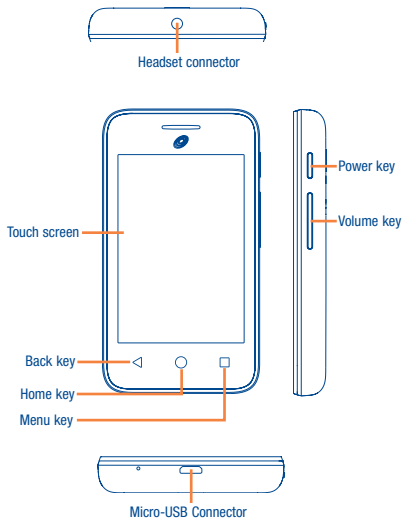
**PROTECT YOUR HEARING**

# 1

## Your mobile .....

### 1.1 Keys and connectors



#### Back key

- Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.



#### Home key

- While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.



#### Menu key

- Touch to access setting options.
- Touch and hold to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently.

## Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Generate a pop up menu providing more options: **Power off**, **Restart**, **Airplane mode**, and icons of **Silence**, **Vibration** and **Ringer** mode.
- Press the **Power** key for more than 15 seconds to restart.
- Press the **Power** key to light up the screen when it dims during a call.
- Press the **Power** key and **Volume up** key to reset if the phone is off.
- Press the **Power** key and **Volume down** key to capture a screenshot while the device is on.

## Volume Keys

- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ringtone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.

## 1.2 Getting started

### 1.2.1 Set-up

#### Removing and installing the back cover



#### Installing and removing the micro SD card



Insert the micro SD card with golden contact facing downwards into the slot. Slide it out to remove the micro SD card.



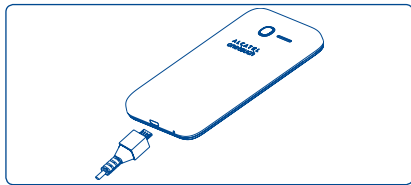
To avoid data loss and SD card damage, before removing the SD card, please ensure that the SD card is unmounted (**Settings**\**Storage**\**Unmount SD card**).

## Installing and removing the battery



- To install, insert and click the battery into place, then close the phone cover.
- To remove the battery, first power the phone off. Then unclip the cover and remove the battery.

## Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and main socket respectively.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

### 1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, Password, Pattern or Voice unlock) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or have forgotten it, contact your service provider. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

### Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options:

- Select the phone's language, then touch **Get started**.
- Select the input method, then touch **>**.
- Set up Wi-Fi and your Mobile data connection, then touch **>**.
- **Set up your Google account:** Touch **Set up now** to set up your Google account. If you already have a Google account, touch **Existing**; then enter your Email address and password. If you've forgotten the password, go to <http://www.google.com> to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google account, touch **New** to create one.
- **Set up screen lock** to activate device protection, you can also touch **Cancel** to skip it.
- Finish **Backup & reset** settings, then touch **>**.
- Activate **Location**, or skip by touching **>**.
- When the **Finished** screen displayed, touch **Enjoy now**.

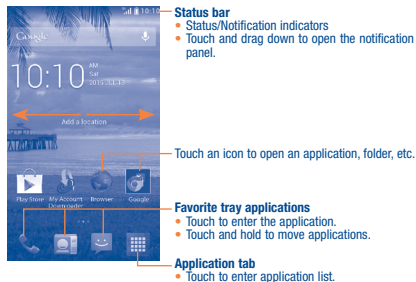
If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

### 1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the phone options appear, select **Power off**.

## 1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

### 1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

#### Touch



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

#### Touch and Hold



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, touch and hold this contact, an options list will then appear on screen.

#### Drag



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

#### Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

The device also supports one finger zoom in (Message, Browser, Email and Gallery) by double tapping the screen then slide with one finger to zoom in/out.

#### Flick



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

#### Pinch/Spread





























Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.





























### 1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notification information.

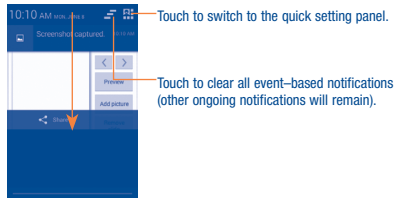

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel or Quick setting panel. Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you can touch them to access notifications directly.

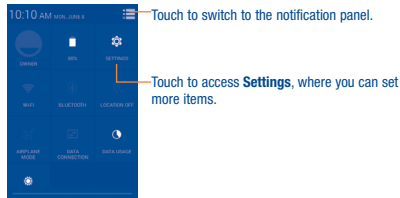
### Notification panel

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read the detailed information.



### Quick setting panel

Touch  on the Notification panel to open the Quick setting panel, where you can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.




### 1.3.3 Search bar


The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



#### 1 Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Type the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch the  icon on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

#### 2 Search by voice

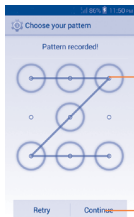
- Touch  from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

### 1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by creating a variety of patterns, PINs or passwords etc.

### To create a screen unlock pattern

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Security\Set up screen lock\Pattern**.
- Draw your own pattern.



Draw your unlock pattern

Touch to confirm by drawing pattern again

### To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Security\Set up screen lock\PIN or Password**.
- Set your PIN or password.




### To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

### To unlock phone screen

Press the power key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password, etc. to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, you could:

- Double tap the screen or press the **Power** key to activate unlock options;
- Touch and drag  to  to unlock the screen, or drag  to camera, message, or phone icons to access the corresponding screen.



## 1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

### Add

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a widget to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen as you prefer.

### Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

### Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of the **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

### Create folders

To improve the organization of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

## Wallpaper customization

Touch the **Menu** key on the Home screen then touch **Wallpaper** to customize wallpaper.

### 1.3.6 Widgets and recently-used applications

#### Consult widgets

Touch  on the Home screen to enter applications and widgets list.

Slide left and right to view all applications and widgets. Touch **WIDGETS** to access the category directly.

To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

#### Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, touch and hold the **Menu** key from the Home screen. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application.



Slide horizontally to view all thumbnails of recently-used applications.

Touch one thumbnail and slide it upwards or downwards to delete it. You can also touch and hold it and then select **Remove from list** to delete or **App info** to learn more.

Touch **Clear all** at the bottom to activate the system's one key boost which clears memory used by recent applications.

### 1.3.7 Volume adjustment

#### Using Volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To active the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrate. Press the **Volume down** key once more to active the silent mode.


#### Using Settings Menu

Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Sound\Volume** you can set the volume of media, ringtone, alarm, etc. to your preference.

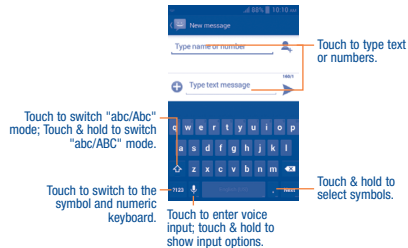
# 2 Text input .....

## 2.1 Using Onscreen Keyboard

### Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, select **Settings\Language & input**, touch the Settings icon  on the right of **Android keyboard**, and a series of settings will become available for your selection.

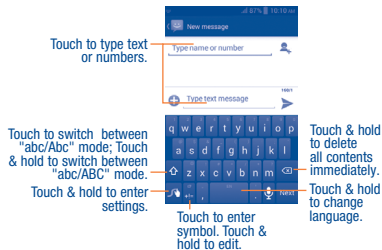
### 2.1.1 Android keyboard



## 2.1.2 Swype






Swype Input lets you enter a word with one continuous motion: just drag your finger over the letters in the word.

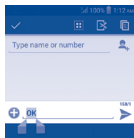
- Place your finger on the key with the first letter of the word and drag your finger to each subsequent letter without lifting your finger off the screen.
- Continue until you have finished the word. Lift your finger after the last letter.
- If Swype Input cannot clearly determine your word, the word choice window opens. Select an alternative word from the list.



