

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Audio Volume Leveler (AVL) Control keeps the TV sound at an even level. Differences in volume levels during commercial breaks are reduced, making for a more consistent, comfortable sound for your listening pleasure (Pg. 15).

Update Clock makes the clock of the TV be consistent with the time extracted from the current channel in Digital mode. (Pg. 25).

Parental Control lets you block programs from viewing with content not suitable for children or with restricted TV ratings (Pg. 17-22).

Channel Edit & Name Lets you skip or unskip channels from the selection cycle with CH+/CH-. Also, Channel Edit allows you to give a name to a certain channel (Pg. 12).

Closed Caption allows you to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as onscreen text. (Pg.26-27).

Digital Audio allows you to switch to another audio language when it is available. This is only for programs that are shown in more than one audio language (Pg. 15).

TV Switching Off automatically turns OFF the TV after a set amount of time that you have chosen (Pg. 25)

Auto Off turns the TV off automatically when no signal has been received for 15 minutes. "TV Switching Off" will appear during the last minute before the TV switches off. If there is any operation done during the last minute, the Auto Off will be cancelled and will reinitialize the countdown to 15 minutes again.

What is Digital Television (DTV)?

Digital Television (DTV) is a relatively new type of broadcasting that promises to transform television viewing into a whole new experience. Digital technology is used to capture images and sound to deliver a better picture quality.

There are many levels of digital television quality. The most common are:

Standard Definition TV (SDTV)

SDTV is the basic level of quality display and resolution for both analog and digital. Transmission of SDTV can be in the traditional (4:3) or widescreen (16:9) format.

Enhanced Definition TV (EDTV)

EDTV is better in picture quality than analog television. The formats for EDTV are 480p widescreen (16:9) or traditional (4:3). EDTV is in the middle range quality between SDTV and HDTV.

High Definition TV (HDTV)

HDTV has the highest quality for digital broadcast formats. Its resolution is widescreen format (16:9). Combined with digitally enhanced sound technology, HDTV sets new standards for sound and picture quality in television.

Difference between Digital and Analog?

Digital Television is a more flexible and efficient technology than the analog broadcast system. Analog broadcasts can only provide one program at a time. Digital television can broadcast a high definition program or more than one standard definition program at the same time. With Digital television you can receive information of programs through the Information Banner. This information is provided by the broadcaster.

QUICK TIPS BEFORE YOU START

- I When the TV is powered on for the first time you will be prompted to auto install the TV in order to receive the channels that are broadcasted locally.
- 2 Auto installation may take **20** to **40** minutes depending on the number of channels that are transmitted by the cable provider or broadcaster.
- When the TV is not receiving any signal from the antenna / cable, **NO SIGNAL** will appear on the TV screen. This can be caused by the antenna /cable not being plugged in correctly or when the wrong tuner mode is selected.
 - When no transmission is received from the broadcaster, **NO PROGRAM** will appear on the TV screen.
 - When in Digital Mode an "audio only" (without video picture) signal is received from the broadcaster, **AUDIO ONLY** will appear on the TV screen.
- 4 You will not be able to receive pay channels when using direct antenna/ cable connection to the television.
- When the set-top box is connected to the television using coaxial cable, it is necessary to auto-program the television for the signal channel (3 or 4) that the set-top box outputs and change the channels at the set-top box to view the program.
- When the set-top box is connected to the television using **AV** connection, select the television input source for the set-top box to view the program and change the channels at the set-top box to view the program.
- 7 Pressing the **Ana/Dig** button on the remote control toggles the TV between Digital and Analog Mode.



BASICTV AND REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION


Press **POWER** button on the TV to turn it on.

Press the **VOLUME** + to increase the sound level and **VOLUME** - to lower the sound level.

Press **CHANNEL +** or - to select TV channels.

Point the remote control towards the remote sensor window on the front of the TV when using the remote control.

Press **MENU** button on the remote to display the onscreen menu.




