Getting Started With PCS Service

Determine if Your Phone is Already Activated

If you received your phone in the mail or purchased it at a Sprint Store, it probably has already been activated. All you need to do is unlock your phone.

If your phone is not activated, please refer to the Start Here Guide included with your phone.

Unlocking Your Phone

Follow these steps to unlock your phone:

- **1**. Press and hold for a few seconds to turn the phone on.
- 2. Highlight **Unlock** and press 🔩.
- **3**. Enter your four-digit lock code. For security purposes, the code is not visible as you type.

Note: To select a softkey, press the softkey button directly below the Voicemail Notification softkey text, which appears at the bottom left and bottom right of your phone's display screen. Softkey actions change according to the screen you're viewing and will not appear if there is no corresponding action available.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or PCS Phone Number or try 0000. If none of these work, call PCS Customer SolutionsSM at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

Activating Your Phone

To activate your phone, follow the directions in the Start Here Guide included with your phone. You can also visit http:// activate.sprintpcs.com and activate your phone online.

Setting Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your PCS Phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your PCS Phone is activated.

To set up voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold .
- 2. Follow the system prompts to create your passcode, record your greeting, record your name announcement, and choose whether to activate One-Touch Message Access (a feature that lets you access messages simply by pressing and holding , by passing the need for you to enter your passcode).

Note: The voicemail setup process may vary in certain Affiliate areas.



V our PCS Phone is packed with features that simplify your life and **L** expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. This section will guide you through the basic functions and calling features of your phone.

Front View of Phone



Key Functions

- **1. Speaker**: The speaker allows you to hear the other caller and the different ring tones and sounds offered by your phone.
- **2. Signal Strength Indicator**: This icon represents the signal strength by displaying bars. The more bars displayed, the better the signal strength.
- **3. Display Screen**: The display screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
- Headset Jack: (located on the left side of the phone.) Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe and convenient hands-free conversations.
- 5. **OK/Voicemail Key**: Pressing when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in the menu. Pressing for two seconds automatically dials your voicemail
- 6. Navigation Key: This key allows you to scroll through the phone menu options, and provides a shortcut to phone functions from Standby Mode.
- 7. Volume Keys: Allows you to adjust the call ringer volume in Standby mode (with the flip open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume keys can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the Volume Key up or down.
- **8. TALK**: Place or receive a call. In Standby mode, press the key once to access the Outgoing call log. If you press and hold the key down you will initiate Voice Recognition feature.
- Numeric Keypad: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.
- **10.Shift/Asterisk**: Enters the asterisk [*] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type.
- **11.Accessory Interface Connector**: This connector is used to connect any available accessory cables to your phone.
- **12.Power Interface Connector**: The power interface connector is used to plug in the charging accessories.

- **13.Microphone**: The Microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- **14.Space/Pound**: Enters the pound [#] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to enter a space.
- **15.BACK**: Deletes characters from the display. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu. This key also allows you to return to the previous screen in the PCS Wireless Web browser.
- **16.END**: Ends a call. Press and hold this key for a few seconds to turn your phone On or Off. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to Standby mode and cancels your input.
- **17.MENU Key**: Displays the first level or Main Menu of options. Press again to view the next menu page.
- **18.Ringer Indicator**: This icon indicates that a ringer is set.
- **19.Battery Indicator**: The battery indicator displays the amount of remaining battery charge currently available in your phone. When all bars are displayed in the battery icon, the phone's battery is fully charged. When they are not displayed, the phone's battery is completely discharged or empty.
- **20.Position Location**: This icon indicates that the position location is active.

Viewing the Display Screen

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.



▶ displays your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.



▶ means your phone cannot find a signal.



tells you a call is in progress.



▶ indicates you have voicemail, text, numeric pages, or PCS Web Alert messages waiting. Press briefly to see a list of pending messages or press and hold to dial voicemail box.



▶ indicates that 3G functionality is active.



▶ indicates that 3G functionality is dormant or inactive.



▶ indicates that you are receiving information



▶ indicates that you are sending information.



▶ indicates your phone is in vibrate mode.



► shows your current battery charge strength. (Icon shown fully charged.)



▶ indicates that position location is active.



▶ indicates that position location is inactive.



▶ indicates that TTY option is On.



▶ indicates that your phone is roaming



indicates that your phone is in security mode.



▶ indicates that an alarm is set on your phone.



► indicates that the ringer is set at a level between 1-8 or 1-Beep is selected.



► Indicates that the ringer is turned Off



indicates that something has been downloaded to your phone.

Tip: Display indicators let you know when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and whether you're operating in digital or analog mode.

Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

Turning Your Phone ON

■ Press for approximately two seconds to turn your phone On.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Searching for Service" or "Entering PCS Service" which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters Standby mode — the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to Standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for PCS Service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

Turning Your Phone OFF

■ Press for two seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using the Battery

Battery Capacity

Your PCS Phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (LiIon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The battery provides approximately [xx] hours of continuous digital talk time ([xx] hours in analog) or approximately [xx] hours of continuous digital standby time ([xx] hours in analog).

When the battery reaches [xx]% of its capacity, the battery icon blinks. When there are approximately two minutes of talk time left, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.


Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Installing the Battery

Your PCS Phone comes with a LiIon battery. Follow these steps to install it:

- 1. Place the battery so that the tabs on the end align with the slots at the bottom of the phone.
- **2.** Press the battery down until it clicks into place. Make sure that the battery is properly installed before switching the phone on.



Removing the Battery

To remove your battery, follow these easy steps:

- **2**. Pull the battery lock above the battery toward the top of the phone and hold it in that position.
- 3. Lift the battery away, as shown.



Charging the Battery

Your PCS Phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Sprint-approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Using the Desktop Charger

To use the desktop charger provided with your phone:

- 1. Plug the round end of the AC adapter into the charger holder and the other end into the electrical outlet.
- **2**. Insert the phone (with the battery installed) into the slot.
- A **red light** on the charger lets you know the battery is charging.
- A **green light** indicates that the battery is at least 90 percent charged.
- A **yellow light** indicates that there is a problem charging the phone.

It takes approximately 4 hours to fully recharge a completely rundown battery. With the Sprint-approved LiIon battery, you can recharge the battery before it becomes completely run down.

If a Travel Charger is used to charge the battery, multi-colored lights are displayed when the flip is closed. Red, Green, and blue lights are cycled during the charging process. When the battery is completely charged, all lights are displayed continuously.

Using the Travel Adapter

The travel adapter allows you to use the phone while the battery is charging, but this causes the phone to charge more slowly.

1. With the battery in position on the phone, plug the connector of the travel adapter into the jack at the bottom of the phone.



2. Plug the adapter into a standard AC wall outlet.

When charging is finished, unplug the adapter from the power outlet and from the phone by pressing the grey tabs on both sides of the connector and pulling the connector out.



Note: You must unplug the adapter before removing the battery from the phone during charging; otherwise, the phone could be damaged.

Displaying Your Phone Number

Just in case you forget your phone number, your PCS Phone can remind you.

To display your phone number:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press (2AEC) for **Phone Book**.
- 3. Press for My Phone #.

Making and Answering Calls

Making Calls

Your PCS Phone offers many different ways to make calls, including PCS Voice Command SM (page 127), Speed Dialing (page 21) and using Call History (page 58).

To make a call using your keypad:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- 2. Enter a phone number. If you make a mistake while dialing, press to erase one digit at a time. Or, press and hold to erase the entire number.
- 3. Press Mer.
- **4**. When you're finished, close the flip or press (2009).

