## FCC RF EXPOSURE INFORMATION

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

## Body-w orn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations using the optional belt-clip/holster placed 0.8 inches $(2.1 \mathrm{~cm})$ from the body. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.8 inches $(2.1 \mathrm{~cm})$ must be maintained betw een the user's body and the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. Third-party belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories used by this device must meet the separation distance requirement of 0.8 inches $(2.1 \mathrm{~cm})$ from the body and should not contain metallic componants. Body-w orn accessories that do not meet these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should be avoided.

Installing Bathery

## To Install the Batitery

1. Insert the saw-toothed end on the bottom of the battery into the slots on the bottom of the phone (1)), then slide the battery down (2)).

2. Press the battery down until you hear a didk


## To Rencovethe Bathery

If you want to remove the battery, do as follows:

1 If necessary, switch off the phone by hol ding down END/0 key until the power-off message is displayed.
2. Push up and hold the catch above the battery on the back of the phone (1) and lift the battery away. (2) (3)


Use the grooves on both sides of the phone when you lift the battery away.

## Charging a Bathery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. A desk top charger is provided with your phone. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask you local SAMSUNG dealer for further details.
The phone can be used while the battery is charging.

Note: You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery is fully recharged in approximately 8-12 hours.

1. Plug the power cord of the charger into a standard wall outlet.

2. Remove the battery from the phone and place it in the rear compartment of the charger. The light markedon the front of the charger tums red.

3. If you do not wish to use your phone while charging the battery, you can leave the battery attached to the phone Place the phone with the battery attached in the front compartment of charger with the keypad facing forward. The light marked $\square$ on the front of the charger tums red.


## Law Bethery Inclicatior

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, an empty battery icon (no bars displayed) flashes in the upper right comer of the screen. You will hear a waming tone

When the battery becomes too weak for the phone to operate, it switches off automatically.

1. Open the flip cover.
2. Hold down END/O key for more than one second to switch the phone on

The red light flashes, an alet sounds:

- When the systemlocates senvices, the greeting message displays along with the date and time. You can now place and receive calls.
- If the system cannot locate senvice, the greeting message displays without the date and time. In this case, you cannot place and receive calls. You can try later when service is available.
- If your phone is locked, the lock icon appears. Press (MENO key, and enter the four-digit lodk code to unlodk the phone.

3. When you wish to switch the phone off, hold down

## General Functions

## Maling a Call

When the idle screen is displayed, key in the area code and phone number and press SEND key.

Note: If you have set Auto Retry option (7-1) to On (see page $53)$, and the call does not connect, the phone automatically retries to make the call.

When you have finished your call, briefly press END/0 key or dose the flip.

## Energency Dialing

You can place calls to $100,101, * 166$ or one of the three errergency numbers in your emergency number list even if your phone is locked. For further information on emergency number list, refer to page 57.

## Prepend Dialing

The Prepend option enables you to add up to digits, such as area codes and network feature activation codes, to a phone number. You can prepend an existing entry in the Phone Book or Call Logs before dialing.

To prepend existing phone numbers in the Phone Book or Call Logs:

1. Access the phone number entry.
2. When the desired phone number displays, press MENV key to access the Options menu
3. Press 4 bill key ( 3 䟚 key in Call Logs) to select

Prepend option.
4. Enter the area code or feature code
5. Press sEND key to dial the number.

## Making a Call franthe Phane Book

You can store the phone numbers called regularly in memory, called the Phone Book. You then simply recall the number to dial.
For further information on Phone Book, refer to page 35.

## TOSeardhan Entry, Then Dial

The screen shows the entries stored in the Phone Book in numerical order.

2 Use $\triangle$ or key to find the desired entry.

The screen shows the names stored in the Phone Book in alphabetical order.

## ThreeTToudh Dial

Merrory locations 100 through 229 are special three-touch locations.

Press the first and the second digit briefly, then hold down the third digit of the memory cell.

The number (and name) stored is displayed, then dialed.

## Notes

- If you press \# after pressing the digits for speed dialing, you can see the phonebook contents of the corresponding location number; name, memory location number, phone number, and so on.
- When several numbers are saved in one location, only the phone number which is specified with SetSpeed Dial option will be automatically dialed. For details, refer to Options under Phone Book menu on page 35 .


## Vaice Dialing

Before using the Voice Dialing featue, you must record the narre in your phone For details, refer to page 50.

1. To place a call, press and hold *s key, or open the flip, depending on the SetActive (6-4) option (see page 52).
2. At the voice prompt, say the name into the phone

- If the phone recognizes the name, the phone attempts a connection.
- If the phone does not recognize the name, the screen prompts for the name again.
- If the phone is unable to recognize the name after two attempts, the message Cannot Recognize Name Please check name displays. Try the call again later, or chedk the recorded name.