REMOTE CONTROL

ow to load the supplied batteries into the remote control.

Remove the battery compartment lid on the back of the remote control.

Insert two AA-sized batteries into the battery compartment, making sure the positive + and negative - polarity line up correctly as indicated inside the case.



FIRST TIME YOU TURN ON THE TV

The first time you turn on the new TV set, you will see a screen that helps you to auto install the programs. Auto installation starts with the analogue channels followed by the digital channels. The time taken for installation depends on the number of channels available. You can stop the first auto installation by pressing the **POWER** button on the remote control. The auto installation is stopped and the TV goes into standby mode. Any channels that have already been found are stored.


Note: This screen will only appear the first time you turn on the TV. If you wish to auto install programs later, please follow the procedure on the next page (page 9).

Follow the instructions on this screen to start auto installation:

Press **CURSOR** < or > to select Antenna or Cable. Press **OK** button to confirm and start auto installation.



HELPFUL HINTS

ANTENNA: If you have an off-air or roof-top antenna, select **Antenna**.

CABLE: If you have subscribed to cable signal from any cable company, or you are receiving free-to-air cable channels through your wall connection select *Cable*.

The first-time installation will install both Digital and Analog channels.

AUTO CHANNEL SEARCH

You can auto install programs on your TV. This makes it easy for you to select only the TV stations in your area when the CHANNEL (+) or (-) buttons are pressed.

Follow these steps for Digital Mode and Analog Mode.

Complete the antenna or cable signal connection before activating AUTO CHANNEL SEARCH. See "How to make the best connection guide" for details.

Press **MENU** button on the remote control to display onscreen menu.

Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the onscreen menu until you see **Setup** highlighted.


Press **CURSOR** < or > to display the SETUP menu features.



When searching completes, the CHANNEL EDIT AND NAME menu will appear on the screen.

When **Cable** is selected, channels I to I35 are available in Digital Mode and channels I to I25 are available in Analog Mode.

When **Antenna** is selected, channels 2 to 69 are available for both Digital and Analog Modes.

When you are in **Digital Mode**, channel numbers will be displayed as 1-2, or 2-35 etc.

Whether you selected either Cable or Antenna mode, both Digital and Analog channels will be installed.

HOWTO USETHE LANGUAGE CONTROL







Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the onscreen menu until you see **Setup** highlighted.



- Press CURSOR \(\cap \nt \nt \) to highlight any FAV., and use NUMERIC buttons to enter or press CURSOR < or > to select a channel No. for each Favorite. If the channel is named, its name will be displayed simultaneously.
- When finished, press **CLEAR** button to clear the menu from the TV screen.
- Press **FAV** button repeatedly to go to the favorite channels you have set. If you want to cancel one or two channels from the favortie channel cycle, just go back to FAVORITE LIST menu. Use **CURSOR** \land or \lor to highlight the corresponding favorites and press **CURSOR** < or > to select **None**.

HELPFUL HINTS

When you are in Digital mode, you can only set Digital favorite channels. And in Digital mode, you can only access the Digital favorite channels.



PICTURE MENU CONTROLS

To adjust your TV picture controls, select a channel and use the Picture Menu Controls listed below. Your selection is stored as Personal.

Follow these steps for Digital Mode and Analog Mode.

Press **MENU** button on the remote control to display onscreen menu.

Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the onscreen menu until you see **Picture** highlighted.

Press **CURSOR** < or > to display the PICTURE menu features.

Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the picture features and use **CURSOR** < or > to adjust:

<u>Picture Preset Control</u> - to select a video setting from Sports, Weak Signal, Multimedia, Movies or Personal to enhance the current program source or content.

NOTE: An alternative way of adjusting **Picture Preset** is by pressing **PICTURE** button to display a menu and use **CURSOR** < or > to toggle among the five settings.

<u>Pict. Enhanc. Control</u>- to improve unstable or poor quality video pictures. The options include: **Off**, **Middle** and **High**.

