# **Getting Started**

This manual documents default settings. If you select other settings, steps may be different.




#### Here are some key features found on the front of your device.

- Back: Tap to return to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, menu, or keyboard.
- Front camera: Take pictures and record videos of yourself.
- Home key or Finger scanner: Press to return to the Home screen. Activate the Fingerprint security feature.
- Memory card slot: Install an optional memory card (not included) for storage of files.
- Microphone: Records audio and detects voice commands.
- Power key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock or wake up the screen. Press and hold to turn the device off or restart it, or for quick access to Airplane Mode.
- Proximity sensors: Detects the presence of objects near the device.
- Recent: Tap to display recent apps or touch and hold for Home screen options.

- SIM card slot: Hold the device's SIM Card.
- Volume key: Press to adjust the volume of your device's sounds.

# Charge the Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (charging head and USB cable) is included with the device for charging the battery from any standard outlet.

The battery comes partially charged. A fully discharged battery requires up to four hours of charge time. You can use the device while charging.

**Caution**: Use only Samsung-approved charging devices. Samsung accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

1. Insert the USB cable into the port.



- Connect the USB cable to the charging head, and then plug the charging head into a standard outlet.

#### When to Charge the Battery

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of battery power remaining, the device sounds a warning tone at regular intervals.

In this condition, your device conserves its remaining battery power by dimming the screen.

When the battery level becomes too low, the device automatically turns off.

► For a quick check of your battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the Status Bar of your device's display. A solid color (☐) indicates a full charge.

You can also choose to display a percentage value. Having a percentage value onscreen can provide a better idea of the remaining charge on the battery. For more information, see "Battery" on page 100.

# Here are some features of the Home screen.

- App folder: For your convenience, apps can be grouped together in folders and placed on a Home screen.
- App shortcuts: Shortcuts to your favorite applications on the Home screen.
- Apps screen: Allows quick access to all of the Applications available.
- Home screen indicator: Indicates which Home screen is presently displayed.
- Notification icons: Displays new emails, notifications, available software updates, and so on.
- Status Bar: Display device status icons (right) and notification icons (left).
- Status icons: Display information about the device, such as the network signal strength, battery level, the time, and so on.
- Widget: Self-contained onscreen application that runs on a Home screen (not a shortcut).

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Customize your home screen by adding application shortcuts, widgets, folders, and using wallpapers.

### Manage Home Screens

Your device comes with multiple home screens by default, and you can add more screens. You can also rearrange the home screens in a different order.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.

Touch and hold an empty space on the screen.

  - Change the order of screens: Touch and hold on a screen, and then drag to a new position.

#### App Shortcuts

You can use app shortcuts to launch an app from any home screen.

## Change the Wallpaper

### Widgets

Widgets are self-contained apps that display on a home screen. Unlike a shortcut, a widget operates right on the home screen. There are all kinds of widgets, including links to a specific contact, browser bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many others.

# **Shooting Modes**

Several photo effects are available. Some modes are not available when taking self-portraits.

- Shot & more: Take a quick burst of photos and apply effects to them.

 Dual camera: Take photos and record videos using the front and rear cameras at the same time. A variety of picture-in-picture styles are available.

#### Front camera only

- Selfie: Take selfie shots and apply various effects, such as an airbrushed effect.
- Interval shot: Select the best pictures from a series of continuous shots taken at set intervals.

#### **Both cameras**

- Virtual shot: Create multi-directional views of objects.
- Download: Download additional shooting modes from the Samsung Apps store.

## Camera Settings

## Clock

# The Clock app features an Alarm and a World Clock.

- 2. Tap a tab to use a feature:
  - ALARM: This feature allows you to set an alarm to ring at a specific time.
  - WORLD CLOCK: View the time of day or night in other parts of the world. World Clock displays time in hundreds of different cities, within all 24 time zones around the world.
  - STOPWATCH: You can use this option to measure intervals of time.
  - TIMER: You can use this option to set a countdown timer. Use a timer to count down to an event based on a preset time length (hours, minutes, and seconds).

#### Create an Alarm

Create an alarm event. You can set one-time or recurring alarms, and choose options for how to be notified.

- 2. Tap following items to configure an alarm:
  - Time: Set a time for the alarm.
  - Repeat weekly: Choose when to repeat the alarm, if so desired.
  - DATE: Choose the day for this alarm.
  - OPTIONS: Tap to view and set the following options:
    - Alarm type: Choose whether the alarm will use sound, vibration, or vibration and sound to alert you.
    - Volume: If you have chosen an alarm type that includes sound, drag the slider to set the volume of the alarm.

  - Enter a name, phone number, email address, and assign the contact to a group. Tap ADD ANOTHER FIELD to add more contact information.
    - Tap + Add to enter additional entries.
    - Tap Remove to remove an entry.

- Tap ➤ Expand for additional fields.
- Tap the label to the right of any entry to choose another label for the field (for example, Mobile, Home or Work).

# **Configure Email Accounts**

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

- Tap the drop down menu in the upper left corner, and then tap Time or Album to choose how videos and images are displayed. Other view options may be available.
  - In Album view, you can create albums to organize your images. On the drop down menu, tap Album, and then tap MORE > Create album.

- Depending on the view mode selected, either tap an image or video to view it, or first tap an album or folder and then tap an image or video.
- 4. When viewing an image or video, you can scroll left or right to view the next or previous image or video.

#### Zoom In and Out

Use one of the following methods to zoom in or out on an image:

- Double-tap anywhere on the screen to zoom in or zoom out.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in.
   Pinch the screen to zoom out.

## **Play Videos**

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > [S] Gallery.
- 2. Tap a folder to open it.
- 3. Tap a video to view it.

### Trim Segments of a Video

- Select a video, and then tap the screen once to see the video options.

