Section 1: Getting Started

This section allows you to quickly start using your Samsung SCH-R860U phone by installing the SIM and microSD cards, installing and charging the battery, activating your service, and setting up your voicemail account.

Understanding this User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your phone. A robust index for features begins on page 189. Also included is important safety information that you should know before using your phone. Most of this information is near the back of the guide, beginning on page 152.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from the Home screen. To get to the Home screen, you may need to unlock the phone or keypad. (For more information, refer to "Securing Your Phone" on page 15.)

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your phone, depending on the software version on your phone, and any changes to the phone's Settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the phone unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your phone and any changes to the phone's Settings.

Special Text

In this manual, you'll find text that is set apart from the rest. These are intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, to define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods, or useful shortcuts.
- **Example**: Gives an example of the feature or procedure.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings to your attention important information to prevent loss of data or functionality, or even prevent damage to your phone.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your phone. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

→ Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures.

Setting Up Your Phone

Before using your phone, you need to install the SIM card, the microSDTM card, and the battery into their respective internal slots and compartment.

Important! Before removing or replacing the battery cover, make sure the phone is switched off. To turn the phone off, hold down the power key until the power-off image displays, then touch Power off.

Removing the battery cover

- 1. Locate the cover removal opening (1).
- Place your fingernail in the opening and pry the cover away from the device (2).

Caution! Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively. Doing so may damage the cover.



Installing the battery cover

 Align the cover (1) and press it firmly into place (2), making sure it snaps into place at the corners.





Installing the SIM Card


When you subscribe to a 4G LTE cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, available optional services, and many others features. This SIM card will only work with this device.

Important! The SIM card must be installed for your phone to establish a network connection.

The plug-in SIM card information and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

- Remove the battery cover. (See "Removing the battery cover" on page 6.)
- 2. If the battery is installed, remove it. (See "Removing the Battery" on page 10.)
- Locate the SIM card slot on the top right hand corner of the battery compartment.

- Make sure the gold contacts of the SIM card face downward and that the notched corner of the card faces outward to the right (as shown).
- Carefully slide the SIM card into the SIM card socket (as shown) until touches the stop.



Note: If the SIM card is not inserted correctly, the phone cannot make a network connection.

Once the SIM card is inserted, do not remove it.

6. Replace the battery and battery cover. (See "Installing the Battery" on page 10.)

Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-Ion battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) is included with the phone, for charging the battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A fully discharged battery requires up to 4 hours of charge time.

After the first charge, you can use the phone while charging.

Charging the Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. A wall charger, which is used for charging the battery, is included with your phone. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask your local Samsung dealer for further details. Before using your phone for the first time, you must fully charge the battery. A discharged battery recharges fully in approximately 4 hours.

Note: Verify that the battery is installed prior to connecting the wall charger. If both the wall charger is connected and the battery is not installed, the handset will power cycle continuously and prevent proper operation. Failure to unplug the wall charger before you remove the battery, can cause the phone to become damaged.



Note: If you choose not now, you can sign in later. A Windows Live ID required screen appears when you try to use a feature that requires that you be signed in.

When you are finished, the **Installing apps** screen appears.

- When all the apps have finished installing, touch next.The All done screen appears.
- 9. Touch done to go to the Home screen.

Resetting your Microsoft Account Password

A Microsoft account password is required for Microsoft applications. If you misplace or forget your Microsoft account password, follow these instructions to reset it:

- From your computer, launch your browser and navigate to http://www.hotmail.com.
- 2. Once the Web Page loads, click on the Can't access your account? link.
- Under Reset your password, follow the password reset prompts.

TTY Mode

Your phone is fully TTY-compatible, allowing you to connect a TTY device to the phone's headset jack. Before you can use your phone with a TTY device, you'll need to enable TTY Mode.

Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are sent to voicemail, even if your phone is turned off, so you'll want to set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as you activate your phone.

Setting up Voicemail

- 1. Touch Start → Phone → Voicemail.
- **2.** Follow the automated instructions to set up your new password and record a greeting.

Checking Voicemail

- 1. Touch Start → Phone → Voicemail.
- Follow the automated instructions to manage voicemail.

Tip: You can also access **Voicemail** by dialing your phone number from any touch-tone phone.

Displaying Your Phone Number

■ Touch Start → Settings → Cellular.

Your phone number displays under My phone number.

Roaming

When you travel outside your home network's coverage area, your phone can roam to acquire service on other compatible digital networks.

Tip: You can set your phone's roaming behavior. (For more information, refer to "Cellular" on page 128.)

During roaming, some services may not be available. Depending on your coverage area and service plan, extra charges may apply when making or receiving calls. **Note:** Contact your Wireless Provider for more information about your coverage area and service plan.

Restarting Your Phone

If your phone "freezes" or becomes unresponsive, try the following:

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the Power key for 13 to 15 seconds. The phone will power off, and then turn on automatically.
- 2. If restarting your phone does not solve the problem, remove and replace the battery, and turn on the phone. (See "Turning Your Phone On" on page 14.)

- 1. Earpiece: Use during calls to listen to callers.
- 1.5 Megapixel Front Camera: Use for taking pictures and recording video.
- 3. Proximity and Light Sensors: Detect the presence of nearby objects to control device functions or blank the screen display, such as when you hold the phone to your ear during a phone call. Detect ambient light to determine screen brightness when Brightness is set to Automatic brightness (see "Brightness" on page 133), and when taking pictures with the Front camera.
- Back Key: Press to return to the previous screen or option. Press and hold to display recent applications.
- Microphone: Use during calls to allow callers to hear your voice, and when recording.

Context-sensitive Menus

Touch Search to launch Microsoft Bing and perform Internet searches.

Finger Motions

Touch

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Touch an item to select it.
- Touch an app's icon to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Activate on-screen items by a touch and hold gesture. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget or icon on the Home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe

Swipe your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- · Unlocking the screen
- · Scrolling the Start screen or a menu
- Combine touch and hold with swipe to drag an item to a new location.

Pinch

Using two fingers, make a pinch motion on the screen. For example:

- Pinch in to zoom in on pictures or screens.

Screen Layout

The Home screen is the starting point for using your phone.



Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the phone unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your phone and any changes to the phone's Settings.

- Status Bar: Presents icons to show network status, battery power, connection details, and clocl. (For a list of icons, see "Status Bar Icons" on page 27.)
- Home screen: The starting point for using your phone.
 Place shortcut icons, widgets, and other items to
 customize your phone to your needs. (For more
 information, see "Screen Layout" on page 26.)
- Tiles: Shortcuts to your phone's common apps. (For more information, see "Customizing Your Home Screen" on page 28.)

Status Bar Icons

The Status Bar shows network and battery status and other details.

Note: If there are no icons displayed, touch the top of the screen to display them.



Current signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.



There is no SIM card in the phone.



The SIM card is locked.



Call forwarding is active. For more information, refer to "Phone" on page 148



Battery charge level. Icon shown is fully charged.



The battery is charging. Alternates with the battery charge level. Also displays when the phone is connected to a computer with the USB data cable.



Battery critically low, which means your battery needs to be charged soon or your phone will turn off.



Your phone is actively connected to a 1X network.



Your phone is actively connected to a 3G network.



Your phone is actively connected to a 4G LTE network.



The ringtone is set to vibrate only.



The ringer and vibrate are off.



Bluetooth is activated and your phone has been connected with a Bluetooth device.



Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Wi-Fi is active, but there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Indicates that the Airplane Mode is active. You cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

Display settings

You can customize display settings to your preferences. (For more information, see "Theme" on page 125 and "Brightness" on page 133.)

Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows your current position.

Customizing Your Home Screen

You can customize your Home screen by doing the following:

- · Adding and Removing Application Tiles on the Home screen
- Repositioning Application Tiles
- · Changing the Wallpaper

Adding a Tile from the Applications Menu

1. At the Home screen, sweep the screen to the left.

– or –



The Application Menu displays.

- Touch and hold one of the application listings.
- **3.** Touch **pin to start** after it displays under the icon.

The application now appears as the bottom Tile on the Home screen. You can then move it if you would like.

Removing an Applications Menu Tile

To delete an Application Tile from your Home screen, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold the Application Tile that you want to remove.
- 2. Touch on the icon to delete the Tile.

Tip: After deleting an Application Tile, you can add it back later by pinning it to the home screen from the Applications Menu. (For more information, refer to "Adding a Tile from the Applications Menu" on page 28)



Moving Tiles on the Home Screen

To move an Application Tile on your Home screen, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold the Application Tile that you want to move.
- 2. Drag the Tile to the new location and release.
- **3.** Touch the center of the icon to place it in the new location.

Be careful not to touch the cicon. If you do, the Tile is deleted.

Changing the Lock Screen Wallpaper

You can change the Wallpaper (background) of your Lock screen by following these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch → Settings → system → lock + wallpaper.
- Touch the Wallpaper field and touch Bing to use the Bing screen image.
 - or -

Touch picture → change picture and then touch the Wallpapers folder or any other picture folder that you want.

- **3.** Touch on a wallpaper thumbnail, and when it is enlarged, touch the con.
- Touch the Power / Lock key twice to view the new Lock screen wallpaper.

Changing your Color Theme

You can change the color theme of your phone by following these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch → Settings → system → theme.
- Touch the Background field and then touch on dark or light to set your background color.

Note: Battery power is consumed at a faster rate when the background is set as light.

- Touch the Accent color field and then touch on a color that you like.
- 4. Touch Home 🔐 to return to the Home screen.

Speech Engine

There is an intuitive speech engine integrated into the **Home** key () on your phone.

- 1. From any screen, touch and hold **Home** to activate the intuitive speech engine.
- Speak the words that you would like to search on or the action that you would like to perform.

The following examples show the flexibility of the speech engine:

- · "Call Chris mobile"
- · "Find coffee in Seattle"
- "Open calendar"
- · "Text Brandy"
- Touch Learn more to display the Windows Phone 8 Privacy Statement.
- Touch accept to allow Microsoft to use your voice data to provide and improve the service, which makes additional features available to you.
- **5.** To change speech settings, see "Speech" on page 136.

Entering Text

Your phone uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by touching any text entry field.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. Your phone comes equipped with an orientation detector that can tell if the phone is being held in a portrait (upright) or landscape (sideways) orientation.

Keys

The keys on the QWERTY keyboard are associated with alphabetic letters, special characters, or numbers.

Based on your keyboard settings, the first letter of an entry is capitalized and all consecutive letters are kept in lowercase unless you touch the Shift key () or enter a period. After entering a character, the cursor automatically advances to the next space. (For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 134)

For certain fields, such as the New Message **To** field, a dialer keypad displays when you touch the **123** key to enter a recipient's phone number. (For more information, refer to "Messaging" on page 54)

Using the QWERTY Keyboard

The keyboard provides keys labeled with alphabetic characters. Touch the key corresponding to the character you want to enter.

The following keys perform special functions when entering text. Some keys may perform differently depending on the field in which text is being typed.



- Shift: Used to switch between uppercase and lowercase characters.
- 123 or &123: Touch once to type special characters and numbers that appear on the QWERTY keys. Examples: \$, #, !, 1, 2. After all characters and numbers have been selected, touch abcd.
- @ or Comma: Touch once to type the character displayed, which may be the @ character or a comma, depending on the field in which text is being typed.
- Semicolon or : Touch the semicolon to separate addresses or phone numbers.

Touch to display two screens of Emoticons.

Touch either or to cycle between the two Emoticon screens. Touch a character on the screen. After all characters have been selected, touch abcd.

- 5. Space: Touch to insert an empty space.
- Enter: Touch to move the insertion point to the next line in a message.
- Backspace: Touch to delete the previous character, similar to the backspace key on a computer keyboard.

Changing the Text Input Mode

There are three main keyboard layout keys that change the on-screen keys within the QWERTY keyboard.

The available Text Input modes are:



Symbol and Number Mode: Activates the symbol and number keys.





Emoticons: Activates the Emoticon keys. Touch
or to cycle between the two Emoticon screens.

Note: When in abcd mode, the &123 key appears. When in &123 mode, the abcd key appears.

Using Alphabetic Mode

Whenever you enter text (while creating a message, an email, and so on), if desired, rotate your phone counterclockwise to a landscape orientation.

A screen similar to the following appears:



The Text Input mode is initially set to abcd mode.

Note: Some Text Input screens show black keys on a light background.

- Touch the desired alphabetic characters. After typing the first letter, the following letters are lowercase.
- 2. Touch to input another uppercase letter. Touch twice to switch to caps lock mode and the shift key changes to . All following letters are uppercase until you touch again.

Using Symbol and Numeric Mode

Use Symbol and Numeric mode to type numbers and symbols.

- 1. Touch &123 at the bottom of the screen.
- 2. Touch the desired number and symbol characters.
- Touch either or to cycle through additional pages.
- 4. Touch abcd to return to Alphabetic mode.

Using Emoticon Mode

Use Emoticon mode to add combinations of characters to your text input.

1. Touch (a) at the bottom of the screen.

Note: Emoticons are not available for some input fields.

- Touch either or to cycle between the Emoticon screens.
- After all characters have been selected, touch abcd to return to Alphabetic mode.

Using Text Suggestions

Based on your keyboard settings, your phone suggests alternatives to what you are typing including correct spelling of words similar to what you are entering.

(For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 134)

1. Touch a text input field.

Note: Text suggestion and spelling check are not available for some input fields.

Begin typing a word.

A list of word options displays.

Touch one of the words to replace the word that has already been typed or sweep across the list of words for more word suggestions.

If you replace the word, a space is entered after the word and the cursor automatically advances to the next space.

4. Continue typing.

Keyboard Settings

You can customize the way your phone handles certain functions while you enter text. You can also remove all the words you have added to your suggestion list.

For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 134

Copy and Paste

Windows Phone 8 supports copy and paste. This feature is automatically enabled. You can copy text from most locations on the phone and paste it in most places you can type. Some locations enable you to copy a specific text string by highlighting it. Other locations enable you to copy an entire section of text by using a menu option.

