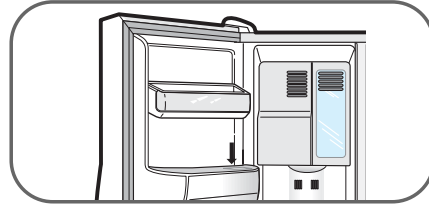

## SETTING UP THE REFRIGERATOR

Once you have performed the following steps, your refrigerator should be fully operational. If not, check the power supply and electricity source. If you have any questions, contact your **SAMSUNG** service center.

**1**

Place the refrigerator in an appropriate location with reasonable clearance between the wall and the refrigerator. (refer to installation instructions in this manual)

**3**

Set the temperature control to the coldest temperature and wait for an hour. The freezer should get slightly chilled and the motor should run smoothly.

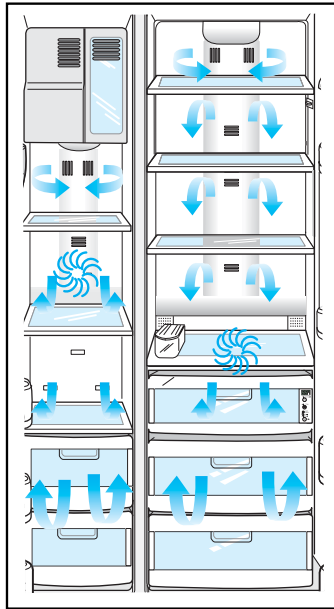
**2**

When the refrigerator is plugged in, the interior light should come on when you open the doors.

**4**

Once the refrigerator temperature is sufficiently low, you can store food in the refrigerator. After starting the refrigerator, it takes a few hours to reach the appropriate temperature.

## MAJOR FEATURES



### Twin Cooling System

- The refrigerator and the freezer have two evaporators. Given this independent system, the freezer and the refrigerator are cooled individually and are, therefore, more efficient. Food odor from the refrigerator does not affect food in the freezer due to separate air flow circulation.

### Multi-Flow System

- Cool air circulates through multiple vents on every shelf level. This provides even distribution of cooling inside cabinets to keep your food fresh longer.

### Xtra Space™

- Vertical room next to the ice maker in the freezer provides space for pizza etc.

### Door Alarm

- Beeper reminds you that the door is open.

### Xtra Fresh™

- Optimized humidity control keeps vegetables & fruits fresh.