## 2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: **Select all** , **Cut** , **Copy**  and **Paste** .
- Touch the  icon to go back without any action.



You can also insert new texts as you prefer

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold the blank, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show **PASTE** and **REPLACE** icon which allows you to complete paste immediately.



## 3 Phone call, Call log and Contacts .....

### 3.1 Phone .....



### 3.2 Placing a call

You can easily launch a call using **Phone**. Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone**.

Display the suggested number(s).



Touch and hold to access voicemail.



Touch to access **Call log**.

Touch to access **Speed dial**, **Contacts**, or other call settings.


Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call log** then touch  to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching **Add to Contacts** icon .


If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up a call, touch .

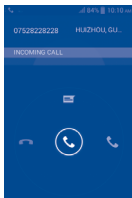
## International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold **0+** to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch .




## Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch  to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

## 3.3 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call:

- Slide the  icon to the right to answer;
- Slide the  icon to the left to reject;
- Slide the  icon upwards to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key.

## 3.3.1 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

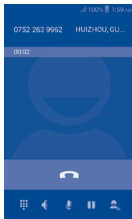
To access your voicemail, touch and hold  on the dial pad.

To set your voicemail number, touch the **Menu** key from the Phone screen, then touch **Settings\Voice call\Voicemail\Voicemail settings\Voicemail number**.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon  appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

## 3.3.2 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.





Touch to end the current call.



Touch to display the dial pad.



Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.



Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.



Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.



Touch to add a call.

During a call:

- Touch the **Menu** key to **Start recording**.
- Press the **Power** key to light up the screen when it dims.




To avoid any incorrect operations on the touchscreen during a call, the screen will automatically lock and unlock once the cellphone is placed and removed from your ear.

### 3.3.3 Managing multiple calls





With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

#### Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the  icon to switch between two lines. The current call is put on hold and you have joined in the other call.

### Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch the icon .
- Dial to add a call and then touch .
- Touch  to start conference.
- Touch  to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

### 3.3.4 Call settings

Touch the **Menu** key from the Phone screen, then touch **Settings**, the following options are available:

#### Voice call

- **Vicemail** Touch to access voicemail service and number settings.

**Service:** Opens a dialog box where you can select your provider's voicemail service or another service.

**Vicemail settings:** If you are using your provider's voicemail service, this opens a dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail.

- **Call forwarding** Select to always forward your calls or when you are busy, unanswered, or unreachable.
- **Call barring** Touch to pick out calls to be barred, cancel call barring, or change barring password.
- **Additional settings** Touch to access other voice call settings.

**Caller ID:** Touch to use default operator settings to display my number in outgoing calls.

**Call waiting:** Mark the checkbox to notify you of new incoming calls during a call.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network service provider.

## Other settings

- **Fixed Dialing Numbers:** Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers to which their children can dial. For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.
- **Minute reminder** Mark the checkbox to enable reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.
- **Quick responses** Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.
- **TTY mode** Touch to select among **TTY Off**, **TTY Full**, **TTY HCO**, and **TTY VCO**.
- **International dialing assist** Mark the checkbox to activate.
- **Hearing aids** Hearing aids mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments. After connecting the phone and Hearing aid machine, it connects to a relay service, which converts incoming speech to text for the person using the Hearing aid and converts outgoing text from the Hearing aid machine to a spoken voice for the person on the other end of the conversation.

## 3.4 Call log

You can access your call log by touching  from the Dial screen. Touch  on the right side of a contact/number to place a call directly.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **Contacts**, etc.

To clear the entire call log, touch the **Menu** key and **Delete**.

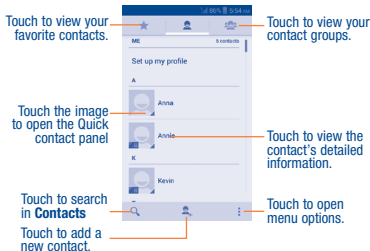
## 3.5 Contacts

**Contacts** enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

### 3.5.1 Consult your Contacts

To access this feature, touch  from the Home screen, then select **Contacts**.



Touch the **Menu** key to display contacts list option menu, following actions are enabled:



- **Delete contact** Select and delete unwanted contacts.
- **Contacts to display** Choose contacts to display.
- **Import/export** Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and micro SD card, or share contacts.
- **Accounts** Manage the synchronization settings for different accounts.
- **Settings** Touch to change the display of the sort list and contact names.
- **Share visible contacts** Share your contacts through Bluetooth, Email, etc.

### 3.5.2 Managing contact groups

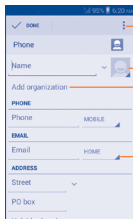
The contact group helps you to improve the organization of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Group** screen.

To create a new group, touch the  icon and then type the group's name and person's name, finally touch **DONE** to confirm.

### 3.5.3 Adding a contact

Touch the  icon to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



If you want to add more information, touch **Add another field** to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch the **Menu** key and then touch **Discard**.

#### Add to/remove from Favorites <sup>(1)</sup>

To add a contact to favorites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch  to add the contact to favorites (the star will turn grey in color).

To remove a contact from favorites, touch the star  on contact details screen.

### 3.5.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch the **Menu** key in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit**. When finished, touch **DONE**.

#### Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

<sup>(1)</sup> Only phone contacts can be added to Favorites.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A ✓ icon will appear below the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

### Set ringtone for a contact <sup>(1)</sup>

On the contact's detail screen, touch the **Menu** key to display options menu, touch **Set ringtone**.

### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch the **Menu** key and **Delete contact** from the contact list screen. Tick the contact you want to remove and touch **OK** to confirm. Touch **ALL CONTACTS** to delete all contacts.




The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

## 3.5.5 Communicating with your contacts

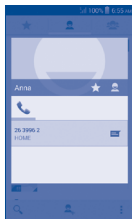
From the contact list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the number.

To send a message to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the  icon on the right side of the number.

## Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number to make a phone call or the  icon to send a message.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

## 3.6 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

From the Contacts screen, touch the **Menu** key to open the options menu, then touch **Import/export**.

To import/export a contact from/to your SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export, then touch **OK** to confirm or **CANCEL** to quit.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch the contact you want to share, touch the **Menu** key and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

<sup>(1)</sup> You can only set a ringtone for established contacts.

### 3.6.1 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch the **Menu** key and touch **Contacts to display** from the contact list screen, then you can choose contacts to display.

Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings**, you can sort list by the given name or family name, as well as view contact names as given/family name first.

### 3.6.2 Joining/Separating contacts <sup>(1)</sup>

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.


Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch the **Menu** key and touch **Edit**, then touch the **Menu** key again and touch **Join**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch the **Menu** key and touch **Edit**, then touch the **Menu** key again and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

### 3.6.3 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch  from the Home screen and enter **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, select the account you want to delete, touch **Remove account**, then confirm.

#### Turn on/off the sync & Auto-sync

Touch an account to enter the account screen, mark/unmark the checkbox(s) to turn on/off the account's auto-sync. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized to each other.

#### Sync manually

You can also synchronize an account manually on **Accounts** screen, touch an account in the list, then touch the **Menu** key and select **Sync now**.

<sup>(1)</sup> Only applicable for phone contacts.

# 4 Messaging.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

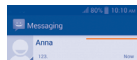
To access this feature, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.



To consult messages stored in your SIM card, touch the **Menu** key from the Messaging screen, then touch **Settings\Text messages (SMS)\Manage SIM messages**.

## 4.1 Write message



On the message list screen, touch the new message icon  to write text/multimedia messages.



- Touch to view the whole message thread.
- Touch & hold to activate delete mode.



### Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient in the **Type name or number** bar or touch  to add recipients; then touch the **Type text message** bar to type the text of the message. When finished, touch  to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (accent) will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

### Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject or email addresses added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Type name or number** bar, and touch **Type text message** bar to type the text of the message. Then touch the  icon to attach picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch  to send the multimedia message.

