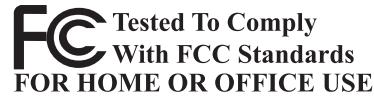

- If the battery pack will not be used for a long period of time (a month or more), charge or discharge (use) the battery pack until the remaining battery level becomes 30% to 40% and store it in a cool, dry place.
- This computer prevents overcharging of the battery by recharging only when the remaining power is less than approx. 95% of capacity.

- The battery pack is not charged when the computer is first purchased. Be sure to charge it before using it for the first time. When the AC adaptor is connected to the computer, charging begins automatically.
- Should the battery leak and the fluid get into your eyes, do not rub your eyes. Immediately flush your eyes with clear water and see a doctor for medical treatment as soon as possible.

- The battery pack may become warm during recharging or normal use. This is completely normal.

- If the temperature is low, the operating time is shortened. Only use the computer within the allowable temperature range.
- This computer has a high temperature mode function that prevents the degradation of the battery in high temperature environments. (→  Reference Manual "Battery Power") A level corresponding to a 100% charge for high temperature mode is approximately equivalent to an 80% charge level for normal temperature mode.
- The battery pack is a consumable item. If the amount of time the computer can be run by using a particular battery pack becomes dramatically shorter and repeated recharging does not restore its performance, the battery pack should be replaced with a new one.
- When transporting a spare battery inside a package, briefcase, etc., it is recommended that it be placed in a plastic bag so that its contacts are protected.
- Always power off the computer when it is not in use. Leaving the computer on when the AC adaptor is not connected will exhaust the remaining battery capacity.

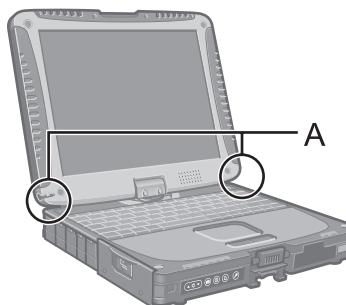

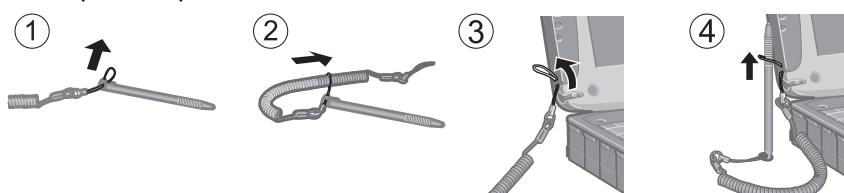

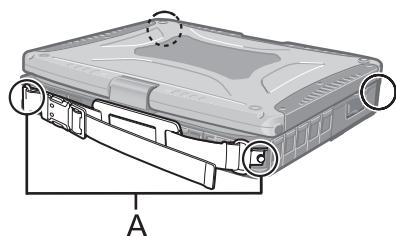

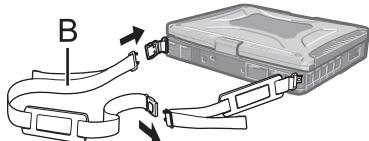

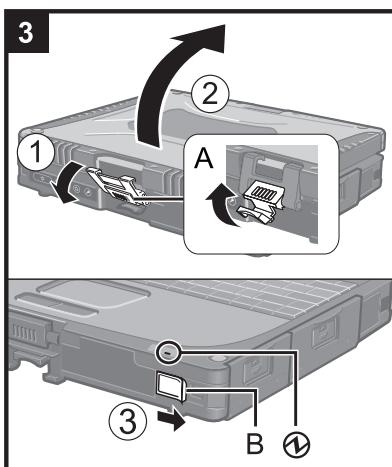


## 2 Connect your computer to a power outlet.

The battery charging starts automatically.

**CAUTION**

- Do not disconnect the AC adaptor and do not switch the wireless switch to on until the first-time operation procedure is completed.
- When using the computer for the first time, do not connect any peripheral device except the battery pack and AC adaptor.
- **Handling the AC adaptor**
  - Problems such as sudden voltage drops may arise during periods of thunder and lightning. Since this could adversely affect your computer, an uninterruptible power source (UPS) is highly recommended unless running from the battery pack alone.



## 3 Turn on the computer.

① Pull up the part (A) and release the latch.

② Lift open the display.

③ Slide and hold the power switch (B) for approximately one second until the power indicator (1) lights.

