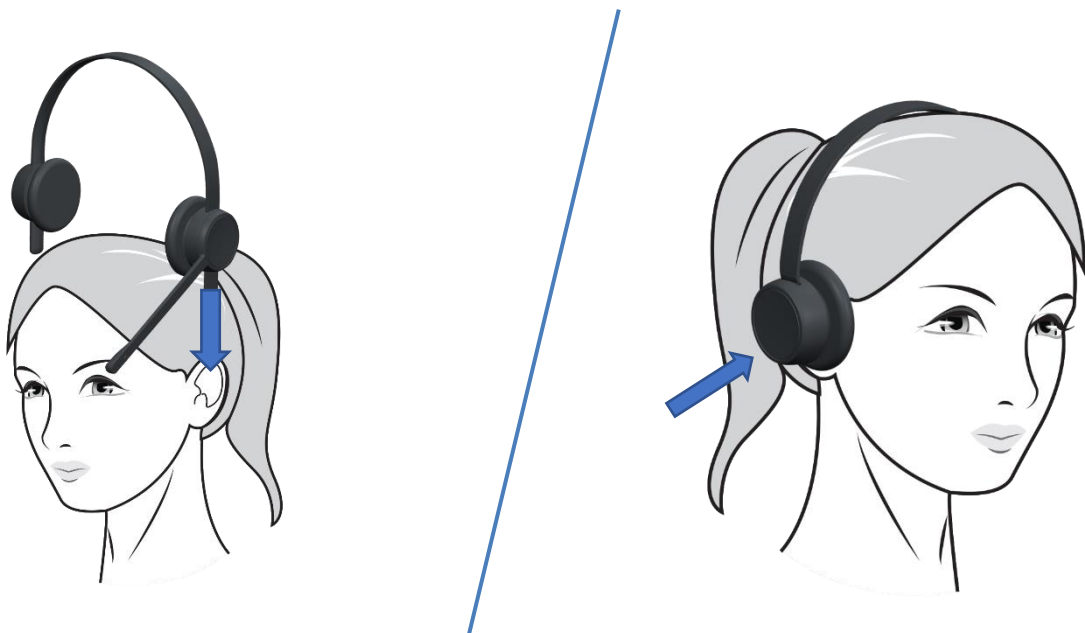
HOW TO REMOVE THE HEADSET FROM THE CHARGING STAND:

Press the top of the right ear cushions (the one with the boom arm) and tip the headset to the left. You will feel a soft click when the headset releases.

WEARING THE HEADSET:

All RTX corded headsets have a flexible and adjustable headband.

For best audio experience the microphone should be placed on the left ear.



Adjusting the headband:

Place the headband on your head with the headset on your ear, and adjust the headband for a comfortable fit.



Positioning the microphone:

For optimal sound quality, adjust the bendable boom arm until it is right in front of your mouth and less than 3-4 cm (1,25-1,5") away.





Rotating the bendable boom arm:

The boom arm can be rotated 270°



Replacing the ear cushions:

To replace the ear cushions, softly remove the old ear cushions with your fingers and gently attach the new ones.

HOW TO CHARGE:

Connect the base station into a wall charger, using the power plug that is delivered with the headset. Place the headset in the base station. (The earcup with the boom arm goes into the base station)

It takes 3 hours to fully charge the headset.



The headset can only be powered, by AC Power plug

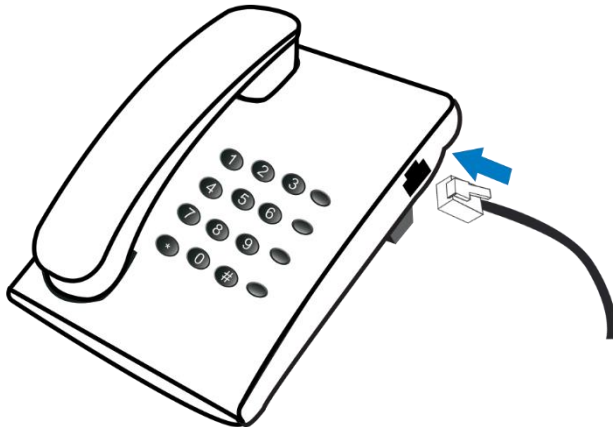
Battery status:

The LED on the charging cradle have different battery status indicators.