Copy with the Highlight Option

To copy text that supports the highlight option:

- 1. Touch the text you want to copy to highlight it.
- 2. Drag the arrows at each end of the highlighted text until only the text you want to copy is highlighted.
- Touch the copy icon that displays near the highlighted text.

The following locations support the highlight option:

- · Webpages in the browser
- Bodies of email messages
- Office documents
- Editable fields in native applications.

Copy with the Menu Option

To copy text that supports the menu option:

- Touch and hold the text or link you want to copy until the menu appears.
- 2. Touch copy or copy link.

The following locations support this option:

- Headings of email messages.
- Directions in maps.
- · Links in the browser.
- Information in contact cards and social networking profiles in the People hub.
- Messages you have sent or received.
- Details pages for local search results.

Pasting Copied Text

To paste text that you have copied:

- 1. Touch where you want to paste the text.
- Touch the paste icon in the text suggestion bar above the keyboard.

After you paste the text, the paste icon disappears. However, you can paste the copied text again by panning from left to right in the text suggestion bar to bring back the paste icon, and then touching the paste icon.

You can paste text in editable fields in native applications including password fields.

Note: When you copy text with special formatting (such as bold, italic, or lists) or images, the text appears when you paste it, but not the formatting or images.

Note: Copying and pasting works only for languages that use a Latin alphabet.

Section 3: Call Functions

This section describes how to make or answer a call. It also includes the features and functionality associated with making or answering a call.

(For more information on call settings, see "Phone" on page 148.)

Making a Call

- From the Home screen, touch Phone → Dialer.
- Use the on-screen keypad to enter the number you want to dial.
 If you make a mistake, touch until the desired numbers have been deleted.
- 3. Touch call to dial the number.

Making an International Call

- From the Home screen, touch Phone →
 Dialer.
- 2. Touch and hold o . The + character appears.
- **3.** Use the on-screen keypad to enter the country code, area code, and phone number.
- 4. Touch call to make the call.

Correcting an Entered Number

After entering a number using the keypad, use the following steps to correct a mis-typed entry when dialing.

- If you make a mistake, touch to erase a single character
- 2. Touch and hold to erase the entire string of numbers.

Ending a Call

To end a phone call:

■ Touch end call.

Dialing a Recent Number

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the **history**. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name is also displayed.

- From the Home screen, touch .
 The history screen displays.
- Touch an entry to enter the contact's detail page, then touch call number or text.

Making a Call from People

You can store phone numbers that you use regularly in the phone's memory. These entries are collectively called **People**. For further details about the **People** feature, see "Dialing or Messaging from People" on page 48.

Answering a Call

When a call is received, the phone rings and displays the caller's phone number and name if stored in People.

- At the incoming call screen, touch answer to answer the call or ignore to send the call to your voicemail.
- 2. Touch end call to end the call.

Note: You can answer a call while using other applications.

After ending the call, the phone returns to the previously active function screen.

History

The phone stores the numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed in the history. The history displays the details of the call.

From the Home screen, touch .

The history screen displays. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name displays.

All calls made, received, and missed are listed. Types of calls are identified on the history screen as Incoming, Outgoing, or Missed.



Calling Back a Missed Call

To call back a missed call number:

- From the Home screen, touch
 The history screen displays a list of recent calls. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name displays.
- 2. Touch **call** to call the displayed number.

Saving a Recent Call to your People

- 1. From the Home screen, touch .

 The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- **2.** Touch the call you want to save to your People. The profile screen displays.
- 3. Touch save . The CHOOSE A CONTACT screen displays.
- **4.** Touch **new** to add as a new contact or touch an existing contact to edit manually.
 - The EDIT PHONE NUMBER screen displays. The **Phone number** and **Phone number type** fields are automatically filled in with the information of the recent call.
- Touch the Phone number or the Phone number type field and use the keypad to edit if necessary.

- **6.** When finished, touch save
 - The NEW PHONE CONTACT screen displays with the Phone number already added.
- Touch the other fields to add name, other phone numbers, email, ringtone, and other information.
- 8. Touch save

(For further details about the **People** feature, see "Your People List" on page 44.)

Sending a Message to a Recent Call

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 🕻 .
 - The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- Touch the call entry to which you want to send a message.
 - The call detail page displays.
- Touch text.
- 4. Use the keyboard to type in a message.
- **5.** When you are done with your message, touch **send**

Deleting a Call from History

- From the Home screen, touch .
 The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- 2. Touch and hold the call you want to delete from the call log.
- Touch delete item.The call is deleted from the call history.

Options During a Call

Your phone provides a number of control options that you can use during a call.

Adjusting the Call Volume

During a call, to adjust the earpiece volume, use the **Volume** keys on the left side of the phone.

 Press the Up volume key to increase the volume level and press the Down volume key to decrease the volume level.

From the Home screen, you can also adjust the ringer volume using these same keys.

In-Call Options

During an active call there are several options available by touching a corresponding on-screen button.

- end call: Terminates the call.
- dialer : Displays the on-screen keypad, where you can enter number using DTMF (Dual Tone Multi-Frequency).
- speaker: Routes the phone's audio through either the speaker or through the earpiece. Touch speaker to turn on the speakerphone.
 Touch again to turn it off.
- mute: Turn the onboard microphone either on or off. Touch to mute your phone during a call. Touch again to unmute.
- hold: Puts a call on hold. Touch to put the present call on hold.
 Touch again to reconnect.
- bluetooth: This option appears if a Bluetooth device is active.
 Touch to activate the Bluetooth device.
- add call: Allows you to add another call to your present conversation. For more information, refer to "3-Way (Multi-Party) Calling" on page 43

Placing a Call on Hold

You can place the current call on hold at any point during a conversation. You can also make another call while you have a call in progress, if your network supports this service.

- While on a call, touch hold.
 The hold icon changes colors. This action places the current caller on hold.
- You can later reactivate this call by touching hold again.

Making a New Call During a Call in Progress

- Touch add call.
 The history screen displays.
- Select a number from your recent calls, or touch keypad to dial a number.

You can also touch **people** to enter a number from your contacts list. Enter the number to add and touch call.

Once connected, the active call appears on the call screen and the call on hold appears in a box at the top of the display.

Switching Between Calls

When you have an active call and a call on hold, you may switch between the two calls, changing the one on hold to active and placing the other on hold.

- 1. Touch the bar at the top of your display to swap between the two calls.
 - The current call (caller #2) is placed on hold and the previous call on hold (caller #1) is then reactivated so that you can continue conversing with that person. The active call appears on the call screen.
- Touch the bar at the top of your display again to swap back.
- Touch end call to end the currently active call. The call on hold is then reconnected

Answering a Call During a Call in Progress

- There are several options available when a call is received when you have a call in progress. Touch one of the following:
 - answer: Allows you to answer the incoming call and put the first call on hold.
 - **ignore**: Sends the new call to your voicemail. The first call stays connected.
 - end call + answer: Allows you to answer the incoming call and end the end the first call.
- 2. If you selected **answer**, touch the bar at the top of your display to swap between the two calls.

3-Way (Multi-Party) Calling

The 3-Way or Multi-Party feature allows you to make or answer a series of incoming calls and place them on hold. If this service is supported by the network, all calls can be joined together.

- 1. While connected to two different callers (one is on hold), touch merge calls.
 - The three calls are conferenced together and are displayed on the Conference screen.
- 2. Touch end call to end the conference call.

Section 4: Your People List

This section allows you to manage your daily contacts by storing their name, number, email, and other information in your phone using the People feature.

Adding a New Contact

Use the following procedure to store a new contact to your People.

- . From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. Swipe to the all list.
- Touch add contact. The CREATE CONTACT IN screen appears.
- Select your Microsoft account or add another account to store the new contact.
- To assign a picture to the new contact, touch add photo. The CHOOSE PICTURE screen appears.
 - Select a picture from your photos or touch **camera** to take a new picture with your camera.
 - When you have made a selection, touch
- **6.** Touch name. The EDIT NAME screen appears.

- Enter the First name and Last name for the new contact.
 - You can also scroll down to enter additional information. (For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 31)
 - . To save your name entries, touch 📵 save.
- 9. To add a phone number, touch phone. The EDIT PHONE NUMBER screen appears with the Phone number field highlighted. The numerical keypad also appears.
- 10. Enter a number.
- To indicate the type of number, touch the Phone number type field and select a number type.
- **12.** To save your number entries, touch save.
- To enter an email address for your contact, touch
 email. The EDIT EMAIL screen appears with the
 Email address field highlighted.
- 14. Enter an email address.

- 15. To identify the type of email address, touch the Email address type field and select an email type, then touch save.
- **16.** Touch **ringtone**, then select a ringtone to identify calls from this contact.
- **17.** Touch other then select any fields that you would like to add to the contact.
- **18.** Touch **(save** to save the new contact entry.

Adding Contacts from an Account

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. Swipe to the all list.
- 3. Touch → settings. The SETTINGS menu appears.
- 4. Under accounts, touch add an account. The ADD AN ACCOUNT menu appears.
- Select the type of account you want to add to your People contacts list.
- 6. Enter the Email address and Password for the account.
- 7. Touch next. The CONTENT TO SYNC screen appears.
- 8. Select a content type that includes "contacts".
- 9. Touch sign in.
- The people screen appears with the contacts list updated to include contacts from the new account.

Editing an Existing Contact

When editing an existing contact, you can touch a field and change or delete the information, or you can add additional fields to the contact's list of information.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the all list, then touch the contact that you want to edit.
- 3. At the contact **profile** screen, touch edit at the bottom of the screen.
- Touch the fields that you want to edit and then use the keyboard to make any changes.
- 5. Touch save to save the edited information.

Deleting Contacts

You can delete contacts from your phone's memory. To delete any People entry:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the all screen, then touch and hold a contact that you want to delete.
- Touch delete on the displayed list.
- If there are linked profiles for the contact, the CHOOSE A PROFILE TO DELETE screen displays. Touch the profile that you want to delete.
- At the Delete contact? prompt, touch delete to delete the contact or cancel to exit.

Creating a New Group

The Group function makes it possible to make individually named groups of people you care about, such as family, friends, coworkers, or social media friends. Once you create a group, you can pin it to your home screen and it becomes a live tile. Notifications appear as new posts, comments, or pictures are added to this group.

Use the following procedure to create a new group of your contacts.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- Swipe to the together list, then touch NEW menu appears.
- Touch Group. The NAME THE GROUP screen appears with the group name field highlighted.
- 4. Enter a group name.
- 5. Touch save. The EDIT GROUP screen appears
- 6. To add members to the group, touch CHOOSE A CONTACT screen appears.
- Scroll through your contacts and touch a contact to add it to the group.

- **8.** Repeat Steps 6 and 7 until you have added all the selected contacts to the group.
- To change a group member's preferred phone number or email address or to remove a member from the group, touch an entry in the list of group members.
- **10.** Touch save to save your changes.

Group Options

Once you have created a group, there are several options available for editing, deleting, and so on.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the together menu, then scroll down and touch the group that you want to display. The group screen displays.
- Touch text to send a text message to all members of the group.
- Touch send email to send an email message to all members of the group.
- 5. Touch pin to pin the group to the home screen.
- 6. Touch edit group to display the EDIT GROUP screen. Touch to add more members to the group. Touch an entry in the list of group members to change that person's preferred phone number or email address or to remove the entry from the group. For more information, refer to "Deleting Contacts" on page 46
- **7.** Touch \longrightarrow **delete** to delete the group.

Note: Deleting a group does not delete the contacts.

Using Your People List

Dialing or Messaging from People

Once you have stored phone numbers in your People, you can dial or message them quickly and easily.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. Swipe to the all screen.
- To highlight all of the letters for which you have contacts, (on the left side of the display) touch any letter.
- **4.** Touch a highlighted letter to quickly jump to the contacts beginning with that letter.



- **5.** Touch the contact you want to call or message.
- **6.** Touch **call mobile** to make a phone call or **text** to send a message.



Note: Depending on the phone type that you entered when the contact was created, the display may show call home, call company, call phone, and so on.

For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 54

Searching for People

You can also find a contact in your People list by using the Search option.

- From the Home screen, touch People → all → ②.
 - The search screen displays with a listing of all your contacts' names.
- Use the on-screen keyboard to type the beginning letters of the contact's name that you are trying to find.The list displays names that begin with the letters you have typed.
- 3. Touch a name in the list to display the contact's profile.

Linking People

Linking People Information

Many people now maintain multiple email accounts, social networking logins, and other similar account information. For example, a Facebook account login name might differ from a corporate email account login because they are maintained separately and for different groups of people.

This device can synchronize with multiple accounts such as Windows Live, Outlook, Google, Facebook, Twitter, and Linkedln. When you synchronize your phone with these accounts, each account creates a separate contact entry in the People list.

If one of your contacts (Amy Smith, for example) has a regular email account that you maintain in Hotmail, but also has a Facebook account under her maiden and married name, as well as a Google account, when you merge these accounts into your Contacts list you can link all of her entries and view the information in one record.

The next time you synchronize your phone with your accounts, any updates that contacts make to email account names, email addresses, etc. automatically update in your People list.

For more information about synchronizing accounts, see "Synchronizing Accounts" on page 51.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Touch a contact name (the name you want to link to another entry). Typically, this is the same contact with a different name or account information.
- 3. Touch 🕞
- Touch choose a contact.
- Touch the second contact entry (the entry in which to link). The second contact is now linked with the first and the account information is merged into one screen.

Note: The information is maintained in the first entry that you selected.

6. Touch the linked contacts to view the contact information you linked. The contacts and information displays with a label next to the contact name to indicate what type of account information is contained in the entry.

Unlinking People

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. Touch a contact name (the account name from which you want to unlink an entry).
- Touch . A number displays over the link symbol showing how many contacts are linked to this contact. The names of all the contacts that are linked are displayed.
- 4. Touch the contact you want to unlink.
- At the prompt, touch unlink. The contact is now "unlinked" and no longer displays in the merged record screen.

Synchronizing Accounts

From the Accounts menu you decide if you want applications to synchronize, send, and receive data at any given time, or if you want the applications to synchronize automatically.

After determining how you want the accounts to synchronize, indicate which account to synchronize with your People list.