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press wice.

Tip: When making calls off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, always dial using 11 digits (1 + area code + phone number).

Answering Calls

- 1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail).
- 2. Press we to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any digit.)

Your PCS Phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- ► The phone rings or vibrates.
- ► The LED flashes.
- ► The backlight illuminates.
- ▶ The screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- ▶ If the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed. To select an option, press the corresponding softkey button.

- ▶ **Quiet** to mute the ringer.
- ▶ **Ignore** to send the call to your voicemail box.

Answering a Roam Call With Call Guard Enabled

To answer a call when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled:

■ Select Answer to answer the call. (See "Call Guard" on page 48 for additional information.)

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

Ending a Call

To disconnect a call when you are finished:

■ Close the phone or press 🕬.

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Call Info is displayed on your screen.

To call a Missed Call entry:

- 1. Highlight the entry and press 🔊.
- 2. Press to dial the phone number.

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial 🖭 👊) and press 🛶, even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Using One/Two/Three Touch Speed Dialing

With this feature, you can automatically call Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 1-9, two key presses for locations 10-99, or three key presses for locations 100-300.

To use **One-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 1-9:

► Press and hold the appropriate key for a few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Calling."

To use **Two-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press and hold the second digit for a few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Calling."

To use **Three-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 100-300:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press the second digit.
- **3.** Press and hold the third digit for a few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Calling."

Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you enter numbers using the keypad. To select an option press and the number on the keypad that corresponds with the desired choice.

- ► (1) Talk is used to dial the phone number. (If you are roaming and have the Call Guard feature activated, you must then press To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On" on page 49.
- ► (2) Save to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 64.
- ▶ (3) Find is used to locate and display Internal Phone Book entries that contain the numbers entered. See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 64.
- ▶ (4) Hard Pause is used to insert a hard pause.
- ▶ (5) **2sec Pause** to insert a 2-second pause.

In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options in addition to the main menu.

To select an option, highlight it and press (%).

- ▶ (1) Mute or UnMute Select Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select **Unmute** to reactivate the microphone.
- ▶ (2) Call History checks your call log for outgoing, incoming, and missed calls. You can also erase the logs from this menu.
- ▶ (3) **Phone Book** accesses the Phone Book menu options.
- ▶ (4) 3-Way Call allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Making a Three-Way Call" on page 99.)
- ▶ (5) **Messaging** allows you to check for voicemail and notifications.
- ▶ (6) **Voice Memo** allows you to record the current conversation. For more information, see "To record the person at the other end of a call:" on page 89.
- ▶ (7) **Tools** accesses the Tools menu options.
- ▶ **(8) Phone Info** displays the hardware/software version, Vision Username, and PRL being used.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Internal Phone Book, the phone number, the duration of the call and the following menu options are displayed for 10 seconds. During this time you can press of to add this number to your internal phone book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 23.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown, No ID, or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number

Your PCS Phone can store up to five phone numbers in each of 99 Internal Phone Book entries. Each entry's name can contain 20 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Internal Phone Book entries alphabetically.

To save a number from Standby mode:

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press For Save.
- 3. Select Add New Entry.
- 4. Select a label and press (%).
- 5. Enter a name for the new entry and press
- **6.** Press of to save.
- 7. Highlight **Yes** using the navigation key and press of to confirm.

Finding a Phone Number

You can search Internal Phone Book entries for phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.

To find a phone number:

- **1.** Enter one to three digits and press [MENO].
- 2. Press 4 for Find.

Note: If you enter more than three digits, press of for Find.



- 3. A list of possible matches is displayed. Select the desired entry and press 🛼.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a hard pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a 2-second pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses. To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter the phone number.
- 2. Press Inenu.
- **3**. Select **Hard Pause** or **2sec Pause**. Hard pauses are displayed as a "P" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 4. Enter additional numbers.
- 5. Press to dial the number or Press for **Save** to save the number in your Internal Phone Book.

When dialing a number with a hard pause, select **Talk** to send the next set of numbers.

Dialing From the Internal Phone Book

To dial directly from an Internal Phone Book entry:

- ▶ **Downloaded** are ringers that have been downloaded right to your phone. (See "Downloading Ringers, Screen Savers and Games" on page 113 and "Ringers" on page 116.)
- ► **Single Tones** include a variety of mono-tone ringers.

Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls

Your PCS Phone provides a variety of ringer options which allow you to customize your ring and volume settings.

To select a ringer type for voice calls so you recognize when a certain type of call is coming in by the ringer:

Silence Mode

When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Games, Notepad, Voice Memos, etc., while you are in Airplane Mode.

To set your phone to Airplane Mode:

TTY Use With PCS Service From Sprint

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone), is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

When establishing your PCS Service, please call PCS Customer SolutionsSM via the state Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) by first dialing . Then provide the state TRS with this number: 866-727-4889.

To turn TTY Mode on or off:

Note: If TTY Mode is enabled, the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack may be impaired.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: 911 Emergency Calling

Sprint recommends that TTY users make emergency calls by other means including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs) rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

Accessing the Security Menu

- 5. The security menu is displayed.

Locking or Unlocking Your Phone

When your phone is locked, you can only receive incoming calls or make calls to 911, PCS Customer Solutions, or special numbers.

Enable/Disable Vision

You can sign in or out of PCS Vision services without turning off your phone; however you will not have access to all PCS Vision services, including Web and messaging if you disable vision. Signing out will avoid any charges associated with PCS Vision services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time.

Roaming is the ability to make or receive calls when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. Your new dual band/tri mode PCS Phone works anywhere on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and allows you to roam on other networks where we've implemented roaming agreements with other carriers and in limited areas where 1900 MHz digital networks are available.

This section explains how roaming works as well as special features that let you manage your roaming experience.

Understanding Roaming

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and whether your phone is operating in analog or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

Roaming Indicator

Sprint Nationwide PCS Network

Other Digital Networks



Tip: Remember, when you are using your phone off the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, always dial numbers using 11 digits (1 + area code + number).

Note: You will pay a higher per-minute rate for roaming calls.

Roaming on Other Digital Networks

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. You may not be able to access certain features, such as PCS Vision.

Roaming on Analog Networks

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some features, such as PCS Vision and PCS Voice Command, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls and access voicemail. You will experience a few differences:

- ➤ You are more likely to experience static, cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- ➤ Some features which are standard on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, such as call waiting, PCS Vision, and direct international dialing, are unavailable.
- ➤ Though callers can leave voicemail messages while you are roaming, you will not receive notification until you return to the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. While roaming, you can periodically check your voicemail for new messages by dialing 1+area code+your PCS Phone Number. Press when you hear your greeting and enter your passcode at the prompt.
- ► There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- ➤ Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and enter an area where roaming is available (whether digital or analog), your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think PCS Service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

Note: When using your phone in analog mode, the handset may feel warm. This behavior is normal for analog operation.

Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode

Your PCS Phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

Set Mode

Choose from three different settings on your phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for **Settings**.
- 3. Press for **Others**.
- 4. Press for **Roaming**.
- 5. Press for **Set Mode**.
- **6**. To select an option, highlight it and press .
 - **Automatic**: This setting seeks PCS Service. When PCS Service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
 - **Analog**: This setting forces the phone to seek an analog roaming system. The previous setting (Sprint Only or Automatic) is restored the next time the phone is turned on.
 - Sprint PCS: This setting allows you to access the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network only and prevents roaming on other networks.

