THE EMERGENCY FEATURE

- user friendly big button phone with emergency call feature, especially designed for senior citizens and people living alone.

When the red key on the wireless emergency pendant is pressed, the telephone will

- 1. Activate a loud local alarm for 15 seconds to get immediate help within the house.
- 2. If no help arrives, the phone dials in sequential mode the emergency numbers from the phone book (up to 30 records)
- 3. Play a pre-recorded or user recorded emergency message
- 4. If the other party receives the call and presses 0 key, a 3 minute speakerphone conversation will be activated.
- 5. After 3 minutes the phone will dial the next emergency number from the phone book unless the receiving party presses digits 1 and 2 to continue the conversation and deactivate the emergency feature.

SPECIAL FEATURES

EASY TO SEE big buttons and large characters on the oversize LCD. The display is high resolution with 5 contrast settings and full backlight.

EASY TO HEAR with selectable loud ringer and red light call indicator, adjustable receiver and speakerphone volume. Hearing aid compatible

INSTALLATION

Where to install the emergency phone


When installing the emergency phone, consider that the unit should be within the range of the emergency pendant, and therefore placed in an area of common use during day and nighttime. The range of the pendant is reduced by any structural obstacles, and has a range of up to around 130 feet in open field.

Installing batteries [Optional]

Your telephone requires four AA batteries (not included) for all functions. This will guarantee full functionality of the telephone, including the emergency function up to a maximum of 12 hours. The telephone numbers in memory and the voice recordings are stored in non volatile flash memory which does not require battery backup.

Before opening the battery compartment, make sure the telephone is disconnected from the telephone line and the AC power supply.





- pen to lift the battery compartment door.
- 2. Insert four AA batteries into the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols.
- 3. Snap the battery compartment door back into place.

When appears on the LCD display, replace the batteries with 4 AA fresh ones. Use only appropriate new AA 1.5V Alkaline batteries.

*PLEASE NOTE, for safety reasons; if the batteries voltage is lower then 2.5V, the phone will automatically be lock. Is this case, the display will fade out, all function will be shut off for the basic functions, such as call, dialing, receiving, etc. will still be working.

Reboot:


- 1. Unplug the AC power adaptor and replace the phone with new fresh batteries.
- 2. When the new batteries are replaced, re-plug in the AC Power Adaptor and the LCD will glow back on and icon on the display will disappear.

Replace the battery of the Pendant:

The pendant is equipped with a pre-installed internal battery. Each time the red key is pressed, the led will light to show correct transmission. In case the led does not light on, please change the battery with a new one

- 1. Use a Philips screwdriver to remove the screw on the lower case of the pendant and remove the lower case.
- 2. Replace the 12V DC battery with a fresh one.
- 3. Replace the lower case and secure it with the screw.


Connecting the plug-in AC adaptor



Insert the plug of the power supply into the power socket on the back of the telephone and plug the adaptor into wall socket. For safety reasons, use only the adaptor provided. Plug the adaptor to the socket-outlet which is near the equipment and should be easily accessible.

In case the telephone is not connected to the adaptor (and with no charged batteries), it will maintain the basic telephone feature of dialing and receiving a call. No other features will be working.


Connecting the telephone line



- 1. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the TEL. LINE at the back of the telephone base.
- 2. Plug the other end of the telephone line cord into the wall outlet.
- 3. Plug one end of the coil cord into the handset's modular jack.
- 4. Plug the other end of the coil cord into the left side of the telephone base.

Lift the handset to check for a dial tone.


Hanging the Phone on the Wall



- Insert the mounting bracket's two tabs into the matching slots opposite the keyhole slot on the bottom of the phone. Then press down and slide the bracket upward until the tab snap into place.
- 2. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the TEL. LINE jack at the back of the base.
- Plug the cord's other end into the wall plate jack, then align the base's keyhole slots with the screws and slide the phone downward to secure it on the wall.

