Important Safety Information

Safety information

The following list shows how to maintain your mobile phone, together with precautions to take.

- Keep your mobile phone and its accessories out of the reach of children and pets.
- Maintain your mobile phone in dry conditions and keep it within normal operating temperatures. It may be damaged at temperatures higher than 55°C/131°F or lower than -20°C/-4°F.
- Do not dry your phone in a microwave oven. Otherwise, sparks can occur and cause an explosion or fire.
- · Do not use or store your mobile phone in dusty, dirty areas.
- Do not disassemble your mobile phone.
- Do not drop or cause severe impact to your mobile phone.
- Do not clean your mobile phone with chemical products, cleaning solvents or detergents.
- Contact your dealer immediately if your mobile phone does not work properly.
- Use only authorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories.
 Any malfunction or damage caused by the use of unauthorized batteries, battery chargers and accessories will void the limited product warranty.
- Ensure that the battery and the battery charger do not come in contact with conductive objects.
- For optimal performance, use cases and accessories that do not contain magnets in close proximity.

Safety precautions

Using a mobile phone while driving is prohibited.

- Using a mobile phone while driving can distract your attention and cause an accident. Always switch your phone off to drive safely.
- In an emergency, use a hands-free device built into your car, or pull it over in a safe place first.
- Please check local laws and regulations and comply with them, with regard to the prohibition of mobile phone use while driving.

Switch off in restricted areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where mobile phone use is restricted.

Switch off in an aircraft

Always switch your phone off or select the airplane mode (Tap All Programs > Settings > Wireless & networks > Airplane mode) when you are in an aircraft. Electromagnetic waves emitted by your phone may affect the electronic navigation equipment in the aircraft.

Switch off in hospitals and near medical equipment

Always switch your phone off in hospitals and obey their regulations. Switch your phone off when using medical equipment for private purposes, if possible. Always consult with the medical equipment's manufacturer or an expert regarding phone use near the medical equipment.

Switch off in dangerous areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where explosive or dangerous materials (e.g. fuels or chemical products) are located and obey relevant instructions or signals. Do not insert or remove your mobile phone's battery in such areas.

Install a hands-free device in a safe location

Install a hands-free device away from the steering wheel and airbag expansion areas. Otherwise you can be injured in a car accident.

Keep away from other electronic devices

Mobile phones emit electromagnetic waves that may affect nearby electronic devices. After switching on your phone, do not place it close to other electronic goods.

About the battery usage

Your phone is powered by a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. In other words, unlike other forms of batteries, you can recharge your battery while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect" inherent in those technologies.

- Do not use a damaged battery or a charger.
- Do not disassemble or open crush, bend or deform, puncture or shred it
- Do not modify or remanufacture, insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Do not put your battery into contact with conductive objects.
- Dispose of and recycle used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Do not dispose of batteries by burning; they may explode.

- Do not use an unauthorized charger.
- Only use the battery for the device for which it is specified.
- Only use the battery with a charging device that has been qualified with the device per this standard. Use of an unqualified battery or a charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.

- The battery recharging time varies depending on the remaining battery capacity and the battery and charger type.
- · Battery life inevitably shortens over time.

- Since overcharging may shorten battery life, remove the phone from its charger once it is fully charged. Unplug the charger once charging is complete. Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, especially inside a car in summer or winter, may reduce its capacity and life. Always keep the battery within normal operating temperatures.

 To prevent injury or burns, ensure that no metal objects come into contact with the + and – terminals of the battery.

FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their boxes or a label located on the boxes.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

 M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together. A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.



In the above example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless phone meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equals M5. This is synonymous for T ratings. This should provide the hearing aid user with "normal usage" while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. "Normal usage" in this context is defined as a signal quality that is acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and WLAN components must be disabled during a call. See page 79 for instructions to disable these components.

FCC Regulatory Compliance

Basic instructions

To understand information contained in this user guide, please keep in mind the followings:

 It is assumed that you start operating your mobile device from the All Programs screen. You can flick the screen to find the application you want to use.



