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# **Safety Precautions**



### **CAUTION**

#### **Secure Ventilation**

Slots and openings in the cabinet and the back or bottom are provided for ventilation, and to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. There should be at least 4 inches (10 cm) of space around the TV. The openings should never be blocked by placing the TV on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface. This TV should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase unless proper ventilation is provided.



# EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER (NEC) NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE



- 19) An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines, other electric light, power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

# **First Time Setup**

When you first turn on the TV, a series of steps will popup to guide you to setup your TV.

- These steps are not necessary if the setup has been completed by your local dealer.
- 1 Plug the power cord into the socket outlet



2 Turn the TV on with the POWER button

4 Select [Home use]





- [Store demonstration] is for shop display.
- To display the [Set viewing mode] screen again as shown above and select [Home use], perform [Reset to defaults] in the [Setup] menu (p. 21).
   If you perform [Reset to defaults], please do not unplug the AC Cord while the TV is being reset.

### 5 Select ANTENNA/Cable setup method

If you select [Yes], select the wiring method used to connect your box to the TV.

### 6 Select [Auto program] and start scanning

First Time Setup completes when scanning is done.



To watch TV via a Cable box, Satellite receiver, or any other source (DVD, DVR, gaming device, etc.), press the **INPUT** button and select the appropriate input (p. 15).


 If you turn off the TV by pulling out the power cord before completing "First Time Setup", "First Time Setup" will launch again when you next turn on the TV.

On the other hand, if you turn off the TV with the **POWER** button on the TV or remote control, this procedure will not launch again on your next power on.

- You can repeat "First Time Setup" by selecting [Reset to defaults] in the [Setup] menu (p. 21).
- After "First Time Setup", you can change [Language] from the [Setup] menu (p. 21) or retune the TV using [Auto program] or [Manual program] (p. 22).

# **Operating the TV**

#### Using the TV controls




- 1 Changes the input mode Chooses Menu and Submenu entries Press and hold for 3 seconds for MENU function
  - Press again and hold for 3 seconds to return to the previous screen from submenus / exit from main menu page.
- 2 Selects channels in sequence Makes selections or adjustments when in the menu system
- 3 Volume Up / Down Makes selections or adjustments when in the menu system.
- 4 Power button
  - Switches TV On or Off (Standby).
  - To completely turn off the TV, remove the power plug from the wall socket.
- 5 Remote control signal receiver
  - Remote control sensor range is about 23 feet (7 meters) in front of the TV set.
- 6 Power LED
  - On: Red
  - Off: No light
  - The TV consumes a small amount of electric energy even when turned off.

#### Note

 Do not place any objects between the TV remote control signal receiver and remote control.

### Using the remote control



- 1 Switches TV On or Off (Standby)
- 2 MEDIA PLAYER ⇒ (p. 16)
- 3 Displays the menu screen → (p. 18)

  - [Off / 15 / 30 / 60 / 90 minutes]

- 7 Displays [Options menu]

(only available when the TV input is "Antenna/ Cable")

- [Channel surf mode]: Specify favorites or type of channels to view. [All / Favorite / Digital only / Analog only]
- [Signal meter]: Check the signal strength if interference is found or freezing occurs on a digital image.
- 8 Colored buttons
  - Performs multiple operations which correspond to the operation guide displayed on the menu screen.
- 9 Volume Up / Down
- 10 Sound Mute On / Off
- 11 Numeric keypad to select channel

#### 12 Selects digital channel number

Example: CH15-1: 1 5 - 1

#### 13 Selects Closed Caption mode

- Digital TV: [Off / Service 1-6]
- Analog TV: [Off / CC1-4 / TEXT1-4]
- The selected mode is only set for the program you are watching at the moment.
- Closed Caption is not available when watching TV with a Cable or Satellite box connected via HDMI.
- Contact your Cable or Satellite operator for instructions on enabling CC with their box.
- Closed Caption settings are memorized in [Closed caption] of [Setup] menu → (p. 21).