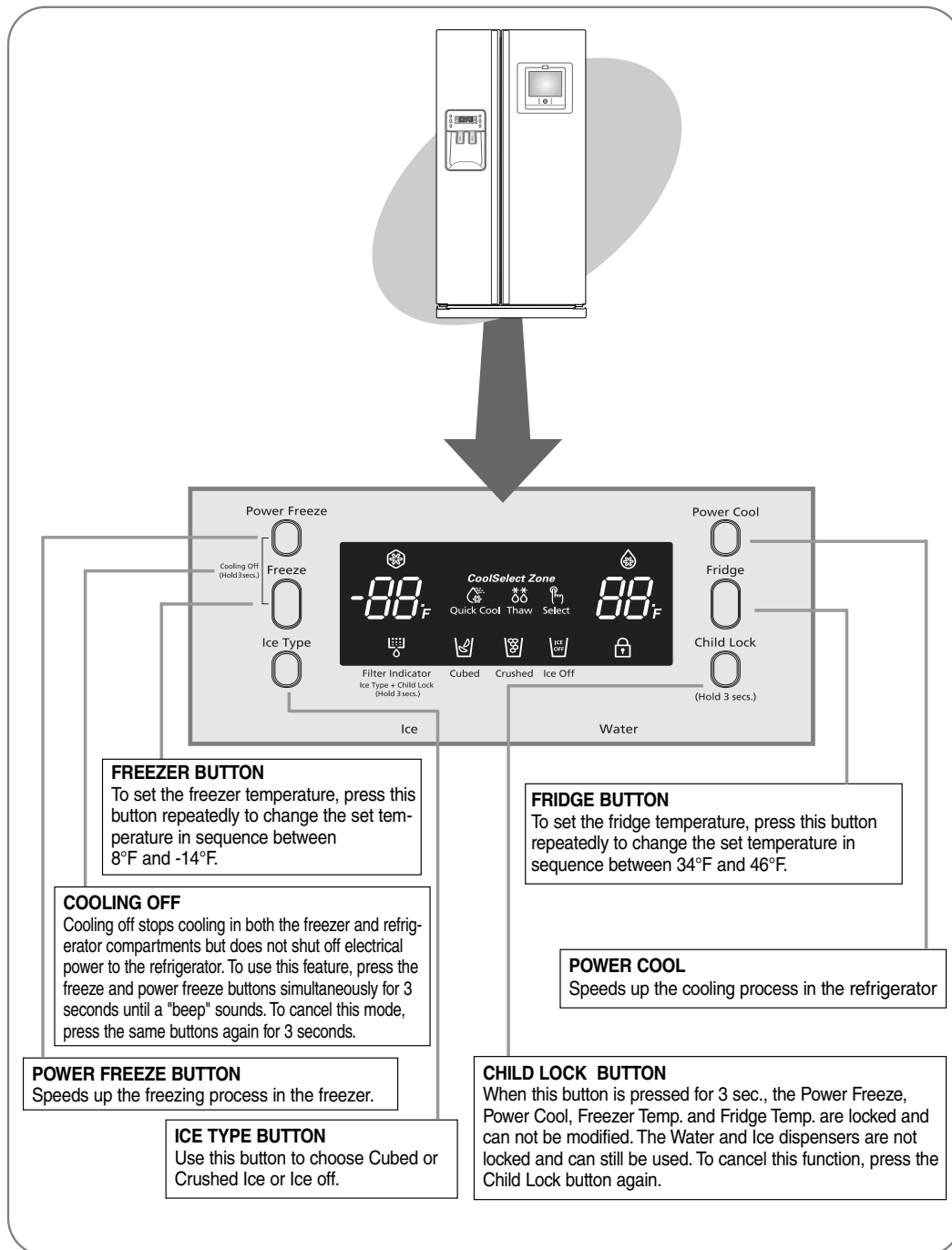
### Deodorizer

- Reusable deodorizer keeps the refrigerator air fresh and odor free.

### CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer

- You can select Quick Cool, Thaw and Select buttons to quickly chill, thaw and cool items. Select Soft Freeze, Cool or Chill to control the temperature of drawer.

## DIGITAL PANEL



**Freezer** indicates the current freezer temperature.

**Fridge** indicates the current refrigerator temperature.

**Quick Cool, Thaw, and Select** show the status of the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer

### Power Freeze



- This light goes on when you press the Power Freeze button. Press this button to quickly return the freezer to its set temperature.
- This feature enables you to get ice faster.
- Press the button again to cancel the Power Freeze mode.

❗ If you use this function, energy consumption will increase.

### Power Cool



- This light goes on when you press the Power Cool button. Press this button to quickly return the refrigerator to its set temperature.
- Press this button again to cancel the Power Cool mode.

### Cubed Ice, Crushed Ice and Ice Off

Ice Off

- Press the Ice Type button in sequence to choose Cubed Ice, Crushed Ice or Ice Off to stop making ice.
- Lit icon indicates the ice type currently chosen.

### Filter Indicator



- Change filter every 6 months. If indicator is orange, the filter has 1 month left. If indicator is red, quick replacement is strongly recommended.
- When the water filter is replaced, reset the indicator by pressing the Ice Type button and the Child Lock buttons simultaneously for 3 seconds.
- To turn this indicator off, press the Ice Type and Child Lock buttons simultaneously and hold for 5 seconds.

## TEMPERATURE CONTROL

### Freezer

- The freezer temperature can be set between 8°F and -14°F.
- Press the **Freezer** button **repeatedly** until the desired set temperature is shown in the temperature display.
- The temperature display changes in sequence between 8°F and -14°F. When the display reaches 8°F, it returns to -14°F.
- After five seconds, the display reverts to the actual freezer temperature. The unit will then work to adjust to the new desired temperature.

### Refrigerator

- The refrigerator temperature can be set between 46°F and 34°F.
- Press the **Fridge** button repeatedly until the desired temperature is shown in the temperature display.
- The temperature display changes in sequence and reverts in the same way as the freezer.



#### WARNING

- When ice cream is stored at a temperature above 4°F in freezer, it may melt.
- The temperature of the freezer or the refrigerator rises from frequent door opening and warm food. This may cause the digital display to blink. The digital display will stop blinking when the freezer and refrigerator return to normal temperature.

If the temperature control does not reset the temp, unplug the refrigerator, wait 9 min, then plug it back in.

## ICE and COLD WATER DISPENSER

### Press the Ice Type button to select the type of ice:

- Cubed ice For Cubed ice
- Crushed ice For Crushed ice
- No ice For ice off

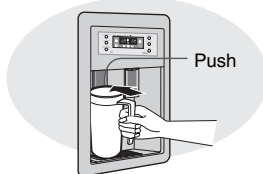


#### NOTE

If the Ice remains in the Ice bucket, cubed ice is obtained. Ice stays in cube form and is crushed when the Crushed ice button is pressed.

