





## VCR Setup

# Using the Menu with the Remote Control

Your VCR has on-screen menus that allow you to access and control the VCR's programmable features. You will use the buttons on the remote control to work with the on-screen programming.

Each button works not only PLAY, CH TA but also as a shift cursor in the on screen menus.





- Press the MENU button on your remote control.

  The Main Menu will appear on screen.
- 2 Select the item you want to adjust using the ▶ button followed by the ▼ button on your remote control.

If the main menu does not appear, make sure the TV is tuned to the same channel as the VCR output CH3/4 on the MAIN MENUI of the VCR. If the VCR is in the TV mode, press the TV/VCR button on the remote control to turn it on.

# Setting the MAIN MENU

To make all of the VCR's features available, set the VCR functions before playing or recording a tape.

#### Record Speed

The VCR can record at two tape speeds. The slower speed (SLP) allows the VCR to record more program material on a tape. Tapes recorded at standard speed (SP) provide a clearer picture. Select the record speed on the MIAIN MENU to set the tape speed. You can refer to the following table:

TAPE	SP (Standard Play)	SLP (Super Long Play)
T-120	2 hrs	6 hrs
T-160	2 hrs	40 minutes8 hrs
T-180	3 hrs	9 hrs

#### Auto Repeat

Auto repeat set the VCR to play a tape repeatedly unless a tape control is activated (Stop, fast-fowardor rewind).

The VCR can record a program in stereo. It can also be set to record the secordary Audio Program(SAP) of any bryadcast with sewnd language audio. The VCR records the same audio on both the Hi-Fi and linear tracks on the tape.

## VCR Output CH

VCR sendds the output signals to channel 3 or 4 on your TV. Set the output channel on the menu to 3 CH or 4CH, whichever is vacant in your area.

# VCR Operation

## Recording

#### Recording while you watch

- Insert a video cassette with the record protect safety tab intact. Check the tape speed. If the VCR indicator on the front panel is not lit, press the TV/VCR button.
- Select a channel to record by pressing CH ts or the number buttons.
- Press the REC button on the remote control or the front of the VCR. The REC indicator will light.
- If you want to edit out unwanted material during recording, press the P/STILL button while recording and the VCR will pause. To resume recording, press the P/STILL button again.
- To end recording, press the STOP button.

#### Record protect tab

Before recording on any video cassette, make sure the record protect safety tab is in place. To prevent accidentally recording over a program, remove the record protect safety tab on the cassette case. To record on a tape with its tab removed, cover the hole with adhesive tape.



Cover the record protect space with cellophane tape to make a new recording

## Care and Maintenance

#### VCR

- Unplug your VCR from the wall outlet before cleaning.
   Use a dry cloth when dusting your VCR.
- Iroper ventilation ensures that overheating will not damage electronic circuits.
   Don't block ventilation holes.
- Take care of your remote control. Keep the remote with your VCR, where it is unlikely to be lost or damaged.
- Keep liquids away from your VCR, including beverages and cleaning liquids.
   Spilling any liquid on the VCR can damage the electronics, resulting in an electric shock or fire.
- Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners that can accidentally get into the VCR, causing damage or creating a fire hazard.
- Do not allow any object to be pushed into the cabinet slots. This includes coins, dusters, cleaning cloths, papers and other objects. Any such objects can connect with a voltage point inside the VCR, causing dangerous shocks, or may short out parts and cause a fire or an electric shock.

Video Head Cleaning

If poor pictures appear on a variety of cassettes, the video heads may need cleaning. This is not a common problem and unless it appears, the heads should not be cleaned. If necessary, purchase a head-cleaning cassette. If the picture quality does not improve after cleaning, call 1-800-SAMSUNG for service.

When cleaning the video heads, read all the instructions provided with the head-cleaning cassette. Incorrect head cleaning can permanently damage the video heads.

#### Video Cassettes

- · · High quality, brand-name cassettes often last longer and provide a better picture.
- Rewind your cassettes all the way so that the tape is not at a midpoint.
   This can extend the life of a cassette tape.
- Do not touch or splice the tape. This can damage the tape, and playing such a tape can damage your VCR. Do not take apart any cassette you plan to use again.