Controlling Roaming Charges Using Call Guard

In addition to the roaming icon, Call Guard alerts you when roaming charges apply. This feature makes it easy to manage your roaming charges by reminding you when you make or receive roaming calls. It also requires you to take an additional step before placing or answering a roaming call. This additional step is not required when you make or receive calls while on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

To Turn Call Guard On or Off:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press For Settings.
- 3. Press for **Others**.
- 4. Press for Roaming.
- 5. Press for **Call Guard**. Wait briefly until a message prompt displays and then disappears from the display screen.
- **6**. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off**.
- 7. Press 🕦 to save.
 - If active, an extra step is required to make or take roaming calls.
 - If inactive, no extra step is required to make or take roaming calls.

Note: Voice Dialing and Speed Dialing are not available when you are roaming with Call Guard enabled.

To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

- 1. From Standby mode, dial 1 + area code + the seven-digit number and press (You can also initiate a call from the Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging.)
- **2.** A message is displayed indicating that roaming rate applies. Press to place the call.

To Answer Incoming Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

- 1. Press or open the flip to answer the incoming call.
- 2. A message is displayed notifying you that roaming charges apply. Press to accept and answer the call.

Remember if the Call Guard feature is set to **On**, you need to take extra steps to make and receive roaming calls even if you have selected the **Analog** setting (see page 46).

The Call History keeps track of incoming calls, calls made from your PCS Phone, and missed calls. This section guides you through accessing and making the most of your Call History.

Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Internal Phone Book entries) for calls you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Internal Phone Book entry name (if the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book). Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list.

To view a Call History entry:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for **Call History**.
 - Press for Missed Calls
 - Press 2 for Outgoing Calls
 - Press (3^{out}) for **Incoming Calls**

Call History Options

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press . This feature displays the time and date of the call and, by pressing , gives you the option of selecting:

- ► Talk
- ► Save
- Prepend

Tip: You can also view the next Call History entry by pressing the navigation key right or view the previous entry by pressing the navigation key left.

Making a Call From Call History

To place a call from Call History:

To save a phone number from Call History:

- 3. Highlight the desired entry in the **Missed**, **Outgoing**, or **Incoming** call history and press .
- 4. Press were to save the number.

After you have saved the number, the new Internal Phone Book entry is displayed. (See "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 61)

Note: You cannot save phone numbers already in your Internal Phone Book or from calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Prepending a Phone Number From Call History

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by following these steps:

- 2. Press to for Call History.
- 3. Highlight the desired entry in the **Missed**, **Outgoing**, or **Incoming** call history and press .
- **4.** Press we got to prepend the number.

- ▶ **Edit** allows you to modify or add information to the entry.

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your PCS Phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the T9 Word mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 61.)

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press one to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press .

If you make a mistake, press back to erase a single character. Press and hold back to delete an entire entry.

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the Alpha mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 61). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

- 2. Press for **Tools**.
- 3. Press For Memo Pad.
- **4.** If there are no existing memo's, the New Memo screen is automatically displayed. If there is a memo already saved, press for **Add New**.
- 5. Enter up to 64 characters in the memo and press (to **Save**.

To read a saved note:

- 1. Press of Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Tools.
- 3. Press of Memo Pad.
- 4. Highlight the desired memo using the navigation key and press to view.

To erase saved notes:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for **Tools**.
- 3. Press For Memo Pad.
- 4. Highlight the desired memo using the navigation key and press for **Erase** or for **Erase** All.
- 5. Select **Yes** and press to confirm the deletion.

Viewing the World Time

World Time displays what time it is in twenty-four different time zones around the world together with one or more major cities, states, regions, or countries in a time zone.

To access world time:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Tools.
- 3. Press for World Time.
- **4.** Press the navigation key left, right, up, or down to display the different time zones.
- 5. Press , to turn **DST** (Daylight Savings Time) On or Off.
- **6.** Press to save.

Using the Countdown Timer

Countdown allows you to enter a future date and time into the phone and then see the amount of days, hours, and minutes until that time is reached.

To setup a new countdown:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 6 for **Tools**.
- 3. Press for Countdown.
- 4. If there are no existing countdowns, the New Countdown screen is automatically displayed. If there is already a countdown entered, press [...], [...] for **Add New**.

5. Enter a name using the keypad and press .

6. Enter the time and date you want to countdown from and press to save.

To view a countdown:

1. Press for Main Menu.

2. Press for **Tools**.

3. Press general for **Countdown**.

4. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the desired countdown and press .

To erase a countdown timer:

1. Press for Main Menu

2. Press for **Tools**.

3. Press g for Countdown.

4. A list of the countdown timers are displayd.

5. Scroll to a task you want to erase and press

6. Press of for Erase or for Erase All.

7. Highlights **Yes** using the navigation key and press 🖳 to save.

Tip: When viewing an existing countdown, press the navigation key left or right to cycle between the other countdown entries.

Note: No audible alert is sounded when the countdown is reached.

Setting Time

Your phone keeps the time and date directly from the Sprint PCS system while inside the Sprint PCS Service Area. If you roam outside of the Sprint PCS Service Area, or turn your phone on in an analog roaming area, you'll need to set the time manually.

To setup time:

1. Press for Main Menu.

2. Press for Tools.

3. Press ONEST for **Set Time**.

4. Enter the time you want to set using the keypad. Press and for PM.

5. Enter the date and year you want to set using the keypad.

6. Press to save.

Using Your Phone's Voice Services

In This Section

This section explains the features associated with your phone's Voice Services. The easy-to-follow instructions explain how to use voiceactivated dialing and how to record and manage voice memos.

Activating Voice Recognition

Voice recognition allows you to say commands to perform common functions supported by your phone. There is no voice training required to use the voice recognition feature. You simply say the pre-designated command displayed on your screen in a normal tone of voice to perform the desired function.

To activate voice recognition:

- 1. Press the navigation key left.
- 2. The phone prompts you to say a voice command. Wait for the beep and then say one of the following commands:
 - Digit Dial
 - Name Dial
 - Play Games
 - Voice Memo
 - Phonebook
 - Browser

When it recognizes one of these commands, the phone launches the associated application. If the phone does not hear a command within approximately eight seconds, it de-activates voice recognition without taking any action.

Note: If you want to use a different button to activate voice recognition, press 🔊 🐼 🖅 for **Launch Pad**. On this menu, you can change button assignments, including the button used to launch "Voice Dial," which is the voice recognition application.

Digit Dial

Digit Dial allows you dial any valid 7 or 10 digit North American phone number by speaking the number naturally, without pausing between the digits.

Tips for using Digit Dial:

- ▶ "Digit Dial works best in quieter environments.
- ▶ "When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly. There is no need to pause between digits.

- ➤ "The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead, say "one-eight-zero-zero."
- ▶ "The phone recognizes only valid 7 or 10 digit North American phone numbers.
- ➤ "If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using Digit Dial, try adapting Digit Dial to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers. See the section "Adapting Digit Dial" for details.

To place a call using Digit Dial:

- 1. Activate voice recognition by pressing the navigation key left. The phone prompts you for a command.
- 2. Say **Digit Dial**. The phone prompts you to say the number.
- **3.** Say a valid 7 or 10 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.

Note: If desired, you can say the number "1" before the number. This is not required, the call is made both ways.

- 4. If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say "**Yes**." You can also select the correct number from those displayed on the screen by pressing on the correct number. The phone will then dial the number.
- 5. If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say "No." If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List, and then press of to dial.