- ① Note If you start from the home screen, tap the menu button first and follow the suggested steps.
- Words in bold fonts refer to the action in the handset. For example, "Tap Add to contacts" for the screen below means that you have to tap



- ① Note Words in capital letters refer to hard keys of the handset. For example, LOCK/PWR indicates the physical key on the top right of the handset.
- The symbol ">" refers to the next action. For example, "Settings > Language & keyboard" means that you should tap Settings first and Language & keyboard next.

Setting up Google account

You need to have an account of Google to enjoy a few applications of the handset. The window for creating or registering a Google account appears instantly when you try to run applications that require a Google account. If you have no Google account, you can create one at your handset.

- 1. Tap Next.
- 2. Tap Create if you don't have a Google account.
- 3. Tap Sign-in if you have a Google account.
- 4. Enter necessary information.

Installing the SIM/USIM card

 Press and hold the latch and slide it to remove the battery cover from the device.



Insert the SIM/USIM card into the slot. The gold contacts of the card should go against the metal contacts of the phone.

About the SIM/USIM card

When you subscribe to your network operator, you receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card or Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card containing your registration information, PIN code, etc. Like a credit card, it should be kept secure and handled carefully. Do not bend, scratch or expose it to moisture. Avoid static electricity.

Inserting the battery

1.	Put the connector of the battery into
	the hole located at the top of the unit
	and then insert and press the lower side of the battery.

2. Put the cover back to the handset.



About the battery

Your phone uses a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. Make sure to use an authorized battery and a charger only. For more details, inquire at your nearest dealer.

① Note The Li-lon battery can be recharged while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect" inherent in those technologies.

Charging the battery

1. Open the protective cover on the right side and connect the charger adapter.



- ① Note Make sure to align the connector as indicated in the image. Otherwise, the charging connector will be damaged and the battery won't be charged.
- 2. Disconnect the charger from the device when the battery is fully charged.



Turning the phone on/off

To turn on,

Press and hold Lock/PWR.

To turn off,

Press and hold Lock/PWR and tap Power off.

Gripping the phone

In order to make calls with no problems, hold the device in the right position as indicated below:



① **Note** Using metal accessories (stickers) on the phone, or holding the device by the internal antenna area while changing data and talking on the phone might affect the quality of all calls.

Unlocking the screen


When you turn on the mobile device, the screen is locked by default. To unlock the screen:

- Press LOCK/PWR.

Using the touch screen

You can select items and perform functions with the touch screen of your phone. The following finger actions help you easily understand how to use the touch screen.

Tap: Tap once to select or access a menu or an option.

Long tap: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to view detailed information.

Double tap: Tap the same item twice.

Drag: Tap and hold your finger on an item and move it without losing contact with the screen.

Flick: Tap and drag your finger on an item to select and move it, then lift your finger to drop the item into place.

△ CAUTION

- Do not use sharp tools that can scratch the touch screen.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water or chemicals. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or in chemicals.
- Do not sit on your phone. The touch screen can be damaged.

Customizing the home screen

Home screen is the starting point to use applications on your device. You can customize the home screen for your preferences.

Navigating the home screen

P8000 has seven different screens that provide quick access to menus.

- 1. Drag the screen from the left to the right or vice versa.
- 2. Tap a desired application to run.

Adding a shortcut

- 1. Long tap on the empty space of the screen for a few seconds.
- 2. Select an item to place on the home screen.
- 3. Select a home screen to place the shortcut



① *Note* You can make a shortcut of an application by long pressing an application in All Programs.

Creating a wallpaper

- 1. Press the menu key in the idle mode.
- 2. Select a picture from your Gallery, Live wallpapers or Wallpaper gallery.



Deleting a shortcut or widget

- 1. Press a shortcut or widget you want to delete.
- 2. Drag it to the trash box on the bottom of the screen.



Setting Notifications


You can check or set notifications for your mobile device.

Calling

Making a call

- 1. Tap 📞
- 2. Enter the area code and the phone number.
- 3. Tap 📞

Answering and ending a call

- 1. Drag Accept to the right to answer the call.
- 2. Tap **End** to finish the call. After ending a call, its summary is displayed.





