




Videocassette Tapes

Always insert the videocassette window-side up with the arrow on the case pointing toward the VCR.

Use only videocassette tapes marked VHS. European-standard PAL VHS videocassette tapes and S-VHS prerecorded videocassette tapes are not compatible.

To prevent accidentally recording over previously recorded material, remove the Record Protect Safety Tab on the videocassette case after recording.

To record a tape that has the Record Protect Safety Tab removed, place a piece of cellophane tape over the space from which the tab was removed.



Break off plastic cafety tab to prevent accidentally recording over important tapes



Cover the record protect space with cellophane tape to make a new recording

Note: The recording time available on a videocassette depends on Tape Speed (SP or DSP) and Cassette Type (T60 = 60 minutes at SP or 120 minutes at SLP; T120 = 120 minutes at SP or 360 minutes at SLP).


Note: Keep cassettes from direct sunlight, heat or extreme cold. Do not drop cassettes. Never touch the recording surface of the tape.

About Videocassettes

- In general, high-quality, brand name videocassettes last longer and provide a better picture.
- Rewind your cassettes all the way so that the tape is not at a midpoint; this can extend the tape life.
- Do not touch or splice the tape; this can damage the tape and playing such a tape can damage the VCR.
- · Do not take apart any cassette you plan to use again
- Do not put any object inside a videocassette and do not clean inside a videocassette; this can permanently damage the tape, making it unusable.

Remote Control Battery Install/Replace


- Lift and remove battery compartment cover from back of remote control.
- Insert two AA batteries following polarity (+,--) as diagrammed.
- Replace battery compartment cover.

Antenna/Cable Connection


Connect incoming coaxial antenna or cable line to IN FROM ANT. as shown:



 If your antenna line in is 300 ohm (with twin spade-type connectors), obtain a matching transformer (300 ohm to 75 ohm, not included) that will permit connection to the VCR's 75 ohm coaxial antenna input.

TV Connection

To connect the VCR and TV, use the cable type (75 ohm coaxial or AV RCA-type) appropriate to your TV. Connect the VCR to the TV as shown:



Power

To provide power for the VCR:

(see Rear Panel).

Converter into the vehicle cigarette lighter socket (see Rear Panel). For direct wiring, the cigarette lighter plug may be removed. Be sure to observe proper polarity when connecting wires.



Connect the AC Power Cord to a standard 110 volt household outlet


Connect the small plug end of the DC-DC Converter to the DC-IN jack on the back of the VCR. Insert the cigarette lighter plug end of the DC-DC

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Front Panel




Rear Panel



Remote Control

Always aim the remote control directly at the VCR.





Playing a Tape

- Turn TV and VCR on
- 2. Tune TV to channel 3 or 4, depending on how CH3/4 switch is set.
- 3. Insert videocassette into VCR. VCR automatically begins to play.

Manual Tracking

For best picture quality, the VCR video head must be aligned with the recorded track on the tape; this alignment is called tracking.

Videocassettes recorded on other VCRs and videocassettes with copy protection may require some manual adjustment.

To adjust manually, press TRADING (*) or TRADING (*) as necessary until the best picture possible is achieved.

Note: Picture distortion often occurs at the beginning of a tape. Let the tape play for a moment to see if the distortion clears.

Note: If manual tracking adjustments do not produce a clear picture, there may be a problem with the videotape.

Using Special Features

SRS

For best audio quality, select SRS mode when playing a hi-fi tape.

Forward and Reverse Picture Search

While in Play mode, press or or; to resume normal viewing, press .

Forward and Reverse Jet Search

While in Play mode, press and hold ⊕ or ⊕; Jet Search increases the tape speed 7 times if recorded at SP speed or 21 times for tapes recorded at SLP speed. To resume normal viewing, release the button.

Note: While in Forward or Reverse Jet Search, audio is muted. If streaks, blurring or horizontal jitters appear, adjust picture with Tracking buttons.

Still and Frame Advance

While in Play mode, press to stop on a single still frame. Press again to advance picture frame by frame. To resume normal viewing, press .

Note: Using Pause or Still mode for more than five minutes stresses the tape and causes undue stress on the video heads; the VCR automatically disengages Pause or Still mode after five minutes have elapsed.

Auto Repeat

Press to repeat tape continuously from beginning to end.

Double Speed Playback

Press button to begin playback; press button again to begin Double Speed Playback. To resume normal viewing, press button a third time.

Note: While in Double Speed Playback, audio is muted. If streaks appear, adjust picture with Tracking buttons to minimize.

Slow Motion Playback

Press ∞∞ or ∞∞ for Slow Motion Playback. Each time ∞∞ is pressed, Slow Motion Playback slows incrementally; each time ∞∞ is pressed. Slow Motion Playback speeds up incrementally.

Recording

- Turn on TV and VCR
- 2. Insert videocassette tape
- Press to change VCR to TV mode
- Select TV channel and record speed (SP, SLP)

Note: Tape speed can be changed while recording; there may be minor distortion but no interruption.

