

On-Screen Features (in either English, French, or Spanish) show helpful messages for setting of TV controls.

Audio/Video Jackpanel for direct connections with VCRs (or other video accessories) providing quality TV picture and sound playback.

Twin Antenna (A/B) Inputs for easy displaying of two separate signal sources on the TV. An A/B button on the remote control switches the TV's Main screen between the two Antenna (A & B) Input options.

Surround Sound external speaker connections allow you hook your TV to external audio equipment for more dynamic sound replay and audio effects.

On Timer automatically turns the TV ON at a preset time, and channel.

Sleep-Timer automatically turns the TV OFF at preset times.

SmartLock feature allows you to block the viewing of certain channel or external audio/video connections were you might not want your children viewing inappropriate material.

Smart Picture allows you to set the picture color, tint, contrast, etc. for various types of programming such as Sports, Movies, Multi Media (Gaming), or Weak Signals with the push of one button.

Smart Sound controls the sudden volume changes that occur when changing programs or when a commercial break comes on. It eliminates the peaks and valleys in the TV's sound with one pleasant listening level.

Picture-In-Picture (PIP) allows you view to different programs (or picture sources) on the TV screen at the same time. PIP will also let you swap the pictures, move the PIP picture to any of the four corners, and even freeze the picture until you shut it off.

NOTE: This owner's manual is used with several different television models. Not all features (and drawings) discussed in this manual will necessarily match those found with your television system. This is normal and does not require you contacting your dealer or requesting service.

Your new television and its packing contain materials that can be recycled and reused. Specialized companies can recycle your product to increase the amount of reusable materials and minimize the amounts which need to be properly disposed.

How to Adjust the TV Picture

To adjust your TV picture controls, select a channel and follow the steps shown below:

(BEGIN)

- Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu.

 PICTURE will be highlighted.
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 button and the menu will shift to the right to display an adjustment bar in front of the BRIGHTNESS control.
- 3 Use the CURSOR LEFT ◀◀ or RIGHT ▶▶ buttons to adjust the BRIGHTNESS level of the picture.
- After adjusting the BRIGHTNESS control, **press the CURSOR DOWN button** to select another

SMART HELP

Remember, when the bar scale is centered, the control settings are at normal mid-range levels.

BRIGHTNESS Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ buttons until darkest parts of the picture are as bright as you prefer.


<u>COLOR</u> Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ buttons to add or eliminate color.

PICTURE Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ buttons until lightest parts of the picture show good detail.

SHARPNESS Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ buttons to improve detail in the picture.

TINT Press the ▶ **or** ◀ buttons to obtain natural skin tones.

COLOR TEMP Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ buttons to select NORMAL, COOL, or WARM picture preferences. (NORMAL will keep the whites, white; COOL will make the whites, bluish; and WARM will make the whites, reddish.)



SETTING THE TV'S CLOCK

Your television comes with an on-screen clock. During normal operation the clock appears on the screen when the STATUS/EXIT button is pressed or if the Timer DIS-PLAY control is turned ON.

(BEGIN)

- Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu. PICTURE will be highlighted.
- 2 Press the CURSOR DOWN
 button twice to select the FEATURES menu.



ACTIVATING THE TV'S ON TIMER CONTROL

Just like an alarm clock you can set the TV to turn itself on at the same time everyday.

A fter your personal access code has been set (see previous page), you are now ready to select the channels you want to block out or censor.

- Press the CURSOR DOWN button twice to select the FEA-TURES menu.
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 bb button and the menu will
 shift to the left, then CURSOR

 LOCK control.


 button again to shift the display left, the BLOCK CHANNEL control will be highlighted.

TURNING ON THE DYNAMIC NOISE REDUCTION (PICTURE) CONTROL

Due many reason such as poor cable reception, the picture can sometime appear slightly "speckled" (noise in the picture). The DNR (Dynamic Noise Reduction) control can help eliminate this type of interference and improve the quality of the picture.



The Incredible Picture feature helps to "sharpen" the picture quality. The black portions of the picture become richer in darkness and the whites become brighter.



Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses onscreen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

(BEGIN)

- Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu.

