Install the SIM or USIM card

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card,

- 1 Open the cover of the SIM card slot.
- Insert the SIM or USIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.





- Do not insert a memory card into the SIM card slot.
 If the memory card becomes lodged in the SIM card slot, you must take your device to a Samsung Service Centre to have the memory card removed.
- The SIM card slot of your device is only suited for standard SIM cards. Inserting a microSIM card or a microSIM card with an unauthorised holder may cause damage to the SIM card slot of your device.
- 3 Close the cover of the SIM card slot.

Charge the battery

Your device has a built-in battery. Before using the device for the first time or when the battery has been unused for an extended period, you must charge the battery.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers. Unauthorised chargers can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- Charge the battery only with a charger. You cannot charge the battery with the USB cable.
- When your battery is low, the device will emit a
 warning tone and display a low battery message. The
 battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level
 becomes too low, the device will automatically power
 off. Recharge your battery to continue using your
 device.
- If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the USB power adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.
- Connect the USB cable to the USB power adapter, and then plug the end of the USB cable into the multifunction jack.



The shape of the USB power adapter may differ depending on your region.



Connecting the USB cable improperly may cause serious damage to the device or USB power adapter. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

2 Plug the USB power adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged, first unplug the USB power adapter and USB cable from the device, and then from the power outlet.



To save energy, unplug the USB power adapter when not in use. The USB power adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the USB power adapter from the electrical socket when not in use to avoid wasting power. The device should remain close to the electrical socket while charging.


Insert a memory card (optional)

Your device accepts memory cards with maximum capacities of 64 GB. Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.





- Your device supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your device will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- When you insert a memory card in your device, the file directory of the memory card will appear in the extSdCard folder under the internal memory.
- 1 Open the cover of the memory card slot.
- 2 Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



- 3 Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4 Close the memory card cover.

Remove the memory card

Before removing a memory card, first unmount it for safe removal.

- Open the application list and select Settings → Storage
 → Unmount SD card → OK.
- 2 Open the memory card cover.
- 3 Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the device.
- 4 Remove the memory card.
- 5 Close the memory card cover.
- Do not remove a memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data or damage to the memory card or device.

Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your device. Format the memory card only on the device.

Open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Storage** \rightarrow **Format SD card** \rightarrow **Format SD card** \rightarrow **Erase everything**.

Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on your device. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.





Use the S Pen and the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions for using the touch screen.



- Do not press the touch screen with your fingertips, or use sharp tools on the touch screen. Doing so may damage the touch screen or cause it to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.
- Leaving the touch screen idle for extended periods may result in afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting.
 Turn off the touch screen when you do not use the device.
- Do not bend the S Pen.
- Do not use the S Pen near by a source of magnetic interference. It may cause the S Pen to malfunction or freeze.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- You can purchase a replacement S Pen from your local Samsung dealer.
- If your S Pen is not working properly, replace the tip of the S pen or take it to a Samsung Service Centre.
- For best results, keep the S Pen mostly perpendicular to the touch screen and avoid using it at sharp angles.

Control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger or the supplied S Pen to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a list of options.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.

Rotate the touch screen

Your device has a built-in motion sensor that detects its orientation. If you rotate the device, the interface will automatically rotate according to the orientation.

To set the interface to keep the orientation, select the right side of the system bar, and then select **Screen rotation** on the notifications panel.

Lock or unlock the touch screen

When you do not use the device for a specified period, your device turns off the touch screen and automatically locks the touch screen to prevent any unwanted device operations. To manually lock the touch screen, press the Power key.

To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing the Power key, tap anywhere on the screen, and then flick your finger in any direction.



You can activate the screen lock feature to prevent others from using or accessing your personal data and information saved in your device. ► p. 34

Get to know the Home screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the Home screen. From the Home screen, you can view indicator icons, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and other items. Scroll left or right to a panel of the Home screen.

- **Sound**: Activate or deactivate Silent mode. You can vibrate or mute your device in Silent mode.
- **Screen rotation**: Activate or deactivate the auto rotation.
- **Power saving**: Activate or deactivate Power saving mode.
- **Blocking mode**: Blocking mode: Activate or deactivate Blocking mode. In Blocking mode, your device will block all notifications.
- Mobile data: Activate or deactivate the data connection.
- Bluetooth: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- **Driving mode**: Activate or deactivate Driving mode.
- **Sync**: Activate or deactivate auto-syncing of applications.

Adjust the brightness of the display

- Open the application list and select Settings → Display
 → Brightness.
- 2 Clear the check box next to **Automatic brightness**.
- 3 Drag the slider to adjust the brightness.
- 4 Select **OK**.



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

Set a screen lock

You can lock your device by activating the screen lock feature.



