



- **1. Earpiece:** Allows you to hear the other caller.
- 2. Main Display Screen:
 Displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
- 3. [] Directional Key:
 Allows you to scroll through
 phone menu options and
 provides a shortcut to phone
 functions from idle mode
- [=//] Left Soft Key: Press to access the messaging menu or access the function listed above the key.
- 5. [aw] Camera & Video Key: In idle mode, press once to start taking a picture. If pressed one more time, it toggles to the video recording mode.
- [C] SEND Key: Press to make or receive a call. In idle mode, press to access the all calls list.













- 8. [※-#] Shift Key: Press to enter an asterisk (*) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type. Press and hold to display the plus sign (+) for international dialing.
- [*** Best of the state of the
 - Press to enter the (#) character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to add a space.
- 10. [Augs] CLR Key: Press to clear a character from the display. Press and hold to clear all characters. Within a menu, press to return to the previous menu. Press and hold to activate the G'zGEAR function in idle mode.





- 11. [T] END/PWR Key: Press and hold to turn the phone on/off or press to end a call or browser session. Within a menu, press to return to idle mode.
- [Z] Speakerphone / Flashlight Key: With the flip open, press to turn speakerphone on or off.
- **13.** [] **OK Key**: Press to access the menu from idle mode. It also allows you to accept choices when navigating through the menu.
- 14. [] Right Soft Key: Press to access the contacts menu in idle mode or access the function listed above the key.
- **15. Microphone**: Allows the other caller to hear you.
- **16. External Speaker**: Allows you to listen to music, sounds or ringtones.

- Front Display Screen: Displays incoming calls, messages, signal, battery strength, time and date.
- 18. Camera: Built-in camera lens.
- 19. Sim Card Slot: Allows you to insert a SIM card. The SIM Card comes preinstalled in the device (located under the battery).
- Headset Jack: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
- 21. [###] PTT Key: Press to activate the PTT mode in idle mode.
- 22. [D] Volume Keys: Press to adjust the master volume in idle mode or adjust the voice volume during a call.
- 23. Voice Command Key: Press to activate the voice command function in idle mode
- Charging / Data Jack: Plug in a wall charger or USB cable (USB cable sold separately).





WATER RESISTANCE

The C781 is water resistant. It provides reliable performance for outdoor activities, and in wet conditions such as driving rain or high humidity.

The tested devices meets the requirements of the MIL-STD-810G (Rain & immersion 1m, 30min) standard.

CAUTION: The Water Resistance feature does not guarantee protection against the usage of this device underwater. Do not use the handset underwater.



- · Securely close the Charging/Data Port cover and the Headset Jack cover.
- Completely close the battery cover and slide the battery cover lock to the LOCK position.

SHOCK RESISTANCE

The rugged construction of the Ravine™ provides outstanding shock and vibration resistance. The tested device meets the requirements of the MIL-STD-810G (Drop 1.5m) standard.



CAUTION: The shock and vibration resistance features do not quarantee protection against every type of shock and vibration. Your handset may be damaged or malfunction depending on the severity of the shock or vibration.


DUST RESISTANCE

For additional peace of mind, the Ravine[™] is also dust resistant. The device was tested using silica flour at a temperature of 95°F and meets the MIL-STD-810 (Dust) standard.



- Your handset can be rinsed with clean water when dirty. To ensure water resistance, make sure that all covers are securely closed before rinsing.
 - Periodically, clean the Charging Terminals and Battery Terminals with a dry cloth or cotton swab. Dust may cause electrical connection problems. Avoid wiping with excessive force, which can damage the terminals.

BEFORE USING





- Do not clean terminals inside the handset, or they may be damaged.
- · If mud or sand is adhered to the handset, do not use it until wiping completely.
- Do not place the handset directly on sand. If sand gets into the Earpiece or Speaker, sounds may be difficult to hear. Sand getting into the handset's hinge can cause problems such as overheating.