SETTING UP

Please note that in this model some function keys will have a double function:



MENU KEY

Press the MENU key as many times as necessary to select the features you wish to choose:

- 1. LCD CONTRAST
- 2. ENTER TIME/DATE
- 3. LCD LANGUAGE
- 4. VOICE
- 5. STORE NUMBER
- 6. NAME RECORDING
- 7. RECORD MESSAGE
- 8. CHECK MESSAGE
- 9. FLASH
- 10. TONE / PULSE
- 11. REMOTE PENDENT

Setting the LCD CONTRAST

Depending on the viewing angle of the telephone, the user may want to adjust the LCD contrast:



- 1. Press the MENU button. The display shows **LCD CONTRAST**.
- 2. Press the **a** button. The display shows the current contrast setting which varies between 1 to 5.



- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the contrast level and confirm with 🏖 button.
- 4. The display now shows to **TIME/DATE**, you can refer to next section to set the time and date or press **PHONE BOOK** button to exit the set-up mode.

Setting the TIME/DATE

1. Press and release the MENU button until **TIME/DATE** is shown on the LCD display.



2. Press the 🏖 button. The display shows **ENTER TIME** and the hour digit will be flashing.



3. Select the current hour using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with 🏖 button. The minutes will now flash on the display.



4. Select the required minutes using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with ☎ button. The display now shows ENTER DATE and the month digit will be flashing.



5. Select the current month using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with 🏖 button. The day will now flash on the display.



- 6. Select the current day using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with 🏖 button.
- 7. Exit the set-up mode by pressing the **PHONE BOOK / ESC** button.

Some telecom providers, when sending the caller ID signal also send the time and date. In this case the telephone will automatically set the internal clock.

Setting the LCD LANGUAGE

This telephone has 11 different languages on the LCD.

The telephone factory preset default display language is **ENGLISH***.

Setting the language Display on the LCD

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **LCD LANGUAGE** is displayed.



- 2. Press the A button, the display shows **ENGLISH***.
- 3. Select the desired language; FRANCAIS (F), ITALIANO (I), DEUTSCH (DE), NEDERLANDS (NL), TUERKCE (TR), ESPANOL (ES), SLOVENSKI (SI), PORTUGUES (PT), DANSK (DK), SVENSKA (SE), etc) by using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with ♠ button.



4. Press **PHONE BOOK / ESC** button to exit the set-up mode.

Note: The [*] after the language means this language is the currently used language.

Note: The language on the LCD does not have a corresponding voice language. If user select the LCD Display in English and the voice setting was in French, it will not change to English.

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Setting the VOICE

This telephone is equipped with one primary and three secondary spoken languages:

Primary spoken language: the telephone will voice digits from 0 to 9 (used in pre dialing, talking caller ID, talking phonebook), the pre-recorded emergency message, and a fully voice guided menu. On the LCD the primary language is the first language that will show on the display.

Secondary spoken language: the telephone will voice from 0 to 9 (used in pre dialing, talking caller ID, talking phonebook) and the pre-recorded emergency message.


The telephone default voice language is **ENGLISH***.

Setting the VOICE language spoken by the telephone

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **VOICE** is shown.



2. Press the A button, the display shows VOICE ENGLISH *, VOICE FRANCAIS, VOICE ITALIANO, VOICE ESPANOL or VOICE OFF.



- 3. Select the desired option using the ▲ or ▼and confirm with 🏖 button.
- 4. Press **PHONE BOOK** button to exit the set-up mode.

Note: The [*] after the language means this language is the currently used language.

Note: The language on the LCD does not have a corresponding voice language. If user select the LCD Display in English and the Voice setting was in French, it will not change to English.

Setting the FLASH

This feature allows the user to set the flash time required in each country or needed on the PABX. Contact your local telecom provider to know the appropriate flash time.

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **FLASH** is shown.



2. Press the **b** button,



3. Select the required flash time (default is 600ms) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with the ♣ button. (80 / 100 / 270 / 300 / 600)



4. Press **PHONE BOOK** button to exit the set-up mode.


Setting the TONE PULSE

This feature is needed for those countries requiring pulse dialing (default is tone).

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **TONE/PULSE** is shown.



- 2. Press the **b** button,
- 3. Select the **TONE** or **PULSE 40/60** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with the 🏗 button.



4. Press **PHONE BOOK** button to exit the set-up mode.

Setting the REMOTE PENDENT

THE TELEPHONE COMES EQUIPPED WITH ONE EMERGENCY PENDANT WHICH IS ALREADY PAIRED WITH THE UNIT.

