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

## - Safety Instructions

Please read and understand all the instructions to avoid injury to yourself and damage to the device



### **Earphones**

### Follow Traffic Safety Instructions

- Do not use earphones while driving an automobile or riding a bicycle.
- It is not safe to listen at high volume while walking down the street, especially while crossing at intersections.

#### Protect your ears

- Do not turn the volume too high.
   Doctors warn against prolonged exposure to high volume.

- Battery Charger Safety



### **CAUTION**

RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK. DO NOT OPEN





The uninsulated parts inside the charger could cause electric shock.

For your safety, do not open the case of the charger.



Read this User Manual to prevent any problems that may occur while using the charger.

### Warning

• Use the charger away from water sources to avoid fire or electric shock.

### Caution

- Use the charger only with a power outlet that matches the shape of the converter's plug to avoid electric shock.
- Make sure that the charger's plug is inserted all the way into the outlet.


## - Charging the battery



A charger is supplied with your Samsung Napster Player.

### Plug the charger into a wall outlet.

- \* Red light indicates that the battery is being charged.
- Green light indicates that the battery is fully charged after charging




### Caution

- Do not charge longer than the specified charge time to avoid risk of fire.
- Do not plug several devices into the same outlet.
- Do not use a rechargeable battery or charger that is defective.
- When using the rechargeable battery for the first time or after several months of non-use, fully charge it before use.
- Do not charge the rechargeable battery for more than 24 hours.
- Overcharging or overdischarging will reduce the battery life.
- The rechargeable battery is consumable items and its capacity will decrease gradually.
- To prolong the life of your battery, use the fully charged battery until it is completely discharged, and then fully charge it again before use. If you charge the battery that is not completely drained, the battery operating time will decrease. In this case, fully cycle (fully charge and then fully discharge) the battery several times.
- Do not let metallic objects, such as necklaces or coins, come into contact with the terminals (metallic parts) of the charger and the built-in rechargeable battery.
   A fire or electric shock may result.

### When downloading or uploading files

The rechargeable batteries drain quickly when you download or upload recorded files. Always use the charger when transferring files.

## **Installation and Setup**

- Installing the Napster Software

The Napster application is included with the installation CD that came with your Samsung Napster Player. Before you install the Napster software, review the system requirements on page 13. If you don't already have Windows Media Player 9, it will automatically be installed as part of the installation process.

### You will first need to install the Napster application:

- Insert the installation CD that came with your Samsung Napster Player and follow the directions to install Napster.
- Follow the on-screen instructions as the InstallShield Wizard guides you through the installation. When the installation has completed, click [Finish].



## Installation and Setup

- Registering for a Napster Account
- 1. After you have completed the installation, create a member name and password. Enter the required information and click [submit].



### Note

If you already created your member name through a retailer's registration program, follow the [I am already a member] link in the upper right corner.

This completes your installation and registration of Napster. To find out more about the Napster Premium service click [yes, tell me more]. Otherwise, click [no thanks, just sign me in] to sign in to Napster and start purchasing tracks to transfer to your Samsung Napster Player.

- Checking the USB Driver

## Connecting your Samsung Napster Player to your PC with a USB Cable

- Charge the battery on the Samsung Napster Player, and then press the On/Off button to turn on the power.
- 2 Connect one end of the USB cable to the USB port on your PC.
- 3 Open the Samsung Napster Player's upper door and connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB cable socket.
  - is initializing or executing a command, your PC may malfunction. Be sure to perform a safe removal before physically disconnecting the USB cable.

For instructions on safely removing your device, see page 34.



 A message appears, indicating that a new device has been found, and the USB driver will be installed. If the USB driver does not install automatically, restart your PC and try again.

## Follow these steps to verify that your USB driver installed successfully:

Windows 2000 Professional:

If the USB driver is installed, "Samsung/Napster YP-910" will appear under "Universal Serial Bus Controllers."

- Uploading recorded files to a PC

## Changing the "Hidden files and folders" option

In order to be able to upload recorded files to a PC, you must first change the "Hidden files and folders" option on the View tab in the Folder Options.

**1** In Windows Explorer, click [Folder Options] on the [Tools] menu.



- 2 Choose the [View tab].
- 3 Check the item [Show hidden files and folders].



### Uploading recorded files

In Windows Explorer, select the drive indicated by "YEPP", and then click the \System\music folder.