Note: In some cases, the phone might ask you to repeat a number. Make sure that the number is a valid 7 or 10 digit North American phone number, and then say the number again. If the number isn't valid, or if the phone still doesn't understand the number on the second try, it will not place a call.

Enabling/Disabling Digit Dial Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Digit Dial feature displays the list of top voice recognition choices or automatically dials the first number, without displaying a choice list.

To enable or disable choice lists for Digit Dial:

- 1. Press for **Settings**.
- 2. Press for Voice Dial.
- 3. Press for Choice List.
- 4. Press for **Digit Dial**.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Yes** or **No** and press \mathcal{O}_{N_0} .

Adapting Digit Dial

Digit Dial works well for most people without any special adaptation. However, if you speak with a strong accent or unique voice, you may obtain better results by adapting the system to better match your voice.

After you adapt Digit Dial, your phone will be customized to your voice. Other people will not be able to use Digit Dial on your phone unless they reset the phone to factory defaults.

Important: ONLY adapt Digit Dial if the system is frequently misrecognizing your speech. You can always restore the system to its original factory setting. Adaptation involves recording several digit sequences to teach the system your voice. The adaptation process takes about 3 minutes.

Tips for adapting Digit Dial:

- ► Adapt digits in a quiet place.
- ▶ Make sure you wait for the beep before starting to speak.
- ► Speak clearly, and say each digit distinctly.
- ▶ If you make a mistake while recording a sequence of digits, or if there is an unexpected noise that spoils the recording, re-record that sequence.

To adapt Digit Dial to your voice:

- 1. Press for **Settings**.
- 2. Press (4 or Voice Dial.
- 3. Press for Adapt Digits.
- 4. The phone displays the first digit sequence. When you are ready to start recording, press . The phone prompts you to say the first sequence of digits.
- 5. Wait for the beep, and then repeat the digits using a normal tone of voice. The phone plays back your recording and asks you if the recording sounds "OK."
- **6**. If the recording sounds ok (no mistakes, and no background noises), say "Yes." If you need to re-record the digits to fix any problems, say "No." The phone then prompts you to say the digits again. Wait for the beep, and then record the digits again. Repeat this step until you are satisfied with the recording.
- 7. After confirming that the recording sounds ok, repeat the recording process with the next set of digits. After six sets of digits, the phone will ask you whether you want to do more adaptation. Answer "Yes."
- 8. Repeat steps 4-8 for another six sets of digits. After the sixth set of digits, the phone indicates that adaptation is complete.

Resetting Digit Dial Adaptation

To erase any adaptation and reset Digit Dial to its original state:

- 1. Press for **Settings**.
- 2. Press 4 for Voice Dial.
- 3. Press 2 for **Reset Digits**.
- 4. Highlight **Yes** using the navigation key and press 🔩

Using Name Dial

Name Dial automatically voice-actives every contact in your Phonebook without the need to record or "train" names before using them. With Name Dial you can dial any person in your Phonebook by saying that person's name.

To place a call using Name Dial:

- 1. Activate voice recognition by pressing the navigation key left. The phone prompts you for a command.
- 2. Say Name Dial. The phone prompts you to say a name.
- 3. Say the full name of the person you want to call, exactly as it is entered in your Phonebook. The phone plays the name through the earpiece and displays it on the screen. If the Phonebook contains only one number for the name, the phone automatically dials that number.
- 4. If the name that you spoke has more than one number associated with it, the phone displays the different locations (home, work, etc.) and asks you which one to dial. Say one of the following locations:
 - Home
 - Work
 - Mobile
 - Pager
 - Fax
- 5. The phone dials the number for the location you specified.

Enabling/Disabling Name Dial Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Name Dial feature displays a list of choices for names that sound alike, or brings up information for the first recognized name, without displaying a choice list.

To enable or disable choice lists for Name Dial:

- 1. Press for **Settings**.
- 2. Press for Voice Dial.
- 3. Press for Choice List.
- 4. Press (2ABC) for Name Dial.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Yes** or **No** and press $\frac{\log_2}{\log_2}$.

When choice lists are enabled for Name Dial, after you say the name, the phone will display one or more names on the screen and prompt you to confirm the name you spoke.

"If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by the correct name, say "Yes."

"If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say "No." The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found," and will not place a call.

You can also choose a name from the choice list manually. Use the Launch Pad up and down buttons to highlight the name, and then press to select it.

Using Name Lookup

Name Lookup lets you retrieve contact information for any person in your Phonebook by saying the full name of the person.

To retrieve information using Name Lookup:

- **1.** Activate voice recognition by pressing the navigation key left. The phone prompts you for a command.
- **2**. Say **Phonebook**. The phone prompts you to say the name.
- **3**. Say the full name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Phonebook. The phone plays the name it recognized through the earpiece, and then opens the contact information for that name.

Enabling/Disabling Name Lookup Choice List

You can customize whether the Name Lookup feature displays a list of choices for names that sound alike, or brings up information for the first recognized name, without displaying a choice list.

To enable or disable choice lists for Name Lookup:

- 1. Press for **Settings**.
- 2. Press for Voice Dial.
- 3. Press for Choice List.
- 4. Press g for Name Lookup.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Yes** or **No** and press .

When choice lists are enabled for Name Lookup, after you say the name, the phone will display one or more names on the screen and prompt you to confirm the name you spoke.

"If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by the correct name, say "Yes."

"If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say "No." The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."

You can also choose a name from the choice list manually. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the name, and then press to select it.

Recording Memos

You can use your phone to record memos that you can listen to later. You can record yourself speaking into the phone's built-in microphone, or record the person at the other end of a phone call.

Note: You can store up to 10 minutes of memos at a time, in up to 10 separate memos. Individual memos can be up to 60 seconds long.

To record a memo using the phone's built-in microphone:

- 1. Press for **Tools**.
- 2. Press for Voice Memo.
- 3. Press of for **Record**. The phone prompts you to start recording after the beep.
- **4.** Wait for the beep and then start speaking. As it is recording, the phone displays a countdown timer that shows how many seconds are left for recording.
- **5.** To pause the memo, press again to resume recording.
- **6.** To finish recording, press (%).

When you have finished recording, the phone offers you the option of reviewing the memo, re-recording the memo, saving it, or quitting without saving the memo.

- To listen to the memo again, select **Review** and press ...
- To discard the current recording and make a new one, select **Rerecord** and press 🐔.
- To save the memo and return to the home screen, select **Save** and press . The phone prompts you to enter a name for the memo. Enter a name. Use the Menu to enter letters, numbers, or symbols. When you are done, press .
- To quit the memo feature without saving the memo, select **Quit** and press \bigcirc .

To record the person during a call:

- When you have established a connection and have a caller on the line, press the navigation key right to begin recording. As it is recording, the phone displays a countdown timer that shows how many seconds are left for recording.
- 2. To pause the memo, press . When a memo is paused, press again to resume recording.
- 3. To finish recording the memo, press ().

Reviewing and Erasing Memos

To review (replay) a memo you have recorded earlier:

- 1. Press for **Tools**.
- 2. Press for Voice Memo.
- 3. Press (2) for **Review**. The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.
- 4. Select a memo and press , or press the number corresponding to the memo you want to review. The phone replays the memo. To pause the memo during replay, press , Press again to resume replaying the memo.