Please contact your local re-seller to purchase additional emergency pendants. These can be used for another person in the house or to leave the pendant in more than one room (like bathroom and bedroom).

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS FOR PAIRING ADDITIONAL PENDANTS ONLY OR IF YOU HAVE DELETED THE PANDANT FROM THE "PAIRING MENU"

New Pendants need to be paired to the telephone:

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **REMOTE PENDANT** is shown.



- 2. Press the 🏖 button,
- 3. Select **PAIRING** or **DELETE** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with the 🏗 button.



Remote Pendent setting:

If you select **PARING**, the display will show **PAIRING** for only 3 seconds.



Immediately press and hold down pendant key for 3 seconds until you see "**PAIRED**" on the display.



If after 2 seconds no pendant was successfully paired, the display will show "PAIRED FAILURE".



Please repeat above procedure until you have successfully paired the pendant with the telephone.

You can pair up to 5 pendants to each telephone. Please repeat above procedures to pair each individual pendant.

If you have already paired 5 pendants to the phone attempt to pair more, the display will show "FULL".



Delete Devices:

If you select "**DELETE**", the unit will delete ALL the paired pendants.



You will need to pair all pendants again including the main pendant which came with the phone.

Press PHONE BOOK / ESC to exit set-up mode.

Upon exiting set-up mode, you should press the pendant button to make sure that the pendants were successfully paired. If the phone beeps, press the pendant again to abort the emergency calling feature.

TELEPHONE OPERATION

Dialing a Call

- 1. Pick up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button (the speaker LED will light) and wait for a dial tone. The line engage led will turn on.
- Press the keypad for the telephone number you wish to dial. The display will show the number that you dialed on the keypad. If you dial a number over 14 digits long, it will show the last 14 digits only.
 - 3. When you have completed your call, hang up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button again to disconnect the telephone call.

The line engage red led will turn off when the line is not engaged. In case the handset is not placed well on the telephone, the red led will remain on to warn the user.

It is possible to switch from a handset conversation to a speakerphone conversation by pressing the **SPEAKER** button and picking up or hanging up the handset accordingly.

Pre Dialing a Call

- Dial on the keypad the telephone number. The telephone will voice the digits dialed (with voice option YES). To correct a number press the **DEL** button for each incorrect digit
- 2. Pick up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button

Receiving a Call

When you receive a call, the telephone rings, the Ringer LED flashes, and the display shows the CALL# and the caller telephone number (with caller id service activated), and say the name of the caller if the number matches with a name recorded in the phone book, if not, it will say the numbers of the calling party (with voice option ON)

The Caller ID feature allows you to decide to pick up the phone or not depending on who is calling.

If you want to talk to the caller:

- 1. Pick up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button to answer the call.
- 2. At the end of the call, return the handset to the cradle or press **SPEAKER** button again.

Receiving a Call with the remote pendant

If you are within a 10 feet from the telephone you can answer to an incoming call by pressing the red button on the remote pendant, the telephone will engage the line and activate the speakerphone. By pressing the red button of the pendant a second time you will deactivate the speakerphone and return to standby mode.

This feature is particularly useful if you are sitting on a couch or relaxing and do not wish to get up to answer the telephone.

Speaker Volume Control

You can adjust the speaker volume for a more comfortable listening level by sliding the witch.

This will also adjust the volume of the voice driven features. It is suggested to maintain the volume at medium level.

Redial

To redial the last number called

- 1. Lift the handset or press **SPEAKER** button.
- 2. Press the REDAIL button.

Noted: The last number dialed (up to 32 digits long) can be redialed.

Pause

You can insert a 3.6 seconds pause into dialing or storing a number into memory in order to access custom and telebanking services, long distance, etc. Press **REDAIL** button at the desired point in number. Press **REDAIL** button again if an additional 3.6 seconds is needed.

This feature is also useful if the telephone is connected on a PABX.

Flash

Many special network services, such as Call Waiting, require a switch hook signal. The **Flash** button provides the electronic equivalent of a switch hook operation.