- Use the sliders at the bottom of the screen to trim the video. Move the start bracket to the desired starting point, move the end bracket to the desired ending point.

When you receive a message, your phone notifies you by displaying the New message icon in the Status Bar.

#### To access a new message:

Drag your finger down from the Status Bar to display the Notification Panel, and then tap the message notification to open the message.

From the Home screen, tap Apps >

Message+, and then tap the message to open it.

# Reply to Messages

Messages you exchange with another person are displayed as conversations in the Messages app, so you can see all the messages in one place.

- 2. Tap a conversation to display it.
- Tap the Type a message field and then type your reply message.
- 4. When the message is complete, tap Send.

# Protect a Message from Deletion

You can lock a message so that it will not be deleted even if you delete the other messages in the conversation.

- From the Home screen, tap Apps > Apps >
   Message+.
- 2. Tap a conversation to display it.
- Touch and hold the message that you want to lock, and then tap Lock message on the pop-up menu. A lock icon displays on the message.

## Delete Messages

- From the Home screen, tap Apps > Apps >
   Message+.
- 2. Tap a conversation to display it.
- Touch and hold the message you want to delete, and then tap **Delete messages** on the pop-up menu. Follow the prompts to confirm the deletion.



- Local storage: View folders and files in their storage locations.
  - Device storage: View folders and files located on the device.
- Cloud storage: Contains shortcuts to FTP servers or other cloud storage locations that you have added.
  - Google Drive: View files saved to your Google Drive account.

After tapping on a category, the following options are available:

- HOME: Return to the main My Files screen.
- **SEARCH**: Search for a file in the selected category.
- MORE: Tap for the following options:
  - **Edit**: Select files or folders.
  - Share: Share files or folders.
  - **Cloud**: View files saved in the Verizon Cloud.
  - View as: Change the appearance of the files or folders.
  - **Sort by**: Change the sort order of the files.
  - Show/Conceal hidden files: Show or conceal hidden files.

**Note**: Options vary by category and folder.


# Options for Selected Files and Folders

- ► Tap MORE > Edit, select a file or folder, and then use one of these functions:
  - **DELETE**: Delete files or folders.
  - MORE: Select one of the following options:
    - Move: Move files or folders to another folder.
    - Copy: Copy files or folders to another folder
    - Rename: Rename a file or folder. This option only appears when just one file or folder is selected.
    - Add shortcut on Home screen: Add a shortcut to the folder/file on the main Home screen

- Compress: Create a zip folder containing the selected files. This option only appears in Local Storage categories. A selected zip folder has the additional options of Extract and Extract to current folder.
- Details: View details of the selected file(s) or folder(s).

**Note**: Options vary by category and folder.

# Video Player



#### Play videos stored on your device.

- Scroll through the videos stored on your device. After a few seconds, each video thumbnail begins playing a preview of the clip.
- 3. Tap a video to view it.

#### Use Pop-up Player

Multi task with Pop-up player by transforming your video player into a pop-up window. The video will continue to play, and the pop-up window can be resized or moved anywhere on the screen.

- 2. Tap a video to view it.
- Tap Pop-up player to continue playing the video in a floating window.
  - Drag the window to any location on the screen.
  - Use two fingers to pinch or spread to resize the floating window.

# Settings

Configure your device's connections and settings, add accounts, and customize the home screen, apps, and features.

# **About Settings**

- Some options are enabled or disabled by tapping the ON/OFF button to turn the option ON or
   OFF.
- For some options, you must tap a field, such as Email address, to display and set options.
- Some options are enabled or disabled by tapping a checkbox. When enabled, a check mark displays.

## **Access Settings**

► From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** >  **Apps** >  **Settings**.

- or -

From a Home screen, drag down from the Status Bar to display the Notification Panel, and then tap **Settings**.

## Airplane Mode

Airplane mode disconnects your device from all networks and turns off connectivity features such as Wi-Fi.

While in airplane mode, you can use other features, such as playing music, watching videos, or other applications.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Airplane mode, and then tap ON/OFF to enable or disable the option.

**Note**: You can also control Airplane mode from the Device options menu. Press and hold the **Power** key, and then tap **Airplane mode**.

# Wi-Fi Settings

Wi-Fi is a term used for certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN). Communication requires access to a Wireless Access Point (WAP).

#### Turn Wi-Fi On or Off

Turning Wi-Fi on makes your device able to discover and connect to compatible in-range WAPs.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Wi-Fi, and then tap ON/OFF beside Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi on or off.

## Scan and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- 1. From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Wi-Fi, and then tap the network you want to connect to.
  - When you select an open network, you are automatically connected to the network.
  - Enter a wireless password, if necessary.

# Manually Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- 2. Tap Wi-Fi > MORE > Add network.
- 3. Enter information about the Wi-Fi network:
  - Tap Enter SSID to enter the name of the Wi-Fi network.
  - Tap the Security field and select a security option. This must match the current security setting on your target WAP. If secured, you will also need to enter your WAP's password.
  - Tap Show advanced options, if you need to add advanced options such as Proxy and IP settings.
- Tap CONNECT to store the new information and connect to your target WAP.

## Wi-Fi Options

The Wi-Fi settings menu allows you to set up many of your device's advanced Wi-Fi services.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on.
- 3. Tap **MORE** for options:
  - Add network: Manually enter the credentials for a Wi-Fi network.
  - WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
  - WPS PIN entry: View the PIN used by your tablet to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment (not configurable).
  - Smart network switch: Automatically switch between mobile data and Wi-Fi to maintain a stable Internet connection.
  - Advanced:
    - Show Wi-Fi pop-up: When opening apps, see a pop-up when Wi-Fi is available.