INSTALLING THE SIM CARD AND BATTERY


Your wireless device comes with a SIM card installed which along with a Global Feature on your account, enables you to make calls and access email in GSM Networks while traveling overseas.

Should your SIM card be lost or damaged, please follow these instructions for the installation of your new SIM.

- 1. Slide the SIM card into the slot in the direction of the arrow shown in the figure.
 - To remove the SIM card, pull out the SIM card in the opposite direction of the arrow.



- Slide the battery into the slot by aligning the contacts (1) and press down until you hear "click (2)."





Press down firmly on the side of the battery cover at each arrow points, as shown in the figure.



Slide the battery cover latch to the LOCK position in the direction of the arrow shown in the figure.




CHARGING THE BATTERY

- 1. Connect the USB data cable into the cableless wall adapter.
- 2. Plug the USB data cable into the phone's charging/data jack and the wall adapter end into an electrical outlet.



If the battery connector is not properly aligned, damage could occur to the charging connector and the phone may not be charged.





REMOVING THE BATTERY

1. Slide the battery cover latch to the FREE position in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.



2. Insert your finger in the groove and pull up the battery cover in the direction of the arrow.



3. Remove the battery by pulling the tab up.





• When you charge the battery with the handset powered off, you will see a charging status screen. After charging is completed, the Charge Complete message appears and you cannot operate the phone until it is powered on. To turn your phone on, press and hold the Power Key until your display turns on.



- It is more efficient to charge the battery with the handset powered off.
- · Battery operating time gradually decreases over time.
- If the battery fails to perform normally, you may need to replace the battery.

BATTERY HANDLING INFORMATION

DO'S

- · Only use the battery and charger approved for use with the C781.
- Only use the battery for the system for which it is specified.
- · Only use or replace the battery with a charging system or another battery that has been qualified with the system per this standard, IEEE-Std-1725-2006. Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.
- . Only use the battery for its original purpose. As an improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Try to keep batteries in a temperature between 41°F (5°C) and 95°F (35°C). If the battery is stored in temperatures above or below the recommended range, give it time to warm up or cool down before using.
- · Store the discharged battery in a cool, dark, and dry place.
- Purchase a new battery when its operating time gradually decreases after fully charging.
- · Properly and promptly dispose of the battery according to local laws.
- · Battery usage by children should be supervised.



DON'TS

- Don't attempt to disassemble or open the battery it is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts.
- · Don't crush, bend or deform, puncture or shred the battery.
- Don't drop the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- · Don't leave the battery in extremely hot or cold temperatures. Otherwise, it could significantly reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- · Don't modify or remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Don't accidentally short-circuit the battery by carrying it in your pocket or purse with other metallic objects such as coins, clips and pens. This may critically damage the battery.
- · Don't short-circuit a battery or allow metallic conductive objects to contact battery terminals.
- · Don't dispose of the battery by placing into a fire.

USING A MEMORY CARD

The C781 supports the use of a microSD™ memory card as a source of external memory.

USING A MICROSD™ CARD

By using a microSDTM card, you can store sounds, videos, images, photos, music, and other files

USING A MICRO SD™ CARD (OPTIONAL)

- Open the microSD™ card cover, and insert the microSD[™] card into the slot with the gold contacts facing up.
- Press the microSD™ card into the slot until you hear the "click", then close the microSD™ card cover
- 3. "SET MEMORY CARD AS DEFAULT STORAGE LOCATION?" will appear on the display.




To prevent possible damages, please keep the microSD™ card slot closed at all times regardless of whether a microSD™ card is inserted or not.

REMOVING A MICROSD™ CARD

- 1. Open the microSD™ card cover, and use your thumb to press and release the microSD™ card.
- 2. Press the memory card inward, gently, until it pops out.
- Remove the microSD™ card and close the microSD™ card cover.







To ensure the proper function of removable memory, please use a microSD™ card.

CONNECTING TO THE HAEDSET

You can connect a compatible device equipped with a standard 2.5mm plug to your handset for safe, convenient, hands-free conversations.

