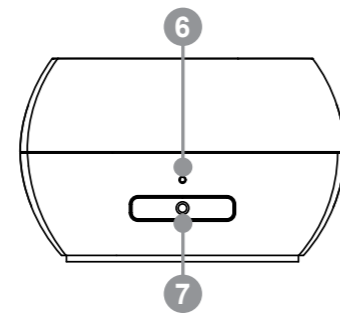
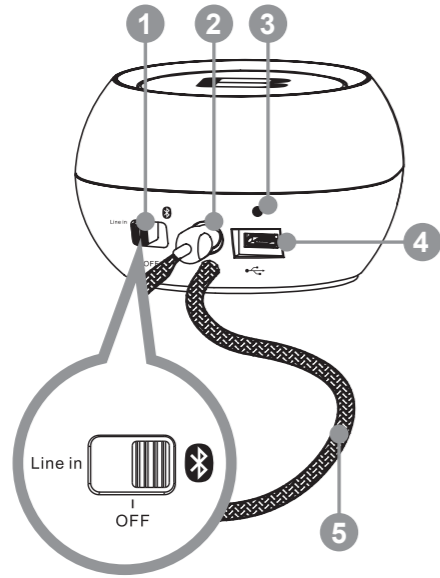

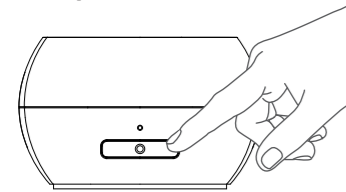

7	Multi Function Button

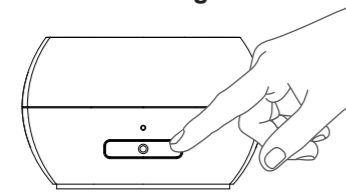
How to use the Multi Function Button ("MFB") ...

1 Call up Siri



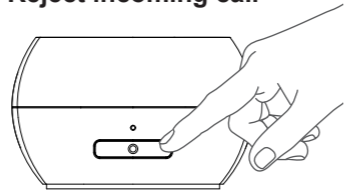
Press MFB to call up Siri

2 Answer incoming call



Press MFB to answer incoming call

3 Reject incoming call



Press and hold MFB to reject incoming call

→ LED OFF



Charging (Power OFF)
→ Solid Red



Charging (Power ON / Line-in & BT)
→ Solid Purple



Pairing Mode (Power on / BT)
→ Flashing Blue



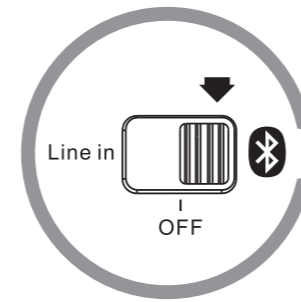
Power ON (Line-in & BT)
→ Solid Blue



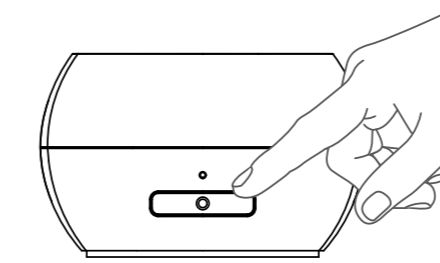
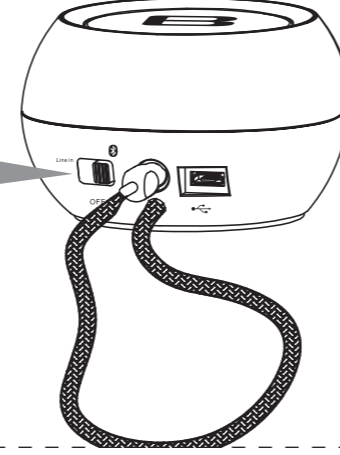
Pairing Mode (Charging)

How to Connect ...

1 Bluetooth mode (Pairing mode)

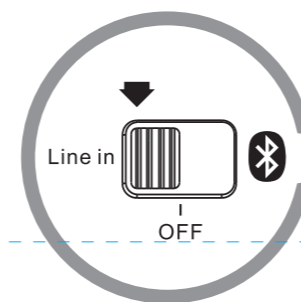


Slide to Bluetooth mode;
LED will light up

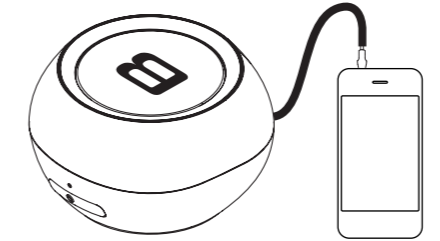
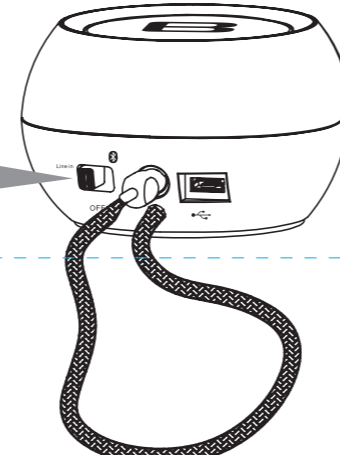


Press and hold "MFB" until it indicates flashing blue, search "Boomerang_mini" on your Bluetooth device and connect

2 Line-in mode

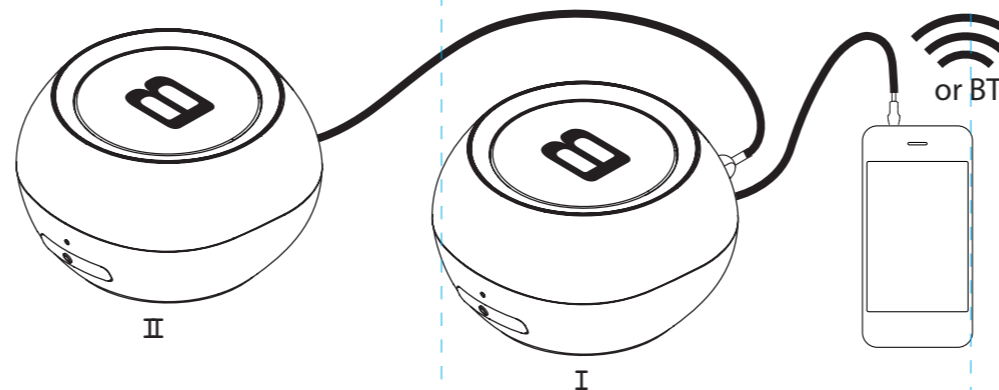


Slide to Line-in mode;
LED will light up



Plug the Built-in Cable to the device to stream music

3 Daisy chain connection



- Put the second speaker into the Line-in mode, and connect to the Line-out jack of first speaker

- Play music from your Music device via BT or Line-in on the first speaker; both speakers stream music at the same time

* When battery is empty, please charge the speaker for at least half an hour before switching on again.
* Fully charged once a month.
* Passcode is "0000".