- Wi-Fi notifications: Receive a notification when new Wireless Access Points (WAPs) are available.
- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi.
- Always allow scanning: Allow Google location service and other apps to scan for networks, even when Wi-Fi is turned off.
- Install certificates: Install authentication certificates.
- MAC address: View your device's MAC address, which is required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
- IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).
- Manage networks: Manage your saved Wi-Fi network connections.
- Help: Learn about setting up and using Wi-Fi networks, and other settings.

#### Wi-Fi Status Indicators

Status Bar icons show your current Wi-Fi connection status:

- When Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP), adjusted
- If a Wi-Fi access point is available, but your device is not connected to it, Additional displays. It may also display if there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point (WAP).

#### Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows direct device-to-device connections via Wi-Fi, without having to connect to a Wi-Fi network.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Wi-Fi, and then tap ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on. Wi-Fi must be on to configure settings.
- Tap Wi-Fi Direct. Your device automatically scans for nearby Wi-Fi Direct devices.
- After scanning for devices, select a device, and then follow the prompts to complete the connection.

#### Wi-Fi Direct Status Indicator

When your device is connected to another device using Wi-Fi Direct, a displays in the Status Bar.

## Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car Bluetooth systems, and Bluetooth-enabled computers, printers, and wireless devices.

**Note**: The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet.

#### Turn Bluetooth On or Off

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on or off.

#### Scan for Bluetooth Devices

When you want to pair with another Bluetooth device, you can scan for nearby devices that are visible.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Tap **SCAN**. Nearby devices display on the screen.

# Review Files Received with Bluetooth

When you receive files from another device via Bluetooth, you can access them from Bluetooth settings.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > 
   Settings.
- 2. Tap Bluetooth > MORE > Received files.

## Change Your Device's Name

Device names are used to identify devices during pairing, and when using Wi-Fi Direct or other Wi-Fi based features. This is the name others will use when pairing with your device via Bluetooth.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth > More options > Rename device.
- 3. Use the keyboard to edit your device name.

#### View Help

You can access Help for the Bluetooth feature.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > @ Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth > MORE > Help.

#### Pair Bluetooth Devices

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device.

Pairing between two Bluetooth devices is a one-time process. Once a pairing is created, the devices will continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information without having to re-enter a passcode.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- Make sure that the target device is discoverable, so that your device can find it. Refer to the instructions that came with the device to find out how to set it to discoverable mode.
- Tap SCAN. Your device will start to scan for Bluetooth devices within range.
- 5. When you see the name of the target device displayed in the Bluetooth devices section, tap the name. Your device then automatically tries to pair with the target device. If automatic pairing fails, enter the passcode supplied with the target device.

**Note**: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth compatible devices.

## Delete a Paired Device (Unpair)

When you unpair from a Bluetooth device, the two devices will no longer recognize each other. To connect again, you'd need to pair the devices.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Settings next to the paired device, and then tap Unpair to delete the paired device.

## Data Usage

### Monitor your mobile data usage.

**Note**: Your service provider may account for data usage differently.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- Tap Data usage for options:
  - Mobile data: Enable mobile data. You can also control Mobile Data at the Notification panel.
  - Limit mobile data usage: When enabled, your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. Drag the red limit line to set the data usage limit.
  - Alert me about data usage: Receive an alert when mobile data usage reaches the warning limit you set. Drag the orange warning line to set the data usage warning limit.
  - Data usage cycle: Tap the menu, and then choose a time period for data usage. Data usage for the period displays on the graph, along with usage by application below.

- 3. Tap MORE for other options:
  - Restrict background data: Restrict some apps and services from working unless you are connected to a Wi-Fi network.
  - Show Wi-Fi usage: Display a Wi-Fi tab that shows Wi-Fi usage.
  - Restrict networks: Select Wi-Fi networks that are Mobile Hotspots and restrict background apps from using these networks.
  - Show units: Automatically switch between megabytes and gigabytes (MB/GB), or show only megabytes or gigabytes.
  - Help: Read help topics for Data Usage.

# More Settings

The More settings allow you to configure a variety of communication settings for your device.

## Mobile Hotspot

Use Mobile Hotspot to share your device's Internet connection with other devices using your device as a Mobile Hotspot.

**Note:** Mobile Hotspot may require a subscription to Mobile Hotspot/Mobile Broadband Connect service. For more information, contact Verizon Wireless.

**Warning**: Using your device as a mobile hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While Mobile Hotspot is active, your device's applications will use the Mobile Hotspot data service. Roaming while using your device as a mobile hotspot will incur extra data charges.

### Turn Mobile Wi-Fi Hotspot On or Off

Activate your device's Mobile Hotspot application to allow other devices to use your device's Internet connection.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings > More > Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to turn Mobile Hotspot on or off.

**Warning**: By default, your device's Mobile Hotspot has no security applied, and any device can connect. To set a password for your Mobile Hotspot, see <u>"Change the Mobile Hotspot Password" on page 85</u>.

# Connect a Device to Your Mobile Hotspot

Use the other device's Wi-Fi control to connect to your device's Mobile Hotspot.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to turn Mobile Hotspot on.
- 3. Activate Wi-Fi on the target device.
- Scan for Wi-Fi hotspots, and select the target device from the list.
- On the target device, enter your device's Mobile Hotspot password.

#### Allowed Device List

Control whether devices can connect to your Mobile Hotspot with the Allowed device list. After you add devices to the list, they can scan for your device and connect using your device's Mobile Hotspot name and password.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings > More > Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to turn Mobile Hotspot on.
- Tap MORE > Allowed devices, and then tap ADD to enter the other device's Device name and MAC address.
- 4. Tap **OK** to add the device.

#### Change the Mobile Hotspot Password

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > Mobile Hotspot.
- Tap ON/OFF to turn Mobile Hotspot on.
- 3. Tap MORE > Configure Mobile Hotspot.
- Tap the Security field, select WPA2 PSK, and enter a new password.