 PICTURE will be highlighted.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN
 button twice to select the FEATURES menu.
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 ▶ button and the menu will shift to the left, TIMER will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the CURSOR DOWN to highlight the CLOSED CAP control.
- 5 Press the CURSOR RIGHT
 bb button again to highlight and choose either CAPTION MODE or TEXT MODE.
- 6 Press the CURSOR RIGHT
 bb button again to highlight the
 CAPTION MODE or TEXT
 MODE options area.
- 7 Press the CURSOR UP ▶ or CURSOR DOWN buttons to select the CLOSED CAPTION option you want.


CAPTION MODE: CC1, CC2, CC3,CC4, CC MUTE, or OFF -dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on-screen.

TEXT MODE: TXT1, TXT2,TXT3, TXT4, or OFF

-often used for channel guide, schedules, or bulletin board information for CC programs.



NOTE: Not all TV programs and product commercials are made for broadcast with Closed Caption (CC) information included. Neither are all Closed Caption modes (CAPTION 1-4, or TEXT 1-4)) necessarily being used by a broadcast station during the transmission of a closed caption program. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of Closed Caption shows.





NOTE: The CC MUTE option can be used to set the TV to turn the Closed Caption mode "ON" whenever the MUTE button on the remote is pressed.

USING THE SLEEP TIMER CONTROL

Have you ever fallen asleep in front of the TV only to have in wake you up at two in the morning with a test pattern screeching in your ears? Well, your TV can save you all that trouble by automatically turning itself off.

Press the SLEEP button on the remote control and the SLEEP timer on-screen display will appear in the lower center of the display.

Press the SLEEP button
repeatedly to pick the amount of time (15 minutes to 2 hours ahead) before the TV will turn itself off.



USING TREBLE, BASS, AND BALANCE SOUND CONTROLS

Besides the normal volume level control, your TV also has individual sound adjustment controls. The TREBLE (high frequency), BASS (low frequency), and Speaker BALANCE may all be used to adjust the sound playback of TV programs.



- 5 After adjusting the TREBLE control, press the CURSOR DOWN button to select another Sound adjustment; BASS or BALANCE. Use the CURSOR LEFT ← or CURSOR RIGHT ▶ buttons to adjust the selected control.

SMART HELP

Remember, when the bar scale is centered,
Speaker BALANCE is centered between the TV's Left and Right side speakers.



How to Set the TV for Stereo Programs

Your TV can receive broadcast stereo TV programs. The TV has both an amplifier and twin speakers through which the stereo sound can be heard.

(BEGIN)

- the remote to show the on-screen menu. **PICTURE** will be highlighted.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN

 button to select the SOUND

 menu.
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 bb button and the menu will
 shift to the right to display an
 adjustment bar in front of the
 TREBLE control.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN


 button to select the STEREO control.
- or RIGHT ▶ buttons to select
 STEREO or MONO. With
 STEREO selected the television
 will reproduce any stereo broadcast signal it receives.



SECOND AUDIO PROGRAM (SAP)

SAP is an additional part of the stereo broadcast system. Sent as a third audio channel SAP can be heard apart from the current TV program sound. TV stations are free to use SAP for any number of purposes, but many experts believe it will be used for foreign language translations of TV shows (or for weather and news bulletins.)

If a SAP signal is not present with a selected program, the SAP option cannot be selected. Also, if SAP is selected on a channel (with SAP) and you select another channel, when you return to the original channel SAP will be OFF (and you will have to reselect the SAP feature.)




USING THE INCREDIBLE STEREO FEATURE

The Incredible Stereo feature adds greater depth and dimension to both monaural (MONO) and stereo TV sound. With the control turned ON the TV's speakers can add even wider sound separation to normal broadcasts.

(BEGIN)

- Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu. PICTURE will be highlighted.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN button to select the SOUND menu.
- 3 Press the CURSOR RIGHT button and the menu will shift to the right to display an adjustment bar in front of the TREBLE control.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN
 button to select the INCR.
 STEREO control.
- Use the CURSOR UP ▶ or DOWN buttons to turn this feature ON.