<u>Color Temp. Control</u> - to select **Normal**, **Warm**, or **Cool** picture preferences. For Normal, whites will maintain their whiteness; Cool will make the white bluish; and Warm will make the whites reddish.

<u>Brightness Control</u> - until the darkest parts of the picture are as bright as you want.

<u>Contrast Control</u> - to increase or decrease the difference between the black portions and white portions of the picture. When contrast is increased, it helps to "sharpen" the picture quality.

Color Control - to add or remove color.

Sharpness Control - to improve sharpness in the picture.


<u>Tint Control</u> - to adjust natural skin tones in the picture quality. This option is adjustable only for NTSC signals.


NOTE: The way you choose to set the Picture Menu controls will become your personal setting.

When finished, press **CLEAR** button to clear the menu from the TV screen.

SOUND MENU CONTROLS

To adjust your TV sound, use the Sound Menu Control listed below. Your selection is stored as **Personal**.

Press **MENU** button on the remote control to display onscreen menu.

Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the onscreen menu until you see **Sound** highlighted.

Press **CURSOR** < or > to display the SOUND menu features.

Press **CURSOR** \land or \lor to scroll through the sound features and use **CURSOR** < or > to adjust

<u>Tone Control</u>- allows you to select your desired sound mode and adjust the equalizer sliders.

Preset- use **CURSOR** < or > to select one from **Personal, Music, Theater** or **Voice** as your desired sound mode.

Equalizer- use CURSOR < or > to highlight the range you want to adjust: 100Hz, 300Hz, 1KHz, 3KHz or 8KHz. Press CURSOR ∧ or ∨ to adjust. When finished, press OK to exit back to TONE CONTROL menu.

Balance- to change the audio output from the right or left speaker.

Sound Type- to select a sound type from the available audio types: **Mono, Stereo** or **Enhanced**.

SAP- exists only in Analog mode. Secondary Audio Programming is sent as a third audio channel. When checked, a SAP signal can be heard apart from the current TV program sound.

NOTE: If SAP is not present on a selected show, this line will be greyed-out.

<u>Auto Vol Level</u>- when checked, to level out the sound being heard when sudden change in volume occurs during commercial breaks or channel changes.


<u>Audio Output</u>- to select Fixed or Variable audio output from the AV out jacks.

<u>Def. Language</u>- exists only in Digital mode. To select a language you prefer for dialog on digital channels. If the language is being broadcast with a program, the TV will play it. Otherwise, the TV will play the default audio for the program.

<u>Cur. Language</u>- exists only in Digital mode. To select a language you prefer for the program you are watching If the language is being broadcast, it becomes preferred for all digital channels until you turn the TV off. Otherwise, the TV will play the default audio for the program.


NOTE: An alternative way of adjusting **Def. Language** and **Cur. Language** is by pressing **PICTURE** button to display a menu. Then use **CURSOR** \land or \lor to highlight either and press **CURSOR** < or > to adjust.

UNDERSTANDING PARENTAL CONTROLS

Parental control is a feature that lets the TV receive and process data sent by broadcasters or other program providers with program content advisory. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with Parental Control can respond to the content advisory and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This feature is useful for adults to prevent certain types of programs from being viewed by children.

Parental control offers the following features to choose from:

Lock - Is a "master switch" for parental control. When checked, all blocking/censoring you have set is enabled. Otherwise, if unchecked, all blocking is disabled.

USA V-Chip - allows you to block programs by ratings. Within its submenu, you can use a certain rating like **Movie Ratings**, **TV Ratings**, **Unrated** or **No Rating**.

Movie Ratings - Certain blocking options exist which will block programming based on ratings patterned by the Motion Pictures Association of America (MPAA).

TV Ratings - Like the Movie Ratings, programs can be blocked from viewing using standard TV ratings set by TV broadcasters.