For example, if you subscribe to Call Waiting*, you can use this feature to put your current call on hold and answer another call on the same line by pressing the **Flash** button.

Please note that a subscription is required to use these services.

Mute

You can hold down the **MUTE** button to mute the microphones of the handset and base. Release the button to resume.

Hearing Aid Compatibility

This unit is compatible with inductively coupled hearing aids.

Ringer Volume Control

The ringer sound level can be adjusted by slide the RINGER switch to select high (♣), mid (♠) and low (♠) level.

The red bright LED will flash with all incoming calls.

Receiver Volume Control

You can adjust the receiver volume for a more comfortable listening level. During a call, press once to have louder sound level, press the button once again to resume. The receiver volume will reset to the normal setting when you replace the handset.

THE PHONE BOOK

Important: When using the phone book features, please note it is only available at phone book mode (icon turns on). If the icon is off, press **PHONE BOOK** button once.

Storing numbers (Phone Book can be stored up to 30 lists)

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until **STORE NUMBER** is displayed.



2. Press the 🏖 button. The cursor will flash in the first position.



3. Enter the desired telephone number with a maximum of 22 digits using the number pad and confirm with **a** button. (Both the **Delete** button and **Pause** buttons can be used when storing the telephone number)



4. When the bottom cursor is flashing enter the desired name with a maximum of 16 letters.



How to enter names in the phone book

The number buttons are also inscribed with letters for entering the name. By repeatedly pressing the appropriate button, upper case letters as well as numbers and special characters can be entered.

Incorrect entries can be deleted by pressing the **DEL** button. To do this, move the cursor the correct position using \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown and then press **DEL** button.



5. Confirm with **b** button. The display now shows **EMERGENCY OFF**.



7. Select the **EMERGENCY ON** or **EMERGENCY OFF** using the ▲ or ▼ and confirm with ♠ button.



The above feature lets you decide whether the phone number you've stored should be dialed out when the emergency feature is activated.

If you selected **EMERGENCY OFF** and press **A**, **SAVED** is shown and the unit display "Name Recording".



That means the phone number is stored only for a general phone dial out, but not for emergency's call dial out.

To record the person's name (example 'this is John'), hold down **b** button, speak clearly into microphone after a beep and "VOICE" icon is flashing.





Release the button when you finish or the unit will stop recording after 3 seconds. The voice prompt will then be played automatically. [Recording the Voice is necessary for the personalized talking caller id and talking phone book feature].

If you selected **EMERGENCY ON**, and press ♠, now "LOCATION" is shown. Select the required location by pressing ♠ or ▼ and confirm with ♠ button, "SAVED!" is shown.









[IMPORTANT NOTE: SELECTING THE CORRECT LOCATION IS VERY IMPORTANT BECAUSE THIS WILL BE DIALED IN THE EMERGENCY FEATURE. LOCATION 1 WILL BE DIALED FIRST, THEN 2, THEN 3 ETC.] [IMPORTANT NOTE: IF YOU CHOOSE TO OVERWRITE A LOCATION, THE PREVIOUSLY STORED NUMBER WILL BE MOVED TO ONE LOCATION "AFTER" THE LOCATION YOU JUST SET]

The unit announces "Name Recording", "SOS" icon is shown. That means the phone number is stored for a general phone and emergency's call dial out.

To record voice (example 'this is John'), hold down **a** button; speak clearly into microphone after a beep and "VOICE" icon is flashing. Release the button when you finish or the unit will stop recording after 3 seconds. The voice prompt will then be played automatically. [Recording the Voice is necessary for the personalized talking caller id and talking phone book feature]

7. You can repeat step 2 to 6 to enter more numbers or press **PHONE BOOK** button to exit.

Incorrect entries can be deleted by pressing the **DEL** button. To do this, move the cursor the correct position using ▲ or ▼ and then press **DEL** button.

Review Numbers (Phone Book Memory)

- 1. Press and release **PHONE BOOK** button, icon is shown.
- 2. Review the stored phone numbers by pressing ▲ or ▼, or enter the first letter of the name of the person you wish to call using the number pad. After a short time, the display will show the first stored telephone number with this initial letter, and announce the name if it was recorded, or announce the telephone number. You can now search for further numbers under this letter by pressing ▼.