## Rear Panel



#### 1.AUDIO OUT

Use to output audio signals to connected equipment.

#### 2.VIDEO OUT

Use to output video signal from VCR to connected equipment.

#### 3.VIDEO IN

Use to output video signal from connected equipment.

#### 4.AUDIO IN

Use to output audio signal from connected equipment.

#### 5.TO TRANSMITTER

Use to send audio signal for FM transmitter.

#### 6.AC 12V INPUT JACK

Permits DC 12V power source connection of your unit to a DC battery, car battery, or AC/DC adapter.


#### 7.IN FROM ANT

Use to input cable or antenna signal.

#### 8.OUT TO TV

Use to output VCR signal to TV or monitor.

## Control buttons and Display



#### 1. POWER BUTTON

Press to turn the VCR power on or off.

# 2. CASSETTE COMPARTMENT

Insert a video cassette.

#### 3. EJECT BUTTON

Press to eject a tape or press to clear a timer program on the menu screen.

#### 4. STOP BUTTON

Press to stop tape or press to move a cursor to right on the menu screen.

#### 5. REC BUTTON

Press to record or press to move a cursor to left on the menu screen.

#### 6. POWER INDICATOR

Lit when VCR is turned on.

## 7. REC INDICATOR

Lit when VCR is rewrding on.

## 8. SP/SLP INDICATOR


Lit when VCR is rewrding in SLP mode

#### 9. DEW/HEAT INDICATOR

When DEW indicator is on, the VCR will not be able to work, which shows the VCR is under a high moist circumstance. Then the VCP will dry itself automatically and turn the light off, whith moist diappeear and works normally.

## Remote Control



#### 1. PLAY

Press to play a video cassette.

#### 2. POWER BUTTON

Press to turn VCR power ON.

#### 3. REC BUTTON

 Press to record a TV program or a external signal.

## 4. REW BUTTON

Press to rewind in stop mode or reverse search in play mode.

#### 5. CH/TRK BUTTON

Press to chang channels. Press to adjust cassette tracking.

#### 6. SHIFT BUTTON

Press to move the cursor.

#### 7. ENTER BUTTON

Press to enter the data.

#### 8. TV/VCR BUTTON

Press to switch between TV and VCR source.

#### 9. MENU BUTTON

Press to display menu screen.

## 10. STILL/SLOW BUTTON

Press to stop the tape on a single still frame in play mode. Press for slow motion playback in the still mode.

#### 11. F.F BUTTON

Press to fast fower in stop mode or foward search in play mode.


#### 12. STOP BUTTON

Press to stop a video cassette.

## Remote Control

## **Battery Replacement**

- 1. Remove the battery compartment lid.
- Place the battery in the battery compartment as indicated inside the compartment.
- 3. Replace the lid.



# Playing a Video Cassette Tape

- 1. Turn TV on and select to video mode.
- Lode a video cassette tape.
  - Then, VCR power turns on automatically.
- 3. Press PLAY to start playback.
  - If the tape doesn't have a safety tab, VCR will playback automatically.

    When playback strats, the VCR automatocally adjusts the tracling for clear picture and sound.
- 4. To stop playback, press STOP.

# Tracking Control

## Important Safety Instructions

For the best picture quality when playing a cassette, the video heads must be aligned with the recorded track. This alignment is called tracking. When playing back a tape, your VCR automatically adjusts the tracking on a video tape, but occasionally a cassette may require some manual adjustment. Keep in mind that picture distortion often occurs at the beginning of a tape.

## Automatic Tracking

Tum the TV on and insert a cassette into your VCR. Press the PLAY button, if necessary. After a few seconds of auto tracking, kyou would hear the sound from the video tape.

## Manual Tracking

Press the TRK buttons on the remote control up or down nutil the picture improves.

NOTE: The noise on the screen may not be completely eliminated depending on the tape used, especially when the tape was recorded on another VCR.