Status	Default Color	Pattern
Battery low – not cradled	Red	Steady on
Battery low - charging	Red	Long slow blink repeated
Battery not low – not full - not cradled	Yellow	Steady on
Battery charging	Yellow	Long slow blink repeated
Battery full – not cradled	Green	Steady on
Battery full - cradled	Green	Long slow blink repeated
Battery info missing	White	Short slow blink repeated
No master registration	Blue	Steady on
Registering	Blue	Long slow blink repeated
Registering, success	Green	Long blink, twice
Registering, failed	Red	Single long blink
Connection to headset lost	White	Short fast blink repeated

HOW TO CONNECT:

Simply plug-in the RJ9, RJ12 or RJ45 cable into the phone.



HOW TO USE:

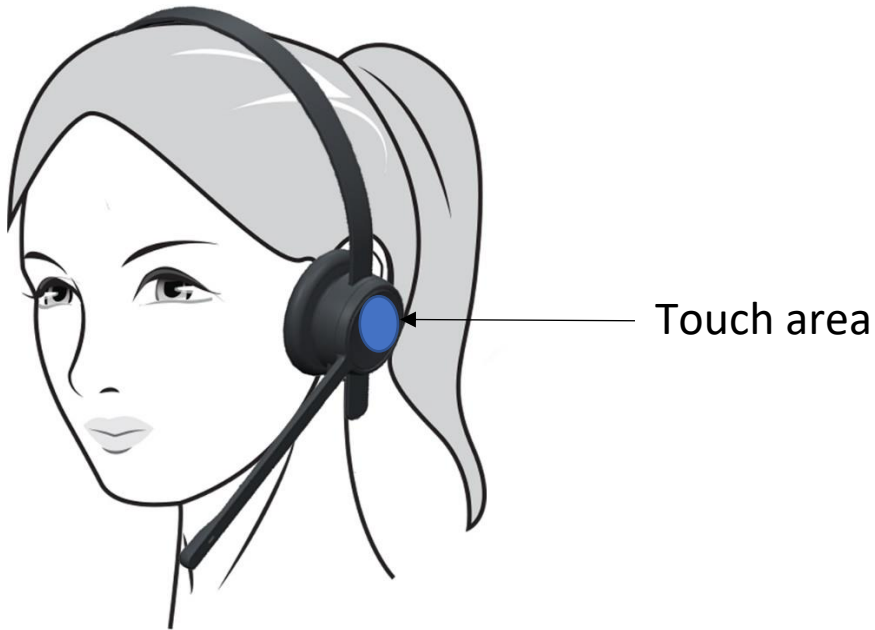
Left ear cup touch functions.

There are 3 touch terms:

Short press – 300 ms to 1,5 sec press

Double Press (two short presses)

Long Press – 1,5 sec to 5 sec press



Status	Mute light
Microphone Muted	ON
Microphone Un-Muted	OFF

Answer Call	Short press
End Call	Double press, when call is active
Reject Call	Double press
Volume up	Slide up
Volume Down	Slide down
Mute	Short press, when call is active
Un-mute	Short press, when call is muted
Put call on hold	Long press, when a call is active
Retrieve call on hold	Long press, when call is on hold
Reject 2 nd incoming call	Short press
Receive 2 nd incoming call, and terminate first call	Double press
Receive 2 nd incoming call, and put first call on hold	Long press
One active call and one call on hold	Short press, to mute/Unmute the active call
One active call and one call on hold	Double press to terminate active call.
One active call and one call on hold	Long press, to swap between calls
Resume music	Short press
Play next number	Double press

