Positioning the TV

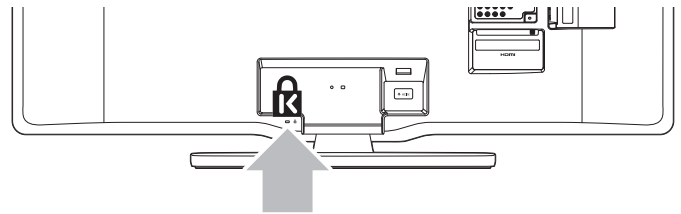
- Do not insert the AC power cord into the power socket outlet before all the connections are made.
- Large screen TVs are heavy, 2 people are required to carry and handle a large screen TV.
- Before you move the TV, disconnect attached cables to prevent damage to connectors.

In addition to reading and understanding safety instructions, consider the following before positioning your TV:

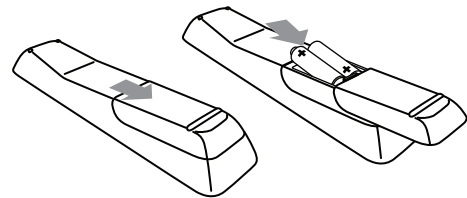
- Ensure that you always have easy access to the AC power cord or plug to disconnect the TV from the power.
- If the TV is mounted on a swivel base, ensure that no strain is placed on the AC power cord when the TV is swiveled. Strain on the AC power cord can loosen connections.
- The ideal viewing distance for watching TV is three times its screen size.
- Position the TV where light does not fall on the screen.
- Connect your devices before you position the TV.

Using a Kensington lock

There is a Kensington security slot on the back of the TV. Prevent theft by looping a Kensington lock between the slot and a permanent object, such as a heavy table.



Installing the remote control batteries

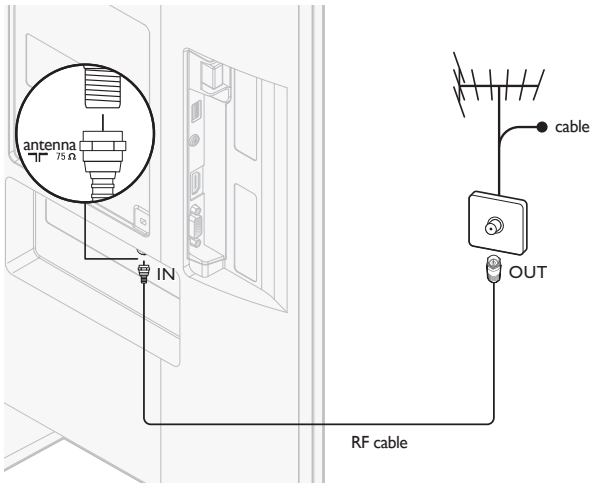


- 1 Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.
- 2 Insert the 2 supplied batteries (AAA, 1.5V). Be sure the + and - ends of the batteries line up with the markings inside the case.
- 3 Slide the cover back into position.

- Remove the batteries if not using the remote control for an extended period of time.

Connecting the antenna or cable



If you connect to an antenna

Any DTV programs that are broadcast in your area can be received for free through an antenna connection.

Contact your local content provider or your local electronics retailer if you are unsure about what HDTV programs are available in your area.

Broadcasters are transitioning from analog to digital TV. This means that a given broadcaster can have channels available either in analog or in digital, or both analog and digital at the same time.

The TV produces stereo sound only if a stereo signal is broadcast.

If you connect to a cable

When your TV is connected to the cable socket, you might receive free digital and high definition programs (depending on your cable provider). The channel number for digital and high definition channels includes a dot "•". For example, 11.1, 46.30, 108.201. Contact your cable provider for more information.

If you connect to a DBS (Direct Broadcast Satellite)

There are two main DBS systems: DirecTV and DishNetwork. These systems require a separate, proprietary set-top box to decode signals and send them to the TV. The set-top box contains a digital TV tuner for receiving off-air digital broadcasts.

Contact your local DBS provider for more information about the connections and the TV channels.

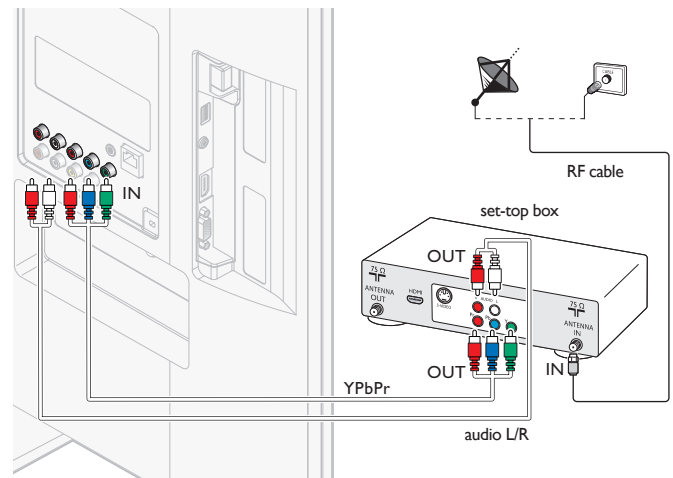

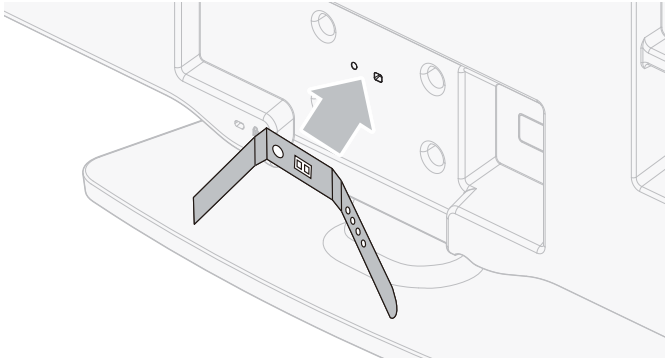

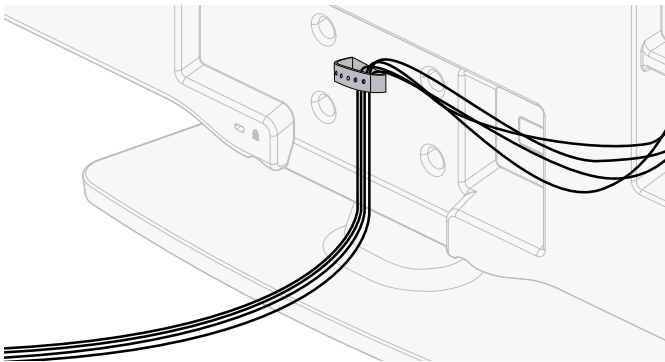
Managing cables

Route your antenna cable and all other cables through the cable management tie at the back of the TV. The holder helps keep your cables tidy and easily manageable.