- 1. To open the headset jack cover, insert your fingertip into the notch and open the cover.
- 2. Plug the connector into the headset iack.



- · Do not forcibly insert/remove the connector into/from the headset jack. Carefully insert/ remove it.
- · Failure to completely reseal the headset jack cover after use may result in damage if the handset is exposed to water.

TURNING THE PHONE ON AND OFF

TURNING ON

- 1. Press and hold the END/PWR Key a until the phone display turns on.
- 2. Enter your 4-digit lock code if the phone is locked.



TURNING OFF

1. Press and hold the END/PWR Key suntil the phone display turns off.



• Immediately change or recharge the battery when BATTERY LOW appears on the display.

Memory may possibly be damaged if the phone turns off due to the battery completely draining.

• Turn the phone off before removing or replacing the battery. If the phone is on, unsaved data may be lost.

MENU ACCESS

Your phone can be customized via the menu. Each function can be accessed by scrolling with the Directional Key or by pressing the number that corresponds with the menu item

- 1. To access the menu, press the OK key [MENU].
- 2. To scroll through the menu, press the Directional key (a) up, down, left or right.
- 3. To return to the previous page, press the CLR key [CLRO].
- 4. To exit the current menu, press the END/PWR Key 🐨.
- 5. To access the messaging menu, press the Left Soft Key [Message].
- 6. To access the contact list, press the Right Soft key \(\subseteq \left[Contacts \right].
- All directions in this manual are based on the list and communicator menu layout and the world display theme. If you have changed the settings, the directions may vary.

MAKING A CALL

BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

- 1. First, gently open the folding cover of the phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number including the area code if needed and press the SEND Key <u></u> .
- 3. To end the all, press the END Key ▼ 3.

When you place or receive a call from phone numbers stored in your Contact List, the name will be displayed.

USING THE SPEED DIALING FUNCTION

- 1. If the speed dial is set, press the speed dial number you wish to connect to, and hold the last digit number you have assigned for the speed dial. "Speed Dial" message appears, and your call is connecting to the contact.
- 2. To end the all, press the END Key 💿.

USING THE CONTACT LIST

- 1. Press the Right Soft Key **\□** [Contacts].
- 2. Select the contact and press the SEND Key
- 3. To end the call, press the END Key ▼.

ABOUT PUSH TO TALK

Push to Talk calls may only be made with other Verizon Wireless Push to Talk subscribers, and only from the National Enhanced Services Rate and Coverage Area. A Push to Talk call is terminated by pressing the End/Power Key or will automatically time out after 10 seconds of inactivity. While you are on a Push to Talk call, voice calls received will go directly to Voice Mail. When you are on a voice call, you cannot receive a Push to Talk call. You cannot prevent others who have your wireless phone number from entering you into their Push to Talk Contact List, Only one person can speak at a time during Push to Talk calls. When using your phone keypad to make a Push to Talk call, you must enter the 10-digit phone number of the called party. Your Push to Talk service cannot be used for any applications that tether your phone to computers or other devices for any purpose. Push to Talk-capable phone and Calling Plan required. If you wish to switch from a Push to Talk Calling Plan to another Calling Plan, you must first stop using your Push to Talk-capable phone and purchase or provide another compatible phone.

USING A PUSH TO TALK (PTT) ALERT

The Push To Talk (PTT) feature allows you to use your phone like a walkie-Talkie to communicate with Verizon Wireless PTT subscribes

An alert call is a call to notify a called party that the calling party wants to talk using a tone. The called party has option to answer or ignore the call.

BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

1. Enter the phone number including the area code if needed and press the Left Soft Kev [Alert].

"Press PTT Key To Alert" message appears on your main display screen.

The Left Soft Key [Alert] is not available when PTT Mode is set to Off.

2. Press the PTT Key good on your left hand side of the phone to alert.

3. Keep pressing the PTT Key while talking and then release the PTT Key Esser.

Release the PTT Key **E** to let the other party talk.