Unrated / No Rating - All programs with no content advisory data can be blocked if Unrated / No Rating is set to .

Block CH - allows you to block channels.

Child Lock - When checked, the front panel of the TV is locked and the TV can be operated by the remote control only.

Change Passwd. - allows you to change password anytime.

NOTE: All the above features are available in both Digital mode and Analog mode. Whether they are activated in either Digital mode or Analog mode, they work in both modes.

Downloadable V-chip - Lets you lock or unlock the programs with a new, different rating region code of 0x05 defined by extension or replacement of the content advisory system in the U.S. This feature is only available in Digital mode and when there is a regional ratings table available. There is a **Reset** option coming along, which allows you to clear all limits you set on downloadable V-chip ratings.

MOVIE RATINGS

G: General Audience- All ages admitted. Suitable for all ages.

PG: Parental Guidance Suggested - Contains material unsuitable for younger children.

PG-13: Parents Strongly Cautioned - Contains material unsuitable for children under the age of 13.

R: Restricted - Suitable for adults above 17 years of age only.

NC-17: - No one under the age of 17 will be admitted.

X: Adults Only - Contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

HELPFUL HINTS

Neither the V-chip settings nor the password you set will be reset by running AUTO CHANNEL SEARCH.

TV RATINGS

TV-Y: Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6

TV-Y7: Contains Fantasy Violence (FV). Appropriate for children age 7 and above who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality.

TV-G: Suitable for most audiences. Contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.

TV-PG: Contains material unsuitable for younger children. Could contain moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).

TV-14: Contains some material unsuitable for children under 14 years of age. Contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).

TV-MA: Viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17. Contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V), explicit sexual situations (S), or crude indecent language(L).

ACTIVATE PARENTAL CONTROL

Parental control allows you to block out any channels. A channel blocked by the Parental Control cannot be viewed until a correct password is used to unblock the channel for viewing. Parental control is defaulted without password protection. The first time you use the TV, create a password to activate Parental Control.

Follow these steps for Digital Mode and Analog Mode.





Once a password is set, the Parental Control menu and Time menu are protected. That is, every time you want to enter Parental Control menu or Time menu, you are prompted to enter password. If you enter a wrong password, "Incorrect Password. Try again." will appear at the help line. Only with a correct password, you have access to these two menus.


CHILD LOCK

12:00 AM: displays the stop time of the currently-viewed program

Unrated: to indicate rating and content theme of the currently-viewed program **HD**: displayed if the feature of high definition is available with the program; otherwise, display **SD**.

Stereo: to indicate the sound mode of the currently-viewed program. It may be Stereo or Mono according to the program itself. If the program is Multi Audio languages, display **Multi**.

The information on the Information Banner is transmitted by the broadcaster. The quality and accuracy of the information depend on the broadcaster. You might see a difference in broadcast time if the broadcaster is from adifferent time zone.

10 Rain: displays the analog channel no. and name


11:20 AM: displays the current time as set in time menu.

Unrated: to indicate rating and content theme of the currently-viewed program

Analog: to indicate TV is in Analog mode.

Stereo: to indicate the sound mode of the currently-viewed program. It may be Mono, Stereo, Mono+SAP or Stereo+SAP according to the program itself.

NOTE: The information banner is time out. Or you can remove the information banner from the screen by pressing **CLEAR** button on the remote control.



HELPFUL HINTS

If "No Program Information" appears on the screen when the **INFO** button on the remote control is pressed, it means the broadcaster is not providing any information.

Press **Ana/Dig** button on the remote to switch between Digital and Analog Mode.