- 1 Attach the cable management tie as illustrated below.



- 2 Pass cables through the cable management tie to avoid tangles.

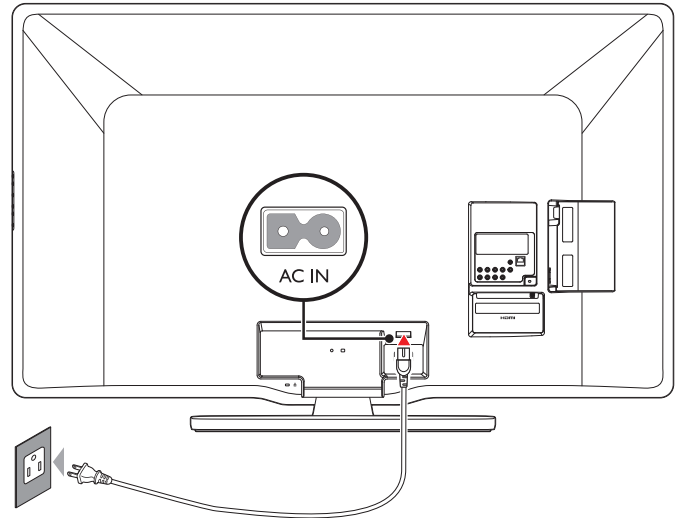


Connecting the AC power cord

Warning

- Verify that your power voltage corresponds with the voltage printed at the back of the TV. Do not insert the AC power cord if the voltage is different.

- 1 Locate the power connector at the back of the TV. The location of the power connector varies according to TV model.
- 2 Insert the AC power cord fully into the power connector.
- 3 Connect the AC power cord plug to the power outlet. Ensure that the cord is tightly secured at both ends.



Disconnect the TV from the power outlet

Caution

- Pull the AC power cord by the plug; do not pull on the AC power cord.

- 1 Unplug the AC power cord from the power outlet.
- 2 Unplug the AC power cord from the power connector at the back of the TV.

Switching on and initial setup

Before you switch on the TV, check that the AC power cord is properly connected. Press **POWER** at the right side of the TV, or press **(standby-On)** on the remote control. The TV normally takes 25-30 seconds to start up and the following screen appears the first time you turn on the TV.

After you read a welcome screen, follow the on-screen instructions to select your language and complete your TV setup. Installation takes approximately 20 minutes.



Network setup screen will appear. Use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Next] > [Wireless]/[Wired]**, then press **OK**.

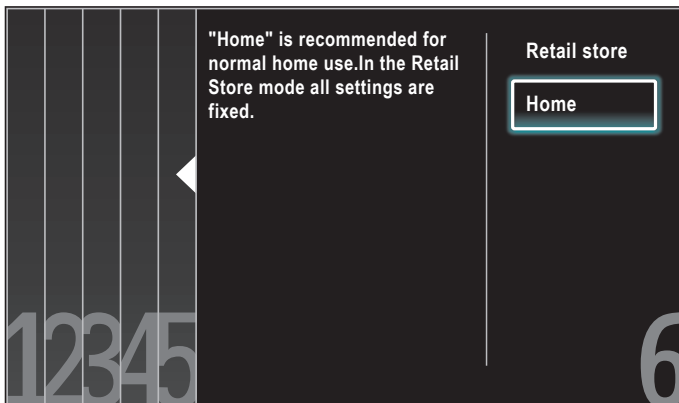
- If you select **[Wireless]**, use **▲/▼** to select a setting and then press **OK**.

Setting items	Description
Easy connect	Select this setting if your router has a Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button. Start scanning for wireless networks on the TV after pressing the WPS button on your router. If connection test fails, refer to the router's manual for more details.
Scan	Search for wireless networks automatically and select the wireless network name (SSID) from the list. see 'Wireless network setting (Auto)' on page 29.

- If you select **[Wired]**, use **▲/▼** to select a setting and then press **OK**.

Connection test will start automatically. (See 'Connection test' on page 29.)

Press **▲/▼** to select the desired mode for energy saving, then press **OK**.



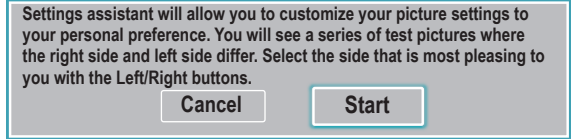

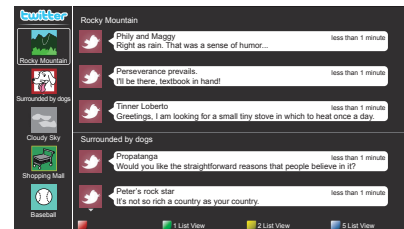

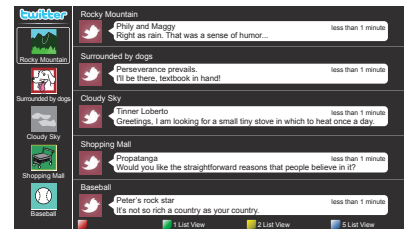

- **[Mode selection]** will not be displayed when incoming signals are other than 720x480p 60Hz, 1280x720p 60Hz and 1920x1080p 24/30/60Hz.
- **[Digital Natural Motion]** If the input video contains adjacent video frames with inherent motion blur captured by the video camera, **[Digital Natural Motion]** will interpolate blur and cause streaking artifacts in high motion scenes. If the content you are watching causes a lot of Interpolation Induced Blur Amplification, it is best to turn off **[Digital Natural Motion]** temporarily.
- **[Digital Natural Motion]** uses frame interpolation to make the video appear smooth which causes a video lag of about 200 milliseconds. If you are using the TV for gaming or as a PC monitor DNM will introduce lag. Closed caption

Closed captioning is an assistive technology that allows persons with hearing disabilities to access television programming. Closed captioning displays the audio portion of programming as text superimposed over the video.

Note

- Closed captioning service may not be controlled by this unit's menu options if you are watching television through an external cable or satellite set top box. In which case you will need to use the menu options on the external set top box to control Closed Captioning.
- The captions do not always use correct spelling and grammar. Not all TV programs and product commercials include closed caption information. Refer to your area TV program listings for the TV channels and times of closed caption shows. The captioned programs are usually noted in the TV listings with service marks such as **[CC]**.