USING THE SPEED DIALING FUNCTION

- 1. If the speed dial is set, press the speed dial number you wish to connect to. "Assisted dialing On" message appears.
- 2. Press the PTT Key good on your left hand side of the phone to alert.
- 3. Keep pressing the PTT Key while talking and then release the PTT Key Esser.

You can hear the response while the PTT Key zees is released.

USING THE CONTACT LIST

- 1. Press the Right Soft Key ☐ [Contacts].
- 2. Select the contact and press the Left Soft Key [7] [Alert]. "Press PTT Key To Alert" message appears on your main display screen.
- 3. Keep pressing the PTT Key while talking and then release the

USING A PUSH TO TALK (PTT) BARGE

A barge call automatically connects to the other party. The called party does not have the option to ignore the call.

BY DIALING THE PHONE NUMBER

- 1. Enter the phone number including the area code if needed.
- 2. Press and hold the PTT Key good on your left hand side of the phone.

- 3. Wait until the "OK to Talk' tone sounds and the message "Talking to" appears on
- 4. Release the PTT Key **ESSET** to let the other party talk.
- 5. Press the END Key to end the call.

LISING THE SPEED DIALING FUNCTION

- 1. If the speed dial is set, press the speed dial number you wish to connect to. "Assisted dialing On" message appears.
- 2. Press and hold the PTT Key and on your left hand side of the phone.
- 3. Wait until the "OK to Talk" tone sounds and the message "Talking to" appears on the display. Speak while pressing down PTT Key
- 4. Release the PTT Key zees to let the other party talk.
- For information about using the speed dial, see page 63.

USING THE CONTACT LIST

- 1. From the idle mode, press the PTT Key **great** to access your PTT contact List.
- 2. Press and hold the PTT Key gray on your left hand side of the phone.
- 3. Wait until the "OK to Talk" tone sounds and the message "Talking to" appears on the display. Speak while pressing down PTT Key
- 4. Release the PTT Key zees to let the other party talk.
- 5. Press the END Key to end the call.
- The phone number you are trying to alert must be saved in the PPT Contact List.

ANSWERING CALLS

- 1. Press the SEND Key to answer the incoming call.
- Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any key.
- 2. To ignore incoming calls, press the Right Soft Key \(\subseteq [Ignore].

ANSWERING PTT CALLS

INCOMING A BARGE CALL

When you receive a barge call, you will hear the calling party speaking through the speakerphone. The calling party's phone number will appear on your display. If the calling party's number has already been registered in your PTT Contact List, the contact name will replace the phone number on the display.

- 1. Press and hold the PTT Key great to talk.
- 2. Release the PTT Key zees to let the other party talk.
- 3. Press the End Key \ To end the call.

INCOMING AN ALERT CALL

When you receive an alert, you will hear the "PTT Alert" tone. The message "Incoming Alert" will be displayed with the phone number or contact name of the calling party. The PTT Alert tone repeats every 1 second until you answer or ignore the call. If you do not answer an incoming alert within 10 seconds, the PTT call will be automatically disconnected

- 1. Answer or ignore the alert. To answer the alert, press and hold the PTT Key and begin talking. To ignore the alert, press the Right Soft Key \= [Ignore].
- 2. Release the PTT Key **ESSES** to let the other party talk.
- 3. Press the End Key \ To end the call.

ENDING A CALL

1. Press the END/PWR Key ☑ ...

MISSED CALL NOTIFICATION

When an incoming call is not answered, the missed call notification appears on the display.

DISPLAY THE MISSED CALL FROM THE NOTIFICATION

- 1. Select View Now and press the OK Key.
- 2. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key

DISPLAY A MISSED CALL FROM IDLE MODE

- 1. Press the OK Key [MENU], select Recent Calls and press the OK Key.
- 2. Select Missed and press the OK Kev.
- 3. Select the missed call and press the OK Key [OPEN].
- 4. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key

WAIT/PAUSE

Pauses are used for automated systems (i.e., voice mail or calling cards). The numbers entered after the pause will automatically be dialed after the pause. It is useful for dialing into systems that require a code.