GLOSSARY

Aspect Ratio	The ratio between the width and height of the TV picture on the screen. In a normal TV set the aspect ratio is 4 to 3 (4:3). The aspect ratio in HDTV is 16:9, which resembles the aspect ratio in a movie theatre (Widescreen). New TV systems support both 4:3 and 16:9 aspect ratio and can automatically switch between them.
Audio Video (A/V)	A term often used when discussing a channel on a TV receiver or on video equipment, which has been especially designed to accept VCR audio-video signal. The A/V channel automatically activates special circuitry within the TV set to prevent picture distortion and skewing. It is also used for audio-video processors, which handle both types of signal.
ATSC	ATSC: Advance Television Systems Committee. Formed to establish technical standards for advanced television systems, including digital high definition television (HDTV).
CVBS	Composite Video Baseband Signal. In broadcast television this refers to the video signal. including the colour information and syncs.
DTV	Digital television. Generic term that refers to all digital television formats, including high-definition television (HDTV) and standard-definition television (SDTV).
Digital Tuner	A digital tuner serves as the decoder required to receive and display digital broadcasts. It can be included inside TV sets or via a set-top box.
HDTV	The generally agreed upon definition of HDTV is approximately twice the vertical and horizontal picture resolution of today's NTSC TV, which essentially makes the picture twice as sharp. HDTV also has a screen ratio of 16:9. HDTV offers reduced motion artifacts (i.e. ghosting, dot crawl), and offers 5.1 independent channels of CD-quality stereo surround sound, (also referred to as AC-3).
NTSC	National Television System Committee. The organization that developed the analog television standard currently in use in the U.S., Canada, and Japan. Now generally used to refer to that standard. The NTSC standard combines blue, red and green signals modulated as an AM signal with an FM signal for audio.
Progressive Scan	In Progressive Scanning all the horizontal scan lines are scanned on to the screen at one time. The Digital TV and HDTV standards accept both Interlaced Scan and Progressive Scan broadcast and display methods.
Resolution	Resolution: A measurement of the finest (smallest) detail that is visible in a video image. TV resolutions may be expressed as number of pixels in an image, or more commonly as Total Number of (horizontally scanned) Lines used to create the image. Standard Digital TV Resolutions: SDTV: 480i - The picture is 704x480 pixels, 480p - The picture is 704x480 pixels. HDTV: 720p - The picture is 1280x720 pixels, 1080i - The picture is 1920x1080 pixels, 1080p - The picture is 1920x1080 pixels.

CLEANING AND CARE

WARNING Concerning stationary images on the TV Screen:

Do not leave stationary or letterbox images on screen for extended periods of time. This can cause uneven picture-tube aging.

Normal use of the TV should involve the showing of pictures that contain constantly moving and changing images that fill the screen. Be careful not to leave nonmoving images on screen for extended periods of time, or to display the same images on screen too frequently, because subtle ghost images can be left on the screen. Sources of stationary images may be DVD disks, laser disks, video games, cd-i disks, videotapes, digital television boxes, broadcast channels, cable channels, satellite channels, and others. Here are some examples of stationary images (this is not an all-inclusive list; you may encounter others in your viewing):

- DVD menus listings of DVD disk content.
- Letterbox black bars shown at the top and bottom of the TV screen when a wide screen (16:9) movie is viewed on a TV with standard (4:3) aspect ratio.
- · Video-game images and scoreboards.
- Television station logos present a problem if they are bright and stationary; moving or low-contrast graphics are less likely to cause uneven aging of the picture tube.
- Stock-market tickers presented at the bottom of the TV screen.
- Shopping channel logos and pricing displays bright and shown constantly or repeatedly in the same location on the TV screen.

Placement of the TV

- To avoid cabinet warping, cabinet color changes, and increased chance of set failure, do not place the TV where temperatures can become excessively hot, for example, in direct sunlight or near a heating appliance.
- Be sure to allow a free flow of air to and from the perforated back cover of the set.

Cleaning

- To avoid possible shock hazard, unplug the TV from the Electrical outlet before cleaning.
- Regularly dust the TV with a dry, nonscratching duster to keep the TV clean.
- When cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface. Avoid using anything abrasive. Do not use household cleaners. Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the back cover of the set.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent damage of the cabinet finish.