*If no voice was recorded for the contact, the phone will only announce the telephone number only.

Notes:

- If no telephone number is stored, the display will show **EMPTY**.
- · After you view all the Caller ID in memory, the display will show END OF LIST.
- If SOS icon is displayed on the contact, this means that the number is an emergency primary dial out contact.

If no key is pressed for 30 seconds, the telephone will return to standby Caller ID mode.

Dial Numbers (the displayed telephone number of Phone Book Memory)

- 1. With the desired telephone number showing on the display, press **b** button. The telephone dials out the displayed telephone number automatically in speakerphone mode.
- 2. The display shows dialed out telephone number and counting timer.

OR

- 1. Pick up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button (the speaker LED will light) and wait for a dial tone.
- 2. Press and release **PHONE BOOK** button, icon is shown.
- 3. Review the stored phone number by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- 4. Press to button

Recording / Editing / Deleting voice prompt of name of phone book

When an incoming call is received, the unit will display and announce the caller's phone number. If the caller's phone number is stored in the phone book, and caller's name will be displayed as well.

If the voice prompt is recorded for this phone number, the unit will announce the voice prompt recorded instead of the caller's phone number.

- To record names press and release the MENU button until the "NAME RECORDING" is shown.
- 2. Press the **a** button. A list of the phone book entries will be display.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the list you like to record a voice or name for it.
- 4. To record or edit the voice prompt, hold down **a** button. Speak clearly into the microphone after a beep and "VOICE" icon is flashing. Release the button when you finished or the unit will stop recording after 3 seconds. The new voice prompt will then be played automatically.
 - To delete the voice prompt recorded, press **DEL** button during the voice prompt is playing.
- 5. Repeat step 3 to 4 to edit or delete more entries or exit the set-up mode by pressing the **PHONE BOOK** button.

To Edit the Phone Book Memory

- 1. Press and release **PHONE BOOK** button, icon is shown.
- 2. Select the required location from the phone book by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- 3. Press and hold **MENU** button for two seconds. The display will show **EDIT?**.
- 4. Press **a** button, the first digit of the selected phone number will flash.

- 5. You can move the cursor to the required position by pressing ▲ or ▼. To delete the digit, press **DEL** button, or press any numeric key to replace the digit and confirm with 🏞 button. Then the display shows the flashing first letter of the name.
- 6. Move the cursor to the required position by pressing ▲ or ▼. To delete the letter, press **DEL** button, or press any numeric key to replace the name, and confirm with button, "**EMERGENCY ON or OFF**" is shown.
- 7. If the display shows "EMERGENCY OFF", and you want to change it as an emergency's call dial out, select "EMERGENCY ON " by pressing ▲ or ▼, and confirm with 🏗 button, now "LOCATION" is shown. Select the required location by pressing ▲ or ▼ and confirm with 🏗 button, "SAVED!" is shown.

 If you select "EMERGENCY OFF" and confirm with ♠, "SAVED!" is shown.

[Important note: selecting the correct location is very important because this feature determines in case of emergency sequence of the telephone numbers that will be dialed in the emergency feature. Location 1 will be dialed first, then 2, then 3 etc.]

[Important note: if you choose to overwrite a location, the previously stored number will be set to one location "after" the location you just set]

8. You can repeat step 2 to 7 to edit more numbers or press **PHONE BOOK** to exit.

To Delete the Phone Book Memory

- 1. Press and release **PHONE BOOK** button. icon is shown.
- 2. Select the required location from the phone book by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- To delete single memory, press DEL button once. The display will show the
 DELETE?. Press and hold down "DEL" for approx 2 seconds. The telephone
 number and name will be deleted and the display will now show another number from
 the phone book.

<u>To delete all phone book memories</u>, press and hold **DEL** button until the display shows **DELETE ALL?**. Press **DEL** button for 2 seconds until **EMPTY** appears on the display.

