### Installing batteries

- Apply thumb pressure to slide the battery compartment cover, then remove the cover.
- Insert two "AAA" batteries (included) following the polarity marks in the battery compartment.
- Reinstall the cover. Refer to the battery level indicator www on the display for battery's level. Replace with new batteries when the indicator is flashing.

### Using earphones and external microphone

When earphones are connected, sound output from the speaker will be muted.

When an external microphone is connected, no recording can be made from the built-in microphone.

### Locking the player controls

To avoid accidental key activation, slide  $\widehat{\blacksquare}$  /  $\widehat{\square}$  towards  $\widehat{\blacksquare}$  to lock the keys. Reverse the step to unlock.

### Installing Digital Voice Manager

- 1. Connect the player to the computer as instructed in the previous section.
- Windows: To access the RCA Digital Voice Manager installer, go to My
  Computer (XP users)/Go to Computer (Vista and 7 users) in the Start menu,
  find and open the drive letter associated with the player and then doubleclick the rcaDVM7\_setup.exe to launch the installer.

<u>Mac</u>: When you connect your device to the computer, it will appear on the desktop as a volume labeled RCA\_DVR. Double-click to view the volume's contents, then double-click the file RCA Digital Voice Manager Installer. dmg. When you double-click on this file, it will mount as a volume on the desktop. Double-click the "RCA Digital Voice Manager Installer" icon in the popup window to start the installation.

Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation. The RCA Detective application is installed with the Digital Voice Manager application on Windows and will open the Digital Voice Manager application automatically when you connect the player to your PC.

For information on the RCA Digital Voice Manager and how it works with this unit, refer to the Help Section of the software.

- When the player is in the settings menu, playback mode, or recording mode, a connection between the player and the computer will not be established. Quit the above modes before connecting to the computer.
- Data transfer is possible even if no batteries are installed in the player.
- · Do not disconnect the USB connection during files transfer.

### Folder Renaming


By default the folders on your device are named FOLDER1 - FOLDER10. These folders can be renamed using the DVM software supplied with your device. To do so, simply launch DVM while your device is connected to the computer. A list of folders and files on the device will appear on the left side of the screen. Double click any folder to enable renaming; press enter or click anywhere on the screen to confirm your edits. The newly renamed folders will appear on your recorder the next time you disconnect it from the computer and power it on.



If you change the folder name using Windows Explorer or Finder, the folder will no longer be recognized by the device. It is best to use only the DVM software for renaming folders.



# General controls



### Front Controls

◄
→ Skips to previous/next file; selects items in the menu; press and hold to fast backward or forward.

FOLDER - Selects folders

**REC-PAUSE** – Starts and pauses recording.

PLAY-PAUSE - Confirms a setting in the menu. Starts and pauses playback.

**STOP** – Stops recording or playback. Quits the sub menu and goes to main menu.

### Left Side Controls

Mic - External microphone jack.

Phones - External earphones jack.

Play Speed - Changes playback speed.

**Dict/Conf** – Sets Dictation or Conference recording mode.

**Menu** – While in stop mode, press to access the Settings menu. While in stop mode, press and hold to display file information.

### **Right Side Controls**







# Setting date and time

With the date and time set, you can always view the date and time of your recordings. Normal recording is still possible without setting the date and time. However, no correct recording date and time can be referenced in your recorded messages.

#### To set the date and time

- 1. While in stop mode, press **MENU** to access the Settings menu.
- Press ◄◄/▶► to select DATE+TIME and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press ◄
   to select SET TIME, SET DATE or TIME FORMAT and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press PLAY•PAUSE to select hour, minute, AM/PM, month, day and year.
   Press ◄◄/▶► to adjust the value and then press PLAY•PAUSE to confirm selection.

# **Basic operations**

### Selecting folders and files

- While in stop mode, press FOLDER and then press ◄◄/▶▶ to select folder.
- 2. Press **PLAY-PAUSE** to confirm selection.
- Press ◄◄/▶► to select files and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection. Press
   ◄◄/▶► to skip to the previous/next file.

### Basic playback

### To play back recorded files:

- 1. Select a folder and a file.
- 2. Press PLAY-PAUSE to start playback.
- 3. Press **PLAY-PAUSE** to pause playback, press again to resume.
- 4. You can press Volume + to adjust volume.
- While in stop mode or during playback, press Play Speed to select different playback speeds. Options are SLOW, NORMAL, and FAST.
- Press ◄◄/▶► once to skip to the previous/next file. Press and hold ◄◄/▶► to fast backward/forward through the current file.
- 7. Press STOP to stop playback.

### Accessing Recorded File Information

While in stop mode, press and hold **MENU** to display recorded file information such as, date of recording, time of recording, recording mode, and recording quality.

# Recording

### Recording

- While in stop mode, press REC-PAUSE to start recording. The red recording indicator will illuminate. Recording time will be displayed once you begin recording.
- To pause recording, press REC-PAUSE once. The red recording indicator will be flashing. Press again to resume recording.
- 3. To stop recording, press **STOP**.

### **AVR (Automatic Voice Recording)**

This feature allows the player to sense sound and to record only when you are speaking into the microphone. When dictation stops for about three seconds, recording will pause and then start again automatically when you resume dictation.

- Select AVR ON in the Setting menu. Refer to Settings section for instructions on how to select AVR ON.
- 2. Press REC-PAUSE to enter AVR mode.
- 3. Start dictation. Recording starts automatically.
- 4. Press **STOP** to end AVR recording.

To adjust the sensitivity (Low/Middle/High) of the microphone, press - **Volume** + during AVR recording.

 AVR works better for dictation applications than lecture or conference recordings as background noise can cause some false triggers.