#### 14 Selects the Audio mode for watching TV

- Digital mode: Selects next Audio track (if available) when receiving a digital channel.
- Analog mode: Selects the desired Audio mode [Stereo / SAP / Mono]
- Not available when watching TV with a Cable or Satellite box connected via HDMI.
- To set desired Audio for all channels
   "[Audio language]" (p. 20).
- 15 Input mode selection
  - Display [Input select] screen (p. 15) or press repeatedly to select the input mode.
- 16 Operates the Favorite channel list function 

  ⇒ (p. 15)
- 17 Exits to TV viewing screen
- 18 Returns to the previous menu / page
- 19 Changes aspect ratio and zoom
  - Press repeatedly to select the mode.
     [FULL] / [4:3] / [JUST] / [ZOOM] / [H-FILL]
     ⇒ (p. 25)
- 20 Channel Up / Down
  - When viewing from ANTENNA/Cable source
- 21 Returns to the last viewed channel or input








# Using Media Player

Media Player allows you to enjoy photo or music recorded on a USB Flash Memory.

- During the operation, audio signal is output from DIGITAL AUDIO OUT and HDMI 2 (ARC function) terminals. To use HDMI 2 with ARC function, connect an amplifier that has ARC function and set to use theatre speakers.
- The picture may not appear correctly on this TV depending on the digital cameras used.
- Display may take some time when there are many files and folders in the USB Flash Memory.
- Partly degraded files might be displayed at a reduced resolution.
- The folder and file names may be different depending on the digital camera used.

- If the surface is particularly dirty, soak a soft, lint-free cloth in diluted, mild liquid dish soap (1 part mild liquid dish soap diluted by 100 times the amount of water) and then wring the cloth to remove excess liquid. Use this cloth to wipe the surface of the display panel, then wipe it evenly with a dry cloth of the same type until the surface is dry.
- Do not scratch or hit the surface of the panel with fingernails or other hard objects. Furthermore, avoid contact with volatile substances such as insect sprays, solvents, and thinner; otherwise, the quality of the surface may be adversely affected.

#### Cabinet

If the cabinet becomes dirty, wipe it with a soft, dry cloth.

- If the cabinet is particularly dirty, soak the cloth in diluted, mild liquid dish soap and then wring the cloth dry. Use this cloth to wipe the cabinet and then wipe it dry with a dry cloth.
- Do not allow any mild liquid dish soap to come into direct contact with the surface of the TV. If water droplets get inside the unit, operating problems may result.
- Avoid contact with volatile substances such as insect sprays, solvents, and thinner; otherwise, the quality of the cabinet surface may be adversely affected or the coating may peel off.
- Do not let articles made from rubber or PVC be in contact with the TV for long periods of time.

#### Pedestal

- Wipe the surfaces with a soft, dry cloth. If the unit is particularly dirty, clean it using a cloth soaked with water to which a small amount of mild liquid dish soap has been added and then wipe with a dry cloth. Do not use products such as solvents, thinner, or household wax for cleaning, as they can damage the surface coating. (If using a chemically-treated cloth, follow the instructions supplied with the cloth.)
- Do not attach sticky tape or labels, as they can make the surface of the pedestal dirty. Do not allow longterm contact with rubber, vinyl products, or the like. (Doing so will cause deterioration.)

# Troubleshooting

Before requesting service or assistance, please follow these simple guides to resolve the problem.

If an error message appears, follow the message's instructions.

If the problem still persists, please contact your local Panasonic dealer for assistance.

#### Picture

## Why is there no picture or just a blue, black or snowy screen being displayed?

- → Check if the power cord is plugged in and the TV is turned on (front red LED light should be on; not blinking).
- → Press the INPUT button on the remote control to select the correct input source.
- → Ensure all connections are correct and secure.
- When using external video source, such as a Cable/ Satellite box or DVD player, check that the device is on and functioning correctly.
- Press MENU on the remote control. If the menu is displayed, then the TV is working; recheck above steps.

