#### Unpack





#### Install the battery


- If the device is on, press and hold  $[\mathbb{O}]$  and select **Power** off  $\rightarrow$  **OK** to turn it off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.



- Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.
- 3 Insert the battery.



4 Replace the back cover.



#### Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the device with a travel adapter or by connecting the device to a PC with a USB cable.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- When your battery is low, the device will emit a
  warning tone and display a low battery message. The
  battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level
  becomes too low, the device will automatically power
  off. Recharge your battery to continue using your
  device.
- If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the travel adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

#### Charge with a travel adapter

Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



1

Connecting the travel adapter improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

2 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the travel adapter from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged, first unplug the travel adapter from the device and then from the power outlet.
- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the device.
- To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the outlet when not in use to avoid wasting power. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

#### Insert a memory card (optional)


To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your device accepts microSD<sup>™</sup> or microSDHC<sup>™</sup> memory cards with maximum capacities of 32 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your device. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your device or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.



- Your device supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your device will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- When you insert a memory card in your device, the file directory of the memory card will appear in the external sd folder.
- Remove the back cover and the battery.
- Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

Before removing a memory card, first unmount it for safe removal.

#### Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your device. Format the memory card only on the device.





#### Use the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

Control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.
- Pinch: Place two fingers far apart, and then pinch them together.



- Your device turns off the touch screen when you do not use the device for a specified period. To turn on the screen, press [①] or the Home key.
- You can adjust the backlight time. In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Display → Screen timeout.

#### Lock or unlock the touch screen and keys

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted device operations.

To lock, press  $[\mathbb{O}]$ . To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing  $[\mathbb{O}]$  or the Home key, tap anywhere on the screen, and then drag  $\mathbb{O}$  outside of the large circle.

#### Get to know the idle screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the idle screen. From the idle screen, you can view indicator icons, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and other items.

The idle screen has multiple panels. Scroll left or right to a panel of the idle screen. You can also select a dot on the bottom of the screen to move to the corresponding panel of the idle screen directly.

#### Add items to the idle screen

You can customise the idle screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders. To add items to the idle screen,

- Press [□] → Add or tap and hold the empty area on the idle screen.
- 2 Select the item category  $\rightarrow$  an item:
  - Widgets: Add widgets. Widgets are small applications that provide convenient functions and information on your idle screen.

#### > Add or remove panels to the idle screen

You can add or remove panels of the idle screen to organise widgets according to your preferences and needs.

- In Idle mode, press [□] → Edit.
   You can also place your two fingers on the screen and pinch to switch to Edit mode.
- 2 Add or remove panels by using the following features:
  - To remove a panel, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the trash bin at the bottom of the screen.
  - To add a new panel, select .
  - To change the order of the panels, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the location you want.
- 3 When you are finished, press [≤].

#### **Access applications**

To access your device's applications,

- In Idle mode, select **Applications** to access the application list.
- 2 Scroll left or right to another application screen.
  You can also select a dot at the bottom of the screen to move directly to the corresponding screen.

- When you use applications provided by Google, you must have a Google account. If you do not have a Google account, sign up for a Google account.







If you know the web address of a web page, you can manually add a bookmark. To add a bookmark,





# Latitude

# Connectivity

#### **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 m without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.



- Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received via the Bluetooth wireless feature.
  - Always ensure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.
  - Some devices, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, may be incompatible with your device.

#### Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings.
- 2 Select **Bluetooth** to turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature.

#### > Find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled devices

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings** → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings → Scan devices.
- 2 Select a device.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and select **OK**. Alternatively, select **Accept** to match the PIN between your device and the device. When the owner of the other device enters the same


PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete. If the pairing is successful, the device will automatically search for available services.



Some devices, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, may have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as 0000. If the other device has a PIN, you must enter it.

# > Send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- Select a file or item, such as a contact, memo, or media file, from an appropriate application or My files.
- 2 Select an option for sending data via Bluetooth.



3 Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled device.

# Receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
 → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings →
 Discoverable.

Your device is visible to other Bluetooth devices for 120 seconds.

- When prompted, enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and select **OK**. Alternatively, select **Accept** to match the PIN between your device and the device.
- 3 Open the notifications panel and select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device (if necessary).