USING THE TV VOLUME BAR CONTROL


Use the Volume Bar control to see the TV's volume level settings on the TV screen. The Volume Bar will be seen each time the VOLUME buttons (on the TV or remote) are pressed.

(BEGIN)

Press the VOLUME (+) or (-) buttons on the remote to show the VOLUME bar display on-screen.

Press the VOLUME (+) **or** (–) **buttons** again to adjust the television's sound level.





USING THE TV SPEAKER CONTROL AND AUDIO OUTPUT JACKS

Would you like to hear TV programs through your audio hifi system? The TV's Audio Output jacks and TV Speaker On/Off control work together to offer you this TV sound option.

(BEGIN)

- Connect the R(ight) and
 L(eft) AUDIO OUT jacks on
 the TV to the R and L Audio Input
 jacks on your amplifier or sound
 system. Set the audio system's volume to normal listening level.
- ON. You can now adjust the sound level coming from the audio system with the VOLUME (+) or (-) buttons on the TV or remote.
- To hear the TV sound from only the audio system speakers.


Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu. **PICTURE** will be highlighted.

- Press the CURSOR DOWN button to select the SOUND menu.
- button and the menu will shift to the right to display an adjustment bar in front of the TREBLE control.
- button to select the SPEAKER control.
- Use the CURSOR UP ▶ or DOWN buttons to select turn the television's speakers OFF. You should now only hear TV sound coming from the audio system speakers.



SMART HELP

Remember, the audio system may have to be in AUX(iliary) mode to play sound from the TV.



USING THE SURROUND SOUND EXTERNAL SPEAKER CONNECTIONS

By adding optional external speakers to the TV's sound system, you can create the feeling of reflected sound that surrounds you at a movie theater or concert hall.

(BEGIN)

Connect both external speakers to the speaker wire terminals on the TV.

Recommended speakers: 8 ohm, 15 watt minimum. Be sure the (+) and (-) speaker wires are connected to the correct R(ight) and L(eft) speaker terminals on the TV.


- Place the speakers so the viewing area is between the TV and the rear surround speakers. (See overhead view drawing.)
- Turn the TV and the STEREO control ON.

After setup whenever a stereo signal is received the audio will be heard in Surround Sound.



SMART HELP

Remember, Surround Sound will not work with only one speaker connected; or with monaural audio material (unless the Incredible Stereo feature is turned ON).



HOW TO USE THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS

AUDIO/VIDEO INPUTS

The TV's Audio/Video Input jacks are for direct picture and sound connections between the TV and a VCR (or similar device) that has Audio/Video Output jacks.

BEGIN


- Connect the VIDEO (yellow)
 CABLE to the VIDEO IN jack
 on the back of the TV. Then connect the AUDIO (red and white)
 CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) IN jacks on the rear of the TV.
- Connect the VIDEO (yellow)
 CABLE to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the VCR. Then connect the AUDIO (red and white) CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR.
- Turn the VCR and the TV ON.
- Use the A/V button on the remote to select the AV 1 channel.

With the VCR ON and a prerecorded tape inserted, **press the PLAY button** to view the tape on the television.



SMART HELP

Remember, after it is connected an easy way to select the VCR mode is to press the TV/VCR button on the remote. Channel 3 and 4 can also be selected this way.



HOW TO USE THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS

S-VIDEO INPUT

The S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the television can give you better picture detail and clarity, for the playback of S-VHS VCR tapes, or Digital Video Discs than the normal antenna picture connections.

Note: The VCR (or Digital Video Disc player) must have a S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connections shown on this page.

(BEGIN)

Connect the S-VIDEO

CABLE to the S-VIDEO input jack on the rear of the television, then the AUDIO (red and white) to the AUDIO IN (IN 2) jacks on the rear of the TV.


- Cable to the S-VIDEO output jack on the accessory device.
 Then connect the red and white AUDIO CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) output jacks on the rear of the accessory device.
- Turn the VCR (or Digital Video Disc Player) ON.
- Press the AV button on the remote to tune to the SVID-R channel. You are now ready to view the tape or disc on the TV.



SMART HELP

Remember, after it is connected an easy way to select the S-VIDEO (SVID-R) mode is to press the TV/VCR button on the remote, or tune to the SVID-R channel using the AV button on the remote.