Display captions

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Features] > [Caption settings] > [Closed captions]**.

- consult any consumer information and manuals/guides on closed captions for DTV programming provided by your subscription television provider;
- ensure that the captioning function on your set-top box, if applicable, is turned on; and,
- ensure that the captioning function on your DTV is turned on.

If you are still unable to view closed captions on DTV programming, you should contact your subscription television provider for assistance.

TV

Selecting caption services

Sleeptimer

You can always put your TV in standby mode earlier or reset the sleeptimer during the countdown.

- 1 Press **SLEEP** to set the sleeptimer. (Also, you can set the sleeptimer in **[Features]** menu.)
- 2 Use **SLEEP** or **◀/▶** repeatedly to change the amount of time (in increments of 30 minutes up to 180 minutes).

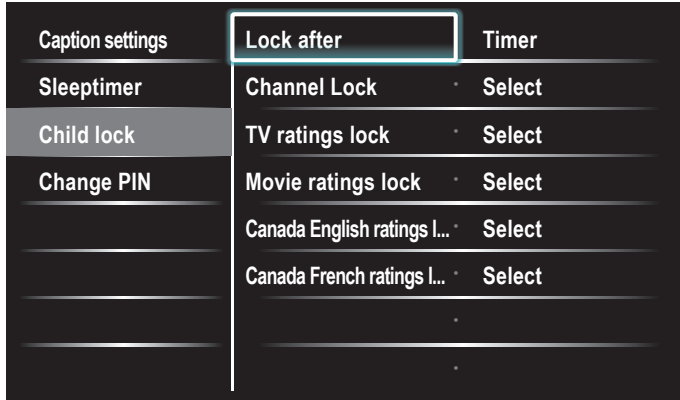

Using the TV ratings lock

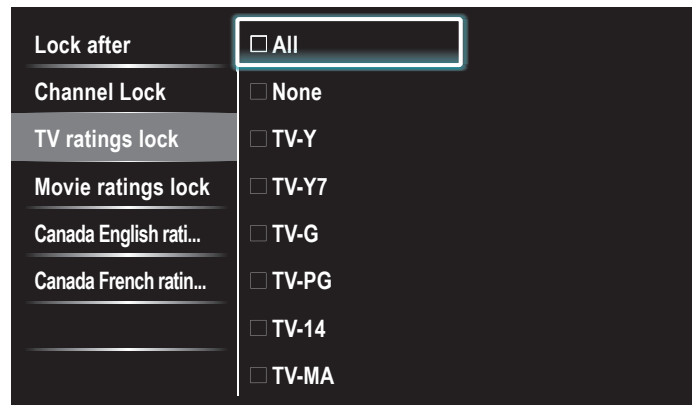
Your TV is equipped with a V-chip that allows you to control access to individual programs based on their age rating and content rating. The program content advisory data are sent by the broadcaster or by the program provider.

If you receive channels through a set-top box or cable box connected by HDMI, you cannot use the TV ratings lock. Your set-top box or cable box must be connected through RF or AV connectors.

- **[TV Speakers]** will be displayed only when **[Master EasyLink]** is set to **[On]**. (See 'EasyLink' on page 28.)

Watch your Video on a USB storage device

- 1 In the USB content browser, use ▲/▼ to select **[Video]**.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to select a file or a folder on the USB storage device.



- 3 Press **OK** or **▶||** to play the selected files.
 - Press **OK** or **▶||** to pause, press **OK** or **▶||** again to resume.
 - Press **▶▶** to fast-forward search.
 - Press **◀◀** to fast-backward search.
 - Press **■** to stop playback.
 - ↳ Press **▶||** to resume from the point at which playback was stopped. Press **OK** to play from the beginning of the file at which playback was stopped.

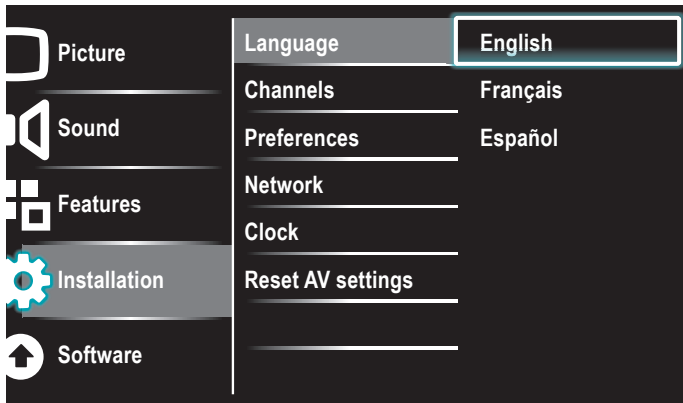

7 Install channels

The first time you set up your TV, you are prompted to select a menu language and to install TV and digital radio channels (if available). This chapter provides instructions on how to reinstall and fine-tune channels.

Selecting your menu language

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Installation] > [Language]**.

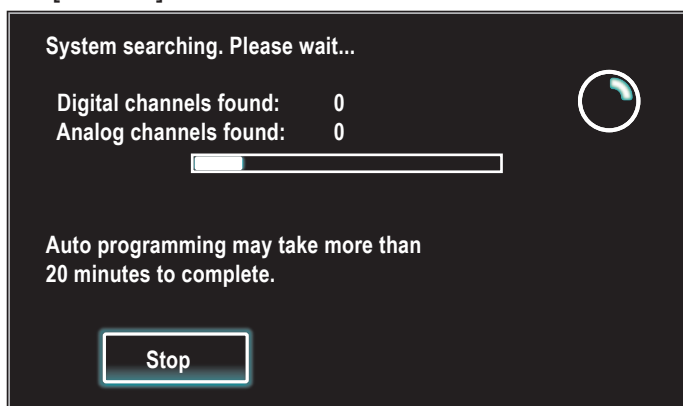


- 2 Select a language and then press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

Autoprogram

If you switch wires (e.g., between antenna and CATV) or if you move the unit to a different area after the initial setting, you will need to perform autoprogram.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Installation] > [Channels] > [Autoprogram] > [Start now]**.