## Attach options:

- **Take picture** Access Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.
- **Capture video** Access Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.
- **Record audio** Enter voice message recorder to record a voice message for attaching.
- **Contact** Enter Contacts to select a contact as attachment.
- **Pictures** Access Gallery application or File manager to select a picture as attachment.
- **Videos** Access Gallery application or File manager to select a video as attachment.
- **Audio** Access to select an audio file as attachment.
- **Calendar** Access Calendar application to select one or more event(s) to attach.
- **Slideshow** Enter Edit slide show screen, touch **Add slide** to create a new slide, and touch currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch the **Menu** key to get more actions, like setting the slide duration, adding music, etc.



Touch to go to previous or next slide.

Touch to preview the current slide.

Touch to edit the title of this slide.

### 4.1.1 Manage messages

When receiving a message, an icon will appear on the status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message composing screen, enter the text, then touch ➤.

Touch and hold an SMS in message details screen. The following message options are available for selection:

- **Copy** This option displays when the message is an SMS. Copy the current message content. You can paste it to the enter bar of the new message you are going to compose.
- **Forward** Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
- **Report as spam** Touch to report the selected message as Spam.

- **Delete message** Delete the current message.
- **Lock/Unlock message** Touch to lock/unlock the message so it can't/can be deleted if you reach maximum number of stored messages.
- **View message details** Touch to view details of the message.
- **Clear all messages** Touch to delete all messages.
- **Select text** Touch to select the message text to copy, cut, add to dictionary, etc.
- **Save message to SIM card** Touch to save the message to SIM card.

#### 4.1.2 Adjust message settings

You can adjust a set of message settings. From the Messaging application screen, touch the **Menu** key and then **Settings**.

##### SMS enabled

- **Airplane mode** Touch to activate or deactivate the Airplane mode.
- **Default SMS app** Touch to select your default SMS app, **Messaging** or **Hangouts**.
- **Tethering & portable HotSpot** Touch to access Wi-Fi **HotSpot**, **USB tethering**, and **Bluetooth tethering**.
- **VPN settings** Touch to set your Virtual private networks.
- **Mobile networks** Touch to activate your **Data connection** and **Data roaming**, select **Access Point Names**, and **Network operators**.

##### Text messages (SMS)

- **Manage SIM messages** Touch to manage text messages stored on your SIM card.
- **Edit quick text** Touch to add or edit message templates.
- **SMS service center** Touch to edit your SMS service center number.
- **SMS storage location** Touch to select where your messages to be stored, **Phone** or **SIM card**.

##### Multimedia messages (MMS)

- **Group messaging** Mark the checkbox to send a single message by MMS when there are multiple recipients.
- **Creation mode** Select to change creation mode.
- **Maximum message size** Select to input the maximum message size.

##### Notifications

- **Notifications** Select to display message notifications in status bar.
- **Mute** Select to mute phone when receiving a new message notification.
- **Select ringtone** Touch to select a ringtone as a new message notification tone.
- **Vibrate** Select to vibrate phone as a notification when receiving a new message.
- **Popup notification** Mark the checkbox to show popup for push notifications.

## General

### DISPLAY AND PREFERENCE

- **Message font size** Touch to select your preferred font size.
- **Show email address** Mark the checkbox to display or hide your email address.

### STORAGE SETTINGS

- **Delete old messages** Select to delete old messages when the maximum number of stored messages is reached.
- **Text message limit** Touch to set the number of text messages to be saved per conversation.
- **Multimedia message limit** Touch to set the number of multimedia messages to be saved per conversation.

### SERVICE MESSAGE SETTING

- **Enable WAP push** Touch to enable receipt of push message from network.

### EMERGENCY ALERTS

- **Wireless emergency alerts** Touch to enter emergency alerts settings, include whether to show threats and alert Tone.

## 4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail or to create a new Email account.

### 4.2.1 Gmail .....






As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organized by labels instead of folders.

#### To access Gmail


From the Home screen, touch  to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

#### To create and send emails

- Touch the  icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in **To** field, and if necessary, touch the **Menu** key and touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch the **Menu** key and select **Attach picture** or **Attach video** to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the  icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch the **Menu** key and **Save draft** or touch **Back** key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch the  icon, then select **Drafts**.
- If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch the **Menu** key and then touch **Discard**.



To add a signature to emails, touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

### To receive and read your emails




When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon  will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, subject, label, etc.

- Touch the  icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch .


### To reply or forward emails

- **Reply** When viewing an email, touch  to reply the sender of this mail.
- **Reply all** Touch  and select **"Reply all"** to send message to all people in a mail loop.
- **Forward** Touch  and select **"Forward"** to forward the received mail to other people.




### Managing Gmails by Labels

To conveniently manage conversations and messages, you can organize them using a Label.

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch the **Menu** key and then choose **Move to**.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch the  icon, then touch a label to view a list of conversations with that label.

Touch and hold an email to activate batch mode, and produce the following options:

-  Touch to archive the email message. To display the archived messages, you can touch in Inbox screen then touch All mail.
-  Touch to delete the email message.
-  Touch to mark an email message as read or unread.

Touch  to show the additional options:

- **Move to** Touch to move the mail to other labels.
- **Change labels** Touch to change the label of the email message or conversation.
- **Add/Remove star** To assign a star or remove the star from the conversation.
- **Mark as (not) important** To Mark the email as important or not important.
- **Report spam** To report the email message/conversation as spam.
- **Report phishing** To report the email message/conversations as phishing.



## Gmail settings

To manage Gmail settings, touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** in Inbox screen.

### General settings

- **Archive & delete actions** Touch to set the actions when touch archive and delete.
- **Swipe to archive** Mark the checkbox to enable Swipe to archive in conversation list.
- **Sender image** Mark the checkbox to show sender image beside name in conversation list.
- **Reply all** Touch to mark the checkbox to make the default responding to messages.
- **Auto-fit messages** Touch to mark the checkbox to shrink messages to fit the screen and allow zooming.
- **Auto-advance** Touch to select which screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.
- **Message actions** Touch to show/hide message actions.
- **Confirm before deleting** Mark the checkbox and you need to confirm before deleting emails.
- **Confirm before archiving** Mark the checkbox and you need to confirm before archiving emails.
- **Confirm before sending** Mark the checkbox and you need to confirm before sending emails.

### Touch an account, and follow settings will show:

- **Inbox type** To set this inbox as the default or priority Inbox.
- **Inbox categories** Touch to enable Inbox appear in other categories.
- **Notifications** Select to activate notification when a new email arrives.
- **Inbox sound & vibrate** Touch to set Ringtone, Vibrate and Notify once.
- **Signature** To add a signature text to the end of each mail you send.
- **Vacation responder** Touch to set the notification when on vacation.
- **Sync Gmail** Mark the checkbox to turn on/off Gmail sync.
- **Days of mail to sync** Touch to set the duration of days for mail sync.
- **Manage labels** Touch to open the Label screen, where you can manage synchronization and notifications.
- **Download attachments** Mark the checkbox to auto download attachments to recent messages via Wi-Fi.
- **Images** Touch to set always show image or ask before showing.

# 5 Email.....

Besides your Gmail account, you can also set up external POP3, IMAP or Exchange email accounts in your phone.



To access this feature, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- Touch **Next**. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch **Manual setup** to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- Finish Account settings of Email checking frequency, notification, synchronizing, etc.
- Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.

To add another email account, you can touch the Menu key and Settings. Touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create it.

## To create and send emails

- Touch the  icon and then Compose from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the **To** field.
- If necessary, touch the **Menu** key and touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch the **Menu** key and **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch  to send.

- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch the **Menu** key and **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy.