EMERGENCY FEATURE

This feature allows you to get immediate help from the people on the emergency phone list

The emergency feature is only possible with the unit powered by the AC adaptor or by the backup batteries. (not included)

Emergency Message

Two options are provided for the emergency message:

- A. A pre-recorded message "This is an emergency call, to accept this call press zero". This message will be played unless you decide to record your own message.
- B. Your own recording (MAX. RECORDING TIME 20 SECONDS).
 This can be any message of your choice, but should always end with the phrase "TO ACCEPT THIS CALL PRESS ZERO".

*EMERGENCY MESSAGE RECOMMENDATION

"This is an emergency call... My name is Jane Smith. My address is 123 main St. I need immediate medical assistance. To accept this call please press zero"

To Record your own emergency message

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until the **RECORD MESSAGE** is shown.



2. Press and hold down the **b** button. Start your message immediately after the beep and "VOICE" icon will be flashing.



While recording, keep at a distance of 15 cm from the telephone so that you can speak clearly into the microphone.

Release the button after you have finished your emergency message.
 The message will now be played back automatically.

Check the Message (Emergency Message)

You can check the emergency message at any time.

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until the **CHECK MESSAGE** is shown.



2. Then press the **a** button to play back the message.

<u>Delete the Message (Delete your own emergency message and reverting to the</u> pre-recorded message)

If you have recorded your own message, you can delete this and by doing so revert to the pre-recorded message.

- 1. Press and release the **MENU** button until the **CHECK MESSAGE** is shown.
- 2. Then press the **a** button to play back the message.
- 3. During the playback, press **DEL** button. Your own message will be deleted and you will be using the pre-recorded factory default greeting.

To Store Numbers M1 and M2 Keys (Hot Keys)

The phone is equipped with two emergency one touch memory. They can be programmed with the telephone number of the police or the ambulance or any other emergency numbers.

1. Press and release the **MENU** button until the **STORE NUMBER** is shown.



2. Press the 🏖 button. The cursor will flash in the first position.





- 3. Enter the desired telephone number with a maximum of 22 digits using the number pad and confirm with **>** button.
- 4. Press **M1** or **M2**.
- 5. Confirm with 🏖 button. The number has now been saved and display show SAVED!.



6. Repeat step 2 to 5 to store other numbers for other memory buttons.

To dial the numbers in the emergency MEMORY Buttons, simply pick up the handset or press **SPEAKER** button then press **M1** or **M2**.

NOTE: THE NUMBERS STORED IN THE **M1** OR **M2** MEMORY BUTTONS ARE FOR MANUAL DIALING ONLY AND WILL NOT BE DIALED IN THE EMERGENCY DIAL OUT SEQUENCE.

Activate the Emergency Call:

- 1. When the key of the pendent is pressed for more than one second or the emergency button SOS on the telephone is pressed, the NEW CALL LED on the telephone will blink continuously. The telephone beeps loudly for 15 seconds. If during this time the emergency button SOS on the telephone, or the key of the pendant is pressed for more than 5 seconds, the emergency procedure will be stopped immediately. If the key is not pressed, the SOS icon will turn on the LCD and the emergency dialing will start:
- 2. The telephone dials out the first emergency number (stored in the phone book emergency location 1) in speakerphone mode, and then announces the emergency message continuously.

If during 60 seconds the called party acknowledges the call by pressing **0**, the telephone will be put in speakerphone conversation mode for 3 minutes.

If within these 3 minutes, the called party presses 1 and then 2, the emergency dialing procedure will be stopped (SOS icon will turn off). The unit will be kept in speakerphone mode continuously without stopping unless the user presses the speakerphone key again or presses the remote key to stop the speakerphone. If 1 and 2 are not pressed during 3 minutes, the emergency feature stops only when all the emergency numbers have been called.

- If **0** is not pressed during 45 seconds, the telephone will dial out the next emergency number automatically in speakerphone mode.
- 3. After completing the first cycle of emergency calls, if no call was successful and none of the called parties have pressed 0, the SOS icon will remain on and the telephone will go in standby mode for 10 minutes to allow for incoming calls. After 10 minutes, or thereafter if the line is engaged by incoming call, the telephone will

repeat a second cycle of emergency calls and at the end stop the emergency procedure (SOS icon will then turn off).