- 2 Press **OK** to start the installation.
If you run **[Autoprogram]** when you have locked channels, a message appears asking to enter your PIN. Enter your PIN in order to complete the installation.
If you have forgotten your PIN, reset it as described in 'Changing your PIN' on page 25.
 - When autoprogramming is complete, the lowest memorized channel will be displayed.
- 3 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Weak channel installation

This function lets you add the channels that were not added by the autoprogram due to the receivable condition at the initial setup.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Installation] > [Channels] > [Weak channel installation]**.
- 2 Use **◀/▶** to select channel input box, then use **▲/▼** to select a channel you want to memorize.
- 3 Use **◀/▶** to select **[Search]**, then press **OK**.
- 4 Display will be changed to **[Store]** from **[Search]** when the channel is found, then press **OK**.
- 5 Press **MENU** to exit.

Note

- In most cases, digital channels are not broadcast on the RF channel on which they appear on your TV. To add digital channels you need to know the RF channel on which the digital channel is being broadcast. E.g. If there is a digital channel 9.1 which is being broadcast on RF channel 25, you need to enter 25 while performing a weak channel installation. To find out the RF channel on which a particular digital channel is being broadcast, please contact your local service provider. Installing digital channels using **[Weak channel installation]** might not work for direct cable connections and if the digital signal is too weak for the TV to process.

Installation mode

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Installation] > [Channels] > [Installation mode]**.
- 2 Use **▲/▼** to select, then press **OK**.
- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

Uninstall channels

Those channels can still be selected with the **Number** buttons.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Setup] > [Installation] > [Channels] > [Uninstall channels]**.
- 2 Use **▲/▼** to select the channel you want to remove, then press **OK**.
 - You will not be able to select the channel again using **CH +/-**.
 - To reactivate a removed channel, use **▲/▼** and then press **OK**.
- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

Return your settings to default values

When you return picture and sound settings to their default values the channel installation settings are not affected.

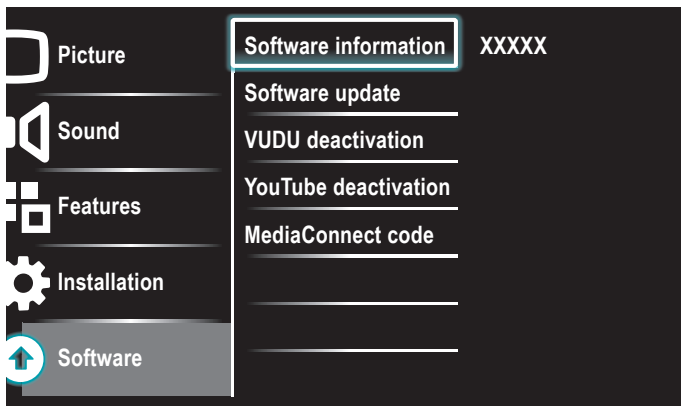

- 2 Press **OK** to reset the picture and sound settings.
- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

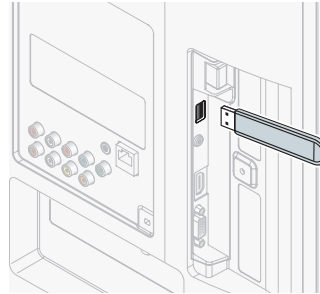

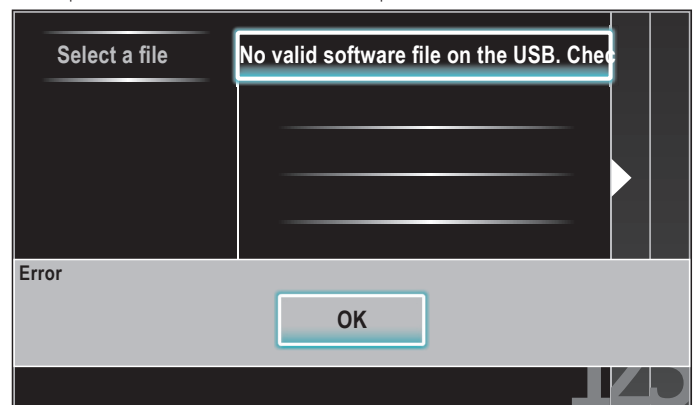

Network update

 - The unit will start updating the firmware version.