**CAUTION**

- Do not slide the power switch repeatedly.
- The computer will forcibly be turned off if you slide and hold the power switch for four seconds or longer.
- Once you turn off the computer, wait for ten seconds or more before you turn on the computer again.
- Do not perform the following operation until the hard disk drive indicator (2) turns off.
  - Connecting or disconnecting the AC adaptor
  - Sliding the power switch
  - Touching the keyboard, touch pad, tablet buttons, touchscreen (only for model with touchscreen), digitizer (only for model with digitizer) or external mouse
  - Closing the display
- When the CPU temperature is high, the computer may not start up to prevent overheating of the CPU. Wait until the computer cools down, and then turn the power on again. If the computer does not power on even after cooling down, contact Panasonic Technical Support (→ page 37).

## 4 Setup Windows.

① Follow the on-screen instructions.

- After turning on the computer, "Please wait a moment while Windows prepares to start for the first time ..... " appears, and then a small circle circulates on the screen. This will take a few minutes.
- During setup of Windows, use the touch pad and clicking to move the cursor and to click an item.
- Setup of Windows will take approximately 20 minutes.  
Go to the next step, confirming each message on the display.

**CAUTION**

- You cannot choose the following words for user name and password: CON, PRN, AUX, CLOCK\$, NUL, COM1 to COM9, LPT1 to LPT9.
- You can change the user name, password, image and security setting after setup of Windows.
- Remember your password. If you forget the password, you cannot use the Windows. Creating a password reset disk beforehand is recommended.
- The wallpaper for the first logon user has already been set on "4 Setup Windows." .

When using this computer under the Sun, the screen becomes easily viewable by changing the wallpaper to the white wallpaper.

① Right-click on the desktop, and click [Personalize] - [Desktop Background].

② Select [Solid Colors] at [Picture Location].

③ Select the white wallpaper and click [OK].

## 5 <Only for model with touchscreen> Perform the touchscreen calibration.

### NOTE

- At first, log on to Windows as an administrator, and perform this calibration.
- Return the rotated display to [Primary Landscape] before the touchscreen calibration.

- ① Click  (Start) - [Control Panel] - [Additional Options] - [Tablet Calibration].
- ② Using the stylus, touch each of the 9 "+" target marks one by one.

### NOTE

- Perform the following calibration for each user.

- ① Click  (Start) - [Control Panel] - [Mobile PC] - [Tablet PC Settings].

- ② Click [Calibrate].

- ③ Using the stylus, touch each of the four "+" target marks one by one, and then click [OK].

- Perform the calibration for the orientation to be used.

### NOTE

#### ● PC Information Viewer

This computer periodically records the management information including the hard disk information such as number of hours powered-on, number of times powered-on, internal temperature, replacement sector. The maximum data volume for each record is 750 byte. These information are only used for estimating the cause when the hard disk goes down by any possibility. They are never sent to outside via network nor used for any other purpose except for the purpose described the above.

To disable the function, add the check mark for [Disable the automatic save function for management information history] in [Hard Disk Status] of PC Information Viewer, and click [OK].

## ■ When Starting Up/Shutting Down

### CAUTION

- Do not do the following
  - Connecting or disconnecting the AC adaptor
  - Sliding the power switch
  - Touching the keyboard, touch pad, touchscreen, digitizer or external mouse
  - Closing the display

### NOTE

- When the DC plug is not connected to the computer, disconnect the AC cord from your AC wall outlet. About 0.9 W of power is consumed simply by having the AC adaptor plugged into an electrical outlet.

- To conserve power, the following power saving methods are set at the time of purchase.

- The screen automatically turns off after 15 minutes of inactivity.
- The computer automatically enters sleep<sup>\*1</sup> after 20 minutes of inactivity.

<sup>\*1</sup> Refer to  Reference Manual "Sleep or Hibernation Functions" about resuming from sleep.

- Note that the computer consumes electricity even when the computer power is off. If the battery pack is fully charged, the battery will fully discharge in the following period of time:

- When power is off: Approx. 7 weeks
- In sleep: Approx. 3 days
- In hibernation: Approx. 6 days

At the time of purchase, "Wake Up from LAN" is enabled.

If "Wake Up from LAN" is disabled, the period of time in sleep will become slightly longer, and the period of time in hibernation will become about the same as during power-off. Even if "Wake Up from LAN" is enabled, when the LAN cable is not connected, the period of time in sleep and hibernation will be slightly longer.