### Push the ice dispenser lever with a cup.

- Place a cup in line with the dispenser to prevent ice from jumping out.



#### NOTE

To avoid injury, never put fingers or any other objects in the dispenser opening.

### Water Dispenser

The capacity of the water tank is approximately 0.3 gal.

### Cold Water

- Push the water dispenser lever with a cup.
- If you have just installed the refrigerator or installed a new water filter, throw away the first six glassfuls of water or until water flows cleanly to flush out impurities in the water supply system.



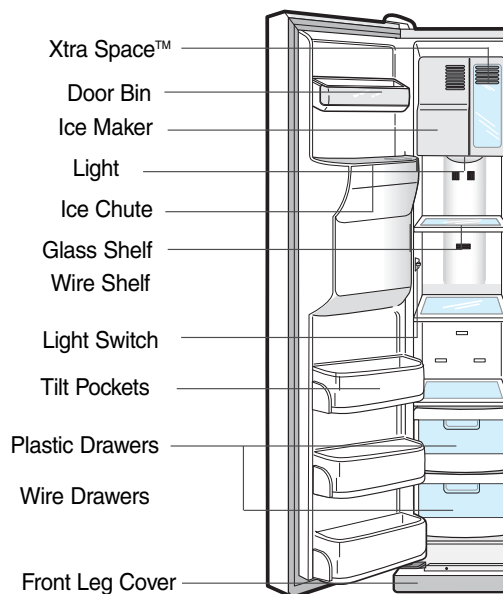
#### CAUTION

If there will be a long period of time (long vacation or business trip) where you won't use the water or ice dispensers, close the water valve and shut off the water supply to the refrigerator. Otherwise, water leakage may occur.