2 Drag and drop the recording file (M\*\*\*.mp3) you want to upload to the PC onto the folder where you want it stored.



### Caution

Never delete or modify other folders or files in the yepp system folder.

- Searching for and Purchasing Music

#### Here are some things you should know about tracks purchased on Napster:

- Tracks purchased on Napster are yours to keep and can be burned to CD and seamlessly transferred to your Samsung Napster Player.
- You can have your purchased tracks on up to three computers.
   To copy your purchased tracks to another computer, use the [Sync/Restore] feature on Napster available from the [My Account] menu.
- The unlimited downloads that come with the Napster Premium service cannot be transferred to your device until they have been purchased.

#### Note

If you try to transfer to your Samsung Napster Player tracks that have not yet been purchased, you will automatically be prompted to purchase the tracks.

### To search for and purchase music on Napster:

1. Launch the Napster application by double-clicking the Napster icon on your desktop. Note

If you do not have the Napster application, see page 18 for instructions on installing Napster.

2. If there is a specific track you are looking for, simply type the artist, album, or track name in the search field in the upper right corner, select the [search] type from the drop-down menu, and click search. If you do not know specifically what you are looking for, you can go to the Browse tab to browse for music by genre.



3. Select the track(s) you would like to purchase.

### Note

You can also purchase an entire album by clicking the provided ([buy album]) link or selecting a track on the album, right-clicking, and choosing ([Buy Album].)

4. Click the [buy track] button, or right-click and choose [Buy Track(s)].

- 5. A confirmation page with your selected tracks is displayed. Click [Next].
- 6. If it is your first track purchase and you are not a Premium service member, you will be prompted to enter your credit card information.

Once you purchase the track, the track is automatically downloaded to your Napster Library. Purchased tracks can then be burned to CD and transferred to your Samsung Napster Player.

# Using Napster with Your Samsung Napster Player - Importing Your Existing Music

You can use Napster to import existing WMA or MP3 files into your Napster library. Once these imported tracks are in your Napster Library, you can add these tracks to playlists and transfer them to your Samsung Napster Player.

### Note

If you do not have the Napster Premium service and you attempt to import Napster tracks sent to you by other Napster members, you will be prompted to either purchase the tracks or sign up for the Napster Premium service. Any other protected WMA files will require that you have the correct license for those tracks to import them into Napster.

If you purchase the tracks, you can burn them and transfer them to your Samsung Napster Player. If you sign up for the Napster Premium service, the imported tracks are treated as regular Napster downloads.

### To Import WMAs or MP3s into your Napster Library:

- Select [Import Track(s) to My Library] from the [File] drop-down menu on the Napster application.
- 2. Browse to and select the directory where the tracks are located from the **[Folder]** window on the left.
- Select the particular tracks from the [Files] window on the right. To select multiple tracks, hold down the [Ctrl] or [Shift] keys while selecting, or click [select all].

4. Click the [OK] button.



5. A progress bar displays while the tracks are importing.

When the tracks successfully import, they will be stored and accessible from your Napster Library. You will also be prompted to edit the track data for any non-Napster tracks (see next section).

## - Editing Track Data

After you import non-Napster WMA or MP3 files into your Napster Library, you can edit the associated track information that affects how the tracks is displayed within Napster and your Samsung Napster Player.

#### Note

After you successfully import tracks, you will automatically be prompted to edit the track data.

#### To edit track data:

- 1. Select the track(s).
- 2. Right-click and Select [Edit Track Data].
- 3. Select the track from the [Track Filename] box on the left.



 Type in or edit the [Artist], [Album], [Track] and/or [Track #] on the right. The track # specifies the order the track appears within an album.

- 5. Click the [apply] button to apply the changes to that track.
- When finished, click [OK] to apply the changes and close the Edit Track Data screen.

After you edit the track information, the correct data is displayed when you view the tracks in your Napster Library.

### To edit multiple tracks or an entire album at one time:

- 1. Select the track(s) or album.
- 2. Select [Edit Track Data] from the [File] menu on the Napster application.
- 3. Click [Select All], or select multiple tracks using the [Ctrl] or [Shift] keys.