## Last Nunlber Redial

The phone stores the last 10 numbers dialed To recall any of these numbers, proceed as follows.

1. If there are any characters on the display, dear the display by hol ding down CLR key for more than one second.
2. Press sEND key. The list of outgoing calls are displayed.
3. Use $\triangle$ or key (or (4) or key on the left side of the phone) to scroll through the list until you select the required name or number.
4. Press SEND keyto dial the number displayed.

## Answeringa Call

When somebody calls you, the phone rings and the phone icon is displayed in the midde of the screen.

If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if prestored in your Phone Book) is displayed. If the caller cannot be identified, only the phone icon appears.

1. To answer a call, open the flip cover. If the flip is already open, press any key except for END/0 key.

If the Answer Mode menu (7-4) is set to Send=Answer option, you can answer a call only by pressing SEND key.
2. End the call by dosing the flip cover or pressing END/Q key.

Note: You can answer a call while using the phone book or menu features. The current operation will be interrupted.

## Miewing Missed Calls

If you are unable to answer a call for any reason, you can find out who was calling you, if this senvice is available. Ir SEND way, you can call the person badk simply by pressing key, if necessary.

The number of missed calls is displayed on the ide screen immediately after the call was missed.

To view the missed call, refer to 'Incoming (1-2) under

## In-call Options

Your phone provides a number of functions that you can use during a call. You may not utilize all of these fundions at all times. Many of the in-call options are network senvices.

Press MENO key during a call to access the following in-call options:

Calls: allows you to access the Calls menu.

Phone Book: allows you to access the Phone Book menu.
Mute/Unmute: allows you to switch your phone's miarophone off, so that the other party cannot hear you

Example: You wish to say something to another person in the roombut do not want the other party to hear you.

Silent Key: does not transmit the key tones. It allows you to press keys without hearing annoying key tones during a call.

Note: To communicate with answering machines or computerized telephony systems, the Silentkeys option must be disabled.

Version allows you to view the software and hardware version of your phone.

Send Tel \# sends DTMF tones of your number.

SEND. sends DTMF tones of the currently displayed number. DTMF (Dual Tone Multi Frequency) tones can be used to control electronic phone sevices sudh as bank-byphone or voicemail. During a call, key in the digits you want to send as DIMF tones, for example, the bank account number and password. Then select this in-call option

## Call Weiting

You can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress, if this sevice is supported by the network. Contact your sevice provider to activate Call Waiting.

When a waiting call is detected, the incoring call alet sounds (network dependent) and a text notification displays.

To answer a waiting call:

1. To answer the call, Press ssend key. The phone conneds the calling party, and places the current party on hold.
2. Press SEND key again to switch between two parties.

## Three-MEy Calling

This feature enables you to conduct conference calls with two separate parties at the same time You are billed airtime for each outgoing call separately. Contact your senvice provider to adivate Three-Way Calling.

To place a Three-Way call:

1. During conversation, press SEND key, enter the phone num ber for the third party, and then press SEND key again. The phone places the other party on hold.
2. When the third party answers, press sEND key again to connect with the original party.

## Call Fomeroing

This feature provides the option of forwarding incoming calls to another phone number, even while your phone is off.
Activating Call Forwarding does not affect outgoing calls made fromthis phone. Contact your senvice provider to adivate Call Forwarding.

## Adjusting the Volunce

During a call, if you want to adjust the eanpiece volume, use the volume keys on the left side of the phone. Press (4) key to increase and key to decrease the volume.


Press the keys to adjust
the volume.

In the ide mode, you can adjust the key tone volume using the same keys.

## Quick Switching to Viloration Mocke

You can quiddy switch your phone to vibration mode with a touch of \# key. Press and hold the key until the $\|\| l l$ and $*$ Mibrate $*$ appears in the display. Your phone goes to the vibration mode immediately.

Press and hold \#\# key again to retum to Bell ring mode.

This feature is connevient when you are in a hury to mite the phone's ringer in a theater for example.

## Recarding a Voice Ment

Your phone can record up to 5 voice memos. Each voice memo can be up to one minute in length.

When recording, a 60-second timer displays and an alet sounds to indicate when recording time expires.

## To Recorda Vaice Merso

To record a voice memo, press and hold $\infty \gg$ key. The message "Recorcing" displays, along with the timer. To stop recording, press $\sim \gg$ key again.

The following options for the current voice memo becomes available:

Acld Label: allows you to add a labed for the memo you have just recorded. Enter a proper name up to 12 digits using the keypad. If you do not add a labed, the recorded date and time will be used to identify the memo. If you make a call and record the conversation, the phone number is saved as the label when you do not add a label. If you record the conversation which is held by someone's calling and do not enter a labe, No Label is saved as the label.

