Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile Tablet PC.



Safety warnings

Keep your Tablet PC away from small children and pets

Keep your Tablet PC and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing

Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earTablet PCs into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile Tablet PCs and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile Tablet PCs or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your Tablet PC and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your Tablet PC. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your Tablet PC.
- Never dispose of batteries or Tablet PCs in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or Tablet PCs.
- Never place batteries or Tablet PCs on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile Tablet PCs and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your Tablet PC is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the Tablet PC immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the Tablet PC in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your Tablet PC at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your Tablet PC whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your Tablet PC could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the Tablet PC, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your Tablet PC, hold the Tablet PC with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your Tablet PC while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile Tablet PCs while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile Tablet PC in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your Tablet PC or cause injury.

Turn off the Tablet PC near medical equipment

Your Tablet PC can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the Tablet PC or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your Tablet PC can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your Tablet PC or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.

Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.

Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your Tablet PC carefully and sensibly

Do not allow your Tablet PC to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your Tablet PC with wet hands. Water damage to your Tablet PC can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your Tablet PC in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your Tablet PC is a complex electronic device— protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your Tablet PC, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the Tablet PC's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your Tablet PC and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic

closures or allow your Tablet PC to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your Tablet PC emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.



Important usage information

Use your Tablet PC in the normal position

Avoid contact with your Tablet PC's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your Tablet PC

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your Tablet PC may result in damage to your Tablet PC and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.
- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the Tablet PC is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or Tablet PC.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your Tablet PC may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Health and safety information

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Certification Information (SAR)

Your wireless Tablet PC is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. government. These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations, the National Counsel on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile Tablet PCs employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless Tablet PCs to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/ kg). The FCC exposure limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the Tablet PC transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the Tablet PC while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the Tablet PC is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output. Before a new model Tablet PC is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the exposure limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model Tablet PC are performed in positions and locations as required by the FCC.

Non-compliance with the above restrictions may result in violation of FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Consumer Information on Wireless Tablet PCs

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published a series of Questions and Answers for consumers relating to radio frequency (RF) exposure from wireless Tablet PCs. The FDA publication includes the following information:

What kinds of Tablet PCs are the subject of this update?

The term wireless Tablet PC refers here to hand-held wireless Tablet PCs with built-in antennas, often called "cell," "mobile," or "PCS" Tablet PCs. These types of wireless Tablet PCs can expose the user to measurable radio frequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the Tablet PC and the user's head. These RF exposures are limited by Federal Communications Commission safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the Tablet PC is located at greater distances from the user, the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless Tablet PCs," which have a base unit connected to the teleTablet PC wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures well within the FCC's compliance limits.

Do wireless Tablet PCs pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless Tablet PCs. There is no proof, however, that wireless Tablet PCs are absolutely safe. Wireless Tablet PCs emit low levels of radio frequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

What is FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless Tablet PCs?

Under the law, FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless Tablet PCs before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless Tablet PCs are shown to emit radio frequency energy (RF) at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless Tablet PCs to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace or recall the Tablet PCs so that the hazard no longer exists.

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, FDA has urged the wireless Tablet PC industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- "Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless Tablet PCs;
- "Design wireless Tablet PCs in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function; and
- "Cooperate in providing users of wireless Tablet PCs with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless Tablet PC use on human health.

FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the

federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:

- "National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- "Environmental Protection Agency
- "Federal Communications Commission
- "Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- "National Telecommunications and Information Administration

The National Institutes of Health participates in some interagency working group activities, as well.

FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless Tablet PCs with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All Tablet PCs that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. FCC relies on FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless Tablet PCs. FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless Tablet PC networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless Tablet PCs themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless Tablet PCs. Base stations are thus not the primary subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of radio frequency energy (RF) exposures characteristic of wireless Tablet PCs have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be predisposed to develop cancer in absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless Tablet PCs, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health.

Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless Tablet PCs and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neuroma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless Tablet PCs RF exposures. However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of Tablet PC use in these studies was around three years.