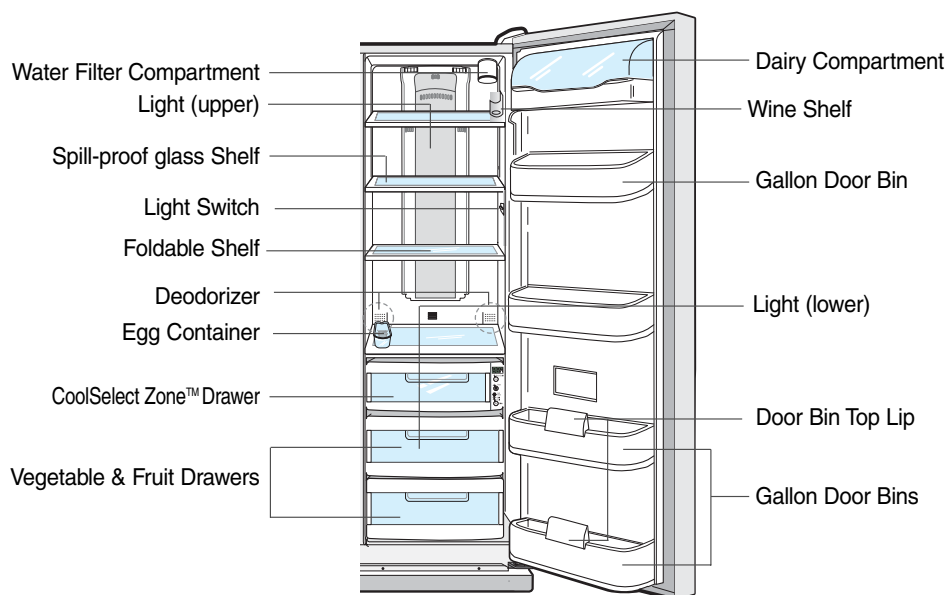

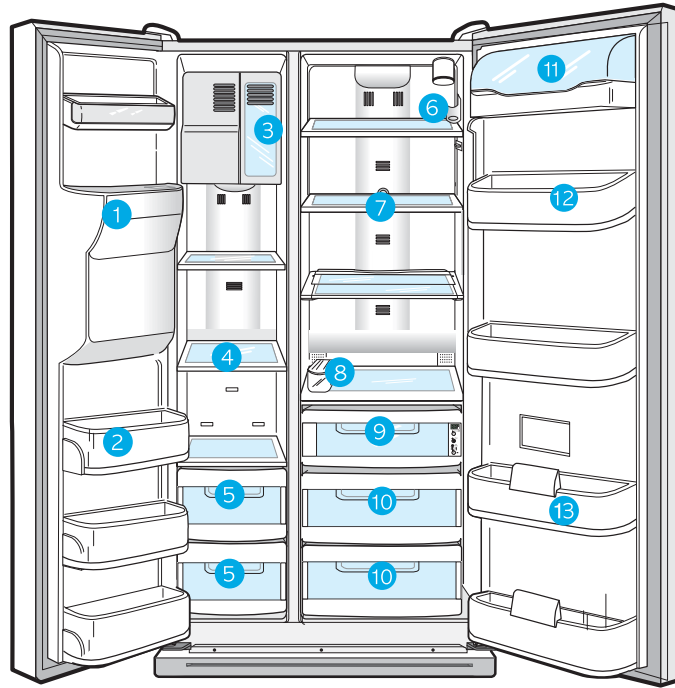

#### 1 Ice chute

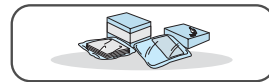


#### WARNING

Do not put your fingers, hands or any other unsuitable objects in the chute or ice-maker bucket, as this may result in personal injury or material damage.

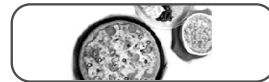
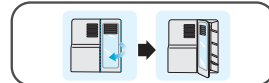
#### 2 Door Bin

- Can be used for small packages of frozen food.



#### 3 Xtra Space™

- Can be used for frozen foods such as pizza, pasta, burritos, and fajitas.
- In order to prevent odor penetration to the ice, stored food should be wrapped securely.



#### 4 Tempered Glass Shelf

- Can be used to store all types of frozen food.



#### 5 Plastic Drawer

- Can be used to store meats and dry foods. Stored food should be wrapped securely using foil or other suitable wrapping materials or containers.



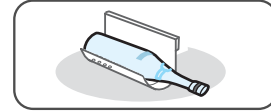

### Wine Shelf

- Place your wine bottles on the shelf to maintain their taste.

### Tempered Spill Proof Glass Shelf

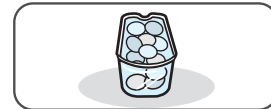
- Can be used to store all types of chilled food.

- Circular marks on the glass surface are a normal phenomenon.

### Egg Container

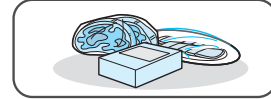
- Put eggs in the container and place them on the shelf.

- Helps to preserve the taste of food and prolongs its freshness. Use to store cheese, meat, poultry, fish or any other foods used quickly.

- Is used to store fruits and vegetables.
- This drawer is airtight. Optimized humidity control design helps to preserve the freshness of the stored vegetables and fruits.

### Dairy Compartment

### 13 Gallon Door Bins

- Can be used to store foods in packages, such as milk and yogurt.

# CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer GUIDE

## “Quick Cool” Button

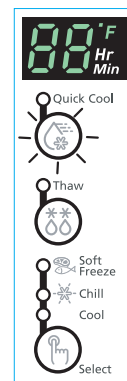
- You can use the Quick Cool feature with the CoolSelect Zone™.
- “Quick Cool” allows 1~3 canned beverages to cool within 60 min.
- To cancel this option, press the “Quick Cool” button again. CoolSelect Zone™ returns to the previous temperature.
- When “Quick Cool” ends, it returns to the “Cool” temperature setting.



Depending on the beverages, the cool-down time may vary.

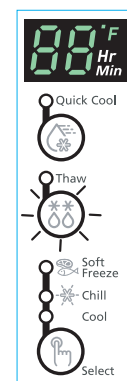


- When the “Quick Cool” option is selected, remove food stored in the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer that you do not want to cool.



## “Thaw” Button

- After “Thaw” is selected, warm and cold air is alternately supplied into the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer.
- Depending on the weight of the meat, thawing time can be selected for 4 hrs, 6 hrs, 10 hrs, and 12 hrs sequentially, keeping the meat partially frozen.
- When “Thaw” ends, the CoolSelect Zone™ display returns to “chill” condition.
- **When “Thaw” ends, meat is in a half-frozen state so it is easy to cut for cooking.**
- To cancel this option, press any button except “Thaw”.
- The approximate thawing times of meat and fish are shown below. (Based on 1 inch thickness)



Thaw Time	4 hours	6 hours	10 hours	12 hours
Weight	0.8 lb	1.3 lb	1.7 lb	2.2 lb



Depending on the size and thickness of the meat and fish, the thawing time may vary. The above chart represents the total weight of food in the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer.  
Ex) The total thawing time for 1.3 lb frozen beef and 0.8 lb frozen chicken will be 10 hours.



- When the “Thaw” option is selected, be sure to remove food stored in the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer that you do not want to thaw.

# CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer GUIDE

## “Select” Button

### 1 Soft Freeze

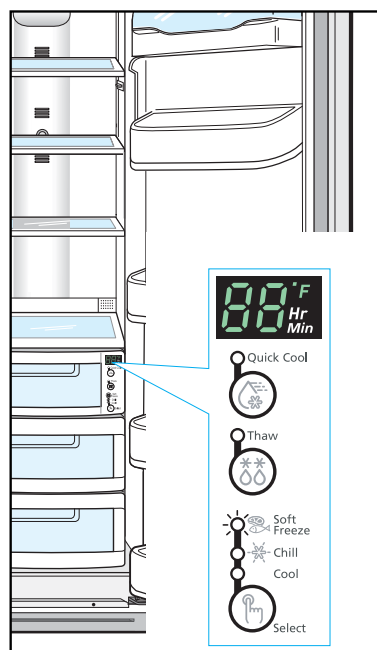
- When “Soft Freeze” is selected, the temperature on the digital panel displays 23°F (-5°C), regardless of the set temperature of the refrigerator.
- “Soft Freeze” temperature helps keep meat and fish fresh for longer.

### 2 Chill

- When “Chill” is selected, the temperature of the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer is kept at 30°F (-1°C), regardless of the set refrigerator temperature.
- “Chill” temperature helps keep meat or fish fresh for longer.

### 3 Cool

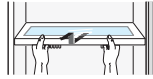
- When “Cool” is selected, the temperature will be the same as the set temperature of the refrigerator. The digital panel shows the same temperature as that of the Control panel.
- When using “Cool”, the CoolSelect Zone™ Drawer allows extra refrigerator space.



## REMOVING THE FREEZER ACCESSORIES

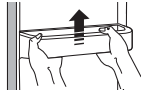
### 1 Glass Shelf

- Pull the shelf out as far as it goes. Then lift it up and remove it.



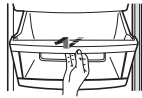
### 2 Door Bin

- Hold the door bin with both hands and then lift it up.



### 3 Plastic Drawer (Wire Drawer)

- Remove the drawer by pulling it out and slightly lifting it up.

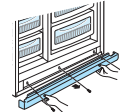


### 4 Ice Maker Bucket

- Remove the bucket by lifting up and pulling out.

### 5 Front Leg Cover

- Open the freezer and refrigerator doors, remove three screws and detach the cover.
- To reattach the front leg cover, put it back to original position and tighten the three screws.



**NOTE**

- Do not use excessive force when removing the cover. It may cause an injury.

## REMOVING THE REFRIGERATOR ACCESSORIES

### 1 Spill Proof Glass Shelf

- Pull the shelf out as far as it will go. Then lift it up and gently remove it.

### 2 Vegetable & Fruit Drawer

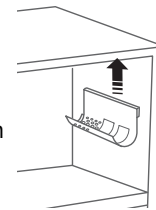
- Remove the drawer by holding the handle, pulling the drawer out and lifting it up smoothly.
- Remove the optimized humidity control cover by pulling it towards you.

### 3 Gallon Door Bin

- Hold the bin with both hands and remove by lifting it up.

### 4 Wine Shelf

- It is attached to the cabinet wall. To remove the wine shelf, lift it up in the direction of the arrow as shown.
- Simply take the shelf out of the tabs.



**NOTE**

- Before removing the freezer and refrigerator accessories, please remove the stored foods.

## CARE AND CLEANING

### Interior

- Clean the accessories with a mild detergent, then wipe out with a dry cloth.
- After washing the accessories, make sure that they are dry before using them again.



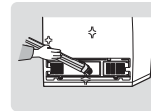
### Exterior

- Wipe the digital panel and display panel with a clean cloth.
- Clean the surface of doors, handles and cabinet with a mild detergent and soft cloth, then wipe off the surface with a dry cloth.
  - Do not use Benzene, Thinner or Clorox™ for cleaning
  - Do not spray water directly on the surface of the refrigerator while cleaning.
- The exterior part of the refrigerator should be polished once or twice a year.



### Rear

- Use a vacuum cleaner to remove dust once or twice a year.



- Do not remove cover, risk of shock.

### WARNING

### Ice and water dispenser

- Use a damp cloth to clean the ice and water dispenser. Then wipe it out with a dry cloth.
- To keep drainage grid dry, do not touch ice and water dispenser without a cup or glass in place.



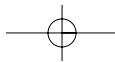
### Rubber door seals

- If the rubber door seals are dirty, the door will not close properly, The refrigerator will not be able to function efficiently. Clean the doors with a mild detergent and damp cloth. Then wipe with a dry cloth.