# Turn Off Mobile Wi-Fi Hotspot Automatically

Set your device to automatically turn off Mobile Wi-Fi hotspot if there are no connected device.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings > More > Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to turn Mobile Hotspot on.
- Tap MORE > Timeout settings and select an amount of time.

## **Tethering**

Use Tethering to share your device's Internet connection with a computer that connects to your device with a USB cable or by Bluetooth.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > Tethering.
- 2. Choose a tethering method:
  - Bluetooth tethering: Use Bluetooth to pair your device with the computer. (Consult the computer's documentation for more information about configuring your computer to pair with Bluetooth.) Tap Bluetooth tethering to turn tethering on.
  - USB tethering: Connect the computer to the device with a USB cable, and then tap USB tethering to turn tethering on.

**Note**: Using tethering requires a separate subscription. For more information, contact Verizon Wireless.

#### Mobile Networks

You can control your device's access to networks and mobile data services.

**Caution**: Depending on your service plan, changes you make to mobile networks settings may incur extra charges. Consult Verizon Wireless for information.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Mobile networks for options:
  - Data roaming access: Enable or disable connection to data services when your device is roaming on another network.
  - Roaming: (Not configurable) Current roaming status.
  - Signal strength: (Not configurable) Current signal strength.
  - Network mode: Choose a preferred network mode.
  - Access Point Names: Configure wireless network access.

 Network operators: Select a network from all available networks, to automatically select a net network from your preferred networks.

## **Printing**

Print images and documents to Samsung printers and other compatible printers (not included).

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > Printing.
- 2. Tap a print service and follow the prompts.

**Note**: Tap **Download plug-in** to install additional print service drivers.

## Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

Set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

You must set a screen lock pattern, PIN, password, or fingerprint before setting up a VPN. For more information, see <u>"Set a Screen Lock" on page 108</u>.

#### Add a VPN

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > VPN.
- Tap Basic VPN or Advanced IPsec VPN and follow the prompts to set up your VPN.

#### Connect to a VPN

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap either Basic VPN or Advanced IPsec VPN.
- Tap the VPN you want to connect to, enter your log in information, and tap Connect.

#### Edit or Delete a VPN

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap either Basic VPN or Advanced IPsec VPN.
- Touch and hold the VPN that you want to edit or delete.
- 4. Tap either Edit network or Delete network.

#### **Ethernet Connection**

Manage your Ethernet connection.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More.
- Tap Ethernet and follow the prompts to connect to an Ethernet network.

## **Nearby Devices**

Share your media files with nearby devices via Wi-Fi.

**Warning**: If file sharing is enabled, other devices can access your data. Use this option with care.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > More > Nearby devices.
- 2. Tap **ON/OFF** to enable Nearby devices.
- 3. Set the following options:
  - Content to share: Select the content to share.
     Choices are: Videos, Photos, and Music.
  - Allowed devices: Indicate the devices accessible to your device.

 Blocked devices: Indicate the devices not accessible to your device.

- Download to: Set whether to download data to Device or SD card.
- Receive files from other devices: If a nearby device attempts to upload data, this setting indicates the response.

#### View Your Verizon Account

View your Verizon account and data plan information.

► From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > ♠ Settings > More > View Verizon Account.

# Sound and Notification Settings

Configure the sounds and vibrations used to indicate notifications, screen touches, and other activities.

- Vibrate: Your device vibrates for notifications and alerts. This uses the Vibration intensity you choose in Sound settings.
- Mute: Your device plays no sounds or vibrations.
   Onscreen reminders will still occur.

#### Sound Mode

You can switch between sound modes, while preserving the individual sound settings you've made.

**Tip:** Sound modes are also available from the Device options menu. Press and hold the **Power** key, and then choose Mute, Vibrate, or Sound from the Device options menu.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Sound and notification > Sound mode, and then choose a mode:
  - Sound: Your device uses the sounds, vibrations, and volume levels you've chosen in Sound settings for notifications and alerts.

## Adjust the Volume

Set the system volume level, and set default volume for notifications and other media

**Tip**: You can also set System volume from the home screen by pressing the **Volume** key.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Sound and notification > Volume, and then drag the sliders to set the default volume for:
  - Notifications
  - Media
  - System

OR INTERNAL USE ONLY

#### Sounds

Configure notification and system sounds.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- Tap Sound and notification > Sounds for the following options:
  - Default notification sound: Choose a sound for notifications, such as for new messages and event reminders.
  - · Calendar: Configure event notifications.
  - Email: Configure email account notifications.
  - Touch sounds: Play tones when you touch or tap the screen to make selections.
  - Screen lock sounds: Play a sound when you unlock the screen.
  - Keyboard sound: Play a sound when the Samsung keyboard is tapped.

#### **Vibrations**

Set the level for vibration to accompany notifications and feedback for your screen touches, also known as haptic feedback.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- Tap Sound and notification > Vibrations for the following options:
  - Vibration intensity, and then drag the sliders to set the vibration intensity for:
    - Notifications
    - Vibration feedback
  - Vibration feedback: Tap the ON/OFF switch to enable vibrations when the softkeys are tapped and for certain software actions.
  - Keyboard vibration: Tap the ON/OFF switch to enable vibrations when the Samsung keyboard is tapped.

## Sound Quality and Effects

Choose from advanced sound options to customize your audio experience.

#### Adapt Sound

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Sound and notification > Sound quality and effects
- Tap Adapt Sound and follow the prompts to customize your sound settings.

#### Other Advanced Options

- From a Home screen, tap  **Apps > ♠ Settings**.
- Tap Sound and notification > Sound quality and effects.
- 3. Tap ON/OFF to enable each option:
  - SoundAlive+: Recreate the effects of rich surround sound.
  - Tube Amp: Simulate the soft timbre of a tube DRAFT amplifier.