To set up an account, follow these steps:

1. From the Home screen, touch

- ch People.
- 2. Swipe to the what's new screen, then touch set up account
- Touch an account type to add. Select Outlook, Hotmail, Backup Assistant Plus, Google, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, or advanced setup (used for accounts that use Exchange ActiveSync).
- Follow the on-screen instructions. The selected account type synchronizes with your Contacts list.

What's New

Synchronized accounts display information on the **what's new** screen. For example, if you add your Facebook account, you can see what your contacts are posting.

Importing Facebook Contacts

When you add your Facebook account, your profile picture displays at the top of your People list. Touch the picture to go to your Facebook profile. Your phone also imports all of your Facebook contacts and creates a profile for each contact or adds information to existing profiles.

You can limit imported Facebook contact information to the existing contacts already on your phone. (For more information, refer to "People" on page 146.)

People Options

You can access several options while viewing the details page for a specific entry.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch
- 2. Touch a specific contact entry.
- **3.** Touch one of the following options:



pin: Touch the pin icon to pin this contact to your Home screen.

People.



link: Touch the link icon to link several contacts together. (For more information, refer to "Linking People" on page 50.)



edit: Touch the edit icon to make changes to the contact's information.



share contact: Touch the options icon, then touch share contact. Touch share to send a contact's in formation via Tap + Send, Messaging, or an email account.

delete: Touch the options icon and then touch **delete** to delete the contact from your People list.

Additional People Options

Depending on your settings, additional information from accounts such as Facebook, Twitter, or LinkedIn displays on the profile pages of your contacts.

- From your People list, touch a contact entry. Depending on the information available on your accounts, phone numbers, home addresses, company names, email addresses, birthdays, and so on, are displayed. There is also a write on wall option and a send email option.
- Swipe the screen to the left on any contact profile to the what's new screen for that contact. Posts for the contact are displayed. Scroll down the posts to display additional posts.
- Swipe the screen to the left on any contact profile to the history screen for that contact. Recent activity from that contact is displayed. Scroll down the posts to display additional posts.

Use the **filter my contact list** option to limit additional information from accounts such as Facebook, Twitter, or LinkedIn from displaying on the profile pages of your existing contacts. (For more information, refer to "People" on page 146.)

Recent Activities

From the **recent** screen, you can see the contacts that you viewed last.

- From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe your screen to the left twice to display the recent screen.
- 3. Touch a contact to see their profile.

Section 5: Messaging

This section describes how to send and receive different types of messages. It also includes the features and functionality associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your phone provides the following message types:

- Text Messages
- Multimedia (Picture) Messages
- Email Messages
- Online Messages

The Short Message Service (SMS) lets you send and receive text messages to and from other mobile phones or email addresses. To use this feature, you may need to subscribe to your service provider's message service.

Important! When creating a message, adding an image to a text message changes the message from a text message to a multimedia message.

When messages are received, the number of messages displays in the Messaging tile on the Home screen.

Creating and Sending Text Messages

To create a new message and send it to another mobile phone or an email address:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch [7] Messaging.
- 2. Touch new.
- Touch the To field to manually enter a recipient. Touch the 123 key on the on-screen keypad to enter a phone number.
 - or –

Touch the button to the right of the To field to select a recipient from your People list. Valid entries must have a wireless phone number. Contacts with only an email address are not listed.

 Touch the button to add additional recipients from your People list. Each contact is placed in the To field separated by a semicolon (;).

or –
 Add more recipients by touching the recipient field.

Note: Each additional recipient entry must be separated by a semicolon (;).

- To remove recipients, touch the entry in the
 To field then touch remove. You can also open the
 contact's profile or cancel and return to the
 New Message screen.
- Touch the type a text message box and use the on-screen keyboard to type your message. For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 31
- 7. Review your message and touch send.

Note: If you exit a message before you send it, the message is saved as a draft.

Voice to Text Messages

To create a new message using your voice:

- Create a new message and add recipients in the To field. For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 54
- Touch speak and say your message when go is displayed. When you stop speaking, your words are displayed.
- 3. To repeat the message, touch speak. The original message is deleted and the new message is displayed.
- 4. Once your spoken message is correct, touch send.

Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages

A multimedia message is a message that contains a picture attachment. To create a multimedia message and send it to another mobile phone or an email address:

- From the Home screen, touch Messaging.
- 2. Touch new.
- Touch the To field or touch the button to the right of the To field to enter a recipient.
 (For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 54.)
- Touch the type a text message box and use the on-screen keyboard to type your message. (For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 31.)
- 5. Touch **attach** to add a picture, video, your current location, a voice note, or a contact to the message.
- To remove an attachment, touch and hold the attachment, then touch remove from the pop-up menu.
- 7. Review your message and touch send.

Messaging Conversations

Any messages you have sent or received can be viewed in the Messaging **threads** list.

Sent and received text, picture, and online messages are grouped into message threads. Threaded messages allow you to see all the messages exchanged (similar to a chat program) and displays a contact on the screen. Message threads are listed in the order in which they were received, with the latest message displayed at the bottom.

Displaying a Messaging Conversation

To view a conversation in the Messaging threads list:

From the Home screen, touch Messaging → threads.

The Messaging threads list displays any messages you have sent or received.

All messages to or from another phone or email address are grouped in one conversation.

Entries in the Messaging threads list contain the recipient's phone number, contact name, or email address, the time that the last message was received or sent, and the first words of the message.

An entry for conversations with multiple recipients starts by indicating the number of recipients (such as **3 recipients**) and then the recipients are listed.

- Touch the type a text message and use the on-screen keyboard to type a reply message to the recipient. (For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 31.)

Viewing a Picture Attachment

To view a picture attached to a message:

- Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- Locate the message box that contains the picture attachment.
- Touch Get media content now to download the attachement. Touch the picture to open Photos and display the picture. Pinch the screen with two fingers to out or stretch the screen outward to zoom in.

Viewing a Video Attachment

To view a video attached to a message:

- 1. Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- Locate the message box that contains the video attachment. The file name is underlined.
- Touch the video file name in the message box. The video player opens and plays the video.



To pause playback of the video attachment, touch To continue playback of the video attachment, touch (

To stop playback of the multimedia message, touch

Listening To an Audio Attachment

To listen to an audio attached to a message:

- 1. Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- Locate the message box that contains the audio attachment.
- Touch the file name to open the audio player and play the audio file.

Deleting a Messaging Conversation

To delete a Messaging conversation:

- From the Home screen, touch Messaging.
 The Messaging conversations list displays any messages you have sent or received.
- Touch and hold a message in the list, then touch delete.

- or -

Touch a message in the list, then touch → delete thread.

Touch delete to delete all messages in the selected conversation or touch cancel to return to Messaging conversations

Deleting a Message

To delete a message in a Messaging conversation:

- Touch and hold the message box that contains the message you want to delete.
 - The delete, forward, and copy options display.
- 2. Touch delete.
 - The **Delete message?** screen displays.
- Touch delete to delete the message or touch cancel to return to Messaging conversations.

Forwarding a Message

To forward a message in a Messaging conversation:

- Touch and hold the message box that contains the message you want to forward. The delete, forward, and copy options display.
- Touch forward. The New Message screen displays with the contents of the selected message included.
- Touch the To field or touch the button to the right of the To field to enter a recipients. (For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 54.)
- **4.** Touch send to forward the message.

Messaging Settings

To view and change messaging settings:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch [3] Messaging
- 2. Touch → settings.

The messaging settings screen displays. (For more information, refer to "Messaging" on page 144.)

Message Drafts

When you exit a message without sending, the message is automatically saved as a draft.

- I. From the Home screen, touch 🔃 Messaging.
- 2. Touch → drafts.
- Touch any message to resume editing. Once the message is sent, it will be removed from drafts.
- To delete a draft, touch and hold the message until the delete menu appears. Touch delete to permanently delete the message.

Online Messaging

Once you sign in to Windows Live, you have access to Windows Live Messenger and you can chat with friends online. To set your status:

1. From the Home screen, touch Messaging
→ online.



2. Swipe to the online screen and touch set your chat status and see who's online.

- or -

Touch status (A)

The **SET CHAT STATUS** displays.

- 3. Touch one of the following options to set your chat status:
 - available: You are online and available to send and receive chat messages.
 - **busy**: You are online, but temporarily unavailable.
 - away: You are online, but unavailable for a period of time, such as at lunch.
 - invisible: You are online, but you appear as offline to others.
 - offline: You are offline.

Note: Touching any option other than offline causes your device to check and list who is online. Any contact who has a Windows Live email address is listed along with their status. Recent chat threads are also listed.

Using Email

Email enables you to review and create email using Windows Live, Outlook, Google, and several other email services. You can also receive text message alerts when you receive an important email.

Note: The options on screens and in menus may vary depending on which email account you have enabled.

Setting Up an Email Account

To set up an email account:

1. From the Home screen, touch **Email**

- or -

From the Home screen, touch **Email** → ... **Options** → add email account.

- or -

From the Home screen, touch **Settings** . Under the **system** menu, touch **email** + **accounts** → **add an account**.

The **ADD AN ACCOUNT** screen displays with the possible email services choices.

 Touch an email service, such as Outlook, Hotmail, Backup Assistant Plus, Yahoo! Mail, Google, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn.

Touch **other account** to add other types of email accounts.

For some email accounts, such as Outlook, touch advanced setup. For more information, refer to "Advanced Email Setup" on page 63

3. Enter your email address in the Email address field.

- Enter your password in the Password field.
- 5. Touch sign in.

If your email information is found, your account information is saved.

If **Attention required** displays, touch the account, correct your **user name** and **Password**, and touch **save**.

6. For Outlook, enter the Domain and touch sign in. If you think your information is incorrect, touch try again. Otherwise, touch advanced, enter the Server, and touch sign in.

Advanced Email Setup

For some email accounts, such as Outlook, entering your email address and password may not be enough information. You may need to enter additional information.

- 1. Touch advanced setup.
 - The Advanced Setup screen displays.
- Enter your Email address and Password and touch Next.

The next another Advanced Setup screen displays.

Touch Exchange ActiveSync or Internet email, depending on the kind of account you want to set up.

Note: If you are not sure which option to choose, check with your service provider.

- On the Exchange ActiveSync screen, enter the Domain and Server information and adjust any other information as necessary.
 - or -

On the Internet Email Account screen, enter the **Incoming email server** and **Account type** information and adjust any other information as necessary.

5. Touch sign in.

Important! Only some "Plus" accounts include POP access allowing this program to connect. If you are not able to sign in with your correct email address and password, you may not have a paid "Plus" account. Launch the Web browser to access your account.

Checking Your Email

When you have new email, a number displays in the Email icon on the Home screen. To check your email:

- From the Home screen, touch the email icon (such as Hotmail <1) of the account you want to check.
 The Inbox screen displays all emails in your inbox.
- Swipe the screen left to display all, unread, flagged, or urgent emails.
 - A list of emails displays. For each email, the sender's name, the day the email was sent, the subject of the email, and the first words of the email are displayed.
- 3. Touch and hold an email entry in the list to display the options delete, mark as unread, move, set flag, complete flag, or clear flag, which is applied only to that one email. (Available options may differ depending upon your email service provider.)
- 4. Touch an entry in the list to open the email.

Email Folder Options

The Inbox is one of many email folders. The options available while viewing a folder are located at the bottom of the screen.

Note: Available options may differ depending upon your email service provider.

The options are:

- 1. new: Create a new email.
- 2. select: Display the emails in this folder so they can be marked.
 - Touch to the left of an email in the list to mark it with a check mark.
 - Once you have marked the emails, touch: delete or move, or touch mark as read, mark as unread, set flag, complete, or clear flag.
 - 3. sync: Synchronize your emails. For more information, refer to "Syncing Your Email Account" on page 69
- 4. search: Use the keyboard to enter a word or phrase to search for in the current inbox.

- **5. more options**: Display additional inbox options.
 - folders: Select which folders to display. Touch show all folders to display a list of inbox folders: inbox, drafts, outbox, sent, trash, and junk.
 - settings: Displays the sync settings for this email account.
 For more information, refer to "Email Account Settings" on page 68 Also allows you to always blind copy yourself, organize emails into conversations, add an email signature to your emails, and use a light background for emails.
 - From the Conversations field, Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the option On. Emails in your inbox are organized by conversation, bringing replies to a thread into a consolidated view so it is faster and easier to stay on top of the conversation. Touch the check box that displays to show replies and email from all your synced folders.
 - From the Signature field, Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the option On. Touch the type your signature here or Sent from my Windows Phone field, and use the on-screen keyboard to create your signature,

- Touch Always bcc myself to always generate a blind copy of the email for yourself.
- Touch use light background for email to use a light background while viewing emails.
- link inboxes: Displays this inbox and other inboxes which can link to it. For more information, refer to "Linked Inboxes" on page 70
- add email account: Displays the Add an Account screen.

Reading Emails

When you touch an email entry in a folder, such as the Inbox, the email displays. Swipe up and down the screen to move through the email. Swipe across the screen to view the email. Touch each side of the email and pinch inward or stretch outward to zoom in or out.

The options available while viewing an email are located at the bottom of the screen. The options are:



respond: Allows you to reply, reply all, or forward. In either case a new email is started that contains the current email information.



delete: Delete the email being viewed.



newer: Display the next email in the current folder that was received at a more recent time.



older: Display the next email in the current folder that was received at a later time.

toggle flag: Flag or unflag the email. When an email is flagged, it appears in the flagged list of emails.
mark as unread: Mark the current email as unread.

move: Move the current email to another folder.

Creating and Sending an Email

To create a new email message and send it to another email address:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch an email icon (such as **Hotmail**).
- 2. Touch new .

The New Email Message screen displays.

- Touch the To field to manually enter a recipient. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter an email address.
 - or -

Touch the button to the right of the **To** field to select a recipient from your Contacts list. Valid entries must have an email address.

 Touch the button to add additional recipients from your Contacts list. Each contact is placed in the To field separated by a semicolon (:).

– or –

Add more recipients by touching the recipient field.

Note: Each additional recipient entry must be separated by a semicolon (;).