What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless Tablet PCs poses a health risk?

A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually using wireless Tablet PCs would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but ten or more years' follow-up may be needed to

provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing agent and the time tumors develop - if they do - may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless Tablet PCs. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the Tablet PC is held, or which model of Tablet PC is used.

What is FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless Tablet PC RF?

FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to radio frequency energy (RF).

FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization international Electromagnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world. The Project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues.

FDA and Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association (CTIA) have a formal Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) to do research on wireless Tablet PC safety. FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts to independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless Tablet PC users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radio frequency energy from my wireless Tablet PC?

If there is a risk from these products - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radio frequency energy (RF). Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless Tablet PC will reduce RF exposure.

"If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless Tablet PC every day, you could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the exposure level drops off dramatically with distance. For example, you could use a headset and carry the wireless Tablet PC away from your body.

Again, the scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless Tablet PCs are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless Tablet PC use.

What about children using wireless Tablet PCs?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless Tablet PCs, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to radio frequency energy (RF), the measures described above would apply to children and

teenagers using wireless Tablet PCs. Reducing the time of wireless Tablet PC use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless Tablet PCs at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless Tablet PC causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless Tablet PC use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Do hands-free kits for wireless Tablet PCs reduce risks from exposure to RF emissions?

Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless Tablet PCs, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used with wireless Tablet PCs for convenience and comfort. These systems reduce the absorption of RF energy in the head because the Tablet PC, which is the source of the RF emissions, will not be placed against the head. On the other hand, if the Tablet PC is mounted against the waist or other part of the body during use, then that part of the body will absorb more RF energy. Wireless Tablet PCs marketed in the U.S. are required to meet safety requirements regardless of whether they are used against the head or against the body. Either configuration should result in compliance with the safety limit.

Do wireless Tablet PC accessories that claim to shield the head from RF radiation work?

Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless Tablet PCs, there is no reason to believe that accessories that claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special Tablet PC cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the Tablet PC. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hand-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the Tablet PC. The Tablet PC may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption. In February 2002, the Federal trade Commission (FTC) charged two companies that sold devices that claimed to protect wireless Tablet PC users from radiation with making false and unsubstantiated claims. According to FTC, these defendants lacked a reasonable basis to substantiate their claim.

What about wireless Tablet PC interference with medical equipment?

Radio frequency energy (RF) from wireless Tablet PCs can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless teleTablet PCs. This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless Tablet PC EMI. FDA has tested wireless Tablet PCs and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for

hearing aids and wireless Tablet PCs so that no interference occurs when a person uses a compatible Tablet PC and a compatible hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000.

FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless Tablet PCs for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

Road Safety

Your wireless Tablet PC gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice, almost anywhere, anytime. But an important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless Tablet PCs, one that every user must uphold.

When driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. When using your wireless Tablet PC behind the wheel of a car, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

- 1. Get to know your wireless Tablet PC and its features, such as speed dial and redial. If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road.
- 2. When available, use a hands-free device. If possible, add an additional layer of convenience and safety to your wireless Tablet PC with one of the many hands free accessories available today.
- 3. Position your wireless Tablet PC within easy reach. Be able to access your wireless Tablet PC without removing your eyes from the road. If you get an incoming call at an inconvenient time, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- 4. Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- 5. Do not take notes or look up Tablet PC numbers while driving. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from

- your primary responsibility, driving safely.
- 6. Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- 7. Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.
- 8. Use your wireless Tablet PC to call for help. Dial 9-1-1 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident or medical emergencies. Remember, it is a free call on your wireless Tablet PC!
- Use your wireless Tablet PC to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 9-1-1 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.
- 10. Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency number.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch your Tablet PC off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the Tablet PC or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, users are advised that for the satisfactory operation of the equipment and for the safety of personnel, it is recommended that the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position.

Using Your Tablet PC Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless Tablet PC. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless Tablet PC and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker.

These recommendations are consistent with the independent research and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

should always keep the Tablet PC more than 15 cm

(6 inches) from their pacemaker when the Tablet PC is switched on.