### WARNING

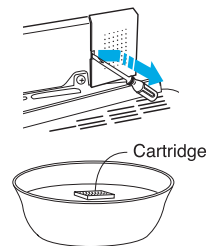
- Do not spray the refrigerator with water. It may cause a serious electric shock.
- Do not clean it with benzene, thinner or car detergent. It may cause a fire.



## CARE AND CLEANING

### Twin Deodorizer

- Remove the cover with a flat blade screw driver as shown.
- Take out the cartridge from the cover and soak it in clean, warm water for at least 4 hrs. Completely dry out the cartridge in sunlight for at least 8 hrs in an open area.
- Repeat this process once or twice a year.



#### NOTE

- If cartridge is dried in a confined area, there may be some odor.
- Keep children away from contaminated water.

## CHANGING THE INTERIOR LIGHT



#### WARNING

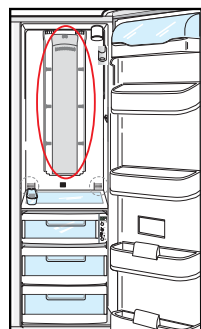
Before changing the interior light, unplug the refrigerator from the power supply. If you have difficulty changing the light, contact your service center.



### INTERIOR LIGHT IN THE REFRIGERATOR.

#### Upper

The upper light is located in the upper center of the refrigerator.



- 1 Place a flat screwdriver under the light cover hooks and push in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Pull the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- 3 After changing the bulb, replace the light cover.

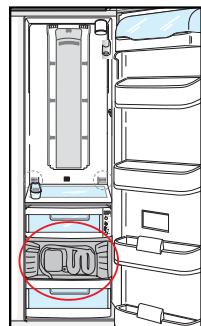


#### NOTE

Replacement bulbs for the upper refrigerator are available at retail outlets such as Wal-mart and The Home Depot. Use replacement bulb size E26, maximum 40 watts.

#### Lower

The lower light is located in the lower center of the refrigerator.



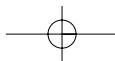
- 1 Place a flat screwdriver under the light cover hooks and push in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Change the bulb with a new one (2).
- 3 After changing the bulb, replace the light cover.

## WATER FILTER

### The water "Filter Indicator" light

- "Filter Indicator" light lets you know when it is time to change your water filter cartridge. The light will change from green to orange. This tells you that it is almost time to change the current cartridge. It is recommended that you replace the cartridge when the light changes to red.  
(see "Install the water filter" section for more information)

- If you install the water filter, throw away the first six glassfuls of water filter, or until water flows clearly to flush impurities in the water supply system.

### Using the dispenser without the water filter

- You can not use the water and ice dispenser without a water filter cartridge because the water line blocks at the water supply.

### Ordering replacement filters

- To order more water filter cartridges, call 1-800-SAMSUNG and ask for accessory Part # DA29-00003B or contact your authorized Samsung dealer.

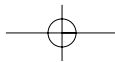
## DOORS

The refrigerator doors have a special door opening and closing feature to make sure that they close all the way and are securely sealed.

When opening the door, it will only open so far. After reaching a certain point, it will remain open.

When the door is partially open, it will close automatically.

The refrigerator should be properly installed & leveled.

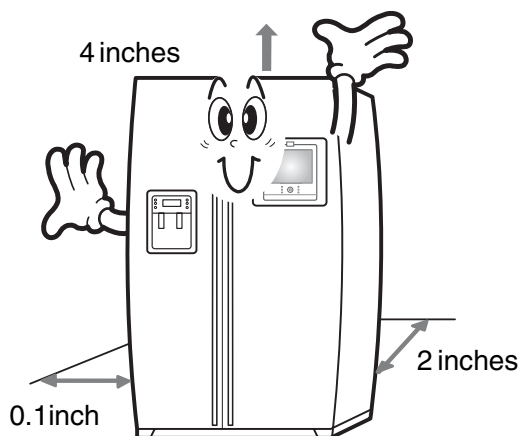

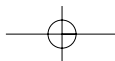
**Allow sufficient space to circulate the air in the internal cooling system.**

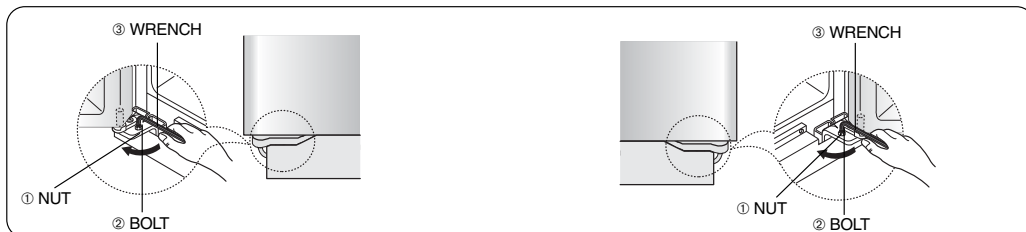
- 2) Please adjust the height difference between the doors by turning the bolt (②) clockwise (↻) or counter clockwise (↻).