Received data is saved to the bluetooth folder. If you receive a contact, it is automatically saved to the phonebook.

# Make calls by pairing with a phone

You can make a call with your device when you pair it with a Bluetooth-enabled phone.



To use this feature, you must create a contact first.

- 1 Activate the Bluetooth feature on the phone to locate and pair with your device.
- 2 Search for contacts and make calls with your device.

While dialling, you can make the call from either of the paired devices by selecting a device from the pop-up window.

#### Wi-Fi

Learn to use your device's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n standards.

You can connect to the internet or other network devices anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.



Your device uses non-harmonised frequency and is intended for use in all European countries. The Wi-Fi can be operated in the EU without restriction indoors, but cannot be operated outdoors in France.

#### Activate the Wi-Fi feature

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$ Wireless and network  $\rightarrow$  Wi-Fi settings  $\rightarrow$  Wi-Fi.



The Wi-Fi feature running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, activate the feature only when needed.

Using WPS, you can connect to a secured network. To connect to a Wi-Fi AP with a WPS button,

   → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2 Select WPS button connection.
- $\beta$  Press a WPS button on the access point within 2 minutes.

To connect to a Wi-Fi AP with a WPS PIN,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2 Select a network indicated by the WPS icon and select WPS PIN.
- 3 On the access point, enter the PIN and press the start button.

#### **AllShare**

Learn to use the Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) service that enables you to share media files between DLNA-enabled devices in your home over Wi-Fi.

You must first activate the Wi-Fi feature and add a Wi-Fi profile. ▶ p. 81



- Playback quality may vary by content type.
- Some files may not play properly depending on how they are encoded.

# Customise DLNA settings for sharing media files

To allow other DLNA-enabled devices to access media files on your device, you must activate media sharing.

- $I\,$  In Idle mode, open the application list and select **AllShare**.
- 2 Press [ $\blacksquare$ ] → **Settings**.
- 3 Adjust the following settings to customise the DLNA feature:

Device name	Enter a name for your device as a media server.
Share videos	Turn on video sharing with other DLNA-enabled devices.

Default memory	Select the default memory location for saving downloaded media files.

- 5 Control playback using icons of your device.



Playback may be buffered, depending on the network connection and the connected server.

# > Play files of one device on the other device

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **AllShare**.
- 2 Select Remote device. Your device automatically searches for DLNA-enabled devices.
- 3 Select a device as the media server—the one that contains media files.
- 4 Select a media category and a file.
- 5 Select a player—the one that will play the media file. Playback begins at the selected player.
- 6 Control playback using icons of your device.



#### TV connections

Learn to use your device as a remote control for your Samsung smart TV by connecting them via Wi-Fi. Once they are linked, you can also view live feeds on your device in Dual view mode.



This feature is available only with TVs that support wireless remote controls.

- Connect your device and a Samsung smart TV to a same Wi-Fi AP.

- 6 Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 7 Start synchronisation.

# Connect as a mass storage device

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the file directory of the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.



The file directory of the memory card will appear as a removable disk, separate from the internal memory.

- If you want to transfer files from or to a memory card, insert a memory card into the device.
- 2 In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and network → USB settings → Mass storage.

- 3 Using a USB cable, connect the multifunction jack on your device to a PC.
- 4 When connected, select **Turn on USB storage**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.
- 5 Open the folder to view files.
- 6 Copy files from the PC to the device or memory card.
- 7 When you are finished, select **Turn off USB storage**.



To disconnect the device from the PC, click the USB device icon on the Windows task bar and click the option to safely remove the mass storage device. Then remove the USB cable from the PC. Otherwise, you may lose data stored on the memory card or damage the memory card.

#### **VPN** connections

You can create virtual private networks (VPN) and connect to your private network securely through a public network, such as the internet.



Your device should already be configured with internet access. If you have trouble accessing the internet, you need to edit connections. If you are not sure about the connection information to enter, ask your service provider.

  → Wireless and network → VPN settings → Add VPN.

## > Connect to a private network

   → Wireless and network → VPN settings.
- 2 Select a private network.
- 3 Enter the user name and password and select **Connect**.