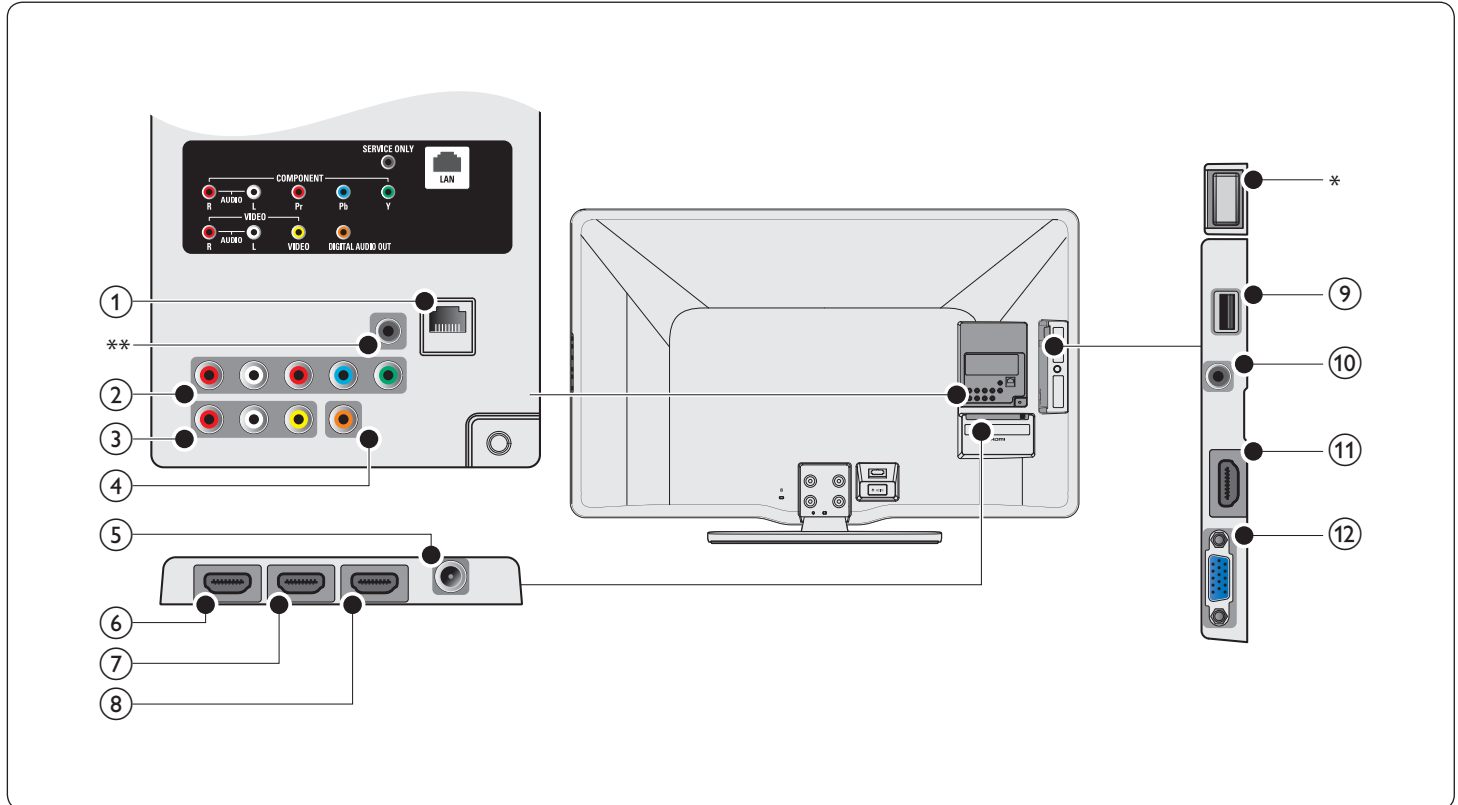

9 Connect devices

This section describes how to connect various devices with different connectors and supplements examples provided in the Quick Start Guide.

Connection overview



- ① **Ethernet port**
For internet connection using an Ethernet cable with a RJ-45 connector.
 - ② **Component video and audio input jack**
Video input from analog devices such as DVD, receiver, game console, etc. This connector is used with audio input.
 - ③ **Composite video and audio input jack**
Video input for analog devices such as DVD, camcorder, game console, etc. To be used with audio input.
 - ④ **Digital audio output jack**
Digital audio output to home theaters and other digital audio systems.
 - ⑤ **Antenna input jack**
Signal input from an antenna, cable or satellite.
 - ⑥ **HDMI 1 input jack**
First HDMI in connector.
Digital audio and video input from high definition digital devices such as Blu-ray players.
In addition to normal HDMI functionality, outputs TV audio to an HDMI ARC-compliant device, such as a home theater system.
(HDMI 1 only)
 - ⑦ **HDMI 2 input jack**
Second HDMI in connector.
 - ⑧ **HDMI 3 input jack**
Third HDMI in connector.
 - ⑨ **USB terminal**
Data input from USB storage devices only. Do not connect any device to this terminal such as; digital camera, keyboard, mouse, etc.
 - ⑩ **Audio input jack for HDMI 4 and PC**
 - ⑪ **HDMI 4 input jack**
Fourth HDMI in connector.
 - ⑫ **PC input jack**
VGA cable connection for PC.
- * **Wireless LAN (internal)**
Please make sure that there are no obstacles between the TV and the wireless router. Other devices and wireless routers using the 2.4GHz spectrum might cause interference and dropouts in connection. Refer to the user manual of your wireless router to select the best transmission channel in your usage settings.
- ** **service only**
For use by service personnel only.

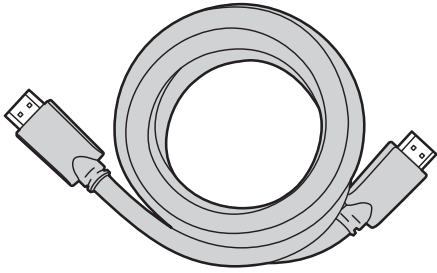
- Disconnect the AC power cord before connecting devices.

- Do not use an extension cord between the USB flash memory and the unit. Always insert the USB flash memory to this unit directly.
- Different types of connectors may be used to connect a device to your TV, depending on availability and your needs.

Selecting your connection quality

HDMI - Highest quality

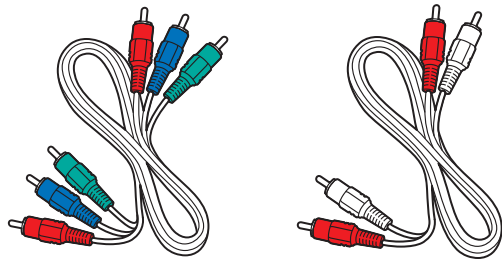


Supports high-definition signals and gives highest picture and sound quality. Video and audio signals are combined in one cable. You must use HDMI for full high-definition video and to enable Philips EasyLink.

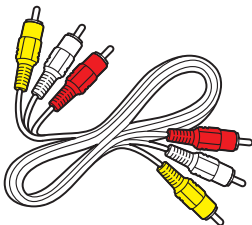

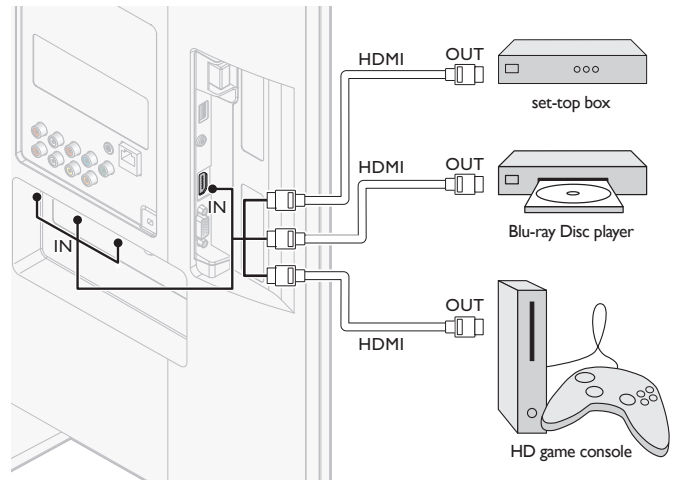


Composite video/audio cable (yellow/red/white)
For analog connections. Composite cables usually combine a yellow video cable with a red/white audio L/R cable. Match the audio cable colors when you connect to the TV.