- 4. Type in or edit the [Artist] and/or [Album] title. If the box is selected, this change applies to all the tracks selected.
- 5. Click the [apply] button to apply the changes to those tracks or album.
- Once you edit the Artist and/or Album names for all the selected tracks, you can go back to individually edit the [Track] and [Track #] for each track.
- 7. When finished, click **[OK]** to apply the change and close the Edit Track Data screen.

After you edit the track information, the correct data is displayed when you view the tracks in your Napster Library.

## - Creating Playlists

### To create a playlist using Napster:

1. Select tracks from within Napster that you would like in your playlist. Tip

Hold down the [Ctrl] or [Shift] key while selecting to select multiple tracks.



- 3. Type in a title for the playlist in the highlighted box.
- 4. Click [save].

After you create the playlist, you can continue to add songs by selecting the track(s), clicking the add to playlist button, and then selecting the playlist from the **[add to playlist]** screen.

Additional changes to your playlist can be made by locating the playlist in your Napster Library:

- To rearrange tracks in your playlist, drag and drop the tracks in the desired order
- To remove tracks from your playlist, right-click and select [Delete Track(s)] from the drop-down menu or press the "Delete" key on your keyboard.
- To rename your playlist, right-click on the playlist and select [Rename Playlist] from the drop-down menu.

### Note

Changes to playlists cannot be made while the playlist is on your device.

To make changes to a playlist, make them on the playlist that is in your

Playlists folder of your Library, and then re-transfer the playlist to your device.

- Transferring Music to Your Samsung Napster Player

Tracks that you purchase through Napster can be transferred seamlessly to your Samsung Napster Player using the Napster application.

### Note

Before transferring, make sure your Samsung Napster Player battery is charged, otherwise your transfer may not complete successfully. When you plug your device into your computer through the USB port, the Napster application will automatically recognize it and display it as Samsung/Napster YP-910 under the menu tree of your Napster Library. If your Samsung Napster Player is not connected or detected, it will display a "Portable Device" icon.

If your Samsung Napster Player is not listed, check your connection and verify that the Samsung Napster Player is detected by your computer. (see page 20).

#### Note

If you try to transfer tracks to your Samsung Napster Player that you have not purchased yet, you will automatically be prompted to purchase the tracks.

Make sure your Samsung Napster Player battery is charged or connected to AC power.

### To transfer tracks from your Napster Library to your Samsung Napster Player:

1. Locate the track(s) or playlist that you want to transfer in your Library. Note

You can transfer tracks from anywhere else in Napster by right-clicking and selecting [Transfer Track(s) to Portable Device].

 Click and hold the mouse on the track(s) or playlist, then drag the tracks to the listed Samsung/Napster YP-910 icon in the left pane of your Napster Library (refer to the following figure).



### Note

If the tracks are Napster tracks that you have not already purchased, you will be prompted to purchase them.

Continued...

3. The progress of the transfer displays under Transfer Status. To view transfer status, click on the + in front of Samsung/Napster YP-910 under your Library to expand the sub-folders, and then click on [Transfer Status].



4. When the tracks have finished transferring, the status is listed as Complete. Important Note

Do not disconnect the device while the transfer is in progress.

Once the transfer is complete, you can disconnect your device by clicking the unplug/eject icon on your Windows taskbar and following the instructions in the message box that appears.

#### Important Note

Never unplug the device without first safely disconnecting. To safely disconnect or eject your Samsung Napster Player:

Windows 2000

Click the "unplug/eject" icon on your Windows taskbar and follow the instructions in the message box that appears. Windows XP

Click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon on your Windows taskbar and follow the instructions in the message box that appears.



## Using Napster with Your Samsung Napster Player

- Accessing Music on Your Samsung Napster Player

When you connect your Samsung Napster Player to your computer, you will be able to view the music that is currently loaded on your device. You can view your collected artists, albums, and playlists by clicking the [Samsung/Napster YP-910] icon in your Library.





Besides removing tracks, you cannot modify the general organizational structure of music on the device. You can play a track by double-clicking on it or by selecting it and clicking the play button.

### Note

You can only play the tracks stored on your device one at a time.

You can also only play tracks from the same computer that you used to transfer the tracks to your player.

### Note

To modify a playlist that is on your Samsung Napster Player, make the changes on the playlist that is in your Playlists folder of your Library, and then retransfer the playlist to your device.