Note:

- 1. If NO emergency numbers have been set, the telephone will not dial anything and just beep loudly continuously when the emergency SOS key on the telephone, or the key of the pendant is pressed for more than one second.
- 2. It is important that the pendant must be within the range of the telephone to activate the emergency feature. The user should check that between the pendant and the telephone there are no structural obstacles, heavy concrete walls, etc.
- When the red key on the pendant is pressed, the led on the pendant will light up for as long as the key is pressed. If the led does not light up it is necessary to replace the battery.
- 4. To stop the ongoing emergency feature, press and hold for more than three seconds the emergency button on the telephone, or press and hold the button of the pendant for more than three seconds Engaging the line through the handset or the speakerphone SPEAKER button will also stop the ongoing emergency feature. When the emergency feature is off the SOS icon will also turn off.
- 5. The emergency feature will automatically stop when all the emergency numbers have been dialed or if the receiver presses 1 and 2 after the 0 key. [The reason for interrupting automatically the call after 3 minutes is for safety in case a receiving party presses 0 but for any reason is unable to receive the message, in case of mobile phone line failure for example]
- 6. The receiving party is expected to press **0**, **1**, **2** with a touch-tone phone, a standard feature in most telephones.

The following is a brief explanation on the above

*Please note: If 1 and 2 buttons are pressed by the receiving party after they have pressed 0 to accept the emergency call, the speakerphone will keep active until the speaker button on the phone or the pendant button is pressed to disconnect the call.

THE CALLER ID

On each incoming call with available caller ID the telephone will ring and announce the caller with their name (if a name was recorded associated with a telephone number in the phone book) or with the telephone number.

Important: When using the Caller ID features, please note it is only available at Caller ID mode (CLIP icon turns on), if the CLIP icon is off, press **PHONE BOOK** button once.

Please note that all caller ID features are strictly related to the service provided by the telephone service provider. In most countries it is necessary to subscribe to the caller ID service with the telephone service provider.

If the telephone is connected to a PABX the caller ID features depend on the PABX.

The caller ID feature is only possible with the unit powered by the adaptor or by the backup batteries.

Receiving a Call (the telephone can store up to 64 calls)

 If only the caller's phone number is received, the display shows the caller's phone number with the time and date it was received. The NEW icon turns on and NEW CALL LED blinks.

Notes:

- 1. CALL#01 means this data is stored in Caller ID memory location #01.
- 2. The calling time and date are immediately recorded from the real-time clock.
- If both the caller's name and phone number are received, the display shows the caller's name and phone number, with the time and date it was received. The "NEW" icon turns on and NEW CALL LED blinks.

Note: If the caller's name has more than 16 characters, only the first 16 characters will be displayed.

Erase the desired Caller ID Memories

- 1. Select the desired Caller ID memory location by using the ▲ or ▼button.
- To delete single memory, press DEL button once. The display will show the DELETE?. Press DEL button for 2 seconds. The data for that call will be erased, and the CALL# and Caller ID information will be updated.

<u>To delete all Caller ID memories</u>, press and hold **DEL** button until the display shows **DELETE ALL?**. Press **DEL** for 2 seconds until **NO CALLS** appears on the display. Both the total call and new call counters will become zero, and the current time and date will be displayed.

Call Back (Redial) from the Caller ID Memory

Select the desired Caller ID memory location by pressing ▲ or ▼.

Press **a** button once, the speakerphone will turn on automatically and dial the selected number.

OR

With the handset picked up, select the desired Caller ID memory location by pressing ▲ or ▼ then press 🏖 button twice.

Some telephone companies in certain areas require dialing "1" when dialing back incoming calls (long distance.)

To add the "1" on the caller ID call back feature, press ▲ or ▼ until the desired number is displayed on the LCD screen. Press ♣ once, then press ▲ or ▼ button. The telephone number with the "1" in front of the 10 digit number will display on the bottom on the LCD screen. Press ♣, the telephone will then call back the desired number and add the "1".

Copy from the Caller ID to the Phone Book

You can copy Caller ID information to the phone book while you are reviewing the Caller ID information.

- 1. Select the desired Caller ID memory location by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- 2. Press and hold MENU button for two seconds, display will show COPY TO MEMORY.
- 3. Press a button, display will show SAVED!.