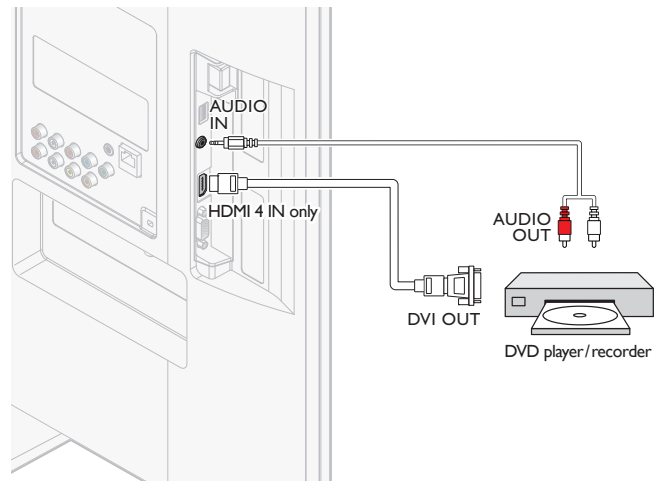

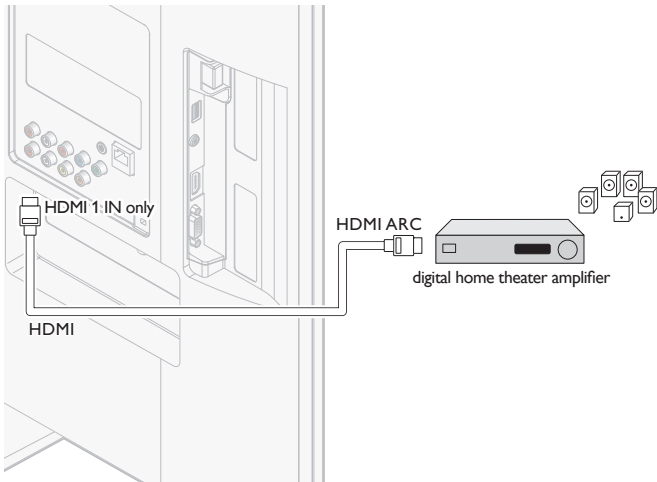

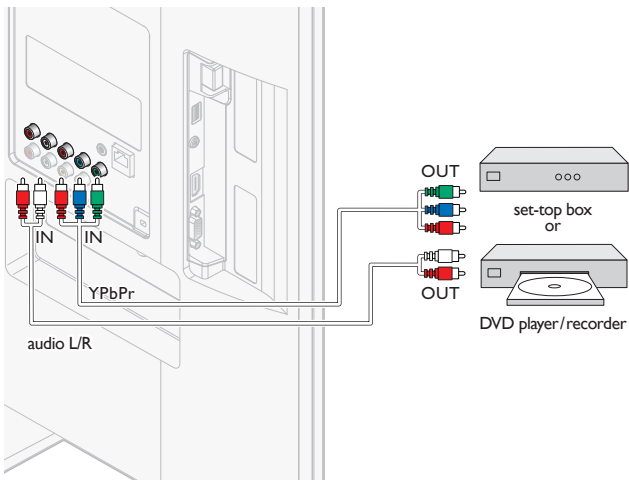

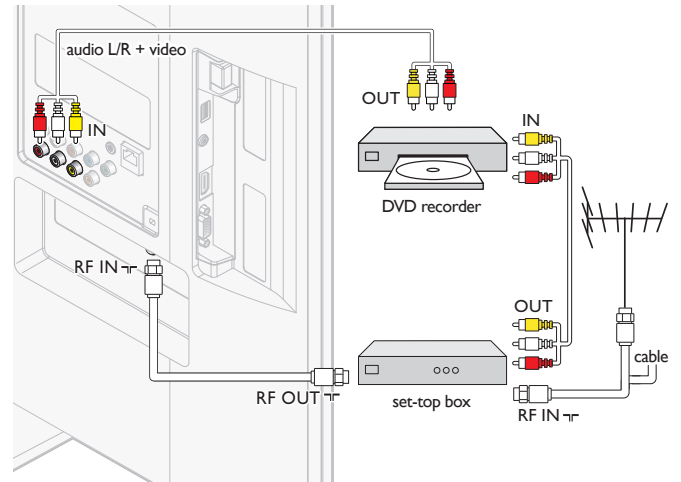

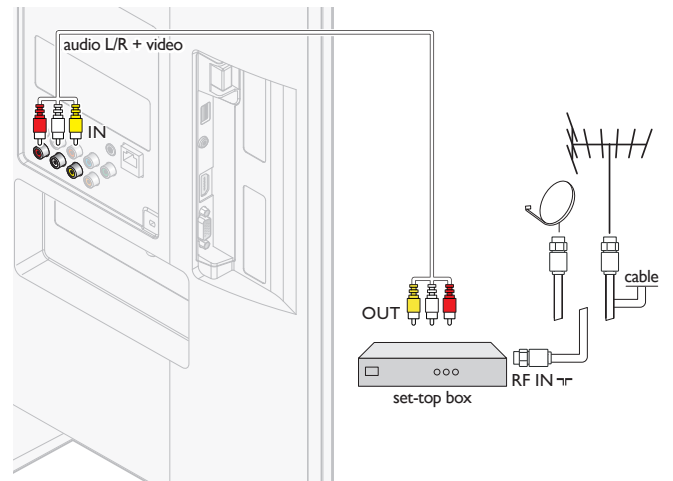

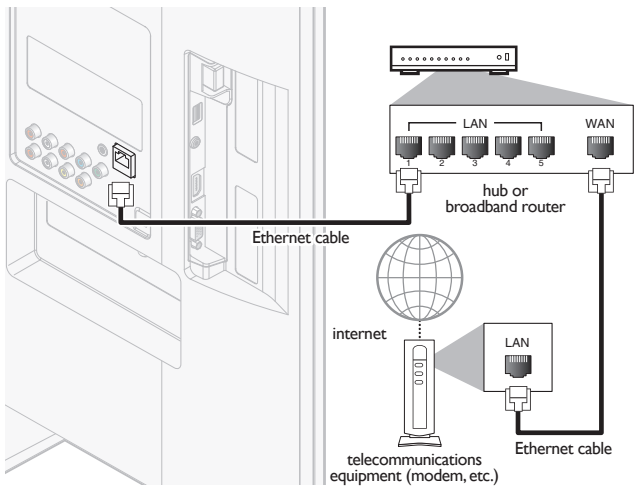
Connecting a set-top box via a composite connector and analog audio