- should not carry the Tablet PC in a breast pocket.
- should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize potential interference.

If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch your Tablet PC off immediately.

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless Tablet PCs may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may wish to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your Tablet PC off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Switch your Tablet PC off in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially Explosive Environments

Switch your Tablet PC off when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Users are advised to switch the Tablet PC off while at a refueling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

This Tablet PC, like any wireless Tablet PC, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks as well as user programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless Tablet PC for essential communications (medical emergencies, for example).

Remember, to make or receive any calls the Tablet PC must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless Tablet PC networks or when certain network services and/ or Tablet PC features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. If the Tablet PC is not on, switch it on.
- 2. Key in the emergency number for your present location (for example, 911 or other official emergency number). Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 3. Press

If certain features are in use (call barring, for example), you may first need to deactivate those features before you can make an emergency call. Consult this document and your local cellular service provider.

When making an emergency call, remember to give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Remember that your Tablet PC may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident; do not cut off the call until given permission to do so.

Product Performance

Getting the Most Out of Your Signal Reception

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your Tablet PC informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal.

If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your Tablet PC is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your Tablet PC is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your Tablet PC returns to standby mode.

Maintaining Your Tablet PC's Peak Performance

For the best care of your Tablet PC, only authorized personnel should service your Tablet PC and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

There are several simple guidelines to operating your Tablet PC properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Place the mobile Tablet PC's acoustic output next to your ear for proper orientation.
- Do not tamper or alter the Tablet PC's antenna.
- Don't use the Tablet PC if the antenna is damaged.
- Speak directly into the Tablet PC's receiver.
- Avoid exposing your Tablet PC and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your Tablet PC does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it is inoperable, call Customer Care for service.

Charge the battery

Before using the Tablet PC for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the Tablet PC.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack. Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the Tablet PC. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.
- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the [||||] icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the Tablet PC.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.

About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the Tablet PC will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the Tablet PC will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your Tablet PC.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 m without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.

Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

Always ensure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.

Received data is saved to an appropriate application or folder according to its type. For example, a music or sound clip is saved to the sound folder and a contact to the Tablet PCbook.

> > Use Remote SIM mode

In Remote SIM mode, you can make or answer calls only with a connected Bluetooth hands-free car kit via the SIM or USIM card on your device. To activate Remote SIM mode.

- 1 In Menu mode, select **Settings** →**Connectivity** → **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Select Select

To use Remote SIM mode, start the Bluetooth connection from a Bluetooth hands-free car kit.



You must authorise the Bluetooth hands-free car kit.

Wi-Fi

Learn to use your device's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n standards.

You can connect to the internet or other network devices anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.

Your device uses non-harmonised frequency and is intended for use in all European countries. The WLAN can be operated in the EU without restriction indoors, but cannot be operated outdoors in France.

> Activate the WLAN feature

In Menu mode, select **Settings** →**Connectivity** →**Wi-Fi**.

An active WLAN running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, activate the WLAN only when needed.

> Deactivate the WLAN feature

(WPS)

- 3 Press a WPS button on the AP device within 2 minutes. Or, enter a PIN on the AP device and select **Start** within 2 minutes.

Mobile AP

Learn about the Mobile AP feature, which sets your device as an wireless AP (Access Point) to connect to the internet on other network devices.

- 1 In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Connectivity** → **Mobile AP**.
- 2 Select **Mobile AP** on the top to activate the Mobile AP feature.

troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile Tablet PC, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

While using your Tablet PC, the following messages may appear:

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
Please insert SIM card	Ensure that the SIM card is installed correctly.
Tablet PC lock	When the Tablet PC lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the Tablet PC.
Enter PIN	When using the Tablet PC for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.
Enter PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your Tablet PC displays "Network unavailable" or "Network error."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [

Another caller cannot reach you.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the Tablet PC turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

Your Tablet PC is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your Tablet PC requires more power and may heat up.

This is normal and should not affect your Tablet PC's lifespan or performance.