- Press 6; the REC button will light
- To pause recording, press . To resume recording, press . To resume recording.
- To end recording, press .

Cleaning and Care

- Disconnect the VCR from the power source before cleaning.
- Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners on or in the VCR.
- Use a dry cloth to dust the VCR
- Keep the remote control with the VCR and secure it in such a manner that it is unlikely to be lost or damaged.
- Keep liquids away from the VCR. A spill on the VCR can damage the electronics and cause electric shock or fire.

DO NOT INSERT ANY OBJECTS INTO THE CABINET SLOTS;

CONTACT WITH A VOLTAGE POINT INSIDE THE VCR CAN CAUSE DANGEROUS SHOCK OR MAY SHORT OUT PARTS AND CAUSE FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK.

Video Head Cleaning

If poor playback qualities (snow, distortion, streaking, etc.) develop and persist, the unit's video heads may need cleaning. Do not clean the heads excessively. If necessary, purchase a head cleaning cassette.

When using a head cleaning cassette, read all instructions carefully; incorrect head cleaning can permanently damage the video heads.

Troubleshooting

Before calling for service, check the following:

Problem: No power.

Solution: Make sure the VCR is on and connected to an operating power

source; check the remote for "good" batteries.

Problem: Videocassette cannot be inserted.

Solution: Press to see if a cassette is already in the VCR. Make sure the videocassette is window-side up, with the arrow pointing toward the VCR.

Problem: No picture, distorted picture on playback.

Solution: • Try another videocassette to see if it plays back properly.

- Press TRACKING (a) Or TRACKING (a) to adjust the picture.
 - Press of for VCR viewing.
 - Set the TV channel to 3 or 4, depending on how the CH3/4 switch is set.
 - Make sure the TV is working properly.
 - If the problem occurs on more than one tape, try using a video head cleaner cassette.

Problem: No TV broadcast picture.

Solution: • Press of for TV viewing or turn VCR POWER off.

- Check all connections between VCR, antenna/cable, and TV.
- Make sure TV is on.

Problem: Streaks (noise) on a taped program.

Solution: • Press TRACKER OF TRACKER TO adjust the picture.

- Check all connections.
- View another videocassette to see if it plays back properly.
- If the problem occurs on more than one tape, try using a video head cleaner cassette.

Note: Copy protection schemes can distort the picture; see your rental store operator.

Problem: Streaks (noise) or jitter with the VCR in Still mode.

Solution: Press TRACKING (a) OF TRACKING (v) to adjust the picture.

Problem: VCR will not Play, Rewind or Fast Forward.

Solution: • Check if the VCR is in Still mode.

Check if the cassette has been rewound.

Problem: The VCR motor continues to run even after (a) is pressed.

Solution: This is normal; the video heads run for five minutes even after a cassette has been stopped.

Limited One Year Warranty-USA and Canada

Length of Warranty. This warranty from Recoton Mobile Electronics shall be in effect for a period of one year from the date of the first consumer purchase.

Persons Protected. This warranty will be enforceable by the original owner and any subsequent owners during the warranty period so long as proof of date of purchase from an authorized Jensen dealer is presented whenever warranty service is required.

What is Covered. Except as otherwise specified below, this warranty covers all defects in material and workmanship in this product. The following are not covered: damage resulting from accident, misuse, abuse, neglect, product modification, improper installation, incorrect line voltage, unauthorized repair or failure to follow instructions supplied with the product; damage occurring during shipment (claims must be presented to the carrier); elimination of car static or other electrical interferences; any product purchased outside USA or Canada, or on which the serial number has been defaced, modified or removed.

How You Can Get Service.

U.S. Purchasers. Please telephone Jensen at 1-800-323-4815. We will either inform you of the name and address of an authorized Jensen repair station which will service the product or will advise you to send the product to a factory service center.

Canadian Purchasers. The product should be returned to the Jensen dealer from whom it was purchased and

such dealer either will service or arrange for service of the product.

If shipment of the product is required, it should be packed securely. The original dated bill of sale must always be included with the product as proof of warranty coverage.

What We Will Pay For. We will pay for all labor and material expenses required to repair the product, but you must pay any labor costs for the removal and/or installation of the product. If the product is shipped for warranty service, you must prepay the initial shipping charges, but Jensen will pay the return shipping charges if the product is returned to an address inside the USA or Canada.

Limitation of Implied or Statutory Warranties and Conditions. All implied or statutory warranties and conditions, including warranties or conditions of merchantability, fitness for particular purposes and non-infringement, are limited in duration to the length of this warranty.

Exclusion of Certain Damages. Jensen's liability is limited to the repair or replacement, at our option, of any defective product and shall not include incidental or consequential economic damages of any kind.

Some states and/or provinces do not allow limitations on how long an implied warranty lasts and/or do not allow the exclusion or limitation of incidental or consequential damages, so the above limitations and exclusions may not apply to you. This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights which vary from state to state and province to province.

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