① Note When the screen of your phone is on, tap Accept to answer the call.

Tap End to reject the call.

Rejecting a call

- 1. Tap Reject.
- 2. Send a message to the caller if necessary.

Making a multiparty call

- 1. Tap **Hold** during a call.
- 2. The second party can hear a waiting sound.
- 3. Tap **Swap** to change the party.



Making a conference call

- 1. Tap 📞.
- 2. Enter the area code and the phone number
- 3. Tap so to invite a third party to the call.



Making a speed dial call

You can make a speed dial call by designating numbers from 2 to 9.

- 1. Tap 📞 .
- 2. Tap the number 2. A call is made to the number that is designated as 2.
- ① Note The number 1 is designated as the voice mail by default.

Making a voice mail

You can make a voice mail by designating the number 1 for the call.

- 1. Tap 📞 .
- 2. Long tap the number 1.
- ① *Note* The screen moves to the voice mail number edit if the number has not been designated for the voice mail.

Making a call from the Address Book

You can make a call to the contact in the address book.

- 1. Enter a telephone number. Contacts that start with the first three numbers are displayed on the screen.
- 2. Select a contact to call.
- 3. Tap a contact >
- ① *Note* The address book list disappears if there is no contact that matches with the entered number.

Saving a new contact

You can save a new contact while entering a telephone number.

- 1. Enter a telephone number.
- 2. Press the menu key.

- 3. Tap +Add to contacts > +Create new contact.
- 4. Enter necessary information of the contact and tap Done.

Making an emergency call

- 1. Long tap SOS to unlock the phone.
- 2. Tap 911 or other numbers for emergency calls.

Missed calls

You can check calls that you have missed in the idle mode.

- 1. Tap to see the list of missed calls.
- 2. Select a number to call back.
- 3. Tap

Talking through the speaker

- 1. Tap **Speaker** during a call. Speaker turns green when the function is on
- 2. Tap **Speaker** after ending a call.
- ① **Note** If the headset is connected to the device, the speaker is not operated.

Talking through the Bluetooth

- Tap a theme among User theme, Communication, Travel, Work or Free Time.
- 3. Tap Done.

Setting Bluetooth

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth settings** to manage the wireless technology option. Refer to the page 41 for more information.

Setting VPN settings

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings > Add VPN.
- Tap among Add PPTP VPN, Add L2TP VPN, Add L2TP/IPSec PSK VPN or Add L2TP/IPSec CRT VPN

Setting mobile networks

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- 2. Tap **Data roaming** to connect to data services when roaming.
- ① Note You may incur significant charge when roaming.
- 3. Tap Use only 2G networks. You can save battery.

Call settings

Managing fixed dialing numbers

- Tap Settings > Personalize > Call settings > Fixed Dialing numbers.
- 2. Tap among Enable FDN, Change PIN2 or FDN list.

Setting the voicemail

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Call settings > Voicemail settings.
- 2. Enter the voicemail number or tap <u>a</u> and select a contact to designate as the voicemail recipient.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting TTY mode

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Call settings > TTY mode.
- 2. Tap among TTY Off, TTY Full, TTY HCO or TTY VCO.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Sound & display

Setting silent mode

 other sound except the media volume alarms are silenced if you
 select this option.
- 2. Tap Silent mode again to activate other functions.

Setting phone ringtone

- 3. Tap **OK**.

Adjusting the media volume

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Sound & display > Media volume.
- 2. Drag ento the right or left.

Setting orientation

1. Tap Settings > Sound & display > Orientation.

Setting brightness

Setting my location

Setting screen lock with a pattern lock

Setting screen lock with a password

- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set screen lock > Password lock.
- 2. Enter numbers as a password.
- 3. Enter the numbers again to confirm the password.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Setting SIM card lock

- 1. Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up SIM card lock.
- 2. Tap **Lock SIM card** and enter the SIM PIN if you want to require PIN to use the phone.

