Messaging Folders & Memory Status

Deleting Messages Automatically

When memory for messaging folders is low, old messages are automatically deleted one by one. Protect important messages from unintentional deletion ($\square P$.13-21), or set message deletion settings to **OFF** ($\square P$.18-18). Messages in Drafts and SMS on USIM Card are not deleted automatically.

When Messaging Memory is Full

[] (Received Full) appears in Standby and no more new incoming messages are received. Delete old messages in Incoming Mail folder (C→P.13-21), then retrieve new messages (C→P.13-15).