#### Do Not Disturb

This setting allows you to block all notifications and alerts. The options below determine what notifications can make sounds, and during what time periods you want to enter this mode.

#### To activate Do Not Disturb mode:

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Sound and notification > Do not disturb.
- 3. Tap **ON/OFF** to turn the feature on.
- Tap Allow exceptions to allow alarms, calls, messages, or events and reminders.
- Tap Set schedule and then tap Days, Start time, and End time to set up a do not disturb schedule.

#### Notifications on Lock Screen

You can select what notifications, if any, appear on the Lock screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Sound and notification > Notifications on lock screen and select an option: Show content or Do not show notifications.

## **App Notifications**

Configure notifications for each app on your tablet.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > @ Settings.
- 2. Tap Sound and notification > App notifications.
- 3. Scroll through the alphabetical list of apps and tap the app.

# Display and Wallpaper Settings

## Adjust the Screen Brightness

Adjust the screen brightness to suit your surroundings, or to your personal preference. You may also want to adjust screen brightness to conserve battery power.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- Tap Display and wallpaper > Brightness for options:
  - Tap Auto to allow the device to adjust brightness automatically.
  - To set a custom brightness level, clear the Automatic brightness check mark and then tap and drag the slider for **Brightness**.

**Note**: You can also control Brightness from the Notification panel. Drag down the Status bar at the top of the screen to find the Brightness options.

## Change Wallpaper

Change the look of the home and lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Display and wallpaper > Wallpaper.
- 3. Tap **HOME SCREEN**, **LOCK SCREEN**, or **HOME AND LOCK SCREENS**.
- Tap a image to preview it, or tap From Gallery to choose your own image.
- Once you have chosen an image, tap SET AS WALLPAPER.

## Change the Font Style and Size

You can set the font style and size for all text that displays on the screen.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Display and wallpaper > Font to choose a Font style and Font size.
  - Drag the slider to adjust the font size.
  - Tap a font style to select a font, or tap **Download** fonts to find new fonts from GALAXY Apps.
- 3. Tap **DONE** to set the font size and style.

#### **Screen Rotation**

Set the screen to rotate when the device is rotated (landscape or portrait).

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > Settings.
- 2. Tap Display and wallpaper > Screen rotation.
- Tap either Rotate screen content or Stay in current orientation.

## Set the Screen Timeout Delay

Choose how long the display screen remains lit after you tap the screen or press any key.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Display and wallpaper > Screen timeout, and then choose a time period.

## **Smart Stay**

Using the front camera to detect your face, the screen will not time out as long as you are facing the screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > @ Settings.
- Tap Display and wallpaper > Smart stay to enable.

#### Select a Screen Mode

Choose a screen mode to match your type of viewing. Set your device automatically adapt the display depending on the type of image being displayed and other criteria such as battery level.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Display and wallpaper > Screen mode, and then choose a screen mode.
  - To have your device automatically optimize the display to match the type of image being displayed and other criteria, such as battery level, tap Adaptive display.

## Daydream (Screen Saver)

The Daydream setting controls what the screen displays when the device is docked (dock not included), or while charging. You can choose to display colors, or display photos stored on your device.

From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.

 Tap Display and wallpaper > Daydream. Tap ON/OFF to turn Daydream on. Configure options:

- Colors: Tap the selector to display a changing screen of colors. Tap Settings for options.
- Google Photos: Display pictures from your Google Photos account. Tap Settings for options.
- Photo Frame: Display pictures in a photo frame.
   Tap Settings for options.
- Photo Table: Display pictures in a photo table.
   Tap Settings for options.

## Motions and Gestures

Control certain device actions by touching the screen with the palm of your hand.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Motions.
- 3. Tap **ON/OFF** to enable each of the following:
  - Mute: Mute sounds and video by placing your hand on the screen while the screen is on.
  - Palm swipe to capture: Capture an image of the screen when you sweep your hand left or right across the screen.

## Storage

View the device memory and usage, or mount, unmount, or format an optional memory card (not included).

## **Device Memory**

View and manage the memory used by the device.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Storage.
  - The Device memory displays as Total space and Available space.
  - The amounts of memory used by Applications, Pictures and videos, Audio, Downloads, Cached data, and Miscellaneous files are also displayed.

#### To increase available memory:

- Tap Cached data to clear all cached data for all apps.
- Tap Miscellaneous files, select unnecessary files (or tap SELECT ALL), and then tap T Delete.

## Memory Card (SD Card)

Once a memory card (not included) has been installed in your device, the card memory displays as Total space and Available space.

#### Install a Memory Card

You can use a microSD or microSDHC card (not included) to add additional memory space to your device.



- Open the microSD card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it clicks into place.
- Close the microSD card slot cover.

#### Mount a Memory Card

When you install a memory card (not included), it is automatically mounted (connected to the device) and prepared for use. However, should you unmount the card without removing it from the device, you will need to mount it before it can be accessed.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Storage > Mount SD card.

#### Remove a Memory Card

**Warning:** To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card (not included), unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Storage > Unmount SD card.
- Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- Gently press inward on the memory card so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out
- 5. Close the memory card slot cover.

#### Format a Memory Card

**Warning**: When formatting an memory card (not included), you will want to backup your music and photo files that are stored on the card because formatting the SD card deletes all the stored data.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Storage > Format SD card and follow the prompts.

## **Battery**

View how battery power is used for device activities. Conserve battery power by automatically adjusting the screen brightness, limiting the performance of the CPU, and other power reduction activities.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Battery for options:
  - Power saving mode: Tap ON/OFF to turn the feature on, and customize options.
  - Ultra power saving mode: Tap ON/OFF to turn the feature on. Ultra power saving mode saves even more battery power by using a grayscale theme to your home screen and limiting the number of usable apps.
  - Display battery percentage: Display the battery charge percentage next to the battery icon on the Status bar.