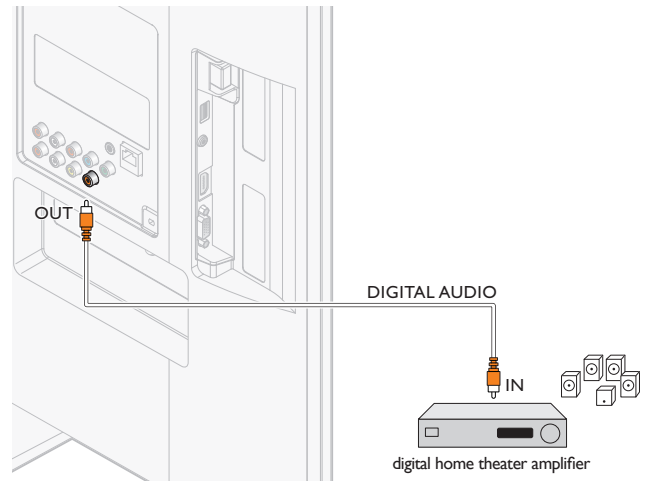

- If your telecommunications equipment (modem, etc.) does not have broadband router functions, connect a broadband router.
- If your telecommunications equipment (modem, etc.) has broadband router functions but there is no vacant port, use a hub.
- For a broadband router, use a router which supports 10BASE-T/100BASE-TX.
- Do not connect your PC directly to the Ethernet port of this unit.

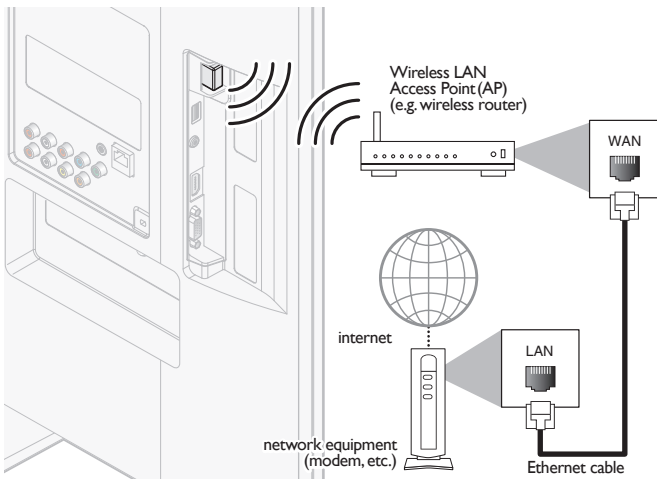

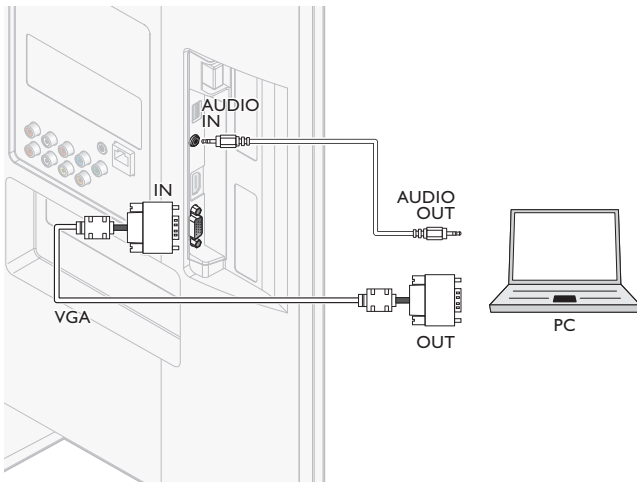

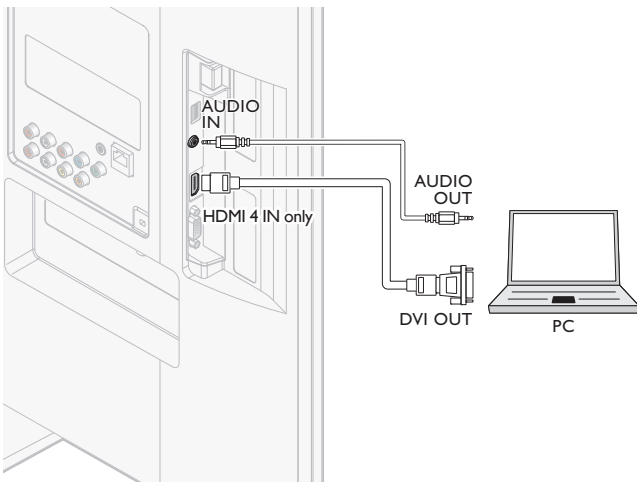

- Use a Wireless LAN Access Point (AP) (e.g. wireless router) which supports IEEE 802.11 b/g/n. (n is recommended for stable operation of the wireless network.)
- This unit does not support Ad-hoc mode.
- Other radio devices or obstacles may cause interference to the wireless network connection.

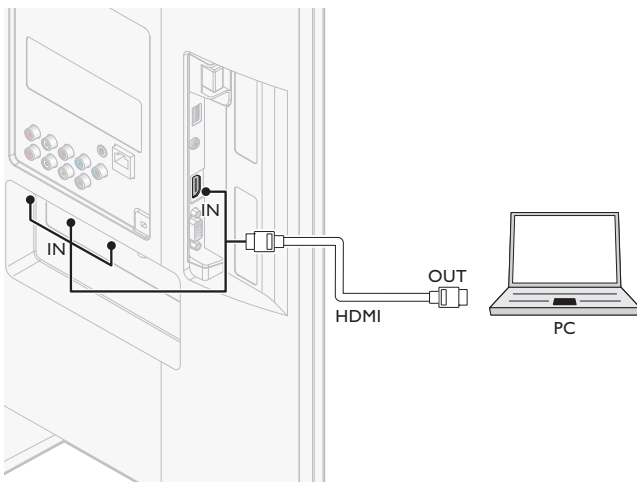

Add devices

After connecting devices, assign the device attached to each connector. This allows you to easily identify devices connected to your TV.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and then use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select **[Add new devices]**.
 - 2 Use **◀/▶** to select **[Start]**, then press **OK**.
 - 3 Use **▲/▼** to select a device and press **OK**.
 - 4 Use **▲/▼** to select the connector your device is connected to and press **OK**.
 - 5 If there is video and audio output, press **OK**.
- Repeat the procedure until all devices are correctly assigned to connectors.

Remove devices

If a device is no longer connected to the TV, remove it from the home menu.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control.
- 2 Use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select a device to remove.
- 3 Press **OPTIONS**.
- 4 Use **▲/▼** to select **[Remove device]**, then press **OK**.
- 5 Use **◀/▶** to select **[OK]**, then press **OK**.