- **5.** Touch the **Subject** field and use the on-screen keyboard to enter a subject for your email.
- Touch the body of the email and use the on-screen keyboard to enter your message. For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 31

The options available while creating an email are located at the bottom of the screen. The options are:



send: After you review your message, touch send to deliver it.



attach: Allows you to choose a picture. Swipe the screen to choose from **albums**, **date**, or **favorites**.



close: Allows you to save the email to the drafts folder or delete the email. Touch Back to cancel and keep editing the email.



record: Allows you to speak your message and have it converted to text.



priority: Allows you to set the email's priority to high, normal, or low.

show cc & bcc: Allows you copy and blind copy additional recipients. Add recipients in these two fields similar to the way **To** recipients are added.

Email Account Settings

Once your Hotmail or email account is set up, you may want to adjust some of your settings.

Note: Available options may differ depending upon your email service provider.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- Touch the email entry (for example, Hotmail).The Settings for your email account (for example, Hotmail Settings) display.
- Touch the field that contains the information you want to change.

The following fields display depending on the email account:

- Account name: Use this field to change the name that appears on your phone for this account.
- Email address: Displays the email address for this account.

- Download new content: Allows you to set how often you want your phone to download new emails for this account. Possible values are: as items arrive, every 15 minutes, every 30 minutes, hourly, and manually. If you choose manually, see "Syncing Your Email Account" on page 69.
- Download email from: Allows you to limit the email downloaded to your phone for this account. Possible values are: the last 3 days, the last 7 days, the last 2 weeks, the last month, and any time.
- Content to sync: Indicates which content to synchronize between your phone and the account, such as, Email, Contacts, Calendar, and so on.
- **user name**: This is the name that appears on your messages.
- Incoming email server: Displays the email server name.
- user name: Displays your user name.
- Password: Displays your password.
- Outgoing (SMTP) email server: Displays the email server name.

Touch the following to check or uncheck the option:

- Outgoing server requires authentication: Access to server requires authentication.
- Use the same user name and password for sending email:
 Use same login information for both outgoing and incoming email.
- Require SSL for incoming email: Use SSL security for incoming email.
- Require SSL for outgoing email: Use SSL security for outgoing email.

Note: Some fields on this screen should not be changed without consulting your service provider.

Deleting an Email Account

To delete email accounts other than Windows Live:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- Touch and hold the email account that you want to delete. An option list displays.
- Touch delete to delete the account.

Note: Windows Live email accounts cannot be deleted.

Syncing Your Email Account

In order to view email messages on your phone for any email account, content has to be downloaded to your phone. Syncing is simply downloading content from your email provider and storing it on your phone.

Use the following method if you choose to download new content manually:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- 2. Touch and hold the email account that you want to sync. An option list displays.
- Touch sync. Syncing displays while new content is downloaded.

Linked Inboxes

Each time you add a new email account, a tile is added to the Home screen with the email name and to the Apps list.

When you add more than one email account, it is possible to link two or more email accounts so you can see all messages from those accounts in one inbox. When email accounts are grouped



in this way, one tile is displayed on the Home screen for each linked group instead of the individual email tiles. Linked inhoxes can be renamed

Creating Linked Inboxes

To create linked inboxes:

- From the Home screen, touch Email for one of the email accounts that you want to link and then touch
 → linked inboxes. This inbox and other inboxes to which it can be linked are displayed.
- Touch one or more of the other inboxes that you want to link to this inbox.
- Touch rename linked inbox to give the linked inboxes a new name.

Unlinking Inboxes

To unlink inboxes:

- From the Home screen, touch a linked inbox and then touch ... → linked inboxes.
- Touch the email account listed under this inbox that you want to unlink.
- Touch unlink to unlink the inboxes. The unlinked email account displays under other inboxes.

Setting Up a Microsoft Account

When you set up a Microsoft account, you are doing more than just setting up an email account. You can get apps, play Xbox LIVE games, and more.

- Read the information, including the Windows Phone Terms of Use, and touch next.
- Touch the Microsoft account field and enter your email address.
- Touch the Password field and enter your password. Touch Show password to display the characters.
- Touch Allow Microsoft to email me information and tips about my Windows Phone. to enable this option.
- 6. Touch sign in.
- Follow the instructions to set up your Microsoft account to use SkyDrive, sync your text messages, and back up your phone settings.

Section 6: Multimedia

This section explains how to use the multimedia features of your phone, including Music Player, Video Player, Gallery, Camera, and Camcorder.

Xbox Music Pass

Xbox Music Pass is a monthly music subscription service giving you unlimited access to millions of songs. Download or stream as many songs as you like and listen to them for as long as your subscription is up to date. On your Windows Phone, the streaming feature requires wireless network access. Carrier fees may apply.

Music + Videos

This section explains how to access music, videos, podcasts, and radio on your phone. Navigate the **Music + Video** app as follows:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the following menus:
 - **collection**: Displays media categories such as music, video, and podcasts, as well as a link to the Store app.
 - history: Displays thumbnails that indicate songs or videos you have recently played. Touch the thumbnail to return to replay that song or video.
 - new: Allows you to play music, videos, and podcasts downloaded from your PC, as well as media stored on a memory card. It also gives you access to the music area of the Xbox Music Store.

- apps: Displays links to other music applications, such as Slacker Radio.
- xbox: Displays featured artists from the Xbox Music Store.
 Touch a thumbnail to play the song and see more details about the artist from the Xbox Music Store.

Adding new music and videos

To add new music and videos with your Xbox Music Pass:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the **new** menu.
- 3. Touch Xbox Music Pass.
- Sign in with your account information, and follow the online prompts to download new music and videos.

To add new music and videos from your computer:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the new menu.
- 3. Touch Connect to your computer to add stuff.

4. There are several ways available to transfer music and videos between your phone and computer, such as using the cloud (Internet storage such as SkyDrive), using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app, etc. Select the appropriate set up for your phone, and follow the online instructions to install and use the file transfer software of your choice.

- delete: Delete the song.
- Touch the song that you want to play. Song details such as artist and time information (time played and time remaining) are displayed.

Pause the music.

Touch and hold to rewind the music.

Tap twice to play the previous song.



Touch and hold to fast-forward the music. Touch to play the next song.

Playing Videos

To play videos from the Music + Videos app:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the collection menu.
- Touch videos. Videos will be organized by all, tv, music, movies, and personal. Your personal videos are displayed in the all and personal categories. Videos have to be downloaded from your PC will be displayed under tv. music. and movies.
- 4. Touch and hold a video thumbnail to display the following option:
 - pin to start: Allows you to add a tile on the Home screen for this video. (For more information, refer to "Moving Tiles on the Home Screen" on page 29.)
 - delete: Delete the video.
- Touch the video that you want to play. The video begins to play in landscape mode. At the bottom of the screen, the video file name, the video controls, and the time information (time played and total time) are displayed.

6. The following video controls are available:



Pause the video.



Start the video after being paused.



Touch and hold to rewind the video.



Touch and hold to fast-forward the video.



Display the video in full screen.



Display the video in a reduced format.

Note: If no control icons are displayed on the screen in addition to the picture, touch anywhere on the screen to display them.

Podcasts

- . From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the collection menu.
- 3. Touch **podcasts**. Podcasts are organized by audio and video.
- A thumbnail, the podcast name, the category, and the date created are displayed for each file.
- 5. Touch and hold a podcast thumbnail to display the following option:
 - pin to start: Allows you to add a tile on the Home screen for this podcast. (For more information, refer to "Moving Tiles on the Home Screen" on page 29.)
 - **delete**: Delete the podcast.
- 6. Touch the podcast that you want to play.

The podcast begins to play in portrait mode. At the bottom of the screen, the time information (time played and time remaining) and the podcast controls are displayed.

- **7.** The following podcast controls are available:
 - Pause the podcast.
 - Start the podcast after being paused.
 - Rewind the podcast.
 - Fast-forward the podcast.

Store

To visit the music area of the Store app from

Music + Videos:

- From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left or right to view the collection menu, then touch store.
- 3. Touch music. The artist of the week displays.
- Swipe left or right to view more music categories.
 The choices are: artist of the week, spotlight, new releases, top albums, top artists, and genres.
 - artist of the week: Displays the artist's album, the songs on the album, and the cost of each song. Touch the artist's name to view more albums. Touch and hold on a song to buy the song or share it with friend in a message.
 - new releases: Displays recently released albums and songs.
 Touch an album thumbnail to play sample music.
 - top albums: Displays one or more popular albums and the songs on the albums. Touch an album thumbnail to play sample music.

- top artists: Displays one or more popular artists. Touch an artist thumbnail to play sample music.
- genres: Allows you to access music based on your music genre preferences. Touch the name of a music genre to view new releases, top songs, top albums, top playlists, and top artists for that genre.
- **spotlight**: Displays one or more featured artists. Touch an artist's name to display their albums and songs.
- **5.** Touch any item to browse, review, or purchase.

Photos

The Photos application is where you view photos and play back videos. You can set photos as your lock screen background or share them as a picture message. And you can use your camera to scan barcodes, QR Codes, Microsoft Tags, books, CD's, and other DVD's and get more information on these products with your Internet browser.

Uploading To SkyDrive

Windows Live SkyDrive provides free storage so you can store photos online, share them with the people you choose, and access them from any web browser. Various options include **share on SkyDrive** if you have set up a Microsoft account.

For more information about SkyDrive, go to http://explore.live.com/ and click on **SkyDrive**.

Accessing Pictures and Videos

When you take a photo or shoot a video, the file is saved so you can view your photos and videos at any time. To access photos and videos:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch <a> Photos.
- 2. Photos and videos are displayed depending on which option you choose:
 - camera roll: Thumbnails are displayed for taken photos and videos.
 - albums: Thumbnails are displayed for groups of pictures such as Camera Roll, Screenshots, etc. Other albums are displayed depending on the accounts you have set up such as Microsoft, Facebook, and so on.
 - date: Thumbnails of all photos and videos are displayed in order of month and year created.
 - people: Thumbnails are displayed of all People photos that you have viewed from your accounts, such as Facebook, Twitter, and Linkedln. You can also touch choose contact and touch a contact to load that contact's posted pictures.

- 3. Swipe left across the screen to view the following menus:
 - favorites: Photos added to favorites can set to display on the animated Photos Tile on the Home screen, or may be pinned there for one-tap access.
 - what's new: Displays photos posted by your contacts on your synchronized accounts, such as Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn.
 - apps: Get direct access to photo apps such as Live Wallpaper and Photo Editor.

Thumbnail Options

- When viewing groups of thumbnails, additional options may be available. Touch one or more thumbnails. A check mark indicates selection (touch again to deselect).
- Touch Additional options to display the following options:
 - add to favorites: Adds the photo(s) to your favorites.
 - delete: Deletes the photo.
 - share: Share the photo(s) via Tap + Send
- **3.** Touch **••• Options** to display the following options:
 - select all: Selects all thumbnails.
 - save to SkyDrive: Saves the selected photo(s) to the SkyDrive.
 - save to SD card: Saves the selected photo(s) to the SD card (if installed).
 - save to phone: Saves the selected photo(s) to the phone's storage.

Viewing Pictures

Once you locate the photo you want to view:

- 1. Touch the thumbnail to view the picture.
- While viewing a photo, touch each side of the photo and pinch inward or stretch outward to zoom in or out.

– or –

Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.

You can magnify the photo up to 400 percent.

Touch and slide a magnified photo to move the focus to the area you touch.

3. Swipe across the screen to the right or left to view more photos and videos.

- **4.** Touch and hold a photo or touch **Options** to display the following options:
 - **share...**: Share the photo with others. Options are:
 - **Tap + Send**: Shares the photo via Bluetooth.
 - Messaging: Opens a New Message screen with the photo in-line, For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages" on page 56
 - Email: Opens a New Email screen with the photo in-line. This
 option varies depending on how you have your email set up.
 - Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn: Upload the photo to a synchronized account.
 - MiniDiary: Adds the photo to today's MiniDiary entry.
 - OneNote: Adds the photo to OneNote as a Quick Note.
 - edit: Automatically adjust the photo. Options are rotate, rotate, rorp, and rix (auto color adjustment). If you like the changes, touch rolls are to replace the original photo.
 - delete: Delete the photo or video.
 - add to favorites/remove from favorites: Add or remove the photo as a favorite.

- set as lock screen: Sets the photo as the lock screen background.
- save to SkyDrive: Upload the photo to SkyDrive (see "Uploading To SkyDrive" on page 78).
- apps...: Edit the photo with your installed photo editing apps.

Note: If your device displays that the memory is full when you access **Pictures**, delete some of the files.

5. Touch \leftarrow to return to the thumbnails screen.

Viewing Videos

To view a video:

- Touch the thumbnail to view the video. The first frame
 of the video displays indicating the length of the video
 in minutes and seconds (for example, 01:25). The play
 button is also displayed.
- 2. Touch to play the video. Touch to pause the video playback. Touch and hold to fast forward through the video or touch and hold to rewind the video. Touch to display the video in full screen.

 Touch to display the video in a reduced format.

Note: If no control icons are displayed on the screen in addition to the video, touch anywhere on the screen to display them.

- 3. Touch and hold a video or touch ••• Options to display the following options:
 - **share...**: Share the photo with others. Options are:
 - **Tap + Send**: Shares the photo via Bluetooth.
 - Messaging: Opens a New Message screen with the photo inline. (For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages" on page 56.)
 - Email: Opens a New Email screen with the photo in-line. This
 option varies depending on how you have your email set up.
 - delete: Delete the photo or video.
 - save to SkyDrive: Upload the photo to SkyDrive (see "Uploading To SkyDrive" on page 78).
- **4.** Touch **4.** to return to the thumbnails screen.

You can also play videos from Music + Videos. (For more information, refer to "Playing Videos" on page 75.)

Camera

This section explains how to use the camera and the camcorder on your phone. You can take photographs and shoot videos by using the built-in camera functionality. Your 5 megapixel camera produces photos in JPEG format.