#### Why doesn't the picture look like it is in High-Definition?

- → Press INFO on the remote control to confirm the type of signal being received. HD signal should be 720p, 1080i or 1080p.
- → Select a High-Definition channel from your HD source (Cable, Satellite or fiber optic service). HD channels sometimes broadcast non-HD content.
- Ensure that your HD source (HD box, Blu-ray player, etc.) is connected to the TV with an HDMI or COMPONENT cable and set to output an HD video signal.

# Why do black bars appear on the top and bottom and/or sides of the screen?

- → Change the format (aspect ratio) of the picture by pressing FORMAT on the remote control (p. 14).
- → Check the aspect settings on your external video source, such as Cable/Satellite box, DVD/Blu-ray Disc player, etc.

Note: Some content, such as film-based movies, are available in extra-wide format. Top and bottom bars are unavoidable.

# Why is the picture snowy when [ANTENNA/Cable In] is selected?

- → When using a cable service (without a box), check that all connections are secure.
- When using a cable or satellite box, change the connection to COMPOSITE, COMPONENT or HDMI (p. 11).
- If you're using an antenna, then check that connections are secure. Change the position or direction of the antenna and check the [Signal meter] (p. 14).

## Why is the picture chaotic and/or torn and/or with a buzz in the speakers?

- Check if electrical products such as kitchen appliances, fluorescent lights or light dimmers are nearby. They may interfere with the TV's picture.
- Try viewing a picture from another device, such as a DVD player or a game console, to narrow down the source of the problem.

#### Why is there a black box on the screen?

→ Change settings of Closed Caption (CC) (p. 14, 27).

# Why is the screen blank and the power indicator blinking?

→ The TV has gone into shutdown mode to protect itself. Try unplugging it for a few minutes and connecting it again. If there was a temporary power surge on the AC line it may now be OK. If the blinking returns, visit www.panasonic.com/support (U.S.A.) or www.panasonic.ca/english/support (Canada).

# Why do some small spots on the screen remain bright or dark?

→ The TV panel is made up of a few million pixels and is produced with advanced technology through an intricate process. Sometimes a few pixels may be bright or dark. These pixels do not indicate a defective panel and will have no impact on the performance of the TV.

#### Sound

#### Why is there no sound coming from the TV?

- → Make sure the volume is up and MUTE is off.
  → Check that the correct SAP (Secondary Audio
- → Check that the correct SAP (Secondary Audio Program) is selected by pressing SAP on the remote control (p. 14).
- → If the TV is connected to a Home Theater via optical cable, then: Check the connection, the audio system is on, the correct input is selected.
- → Check [HDMI1-2 in] analog/digital audio settings (p. 19).

# Why is the sound unusual, distorted, low volume or in another language?

- → Check that the correct SAP (Secondary Audio Program) is selected by pressing SAP on the remote control (p. 14).
- → Check that all connections of external equipment connected to the TV are secure.
- → When using Cable or Satellite box, check the device's audio settings (example: try changing the box's Audio Range to "narrow").

# Why is there a clicking, ticking or buzzing sound coming from the TV unit?

- → When TV power is turned on or shut off there are electrical components that make a click sound. This is normal
- Changes in the temperature and humidity of the room may cause thermal expansion and contraction that can produce sounds. This is not a sign of faulty operation or a malfunction.

#### Other

### Why does the CC button not display Closed Caption?

- When viewing TV via an HDMI connected device, such as a Cable or Satellite box, CC must be enabled at the device.
- Closed Caption is available only at supported TV programming.

#### Why do parts of the TV become hot?

- → The main unit radiates heat and some of the parts may become hot. Even if the temperature of parts of the front, top and rear panels has risen, these temperature rises do not cause any problems in terms of performance or quality.
- → Ensure good ventilation.
- → Do not block the ventilation holes of the TV and do not place the TV on top of other equipment.

#### Why doesn't the Remote Control work?

- → Check that the batteries are fresh, are of the same type and are installed with the correct polarity (+ and -).
- → To operate other devices, such as changing channels when using Cable or Satellite boxes or operating non-Panasonic Blu-ray players, use the remote control of the devices.