Note

HDMI/DisplayPort Audio Specifics:

- To hear your PC audio from the TV speakers, make sure the default playback device is the HDMI Audio Device and not your computer speakers/soundcard.
- The HDMI Audio device is a child device on your graphics card, which means your graphics card video & HDMI audio drivers need to be up to date and bug free (we have seen many cases where having a bad video driver resulted in no HDMI audio).
- Make the TV the only output device. Sometimes if you extend your desktop to the TV or duplicate the desktop with another monitor or your laptop screen, Windows does not make the HDMI audio devices as the default audio playback device.

10 Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible cause and solution
No power or indicator light.	The TV is not connected to the power. Press POWER at the side of the TV or on the remote control. Ensure that the AC power cord is connected tightly to the TV power connector and to the power socket outlet. Remove the AC power cord from the power socket outlet, wait 60 seconds and reconnect the AC power cord. Connect the TV to a different power socket outlet.
No picture or sound is detected from the device using HDMI 1-4 input jack.	HDCP authentication fail. Ensure that your HDMI cable is certified. Press SOURCE on the remote control to switch to another source and then switch back to the HDMI source. Reset the accessory device and the TV. Turn on the TV. Select the HDMI channel. Turn on the accessory device. While the TV and the accessory device are powered on, unplug either end of the HDMI cable and then reinsert the cable.
No sound is detected from the PC using PC input jack.	An audio cable is not connected. Connect an audio cable to the PC/HDMI 4 AUDIO IN on the TV. Press SOURCE on the remote control, and select the PC source.
No picture or sound is detected from the PC using HDMI 4 input jack.	An incorrect HDMI input jack is connected or an audio cable is not connected. Connect a HDMI-DVI cable to the HDMI 4 input jack on the TV. Connect an audio cable to the PC/HDMI 4 AUDIO IN on the TV. Press SOURCE on the remote control, and select the HDMI 4 source.
TV does not respond to the remote control.	Batteries are installed incorrectly, or low battery power. Ensure that you are using the TV remote control. Ensure that the batteries are inserted correctly and do not need to be replaced. Remove the AC power cord from the power socket outlet, wait 60 seconds and reconnect the AC power cord.
The picture is distorted, stretched out, or has black bars on the side or top.	Broadcast video format. Press FORMAT on the remote control to select the best picture format. For some accessory devices, the picture format must be set in the accessory device.
The picture is mostly red and green, or the picture misses red when connected to an accessory device via component cables.	Insecure/incorrect connection. Ensure all the connections are made according to the color code. Push the component cables all the way into the YPbPr sockets on the TV.
No picture or sound.	No picture or sound - ensure you have selected the correct channel. Incomplete channel installation. If the TV receives channels via an AV connection, set the TV to the correct source input. If the TV is connected directly to the wall via a coaxial connection, perform the autoprogram again.
No sound on the TV loudspeaker.	Volume level is set to zero - increase the volume. Sound is muted - press MUTE on the remote control. Audio cable is not connected - for AV connection, ensure that the Audio L/R cable is connected as described in Connecting your devices. (See 'Connecting your devices' on page 38.) If you use a component cable, ensure that you have not crossed the red audio cable with the red video cable. Audio output setting for the accessory device is incorrect. For HDMI connections, some accessory devices have an HDMI audio output setting that must be turned on for HDMI to HDMI connections. Check if [Sound] > [TV Speakers] > [Off] is set to [On] . No sound will be output when [TV Speakers] is set to [Off] .
Bad picture quality with a coaxial connection.	Standard definition channels are not as clear as high definition channels - connect the devices via component or HDMI cables.
Cannot control your TV and connected devices with one remote control.	Confirm that the connected devices are EasyLink compliant and are connected to your TV via an HDMI cable. Not all brands of devices such as Blu-ray Disc players use the same system as Philips EasyLink. Other brands might not work with Philips EasyLink.
Folder or files stored on DLNA home media server are not displayed in the file list or cannot be played back.	Check the setting on your home media server. (Refer to the user manual of the home media server.) Check the network connection and settings.
Cannot use VUDU feature.	VUDU is available only in the United States and Mexico. Check if the network connection is properly made.
Cannot rent or buy movies/TV episodes on VUDU.	You need to activate the VUDU account. (Refer to page 17.) Log into your account at http://my.vudu.com and check your payment information.
The picture quality of streaming movie (VUDU) is poor.	Check the speed of your internet connection. You need speeds of at least 8 Mbps to this player for high quality uninterrupted playback.
Streaming movie (VUDU) often stops or starts buffering during playback.	Contact your internet service provider to troubleshoot your internet connection for speed and line quality. Consistent line quality and speed are very important for internet video playback.

The audio of internet radio station interrupted.	vTuner server; station or the internet connection is busy. The bit rate of the station is high.
Cannot connect to the network.	Check if the Ethernet cable connection is properly made. Turn on the modem or broadband router. Check the network settings. Check if the broadband router and/or modem is correctly connected.
Cannot connect to the network while my PC is connected to the network.	Check the content of your internet service contract to see if your internet Service Provider prevents multiple terminals connecting at the same time.
Cannot play back internet radio.	Check if the network connection is properly made. Check the firewall setting of the modem or router. For some stations, playback is not available on this unit.
The quality of the internet radio audio is poor or noise occurs during playback of internet station.	The bit rate of the station is low.
Cannot use the wireless connection.	Check if the Wireless LAN Access Point (AP) (e.g. wireless router) is oriented properly or not placed too close between them. Once you have activated the wireless connection please wait 30 seconds for the connection to be established after turning on the unit, before trying to access network features such as NetTV.
Cannot get into the PC's screen even the Philips Wireless MediaConnect is launched.	The start up screen (PHILIPS logo with spinning circle) keep displaying until the unit found the PC that is running Philips Wireless MediaConnect. Make sure if the network connection is connected properly. Check if your PC runs Philips Wireless MediaConnect. Make sure your TV and PC are connected on the same network.
I have a 1.8GHz CPU but MediaConnect does not work on my PC.	For smooth operation of your PC while Philips MediaConnect is running you need a mainstream dual core processor from Intel® or AMD. Intel®: Core™2Duo or Core™ i3/i5/i7 @ 1.8GHz or higher. AMD: Athlon II X2, Turion II Dual-Core™ or Phenom X2 @ 2GHz or higher.

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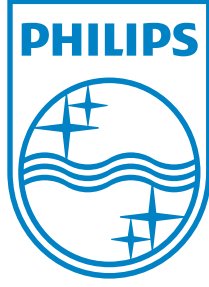
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