If you have added SVID-R to the TV's channels memory, just press the CHANNEL + or – buttons to select the S-VIDEO mode.



USING THE REMOTE LOCATOR FEATURE

Have you ever played hide and seek with your remote control? Are you tired of tearing the house apart trying to find if someone has stuffed the remote under the couch, put it on the shelves, or hid it in the desk? Well, your TV remote can save you all that looking by automatically signaling its location to you.

Here's how it works:

(BEGIN)

Press the POWER button on the set to turn the TV ON.

Note: Normally you can press any button on the front of the TV to turn the set ON. But for the remote locator to work you need to be sure to use the Power button at the TV.

A "locating remote" message shows on the TV screen.

Within a few seconds a chirping or beeping sound will begin to come from the remote control hand unit.

The remote will continue to signal its location for around 30 seconds. Normal TV program sound will not be heard while the remote locator is working.


Once you find the remote just press any button on the remote and the beeping will stop.

The remote is now ready for normal TV feature use.



SMART HELP

Remember, the remote locator may not properly receive its "homing" signal from the TV if it has been placed on a metal shelf or counter material.



USING THE REMOTE LOCATOR FEATURE

Address Code Programming of the Remote

For most homes this step would not be needed but for your information:

Up to 9 different remote locator address codes can be set on which the TV can send out its "homing" signal.

This is done in case there is more than one TV (with remote locator) present, and you want only one specific remote to be signaled when the TV is turned ON.*

To set a Locator Address Code:

(BEGIN)

- the LOCATOR CODE button on the remote. (Also be sure the TV/VCR/ACC SYSTEM switch is in the TV mode.)
- The TV shows the present Remote Locator Code.

Remote Locator Code is set to 5

Press any number key to change code

Press any number button (0-9) on the remote to set or change the Locator Code.



SMART HELP

Remember, if the batteries are replaced the Locator Code will need to be reentered.

When setting the Locator Code if any button, other than the number buttons are pressed, the remote will return to its normal operation mode.



USING THE SMART PICTURE CONTROL

Whether you're watching a movie or a video game, you TV has automatic video control settings matched for your current program source or content. The Smart Picture feature quickly resets your TV's video controls for a number of different types of programs and viewing conditions you may have in your home. Each Smart Picture setting is preset at the factory to automatically adjust the TV's Brightness, Color, Picture, Sharpness, Tint, and Color Temperature levels.


(BEGIN)

button on the remote control. The current Smart Picture setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

Press the SMART PICTURE
button repeatedly to select either
PERSONAL, MOVIES, SPORTS,

Note: The PERSONAL setting is the setting that you setup using the PICTURE options within the onscreen menu. This is the only setting that can be changed. All other setting are setup at the factory during the time of production.





USING THE SMART SOUND CONTROL

A re you tired of the sound of commercials following you into the next room or all through the house? Smart Sound allows you to preset a desired volume level that the TV sound will not go above. This makes for an even, more consistent sound by reducing the peaks and valleys that can occur during program changes or commercial breaks.

(BEGIN)


ton on the remote control. The current Smart Sound setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

2 Press the SMART PICTURE button repeatedly to turn the feature ON or OFF.




SMART HELP

Remember, Smart Sound works only with the programs coming through the ANTENNA/CABLE input on the rear of the TV (RF audio). It will not control the sound levels for the External AV1, AV2, SVID-R or MM1, MM2, and MM3 connections.



AVL CONTROL

Note: SMART SOUND is the same feature as AVL within the SOUND on-screen menu controls. When SMART SOUND is changed, the AVL control will also change (and vice versa).



USING THE TV'S CHANNEL SURF CONTROL

A "list" or series of previously viewed channels can be selected with the SURF button on your remote control. With this feature you can easily switch between different TV programs that currently interest you. The SURF control allows you set up to ten channels in its quick viewing "list".

(BEGIN)

- Press the CHANNEL (+) or (-)
 buttons (or the NUMBER buttons)
 to select a channel to add to the
 SURF list.
- Press the SURF button on the remote. The on-screen display will read, "THE SURF LIST IS EMPTY, Press > to add".
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 button to add the present channel to the SURF list.