Continue: allows you to continue recording the memo.
Erase: allows you to erase the memo you have just recorded.

## To Review a Moice Menco

This option allows you to play badk all memos recorded, starting with the latest memo. The screen displays the label if you have entered one If not, the screen displays the date and time when the memo was recorded, the phone number or No Lalbel. For more details, see 'Acld Lalbel' above While the memos display, the following options are available.

Replay. plays the current merro once again
Erase: erases the memo arrently being played.
Next Memo: skips to the next memo.
Prev Mem: skips to the previous memo.

## Using the Menus

A three-leved menu structure is available to set the various options available on your phone. You can set the menu options in two different ways.

## Using the Nemigetion Keys

The following keys are used to set menu option by sordling then selecting an option.

The RS-232C Cable connects your phone to a computer port, allowing you to use Intemet or other communication programs.

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion standard battery.

Additional batteries are available for purchase (ask your SAMSUNG dealer for further details):

## Precautions When Using Batteries

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended punpose.
- If you use the phone near the networks base station, it uses less power, talk and standby times are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Battery charging times depend on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk time and standby time) is noticeably shorter than nommal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself overtime.


# Safety Information 

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require coding or waming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions, as you will reduce the capacity and life-time of the battery. Always try to keep the battery at roomtemperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below $\mathrm{O}^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can ocar when a metallic object (coin, dip or pen) causes a direct connection between the +and - terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery), for exam ple when you carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag. Short-dircuiting the teminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-dircuit.

## Road Safiety

## Operating Environment

- Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and al ways switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).
- Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, induding cellular phones, may interfere with inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physidian or the manufacturer of the medical device if you have any questions. Oher electronic equipment may also be subject to interference.
- As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, you are advised that for satisfactory operations and personal safety, the equipment should only be used in the nommal operating position
- Always switch off the phone when at a refuelling point (service station). You are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fued depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts or accessories.
- Switch off your cellular phone when in an aircraft. The use of cellular phones in an aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft or disrupt the cellular network Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of cellular telephone services to the offender, legal adtion or both


## Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill the warranty obligations and enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small dildren
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity and liquids containing minerals will corrode the electronic diraits.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas as its components may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. Hightemperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up (to its nommal temperature), moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the electronic ciraits.
- Do not attempt to open the phone. Non-expert handling of the phone may darrage it.
- Do not drop or knock the phone. Rough handling may darrage the intemal ciraits.


## Glossary of Terms

- Do not use harsh cherricals, deaning solvents or strong detergents to dean the phone. Wipe it with a soft doth slightly dampened in mild, soapy water.
- If the phone or any of its accessories are not working properly, take themto your nearest qualified senvice centre. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for the phone to be repaired.


## Energency Calls

Important This phone, like any cellular phone, uses racio signals, cellular and landline networks, as well as user-programmed fundions that cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any cellular phone for essential communications (redical emergendies for example).

Remember, to make or receive any calls, the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate celluar signal strength

Emergency calls may not be possible on all cellular phone networks or when certain network services and/or phone features are in use. Check with local cellular service providers.

Airtime-Actual time spent talking on the wireless phone. Most carriers bill customers based on how many minutes of airtime they use each month.

Anterna - A device for transmitting or receiving signals. The size and shape of antennas is determined, in part, by the frequency of the signal they receive Wireless phones and the base station must have antennas.

Base Station - The fixed radio transmitter/receiver that maintains communications with mobile radio telephones within a given area. (Typically called a cell or cell site)

CDMA - (Code Division Multiple Access) A spread-spectrum approad to digital transmission. With CDMA, eadn conversion is digitized and then tagged with a code. The mobile phone deciphers only a particular code to pick the right conversation off the air. The transmitted signal is just above noise level across the available bandwioth.

Channel - Communications signals transmit along paths called channels.

Coclec - Compression \& Decompression

Deactivation - The process of rendering a wireless phone inactive

DTMF - (Dual-tone Modulated Frequency ) You send DTMF signals when you enter numbers by pressing the digit keys.


Roaming - The ability to use a wireless phone to make and receive calls in places outside of the home senvice area.

Senvice Charge - The amount paid each month to receive wireless senvice.

Stancliby Time - The amount of time a fully charged wireless portable or transportable phone can be on and idle without being in use. (See Talk Time)

Talk Time - The length of time a person can talk on a portable or transportable wireless phone without recharging the battery.

Vococler - Voice Coder. A device used to convert speed into digital signals.

Voicemail - A computerized answering senvice that answers a call, plays a greeting and records a message. Depending on the sophistication of the senvice, it can notify the subscriber, via a pager, of an incoming call or message. (Also called voice messaging)

Wireless - Radio-based Systems that allow transmission of telephone or data signals through the air without a physical connection, such as a metal wire (copper) or fiber optic cable.