To erase an individual memo:

- 1. Follow the steps above to display the list of saved memos.
- **2**. Select the memo to erase.
- 3. Press for Erase.
- 4. Press 🖳
- 5. Highlight \mathbf{Yes} using the navigation key and press \bigcirc to confirm.

To erase all existing voice memos in a single step:

- 1. Press for **Tools**.
- 2. Press for Voice Memo.
- 3. Press (3) for **Erase All**. The phone asks you if you want to erase all voice memos.
- 4. Select **Yes** and press

 \pmb{N} ow that you've mastered your phone's fundamentals, it's time to explore the calling features that enhance your PCS Service.

Using Voicemail

Setting Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your PCS Phone are automatically trandferred to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your PCS Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your PCS Phone is activated.

To set up voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold .
- 2. Follow the system prompts to create your passcode, record your greeting, record your name announcement, and choose whether to activate One-Touch Message Access (a feature that lets you press one key to access messages and bypasses the need for you to enter your passcode).

Note: The voicemail setup process may vary in certain Affiliate areas.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your PCS Phone alerts you:

- ▶ By displaying a message on the screen.
- ▶ By sounding the assigned righer type.
- ▶ By the LED blinking red.
- ▶ By displaying **≥** at the top of your screen.

New Voicemail Message Alerts

When you receive a new voice message, your phone alerts you and prompts you to call your voicemail. To call your voicemail, press and hold . To display your Missed Log, press . , , , , .

Important: When you are roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your voicemail by dialing 1+ area code + your PCS Phone Number. When your voicemail answers, press and enter your passcode. You will be charged roaming rates when accessing voicemail while roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

Note: Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and you are in a PCS Service Area.

Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

You can review your messages directly from your PCS Phone or from any other touch-tone phone. To dial from your PCS Phone, you can either speed dial your voicemail or use the menu keys.

Using One-Touch Message Access:

■ Press and hold 🔊. Follow the system prompts.

Using the Menu Keys on Your PCS Phone to Access Your Messages:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Voicemail.
- 4. Press for Listen.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your PCS Phone.

Using a Phone Other Than Your PCS Phone to Access Messages:

- 1. Dial your PCS Phone Number.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, press 🖦
- 3. Enter your passcode.

Tip: When you call into voicemail you first hear the header information (date, time, and sender information) for the message. To skip directly to the message, press during the header.

Voicemail Button Guide

Here's a quick guide to your keypad functions while listening to voicemail messages. For further details and menu options, see "Voicemail Menu Key" on page 97.



Voicemail Options

Your PCS Phone offers several options for organizing and accessing your voicemail.

Using Expert Mode

Using the Expert Mode setting for your personal voicemail box helps you navigate through the voicemail system more quickly by shortening the voice prompts you hear at each level.

To turn Expert Mode on or off:

- Press and hold to access your voicemail. If your voicemail box contains any new or saved messages, press to access the main voicemail menu.
- 2. Following the system prompts, press (3 to change your Personal Options.
- **3**. Press **4** or Expert Mode.
- **4**. Press to turn Expert Mode On or Off.

Setting Up Group Distribution Lists

Create up to 20 separate group lists, each with up ro 20 customers.

- 1. Press and hold to access your voicemail. If your voicemail box contains any new or saved messages, press to access the main voicemail menu.
- 2. Follow the system prompts, press (300) to change your Personal Options.
- 3. Press (2ANC) for Administrative Options.
- 4. Press for Group Distribution Lists.
- 5. Follow the voice prompts to create, edit, rename or delete group lists.

PCS Callback

Return a call after listening to a message without disconnecting from voicemail.

- 1. After listening to a message, press 🖭 .
- **2**. Once the call is complete, you're returned to the voicemail main menu.

Voicemail-to Voicemail Message

Record and send a voice message to other PCS Voicemail users.

- 1. From the main voicemail menu, press (2se) to send a message.
- **2**. Follow the voice prompts to enter the phone number.
- 3. Follow the voice prompts to record and send your voice message.

Vooicemail-to Voicemail Message Reply

Reply to a voice message received from any other PCS Voicemail user.

- 1. After listening to a voice message, press 2.
- 2. Follow the voice prompts to record and send your reply.

Voicemail-to-Voicemail Message Forwarding

Forward a voice message, except those marked "Private," to other PCS Voicemail users.

- 1. After listening to a message, press 6
- **2**. Follow the voice prompts to enter the phone number.
- **3**. Follow the voice prompts to record your introduction and forward the voice message.

Voicemail-to-Voicemail Receipt Request

Receive confirmation that your voice message has been listened to when you send, forward, or reply to other PCS users.

- 1. After you have recorded a message, press 🕠 to indicate you are satisfied with the message you recorded.
- 2. Press 4 to mark receipt requested.
- **3**. Press to send your voicemail message.

Continue Recording

■ Before pressing to indicate you are satisfied with the message you recorded, press (4) to continue recording.

Extended Absence Greeting

When your phone is turned off or you are off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network for an extended period, this greeting can be played instead of your normal personal greeting.

- 1. From the main voicemail menu, press for Personal Options.
- 2. Press (3 see for Greetings.
- 3. Press (300) to record an Extended Absence Greeting.

Clearing the Message Icon

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice and text messages.

To clear the icon from the display screen:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press (3) for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Voicemail.
- 4. Press (MENU) 2/8C for Clear Icon.

Using Caller ID

Caller ID lets people know who's calling by displaying the number of the person calling.

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 1. Press *san 6 Toos.
- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- 3. Press Min.

To permanently block your number, call PCS Customer Solutions.

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

 Press . (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)

To switch back to the first caller:

■ Press 🏧 again.

Tip: For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing before placing your call. Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press [max].
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press for 3-Way Call.
- 3. Dial the second number and press [mar.].
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press again to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press [Aux].

Note: Call Waiting and Three-Way Calling are not available while roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

Using Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number — even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when Call Forwarding is activated.

To Activate Call Forwarding

- 1. Press *snn Tross 2ABC.
- 2. Enter the area code and phone number to which your future calls should be forwarded.
- 3. Press . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

To Deactivate Call Forwarding

- 1. Press *sam (7,000) 2ABC (Next).
- 2. Press . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the deactivation.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

Clearly, it's a whole new way to look at wireless.

Getting Started With PCS Vision

With your Vision-enabled PCS Phone and PCS Service, you are ready to start enjoying the advantages of PCS Vision. This section will help you learn the basics of using your PCS Vision services, including managing your User Name, launching a Vision connection, and navigating the Web with your Vision-enabled PCS Phone.

Your User Name

When you buy a Vision-enabled PCS Phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a User Name. Then, when you use PCS Vision services, your User Name is submitted to identify you to the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. The User Name is also useful as an address for PCS Mail, as a way to personalize Web services, and as an online virtual identity.

A User Name is typically based on the customer's name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." For example, the third John Smith to sign up for PCS Vision services might have jsmith003@sprintpcs.com as his User Name. If you want a particular User Name, you can visit www.sprintpcs.com and get the name you want — as long as nobody else has it.

Note: If you already have a PCS Mail User Name, that will automatically become your PCS Vision User Name.

Your User Name will be automatically programmed into your PCS Phone. You don't have to enter it.

Finding Your User Name

If you aren't sure what your PCS Vision User Name is, you can easily find it online or on your PCS Phone:

- ► At <u>www.sprintpcs.com</u>: Log on to your account using your PCS Phone Number and password. Your User Name appears in the top banner, next to your phone number.
- ➤ On your PCS Phone: Your User Name should appear on your phone's display screen in standby mode. You can also find it under the Phone Info option in your phone's main menu.