## 5.1 Hangouts.....


Google's instant messaging service, Hangouts, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Hangouts**. All friends added by using Hangouts from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.


To sign out, touch  from Friends list screen to display options, then touch **Settings\Sign out**.

### 5.1.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then type your message and finally touch .


You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching  and select **Add people** on group chatting screen and then selecting the friend you want to add.

### 5.1.2 To add a new friend

From Friends list, touch the icon  to add a new friend. Type name, email or number of the friend you want to add, and then touch **Message** or **Video call** to start a chat.


A notification with this invitation will be received by the friend. By touching the invitation, the friend can select **Decline** or **Reply** in response.



### 5.1.3 To manage your friends

Besides adding new friends to your friends list, touch  and selecting **People & options** from your Chatting screen, the following actions will be available:

-  Touch to add the person into a new group Hangout.
-  Touch to open **Settings** or **Help**.
-  Touch to add the person to your circles of **Friends**, **Family**, **Acquaintances** or **Following**.
- **Notifications** Mark the checkbox to be notified of new messages.
- **Block** Touch to block the friend from exchanging messages. If blocked, you will no longer receive direct messages and notifications, but this person will still be present in any group Hangouts you have in common. All blocked friends can be viewed by touching  and **Settings**, then touch **Blocked People**. To unblock a friend, touch **Unblock** besides the name of this friend.

### 5.1.4 Settings

A series of settings are available for your selection by touching  and **Settings** from Friends list screen.

- **Hangout requests** Touch to view hangout request that you received when someone sends you a message or invites you to a video call for the first time.
- **Snooze notifications** Touch and select how long you'd like to go without receiving Hangouts notifications. This setting will temporarily disable notifications about new messages and video calls.
- **Archived Hangouts** Touch to display all archived Hangouts that have been prevented from displaying in the Hangouts list. To unarchive a Hangout, touch and hold it till  appear, touch  and select **Unarchive**.
- **Settings** Touch to open further personal settings for every Hangout you have.
- **Send feedback** Touch to send your feedback for Hangouts.
- **Help** Touch to view Hangouts help through your selected app.

# 6 Calendar & Alarm clock & Calculator.....

## 6.1 Calendar.....



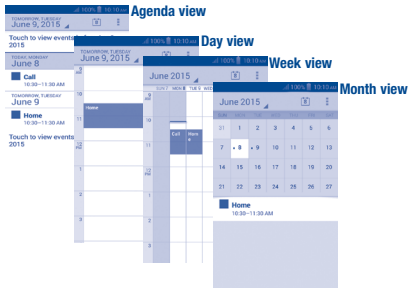
Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

### 6.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open a drop-down menu of **Day**, **Week**, **Month**, and **Agenda** for your options. Touch the icon to return to Today's view.



In **Agenda**, **Day** or **Week** view, touch an event to view its details. Touch a day in **Month** view to open that day's events.

### 6.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch and then **New event** to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All day**.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from **Day**, **Week** view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch an empty spot till it turns blue, then tap again to enter **New event** editing screen.


Important options by touching the **Menu** key from Calendar main screen:

- **Refresh** To refresh the calendar.
- **Search** To search in the calendar.
- **Calendars to display** To show or hide, remove or add calendars.
- **Clear events** To clear all events in selected account.
- **Go to** To skip to a specific date.
- **Settings** To set a series of Calendar settings.

### 6.1.3 To share, delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch it to enter details screen. Touch the icon to share the event to other people by Bluetooth, Email or messaging, etc. Touch the icon and then **Edit** to edit the event, or **Delete** to remove it.

### 6.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon  will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch event name to view Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze** in the notification panel to remove the reminder.

## 6.2 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch  from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

### 6.2.1 World clock



To access this function, touch  on the Time screen.

According to the delivery location, the system will set a default clock.

- Touch the  icon to enter a city name or choose a time zone from the list.
- Touch the  icon to delete selected time zone.

### 6.2.2 Alarm

#### To set an alarm

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the **Alarm** screen, touch  to add a new alarm. Following options will show:


- **Label** Touch to set a name for the alarm.
- **Repeat** Touch to select days you want alarm to work.
- **Volume** Scroll left or right to adjust volume for your alarm.
- **Vibrate** Select to activate vibration.
- **Ringtone** Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- **Time** Scroll up or down to select time for your alarm.

When finished, touch **OK** to confirm.

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter alarm editing screen.

Touch  to delete the selected alarm.

#### To adjust alarm settings

Touch the  icon from the Alarm screen, the following options can now be adjusted:

- **Alarm in silent mode** Select to play alarm with sound or vibration even when the phone is in Silent mode.
- **Snooze duration** Touch to set temporary turn off time of an alarm.
- **Volume buttons** Touch to set side **Volume** key behaviors when alarm sounds: **None**, **Snooze** or **Dismiss**.

### 6.2.3 Timer

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the **Timer** screen.

Touch **Start** to activate the timer.

Touch **Lap**, a list of records will show below according to the updated time.

Touch **Stop**, the total time and the lap time will not run until touch **Resume**.

Touch **Clear** to delete the record.

### 6.2.4 Countdown

From the Time screen, touch  to enter the **Countdown** screen.

Scroll up or down the **Time** scroll bar to set countdown time.

Touch **Start** to activate Countdown. Or touch **Cancel** to dismiss the ongoing countdown.

Touch **Ringtone** to set a ringtone for your countdown.

## 6.3 Calculator.....

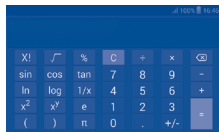
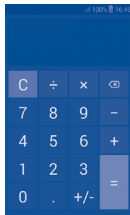



With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch  from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between two panels, touch the Menu key and then **Scientific calculator** or **Basic calculator**.



Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch  to delete digits one by one, touch and hold  to delete all at one time.

You can clear the calculator's history by touching .

You can Tap the triangle to see the history.

When some numbers or operations have been entered, touch and hold the entering bar to open a menu :

- **Cut** To cut selected text
- **Copy** To copy selected text
- **Paste** <sup>(1)</sup> To paste what you have previously copied to the entering bar

<sup>(1)</sup> Option will not appear unless copy or cut operation has been made.

# 7 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/UMTS networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is more convenient.

## 7.1 Connecting to the Internet



### 7.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/UMTS

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: GPRS/EDGE/UMTS.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the **Menu** key on the Home screen, then touch **Settings\More...\Mobile networks\Access point names** or **Network operators**.

#### To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/UMTS network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\More...\Mobile networks\Access point names**.
- Touch the  icon and then **New APN** to access editing screen.
- Enter required APN information.
- When finished, touch the  icon and then **Save**.

#### To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can connect/disconnect to a data service.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.


- Touch **Settings\More...\Mobile networks**.
- Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming mode.

When data roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to “7.1.2 Wi-Fi”).

### 7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within the the range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings**.
- Touch the switch  beside Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi on or off.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

#### To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** from the Home screen.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, then touch the **Menu** key and then **Advanced** from Wi-Fi screen.
- Mark/Unmark the **Network notification** checkbox to activate/deactivate this function.

## To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** from the Home screen.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, and then touch **+**.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch **Save**.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within the range of this network.

## To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **Forget** in the dialog that opens.

## 7.2 Browser.....



Using the Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To access this function, touch  from the Home screen, then touch **Browser**.

### To go to a web page

On the Browser screen, touch the URL bar at the top, enter the address of the web page, then confirm.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

### To set home page

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Browser screen to display option menu, touch **Settings\General\Set home page**.
- Choose a page or most visited websites as your home page.
- If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your home page, touch **OK** to confirm.

### 7.2.1 Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.



## To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.




To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double-tap on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double-tap again.

## To find text on a web page

- Touch the **Menu** key from web page screen, then touch **Find on page**.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch ✓ or the **Back** key to close the search bar.



## Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text from a web page:

- Touch and hold the text to highlight the text.
- Move two tabs to select the text.
- Touch the  icon to select all words in this web screen.
- Touch the  icon to share or the  icon to search on the page or the web.
- When finished, touch ✓ or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

## To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.


- Touch  to open all windows' thumbnails.
- Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- Touch  to open a new window.

- To close a window, touch  on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

## Other options:

- **Refresh** To refresh the current page.
- **Stop** To stop opening the current page.
- **Home page** To get back to the home page you set.
- **Save to bookmarks** To add the current website page as bookmark.
- **Close** To close all tabs and exit.
- **Save for offline reading** To save the web page for offline reading. You can find **Saved pages** by touching the **Menu** key and then touching **Bookmarks/History**.
- **Share page** To share the current page with your friends via various ways, like Message, Email, Bluetooth, etc.
- **Find on page** To input contents you want to find on the current page.
- **Request desktop site** To enable/disable computer version websites.
- **Bookmarks/History** To see the bookmarks and browsing history.
- **Settings** To access a series of Browser settings.
- **Version** Touch to view Browser version.



Touch the  icon on the left of the URL, you can view more information about the current page.

## 7.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

### To manage a link, phone number or address displayed on a web page

- **Link** Touch the link to open the web page.  
Touch and hold the link to open options for further operation, like **Open**, **Open in new window**, **Save link**, **Copy link URL**, **Share link as bookmark**, etc.
- **Phone number** Touch to dial, add to contact or copy the phone number.
- **Address** Touch to open Google Maps to locate the address.


### To view Browser history

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Browser screen.
- Touch **Bookmarks/History**.
- Touch **History** tab to view browser history, or **Saved pages** to view the websites you've saved.
- Touch **Most visited** to view your most frequently visited pages.

### To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Security**, mark the checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).


To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, select the item to be canceled, and touch  to confirm.


To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **DOWNLOADED**.

## 7.2.3 Manage bookmarks


### To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch the **Menu** key and **Save to bookmarks**, or from the **History** screen, touch the star icon  beside the URL.
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch **OK** to confirm.

### To open a bookmark

- Touch the Menu key and then **Bookmarks/History**, or touch the  icon to enter the **Bookmarks** screen.
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch **Open** or **Open in new window**.

### To edit a bookmark

- Touch the Menu key and then **Bookmarks/History**, or touch the  icon to enter the **Bookmarks** screen.
- Touch and hold the bookmark you want to edit.
- Touch **Edit bookmark**, and enter your changes.
- When finished, touch **OK** to confirm.

### Touch and hold a bookmark in the bookmark list to view these additional options:

- **Add shortcut to Home** To add a bookmark shortcut to the Home screen.
- **Share link** To share the bookmark.
- **Copy link URL** To copy the bookmark link.
- **Delete bookmark** To delete a bookmark.
- **Set as home page** To set this page as the home page.

## 7.2.4 Settings

A series of settings are available for your adjustment. To access Browser settings, touch the **Menu** key from the Browser screen, and then touch **Settings**.

### General

- **Set home page** Touch to set home page.

### Privacy & security

- **Clear cache** Touch to clear locally cached content and databases.
- **Clear history** Touch to clear the browser history.
- **Show security warnings** Mark to show warning if there is a problem with a site's security.
- **Accept cookies** Mark to allow sites to save and read cookie data.
- **Clear all cookie data** Touch to clear all browser cookies.
- **Remember form data** Mark the checkbox to remember data in forms for later use.
- **Clear form data** Touch to clear all the saved form data.
- **Enable location** Mark to allow sites to request access to your location.
- **Clear location access** Touch to clear location access for all websites.

### Accessibility

- **Preview** Provide a preview window for text size adjustment.
- **Text scaling** Slide to change the size of the text display.
- **Zoom on double-tap** Slide to change the magnification level while double-tap the page.
- **Minimum font size** Slide to change the minimum font size.

### Advanced

- **Set search engine** Touch to select a search engine.
- **Open in background** Mark to open new windows behind the current one.
- **Enable JavaScript** Mark to enable JavaScript.
- **Allow multi-tabs per app** Mark to allow one app use multiple tabs.
- **Enable plug-ins** Touch to set enable plug-ins.
- **Website settings** Touch to view advanced settings for individual websites.
- **Open pages in overview** Mark the checkbox to show overview of newly-opened pages.
- **Auto-fit pages** Mark to format web pages to fit the screen.
- **Block pop-up windows** Mark the checkbox to prevent pop-up windows.
- **Text encoding** Touch to select the character-encoding standard.
- **Reset to default** Touch to clear all browser data and to reset all settings to default.

## Bandwidth management

- **Search result preloading** Touch to enable/disable browser to preload search results in the background.
- **Web page preloading** Touch to enable/disable browser to preload web page in the background.
- **Load images** Mark to display images on web pages.

## Labs

- **Quick controls** Mark to enable quick controls.
- **Full screen** Mark to use the full screen mode.

## 7.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices <sup>(1)</sup>

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Bluetooth**, your advice and other available ones will show on the screen.

### To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings**.
- Touch  to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch **Settings\Bluetooth**.
- Touch the **Menu** key and **Rename phone**.
- Enter a name, and touch **Rename** to confirm.

### To make device visible

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\Bluetooth**.
- Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch the **Menu** key and **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

<sup>(1)</sup> You are recommended to use ALCATEL ONETOUCH Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with phone. You can go to [www.alcatelonetouch.us](http://www.alcatelonetouch.us) for more information about ALCATEL ONETOUCH Bluetooth headsets.

### To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\Bluetooth**.
- Touch **SEARCH FOR DEVICES**.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will pop up, touch **Pair** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

### To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the Settings icon  beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch **Unpair** to confirm.

## 7.4 Connecting to a computer <sup>(1)</sup>

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your micro SD card/internal storage and the computer.

### To connect/disconnect your phone to the computer:

To connect:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and touch **USB connected**.

<sup>(1)</sup> You can change your default connection mode via **Settings\Storage**. Touch the **Menu** key **USB computer connection**. Some operations which are available under mass storage are not usable under MTP and PTP.

- Touch **Mount** in the dialog that opens if you want to transfer files.

To disconnect (for mass storage):

- Open the Notification panel and touch **USB connected**.
- Touch **Turn off** in the dialog that opens to cancel USB mass storage.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage, touch **File Manager**. All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications into your phone, etc.

### To safely remove the micro SD card from your phone

The micro SD card can be removed from your phone any time the phone is powered off. To remove the micro SD card while the phone is on, you must unmount the storage card from the phone first, to prevent corrupting or damaging the storage card.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch **Settings\Storage**.
- Touch **Unmount SD card**.

You can now safely remove the micro SD card from the phone.

### To format a micro SD card

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch **Settings\Storage**.
- Touch **Format SD card**, a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the micro SD card will erase its contents.
- Touch **Format SD card** to confirm.

## 7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

### To add a VPN

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\More...\VPN settings** and then touch **+**.
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch **Save**.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your phone.

### To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\More...\VPN settings**.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **Connect**.

To disconnect:

- Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for the VPN disconnection.

### To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\More...\VPN settings**.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- Touch **Edit profile**.
- After finished, touch **Save**.

To delete:

- Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

# 8 Google Play Store (1)....

Google Play Store is an online application store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

To open Google Play Store:

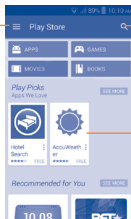
- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Store**.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention.

Touch  and then select Help to enter Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.

## 8.1 Locate the item you want to download and install

Google Play Store home page provides several ways to find applications. It showcases applications and games in categorized listings.

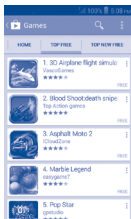
Touch here and then select **My apps** to see all your downloads.



Touch to search in **Play Store**.

Slide left and right to see all categories.