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- Deleting Music on Your Samsung Napster Player

### To remove track(s) or playlists from your Samsung/Napster Player:

- Verify that your Samsung Napster Player is connected to your computer and displayed in your Napster Library as Samsung/Napster YP-910.
- Navigate to and locate the track(s) or playlist within the Samsung Napster Player menu tree.



Select the track(s) and click the [remove] button or press the [Delete] key on your keyboard.

#### Note

You can delete a playlist, but the tracks will still remain on your player and will need to be deleted separately.

## Using Napster with Your Samsung Napster Player

- Managing Your Existing Playlists

If you have an existing playlist on your Samsung Napster Player that you want to modify, you should do this through Napster.

### To modify an existing playlist using Napster:

- Locate the original playlist in your Napster Library (not the one under your Samsung Napster Player).
- 2. Make the desired changes (see the section on "Creating Playlists").
- When you have finished your changes, simply drag and drop the playlist back onto the [Samsung/Napster YP-910] icon in your Napster Library.
- 4. When prompted to overwrite the playlist on your device, answer [Yes].
- The modified playlist will now be accessible from your Samsung Napster Player.

- Getting Help with Napster

Additional help for the Napster application is available by clicking on the button from any screen, or through the Help drop-down menu. The following help options are available:

- User Guide: Comprehensive online instructions for using all the Napster features and functions
- FAQs: Answers to frequently asked questions about Napster
- Customer Support: If you are having issues or need help using Napster, you can fill out a help request form or find out how to contact Napster Customer Support by selecting Customer Support from the Help drop-down menu.

### Note

Napster Customer Support can assist with basic usage questions regarding your Samsung Napster Player, but if you need technical assistance or have an issue related to the device itself, you will need to contact Samsung Customer Support at 1-800-SAMSUNG.

- Playing music

Make sure the device is fully charged and the earphones are connected.

### **Turning Power On and Off**

Power On: Press and hold the ▶II button to turn on the power.

Power Off: While in Pause or Stop mode, press and hold the ►II button to turn off the power.

## **Playing Music**

Select Now Playing in the menu.

To play a track, press the ►II button.



## **Pausing Music**

Press the ►II button to pause Playback.

 While in Pause mode, briefly press >II again to resume playback.



#### Note

 WMA files can be played only if they are recorded with a compression rate between 14 Kbps to 192 Kbps that Windows Media Player supports.

## **Using Your Samsung Napster Player**

- Adjusting Volume

## **Adjusting the Volume**

Press the up or down volume button to adjust the volume.

### Note

- The volume can be adjusted in increments between 0 and 20.
- Press once to adjust the volume by one level.
   Press and hold to increase or decrease the volume in greater increments.



- Searching Within Music Files



#### Note

- VBR (Variable Bit Rate) File: An MP3 file that has varying compression ratios.
- When playing a VBR file, even if you press ◄◄ within 5 seconds after the start of playback, the previous song may not be played.
- The actual play time and the time displayed on the main unit may differ for VBR files.


## Searching for Specific Parts in PLAY Mode

 During playback, pull and hold the ◄◄/ ►► to forward or reverse search the currently playing file.




## Searching for Music Files in PLAY Mode.

- During playback, briefly pull the ►► to play the next track in the playlist.
- Briefly pull the ◄◄ to play the previous track in the playlist.
- Press and hold the Menu button to display the current playlist. Use the Volume Up, down buttons to find the song you want and press the II to play it.



## Searching for Music Files in STOP or PAUSE Mode.

While in stop or pause mode, pull the
 ◄◄/▶► to move to the previous or next track in the playlist and play it automatically.



### - Hold Feature

Use the Hold feature to lock and disable all buttons. The Hold feature is useful to prevent your Samsung Napster Player from being accidentally turned off or on, or to ensure uninterrupted playback.

#### Hold Function of the Main Unit

### Activate on the main unit.

- # All buttons on the main unit will be disabled, and only the buttons on the remote control can be used for input.
- \*When you activate the Hold switch, a " appears on the display.
- # appears on the display.

#### Hold Function of the Remote Control

### Activate on the remote control.

# All buttons on the remote control will be disabled, and only the buttons on the main unit can be used for input.

## **Using Your Samsung Napster Player**

- Menu Mode

### Press the Menu button to switch to MENU mode.

Use the Scroll Up/Scroll Down buttons to select the menu item you want, and then briefly press the Select button.