- Battery Chart: The battery level displays as a percentage. The amount of time the battery has been used also displays. Tap the chart to view History details.
- Tap REFRESH to update the listing.

**Note**: Other applications may be running that affect battery use.

# Application Settings

Use the Application manager to manage the system requirements of your applications. You can also configure your Default application settings.

## **Application Manager**

You can download and install new applications on your device. Use the Application manager to configure your downloaded and preloaded applications.

**Warning**: Because this device can be configured with system software not provided by or supported by Google or any other company, end-users operate these devices at their own risk.

## Memory Usage

See how memory is being used by Downloaded or Running applications.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications > Application manager.
- Tap DOWNLOADED, SD CARD, RUNNING, or ALL tabs to display memory usage for that category of applications.

The graph at the bottom of the DOWNLOADED tab shows used and free device memory. The graph at the bottom of the RUNNING tab shows used and free RAM.

#### Downloaded

Displays apps you have downloaded onto your device.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings > Applications > Application manager.
- Tap **DOWNLOADED** to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.
  - To switch the order of the DOWNLOADED list, tap MORE > Sort by size or Sort by date.
  - To reset your application preferences, tap MORE
     Reset app preferences.
  - To uninstall more than one app, tap MORE > Uninstall multiple.
- Tap an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions. The following actions are available
  - FORCE STOP: Stop an app that is misbehaving.
     Restart your device if stopping an app, process, or service causes your device to stop working correctly.

- UNINSTALL: Delete the application from the device.
- MOVE TO SD CARD: Move this app to your microSD card.
- CLEAR DATA: Clear application data from memory.
- CLEAR CACHE: Clear an application's temporary memory storage.
- CLEAR DEFAULTS: Clear an application's customization.

#### SD Card

Displays apps you have downloaded onto your memory card (not included).

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications > Application manager.
- Tap SD CARD to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.
  - To switch the order of the SD CARD list, tap
     MORE > Sort by size or Sort by date.
  - To reset your application preferences, tap MORE
     Reset app preferences. (When you Reset app preferences, you will not lose any app data.)
  - To uninstall more than one app, tap MORE > Uninstall multiple.
- Tap an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

### **Running Services**

View and control services running on your device.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications > Application manager.
- 3. Tap RUNNING.
- Tap SHOW CACHED PROCESSES to display all the cached processes that are running. Tap SHOW SERVICES IN USE to switch back.
- 5. Tap one of the applications to view application information. (Options vary by application.)
  - STOP: Stops the application from running on the device. This is usually done prior to uninstalling the application.
  - REPORT: Report failure and other application information.

**Warning**: Not all services can be stopped. Stopping services may have undesirable consequences on the application or Android System.

## **Default Applications**

Set and manage your default applications.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Applications > Default applications.
- 3. Tap **CLEAR** to remove a default.

## **Applications Settings Shortcuts**

Shortcuts to the settings for various apps are available in one convenient location.

From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings > Applications.

- Tap one of the following to display the settings for the selected app:
  - Calendar
  - Camera
  - Contacts
  - Email
  - Music
  - Weather

## Users

Share this tablet with multiple people by creating User accounts. Users have their own space, which they can customize with their own apps, wallpaper, and so on. Users can also adjust tablet settings like Wi-Fi which affect everyone.

**Note:** Restricted profiles allow only limited access to apps and content.

## Set Up User Profiles

Set up user profiles and then select one when unlocking the device to use personalized settings.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- 2. Tap Users.
- Tap Add user or profile and follow the instructions AFT
  to set up a new user profile.
   FOR INTERNAL USE ONLY

## Delete a User or Profile

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Users.
- 3. Tap To Delete next to a user profile to delete it.

**Note**: Only the device owner can delete other user accounts.

## Change User Profiles

Switch between users by sliding down the Notification Panel and tapping the **Users** icon. Then you can tap another user, add a user, or configure user settings.

## Location

Some apps, such as Google maps, may require one or more location services be turned on for full functionality.

## **Location Method**

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Location.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to enable Location services.
- Tap Locating method to select how your location is determined:
  - High accuracy: Use GPS, Wi-Fi, and mobile networks.
  - Power saving: Use Wi-Fi and mobile networks (no GPS).
  - GPS only: Use GPS only.

## **Recent Location Requests**

Apps that have requested your location are listed under Recent location requests.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Location.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to enable Location services.
- 3. Tap an entry to view the app's settings.

### **Location Services**

Google uses Location Reporting to store and use your device's most recent location data. Google apps, such as Google Maps, can use this data to improve your search results based on places that you have visited.

**Note**: A Google Account is required in order to use this feature.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Location.
- 2. Tap ON/OFF to enable Location services.
- 3. Tap Google Location Reporting for options:
  - Location Reporting: Allow Google apps to use your device's most recent location data.
  - Location History: Allow Google to store a history of your location data. Tap DELETE LOCATION HISTORY to permanently delete your location history.

# Lock Screen and Security

Choose settings for locking and unlocking your screen, as well as other security settings.

### Set a Screen Lock

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Screen lock to select a screen lock and level of security:
  - Swipe: Swipe the screen to unlock it. This option provides no security.
  - Pattern: A screen unlock pattern is a tap gesture you create and use to unlock your device. This option provides medium security.
  - PIN: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen. This option provides medium to high security.
  - Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen. This option provides high security.

- If choosing a secured lock screen option, select your notification settings:
  - Show content
  - Hide content
  - Do not show notifications

## Screen Lock Options

- Show information: Show the dual clock, or information such as the weather information, on the lock screen.
- Unlock effect: Set the visual effect used when unlocking the screen. (This option is available for Swipe only.)
- Secure lock settings: Set your secure lock functions such as Auto lock, Lock instantly with Power key, and Smart lock. (These options are available for Pattern, PIN, Password, and Fingerprint locks.)