Touch a category on Google Play Store screen to browse its contents. You can also select a subcategory if there is any. Within each category you can select to view items sorted by Top paid, Top free, Top grossing, etc.



Touch the Google Play Store icon  on the top left of the screen or touch **Back** key to return to the previous screen.

## 8.2 Download and install

To download & install:

- Navigate to the item you want to download, and select to enter the details screen from which you can read its description, overall rating or comments, view developer's information, etc.
- Touch **INSTALL** to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch **ACCEPT** to download.
- The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch **X** to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon  on the status bar.

(1) Depending on your country and provider.



Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for results of using this item on your phone.

#### To open the application you have downloaded:

- On Google Play Store screen, touch  and **My Apps**.
- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch **OPEN**.

#### To buy an application <sup>(1)</sup>

On Google Play Store, some applications are labeled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.


- Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price on the upper-right of the screen to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch **Continue** to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log in to Google payment and billing service.
- If your account has multiple credit card accounts, select one to proceed.
- Select the Terms of service link and read the document. When finished, touch the **Back** key.
- Mark the checkbox if you agree with the terms of service.
- Touch **Buy now** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, Android downloads the application.

<sup>(1)</sup> Google Paid applications may not be available to users in some countries.

#### To request a refund

If you are not satisfied with the application, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase. Your credit card will not be charged and the application will be removed. If you change your mind, you can install the application again, but you will not be able to request a refund.

- Touch  and **My apps** from Google Play Store screen.
- Touch the application that you want to uninstall and refund.
- Touch **REFUND** to uninstall the application and refund. If the button becomes **UNINSTALL**, your trial period has expired.
- In the survey form, select the answer that best matches your reason, and touch **OK**.

## 8.3 Manage your downloads

After you downloaded and installed an application, the following further operations are available for your selection.

#### View

On Google Play Store screen, touch  and **My Apps**.

#### Uninstall

On Google Play Store screen, touch  and **My Apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall to enter the details screen, touch **Uninstall**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

#### Refund

On Google Play Store screen, touch  and **My Apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall for a refund, touch **REFUND**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.



## Update notification

On Google Play Store screen, touch  and **My Apps**. Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings\Notifications** to enable update notification.

## Auto update

Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings\Auto-update apps** to enable this function. To auto update one specific application, mark the checkbox of **Auto-update apps at any time**. Do not auto-update apps or **Auto-update apps over Wi-Fi only** from the details screen,

## Rate and review

Open the details screen for an application, touch the stars ★★★★★ beside **Rate & review** to award and input comments, touch **OK** to confirm.

## Flag

You can report an inappropriate application to Google Play Store by flagging it. Open the details screen for the application, scroll to the bottom and touch **Flag as inappropriate**, enter the reason and finally touch **Submit**.

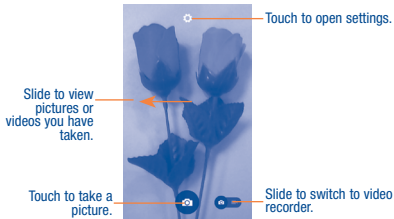
# 9 Multimedia applications...

## 9.1 Camera


Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera or Camcorder, please be sure to remove the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.





To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera**.



### To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary, touch the  icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

## To shoot a video

Switch Camera mode to Video mode. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch the  icon to start recording. Touch the icon  to pause recording, and then the icon  to proceed. Touch the icon  stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

## Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Slide left to quick review the pictures or videos you've taken.
- Touch the  icon then Gmail, Bluetooth, Messaging, etc to share.
- Touch the  icon to access **Gallery**.

### 9.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the  icon to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

#### Photo settings

- **Night** Touch to switch to Night mode.
- **Filter** Touch to select a filter effect for photo taking.
- **Shutter sound** Touch to turn on/off shutter sound.
- **Advanced** Touch to show series of advanced options: **Full screen, Picture size, and Timer**.
- **Full screen** Touch to select Standard (4:3) or Full screen view.
- **Picture size** Touch to select picture size.
- **Timer** Touch to select pause duration before capturing pictures.

#### Video settings

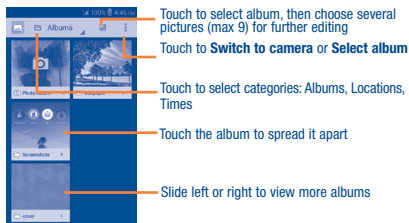
- **Video quality** Touch to set Video quality as Superfine, Fine or Normal.
- **Sound recording** Touch to turn on/off sound recording.

## 9.2 Gallery .....



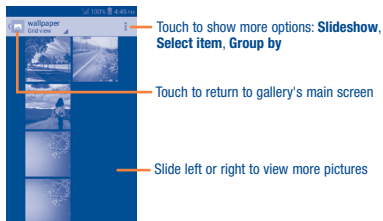
Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery**.



### To view a picture/play a video



Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in **Gallery**.




- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will spread the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

### Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from full-screen picture view. Touch the icon  to share the picture, touch the  icon above and confirm **OK** to delete the picture.

Touch  from full-screen picture view, picture details will be available for your view.



Touch to share the picture through selected apps

Touch to edit the picture: **Beauty, Enhance, Effect, Frame, Mosaics**, etc.

Touch to play the slideshow



Touch to set the picture as contact photo or wallpaper

Touch  from full-screen picture view to edit a picture.






- Edit** Touch to **Crop, Rotate** or **Sharpen** the picture.
- Beauty** Touch to beautify the picture by **Dermabrasion, Whitening, Complexion**.
- Enhance** Touch to open **Toning color** and **Exposure**.
- Effects** Touch to set effect of **Lomo, Portrait, Fashion** or **Art**.
- Frame** Touch to choose frame.
- Mosaics** Touch to add mosaics to the picture.
- Text** Touch to edit words onto the picture.
- Bokeh** Touch to set **Circle bokeh** or **Line bokeh** for the picture.



After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch  to confirm and save, touch  to exit without saving.

## Batch operation

Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch  and touch **Select album** or **Select item** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch  to delete. Touch  to share selected ones.

## 9.3 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **YouTube**.



As an online video service, your phone must have a network connection to access YouTube.



Touch to open further options of Settings, Send feedback, Help, Sign in.

Touch to search for a video.

Touch to play the video and to show more information.

By touching the **Menu** key from YouTube screen, you can set General settings for YouTube. For details about these features, please visit the YouTube website: [www.YouTube.com](http://www.YouTube.com).

### 9.3.1 Watch videos

Touch a video to play it. In the Playing screen, you can view information and comments of the video, and also reach to more related ones. You can also rate, share, label as Favorite, create a new playlist, etc from this screen.

To exit video playing screen, touch the **Back** key to return to the video list.

## 9.4 Music

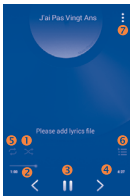
Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the micro SD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to micro SD card using an USB cable.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Music**.

You will find four libraries in which all songs are classified: **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs**, and **Playlists**. Touch the Menu key and **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs.

### 9.4.1 Playing music

Touch a song or touch **Play** from drop-down menu to play the song.



- 1 Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode (tracks are played in random order).
- 2 Touch to skip to the previous track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- 3 Touch to pause/resume playback.
- 4 Touch to skip to the next track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- 5 Touch to select repeat mode: Repeating all songs, Repeating current song, or Repeat is off.
- 6 Touch to show the displaying song.
- 7 Touch to open Music setting options.



While playing songs with Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

### Adjust sound effects

Touch the **Menu** key and **Sound effects** from playing screen to enable and adjust sound effects.

## 9.4.2 Working with playlists

Playlists allow you to conveniently organize all songs stored in the micro SD card or phone storage.

You can create a new playlist, add a song to the list, and delete or rename a playlist.

