- 1.Frequency range:88.1~107.9MHZ •
- 2. Memory the latest frequency when press open button.
- 3. Memory store 10 (M1-M10)pcs optional selected frequency by user.
- 4.power source: 2 AAA batteries or DC5V car charge optional.
- 5. Memory frequency operate step:
 - a.Press frequency select button(+/-) select frequency you want to store.(i.e:88.1MHZ)
 - b.Press memory button around 2 seconds.M1 turn into glint state.With frequency select button(+/-) select memory spot you want store(i.e:M5).