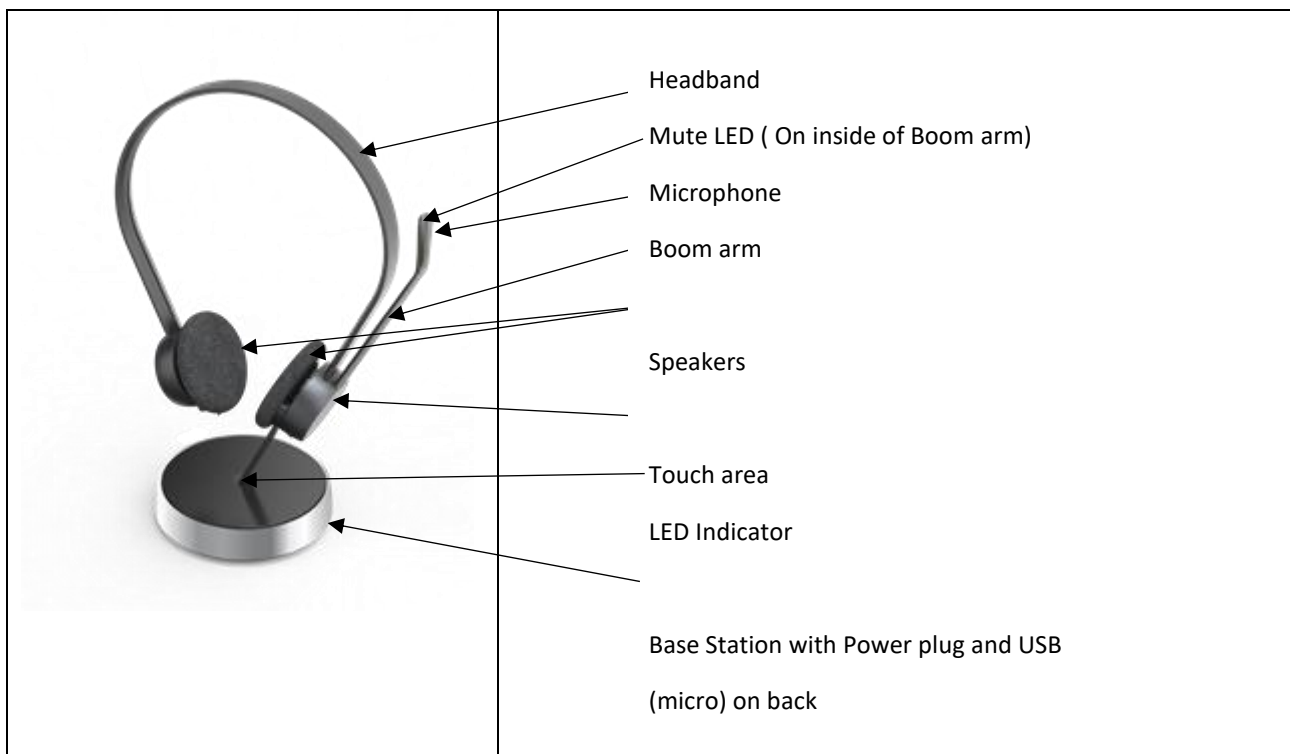
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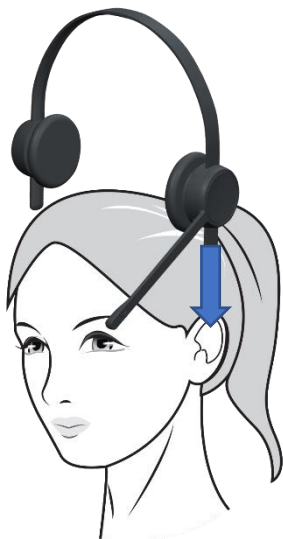
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HOW TO CONNECT:

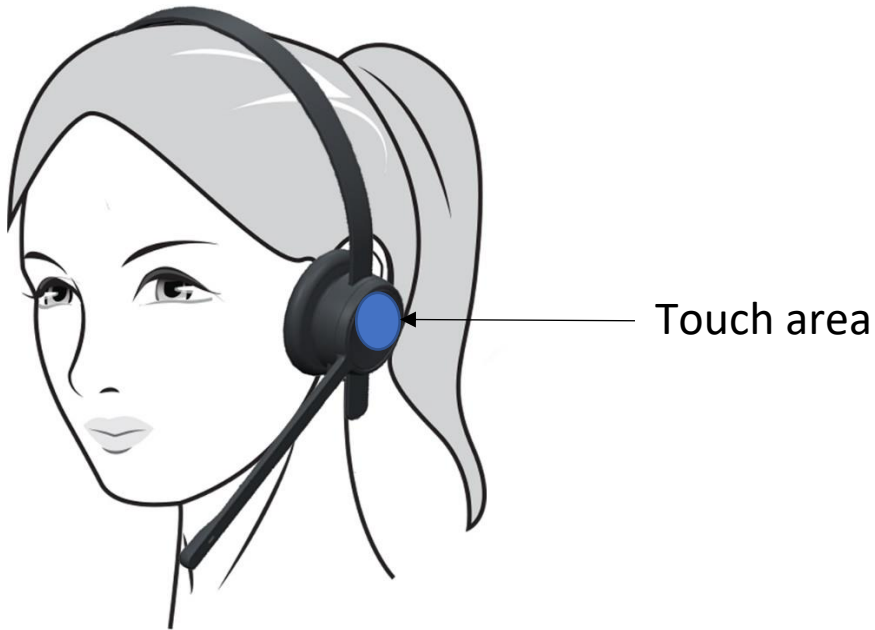
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Resume music	Short press