### To create a playlist

Touch **Recently added** from the Playlists screen, touch the **Menu** key and then select **Save as playlist**, enter the name and finally touch **Save**.

### To delete a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Delete**.

### To rename a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Rename**. When finished, touch **Save** to confirm.

## 9.5 Video Player .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Video Player**.

**Video Player** is a small built-in video player that lists all your videos.

Touch an item from the list to play. While playing, touch a point on the timeline to jump to and play from.

# 10 Google Maps (1) .....



## 10.1 Get My Location

### 10.1.1 Choose a data source to decide My Location

Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Location**.

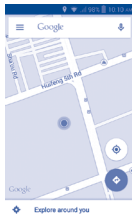
Touch the switch  beside **Location**, and then select a **Mode** to set Wi-Fi or mobile networks as my location data source.

### 10.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Maps**.

Touch  icon on the map to view **My Location**.

The map will then center on a blue dot with a blue circle around. Your actual position is within the blue circle.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.

To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

## 10.2 Search for a location

While viewing a map, touch the search icon  to activate search function.

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



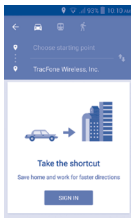

## 10.3 Get driving, public transport or walking directions

### 10.3.1 Get suggested routes for your trip


Touch the **Route** icon  from Maps screen.

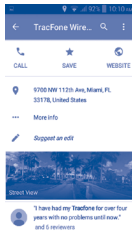


- Touch enter bar to edit your start point by one of the following methods: entering an address or using My Location.
- Do likewise for your end point.
- To reverse directions, touch the  icon.
- Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transport, or walking directions.
- A couple of suggested routes will appear in a list. Touch any routes to view their respective detailed directions.
- Touch the  icon for route options to avoid highways and tolls when choosing driving by car or for editing the departure and arrival time when using public transport.

To get reverse directions for a route you've already made, simply touch the  icon. No need to enter your start point and end point again.

## 10.4 Save a location

- Touch & hold a location on a map.
- Touch the information at the bottom then touch the  icon to save the location.



## 10.5 Map view

Touch the  icon at the left lower corner, you could switch the map view to **Traffic**, **Public transport**, **Cycling** or **Satellite** view.

# 11

## Others .....

### 11.1 File Manager .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **File Manager**.

**File Manager** displays all data stored on the phone and the micro SD card, including applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to phone/micro SD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

**File Manager** allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

### 11.2 Sound Recorder .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder**.

**Sound Recorder** allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.

### 11.3 Radio .....



Your phone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS <sup>(2)</sup> functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Radio**.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

Touch to decrease 0.1MHz.  
Touch and hold to search and go to the nearest lower frequency channel.

Touch to add the current station to favorites.

Drag to change current frequency.

Touch to go to previous saved channel.

Touch to go to next saved channel.

Touch to increase 0.1MHz. Touch and hold to search and go to the nearest higher frequency channel.

Touch to search for all available stations automatically.

Touch to play/stop.

Touch to open and view the saved channel list.

<sup>(1)</sup> The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

<sup>(2)</sup> Depending on your network operator and market.



## Available options:

Touch the  icon to access:

- **Save channel** Save the current tuned station to the channels list.
- **Search** Search for all available stations automatically.
- **Delete** Delete the channel.
- **Audio mode** Listen to the radio using loudspeaker or headset.
- **Record FM** Record video voice of the current channel.
- **Enter frequency** Enter the frequency manually.
- **RDS settings** Touch to select **Channel information** and **Alternative frequency**.
- **Exit** Turn off the radio.

## 11.4 Notes .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Notes**.

Use **Notes** to note down inspirations, ideas, excerpts, things to do and all those things you may want to keep for future reference.

Touch **Help** in **Notes** to get more information about how to use it.

## 11.5 Setup Wizard.....

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Setup Wizard**.

Setup Wizard helps to set up your phone in multiple ways: language, input method, mobile data connection, account setup and synchronization, backup and reset, etc. This will also be performed the first time you power on your phone.

## 11.6 Help Me .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Help Me**.

**Help Me** provides help when you have questions or need assistance while using the phone.

## 11.7 Other applications <sup>(1)</sup>

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, please refer to the leaflet provided with the phone. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Google Play Store on your phone.

<sup>(1)</sup> Application availability depends on country and provider.

# 12

## Settings .....



To access this function, touch the **Menu** key and then **Settings** from the Home screen.

### 12.1 WIRELESS & NETWORKS

#### 12.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to “7.1.2 Wi-Fi”.

#### 12.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to “7.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices”.

#### 12.1.3 Data usage

Touch the **Menu** key you can view settings related to your data usage. Mark the checkbox of set mobile data limit, your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your provider may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

#### 12.1.4 Airplane mode

Through **More...**\ **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Airplane mode by touching AIRPLANE MODE on Quick setting bar or in phone options when pressing Power key.

#### 12.1.5 Default SMS app

Touch **More...**\ **Default SMS app** to select between Hangouts or Messaging.

#### 12.1.6 Tethering & portable HotSpot

Touch to access **Wi-Fi HotSpot**, **USB tethering**, and **Bluetooth tethering**.

##### Wi-Fi HotSpot

Touch the switch  to turn on **Wi-Fi HotSpot**. Touch Wi-Fi HotSpot to access its settings.

##### USB tethering

Mark the checkbox to activate USB tethering.

##### Bluetooth tethering

Mark the checkbox to share Internet connection.

### 12.1.7 VPN settings

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to “7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks”.

### 12.1.8 Mobile networks

#### Data enabled

Touch to enable or disable data access over Mobile network.

#### Data roaming

If you don't need to transmit data on other provider's mobile networks, unmark the checkbox of **Data roaming** to avoid incurring significant roaming charges.

#### Access point names

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

#### Network operators

You can select a network operator manually or automatically.

## 12.2 DEVICE

### 12.2.1 Sound

Use the Sound settings to configure many aspects of call and notification ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

- **Volume:** Touch to set volume for Media, Ringtone, Notifications and Alarms.
- **Phone ringtone:** Touch to set your default incoming call ringtone.
- **Vibrate when ringing:** Mark the checkbox to enable vibrate and ringtone at the same time.
- **Default notification:** Touch to set the default sound for notifications.
- **Dial pad touch tones:** Mark the checkbox to enable playing tones when using dial pad.
- **Audible selection:** Mark the checkbox to enable playing sound when making screen selection.
- **Screen lock sound:** Mark the checkbox to enable playing sounds when locking and unlocking the screen.
- **Haptic feedback:** Touch to activate or deactivate vibration when pressing soft keys and on certain UI interactions.
- **Power on ringtone:** Touch to activate or deactivate your power on ringtone.
- **Power off ringtone:** Touch to activate or deactivate your power off ringtone.

### 12.2.2 Display

- **Lock screen notifications:** Mark the checkbox to show notifications on lock screen.
- **Wallpaper:** Touch to set the wallpaper.
- **Brightness:** Touch to enable automatically adjust the brightness of the screen.

- **Sleep:** Touch to set screen timeout.
- **Daydream:** Touch to turn on or off daydream and select a mode and time for it.
- **Font size:** Touch to set the font size.

### 12.2.3 Storage

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone and on your micro SD card; to manage your micro SD card; and if necessary, to reset the phone, erasing all of your personal information.

If micro SD card has been detected, the system will remind you that if you want to set micro SD card as preferred space for daily use and you could always change the storage location by touching **Settings\Storage\DEFAULT STORAGE**.

#### SD CARD

Lists the amount of space on any micro SD card installed in your phone and the amount you can use to store photos, videos, music, and other files. You can touch one category to access the function and learn more details.

#### Mount/Unmount SD card

You must mount the micro SD card before using applications and files in it, or formatting the micro SD card. Unmount the micro SD card from your phone so that you can safely remove it when the phone is on.

#### Format SD card

Touch to format the SD card. This action will erase its contents.