Launching a PCS Vision Connection

To launch a PCS Vision connection:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 4 for Web.
- **3.** Your PCS Vision connection will launch and the PCS Vision Home page will display.

The PCS Vision Home Page



Shortcut: You can also press the navigation key right to launch the Web.

Note: If Net Guard is enabled and displayed (see below), select **OK** (right softkey) to continue and launch the Web.

While connecting, the following will appear on the screen: Internet - Connecting as jsmith003@sprintpcs.com....

If you had a previous PCS Vision connection, the last page you visited will display when you launch your browser, for example, PCS Short Mail or ESPN Top News. When this occurs, you may not see the "Connecting as..." message when you launch the session. Though the browser is open, you are not currently in an active data session - that is, no data is being sent or received. As soon as you navigate to another page, the active session will launch and you will see the "Connecting as..." message.

Net Guard

When you first connect to the Internet, the Net Guard will appear to confirm that you want to connect. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting Always Auto-Connect when the Net Guard is displayed.


To change your Net Guard settings:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press of Settings.
- 3. Press of Vision.
- 4. Press for Net Guard.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off**.
- 6. Press of to Save.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session. The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

PCS Vision Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone's display lets you know the current status of your PCS Vision connection through indicators which appear at the top of the screen. The following symbols are used:



Your PCS Vision connection is dormant (no data is being sent or received). Though not currently active, when dormant the phone can restart an active connection quickly; voice calls can be made and received.

Your phone is not currently able to access PCS Vision service features.

If no indicator appears, your phone does not have a current PCS Vision connection. To launch a connection, see "Launching a PCS Vision Connection" on page 103.

Navigating the Web

Navigating through menus and Web sites during a PCS Vision session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

Softkeys

When browsing the Web, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkey buttons directly below the phone's display screen. Depending on which Web sites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.

To use softkeys, simply press the desired softkey button. If an additional pop-up menu appears when you press the softkey button, select the menu items using your keypad (if they're numbered) or by highlighting the option and pressing [n].

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some Web sites.

Press the navigation key up and down to scroll line by line or press the volume buttons on the side of the phone to scroll one page at a time.

Selecting

Once you've learned how to use softkeys and scroll, you can start navigating Web sites.

► Select on-screen items by using the navigation key to highlight the desired item, then press the desired softkey button (or press 🔊).

You'll find that the left softkey is used primarily for selecting items. This softkey is often labeled "OK."

▶ If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number kevs) to select an item.

Links, which appear as underlined text, allow you to jump to different Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

► Select links by highlighting the link and then selecting the appropriate softkey.

Tip: The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the key on your phone's keypad, even though the number 0 doesn't appear on the screen.

Going Back

■ To go back one page, press BACK on your phone. (Note that BACK is also used for deleting text (like a BACKSPACE key) when you are entering text.)

Going Home

■ To return to the PCS Vision Home page from any other Web page, press and hold

™Messaging

Now you can send and receive email and text messages and participate in Web-based chatrooms right from your PCS Phone. Messaging allows you to stay connected to friends, family, and co-workers 24 hours a day with always-on text capabilities anywhere on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

Message Types

There are many types of text messaging available on your phone. (PCS Voicemail provides voicemail-to-mailbox messaging. For information about using your phone's voicemail feature, see "Using Voicemail" on page 92.)

Messages

These appear on your screen as Page/Text and include numeric messages (pages), Messages, Updates, and Mail.

Reading a Message

To read a message:

- 1. Press the for Main Menu.
- 2. Press For Settings.
- 3. Press (5xx) for Messaging.
- 4. Press for Notifications.
- 5. To view your messages, select **Inbox** and press 🔩
- **6.** Select the message you want to read and press 🔊.

Setting the Pop-up Message

To view a pop-up message when a new message comes in:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press For Settings.
- 3. Press for Messaging.
- 4. Select **On** and press 🔩

Erasing All Messages

To erase all messages:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press (4 on Notifications.
- 4. Press INDICATE for Erase.
- **5**. Press the navigation key up or down to select one of the following options:
 - Erase This Deletes the message that is highlighted.
 - Erase Old Deletes all read messages.
 - Erase AII Deletes all messages.
- 6. Press (%).

Signing Up for Updates

With Updates, you can have news and information sent directly to your PCS Phone at the times you choose.

To select the information you want to send to your PCS Phone:

- 1. From your computer, log on to the Internet.
- 2. Go to the site from which you want to receive information. A few of the sites you can visit are America Online®, Yahoo!®, MSN® and eBay®. (The location where you request updates within each site will vary.)
- 3. Where indicated on the site, input your 10-digit PCS Phone Number followed by "@messaging.sprintpcs.com." For example: 5551234567@messaging.sprintpcs.com.

Upon completing the registration process, you should begin receiving updates on your PCS Phone as requested.

E-mail

Using E-mail

With E-mail, you can set up an account at no additional charge and perform many of the typical email functions from your PCS Phone that you can from your personal computer.

You can manage your E-mail account from your PCS Phone or from your personal computer at www.sprintpcs.com. You can also access other select email providers from the Web through your E-mail.

Accessing E-mail Messages

To access E-mail messages:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press of for Messaging.
- 3. Press for **E-mail**. (If you're a first-time user, your phone will prompt you to set up your PCS Mail account by establishing a User Name and password.)
- 4. To view your messages, select Inbox and select the OK soft key.
- 5. Scroll to select the message you wish to read and press $[\infty]$.
- Once you've read a message, use the quick actions at the end of each message (Erase, Reply, Reply All, or Next Message) or select Menu for a full list of options.

Composing E-mail Messages

To compose a PCS Mail message:

- 1. From the PCS Mail menu (see steps 1-3 above), select Compose.
- 2. Select Add Name to enter the address of the person to whom you're sending a message and press .
- 3. Select Next to enter the subject and your message.
- **4**. Select **Send** when your message is ready to be delivered.

PCS Shortmail

Using PCS Short mail

With PCS Short mail, you can use a person's wireless phone number to send instant text messages from your Vision-enabled PCS Phone to their messaging-ready phone — and they can send messages to you. When you receive a new message, you'll automatically be notified with a one-way text message.

In addition, PCS Short Mail includes a variety of pre-set messages, such as "I'm running late, I'm on my way," that make composing messages fast and easy. You can also customize your own pre-set messages (up to 100 characters) from your PCS Phone or at www.sprintpcs.com.

To send a PCS Shortmail message:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press of for Messaging.
- 3. Press (250) for **Shortmail**. (The browser will launch and go to the Short Mail page.)
- 4. Select Compose.
- **5.** Select **To**, enter the wireless phone number of the person to whom you wish to send a message (you can also scroll down to select an existing recipient), and select **Add**.

Note: You must use the right softkey to select the **123** character input mode to enter the recipient's phone number.

- **6**. Select **Done** (or add additional recipients and select **Done**).
- 7. Compose a message or use the pre-set messages or icons.
 - To type a message, highlight the **Message** box and use your keypad to type a message. Use the right softkey to select a character input mode.
 - To use a pre-set message or "emoticon," highlight Insert and select Pre-set Msgs or Icons. Select Go, then select the message or emoticon you'd like to insert and select OK.
- 8. Review your message and select Send.

