Charge the battery for about 6 hours before initial use.




#### <Message Waiting>

#### Power On/Off






 With this PS, the POWER button has multiple functions. When the button is depressed for longer than 2 seconds, the PS is either turned on or turned off. When depressed less than this time, the button serves to disconnect the telephone conversation or cancel a function. Please make a mental note of the multiple function of this button as you use this manual.


#### Wave Search

While in stand-by mode or receiving a call, you can adjust the volume by pressing repeatedly. (Default: —— high)



- Hold down to change from "MEETING MODE" to "VIBRATION OFF/RINGER OFF".
- If Key Tone is set to "OFF", the ring tone does not sound while adjusting the volume.
- While charging, the PS rings for incoming calls (except in "MEETING MODE" and "VIBRATION OFF/RINGER OFF").
- If you press while in stand-by mode, the ring tone does not sound for confirmation.
- Vibration & Ring setting is also available. (See page 33.)

#### Receiver Volume Adjustment


During a conversation or in off-hook status, you can adjust the volume by pressing repeatedly. (Default: \_\_\_ medium)

# Troubleshooting

### Battery Information

After your Panasonic battery is fully charged [at 25 °C (77 °F)]:

Operation	Approx. battery charge
While in use (Talk)	Up to about 6 hours
While not in use (Stand-by)	Up to about 60 hours

- Battery charge may be shortened depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- · You need not worry about overcharging.
- · The battery will drain even while the unit is "OFF".
- The PS can receive calls even while charging.
- If " \( \bar{\bar{\pi}} \)" flashes, power off the handset, otherwise battery charge will be shortened greatly.

#### Low Battery Warning

The battery needs to be charged in the following situations:

- " T " flashes or the alarm sounds every five seconds\*.
- When "CHARGE BATTERY" is displayed, your PS must be re-charged. Please re-charge your PS for 6 hours. When "CHARGE BATTERY" is displayed, the PS cannot be operated.
- \* If the low battery warning occurs during a conversation, you can have the conversation for another minute, and then the call will be disconnected automatically.

#### Replacing the Batteries

If " 🖪 " flashes after a few telephone calls even when the handset batteries have been fully charged, it is time to replace the batteries with new ones.

Before replacing the batteries, turn the power off to prevent memory loss. Make sure you charge the new batteries for about 6 hours in order to display the battery strength prompt

• Please order Panasonic battery with service part No. N4HHGMB00001 to replace.