When you turn clockwise (↻), the door goes up.



- 3) After adjusting the doors, turn the nut clockwise (↻) until it reaches the lower end of the bolt, then tighten the bolt again with the wrench (③) to fix the nut (①).



If you do not fix the nut (①) firmly, the bolt (②) may be released.

## CHECKING THE WATER DISPENSER LINE

- 1) In order to operate the ice maker properly, water pressure of 20 ~125 psi is required.  
In this range a 170 cc (5.74 ounces) paper cup can be filled in 10 secs.
- 2) The water filter removes particles. It does not sterilize or destroy any micro-organisms.
- 3) If the refrigerator is installed in an area with low water pressure (below 20psi), you should install a booster pump to compensate.
- 4) Ensure the water storage tank inside the refrigerator is properly filled initially. Push the water dispenser lever until the water runs from the outlet.



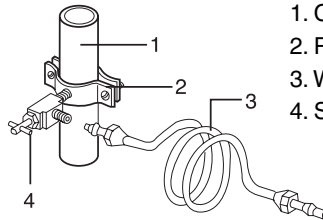
**NOTE**

A Water line installation kit is available at extra cost from your dealer. Samsung recommends using a water supply kit containing copper tubing.



### Connecting to water supply line

- Shut off the main water supply line and turn the Ice maker to the off position.

Remove the water filter from the box and put a month indicator stick on the filter as shown.

- 2) If the water filter was installed in March, put on the "SEP" sticker.

- 4) Slowly turn the water filter clockwise 90° to align the indication mark on the cover, locking the filter in position. Do not overtighten.

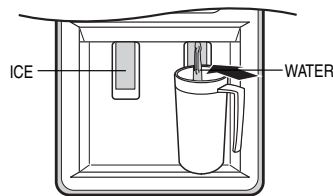

**Remove any residual matter inside the water supply line after installing filter.**

- 1) Turn on the main water supply & shut-off the valve of the water supply line.
- 2) Run water through the dispenser until the water runs clear (6~7 minutes). This will clean the water supply system and clear air from the lines.
- 3) Additional flushing may be required in some households.
- 4) Open the refrigerator door and check if water leaks around the water filter.



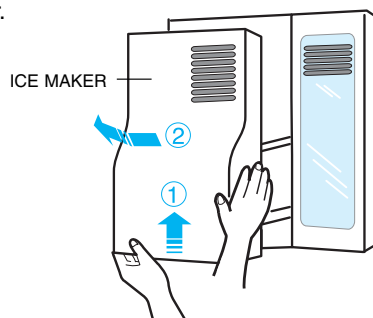
**NOTE**

- A newly-installed water filter cartridge may cause water to briefly spurt from the dispenser.
- Before reinstalling the water filter, remove the wine shelf.



**Check the amount of water supplied to the ice tray.**

- 1) Lift up ① and pull out ② the ice maker bucket in the freezer.



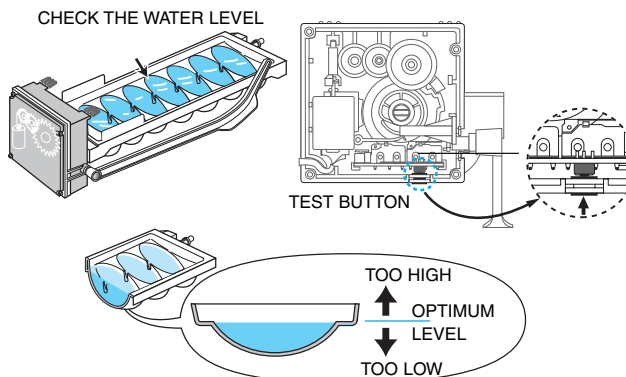
- 2) When you press the test button, the ice cube container is filled with water from the water supply tap.

Check the amount of water (see the illustration below).

If the water level is too low, the ice cubes will be small.

This is not a problem with the ice maker but of the water pressure in the pipe, and occurs frequently.

When this problem occurs, contact a service person to check the amount of water supplied.



