BEFORE USING

■ BATTERY INSTALLATION

As shown in the picture below, put the mold locators of the battery into the holes located in the bottom of the unit.

• Insert the mold locator of the battery into the hole located in the bottom of the unit.



2 Press the battery cover case until the sound of a 'click' is heard.





If the battery is not correctly placed in the compartment, the handset will not turn on and / or the battery may detach during use.

BATTERY USAGE

■ BATTERY CHARGING

POWER CONNECTION

- Plug the AC Charger into a standard outlet.
- 2 Plug the other end of the AC Charger into the bottom of your phone. The battery must be installed on to the phone.



BATTERY USAGE



When you charge the battery with the phone power off, you will see a charging status screen. You cannot operate the phone until it is powered on.

BEFORE USING

- The battery is not charged at the time of purchase.
- Fully charge the battery before use.
- It is more efficient to charge the battery with the handset powered off.
- The battery must be connected to the phone in order to charge it.
- Battery operating time gradually decreases over time.
- If the battery fails to perform normally, you may need to replace the battery.

BATTERY LIFE (FOR NEW BATTERY)

The operating time is subject to your handset usage and configuration. (SLOT CYCLE=2)

BEFORE USING BATTERY HANDLING INFORMATION

■ DO's

- Only use the battery and charger approved by the manufac turer
- Only use the battery for its original purpose.
- Try to keep batteries in a temperature between 41°F (5°C) and 95°F (35°C).
- If the battery is stored in temperatures above or below the recommended range, give it time to warm up or cool down before using.
- Completely drain the battery before recharging. It may take one to four days to completely drain.
- Store the discharged battery in a cool, dark, and dry place.
- Purchase a new battery when its operating time gradually decreases after fully charging.
- Properly dispose of the battery according to local laws.

■ DON'Ts

- Don't attempt to disassemble the battery it is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts.
- Don't accidentally short circuit the battery by carrying it in your pocket or purse with other metallic objects such as coins, clips and pens. This may critically damage the battery.
- Don't leave the battery in hot or cold temps.
 Otherwise, it could significantly reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- Don't dispose of the battery into a fire.

1 Press and hold $\mathring{\epsilon}$, until Logo appears and the tone sounds.



- To select a logo, refer to page 97 for more details. (Display > Wallpaper) for more detail.
- If your cellular telephone is locked when "Password" appears on the display, enter your 4-digit password to unlock your cellular celephone.
- The default password is the last 4 digits of your phone number.

■ TURNING THE PHONE OFF

Press and hold
 nutil your Logo appears.



- Immediately change or recharge the battery when "Low Battery! Phone is turning off" appears on the display.
 Memory may possibly be damaged if the phone turns off due to the battery completely draining.
- Turn the phone off before removing or replacing the bat tery. If the phone is on, unsaved data may be lost.

ACCESSING THE MENU

BASIC OPERATION

Your phone can be customized via the menu. Each function can be accessed by scrolling with the Navigation key or by pressing the number that corresponds with the menu item.

- 1 To access the menu in the idle mode, press / [MENU].
 - To search through the menu in numerical order, press down.
- 2 Use the Navigation key to scroll through the menu.
- To return to the previous page, press \(\). To exit the current menu and return to the idle mode, press \(\bar{\epsilon} \).
- Press the Navigation key to enter a function when its main page is displayed or press its assigned number to have direct access to the function.

■ MAKING A CALL

1 Enter a phone number.



To modify the phone number you have entered:

• To erase one digit at a time press .



• To erase the entire number, press and hold \ \ .



The indicator, appears on the display.



- If you activate the "AUTO REDIAL" function, the phone will automatically redial for the activate the second s will automatically redial for the number of times you have selected. (Refer to page 57).
 - When you place or receive a call from stored phone numbers, both the name and phone number will be displayed.
- 3 To end a call, press 💰 .

■ PAUSE FEATURE

Pauses are used for automated systems (i.e., voice mail, calling cards). Insert a pause after a phone number then enter another group of numbers. The second set of numbers is dialed automatically after the pause. This feature is useful for dialing into systems that require a code.











BASIC FUNCTIONS

- To insert a pause, enter a phone number then press / [MENU]. Select either a Hard Pause or a Timed Pause .
- 2 Press > to dial the number and 0 K to store the number.

■ ANSWERING A CALL

BODY-WORN OPERATION

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 1.5 cm. from the body. To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure requirements, use only belt-clips, holsters or similar accessories that maintain a 1.5cm, separation distance between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna. The use of belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories should not contain metallic components in its assembly. The use of accessories that do not satisfy these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, and should be avoided.

SAFETY AND WARRANTY

THIS MODEL PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. * Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

SAR INFORMATION

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.796 W/Kg and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.723 W/Kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements). While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmentrequirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. * In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a sub-stantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations inmeasurements.

PRECAUTIONS WHEN USING BATTERIES

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power; talk and standby time are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Battery charging time depends on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The bat tery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk time and standby time) is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Use only Pantech-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Pantech approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.

PRECAUTIONS WHEN USING BATTERIES

- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions or you will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below 0 °C (32 °F).
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regula tions. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use the phone with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the phone.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas, as its moving parts may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.
- Do not paint the phone. Paint can clog the device's moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Do not put the phone in or on heating devices, such as a microwave oven, stove, or radiator. The phone may explode when overheated.
- If the phone, battery, charger, or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for service.

TROUBLESHOOTING

To save the time and expense of an unnecessary service call, perform the simple checks in this section before contacting a service professional.

When you switch on your phone, the following messages may appear:

"Phone lock"

• The automatic locking function has been enabled. You must enter the phone's password before you can use the phone.

"No Service" or "Network Failure," displays

- The network connection has been lost. You may be in a weak signal area. Move and try again.
- You are trying to access an option for which you have no subscription with your service provider. Contact the service provider for further details.

When call quality is poor:

• end the phone call and try again.

When the other party cannot hear you speaking:

- your phone may have been set to mute.-
- therefore, activate "unmute" by pressing the ok key.

When battery lifetime becomes shorter than usual:

• this may happen when you are in an area with low signal strength.

turn off your mobile phone when it is not in use. change the battery when the battery lifetime ends.

TROUBLESHOOTING

When your phone does not turn on:

 make sure your battery is charged. check to see if your phone works while recharging the battery.

When you are unable to send a message:

 either you have not been registered to receive the sms service, or you may be out of the service range of your network service provider.

When you are unable to charge the battery:

- this may be the result of one of the following three cases.
- your charger may be out of order. Contact your nearest dealer.
- 2. you may be attempting to use the phone in overly hot/cold temperature.
- try changing the charging environment.
- 3. your battery may have not been connected to the charger properly. Check the connector.

When you are unable to input data into the phone book:

• your phone book memory may be full. try to delete some entries from your phone book.

When you are unable to select a certain function:

 you may not have been subscribed for that function, or your network service provider may be in an area where such service cannot be provided. contact your local service provider.