① Note You can re-assign a shortcut for an application.

Viewing services and applications that are active

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Running services.
- 2. Tap a service or an application to stop its operation or to manage its option.

Debugging USB

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 2. Tap **USB debugging** if you want to allow the debug mode when USB is connected.
- 3. Tap **OK** on the page about USB debugging.

Maintaining the staying condition

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- Tap Stay awake if you want to keep your phone awake while it is being charged.

Accounts & sync

Managing the background data

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap **Background data** if you want to sync, send and receive data at any time.
- Tap Add account on the bottom of the screen if you want to add an account.

Allowing background data to sync automatically

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap **Auto-sync** if you want to sync data automatically.

Privacy

Setting privacy information

- 1. Tap **Settings** > **Privacy**.
- 2. Tap **Use My Location** if you allow Google's search results and other services to use my location.

Backing up settings

- 1. Tap Settings > Privacy.
- 2 Tap Back up my settings if you want to back up your settings.

Resetting the phone

- 1. Tap **Settings** > **Privacy**.
- 2. Tap **Factory data reset** if you want to erase all the data of the phone.
- 3. Tap Reset phone.

SD card & phone storage

Viewing the status of storage

 Tap Settings > SD card & phone storage. You can view the total space and available space for the SD card.

- 2. Tap **Unmount SD card** if you want to unmount the SD card from your phone safely.
- ① *Note* You should unmount the SD card from the phone and install on the phone after you tap **Unmount SD card**.

Search

Receiving suggestions from Google

- 1. Tap Settings > Search > Google search settings.
- 2. Tap **Show web suggestions** if you allow suggestions from Google to be displayed.
- 3. Tap Search history if you allow search history to be displayed.
- ① **Note** You should have a Google account to show the search history. For details on the settings, refer to the page 8.

Setting quick search box

- 1. Tap Settings > Search > Google search settings.
- 2. Tap Searchable items.
- 3. Select an item or items that will be included for search.
- 4. Tap Clear search shortcuts if you want to clear shortcuts to recently chosen search results.

Language & keyboard

Setting the language option

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select locale.
- 2. Tap a language to use for the device.
- 3. Press the home key to finish setting the option.

Setting Swype



To update software

You can update your software without visiting the nearest dealer.

- 1. Tap Settings > Software Update.
- 2. Tap Check for Update > Yes to check whether you need to update the software.
- Note After downloading the software, the device will ask you whether to update the software now. If you choose to update the software now, it will restart the handset. If you postpone updating the software, you can select between 30 minutes, 1 hour or 4 hours in Options. After selecting the updating time, you will be sent back to standby mode. If you go to Software Update while you postpone the process, tap Continue Update.

To view the version of software

- 1. Tap Settings > About phone.
- 2. Scroll down to see the version of software.

Troubleshooting checklist

When audio quality is poor: End a call and try again.

When the other party cannot hear you speaking:

Your phone may be set to MUTE. Disable the MUTE function. Or your hand may be covering the microphone.

When battery lifetime is shorter than usual:

This may happen when you are in an area with low signal strength. Turn off your phone when it is not in use. Change the battery when battery energy is exhausted.

When you can not turn on your phone:

Make sure your battery is charged. Check to see if your phone works while recharging the battery.

When you are unable to send a message:

Either you are not registered to receive an SMS service, or you may be in an area where your network service provider cannot provide such a service.

When you are unable to make a call:

Your phone may be set to "fixed dial." Cancel the "fixed dial" function.

When you are unable to charge the battery:

This may be the result of one of the following three cases.

- 1. Your charger may be out of order. Contact your nearest dealer.
- 2. You may be attempting to use the phone in an overly hot/cold temperature. Try changing the charging environment.
- 3. Your battery may have not been connected to the charger properly. Check the connector.

When you are unable to input data into your Address Book:

Your Address Book memory may be full. Delete some entries from your Address Book.

When you are unable to select a certain function:

You may not have subscribed to that function, or your network service provider may be in an area where such service cannot be provided. Contact your local service provider.