**Note**: Options vary based on the screen lock type.

## Find My Mobile

Protect your device from loss or theft allowing your device to be locked, tracked, and for your data to be deleted remotely.

➤ To access your device remotely, visit findmymobile.samsung.com.

**Note**: You must sign up for a Samsung account and enable Google location service to use Find My Mobile.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Find My Mobile.
- Enter your Samsung account password, or if you are not logged in to your Samsung account, tap Add account and follow the prompts.
- 4. The following options are available:
  - Remote controls: Tap to activate or deactivate Remote controls, which allows you to access your device remotely.
  - Google location service: Tap to activate or deactivate Google location service. This service must be on in order to find your phone.

- SIM change alert: Prevent unauthorized changes to your SIM card by being alerted whenever an app or service attempts to change data on your SIM card.
- Reactivation lock: Use your Samsung account to stop anyone from reactivating you device without your permission.

#### **Unknown Sources**

Enable installation of non-Google Play applications.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Lock screen and security.
- 2. Tap Unknown sources to enable this option.

**Warning**: Enabling installation of third-party applications can cause your device and personal data to be more vulnerable to attacks by unknown sources.

## **Encrypt Your Data**

Require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your device each time you power it on or encrypt the data on a memory card (not included) each time it is connected.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings for the following options:
  - Encrypt device: Require a password to decrypt your device each time you turn it on.

 Encrypt external SD card: Tap to enable the encryption of SD card data, requiring a password to be entered each time the microSD card is connected.

**Note**: Make sure your battery is charged more than 80 percent. Encryption takes an hour or more.

## Set Up SIM Card Lock

To prevent another person from using your SIM card to make unauthorized calls or from accessing information stored on your SIM card, you can protect the information by using a PIN code. When enabled, your device asks for a PIN number each time you use the phone. Using this option you can also change your SIM PIN number.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Set up SIM card lock.
- Touch Lock SIM card, enter your SIM PIN code, then tap OK.

FNote: You must activate Lock SIM card before you can change your SIM PIN code.

#### View Passwords

Display password characters briefly as you type them.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings > Make passwords visible to turn the feature on.

## Security Update Service

Automatically receive security updates.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings for options:
  - Security policy updates: Automatically or manually check for security policy updates.
  - Send security reports: Send security reports to Samsung via Wi-Fi for threat analysis.

#### **Device Administration**

Manage your device administrators and application installation privileges.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings > Device administrators to add or remove device administrators.

## **Credential Storage**

Manage your security certificates. If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings for options:
  - Storage type: Select a storage location for credential contents.
  - View security certificates: Display certificates in your device's ROM and other certificates you have installed.
  - Install from phone storage: Install a new certificate from storage.
  - Clear credentials: Erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

## **Advanced Security**

Protect your device with these advanced security options.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings for options:
  - Trust agents: View or disable trusted agents.
     (This option is available only with secure locks, like PIN and password.)
  - Pin windows: Pin a specific app on your phone screen.
  - Usage data access: View which applications can access your device's usage history.
  - Notification access: View which applications can access your notifications.

**Note:** To view Trust agents and Smart Lock, set up a secured screen lock (like pin, password, or pattern). For more information, see <u>"Lock Screen and Security" on page 108</u>.

# **Privacy Settings**

Hide personal content from being accessed by anyone else using your device. Private mode is only available for certain applications.

**Note**: A secure screen lock (Pattern, PIN, Fingerprint, or Password) is required to use Private Mode.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Privacy > Private mode.
- 3. If prompted, set up a secure screen lock.
- 4. Tap the **ON/OFF** switch to enable Private mode.

## Accounts

Set up and manage accounts, including your Google Account, Samsung account, email, and social networking accounts.

Depending on the account, you can choose to synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of content.

## Add an Account

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Tap Add account.
- 3. Tap an account type.
- 4. Follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.

Synchronize Accounts

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Tap an account type.
- Tap an account to view the sync settings for that account.
  - · Check individual data items to sync.
  - If you wish to sync manually, tap MORE > Sync now.

**Note**: Settings and options differ by account type.

### **Delete an Account**

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings > Accounts.
- 2. Tap an account type.
- 3. Tap the account.
- 4. Tap MORE > Remove account.
- 5. At the prompt, tap **REMOVE ACCOUNT**.

## Language and Input

Configure your device's language and input device settings.

## Set Your Default Language

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Language and input > Language.
- 3. Select a language from the list.

# Select Your Default Keyboard or Input Method

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- Tap Language and input > Default keyboard and select a keyboard.

**Note**: Additional keyboards can be downloaded from the Google Play store.

## Samsung Keyboard Settings

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- Tap Language and input > Samsung keyboard for the following menus:
  - Input languages: Select the keyboard language.
  - Smart typing: Configure smart features available on the Samsung keyboard, such as predictive text, auto correction, and swipe entry.
  - Key-tap feedback: Configure feedback features for the Samsung keyboard.
  - Other settings: Change other settings such as the keyboard size, or reset settings for the Samsung keyboard.

## Google Voice Typing Settings

Speak rather than type your text entries using Google Voice Typing.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Language and input.
- Tap the checkbox next to Google voice typing to enable it.
- 4. Tap Google voice typing for options:
  - Choose input languages: Select languages for Google voice typing.
  - Block offensive words: Hide words many people find offensive are in results of Google voice searches. Offensive words are replaced in results with a placeholder (####).
  - Offline speech recognition: Download and install speech recognition engines, allowing you to use voice input while not connected to the network

## Voice Input

Use Google voice recognition to perform Google searches.

To perform a voice search, tap  $\P$  in the Google search bar or widget. Or say "**OK Google**" to launch a Google search (if the hotword detection option is enabled).