To read a PCS Short mail message:

- 1. When you receive a short mail, you will see "New Page/Text Message Arrived" on your display screen. Select View (right softkey).
- 2. You will then see "New Short Mail. Select 'Go' to read it." Select Go (left softkey). (The browser will launch.)
- 3. Scroll to the new short mail message and press . Unread short mail messages will be marked with an asterisk (*).

Note: The last four digits from the PCS Phone Number of the person who sent you a short mail message appear before the message text. If the sender is on your short list, their nickname will appear instead of their number

To reply to a PCS Shormail message:

- 1. While the message is open, select Reply.
- 2. Compose your reply or use the pre-set messages or icons.
 - To type a reply, highlight the **Message** box and use your keypad to type a message. Use the right softkey to select a character input mode.
 - To use a pre-set message or "emoticon," highlight Insert and select Pre-set Msgs or Icons. Select Go, then select the message or icon you'd like to insert and select OK.
- 3. Review your reply and select **Send**.

To add and/or edit Pre-Set Messages:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press of Shortmail.
- 4. Press for Menu.
- 5. Select Pre-set Messages.
- **6.** From the Pre-set Messages menu, select (**Add New**) or the message you wish to edit.
- 7. Enter your new message or changes and select Save.

Note: You may also add or edit Pre-Set Messages in the "Manage My Account" area at www.sprintpcs.com.

Chat

PCS Vision gives you the ability to join wireless chatrooms from your PCS Phone. Send text messages and icons to chatroom participants or launch a one-on-one (private) chatroom.

To access a chatroom from the browser:

- 1. Launch the browser.
- 2. Select Messaging.
- 3. Select CHAT.
- 4. Select Enter. You will see a disclaimer for Wireless Chat. Select I Agree to enter the Chat menu.
- **5**. Select a chatroom from the menu (for example, "Friends" or "Singles").
- **6**. Use your keypad to enter a nickname and select **Enter**. Once in the chatroom, you may scroll through the postings to read messages from other chatroom participants.

Note: To avoid inadvertent data usage charges, you should log out of chatrooms when you are ready to exit.

To post a message:

- 1. Select Add text.
- 2. Enter your message.
- 3. Select Send.

To set up a private chatroom:

- 1. Select 1->1.
- **2**. Select a chatter with whom you'd like to launch a private chatroom.

To exit a chatroom:

Select Leave Room.

Downloading Games, Ringers, and Screen Savers

With PCS Vision and your new Vision-enabled PCS Phone, you have access to a dynamic variety of Premium Service content such as downloadable Games, Ringers, and Screen Savers. While each type of download involves a different file type, the basic method for accessing and downloading files is the same.

Accessing the Download Menus

To access the PCS Vision download menus:

- 1. Press for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 5 for Downloads.
- 3. Select the type of file you wish to download (Games, Ringers, or Screen Savers) and press .
- 4. Select **Get New** and press 🖳 . The browser will launch and take you to the corresponding download menu.

To access the PCS Vision download menus from the Web browser:

■ From the home page, select Games, Ringers, or Screen Savers to go to the corresponding download menu. (For more information about navigating the Web, see "Navigating the Web" on page 105.

Selecting an Item to Download

From the download menus, items available for download may be searched in a number of ways:

- ► Featured displays a rotating selection of featured items.
- ▶ Browse Category allows you to narrow your search to a general category, such as Movie/TV Themes for Ringers or College Logos for Screen Savers. (There may be several pages of available content in a list. Select **Next 9** to view additional items.)
- ► **Search** allows you to use your keypad to enter search criteria to locate an item. You may enter an entire word or title or perform a partialword search (for example, entering "goo" returns "Good Ol' Boy," "The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly," and "Goofy - Club").

Downloading an Item

Once you've decided on an item to download, highlight it and press or select OK (left softkey). You will see a summary page for the item including its title, the vendor, the download detail, the file size, and the cost. Links allow you to view the License Details page, which outlines the price, license type, and length of license for the download, and the Terms of Use page, which details the Premium Services Terms of Use and your responsibility for payment.

To download a selected item:

- From the information page, select Buy (or Get It in the case of a free item). If you have not previously purchased an item, you will be prompted to enter your account password and create your purchasing profile.
- You will see a Confirmation screen confirming your purchase and informing you that the charge will be added to your next PCS Invoice. You will also be informed that the downloaded item has been stored in the My VauIt page.
- Select Download to initiate the download of the item. (You will see a series of browser screens, ending with the Download screen, which lists the item name, vendor, version, size, and type.)
- 4. Select Next (right softkey) to download the item.
- 5. You will see another series of screens detailing the download initiation, progress (in kilobytes), and saving process. When the Completed screen appears, the item has been successfully downloaded to your phone.
- Select Use (left softkey) to assign the downloaded item (or to play, in the case of a game).

– or –

Select **Shop** (right softkey) to look for other items to download.

– or –

Press to quit the browser and return to standby mode.



You can play a variety of entertaining and graphically-rich games on your PCS Phone. New games are easy to download and play.

- Select Assign (right softkey) and select the call type for which you would like to assign the ringer: Caller ID, No Caller ID, or Roaming.

Note: You may assign a ringer to more than one type of call.

To download an available Screen Saver to your phone:

- **5.** Use your navigation key to highlight and select a Screen Saver you wish to download. (For more information on navigating the Web, see "Navigating the Web" on page 105.)
- **6.** From the item information page, select **Buy**. If you have not previously purchased an item, you will be prompted to enter your account password and create your purchasing profile.
- A confirmation page will notify you that the Screen Saver has been purchased and is stored in the My Vault folder. To download the Screen Saver, select Download.
- **8.** From the Download screen, select **Next** (right softkey) to download the Screen Saver. When the Completed screen appears, the Screen Saver has been successfully downloaded to your phone.

Web Web

With Web on your Vision-enabled PCS Phone, you can browse full-color graphic versions — not just text versions — of your favorite Web sites, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop on your PCS Phone anywhere within the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

In addition to the features already covered in this section, the PCS Vision Home page offers always-on access to these colorful, graphically rich Web categories. Many sites are available under more than one menu — choose the one that's most convenient for you.

- ➤ News: Get up-to-the-minute news regarding finance, business, sports, and entertainment at sites like CNN, Bloomberg, USA Today, and Forbes.
- ▶ Weather: Access The Weather Channel to get current weather conditions and forecasts.
- ► Entertainment: Get the latest buzz on your favorite stars as well as movie and music reviews at Web sites like E! Online, Pocket BoxOfficeTM, and TastNtalk.
- ➤ Sports: Enjoy current news, statistics, and sports scores, as well as updates of events in progress at ESPN.com and other sports sites.
- ► Finance: Use Web sites like Bloomberg, Fidelity, and Forbes to get stock quotes, make trades, and check your bank account online.
- ► Travel: Access flight information and make dining arrangements from travel Web sites like Saber and Fodors.
- ► Shopping: Browse or purchase from popular shopping Web sites like Amazon.com or Edmunds.
- ➤ Tools: Use tools like Switchboard to access yellow pages, white pages even reverse phone number look-up or use Google to search for other Web sites or images.
- ▶ Business Links: Access your PCS Business Connection Personal or Enterprise Edition along with links to many business-related sites.
- ► My Account: Check minutes and PCS Vision usage, view your current invoice, or make a payment.
- ► **Google Search**: Launch a Google search in one of three classes: PCS Web, Images, or Internet.

Using the Browser Menu

Navigating the Web from your phone using the PCS Vision Home page is easy once you get the hang of it. For details on how to navigate the Web, select menu items, and more, see "Navigating the Web" on page 105.