To activate the camera:

- From the Home screen, touch Camera.
 - or -Press the **Camera** key

Adding a Location Tag To Your Pictures

The first time you open the Camera application, you are asked if a tag location (known as Geotagging) can be added to your pictures. This allows you to see where your pictures were taken.

Caution! Be aware that your location may be present on a photo when posting your photos on the internet.

- Touch Privacy Statement to view the Windows Phone 8 Privacy Statement Highlights document.
- 2. Touch allow or cancel to accept or reject location tagging.

Camera and Camcorder Mode

To toggle between Camera and Camcorder mode:

Touch the Camera or Camcorder Mode icon (()).



Once you change the mode, the corresponding settings appear.

Taking Photos

Taking photos with your device's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the camera, and pressing the camera key.

Important! Do not take photos of people without their permission.

> Do not take photos in places where cameras are not allowed.

Do not take photos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

To activate the camera mode:


1. From the Home screen, touch camera.

- or -

Using the phone's main display screen as a viewfinder, adjust the image by aiming the camera at the subject.

Note: When taking a photo in direct sunlight or in bright conditions, shadows may appear on the photo.

- Before you take a photo, pinch the screen to zoom out or stretch the screen to zoom out. You can magnify the picture up to 400 percent.
- **4.** Touch **(** to turn the flash On. Touch **(** to turn the flash Off. To use the automatic flash, touch **(**).
- To take a picture of yourself, touch Front Facing Camera to enable or disable the Front Facing Camera.
- 6. If desired, before taking the photo, you can touch Options to access various photo and video settings. (For more information, refer to "Camera and Camcorder Settings" on page 86.)



Photos are automatically stored within your designated storage location.

Lenses

Your camera can scan barcodes, QR Codes, Microsoft Tags, books, CD's, and other DVD's and instantly retrieve information about these products using specialty apps called Lenses. Text may also be scanned and translated or searched.

Note: Touch **more lenses** to download additional scanning software and features.

Bing Vision

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Camera.
- 2. Touch S Lenses → Bing Vision.
- Focus on the code or tag until the camera recognizes it and displays a thumbnail of it. If the item is correctly identified, touch the thumbnail to launch a Bing search for the product. (If the item is not identified or incorrect, try scanning the code or tag again).
- 4. Touch **history** to see recently scanned items.
- Touch scan text to search text. Once scanned, each word is highlighted.
 - Touch translate and select a target language. Each highlighted word is then translated.
 - To search on a word or words, touch each word to add to the search bar at the top. Touch the search bar and use the keyboard to edit any word if necessary. Touch search to perform a Bing search on the selected word(s).

Shooting Videos

Tip: When shooting video in direct sunlight or in bright conditions, it is recommended that you provide your subject with sufficient light by having the light source behind you.

1. From the Home screen, touch camera.

- or Press the **Camera** key (□□□).

2. Touch the Camera or Camcorder Mode icon () to switch to Camcorder mode ().

- 3. To shoot a video of yourself, touch Front Facing Camera to enable or disable the Front Facing Camera.
- 4. Touch to turn on the camcorder's light while recording. Touch to turn the light off.
- Using the phone's main display screen as a viewfinder, adjust the image by aiming the camcorder at the subject.
- **6.** Press the **Camera** key () to begin shooting video.

Press the Camera key () to stop the recording and save the video file to your Pictures folder.

Camera and Camcorder Settings

- - Focus Mode: Set focus to Normal or Macro.
 - Anti-Shaking: Set anti-shaking correction to Off or On.
 - White Balance: Set this option to one of the following choices: Auto (default), Cloudy, Daylight, Fluorescent, or Tungsten.
 - **ISO**: Determines how sensitive the image sensor is to light. Valid values are: Auto, 100, 200, 400, or 800.
 - EV: Helps you avoid underexposed (too dark) or overexposed (too light or white) photos. Options are: -2 (minimum), -1 (low), 0 (medium), 1 (high), or 2 (maximum).
 - Effects: Change the color tone or apply special effects to the photo. Options include: Off (none), Negative, Sepia, Mono, Washed, Vintage Warm, Vintage Cold, Solarize, Posterize, Point Blue, Point Red-Yellow, Point Green, or Cartoonize.

- Photo Resolution: Set the image size. Options include: 2592x1944, 2048x1536, 1920x1080, 1600x1200, 1280x960, 1280x720, or 640x480.
- 2. For video options, touch **Options** → video settings...

The following options are available:

- White Balance: Set this option to one of the following choices: Auto (default), Cloudy, Daylight, Fluorescent, or Tungsten.
- Effects: Change the color tone or apply special effects to the video. Options include: Off (none), Negative, Sepia, Mono, Washed, Vintage Warm, Vintage Cold, Solarize, Posterize, Point Blue, Point Red-Yellow, Point Green, or Cartoonize.
- Photo Resolution: Set the video size. Options include: 1920x1080, 1280x720, or 640x480.

Accessing Photos and Videos

When you take a photo or shoot a video, the file is saved in the Photos folder. You can view your photos and videos immediately or view them anytime in the Camera folder. From the Home screen, touch Photos. For more information, refer to "Photos" on page 78

Assigning an Image To a Contact

The Camera is also used to create an image that can be assigned to the profile of one of your contacts or to your Me profile.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- From the People menu, touch the contact that you want to edit.
- **3.** At the **contact profile** screen, touch **at** the bottom of the screen.
- Touch add photo → camera.
- 5. Take a photo and touch accept or retake.
- Touch each side of the photo and swipe inward or outward to zoom in or out within the crop area. Touch and slide the photo to move it within the crop area.
- Touch to assign the cropped photo to the contact.

Setting a Photo as Your Lock Screen Background

You can set a photo as your Lock screen background immediately. (For more information, refer to "Changing the Lock Screen Wallpaper" on page 29.)

Photo Editor

Photo Editor is the ultimate photo editor for your Windows Phone, combining an easy interface and professional grade tools and effects.

- 1. From the Home screen touch Photo Editor.
- 2. There are three ways to select a photo for editing:
 - Touch a thumbnail of a recently taken photo.
 - Touch select photo to choose a photo to edit.
 - Touch a camera to take a new photo.

The PHOTO EDITOR screen is displayed.

- 3. Touch **Edit** to resize, rotate, or crop the photo.
 - Resize: Change the photo's size. Options are 25%, 50%, 75% or 100%.
 - Rotate: Change the photo's orientation. Options are 90° clockwise, 90° anticlockwise, Flip vertically, or Flip horizontally.
 - Crop: Crop the photo. Options are Free ratio, 1:1, 3:4, 9:16, or Lasso.

- 4. Touch Color to change the photo's overall color. Options are Original, Auto adjustment, Brightness, Contrast, Saturation, Adjust RGB, Temperature, Exposure, Hue, Darken, and Lighten.
 - Touch the color tool icons to apply the effect. Some color tools will display adjustment controls.
 - Touch original to remove the color change.
- 5. Touch Effect to add a special effect to the photo. Options are Original, Vintage, Old photo, Pop art, Greyscale, Sepia, Retro, Sunshine, Downlight, Blue wash, Nostalgia, Yellow glow, Faded colors, Invert, Cartoonify, Sharpen, Soft glow, Magic pen, Oil paint, Posterise, Sketch, Blur, Red eye, Tilt shift, Pixelise, Sphericity, Twirl, and Mirror.
 - Touch the effect tool icons to apply the effect. Some effects tools will display adjustment controls.
 - Touch original to remove the effect.

- **6.** Touch Decoration to add a decoration to your photo.
 - Frame: Add a frame to your photo. Choose from several styles and colors.
 - **Sticker**: Add clip art to your photos. Choose from Brushes, Comics, Papers, and Graphical images.
- Multi-grid: Take multiple separate photos and mix them together. Options are Split in 2, Split in 3, or Split in 4.
- Touch Sundo to remove the last edit.
 Touch Redo to reapply the last edit.
- 8. Touch Share to share the photo via Tap + Send, Messaging, an email account, add the photo to today's MiniDairy entry, or add the photo to OneNote as a Quick Note.
- Touch Cancel to close the photo without saving changes.
- 10. Touch or use as a Lock screen background.
- **11.** Touch **Save** to save the changes to the photo.

Section 7: Applications

This section contains a description of each application that is available in the Applications Menu, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens. (For details, see "Customizing Your Home Screen" on page 28.)

GPS Applications

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPSenabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- in poor weather

- · around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram for the approximate location of your phone's internal GPS antenna.



Accessing the Applications Menu

To display the Applications menu:

1. From the Home screen, do either of the following: Swipe left.

- or -

Swipe down and touch ().



Alarms

The Alarms application allows you to access and set alarms.

Setting a New Alarm

- 1. From the Applications menu, touch (△) Alarms → add.
- Touch the **Time** field then use your finger to swipe the hour and minute fields to set the time you want for the alarm.
- Touch the Repeats field if you want the alarm to sound on multiple days instead of only once. Touch the days that you want the alarm to sound.
- Touch the Sound field and touch the sound title you want. You can hear a sample by touching the symbol next to the sound name.
- Touch the Name field and use the keyboard to enter a name for this alarm.
- Touch save to save the alarm.

Turning Off an Alarm

To turn off an alarm when it sounds:

Touch dismiss on your display to stop the alarm.

- or -

Touch snooze to temporarily stop the alarm.

Changing an Alarm

To make changes to an existing alarm:

- From the Applications menu, touch Alarms.
- 2. Touch the alarm you want to change.
- Touch and change fields. (For more information, refer to "Setting a New Alarm" on page 91.)
- Touch save to save the updated alarm.

Deleting an Alarm

To delete an alarm:

- 1. From the Applications menu, touch (Alarms
- 2. Touch the alarm you want to delete.
- 3. Touch delete to delete the alarm.

Calculator

The Calculator application provides basic arithmetic functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. You can also store numbers in memory.

- I. From **Applications** menu, touch 🚃 **Calculator**.
- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- **3.** Enter the operation for your calculation by touching the corresponding on-screen arithmetic function key.
- 4. Enter the second number.
- 5. To view the result, touch equals (=).

Note: In Portrait Mode, the Calculator application provides basic functions. To perform more complicated calculations, rotate the phone to Landscape Mode. A scientific calculator displays.

Calendar

With the Calendar feature, you can consult the calendar by day or month. You can also create appointments and have them displayed on your agenda.

- From Applications menu, touch Calendar.
 The day screen displays.
- **2.** Swipe your screen to the left to display the **agenda** view, which displays all of your appointments.
- Swipe your screen to the left again to display the to-do view.
- Touch one of the following options on the day or agenda views:



today: Displays the current month and day.



new: Touch the new icon to create a new appointment for your calendar.



month: Touch the month icon to display the month view.

Appointments

The **agenda** screen displays all events that you have added for all dates in the order that they appear.

Create a New Appointment

To create a new appointment:

- 1. From Applications menu, touch 📰 Calendar.
- 2. Touch to create a new appointment.
- Enter the appointment information: Subject, Location, When (date, time) How long, Reminder, Occurs, Status, Attendees (add someone), Private, and Notes.
- 4. Touch 🗍 save.

Edit an Appointment

To edit an appointment:

- From the agenda screen, touch any appointment to display the Appointment details screen.
- Touch edit. The EDIT APPOINTMENT screen displays.
- 3. Touch the field(s) you want to change.
- 4. Touch save when you are finished.

Delete an Appointment

To delete an appointment:

- From the agenda screen, touch any appointment to display the Appointment details screen.
- 2. Touch delete to delete an appointment.
- 3. At the Delete appointment prompt, touch delete.

To-Dos

The **to-do** screen displays all to-do entries that you have added for all dates in the order that they appear.

Create a New To-Do

To create a new to-do:

- 4. Touch save.

Edit a To-Do

To edit a to-do entry:

- From the to-do screen, touch any to-do entry to display the To-Do details screen.

 The EDIT TO-DO screen displays.
- 3. Touch the field you want to change.
- 4. Touch save.

Deleting To-Dos

To delete to-do entries:

- 1. From the to-do screen, touch eselect.
- 2. Touch the to-do entrie(s) you want to delete.
- 3. Touch delete to delete the selected to-do entries.

Sorting To-Dos

To sort to-do entries:

- **1.** From the **to-do** screen, touch **... options**.
- 2. Touch sort by priority to sort to-dos based on priority.
- Touch show completed to only show completed to-dos.

Calendar Settings

To set calendar settings:

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch Calendar → Settings.
- 2. Touch any account to display their calendar.
- Touch theme color to select the calendar color.
- Touch Show to-dos on the calendar to turn this option On.

Camera

Use your 5 megapixel camera feature to produce photos in a JPEG format. Your phone also functions as a Camcorder to take videos.

(For more information, refer to "Camera" on page 82.)

Data Sense

This app finds more efficient ways to use cellular data (such as only downloading certain data while connected to Wi-Fi) and displays your usage.

- . From **Applications** menu, touch **Data Sense**.
- View the overview menu to see your data plan's allowance remaining, and the days left on your data plan before it resets.

Note: This usages is measured by your phone. Your carrier's data usage measurement may differ.

- View the usage menu to see total data usage (both cellular and Wi-Fi), and the amount of data usage each app has used.
- Touch options → map nearby Wi-Fi to discover nearby Wi-Fi hotspots.
- **5.** Touch to configure Data Sense settings. (For more information, refer to "Data Sense" on page 142.)

Games

You can shop for new games, install games you buy on your phone, and play them with the Games feature.

Accessing Games

To access the Games feature:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 🔼 Games.
- Swipe your screen to the right or left to view the following menus:
 - collection: Allows you to get more games. Any games you have acquired and installed are also listed.
 - Xbox: Allows you to Join Xbox Live to play with friends and displays your Xbox Live player ID. You can also use Xbox Smartglass, and access the Games Store.
 - requests: Once you have joined Xbox Live, this screen displays any game invitations or turn notifications. It also allows you to play a game and invite others to play it with you.
 - spotlight: Displays links to Xbox LIVE websites once you have joined Xbox LIVE.

Getting More Games

The new game is added to your collection screen.