- Once you set a screen lock, your device will require an unlock code each time you turn it on or unlock the touch screen.
- If you forget your PIN or password, bring your device to a Samsung Service Centre to reset it.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of security codes or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Set a face detection unlock

- Open the application list and select Settings → Lock screen → Screen lock → Face unlock.
- 2 Read the warning message, and then select Next.
- β Select **Set it up** \rightarrow **Continue**.
- 4 Adjust the device to fit your face inside the figure.
- 5 When your face is captured correctly, select **Continue**.
- Complete the setup of the secondary unlock PIN or pattern.

Set an unlock pattern

- Open the application list and select Settings → Lock screen → Screen lock → Pattern.
- 2 See the on-screen instructions and example patterns and select **Next**.
- 3 Draw a pattern by dragging your finger to connect at least 4 dots and select **Continue**.

- If you forget your unlock pattern, you can deactivate the screen lock feature with a backup PIN.

Set an unlock PIN

Set an unlock password

- 1 Open the application list and select Settings → Lock screen → Screen lock → Password.

Lock your SIM or USIM card

You can lock your device by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM or USIM card.

- 1 Open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security** \rightarrow **Set up SIM card lock** \rightarrow **Lock SIM card**.
- 2 Enter your PIN and select **OK**.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the device.

Activate the Find my mobile feature

Enter text

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad, inputting handwriting on the screen, or speaking words into the microphone.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages.

Change the keyboard type

You can change the keyboard type. Select em on the system bar and select a keyboard type.

You can also enter text with your voice. Select and a voice input option, according to the language you want to use.

Enter text using the Samsung keypad

Enter text by selecting alphanumeric keys and you can use the following keys:



- 5 Select → Paste to insert the text from the clipboard into the text input field.

Using special features

Your device can be used as a powerful notepad, thanks to multiple features that help you input text, capture drawings, and use motion controls or voice commands.

Learn basic S Pen actions

Your device is supplied with a specialised S Pen. With the S Pen, you can perform the following actions:



- Tap: Tap an item or area on the screen to select an item, open a menu, or launch an application.
- Tap and hold: Tap and hold the S Pen on an item for more than two seconds.
- Double-tap: Quickly tap an item or area on the screen twice.
- Flick: Tap an area on the screen, and then slowly drag the S Pen up, down, left, or right to move through lists or screens.
- Draw: Draw a line or shape on the drawing pad.
- Write: Write text on the handwriting panel.

Learn advanced S Pen actions

With the S Pen, you can also perform the following advanced actions.



Back

While pressing the S Pen button, draw < to return to the previous screen.



Menu

While pressing the S Pen button, draw ^ to open a list of options available on the current screen.



Screen capture

While pressing the S Pen button, tap and hold the screen to capture a screenshot.

After capturing a screenshot, you can draw on it, write on it, or crop it. The edited image will be saved in My Files → sdcard → Pictures → Screenshots.



Quick note

While pressing the S Pen button, double-tap the screen to launch the Quick note function.



Text selection

While pressing the S Pen button, drag the S Pen to the left or right on the text to select.



Quick command

While pressing the S Pen button, drag the S Pen up to launch the Quick Command feature.

On the Quick Command screen, draw a gesture command to launch the assigned application or feature. (p. 62)

Replace the tip of S Pen

If the tip is worn down or seems the S Pen is not working properly, replace the tip as new one.



If the S Pen is not working properly after replacing the tip, make sure the tip is fully inserted until it reach the end.

- I Grab the tip with the tip extractor tool, and then pull it out.
- 2 Insert a new tip into the S Pen where you just removed until it reach the end.






Learn motions

Built-in motion recognition provides you with enhanced controls. You can perform actions by moving your device or performing gestures with your hands.

To use some of these functions, you must first activate the motion recognition feature. Open the application list, select **Settings** → **Motion**, and then drag the slider to the right of the top right of the screen.


> Tilt



Pick up

From the Samsung keypad, you can switch to Handwriting mode to enter text more easily. To switch to Handwriting mode, tap and hold , and then select without lifting from screen.



Write your text on the handwriting panel.





Your device will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call, open the notifications panel and select the missed call.

Set auto rejection

Use auto rejection to reject calls from certain numbers automatically. To activate auto rejection and create auto reject lists,

- 1 Open the application list and select Phone \rightarrow Keypad \rightarrow \blacksquare \rightarrow Call settings \rightarrow Call settings.
- 2 Select **Auto reject mode**, and then select an option.
 - All numbers: Reject all calls.
 - Auto reject numbers: Reject calls for the certain number.
- 3 Turn on the auto rejection mode by dragging the slide bar to the right next to **Auto reject mode**.
- 4 Select Auto reject list.
- 5 Select +.
- 6 Enter a number to reject and select **Save**. You can set the criteria for the number.
- 7 To add more numbers, repeat steps 4-6.

Set call forwarding

Call diverting is a network feature to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside of the service area.

Open the application list and select Phone → Keypad →
 □ → Call settings → Call settings → Call forwarding
 → a call type.

- 2 Select a condition.
- 3 Enter a number to which calls will be forwarded and select **Enable**.

Your setting will be sent to the network.