- Power consumption in each mode is as follows. (When AC adaptor is connected)

- When the screen is off: Approx. 12.0 W
- In sleep: Approx. 1.7 W
- The battery pack is fully charged (or not being charged) and the computer is off: Approx. 0.9 W

# First-time Operation

## ■ To change the partition structure

You can shrink a part of an existing partition to create unallocated disk space, from which you can create a new partition. This computer has a single partition in the default setting.

- ① Click  (Start) and right-click [Computer], then click [Manage].
  - A standard user needs to enter an administrator password.
- ② Click [Disk Management].
- ③ Right-click the partition for Windows ("c" drive in the default setting), and click [Shrink Volume].
  - The partition size depends on the computer specifications.
- ④ Input the size in [Enter the amount of space to shrink in MB] and click [Shrink].
  - You cannot input a larger number than the displayed size.
- ⑤ Right-click [Unallocated] (the shrunk space in the step ④) and click [New Simple Volume].
- ⑥ Follow the on-screen instructions to make the settings, and click [Finish].  
Wait until formatting is completed.

### NOTE

- You can create an additional partition using remaining unallocated space or newly creating unallocated space.
- To delete a partition, right-click the partition and click [Delete Volume] in the step ③.

## Regarding Windows Vista

You can select the Classic view of Control Panel or the Classic Start menu. You can also change the way a user logs on or off. This manual explains using the Windows Vista default setting (not Classic view or Classic Start menu etc.).

### ● User Account Control

User Account Control is a new security component of Windows Vista to stop unauthorized changes to your computer.

The User Account Control message will pop up every time you try making an important change to your computer.

### ● Windows Sidebar

The Windows Sidebar does not appear in the default setting. To display it, click  (Start) - [All Programs] - [Accessories] - [Windows Sidebar].

To always display the sidebar:

- ① Right-click the sidebar icon  on the notification area, and click [Properties].
- ② Add a check mark for [Start Sidebar when Windows starts] and click [OK].

### ● When Using Wireless LAN <Only for model with wireless LAN>

If you cannot communicate with the access point or if the access point is not detected, right-click  on the notification area and click [Connect to a network], and then click  in the [Connect to a network] screen.

### ● Sound and Video

- Sound (e.g. MP3, WMA) and video (e.g. MPG, WMV) recorded in PC Cards and SD Memory Cards may be interrupted during playback. If this happens, copy them to the hard disk drive and play back.

- Sound and video in AVI files may be interrupted or produce a time-lag during playback. If this happens, click  or  on the notification area, and click [High performance]. This may remedy the problem.

- Depending on the processing status on Windows, sound may be interrupted at Windows startup. You can mute the sound at startup.

- ① Right-click the desktop and click [Personalize] - [Sounds].
- ② Remove the check mark from [Play Windows Startup sound], and click [OK].

- The thermal control may set the computer to hibernation if you use the computer in a high ambient temperature and use an application that uses a lot of CPU power (for example, playing DVD-Video over an extended period). Wait a few minutes (at least 5) before turning the computer on again if this occurs.

### ● Upgrading Windows Vista™ Business to Windows Vista™ Ultimate

- When you have upgraded the preinstalled "Windows Vista™ Business" to "Windows Vista™ Ultimate", you may have the problem that audio does not sound. To remedy it, reinstall the sound driver in the following procedure.

- ① Click  (Start) - [Control Panel] - [Uninstall a program].
- ② Click [SigmaTel Audio] and click [Uninstall].
  - A standard user needs to enter an administrator password.
  - Follow the on-screen instructions to remove the sound driver.
- ③ Click  (Start) and input [c:\util\drivers\sound] in [Start Search], and press **Enter**.
- ④ Right-click [setup] in [sound] folder and click [Run as administrator].  
If there are two or more "setup" files, right-click the file whose [Type] is [Application].
  - A standard user needs to enter an administrator password.
  - Follow the on-screen instructions and install the sound driver.

- **If high-frequency sound occurs around keyboard while using the computer**

This symptom is mitigated by changing the settings for the USB power saving function.

A standard user needs to enter an administrator password and click [OK].

- Set [USB selective suspend setting] to [Enable].

- ① Click  (Start) - [Control Panel] - [System and Maintenance] - [Power Options].
- ② Click [Change plan settings] of the current power plan.
- ③ In [Change settings for the plan:], click [Change advanced power settings].
- ④ In [Advanced settings], double-click [USB settings].
- ⑤ Double-click the displayed [USB selective suspend setting].
- ⑥ Change settings of [On battery:] and [Plugged in:] to [Enabled].
- ⑦ Click [OK] and exit the [Advanced settings] screen.