Joining and Accessing Xbox LIVE

To access Xbox LIVE, you need a set up a free Xbox account and get a player ID.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch ☐ Games → Xbox.
- 2. Touch join Xbox LIVE or sign in. The Windows Live ID required screen displays.
- Touch sign in. The Sign In With A Windows Live ID screen displays.
- Touch sign in if you have a Windows Live ID, and enter your Windows Live ID and password. Touch sign in.

Touch **create one** and follow the instructions to create an ID and password.

Your player ID is displayed on the Xbox LIVE screen.

To set your profile:

Touch your profile (or Player ID) and follow the onscreen instructions. Some options require Xbox Extras, a free software download. Follow the on-screen prompts to install it.

After joining Xbox LIVE, the requests screen displays with game information such as game invitations and turn notifications. It also allows you to play a game and invite others to play it with you.

To check invitations or play a game:

Touch the desired activity on the requests screen.

Help + Tips

Get help any time. Information for getting around on your phone and making it yours is just a touch away.

- Swipe up or down through the topics and touch a topic to display subtopics.
- 3. Touch a subtopic to display the indicated information.

Internet Explorer

Your phone is equipped with Internet Explorer—your access to the mobile web.

To access the Internet Explorer browser:

From the Home screen, touch [Internet Explorer. (For more information, refer to "Internet Explorer" on page 113.)

Live Wallpaper

Live Wallpaper can change your lock screen background periodically to 12 photos of your choice.

- 1. From Applications menu, touch Live Wallpaper .
- To allow Live Wallpaper to modify your lock screen. touch yes.
- Touch **choose picture** and select (by touching) up to 12 photos from your photo collection. You can also take new photos by touching a camera.
- **4.** Touch **one** to save.
- Touch each thumbnail to crop the photo, if desired. Touch (v) to save the cropped photo.
- Touch **remove pictures** and select (by touching) each thumbnail to remove. Or touch SELECT ALL. Touch **done** to remove selected photos.

Local Scout

Use Local Scout to find cool restaurants, sights, and shops. Then buy tickets or make reservations on the spot.

- From the Home screen, touch Allow maps to access and use your location? screen appears.
- Touch allow to continue or cancel to stop. Touch Privacy
 Statement to view the statement.

 The Local Scout main screen appears.
- 3. Swipe your screen to the right or left to view more menus.
 - The choices are: **eat + drink**, **see + do**, **shop**, and **for you**.
- Swipe up or down each list and touch an entry to view details about the item.

- Swipe up or down each list of details and touch a detail item. Possible items are:
 - address: The street and street number, city, state, and ZIP code. Touch address to show the location on a map.
 - drive: Get directions to the location.
 - **phone**: The site's phone number. Touch **phone** to call the displayed number.
 - **neighborhood**: The name of the neighborhood, if known, in which the site is located.
 - hours: The times of day or night that an establishment is open.
 - category: The type of food, type of attraction, type of shop, and so on.
 - **website**: The website address of the establishment. Touch the link to launch the browser and view the website.

Maps

Depending on your location, you can use Maps to view basic, custom, and satellite maps. The Maps application also allows you to obtain, with your wireless device, navigation instructions to destinations throughout most of the United States and certain international destinations. Once you find a destination, you can view nearby businesses and places of interest, including locations, contact information, and driving directions.

Important! Before using Maps, you must have an active data (3G) connection. The Maps application does not cover every country or city.

Enabling Use My Location

Before you use Maps to find your location, you must enable **Use my location**. To enable the location source:

From the Applications menu, touch Maps if then do either of the following:

If the Allow Maps to access and use your location? screen displays, touch allow.

— or —

Touch •••• Options → settings, then slide the Use my location slider to On. Touch ← to exit.

Navigating the Map

Zooming

- Double-tap on the screen to zoom in.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinching motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward motion by stretching your fingers outward.



Touch and slide on the screen to reposition the map in the display

Touch

 Touch on the map to display information about the location. For example, your location is indicated by a and a pop-up that displays your approximate address.

Delete History

You can also delete any previous map searches, pins, and image data from your phone from the maps settings screen:

- 1. From the maps Setting screen, touch the delete history field.
- Touch delete.

Map Options

At the bottom of the screen, the following controls are available:



scout: Launches Local Scout. (For more information, refer to "Local Scout" on page 99.)



directions: Use the keyboard to enter an end location then touch → to display the directions.



me: Your location displays on the map indicated by a dot.



search: Allows you to search for a place of interest.

options:

directions list: Displays the details of the last directions request.

search results: Displays after a search has been performed. If more than one result is listed, reference numbers display, which are also displayed on the map.

clear map: After viewing or following directions, this option resets the map.

show/hide nearby Wi-Fi: Displays or hides markers of nearby hotspots.

show traffic: Displays real-time traffic conditions so you can plan the fastest route. **hide traffic** turns this option off.

favorite places: Displays your favorite places. hide favorites / show favorites: Use this option to hide or show your favorite locations on the map. aerial view on: Allows you to see your map as a satellite image.

settings: Displays map settings. For more information, refer to "Maps" on page 144

Nearby Places of Interest

After you ask for directions or search for a location:

 Touch My location (start) or the destination location (end) on the directions list, or the search location on a search results map.

The **about** screen displays, which lists the address, directions from your location, the phone number, the neighborhood, and the category.

- 2. Touch pin to pin a shortcut to the location to the Home screen.
- 3. Touch share to send the location information in a message or an email.
- 4. Touch add to add the location as a favorite.
- 5. Swipe your screen to display the reviews and apps screens. Touch options → suggest changes to suggest changes to the location information.

Messaging

The Messaging feature allows you to send online messages, text messages, and multimedia messages to other phones and email addresses.

From the Home screen, touch Messaging.

MiniDiary

The Mini Diary app enables you to create a diary containing your daily activities, attach pictures and share diary entries on Facebook, Photobucket, and Picasa.

- Touch New diary location information is updated automatically to turn this feature On.
- Touch New diary weather information is updated automatically to turn this feature On.
- 5. Touch Use my location to turn this option On.

Note: Enabling this option will send your location information to Microsoft to improve its location services—but will not use this information to identify or contact you. Touch Samsung Privacy Statement and Microsoft Privacy Statement for more information.

- Touch Require a password to enter MiniDiary to turn this option On.
- Touch Back up on SkyDrive to back your MiniDiary data to your SkyDrive account. Note that this will replace previously backed up MiniDiary data already on SkyDrive.
- Touch Restore from SkyDrive to replace your phone's MiniDiary data with backed up data from your SkyDrive account.

Music + Videos

The Music + Videos feature lets you access music, videos, podcasts, and radio on your phone.

From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos. (For more information, refer to "Music + Videos" on page 72.)

Now

The Now application allows you to check today's weather forecast, the latest stock market figures, the currency exchange rate, or read up on the latest headline news and top tweets.

Accessing Now

From the Home screen, touch Now.
The first time you use the Now application, the Allow "Now" to use your location? screen displays.
Touch the Samsung Privacy statement and Microsoft Privacy statement for more information, then touch OK or Cancel.

Weather

Select Cities for Weather Reporting

- 1. Touch **in settings** → cities.
- 2. Touch + Add a city.
- Type a city name using the keyboard, touch , and then touch the correct city.

Touch **current city** to display the city where you are located. Touch the city to select it.

Touch select list to display a list of cities. Scroll through the list of cities and select one.

Stocks

- Swipe your screen to the left. The stocks screen displays.

Currency, Top Tweets, and Settings

 - converter: Calculate the value of one currency based on another currency.
- Touch top tweets to view top tweets from twitter.Swipe your screen to view top tweets from various countries.

Touch refresh to refresh list.

Touch settings to add or remove countries.

- **4.** Touch settings to display the following screens:
 - sections: Check the up to three items that you want to display on the Now front page.
 - live tile: Allows you to add the weather to your primary Now Home screen tile. You can also add secondary tiles for news and top tweets to your Home screen.
 - about: Displays Now information such as software version and Open source announcement.

Office

With Office, you can view, edit, and create Microsoft[®] Excel spreadsheets and Microsoft[®] Word documents. You can view and edit Microsoft[®] PowerPoint presentations. You can also create notes, or search for and share document files with others.

To access Office, follow these steps:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 1 Office.
- Swipe your screen to the left to display the recent screen.
 - Touch Sample document to view general information about Word, which lets you view, edit, and create Microsoft Word documents on your phone.
 - Touch Sample presentation to view general information about PowerPoint, which lets you view and edit Microsoft PowerPoint presentations on your phone.

- Swipe your screen to the left to display the places screen.
 - Phone: Displays the office documents saved on your phone.

 - email: Displays documents opened from your email accounts.

 - SkyDrive: Windows Live SkyDrive provides free storage so you
 can store your documents online. SkyDrive is available if you

Photo Editor

Photo Editor is the ultimate photo editor for Windows Phone, combining an easy interface and professional grade tools and effects

■ From the **Applications** menu, touch **Photo Editor** (For more information, refer to "Photo Editor" on page 88.)

Photos

The Photos application is where you view photos and play back videos. For photos, you can also set photos as wallpaper and share as a picture message.

(For more information, refer to "Photos" on page 78.)

Settings

This application navigates to the system and applications settings for your phone. It includes such settings as: sound, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, accounts, display, security, memory, and any extra settings associated with your phone.

From the Home screen, touch Settings.

(For more information, refer to "Changing Your Settings" on page 124.)

Store

Store provides access to downloadable applications, music, and games to install on your phone. Store also allows you to provide feedback and comments about an application or flag an application that might be incompatible with your phone.

Setting Up a Microsoft Account

Before using Store, you must set up a Microsoft account. (For more information, refer to "Setting Up a Microsoft Account" on page 71.)

Downloading Applications, Games, and Music

The type of content determines where it appears on your phone. Music, videos, and podcasts appear in **Music + Videos**, games appear in **Games**, and applications appear in the **Applications** list.

To access Store and download applications, games, and music:

- From the Home screen, touch Store
 Store screen displays.
- 2. Touch Samsung Zone, apps, games, music, or podcasts.

Wallet

The Wallet app stores credit or debit cards, Microsoft gift cards, PayPal account information, and other payment options, giving you quick and easy access when purchasing online or in stores.

Internet Explorer

Your phone is equipped with Internet Explorer—your access to the mobile web. This section explains how to navigate and introduces you to the basic features.

Accessing Internet Explorer

To access the Internet Explorer browser:

At the Home screen, touch Internet Explorer



Navigating with the Browser

- To select an item, touch an entry or link.
- To scroll through a website, swipe the screen with your finger in an up or down motion.
- 3. Swipe the screen left to right to move laterally across a web page.



- To access internet options, touch For more information, refer to "Browser Options" on page 117
- To return to the previous page, touch \leftarrow .



Zooming In and Out on the Browser

Stretch two fingers outwards at the same time to zoom in or pinch two fingers together to zoom out. See the diagram below.



Enter a URL

You can access a website quickly by entering the URL. Websites are optimized for viewing on your phone.

To enter a URL and go to a particular website, follow these steps:

- 1. Touch the URL field at the bottom of the screen.
- 2. Enter the URL using the on-screen keyboard and touch→ . The website displays.

Search the Internet

To perform an internet search using keywords, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch .
 The Bing search screen displays.
- Touch the Bing search box located at the top of the browser.
- Use the on-screen keyboard to enter one or more search words. Additional words and phrases display as you type, which you can touch to select.
- **4.** To initiate the search, touch \rightarrow .
- A list of search results displays under the categories web, local, media, and shopping.
- 6. Touch an entry in the list to view the website.
- 7. Touch \leftarrow to return to the search list.

Favorites

While navigating a website, you can make it a Favorite site to quickly and easily access it at a future time. The URLs (website addresses) of the Favorite sites are displayed in the Favorites page. From the Favorites page you can also view your browsing history.

- From the Home web page, touch → favorites.
 The favorites page displays.
- 2. The following options are displayed:
 - List of favorite websites: These are web sites that you have added as favorites.
 - Windows Phone Tips: Displays tips that may help you to use your phone.
- 3. Touch an option or a favorite to view the web page.

Adding Favorites

- 1. From any web page, touch → add to favorites.
- Use the on-screen keyboard to enter the Name and the Web address of the Favorite.
- 3. Touch done

Editing Favorites

- From any web page, touch → favorites, then touch and hold the favorite you want to edit.
- On the drop-down list box, touch edit.
- Use the on-screen keyboard to edit the Name or the Web address of the favorite.
- 4. Touch done

Deleting Favorites

- From any web page, touch → favorites, then touch and hold the favorite you want to delete.
- 2. Touch delete.

Recent Browsing History

The Recent page provides you with a list of the most recently visited websites. These entries can be used to return to previously unmarked web pages.

- From any web page, touch → recent.
 The recent page displays a list of your most recently visited websites. The Name and Web address of each website is displayed.
- 2. Touch any entry to display the web page.
- **3.** To delete a single entry, touch and hold it, then touch **delete**.
- 4. Touch delete in to delete the entire recent list.

Browser Options

- 1. From any web page, touch to access the following options:
 - tabs: Displays tabs, which are links to websites. Touch a tab to display the web page. Touch new and enter a web page address to create a new tab. To delete a tab, touch on the tab.
 - recent: Displays a list of your most recently visited websites.
 - favorites: Displays your favorites page.
 - add to favorites: Add a new favorite website.
 - share page: Allows you to share the page using Tap + Send, Messaging, an email or other account.
 - pin to start: Allows you to place a web page shortcut on your Home screen for easy access.
 - find on page: Allows you to search for text within the current web page.
 - settings: Allows you to configure the Internet Explorer Settings on your phone. For more information, refer to "Internet Explorer Settings" on page 117

Internet Explorer Settings

From this menu you can configure your internet settings to allow cookies on the device, allow Bing to suggest web addresses, and set whether you want the browser to display as a mobile device or as a desktop. You can also delete all browsing history.

Cookies are typically placed on your device when you browse and contain both site information as well as personal information (such as a user name and password), which can pose a security risk if not properly managed.

If activated, the Bing search engine automatically suggests web addresses when you perform an internet search.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the applications menu, touch Internet Explorer.
- Touch the Website preference field and choose either Mobile version or Desktop version.
- Touch the Use address bar button for field and choose either favorites, stop/refresh, or tabs.