WAIT

The phone stops dialing until you press the SEND Key ____ to dial the next number.

- 1. Enter the phone number.
- 2. Press the Right Soft Key T [Options].
- 3. Select and select Add Wait and press the OK Key.
- 4. Enter additional number(s).
- 5. Press the SEND Key ___ to dial.

2-SEC PAUSE

The phone waits 2 seconds before sending the next digits automatically.

- 1. Enter the phone number.
- 2. Press the Right Soft Key T [Options].
- 3. Select Add 2-Sec Pause and press the OK Key.
- 4. Enter additional number(s) (pin number or credit card number).
- 5. Press the SEND Key ___ to dial.

MAKING AN INTERNATIONAL CALL

- 1. Press and hold the Shift Key ¥₃₺.
 - The "+" symbol, required for international calls appears.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code, and phone number.
- 3. Press SEND Key ___ to make a call.
- When Assisted Dialing is set to On, the inputted phone numbers may change to the wrong number by the auto-correct function.

3 WAY CALLING

You can talk to two participants at the same time. During the call, the normal airtime rates will be applied for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter the phone number and press the SEND Key
- 2. When you have connected, enter the second phone number to call and press the SEND Key (77).
- When you're connected to the second party, press the SEND Key again to begin your 3-Way call.
- If one of the participants hangs up during the call, you and the remaining participant stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first one to hang up, all three calls are disconnected.

CALL WAITING

If you are on a call and you receive another incoming call, you will hear one beep and the caller's phone number will appear on the display. With Call Waiting, you may put the active call on hold while you answer the other incoming call.

 Press the SEND Key to answer the other call. The first call will automatically be placed on hold. To switch back, press the SEND Key again.

VOLUME QUICK ADJUSTMENT

ADJUSTING THE MASTER VOLUME

CALLER ID

Caller ID displays the name and the phone number of the person calling. If the caller's information is not stored in your contact list, only the phone number is displayed.

Vibrate mode mutes the tones and activates an alert for an incoming call or message.

- 2. To deactivate, press and hold the Vibrate Mode Key *** again.

MUTE FUNCTION

If you activate the mute function while you are talking on the phone, the person you are speaking with cannot hear any sounds from you but, you are still able to hear them. To activate mute function:

SPEAKERPHONE

The Speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone.

If you activate the speakerphone when you are not on a call, it will deactivate automatically after one minute.

Your phone provides you of the flashlight function. To activate the flashlight:



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

The 911 call does not appear in the recent calls list.

MOTION DETECTION

Using the Motion Detection function, you can control your handset just by shaking it.

By default, the Motion Detection function is set to OFF. To use the Motion Detection function:

ANTENNA SAFETY

FI FCTRONIC DEVICES

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals. Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF energy. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Therefore, use of your phone must be restricted in certain situations.

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6") inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. Persons with pacemakers:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than six inches from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.

HEARING AIDS

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider (or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives).

OTHER MEDICAL DEVICES

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna. the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.995 W/Kg and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.12 W/Kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements). While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

WHAT IS HEARING AID COMPATIBILITY?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an "M" rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a "T" rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the telecoil mode thus reducing unwanted background noise.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHICH WIRELESS PHONES ARE HEARING AID COMPATIBLE?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box.

A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) if it has an "M3" or "M4" rating.



A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (telecoil mode) if it has a "T3" or "T4" rating.

HOW WILL I KNOW IF MY HEARING AID WILL WORK WITH A PARTICULAR DIGITAL WIRE FSS PHONE?

You'll want to try a number of wireless phones so that you can decide which works the best with your hearing aids. You may also want to talk with your hearing aid professional about the extent to which your hearing aids are immune to interference, if they have wireless phone shielding, and whether your hearing aid has a HAC rating.