A/CH BUTTON

Your remote also has an A/CH (Alternate Channel) button.
Pressing this button will toggle between the Current and one previous channel.



SETTING THE REMOTE CONTROL TO WORK WITH OTHER DEVICES



Your remote control is set to work your TV and many infrared remote (IR) control VCRs, Cable Boxes, Satellite Systems, DSS, DVD, etc. However, an easy onetime step may be necessary before the remote will work your VCR.

Try this initial check to see if going on to the following section is necessary.

(BEGIN)

- Place the TV/VCR/ACC
 Mode Switch in the proper position.
- 2 Point the remote control at the device and press the POWER button.
- Does the remote turn the device ON?

If YES, stop and try other function buttons on the remote. If they also work the device, then the remote is ready and no further steps are needed.



Please read through steps 1-4 before beginning.

(BEGIN)

- Place the TV/VCR/ACC

 Mode Switch in the proper position.
- 2 Press the VCR RECORD button on the remote control and release.
- 3 Press the SMART SOUND button on the remote within 30 seconds, then release.
- 4 Enter the THREE-DIGIT REMOTE CODE NUMBER for your desired device. The remote is now ready to send commands to the unit.



Remember, if this doesn't work the first time, repeat steps using the same remote code number.

SETTING THE REMOTE CONTROL TO WORK WITH OTHER DEVICES



Search Method

Your TV remote can be set to work various external devices such as VCRs, Cable Boxes, Satellite Receivers, Dss, DVD, etc. by what is called the search method of remote control programming.

If the "Remote Code" number method shown on page did not set your remote to work your external device, then follow the easy steps listed below.

Please read steps 1-4 before beginning.

(BEGIN)

1 Press the POWER button on the device your are attempting to program to turn it ON.

Place the TV/VCR/ACC
| Mode Switch in the proper position.

Press the VCR RECORD and the SMART SOUND buttons simultaneously and hold them down.

The device will begin to change channels after the remote identifies the correct code. When the channels start to change release the VCR RECORD and SMART SOUND buttons. The remote should be ready to operate the device.




SMART HELP

This method can take up to two minute to preform.

Don't let the device scan up more than five channels. If you do the remote may pass up the right code and another two minute search cycle will have to be repeated.

If no channel change happens within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4. Should a channel change still not occur, the remote will not work the desired device.



USING THE REMOTE'S VCR BUTTONS

When using the TV remote with a VCR, first make certain it is set to control your VCR (by the REMOTE CODE or SEARCH method).

(BEGIN)



Point the top of the remote toward the front of the VCR (remote sensor window) when pressing the buttons.



VCR SYSTEM SWITCH

Set in the VCR position to send remote commands to the VCR.

PLAY BUTTON

Press to begin playback of a video tape.

REWIND BUTTON

Press to rewind tapes. For some VCR's the STOP button may have to be pressed first, then REWIND. In playback mode hold down the button to view picture moving rapidly in reverse.

STOP BUTTON

Press to stop the motion of a tape in playback, rewind, fast forward, etc.


VCR RECORD BUTTON

Hold the VCR/RECORD button down to begin a VCR recording.

SMART HELP

Remember, the VCR buttons on the remote will not operate your VCR if those features are not found on your VCR remote control.

Note: All VCR functions (particularly Search, Rewind, Fast Forward, etc.) will operate the same as with the original VCR remote control provided with the VCR.



POWER BUTTON

Press to turn the VCR ON and OFF.

NUMBER BUTTON

Press buttons for direct VCR channel selections.

PAUSE BUTTON

Press to temporarily stop the tape during a playback or recording. Press again to release Pause.

FAST FORWARD BUTTON

Press to rapidly advance the tape. For some VCR's you may need to press the STOP button first, then the FAST FORWARD button. In playback mode hold the button down to view the picture moving rapidly in the forward direction.

<u>CHANNEL + & - BUTTONS</u>

Press to scan up or down through the VCR channel numbers.