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > @ Settings.
- 2. Tap Language and input > Voice input for options.
  - Tap Enhanced Google services for full voice interaction.
  - Tap Basic Google recognition for simple voice recognition.
- 3. Tap **Settings** beside the service to customize.

## Text-To-Speech Options

Configure your text-to-speech options.

- From a Home screen, tap ## Apps > Settings.
- Tap Language and input > Text-to-speech options:
  - Tap Settings next to the Samsung text-to-speech engine for options.
  - Speech rate: Set the speed at which the text is spoken.
  - Listen to an example: Play a sample of speech synthesis (available if voice data is installed).
  - Default language status: Display the default language in use.

## Mouse/Trackpad Settings

Configure settings for using an optional mouse or trackpad (not included).

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Language and input > Pointer speed.
- Touch and drag the slider to set the speed of the pointer.

## Backup and Reset

Back up your data to Google servers. You can also reset your device to its factory defaults.

## **Backup and Restore**

Enable backup of your information to Google servers.

  - Backup account: Select a Google Account to be used as your backup account.
  - Back up my data: Enable back up of application data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to Google servers.
  - Automatic restore: Enable automatic restoration of settings from Google servers. When enabled, backed-up settings are restored when you reinstall an application.

## **Factory Data Reset**

Return your device to its factory defaults.

**Warning:** This action permanently erases ALL data from the device, including Google or other account settings, system and application data and settings, downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files.

- 2. Tap Backup and reset > Factory data reset.

## Reset Your System Settings

Reset your system settings back to their defaults.

- Tap RESET SETTINGS and follow the prompts to perform the reset.

## Date and Time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network.

When you are outside network coverage, you may want to set date and time information manually using the Date and time settings.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Date and time.
  - Automatic date and time: Tap the checkbox to use the time on the mobile and/or Wi-Fi network.
     If this option is checked, you cannot manually set the date and time
  - Automatic time zone: Tap the checkbox to use the time zone detected on the mobile and/ or Wi-Fi network. If this option is checked, you RAFT cannot manually set the time zone; OR INTERNAL USE ONLY.

- Set date: Tap to manually set the date. This
  option is locked if Automatic date and time is
  enabled.
- Set time: Tap to manually set the time. This
  option is locked if Automatic date and time is
  enabled.
- Select time zone: Tap to manually set the time zone. This option is locked if Automatic time zone is enabled.
- Use 24-hour format: Tap to use 24-hour format (as opposed to 12-hour with AM and PM).
- Select date format: Tap to choose your preferred date format.

## Accessibility

Accessibility services are special features that make using the device easier for those with certain physical disabilities.

**Note**: You can download additional accessibility applications from the Google Play store.

- From a Home screen, tap ### Apps > 
   Settings.
- 2. Tap Accessibility for options:

#### Vision

- Voice Assistant: Speak feedback aloud to help blind and low-vision users.
  - Voice Assistant can collect all of the text you enter, except passwords, including personal data and credit card numbers. It may also log your user interface interactions with the device.

- You can turn on Voice Assistant from any screen by pressing the Home key quickly three times (triple-press).
- Voice Assistant help: Tap for help on using Voice Assistant.
- Dark screen: Keep the screen turned off at all times for privacy.
- Rapid key input: Release your finger to enter selection instead of double tapping.
- Speak passwords: Read the characters aloud as you enter your passwords.
- Font size: Set the font size.
- Magnification gestures: Use exaggerated gestures such as triple-tapping, double pinching, and dragging two fingers across the screen.
- Magnifier window: Magnify content shown on the screen.
- Grayscale: Change all colors to gray.

- Negative colors: Reverse the display of onscreen colors from White text on a Black background to Black text on a White background.
- Color adjustment: Adjust the color of the screen if you are color blind or have difficulty reading the display because of the screen color. Tap Color adjustment for options.
- Accessibility shortcut: Quickly enable accessibility features in two quick steps.
- Text-to-speech options: Set your preferred TTS engine and options. For more information, see "Accessibility" on page 122.

#### Hearing

- Turn off all sounds: Turn off all sounds including receiver voice.
- Samsung subtitles (CC): Use Samsung subtitles with multimedia files when available Tap Samsung subtitles (CC) for options.
- Google subtitles (CC): Use Google subtitles with multimedia files when available. Tap Google subtitles (CC) for options.

- Left and right sound balance: Use the slider to set the Left and Right balance when using a stereo device.
- Mono audio: Switch audio from stereo to mono for use with one earphone.
- Auto haptic: The device will vibrate in time to the sound when listening to music, watching videos, or playing games.

#### **Dexterity and Interaction**

- Universal switch: Control your phone with your customized switches.
- Assistant menu: Improve the device accessibility for users with reduced dexterity.
- Touch and hold delay: Select a time interval for this action.
- Interaction control: Enable motions and screen timeout. You can also block areas of the screen from tap interaction.

#### More Settings

- Direction lock: Unlock the screen by swiping in a series of four to eight directions.
- Direct access: Open your accessibility settings by pressing the Home Key three times in quick succession.
- Notification reminder: Beep at set intervals to remind you of any unread notifications.
- Single tap mode: Tap to stop/snooze alarms and calendar events.
- Manage accessibility: Export your accessibility settings and share them with another device.

#### Services

Additional accessibility apps may be downloaded from the Google Play store. Certain accessibility services you install may be configured here.

  - Icon glossary: View information about the status icons and notification icons used on the Status bar.
  - Status: View the status of the battery, network, and other information.
  - Legal information: Display open source licenses, Google legal information, and Samsung legal information.
  - Device name: View and change your device's name.

 Additional device information includes the Model number, Android version, Kernel version, Build number, SE for Android status, Hardware version, Security software version, and more.

# Use System updates to update your device's software.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap System updates.
- Tap Check for new system update to check for available software updates to download and install.