- Now Playing: Display the song currently playing.
- Library: Search and select music to play.
- FM Radio: Listen to FM radio
- Settings: Change the settings.
- FM Transmitter: Listen to your music by transmitting it wirelessly to another FM radio


### Note

• In MENU mode, press the Menu button to exit from the submenu you are in.


### Searching for and Selecting Music Files



- Artists: Shows the artist name from the ID3 tag information stored in the music file.
- Select the artist name, and then press the ►II button. All song titles corresponding to the artist name will be played.
- If you select an artist's name, song titles that correspond to that artist name will be
- You can use the Volume Up, Down buttons to move, and then press the Select button to play the selected song.



- Albums: Shows the album title from the ID3 tag information stored in the music file.
  - Select the albums, and then press the ▶II button. All song titles corresponding to the album name will be played.
  - If you select an album name, song titles corresponding to that album will be displayed.
  - You can use the Volume Up, Down buttons to choose a song, and then press the Select button to play the selected song.




- Tracks: Shows the song title from the ID3 tag information stored in the music file.
- You can use the Volume Up, Down buttons to move, and then press the Select button to play the selected song.

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### Selecting a Playlist

- In the Library, use the Scroll Up/Scroll Down buttons to select Playlists, and then press the Select button.
- 2 Select the playlist that you want to play, and then press the Select button.
  - The selected playlist will be played.



## **Using Your Samsung Napster Player**

- Playing FM Radio

### **Switching to FM Mode**

Press the Menu button.


Select the FM Radio in the main menu and then press the Select button.



## **Automatically Scanning for a Station**

Pull and hold the ◀◀/ ▶▶.

You can search for a station automatically.



## **Manually Tuning In a Station**


Briefly pull ◀◀/▶▶. You can search for a station manually.

### **Presetting FM Stations**

- 1 At the station you want to preset, press and hold the MENU button.
- Pull the ◀◀/▶▶ to select the location to which you want to store the station.
- Press the ►II to store the selected station.

   Briefly press the ►II, and then use the ◄
   to search for the station you want.



### Note

- To delete a station, press and hold the MENU button.
- You can preset up to 40 stations.
- You can preset a new station into the location that already has a station stored.
- After storing the station you want, press the ►II button. When PRESET appears on the display panel, use ◄◄/▶► to select the preset station.


## **Using Your Samsung Napster Player**

- Playing Music Via FM Transmission

This feature allows you to play music stored on your player through your home or car radio using FM transmission.

### Inserting the FM Transmission Antenna

Plug the FM transmission antenna into the FM transmission antenna jack.



### Note

 You will need to adjust the volume level from your external audio device or FM radio because the volume level of transmission in FM Transmission mode is set to a fixed level.

### **Selecting the FM Transmission Frequency**

- Press the Menu button to switch to Menu mode, use the Scroll Up/Scroll Down buttons to select FM Transmitter, and then press the Select button.
- 2 Use the Scroll Up/Scroll Down buttons to set the transmission frequency you want.
  - Press the Select button to store the selected frequency.




3 Set the external audio device's FM frequency to the transmission frequency and play a song. You will now be able to listen to music on your player from the FM radio on your home or car stereo.

## **Using Your Samsung Napster Player**

- Recording From FM Radio

- Press the Record button while listening to FM radio.
  - The current FM broadcast will be recorded into an MP3 file.
- Press the Record button again.
   Recording stops and the file is created.
  - Files are recorded and renamed M0001,
  - Files are recorded and renamed M000 M0002, and so on.
  - MP3 files are automatically added to your Library.



#### Note

 If no sound is heard while recording, check if the monitor volume in the recording setting menu is set to "Mute".

- Recording MP3s


Your Samsung Napster Player can be to used to record directly from any external audio source such as a CD player, cassette player, home stereo or radio.

#### Note

- Before you begin recording, verify that the battery is fully charged, otherwise your recording process may not complete successfully.
- Available recording time is displayed at the center right of the unit when recording starts. If there is no remaining capacity, recording stops automatically.

While in Music mode, use the Line-In cable to connect the main unit's LINE-IN jack and the LINE OUT jack of your external audio device.

 Connecting the Line-In cable to the HEADPHONE OUT jack of your external audio device may distort the recording because the headphone jack's output is too high. Be sure to connect the Line-In cable to the LINE OUT jack.



2 Press the Record button to start recording.