#### PHONE STORAGE

This menu displays the amount of internal phone storage in different colors. The space in grey shows the amount of internal phone storage already used by the operating system, its components, applications (including those you downloaded), permanent and temporary data. The available space will be shown in dark.



If you switch the storage location, some data may become unusable or apps can behave unexpectedly. If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you are required to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

### 12.2.4 Battery

In battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category, then you can learn its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

### 12.2.5 Applications

You use the **Applications** settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites and emails.

- **Downloaded:** Touch to manage and remove installed applications.
- **SD Card:** Touch to view, sort, or reset application preferences in SD card.
- **Running:** Touch to view and control currently running service.
- **All:** Touch to view storage used by applications.

## 12.3 PERSONAL

### 12.3.1 Location

Touch the switch  to open location services.

## Mode

Touch to select a location mode among **High accuracy**, **Battery saving**, and **Device only** to use GPS, Wi-Fi, or mobile networks to determine your approximate location.

## RECENT LOCATION REQUESTS

Touch to view detailed information of applications that had recent location requests.

## LOCATION SERVICES

Touch to access **Google Location Reporting**.

### 12.3.2 Security

#### Set up screen lock

- **None** Touch to disable screen unlock security.
- **Slide** Touch to enable slide unlock mode.
- **Voice unlock** Touch to record voice command for phone unlock.
- **Pattern** Touch to draw pattern to unlock screen.
- **PIN** Touch to enter a numeric PIN to unlock screen.
- **Password** Touch to enter a password to unlock screen.

#### Owner info

Touch to input owner information which will display on the lock screen.

#### Encrypt phone

Require a numeric PIN or passwords to decrypt your phone each time you power it on.

#### Set up SIM card lock

- Mark the checkbox of **Lock SIM card** to lock the SIM card with PIN code.

- Touch **Change SIM PIN** to change the PIN code.

#### Make passwords visible

Mark the checkbox to show passwords as you type.

#### Device administrators

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

#### Protect your phone

Touch to set up screen lock for device protection.

#### Unknown sources

Mark the checkbox to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites, emails, or other locations other than Google Play Store.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Google Play Store.

#### Verify apps

Mark the checkbox to disallow or warn before installation of apps that may cause harm.

#### Auto-start management

Touch to allow or deny auto-start of selected applications when system boots up.

#### App permissions

Turn on the switch to manage app permissions for security and privacy protection.

#### Storage type

Credential storage is software only.

### Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

### Install from phone storage

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the phone storage.

### Clear credentials

Touch to remove all certificates.

## 12.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

### Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.


### Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

### User dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

### Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch **Select input method** to show all input methods. Touch the settings icon  to configure a certain input method.

### Android keyboard

The Android keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalization features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows:

- **Input languages:** Touch to set input language.
- **Auto-capitalization:** Mark the checkbox to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalize the first letter of the first word after a period, the first word in a text field, and each word in name fields.
- **Vibrate on keypress:** Mark the checkbox to have the phone vibrate briefly each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- **Sound on keypress:** Mark the checkbox to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- **Popup on keypress:** Mark the checkbox to pop up the key that you touched.
- **Voice input key:** Touch to set the Mic button on Main keyboard or symbols keyboard or not display.
- **Personal dictionary:** Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.
- **Add-on dictionaries:** Touch to select language for personal dictionaries.
- **Block offensive words:** Mark the checkbox to hide recognized offensive voice results.
- **Auto correction:** Touch to turn on/off auto correction, or you can also adjust the sensitivity of correction.
- **Show correction suggestions:** Touch to show or not the correction suggestions while typing.
- **Next-word suggestions:** Mark the checkbox to use the previous word in making suggestions.
- **Advanced settings:** Touch to view more advanced settings for android keyboard, such as **Suggest Contact names**, **Double-space period**, etc.


### Voice Search

Touch to enter voice search settings.

- **Language:** Touch to choose a language for voice search.

- **Speech output:** Touch to choose speech output: **On, Hands-free only** or **Off**.
- **"OK Google" Detection:** Touch to start a voice search from the Google app by saying "OK Google".
- **Block offensive words:** Mark the checkbox to hide recognized offensive voice results.
- **Bluetooth headset:** Mark the checkbox to enable record audio through Bluetooth headset if available.

### Text-to-speech settings

- **Preferred engine:** Touch to choose a preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the settings icon  to show more choices for each engine.
- **Speech rate:** Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.
- **Listen to an example:** Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.
- **Default language status:** Touch to view whether selected system language is supported.

### Voice control

Touch to select app and language for voice control.

### Pointer speed

Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed, touch **OK** to confirm.

## 12.3.4 Backup & reset

### Back up my data

Mark the checkbox to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google Servers, with your Google account. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

### Backup account

Touch to back up your account.

### Automatic restore

Mark the checkbox to restore your backed up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

### DRM reset

Touch to delete all DRM licenses.

### Factory data reset

Erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your micro SD card, such as music or photos. If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

## 12.4 ACCOUNTS

### 12.4.1 Add account

Use the Add account to add, remove, and manage your Google and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronize data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

Gmail, Google Calendar, and other applications may also have their own settings to control how they synchronize data; see the sections on those applications for details.

Touch an account to see all sync options. Mark the checkbox to permit applications to synchronize data on their own schedule. You can also touch the **Menu** key and **Sync now** to synchronize data for the chosen items of that account.

### 12.5.1 Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

#### Automatic date & time

Select to **Use network-provided time** or **Use GPS-provided time**, or touch **Off** to close automatic date & time.

#### Automatic time zone

Mark the checkbox to use network-provided time zone. Or unmark to set all values manually.

#### Set date

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's date.

#### Set time

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's time.

#### Select time zone

Touch to open a dialog where you can set the phone's time zone.

#### Use 24-hour format

Mark the checkbox to display the time using 24-hour clock format.

#### Choose date format

Touch to open a dialog where you can select the format for displaying dates.

### 12.5.2 Schedule power on/off

Touch to preset the power on/off time and repeat mode.

### 12.5.3 Accessibility

You can use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

#### TalkBack

When TalkBack is on, your device provides spoken feedback to help blind and low vision users.

#### Captions

Touch to turn on and set up language, text size and style for captions.



## **Magnification**

Touch to turn on/ off the Magnification gestures.

## **Large text**

Mark the checkbox to enlarge the screen text.

## **Power button ends call**

Mark the checkbox to end a call by pressing the Power key during the call.

## **Speak passwords**

Mark the checkbox to speak passwords while typing.

## **Accessibility**

Touch to turn on/ off the Accessibility shortcut.

## **Text-to-speech settings**

Touch to set **Preferred engine**, **Speech rate** and **Listen to an example**.

## **Touch & hold delay**

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your phone to differ touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

## **12.5.4 Printing**

Touch to turn on cloud Print.

## **12.5.5 Regulatory & Safety**

Touch to view product information.

## **12.5.6 About phone**

This contains information about things ranging from Legal information, Model number, Firmware version, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number to those listed below:

### **Software update service**

Touch to check for software updates.

### **Status**

This contains the status of the Battery status, Battery level, My phone number, Network, Signal strength, etc.

### **Legal information**

Touch to view legal information.

# 13 Making the most of your phone .....

## 13.1 FOTA Upgrade

Using the FOTA Upgrade tool you can update your phone's software.

To access **System update**, please touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then **Settings>About phone\Software update service**. Touch **Check for updates**, and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, please touch the button **Download**, after it is done please touch **Install** to complete the upgrade. Now your phone will have the latest software version.

You should turn on data connection or connect through Wi-Fi before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check intervals is also available once you restart the phone.

If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, dialog will pop up to choose download or ignore, the notification also will show in status bar.

### FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01- 09 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aid. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities. While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aid and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate. The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box. The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.



M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not rated. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. Your device is rated M3.

The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.
