Battery Information

After your Panasonic battery is fully charged [at 25°C (77°F)]:

Operation Approx. battery life	
While in use (Talk)	Up to about 6 hours
While not in use (Standby)	Up to about 60 hours

- Battery life may be shortened depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- You need not worry about overcharging.
- The battery will drain even while the unit is "OFF".
- The PS can receive calls even while charging.
- If " \(\gamma\) " flashes, power off the handset, otherwise battery life will be shortened greatly.

Low Battery Warning

When the battery needs to be charged, " I flashes or beeps sound every five seconds. During a conversation, the call will hang up automatically within one minute. If idle or in a programming status, "CHARGE BATTERY" is displayed and no key is operated, but the key is available. In these cases, recharge the battery.

Replacing the Batteries

If " If I flashes after a few telephone calls even when the handset batteries have been fully charged, it is time to replace the batteries with new ones.

Before replacing the batteries, turn the power off to prevent memory loss. Make sure you charge the new batteries for about 6 hours in order to display the battery strength prompt correctly.