U.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION - CENTER FOR DEVICES AND RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH CONSUMER UPDATE ON WIRELESS PHONES

1. Do wireless phones pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless phones. There is no proof, however, that wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phones emit low levels of radiofrequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in the idle mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

2. What is FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless phones before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones are shown to emit radiofrequency energy (RF) at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace or recall the phones so that the hazard no longer exists. Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, FDA has urged the wireless phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless phones;
- Design wireless phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function;

and

 Cooperate in providing users of wireless phones with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless phone use on human health.

FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:

- National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- Environmental Protection Agency
- Federal Communications Commission
- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- National Telecommunications and Information Administration

The National Institutes of Health participates in some inter-agency working group activities, as well. FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. FCC relies on FDA and other health agencies for safety guestions about wireless phones. FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

3. What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term "wireless phone" refers here to hand-held wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called "cell," "mobile," or "PCS" phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable radiofrequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head.

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These RF exposures are limited by Federal Communications Commission safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user. the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless phones." which have a base unit connected to the telephone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures far below the FCC safety limits.

4. What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures characteristic of wireless phones have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be predisposed to develop cancer in the absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health. Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neu-roma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless phone RF exposures.

However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of phone use in these studies was around three years.

5. What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless phones poses a health risk?

A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually using wireless phones would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but 10 or more years' follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing agent and the time tumors develop - if they do -may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the phone is held, or which model of phone is used.

6. What is FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless phone RF?

FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization International Electromagnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world.

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The Project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues. FDA and the Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association (CTIA) have a formal Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) to do research on wireless phone safety. FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts to independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

7. How can I find out how much radiofrequency energy exposure I can get by using my wireless phone?

All phones sold in the United States must comply with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) guidelines that limit radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures. FCC established these guidelines in consultation with FDA and the other federal health and safety agencies. The FCC limit for RF exposure from wireless telephones is set at a Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC limit is consistent with the safety standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (IEEE) and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement. The exposure limit takes into consideration the body's ability to remove heat from the tissues that absorb energy from the wireless phone and is set well below levels known to have effects. Manufacturers of wireless phones must report the RF exposure level for each model of phone to the FCC. The FCC website (http://www.fda.gov (under "c" in the subject index, select Cell Phones > Research)) gives directions for locating the FCC identification number on your phone so you can find your phone's RF exposure level in the online listing.

8. What has FDA done to measure the radiofrequency energy coming from wireless phones?

The Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) is developing a technical standard for measuring the radiofrequency energy (RF) exposure from wireless phones and other wireless handsets with the participation and leadership of FDA scientists and engineers. The standard, "Recommended Practice for Determining the Spatial-Peak Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) in the Human Body Due to Wireless Communications Devices: Experimental Techniques," sets forth the first consistent test methodology for measuring the rate at which RF is deposited in the heads of wireless phone users. The test method uses a tissue-simulating model of the human head. Standardized SAR test methodology is expected to greatly improve the consistency of measurements made at different laboratories on the same phone. SAR is the measurement of the amount of energy absorbed in tissue, either by the whole body or a small part of the body. It is measured in watts/kg (or milliwatts/g) of matter. This measurement is used to determine whether a wireless phone complies with safety quidelines.

9. What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radiofrequency energy from my wireless phone?

If there is a risk from these products—and at this point we do not know that there is —it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce RF exposure.

If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you
could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the
exposure level drops off dramatically with distance.

For example, you could use a headset and carry the wireless phone away from your body or use a wireless phone connected to a remote antenna. Again, the scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone use.

10. What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless phones, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF), the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using wireless phones. Reducing the time of wireless phone use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure. Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists

11. What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

Radiofrequency energy (RF) from wireless phones can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephones.

This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was

completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless phone EMI. FDA has tested hearing aids for interference from handheld wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that that no interference occurs when a person uses a "compatible" phone and a "compatible" hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000. FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

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Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cellular telephones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and other potential hearing problems varies.

The amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device, the device settings and the headphones. You should follow some commonsense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before your hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.

 Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.