# **Tools**

#### Clock

Learn to set and control alarms, and world clocks. You can also use the stopwatch and count-down timer.

#### Set a new alarm

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Clock**  $\rightarrow$ Alarm
- 2 Select Create alarm or press [□] → Create.
- 3 Set alarm details.
- 4 Select the check box next to **Smart alarm** to activate simulated nature sounds with the alarm screen prior to the main alarm.
- 5 When you are finished, select **Save**.

## Stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds,

- To stop the alarm, drag outside of the large circle.
- To repeat the alarm after a specified length of time, drag outside of the large circle.

#### Delete an alarm

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Clock**  $\rightarrow$ Alarm
- 2 Press  $[ \blacksquare ] \rightarrow$  **Delete**.
- 3 Select alarms to delete.
- 4 Select **Delete**.

#### Create a world clock

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Clock → World clock.
- 2 Select **Add city** or press  $[ □ ] \rightarrow Add$ .
- 3 Enter a city name or select one from the city list. To select a city in the world map view, select ...
- 4 To add more world clocks, repeat steps 2-3.



## > Use the stopwatch

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Clock → Stopwatch.
- 2 Select **Start** to begin the stopwatch.
- 3 Select **Lap** to record lap times.
- 4 When you are finished, select **Stop**.
- 5 Select **Reset** to clear recorded times.

#### Use the count-down timer

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Clock → Timer.
- 2 Set the length of time to count down.
- 3 Select Start to begin the countdown. You can now use other functions with the timer counting down in the background. Press the Home key or [➡] and access another application.

#### **Calculator**

Learn to perform mathematical calculations directly on your device like a typical hand-held or desktop calculator.

- 3 To open a downloaded file, select the log.
  To delete a log, select the check box and then select
  Delete.

# **Google Search**

You can search for applications and files in your device and specific data on the web.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Google Search.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, set whether or not to view the search history of your Google account.
- 3 Enter a letter or a word of the data to search.
- 4 Select the item's name you want to access.

#### Kies air

Kies air allows you to connect a PC to your device via Wi-Fi. From the PC browser, you can view and control media files, contacts, messages, and any other data saved on your device.

# Customise Kies air settings

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Kies air**.
- Press  $[ \blacksquare ] \rightarrow$  **Settings**.
- Change the following options:

Option	Function
Access request	Set to receive authorisation requests from other devices while your device is connected to a PC.
Enable visibility	Set the device to be visible to a PC.

Option	Function
Time-out	Select the length of time the device waits before ending the connection.
Lock contents	Select the types of data that should not display on the PC browser.
Reset settings	Reset your settings to the factory default values.

## Connect a PC to your device via a Wi-Fi

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Kies air
   → Start.
- 2 Enter the web address displayed by Kies air in the browser on your PC.
- 3 Select Allow (if necessary).
  When connected, you will see your device data on the PC's web browser.
- 4 To end the connection, select **Stop**.

# My files

Learn to quickly and easily access all of your images, videos, music, sound clips, and other types of files stored in your device and memory card.

  - To move up one level in the file directory, select **Up**.
  - To return to the Home directory, select **Home**.

3 Select a file to open.

In a folder, press [□] to use the following options:

- To send a file to others, select **Share**.
- To create a new folder, select **Create folder**.
- To delete files or folders, select **Delete**.
- To change the view mode, select **View as**.
- To sort files or folders, select **Sort by**.
- To use additional features using a file, such as moving, copying or renaming option, select **More**.

# Quickoffice

Learn to view Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and PDF files on your device or memory card.

# Open a Quickoffice document

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Quickoffice.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, register as an online user or skip the registration.
- 3 Select a Quickoffice program.
- 4 Select **SD Card**  $\rightarrow$  a document file.



To create and edit Word, Excel, and PowerPoint files, create a Quickoffice account and purchase a licence.

You can download program updates, new Quickoffice products, or special offers.

### **Troubleshooting**

### Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
   Contact your service provider for more details.

### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
   Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

### Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold [①] for 8-10 seconds and release. The device will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Privacy** → **Factory data reset** → **Reset device** → **Erase everything**.

### The device beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the device.

### The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose
  of the old battery properly and replace it with a new
  battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal
  instructions).

### Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.



### Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile device for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate licence or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.