Advanced Browser Settings

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the applications menu, touch Internet Explorer.
- 2. Touch advanced settings for additional options.
- Touch and slide the Allow access to my location slider to the right to turn the option On.
- Touch Get suggestions from Bing as I type to turn this option On.
- Touch Reduce data use by sending URLs to the Data Sense service to turn this option On.
- Touch Send browsing history to Microsoft to help improve Bing services to turn this option On.
- Touch Use SmartScreen Filter to help protect against unsafe websites to turn this feature On.
- Touch Send a Do Not Track request to websites you visit to turn this option On.
- Touch the Cookies from websites and apps field and select accept all, block some, or block all.

- Touch the Open links from other apps in field and select a new tab or the current tab.
- Touch Allow sites to store files on my phone to turn this option On.
- 12. Touch manage store to display websites that store files on your phone. To free up storage space, touch a site to delete its files.
- Touch Learn about these settings for more information.

Deleting Browser History

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Settings** . Under the applications menu, touch **Internet Explorer**.
- Touch delete history to delete all temporary files, history, cookies, and saved passwords.
 All temporary files, browsing history, cookies, and saved passwords are deleted from the phone.
- Touch Privacy Statement to view the statement.

Wi-Fi

About Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi (short for wireless fidelity) is a term used for certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN). These device types use an 802.11 wireless specification to transmit and receive wireless data. Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing and accessible Wireless Access Point (WAP). These WAPs can either be Open (unsecured) as within most Hot Spots, or Secured (requiring knowledge of the Router name and password).

Turning Wi-Fi On

By default, your device's Wi-Fi feature is turned on. Turning Wi-Fi on makes your device able to discover and connect to compatible in-range WAPs.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Settings** . Under the **system** menu, touch **Wi-Fi**.
- 2. Touch and slide the **Wi-Fi networking** slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.
- The device scans for available, in-range wireless networks and displays them under Wi-Fi networks on the same screen.
- 4. Press to return to the Home screen.

Connect To a Wi-Fi Network

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Make sure Wi-Fi has been turned on. The network names and security settings (open or secure) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 3. Touch the network to which you want to connect.

Note: When you select an open network, you are automatically connected to the network.

 Enter a wireless password, if necessary. If the connection is successful, connected appears under the Wi-Fi network name.

- 5. Touch advanced to display Known networks and set additional options:
 - Touch add to add a new network name. Touch select
 touch each network you want to delete, then touch
 delete to to delete the selected networks.
 - Touch Notify me when new networks are found to turn this option On.
 - Touch Automatically connect to Wi-Fi hotspots to turn this option On.
 - Touch Send information about Wi-Fi connections to help discover nearby Wi-Fi to turn this option On.
 - Touch Keep Wi-Fi on when the screen times out to turn this option On.

Turning Wi-Fi Off

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi networking slider to the left to turn Wi-Fi Off.

Note: Use of wireless data connections such as Wi-Fican cause an added drain to your battery and reduce your use times.

Wi-Fi Status Indicators

The following icons show your Wi-Fi connection status at a glance:



Displays when Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Displays when Wi-Fi is active but there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point (WAP) or it is not connected to a WAP.

Bluetooth

About Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless devices. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 30 feet.

Turning Bluetooth On and Off

To turn Bluetooth on:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On. When you turn Bluetooth on, your device is discoverable and it immediately scans for Bluetooth devices.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the left to turn Bluetooth Off.
- 4. Press to return to the Home screen.

Bluetooth Status Indicator

The sicon displays at the top of your screen when Bluetooth is active and your phone is connected with a Bluetooth device.

Connecting Bluetooth Devices

The Bluetooth connecting process allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device. When you connect devices, they share a passkey, allowing for fast, secure connections while bypassing the discovery and authentication process.

To connect your device with another Bluetooth device:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On. When you turn Bluetooth on, your device is discoverable and it immediately scans for Bluetooth devices.

- Your device displays a list of discovered, in-range Bluetooth devices. Touch a device from the list to initiate connecting.
- 4. Enter the passkey or PIN code, if needed, and touch ok.
- The external device then has to also accept the connection and enter your device's PIN code.
 Once successfully connected to an external device,
 appears at the top of your screen and connected appears under the device name.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different.

Note: Connecting between two Bluetooth devices is a onetime process. Once a connection has been created, the devices continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information without having to re-enter a passcode.

Disconnecting Bluetooth Devices

Disconnecting a connected device breaks the connection between the device and your phone, but retains the knowledge of the connection. At a later point when you want to reconnect the device, there is no need to set up the connection information again.

- 1. Verify your Bluetooth is active.
- From the Bluetooth settings page, touch the previously connected device. The status changes to not connected.
- 3. Touch the device name again to reconnect.
- To delete the device name from your list of Bluetooth devices, touch and hold the device name until delete displays. Touch delete to remove the device from your list.

Note: Disconnections are manually done but often occur automatically if the connected device goes out of range of your phone or it is powered off.

PC Connections

There are several ways available to transfer music, videos, photos, and other files between your phone and PC, such as using the cloud (Internet storage such as SkyDrive), using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app, etc.

- From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos
- Swipe left across the screen to view the **new** menu.
- Touch Connect to your computer to add stuff.
- There are several ways available to transfer music and videos between your phone and computer, such as using the cloud, using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app, etc. Select the appropriate set up for your phone, and follow the online instructions to install and use the file transfer software of your choice.

Section 9: Changing Your Settings

This section explains the sound and phone settings for your phone. It includes such settings as: display, security, memory, and any extra settings associated with your phone. Settings are divided into **system** settings and **applications** settings.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. The system menu displays.
- Swipe left to display the applications menu, or right to display the system menu.

System Settings

Ringtones + Sounds

- From the Settings system menu, touch ringtones + sounds.
- From the Ringer field, touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the ringer On.
- From the Vibrate field, touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the vibrate feature On.
- Touch the Ringtone field, choose a ringtone, and touch
 Touch get more to add additional ringtones.

- 5. Touch the **New text or IM** field, choose an alert type, and touch .
- **6.** Touch the **New voicemail** field, choose an alert type, and touch .
- 7. Touch the **New email** field, choose an alert type, and touch —.
- 8. Touch one of the check boxes to play a sound for:
 - Reminders: Plays a sound when there is a scheduled appointment.
 - **Key press**: Plays a sound when you touch a key.
 - Lock and unlock: Plays a sound when you lock or unlock a function.

 - All other notifications: Plays a sound for all other notifications.

Theme

Using the theme setting, you can change the background and accent color for the screen.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch theme.
- Touch the Background field and select dark or light.

Note: Battery power is consumed at a faster rate when the background is set to light.

3. Touch the Accent color field and select a color.

Email + Accounts

- From the Settings system menu, touch email + accounts.
- 2. Touch add an account to set up a new account.
- 3. Touch an existing account to modify its settings.
- 4. Touch and hold an existing account to sync or delete it.

For more information about email accounts, see "Setting Up an Email Account" on page 62.

Internet Sharing

Internet sharing enables your phone as a mobile hotspot and lets you share your phone's internet connection with other compatible devices. For more information about Internet sharing, go to http://wsmart.myvzw.com or dial *611.

Note: Internet sharing may cause battery power to be consumed at a faster rate.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch internet sharing.
- **2.** Touch and slide the **sharing** slider to the right to turn sharing **On**.

Lock Screen

From this menu you can change the background, set a timeout screen that locks the phone after a specific amount of time, and set up the phone to require a 4-digit password to unlock the phone.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch lock screen.
- 2. Touch the **background** field to choose a photo source.
 - photo: Touch the change photo field to select a background from your photos.
 - Bing: Professional photos from Bing will automatically be displayed as the lock screen background.
 - Live Wallpaper: Touch open app to launch Photo Editor and select a new background photo.
 - Photo Editor: Touch open app to launch Photo Editor and select a new background photo.
- Touch and slide the Show artist when playing music slider to the right to turn the option On.

- 4. Touch the Choose an app to show detailed status field to select which app displays detailed activity when the lock screen is active. Options are Calendar, an email account, Messaging, or Phone.
- Touch up to five + fields to select app that will display limited activity when the lock screen is active. Options are Games, an email account, Messaging, Phone, and Voicemail.
- Touch the Screen times out after field and select a screen time-out time. Options are 30 seconds, 1 minute, 3 minutes, or 5 minutes.
- Touch and slide the Password slider to the right to turn the password requirement mode On.
- Touch the New password field and enter a 4-digit password. Touch Show password to display the password as you type.

- Touch the Confirm password field and re-enter the 4digit password. Touch Show password to display the password as you type. Touch done to confirm.
- After you create a password, touch change password to create a new password.
- 11. After you create a password, touch the Require a password after field to set how often the password is required. Options are each time, 30 seconds, or 1, 3, 5, 15, or 30 minutes.

Note: To remove the password requirement, Touch and slide the Password slider to the left to turn the password requirement mode Off and enter the password.

Wi-Fi

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi networking slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.

For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 119

Bluetooth

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On.

For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 121

Tap + Send

Tap + send (NFC sharing) allows you to share photos, websites, contacts, and more, or pair your phone by tapping to another NFC-capable device.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch tap + send.
- **2.** Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn NFC sharing On.

Airplane Mode

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited.

Important! When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information or applications.

- From the Settings system menu, touch airplane mode.
- Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the airplane mode On.

Note: When you turn on airplane mode, cellular data mode is automatically deactivated.

Cellular

Enabling this feature allows you to use data features even when you are roaming.

Important! Roaming charges may apply when using data features. Contact your Service provider for details.

Note: Available options may differ depending upon your service provider.

- 1. From the **Settings system** menu, touch **cellular**. The Active network appears.
- 2. Touch the Data connection field and select on or off.

Note: Activating the Data connection automatically turns off airplane mode.

- Touch the Data roaming options field and select roam or don't roam.
- Touch the Mode selection field and select Global mode, LTE and CDMA, or LTE, GSM, or UMTS.

- Touch the Highest connection speed field and select 2G, 3G, or 4G.
- Touch the Network selection field and select automatic, any available network, or search again.
- Touch the For limited Wi-Fi connectivity field and select use cellular data or don't use cellular data.

Note: Your phone won't use cellular data when Wi-Fi connectivity is limited. You may not be able to send or receive data.

- Touch the add internet apn field and enter the APN (Access Point Name), User name, Password, Proxy server/URL, Proxy port, and IP type (IPv4, IPv6, or IPv4v6) information.
- 9. Touch to save your changes.

Location

The Location settings allow you to activate location services so other applications (such as Maps) can access your location information.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch location.
- Touch and slide the Location services slider to the right to turn the location mode On.

Note: When Location services are on, your current location will be available to any apps you've allowed to access it.

Kid's Corner

Kid's corner gives parents a restricted area on your phone where you can share apps, videos, games, and music with your child. They'll have a Start screen of their own and easy access to the items you add there.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch kid's corner.
- Touch Learn more for instructions on setting up and using kid's Corner.
- 3. Touch **next** to set up kid's Corner.
- Touch Games, Music, Videos, and App to select which items to include in Kid's Corner.
- Touch launch kid's corner to start the Kid's Corner app.
- 6. Touch pin to add a Kid's Corner tile to your Home screen.

Once kid's corner has been set up, you can turn this feature off and on.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch kid's corner.
- Touch and slide the Kid's Corner slider to the right to turn this feature On or Off.

Battery Saver

To conserve battery power, your phone can turn off some services to help preserve your battery. Calls and texts will still be received, but apps only run when you open them and emails must be synced manually.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch battery saver.
- **2.** Touch and slide the **Battery Saver** slider to the right to turn this option On.
- Touch advanced to set when battery saver is activated. Options are when battery is low, now until next charge, or always.
- **4.** Battery info such as remaining battery life is displayed.

Phone Storage

Information about how storage space on the phone and SD card is being used is displayed. SD memory card storage can be configured as well.

- From the Settings system menu, touch phone storage.
- Touch phone to see the amount of space used for music and videos, pictures, apps, other, system, as well as free space remaining.
- Touch SD card to see the amount of space used for music and videos, pictures, other, as well as free space remaining. The SD card may also be prepared for removal or formatted.
 - Touch remove SD card to dismount the SD card, making it safe to remove.
 - Touch format SD card to format the SD card and prepare it for use. Formatting will permanently erase all data on the card.

- Change where new music, videos, and pictures will be stored.
 - Touch the Store new music + videos on and select phone or SD card
 - Touch the Store new pictures on and select phone or SD card.

Backup

Certain information on your phone can be automatically backed up to the cloud (data storage available on the Internet such as SkyDrive), guarding you against possible data loss.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch backup.
- 2. Touch What gets backed up? to learn more about what phone data can be backed up.
- Touch app list + settings, then touch and slide the Backup slider to the right to turn this option On. Your Internet Explorer favorites, a list of your installed apps, and most settings will be backed up to the cloud.
 - Touch back up now to start the backup process.
 - Touch advanced, then touch delete to delete all settings currently backed up on the cloud and turn the backup option Off.
- Touch text messages, then Touch and slide the Text message backup slider to the right to turn this option On.
 - (For information on the other messaging options shown, see "Messaging" on page 144.)

- **5.** Touch **photos** to backup your photos and videos to SkyDrive.
 - For photos, select Don't upload, Good quality (may use data plan), or Best quality (needs Wi-Fi).
 - For videos, select Don't upload, Good quality (may use data plan), or Best quality (needs Wi-Fi).

Date + Time

This setting allows you to decide if you want the date and time automatically set or if you want to enter the date and time manually. You also configure the phone to use a 12-hour or 24-hour format.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch date + time.
- Touch and slide the 24-hour clock slider to the right to turn this features On. When turned Off, the 12-hour clock displays.
- Touch and slide the Set automatically slider to the right to turn it On.

Manually Setting the Time and Date

- Touch and slide the Set automatically slider to the left to turn it Off.
- Touch the Time zone field and select a time zone from the list.
- Touch the Date field and flick the Month, Day, and Year fields until the desired date/year displays, touch the date/year to enter it into the field, then touch done.
- Touch the Time field and flick the hour and minute fields until the desired time displays, touch the time to enter it into the field, then touch done.