TV/VCR BUTTON

Press to the VCR position (VCR indicator on the front of the unit will light) to view the playback of a tape. Press again to place in the TV position (VCR indicator light will go off) to view one program while recording another program. When used with the TV the TV/VCR button works as a source button. Each press cycles the TV between channels 3 and 4; or the VCR/AUX mode. It is a quick one-button way to select these channels and modes (without entering the TV's Menu system).

USING THE PIP (PICTURE-IN-PICTURE) FEATURE



Hooking up PIP

Picture-In-Picture (PIP) is the showing of two pictures on the TV screen at the same time. (One main screen picture and one small inset picture or PIP). For your ease and convenience this TV has two separate inputs (ANTenna A and ANTenna B) for your home's Antenna and/or Cable TV system signal.

The ANT A input is primarily for the TV' main screen picture. The ANT B input is provided as a second, dedicated source option for the TV's PIP "window" and its feature operations. The signal connected to the ANT B input can be either a Split Signal Input (as described in the section on this page), or another type of external signal source (such as a satellite dish system, additional home antenna, video accessory, etc.).

See the following steps on how channels connected to the ANT(enna) B Input can be shown and used within the PIP window:

(BEGIN)

TV signal to the single 75 ohm
INPUT plug on a two-way Signal
Splitter (not supplied).

Connect two lengths of RF Coaxial Cable (F-type connectors on both ends) to the two OUTPUT plugs on the two-way Signal Splitter.


Connect the twin OUTPUT plugs on the Signal Splitter to the ANT A and ANT B Inputs on the rear of the TV.



USING THE PIP (PICTURE-IN-PICTURE) FEATURE

CHOOSING THE PIP SOURCE

The picture for the PIP window can come through either the ANT/CABLE or any the the external Audio/Video connections at the rear of the TV. PIP Source simply tells the TV which one of these sources it is to show in the PIP window.

(BEGIN)

other device hooked to the external A/V connections) **ON.**

2 Press the PIP ON/OFF button on the remote control. The PIP window should appear in the upper right hand portion of the screen.

2 Press the PIP SOURCE button on the remote to toggle between the different external connection.


The PIP SOURCE may come from the following:

AV 1, AV 2, SVID-R: for picture signal coming from the external Audio/Video jacks on the TV. (Must have an external device hooked up at these locations.)

ANTENNA/CABLE: for a picture signal coming from the ANT/CABLE Input on the back of the TV.

SMART HELP

The PIP SOURCE can also be chosen by pressing the Multi Media Button on the remote control. MM 1, MM 2, MM 3, or the current channel (ANT/CABLE INput jack) can be selected. Try it out and see just how easy it is to use the PIP feature.



USING THE PIP (PICTURE-IN-PICTURE) FEATURE



REMOTE CONTROL BUTTONS

By using the PIP buttons on the remote control the PIP picture can be moved and swapped with the main screen. The PIP inset picture can also be frozen within the PIP window.

(BEGIN)

ton to show the PIP picture. PIP appears in the upper right of the screen.

Press the PIP ON/OFF button again and the PIP picture is reduced in size.










ADJUSTING THE PIP COLOR AND TINT

The Picture-In-Picture (PIP)
Color and Tint controls are
used to make fine tune adjustments
to the color settings for PIP (when
it is shown on the TV screen).

(BEGIN)

- Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu.

 PICTURE will be highlighted.
- 2 Press the CURSOR DOWN
 button twice to select the FEATURES menu.
- Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 button and the menu will shift to the left to display the TIMER controls.
- Press the CURSOR DOWN
 | button to select the PIP menu.
- **5** Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 button again to shift the display to the COLOR and TINT adjustment bars.
- 6 Press the CURSOR RIGHT

 ▶ or the CURSOR LEFT


 buttons to adjust the COLOR and

 TINT bars to the desired levels.

More PIP (Picture-In-Picture) Connections




PIP hookup with a Cable Box and VCR.

(BEGIN)

- First use an optional signal splitter and connect the original cable TV signal to both the CABLE IN on the Cable Converter and the ANTENNA plug on the rear of the television.
- 2 Connect the CABLE OUT on the Converter to the ANT. IN on the VCR.
- On the VCR to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV.