## TROUBLESHOOTING

### The refrigerator does not work at all or it does not chill sufficiently

- Check that the power plug is properly connected.
- Is the temperature control on the display panel set to the correct temperature? Try setting it to a lower temperature.
- Is the refrigerator in direct sunlight or located near a heat source?
- Is the back of the refrigerator too close to the wall?

### The food in the refrigerator is frozen

- Is the temperature control on the display panel set to the correct temperature? Try setting it to a warmer temperature.
- Is the temperature in the room too low?
- Did you store food with a high water content in the coldest part of the refrigerator?

### You hear unusual noise or sounds

- Check that the floor is leveled and stable.
- Is the back of the refrigerator too close to the wall?
- Was anything dropped behind or under the refrigerator?
- A "ticking" sound may be heard from inside the refrigerator, this is normal. This occurs because various accessories are contracted or expanded.

### The front corners and sides of the cabinet are hot; condensation occurs.

- Anti-condensators are installed in the front corners of the refrigerator to prevent condensation.
- Condensation can occur when you leave the door open for a long time.

### Ice is not dispensed

- Did you stop the ice making function?
- Is there any ice in the ice storage unit?
- Is the water line connected and the shut-off valve open?
- Is the freezer temperature too warm? (Set the temperature lower)
- Did you wait for 12 hours after installation of the water supply line before making ice?

### You can hear water bubbling in the refrigerator

- The bubbling comes from the refrigerant circulating in the refrigerator and is normal.

### There is a bad smell in the refrigerator

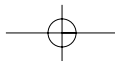
- Wrap strong smelling food so that it is airtight. Throw away any rotten food.

### Frost forms on the walls of the freezer

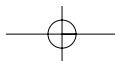
- Is the air vent blocked?
- Allow sufficient space between the foods stored for efficient air circulation.
- Is the door closed properly?

### No water is supplied

- Is the water line connected and the shut-off valve open?
- Is the water supply line crushed?
- Is the water tank frozen because the refrigerator temperature is too low? Select a warmer setting on the display panel.

1. Extend the FM antenna.
2. Fasten it up in the position which gives you the best reception, then fix it on the wall, etc.
  - If reception is poor, you may need to install an outdoor antenna. To do so, connect an outdoor FM antenna to the FM socket on the rear of the system using a 75  $\Omega$  coaxial cable(not supplied).



### 4. How to improve the Radio reception.

- You can improve the quality of radio reception by :
  - Spread the AM/FM antenna out and attach the ends to a wall, in the position providing the best reception.
  - If reception is poor (e.g. distance from transmitter too close, walls blocking the radio waves, etc.), install an outdoor antenna.



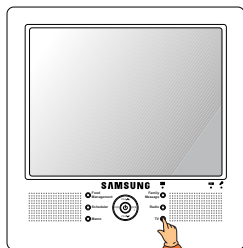

## HOW TO INSERT THE I.C.E. PAD IN THE DOCKING STATION OF THE REFRIGERATOR



### CAUTION

When you put I.C.E. PAD in the docking station of the refrigerator, make sure the I.C.E. PAD screen faces front.

Do not drop the I.C.E. PAD.  
It may cause malfunction and personal injury.

After extensive use, the surface of the I.C.E. pad may be hot. Be careful when touching the I.C.E. pad and when detaching it from the docking station or AC adapter.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

**When the following message is displayed.**

**"Battery is low. Please connect external power supply."**

- Save your data and recharge the battery with the AC adapter or the docking station of the refrigerator.

**When the following message is displayed.**

**"Memory is full. you cannot record any more."**

- Delete unnecessary voice messages from family message lists, and then retry recording.

**When Radio and TV functions do not work.**

- Make sure the Transmitter power is turned on.
- Make sure A/V cables, TV cable and AM/FM antenna cables are connected on the Transmitter correctly.

**When the I.C.E. PAD functions do not work.**

- Press the I.C.E. PAD power button for about three seconds to shut down the I.C.E. PAD, and then press the power button to restart the system.

**When the I.C.E. PAD turns off automatically.**

- Make sure power saving mode is set up.
- If ambient temperature of the I.C.E. PAD rises abnormally, the I.C.E. PAD's power turns off automatically to prevent it from overheating. Once the temperature of the I.C.E. PAD returns to normal, you can turn the unit back on.

**There is noise on FM/AM broadcasts.**

- Check the antenna is connected to the correct port.
- Install a FM/AM outdoor antenna in a direction with good reception sensitivity.

**TV function, When TV image do not display. (TV audio is normal.)**

- Change the channel, and then return to the previous channel, TV function will be displayed normal.
- If TV function isn't normal, turn off the I.C.E. PAD and Transmitter. And then, execute the TV function after turn on the I.C.E. PAD and Transmitter.