Brightness

- From the Settings system menu, touch brightness.
- Touch and slide the Automatically adjust slider to the right to turn it On. The phone automatically adjusts brightness on the display.

Manually Adjust the Brightness Level

- 1. Touch and slide the **Automatically adjust** slider to the left to turn it Off. The Level field activates.
- 2. Touch the **Level** field and select a level. Selections are: low, medium, or high.

Keyboard

This setting controls which languages the keyboard supports, as well as how the keyboard interacts when typing (such as capitalizing the first letter of a sentence, correcting misspelled words, suggesting words when misspelled words are detected, and more).

- From the Settings system menu, touch keyboard.
- 2. Touch add keyboards, select one or more languages, and touch odone.
- Touch a language to configure its keyboard settings (not all languages support all options):
 - · Suggest text
 - · Highlight misspelled words
 - · Correct misspelled words
 - Insert a space after selecting a suggestion
 - · Insert a period after double-tapping the SPACEBAR
 - · Capitalize the first letter of a sentence

Note: Some languages may require a software download to fully support these keyboard options.

- 4. Touch advanced for additional options:
 - Touch the reset suggestions field to remove all the words you have added to your suggestion list.
 - Touch Improve suggestions by sending information about my keyboard usage to Microsoft to participate in sending keyboard touch information, which helps Microsoft improve the keyboard on Windows Phone and to enhance or create new user experiences. Touch Learn more for additional information about this feature and other features of your Windows phone.

Language + Region

This setting allows you to configure the language in which the menus and certain keyboard options are displayed.

Note: Some of the settings require you to restart your phone.

- From the Settings system menu, touch language + region.
- 2. Touch the Phone language field and select a language.
- Touch the Country/Region field and select a country or region.
- Touch the Regional format field and select a regional format.
- Touch the Browser & search language field and select a language.

Ease of Access

This setting controls text size and other visibility options, speech controls, and TTY/TDD mode.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch ease of access.
- Touch and slide the Text size slider left or right to change the text size in phone, People, email, messaging, and lock screen.
- Touch and slide the High contrast slider to the right to turn this option On.
- **4.** Touch and slide the **Screen magnifier** slider to the right to turn this option On.
- Touch and slide the Speech for phone accessibility slider to the right to turn it On.
- Touch the TTY/TDD field and select Off, Full, HCO (hearing carry over), or VCO (voice carry over).

Speech

These settings enable speech recognition over the network, using speech when the phone is locked, and playing audio as a confirmation.

(For more information, refer to "Speech Engine" on page 30.) To use Speech, press and hold the Start key.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch speech.
- Touch Use Speech when the phone is locked to turn this option On. This option enables access to Speech when the phone is locked by pressing and holding the Start key.
- 3. Touch Play audio confirmations to turn this option On.
- Touch the Read aloud incoming text messages field and select Off, always on, Bluetooth and headsets, Bluetooth only, or wired headset only.
- Touch the Text to Speech voice and select female or male
- Touch the Speech language and select a language from the list.

7. Touch Enable Speech Recognition Service to send the words you speak and supporting data, including recent contact names, to Microsoft to provide and improve the service. By allowing access, you can use additional speech features on your phone. Touch Privacy Statement for more information.

Find My Phone

Microsoft Account

To use this feature you must set up a Microsoft account and then sign in at http://windowsphone.live.com. Once you sign in, click on FIND MY PHONE.

Note: If you have an Xbox LIVE, Zune, Hotmail, or Messenger ID, you have a Microsoft account.

On the Find My Phone web page, you can:

- Find it: Lets you to see your phone's approximate location on a map.
- Ring it: Rings your phone for one minute using a special ringtone even if it is on silent or vibrate mode.
- Lock it: Locks your phone so that nobody else can use it. You can also put a "please return" note on the screen.
- Erase it: Removes all the information on your phone and resets it to the factory settings.

Find My Phone

On your phone, the following options are available.

Important! This setting also causes a check for updates over Wi-Fi networks and when your phone is connected to your computer.

Company Apps

Some companies offer policies, certificates, and apps that help you connect to your company's network.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch company apps.
- Use your company's account information to sign in and set up the company app. Contact your company's support for more information.

About

This setting displays information about your device such as the Name, Model, Software, and Screen resolution.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings . Under the system menu, touch about.
- Touch more info to view information such as OS version, Firmware revision number, Hardware revision number, Radio software version, Radio hardware version, Bootloader version, Chip SOC version, MAC address,

PRL-ID, MEID, MDN, ERI, IMEI, and SIM ID.

- Touch Terms of Use or touch Privacy Statement to view those documents.
- Touch reset your phone if you want to reset your phone to the factory default settings.

Caution! After resetting your phone, you must not remove the battery until rebooting is complete.

Note: Once you perform reset your phone, all settings and data are initialized.

Feedback

This setting sends feedback to help improve function for this device.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch feedback.
- Touch and slide the Send feedback slider to the right turn this option On.
- 3. Touch Privacy Statement to view the statement.

Additional Call Settings

This setting provides access to additional call settings, based upon your cellular plan. See your cellular service provider for more information. Not all options are available with all plans.

- From the Settings system menu, touch additional call settings.
- 2. Touch each feature to configure.

Call Blocking

Your phone can automatically reject unknown calls or calls from certain contacts.

- From the Settings system menu, touch call blocking.
- Touch and slide the Block unknown calls slider to the right to turn this option On.
- Touch add by keypad to enter a number to block using the keypad.
 - Touch the **Phone number** field to enter a phone number.
 - Touch the Name field to enter a name.
 - Touch the Criteria field and select include, exactly the same as, or start with to selectively block callers based on the Name field.
 - · Touch Save.

- Touch add from contacts to select a contact to block.
 - · Touch a contact.
 - Select a phone number (if the contact has more than one).
 - Touch the **Phone number** field and **Name** field to edit, if desired.
 - Touch the Criteria field and select include, exactly the same as, or start with to selectively block callers based on the Name field.
 - Touch Save.
- Touch the view blocked calls history field to view all blocked calls.
 - Touch Sync to refresh the list.
 - Touch the **Delete** to remove an entry.
- Touch the remove blocked numbers field and select numbers to delete from the blocked numbers list.
 - Touch the **Delete** to remove an entry.

Contacts Import

You can import contacts from your previous phone via Bluetooth.

- 1. From the Settings system menu, touch contacts import.
- Enable Bluetooth on each phone and set each phone to be discoverable.
- 3. Touch **Search device** and pair the two phones.
- **4.** Select the desired phone from the paired list, and touch **Start** to import all contacts.

- **6.** Touch **Save** to import contacts.

Extra Settings

This setting contains additional device settings.

- . From the Settings system menu, touch extra settings.
- Touch the Auto Display Intensity slider to the right to automatically adjust background color to increase battery life when background color is set to white.
- **3.** Touch the **Echo cancellation** slider to the right to improve voice quality on a phone call.
- **4.** Touch the **Audio output mode** slider to the right to use external speakers when the phone is docked.
- Touch the Haptic feedback slider to the right to have the phone vibrate when screen keys are touched.

Application Settings

Background tasks

The apps in this list can continue to do things in the background even when they are not open.

- From Settings applications menu, touch background tasks. Any apps that you have running in the background are listed.

This feature finds more efficient ways to use cellular data (such as only downloading certain data while connected to Wi-Fi) and displays your usage.

 - One time: Touch the Days until data expires field and select a number of days. Touch the Available data field and enter a balance size limit. Touch the Units field and select MB or GB.
 - Monthly: Touch the Monthly reset date field and select a day.
 Touch the Monthly data limit field and enter a size limit. Touch the Units field and select the MB or GB.

Touch **Done**.

- Touch Restrict background data when I'm near my limit to turn this option On.
- Touch Learn more for more information about tracking and limiting data usage.

Games

The games setting allows you to connect with Xbox LIVE.

- 1. From Settings applications menu, touch games.
- Touch and slide the Connect with Xbox slider to the right to turn this option On.
- Touch and slide the Sync game requests slider to the right to turn this option On.
- **4.** Touch and slide the **Show game notifications** slider to the right to turn this option On.

Internet Explorer

From this menu you can configure your internet settings to allow cookies on the device, allow Bing to suggest web addresses, and set whether you want the browser to display as a mobile device or as a desktop. You can also delete all browsing history.

Maps

This setting allows your phone applications to use your location to provide better local search results.

From this setting you can configure your messaging confirmations and whether or not to backup your messages.

- 7. Touch emergency alerts to configure:
 - Touch and slide the AMBER Alerts slider to the right to turn this
 option On.

This device is capable of operating in Wi-Fi mode in the 2.4 and 5 GHz bands. Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a

slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth[®] headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone.

Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers

and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless phones to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions

accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a new model phone is available for sale to the public. it must be tested and certified to the ECC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model phone are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC. For body-worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines when used with an accessory that contains no metal and that positions the mobile device a minimum of 1.0 cm from the body.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. Do not engage in any activity while driving a moving vehicle which may cause you to take your eyes off the road or become so absorbed in the activity that your ability to concentrate on the act of driving becomes impaired. Samsung is committed to promoting responsible driving and giving drivers the tools they need to understand and address distractions.

If your mobile device has a touch-screen display, please note that a touch-screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a non-metallic stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch-screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. GPS

Certain Samsung mobile devices can use a Global Positioning System (GPS) signal for location-based applications. A GPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. Government that are subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense policy and the 2008 Federal Radio navigation Plan (FRP). Changes may affect the performance of location-based technology on your mobile device.

Even with GPS, when you make an emergency call:

 Always tell the emergency responder your location to the best of your ability; and Remain on the mobile device for as long as the emergency responder instructs you.

Navigation

Maps, directions, and other navigation-data, including data relating to your current location, may contain inaccurate or incomplete data, and circumstances can and do change over time. In some areas, complete information may not be available. Therefore, you should always visually confirm that the navigational instructions are consistent with what you see before following them. All users should pay attention to road conditions, closures, traffic, and all other factors that may impact safe driving or walking. Always obey posted road signs.

Emergency Calls

This mobile device, like any wireless mobile device, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks, as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions, areas, or circumstances.

Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless mobile device for essential communications (medical emergencies, for example). Before traveling in remote or underdeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel. Remember, to

Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer, because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion.

Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F.

Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

Dust and dirt

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

Paint

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

Responsible Listening

Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations. Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss.

This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones

that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations. when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a guiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time. not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise, noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor. Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's quide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Implantable Medical Devices

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:
- Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;
- Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your wireless mobile device with an implantable medical device, consult your health care provider.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your mobile device off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle before using your mobile device in a motor vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Switch your mobile device off in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially Explosive Environments

Switch your mobile device off when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion

or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. Users are advised to switch the mobile device off while at a refueling point (service station).

Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants, or where blasting operations are in progress. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

When your Device is Wet

Do not turn on your device if it is wet. If your device is already on, turn it off and remove the battery immediately (if the device will not turn off or you cannot remove the battery, leave it as-is). Then, dry the device with a towel and take it to a service center.

FCC Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Wireless Devices

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and WLAN components must be disabled during a call.

The U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has established requirements for digital wireless mobile devices to be compatible with hearing aids and other assistive hearing devices.

When individuals employing some assistive hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants) use wireless mobile devices, they may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and mobile devices also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless mobile devices to assist hearing device users find mobile devices that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all mobile devices have been rated. Mobile devices that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated mobile device successfully. Trying out the mobile device with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Wireless mobile devices rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. M-ratings refer to enabling acoustic coupling with hearing aids that do not operate in telecoil mode.

T-Ratings: Mobile devices rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. T-ratings refer to enabling inductive coupling with hearing aids operating in telecoil mode.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing aid manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise.

Under the current industry standard, American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19, the hearing aid and wireless mobile device rating values are added together to indicate how usable they are together. For example, if a

hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless mobile device meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equals M5.

Under the standard, this should provide the hearing aid user with normal use while using the hearing aid with the particular wireless mobile device. A sum of 6 or more would indicate excellent performance.

However, these are not guarantees that all users will be satisfied. T ratings work similarly.



The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

HAC for Newer Technologies

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids.

It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Mobile Device

Your mobile device is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the mobile device, or make calls that increase your mobile device bill.

Keep the mobile device and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.

FCC Notice and Cautions

The mobile device may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the mobile device if such interference cannot be eliminated. Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection Association.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your mobile device not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas, and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the mobile device warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the mobile device.

Although your mobile device is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

Other Important Safety Information

- Only qualified personnel should service the mobile device or install the mobile device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted.
- Check regularly that all wireless mobile device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- When using a headset in dry environments, static electricity can build up in the headset and cause a small quick static electrical shock. To minimize the risk of electrostatic discharge from the headset avoid using the headset in extremely dry environments or touch a grounded unpainted metal object to discharge static electricity before inserting the headset.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the mobile device, its parts, or accessories.

- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment near or in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.
- Switch your mobile device off before boarding an aircraft. The use

- Seizures or blackouts can occur when you are exposed to flashing lights while watching videos or playing games for extended periods. If you feel any discomfort, stop using the device immediately.

- Reduce risk of repetitive motion injuries. When you repetitively perform actions, such as pressing keys, drawing characters on a touch screen with your fingers, or playing games, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, neck, shoulders, or other parts of your body. When using your device for extended periods, hold the device with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, and take frequent breaks. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.

What is not covered?

This Limited Warranty is conditioned upon proper use of the Product.

This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abnormal use, abnormal conditions, improper storage, exposure to liquid, moisture. dampness, sand or dirt, neglect, or unusual physical, electrical or electromechanical stress; (b) scratches, dents and cosmetic damage, unless caused by SAMSUNG: (c) defects or damage resulting from excessive force or use of a metallic object when pressing on a touch screen; (d) equipment that has the serial number or the enhancement data code removed, defaced, damaged, altered or made illegible; (e) ordinary wear and tear; (f) defects or damage resulting from the use of Product in conjunction or connection with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG: (a) defects or damage resulting from improper

testing, operation, maintenance, installation, service, or
