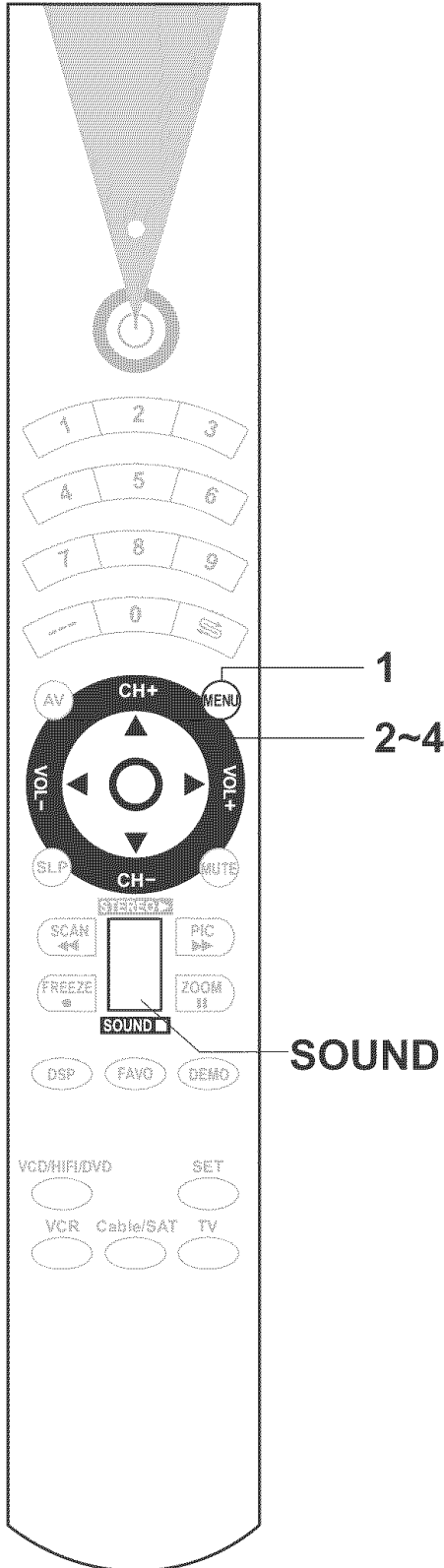
MONO ↔ STEREO (If the program is **STEREO**)

MONO ↔ SAP (If the program is **SAP**)


MONO → STEREO → SAP (If the program is **STEREO & SAP**)

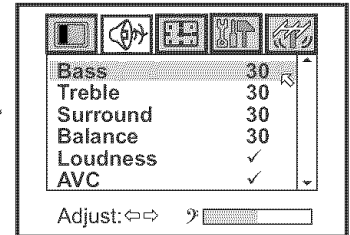

## Adjusting sound

- 1 Press MENU to display the OSD menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ or VOL- to select  icon.

# Troubleshooting (continued)

## RECEPTION DISTURBANCES

Most types of television interference can be remedied by adjusting the height and position of the VHF/UHF antenna. Outdoor antennas are recommended for best results if not using cable or a satellite. The most common types of television interference are shown below. If one of these symptoms appear when the TV is connected to a Cable TV system, the disturbance may be caused by the local cable company broadcast.

### IGNITION:

Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear, picture may flutter or drift. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electric drills and other electric appliances.



### GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve the reception.



### SNOW:

If your receiver is located in the fringe area of a television station where the signal is weak, your picture may be marred by the appearance of small dots. When the signal is extremely weak, it maybe necessary to install an external antenna to improve the picture.



### RADIO FREQUENCY INTERFERENCE:

This interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some cases, causes loss of contrast in the picture.



### PICTURE SIZE VARIATION:

A slight picture size variation is normal when you adjust the CONTRAST or BRIGHTNESS setting.

## CARE AND MAINTENANCE

To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning. The exterior of the receiver may be cleaned with a dust cloth. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts. Mild soap and a soft, damp cloth may be used.