- **Windows Update**

You can update to the latest patches and service packs for Windows with the following menus.

**Do not apply “Driver Updates” even if a message to update a driver appears. If a driver update is required, contact your technical support office.**

- **If the message “Check your computer security” is displayed**

This is not an error message and you can use the computer. However, making appropriate measures is recommended to reduce the risk of virus and other attacks.

- Place the computer on a flat stable surface. Do not place the computer upright or turn it over. If the computer is exposed to an extremely strong impact, it may become inoperable.
- Temperature: Operation : 5 °C to 35 °C {41 °F to 95 °F}  
Storage : -20°C to 60 °C {-4 °F to 140 °F}  
Humidity: Operation : 30% to 80% RH (No condensation)  
Storage : 30% to 90% RH (No condensation)  
Even within the above temperature/humidity ranges, using for a long time in an extreme environment will result in the product deterioration and will shorten the product life.
- Do not place the computer in the following areas, otherwise the computer may be damaged.
  - Near electronic equipment. Image distortion or noise may occur.
  - In extremely high or low temperature.
- As the computer can become hot during operation, keep it away from items that are sensitive to heat.

## Handling cautions

This computer is designed to minimize shock to parts such as the LCD and the hard disk drive and equipped with a drip-proof keyboard, but no warranty is provided against any trouble caused by shock. Be extremely careful when handling the computer.

- When carrying the computer:
  - Turn off the computer.
  - Remove all external devices, cables, cards and other protruding things.
  - Do not drop or hit the computer against solid objects.
  - Do not leave the display open.
  - Do not grip the display part.
- Do not put anything (e.g., a piece of paper) between the display and keyboard.
- When you board an airplane, take the computer with you and never put it in your checked luggage. When using the computer on airplane, follow the airline's instructions.
- When carrying a spare battery, put it in a plastic bag to protect its terminals.

## 2 Select the [Security] menu, then select [Computrace (R) Sub-Menu] and press **Enter**.

## 3 Select [Computrace (R) BIOS Module], and set to [Enable].

## 4 At the confirmation message, select [Execute] and press **Enter**.

## 5 At the reconfirmation message, select [Execute] and press **Enter**.

## 6 Press **F10**.

At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press **Enter**.

The computer restarts.

## Maintenance

### To clean the LCD panel

Use the soft cloth included with the computer. (For further information, refer to "Suggestions About Cleaning the LCD Surface" that comes with the soft cloth.)

### To clean areas other than the LCD panel

Wipe with a soft dry cloth such as gauze. When using detergent, dip a soft cloth in water-diluted detergent and wring it thoroughly.

### CAUTION

- Do not use benzene, thinner, or rubbing alcohol since it may adversely affect the surface causing discoloration, etc.  
Do not use commercially-available household cleaners and cosmetics, as they may contain components harmful to the surface.
- Do not apply water or detergent directly to the computer, since liquid may enter inside of the computer and cause malfunction or damage.

# Hard Disk Backup/Restore Function

[Backup and Restore Center] and [System Recovery Options] allow you create a backup of the entire hard disk data, which can be used to recover from hardware failure.

- Connect the AC adaptor and do not remove it until backup is complete.

## Restoring the hard disk data

**NOTE**

- This function does not work when you turn on the computer for the first time or just after you reinstall Windows. Start and shut down Windows Vista, and then you can use the function.
- Connect the AC adaptor and do not remove it until restoration is complete.

- 3 **Press **↑ ↓** to select [Repair Your Computer] and press **Enter**.**  
[System Recovery Options] appears.
- 4 **Select the keyboard layout and click [Next].**
- 5 **Select [User name] and input [Password], then click [OK].**
- 6 **Click [Windows Complete PC Restore] and follow the on-screen instructions.**

**NOTE**

- If pressing **F8** does not display [System Recovery Options], use the Product Recovery DVD-ROM.
  - ① Perform the steps **1 to 6** of “Reinstalling Software” (→ page 23).
  - ② Click [Run “System Recovery Options”.] and click [Next].
  - ③ Follow the on-screen instructions.

# Hard Disk Data Erase Utility

When disposing the computer or transferring the ownership, erase all hard disk data in order to avoid data leakage. Even if you erase the data or initialize the hard disk using normal Windows commands, the data can be read with some special software. Use the hard disk data erase utility to erase the data completely.