Also connect the AUDIO OUT (right and left) jacks from the VCR to the AUDIO IN jacks on the television.







More PIP (Picture-In-Picture) Connections


PIP hookup with a VCR and a Digital Video Disc Player (or similar device).

(BEGIN)

- TV signal or Antenna signal to the ANT IN jack on the back of the VCR.
- 2 Connect the ANT OUT jack on the rear of the VCR to the ANT IN jack on the rear of the Video Disc Player.
- 3 Connect the ANT OUT jack on the rear of the Video Disc Player to the ANT "A" input on the rear of the TV.
- 4 Connect the yellow Video Cable from the VIDEO OUT jack on the VCR to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV (labeled VIDEO IN 1). Then, connect the red and white Audio Cables from the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR to the AUDIO IN jacks on the rear of the TV (labeled AUDIO L & R IN 1).
- from the VIDEO OUT jack on the Video Disc Player to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV (labeled VIDEO IN 2). Then, connect the red and white Audio Cables from the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR to the AUDIO IN jacks on the rear of the TV (labeled AUDIO L & R IN 2).

Note: When selecting the PIP SOURCE, the VCR will appear on the AV 1 channel, and the Video Disc Player will appear on the AV 2 channel.





TIPS IF SOMETHING ISN'T WORKING



Please make these simple checks before calling for service. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not covered under your warranty.

CAUTION: A video source (such as a video game, Compact Disc Interactive - CDI, or TV information channel) which shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen, can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source the pattern of the non-moving portion of the game (CDI, etc.) could leave an image permanently on the picture tube. When not in use, turn the video source OFF. Regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.

No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again.
- Check that outlet is not on a wall switch. Be sure fuse is not blown on AC Power strip.
- Check to be sure the system mode switch (TV/VCR/ACC) is in the correct position when using the remote control to power the set ON.

No Picture

- Check antenna connections. Are they properly secured to the TV's ANT/CABLE plug?
- Check the TUNER control for CABLE or ANTENNA setting.
- Press the AV button on the remote to make sure the correct signal source is selected.
 (AV 1, AV 2, SVID-R or MM 1, MM 2, MM 3)

No Sound

- Check the VOLUME buttons.
- Check the MUTE button on the remote control.
- Check the SPEAKER on-screen control. OFF position will eliminate sound at the set.
- If attempting auxiliary equipment hook-ups, check audio jack connections.
- (If Applicable) Check Audio Receiver for correct operating mode.

Remote Does Not Work

- Check TV/VCR/ACC "System" switch on the remote. Move the switch to the TV position to operate the television.
- Check batteries. Replace with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries if necessary.
- Clean the remote and the remote sensor window on the TV.
- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again. Be sure fuse is not blown on AC Power strip.
- Check to be sure TV outlet is not on a wall switch.

TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add desired channel numbers (CHANNEL control) into TV memory.
- Check to be sure the TUNER control is set to the CABLE option.

Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When cleaning the TV screen take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool clear water. Use a clean dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.



GLOSSARY TO TELEVISION TERMS

Coaxial Cable * A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

Closed Caption * Broadcast standard which allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

Direct Audio/Video Inputs * Located on the rear of the TV these connectors (RCA phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound connection options.

Identify* Method by which a remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or Cable Converter). Once the code has been "identified" then the TV remote can operate and send commands to the other product.

On Screen Displays (OSD) * Refers to the wording or messages generated by the television (or VCR) to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

Menu * An on-screen listing of feature controls shown on the Television screen that are made available for user adjustments.

Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) * The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture.

Programming * The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the Television's memory circuits. In this way the Television "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

Remote Sensor Window * A window or opening found on the Television control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

Setup Mode * Automatic feature control settings made by the TV. Designed for first time set-up and use. Settings for signal connections (antenna or cable TV), plus channel program memory are held in the TV's memory (even if the set is unplugged and moved to a new location.)

Second Audio Program (SAP) * Another or additional audio channel provided for in the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. The most frequently proposed use for SAP is the simultaneous bilingual broadcast of TV program material.

Status * Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the Television of on screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

Twin Lead Wire * The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.