Use Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode

In FDN mode, your device will restrict outgoing calls, except for the numbers stored in the FDN list. To activate FDN mode,

- Open the application list and select Phone → Keypad →
 □ → Call settings → Call settings → Additional settings → Fixed Dialling Numbers → Enable FDN.
- 2 Enter the PIN2 supplied with your SIM or USIM card and select **OK**.
- 3 Select **FDN list** and add contacts to be used in FDN mode.

Set call barring

Call barring is a network feature that restricts certain types of calling or prevents others from making calls with your device.

- Open the application list and select Phone → Keypad → → Call settings → Call settings → Additional settings → Call barring → a call type.
- 2 Select a condition.
- 3 Enter a call barring password and select OK. Your setting will be sent to the network.

Set call waiting

Call waiting is a network feature to alert you of an incoming call while you are on a previous call. This feature is available only for voice calls.

Open the application list and select **Phone** \rightarrow **Keypad** \rightarrow \blacksquare \rightarrow **Call settings** \rightarrow **Call settings** \rightarrow **Call waiting**. Your setting will be sent to the network.

View call logs

You can view logs of your calls and messages filtered by their types.

- I Open the application list and select **Phone** ightarrow **Logs**.
- 2 Select $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ View by \rightarrow an option.
- β Select a log to view its details.



From the detail view, you can dial or send a message to the number. You can also use some helpful functions by tapping and holding a log on the list.

Customise call settings

- Open the application list and select Phone → Keypad →
 Call settings → an option.
- 2 Change the following options:

Option	Function
Call rejection	Set to reject all calls or from specified phone numbers automatically. You can add phone numbers to the auto reject list.
Set reject messages	Add or edit the message that will be sent when you reject a call.

Option	Function
Ringtones and keypad tones	 Device ringtone: Select a ringtone when a call comes in. Device vibration: Add or select a vibration pattern. Incoming call vibration: Set the device to vibrate when a call comes in. Keytones: Set the device to sound when you enter numbers on the dialling screen. Reminder tone: Select a reminder tone when you have an event.
Call alert	 Call vibrations: Set the device to vibrate when the other party answers or ends a call. Call status tones: Set the device to alert you to the call status during a call. Alerts on call: Set the device to alert you to events during a call.
The power key ends calls	Set to end a call when you press the Power key.

Option	Function
Accessory settings for call	 Automatic answering: Set whether or not the device answers calls automatically after a specified period (available only when a headset is connected). Automatic answering timer: Select the length of time that the device waits before answering calls. Outgoing call condition: Set to allow outgoing calls with a Bluetooth headset, even when your device is locked. Outgoing call type: Select the type of outgoing calls to make you use a Bluetooth headset.
Use extra vol. for calls	Set to show the volume key during a call.
Increase volume in pocket	Set the device to raise the ringtone volume when the device is in an enclosed, such as a bag or pocket.
Call forwarding	Set to send incoming calls to a specified number.

Option	Function
Additional settings	 Caller ID: Display your caller ID to other parties for outgoing calls. Call barring: Set to restrict calls by call type. Call waiting: Set the device to alert you to incoming calls during a call. Auto redial: Set to automatically redial a call that was not connected or that was cut off. Fixed Dialling Numbers: Activate FDN mode to prevent calls to phone numbers that are not in the FDN list on the SIM or USIM card. Auto area code: Set to insert a prefix (area or country code) automatically before a phone number.
Video call image	Select an alternative image to be shown to the other party.
Own video in received call	Set to show your live image to the other party.
Use call fail options	Set to attempt a voice call when a video call fails to connect.
Voicemail service	Select a voicemail service provider.

Option	Function
Voicemail settings	Enter the voicemail server number. You can obtain this number from your service provider.
Ringtone	Set the device to alert you when voicemail arrives.
Vibrate	Set the device to vibrate when voicemails are received.
Accounts	Set to accept IP calls and set up your accounts for IP call services.
Use Internet calling	Set the device to use IP call services. IP call services are provided only via Wi-Fi.

Messaging

Learn to create and send text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.


Send a text message

- 1 Open the application list and select **Messaging** \rightarrow **\square**.
- 2 Add recipients of your message.
 - Enter phone numbers manually, separating them with a semicolon or a comma.
 - Select phone numbers from the lists by selecting <a>I

- 3 Select **Enter message** and enter your message text. To insert emoticons, select \blacksquare \rightarrow **Insert smiley**.

Send a multimedia message

- 1 Open the application list and select **Messaging** \rightarrow **\square**.
- 2 Add recipients of your message.
 - Enter phone numbers or email addresses manually, separating them with a semicolon or a comma.
 - Select phone numbers or email addresses from the lists by selecting .



- 4 Select and add an item.
 You can select a file from the file list or create a new photo or video.

View a text or multimedia message

- Open the application list and select **Messaging**.
 Your messages are grouped into message threads by contact, like a messenger.
- 2 Select a contact.
- For a multimedia message, select a message to view the details.