Although the PCS Vision Home page offers a broad and convenient array of sites and services for you to browse, not all sites are represented, and certain functionality, such as going directly to Web sites and creating bookmarks is not available. For these and other functions, you will need to use the browser menu. The browser menu is a drop-down menu which offers additional functionality to expand your use of the Web on your PCS Phone.

Opening the Browser Menu

The browser menu may be opened anytime you have an active Vision session, from any page you are viewing. To open the browser menu:

lacksquare Press and hold \bigcap . The browser menu will open.

Options available under the browser menu include:

- ▶ Home: Returns the browser to the PCS Vision Home page.
- Bookmarks: Allows you to view and access bookmarked sites and bookmark new sites.
- ► SnapShots: Lets you take and save a snapshot of a Web page you're viewing.
- ► Search: Launches a Google search.
- ► Go to URL: Allows you to navigate directly to a Web site by entering its URL (Web site address).
- ► Show URL: Displays the URL (Web site address) of the site you're currently viewing.
- ► **Refresh**: Reloads the current Web page.
- ► **Settings**: Allows you to configure and manage your browser settings.
- ➤ About...: Displays technical information about the browser, its version, and the encryption version, and provides links to Certificate Information for the various components.

Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favorite Web sites for easy access at a later time.

To create a bookmark:

- 1. Go to the Web page you want to mark.
- 2. Access the browser menu by pressing the voice services key on the side of your phone.
- 3. Select Bookmarks.
- 4. Select Mark Site.
- 5. Use your keypad to edit the bookmark title and URL (if necessary) and select **Save** to save the bookmark.

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address.

Note: Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

Accessing a Bookmark

To access a bookmark:

- 1. Access the browser menu by pressing the voice services key on the side of your phone.
- 2. Select Bookmarks.
- 3. Select View.
- 4. Highlight the bookmark you'd like to access and press 🚱 to go to the Web site.

Deleting a Bookmark

- **1.** Access the **View** menu as outlined above in steps 1-3.
- 2. Select **Delete** and press (%).

Going to a Specific Web Site

To go to a particular Web site by entering a URL (Web site address):

- 1. Access the browser menu by pressing and holding

- 2. Select Go to URL.
- 3. Use your keypad to enter the URL of the Web site you wish to go to.
- **4**. Select **Go** to go to the Web site.

Note: Not all Web sites are viewable on your phone.

Reloading a Web Page

- 1. Access the browser menu by pressing and holding
- 2. Select Refresh.

Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

- 1. Access the browser menu by pressing and holding [.....]

- 2. Select Settings.
- Select Restart Browser.

Using Special Features During a Web Call

Your phone gives you the ability to use special features while you're on a Web call. They are outlined below:

- ► Call Waiting: If someone tries to reach you while you're connected to the Web, your phone behaves like it is turned OFF. Depending on your service, callers may get your voicemail. Call Waiting is automatically deactivated whenever you place or receive a Web connection call.
- ► Accessing Features: You can still access most of your phone's features while you're connected on a Web connection call. You can navigate the phone's menu system to change or view your phone's features or Internal Phone Book entries. You can also read messages or view the Caller ID records that you received before placing the call.

Ending a Web Call

It's important to note that some of the normal ways to end a call won't work with Web connection calls. You should always close the connection through the application on your computer. Your phone will then return to standby mode.

PCS Business ConnectionSM Personal Edition

PCS Business ConnectionSM Personal Edition gives you secure, real-time mobile access to your Microsoft® Outlook® or Lotus Notes® company email, calendar, business directory, and personal contacts. You'll have the features and functions of your Microsoft Outlook and Lotus Notes so you can view, create, reply to, and delete email; schedule appointments; and look up phone numbers in real time, anywhere on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

PCS Business Connection Personal Edition delivers the following features:

- ▶ Business email access: Read, reply to, forward, delete, and compose your company email.
- ➤ Company directory and contacts: Search, view, call, and email contacts from your company's directory. Do all this and add/edit your personal contacts.
- ► Work calendar: Accept and decline meetings, view daily summaries and details, and navigate to various dates.
- ► Files/information on your PC: Browse folders, download, and view documents from any device using a PC browser or Pocket Internet Explorer.

PCS Business Connection Personal Edition requires no hardware or software installation on your company's network. Just install the PCS Business Connection Personal Edition software on your work PC. This allows data to be securely retrieved in real-time by your wireless device when connected to the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. There is a monthly charge for PCS Business Connection and usage charges will also apply.

When your work PC isn't on, you can share connections with your coworkers so that you always have access to your email, calendar, and contacts. Your data remains secure behind the corporate firewall and any changes you make on your wireless device are instantly updated on your company server without the need to synchronize.

PCS Vision FAQs

How will I know when my phone is ready for PCS Vision service?

Your User Name (for example, bsmith001@sprintpcs.com) will display on your phone's screen.

How do I sign-in for the first time?

You are automatically signed in to PCS Vision services when you turn on your phone.

How do I know when my phone is connected to PCS Vision services?

Your phone automatically connects when PCS Vision service is used or an incoming message arrives. Your phone will also display the ♣ icon. (Connecting takes about 10-12 seconds.)

Can I make calls and use PCS Vision services at the same time?

You cannot use voice and PCS Vision services simultaneously. If you receive a call while PCS Vision service is active, the call will be forwarded to voicemail. You can place an outgoing call anytime, but it will interrupt any in-progress PCS Vision session.

When is my data connection active?

Your connection is active when data is being transferred. Outgoing calls are allowed; incoming calls go directly to voicemail. When active, the ⁴ indicator flashes on your phone's display screen.

When is my data connection dormant?

If no data is received for 10 seconds, the connection goes dormant. When the connection is dormant, voice calls are allowed. (The connection may become active again quickly.) If no data is received for an extended period of time, the connection will terminate.

Can I sign out of data services?

You can sign out without turning off your phone, however you will not be able to browse the Web or use other PCS Vision services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time. To sign out, go to Settings/Internet/ Sign Out in your phone's menu.

P art of getting the most out of your PCS Phone is learning how the phone works and how to care for it. This section outlines performance and safety guidelines that help you understand the basic features of your phone's operation.

Getting the Most Out of Your Rectption

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radiofrequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radiofrequency Safety

4A: Safety

The design of your PCS Phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below.

In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- ► Hold the phone with the antenna raised, fully-extended, and over your shoulder.
- ▶ Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- ▶ Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- ► Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- ➤ Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a Sprint Store or call PCS Customer SolutionsSM for service.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only Sprint authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- ▶ Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and redial.
- ► When available, use a hands-free device.
- ► Position your phone within easy reach.
- ► Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- ▶ Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- ➤ Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.

- ▶ Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- ▶ Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- ▶ Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- ► Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radiofrequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- ► Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- ▶ Below deck on boats.
- ▶ Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- ► Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, just or metal powders.
- ► Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your PCS Phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your phone bill.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- ▶ Use only Sprint-approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- ► In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- ➤ Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- ▶ Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- ► Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- ▶ Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- ► The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- ▶ It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- ➤ Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month:

4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)

More than one month:

4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Lilon) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your LiIon batteries, contact your nearest Sprint-authorized service center.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Lilon battery.

Acknowledging Special Precautions and the FCC Notice

FCC Notice

The phone may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the phone if such interference cannot be eliminated.

Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection Association, One Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02269, Attn: Publication Sales Division.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment, and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

Body-Worn Operation

Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) for Wireless Phones

The SAR is a value that corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed in the head of a user of a wireless handset.

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.