 The first syllable or two may be lost when you start recording because this 'sound' is used to turn on the AVR feature. It is a good practice to make some 'sounds' or say a short word to activate the AVR before you begin actual dictation.

### Setting recording quality

#### Definition:

- LP (Long Play) allows up to 1600 hours recording.
- SP (Standard Play) allows up to 280 hours recording.
- HQ (High Quality) allows up to 140 hours recording.

Refer to Settings section for instructions on how to select recording quality.

# Setting recording mode

### **Definition:**

- CONF (Conference) Use in a more open area where recording source is far from the player.
- DICT (Dictation) Use when recording source is close to the recorder.

Slide the **Dict/Conf** switch to select recording mode.

- You may slide the **Dict/Conf** switch during recording. However, you selection will only be effective starting from the next recording.
- For conferences, to obtain optimum recording quality, place the recorder with the microphone freely exposed to the sound source as close as convenient. A built-in automatic recording level control will set the optimum record level during manual recording. Avoid recording near unwanted noise sources, such as air conditioners or fans

# **Deleting files**

- 1. Select the file to be deleted.
- 2. While in stop mode, press ERASE.
- 3. Press ◄◄/ ▶▶ to select FILE(S) and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press ◄ / ▶ to select one of the deleting options:
- Delete the current file (Current file name)
- Delete all files in the current folder (ALL FILES).
- 5. Press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- 6. Press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm deletion.

# **Bookmarks**

#### To create bookmarks

- 1. During playback, press REC-PAUSE.
- Press ◄◄/▶► to select BOOKMARK and press PLAY-PAUSE to create bookmark. You can create up to 29 bookmarks in a file. When the maximum limit is reached. NO MORE BOOKMARKS AVAILABLE will be shown.

### To navigate bookmarks

During playback, press ◄ / ▶ to navigate to different bookmarks within the file.

### To delete bookmarks

- 1. While in stop mode, press ERASE.
- Press ◄◄/▶► to select BOOKMARK and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press◄◄/▶► to select a bookmark or select ALL (to delete all bookmarks created in the current file).
- 4. Press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- 5. Press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm delete.

# Insert

To insert a new segment into the current file

- 1. During playback, press REC-PAUSE.
- Press ◄◄/▶► to select INSERT and press PLAY-PAUSE to start recording. The newly recorded segment will be inserted from this point.
- 3. Press STOP to stop the recording of new segment.

# **Append**

### **Append**

The append function (add to recording) provides an easy way to edit a file when you are recording a list (e.g. a grocery shopping list). This enables you to add items to the end of a file.

To append voice data to the end of a file:

- 1. During playback, press REC•PAUSE.
- Press ◄◄/►► to select APPEND and press PLAY-PAUSE to start recording.
   The recording will begin from the end of the currently seleted file.
- 3. Press **STOP** to stop the recording.

# **Formatting**

### To format the memory of the player

- 1. Select Format in the Settings menu. Refer to the Settings section for details.
- When Format is selected, ALL DATA WILL BE PERMANENTLY LOST will be shown
- 3. Press **PLAY-PAUSE** to confirm your selection and start the formatting.



- If the player is formatted by a computer, make sure you select FAT32 as the file system.
- Properly unmounting the player before disconnecting it greatly reduces the chances of memory errors. To unmount the device:
  - Mac users, locate the RCA\_DVR device in the finder, then Ctrl+click and select Eiect "RCA\_DVR".
  - PC users, choose Safely Remove Hardware from the system tray, then choose to stop the USB Mass Storage Device.
- If power supplied from the battery fails suddenly (e.g. batteries are removed accidentally) during recording, the recoding in progress will be interrupted. The recorded file may also be corrupted and cannot be played back.

# Settings

### Accessing Settings menu

- 1. While in stop mode, press **MENU** to access the Settings menu.
- 2. Press ◄ / ▶ to select Settings and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press ◄◄/►► to highlight the desired item, then press PLAY-PAUSE to select that item.
- 4. Press ◄ / ▶ to adjust the value, then press PLAY•PAUSE to save the setting.
- 5. Press **STOP** to return to the main screen.

AVR	On/Off

### Accessing Date and Time menu

- 1. While in stop mode, press MENU to access the Settings menu.
- Press ◄
   to select DATE+TIME and press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press ◄◄/ ►► to highlight SET TIME, SET DATE or TIME FORMAT, then press PLAY-PAUSE to confirm selection.
- Press ◄◄/▶▶ to adjust the value, then press PLAY•PAUSE to confirm selection.
- 5. Press PLAY-PAUSE to return to the main screen.

# Troubleshooting tips

#### Player doesn't turn on

- Check that batteries are properly inserted and not exhausted.
- Make sure the battery compartment door is properly closed.

#### Can not record

- Make sure the LOCK function is not activated.
- Make sure memory is not full.
- · You have recorded 200 files in one folder. Try to record in a new folder.

### Incorrect recording date and time during playback

 You may not have set the date and time before recording. Refer to the Setting date and time section.

### No sound from speaker during playback

- Make sure volume is not set to 0.
- Headphones should not be connected.

### Can not activate the player after sliding $\widehat{\blacksquare}$ / $\widehat{\circlearrowleft}$ switch to $\widehat{\circlearrowleft}$

Remove the batteries to reset the player.

#### Available recording time becomes shorter

- You may have set the recording quality to 'High Quality'. Refer to the Setting recording quality section.
- Delete the Digital Voice Manager setup software from the player to free up more memory space.

### Can not perform playback

- Make sure you have selected a folder which contains recorded messages.
- Make sure the LOCK function is not activated.

### Can not delete recorded file(s)

· Make sure you follow each step under the Deleting Files section carefully.

### Can not keep the saved settings

· If the batteries are removed, saved settings may be lost.