Note that transferring of the ownership without uninstalling the commercial software will be a violation of the software's license agreement.

The hard disk data erase utility erases data using an overwriting method, but there is a possibility that due to malfunctions or other operational errors, data may not be completely erased. There are also specialized devices that may be able to read data that has been erased using this method. If you need to erase highly confidential data, we recommend that you contact a company that specializes in this process. Matsushita Electric Industrial Co., Ltd. will bear no responsibility for losses or damages suffered as a result of the use of this utility.

## NOTE

- This utility cannot erase data for specific partitions. The entire hard disk data including the data of the recovery partition will be erased.

- 4 **Select the [Boot] menu, then select [USB CDD] and press **F6** until [USB CDD] is at the top of [Boot priority order].**
- 5 **Set the Product Recovery DVD-ROM into the CD/DVD drive.**
- 6 **Press **F10**.**  
At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press **Enter**.  
The computer will restart.
  - If [Enter Password] is displayed during the following procedures, input the Supervisor Password or the User Password.
- 7 **Click [Erase the whole data on the Hard Disk for security] and click [Next].**
- 8 **At the confirmation message, click [YES].**
- 9 **Click [Continue].**
- 10 **Click [Continue] again.**
- 11 **Click [YES].**  
Erasing the hard disk data starts.
- 12 **After erasing is completed, remove the Product Recovery DVD-ROM and click [OK].**

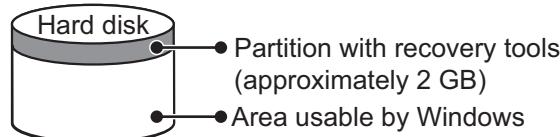
# Reinstalling Software

Reinstalling software will return the computer to the default condition. When you reinstall the software, the hard disk data will be erased.

Back up important data to other media or an external hard disk before reinstallation.

## CAUTION

Do not delete the partition with recovery tools on the hard disk.  
The disk space in the partition is not available to store data.



## Preparation

- Prepare the following items:
  - The Product Recovery DVD-ROM (included)
  - Panasonic USB CD/DVD drive (optional) (refer to recent catalogs and other sources for information about the products available)
  - Remove all peripherals (except for the CD/DVD drive).
  - Connect the AC adaptor and do not remove it until reinstallation is complete.

- 1 **Turn off the computer and connect the CD/DVD drive to the USB port (→ page 11).**
- 2 **Turn on the computer, and press **F2** while [Panasonic] boot screen is displayed.**  
The Setup Utility starts up.
  - If the password is requested, enter the Supervisor Password.
- 3 **Write down all of the contents of the Setup Utility and press **F9**.**  
At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press **Enter**.
- 4 **Select the [Boot] menu, then select [USB CDD] and press **F6** until [USB CDD] is at the top of [Boot priority order].**
- 5 **Set the Product Recovery DVD-ROM into the CD/DVD drive.**
- 6 **Press **F10**.**  
At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press **Enter**.  
The computer will restart.
- 7 **Click [Reinstall Windows] and click [Next].**  
The License Agreement screen appears.
- 8 **Click [Yes, I agree to the provisions above and wish to continue!] and click [Next].**
- 9 **Select the settings and click [Next].**
  - [Reinstall Windows to the whole Hard Disk to factory default.]  
You will have a single partition.
  - [Reinstall Windows to the operating system partition.]  
You can keep the partition structure.
- 10 **At the confirmation message, click [YES].**  
Reinstallation starts automatically. (It will take approximately 30 minutes.)
  - Do not interrupt reinstallation, for example by turning off the computer or pressing **Ctrl** + **Alt** + **Del**. Otherwise reinstallation may become unavailable as Windows may not start up or the data may be corrupted.
- 11 **Remove the Product Recovery DVD-ROM, and then click [OK] to turn off the computer, then remove the CD/DVD drive.**
- 12 **Turn on the computer, and press **F2** while [Panasonic] boot screen is displayed.**  
The Setup Utility starts up.
  - If the password is requested, enter the Supervisor Password.
- 13 **Press **F9**.**  
At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and then press **Enter**.  
The Setup Utility settings excluding the password(s) will return to the default values.
- 14 **Press **F10**.**  
At the confirmation message, select [Yes] and press **Enter**.  
The Setup Utility will close, and the computer will restart.

- 16 Start the Setup Utility and change the settings as necessary.
- 17 Perform Windows Update.

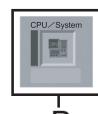

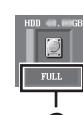
