## USING THE TOUCH BUTTON

Tap on touch screen with your fingertip.





- To avoid damage to the touch screen, do not use any object other than your fingers to operate the touch screen.
- Do not tap on the touch screen if your fingers are not clean.
- Do not tap on the touch screen with gloves on.
- The touch screen may not function if you use a fingernail or other instruments such as a ballpoint pen.

## **USING THE SPEAKER**



Slide the middle of the player in the arrow direction while listening to music or the radio.


- You can listen to music through the speaker.
   Make sure that the earphones are connected to the player if you want to listen to the radio through the speaker.
- If you want to use the earphone for enjoying the music, close the speaker by sliding back to the original position.
   If you close the slide panel, the speaker will shut off.
- Please position the player horizontally when using the speaker.

#### CHARGING THE BATTERY

Charge it before using the player for the first time and when you haven't used it for a long time.

The battery for your mp3 player will fully charge in about 3 hours, although total charging time varies depending on your PC environment.



- Connect the other (larger) end of the USB cable to the USB Connection Port on the bottom of the player.
- 2. Connect the USB cable to the USB port (◆◆) on your PC.

## CARING FOR THE BATTERY

Your battery will last longer if you follow these simple guidelines for caring for and storing it.

- Recharge and store the battery within the temperature range of 40°F~95°F (5°C~35°C).
- Do not overcharge (longer than 12 hours).
   Excessive charging or discharging may shorten the battery's life.
- · Battery life naturally shortens slowly over time.



 If you are charging the player while it is connected to a laptop computer, make sure the laptop's battery is also fully charged or that the laptop is plugged into its power source.

## TURNING THE POWER ON & OFF

#### Turning the Power on

Slide and hold the **(HOLD)** switch in the opposite direction of the arrow.

Power is turned on.

#### Turning the Power off

Slide and hold the o (HOLD) switch in the opposite direction of the arrow again.

Power is turned off.



 Your mp3 player will be automatically turned off when none of the buttons have been pressed for a specific length of time in the pause mode. The factory setting for <a href="Auto Power Off">Auto Power Off</a> is 1 minute, but you can change this length of time. See <a href="page 31">page 31</a> for more information.



## PLAYING MUSIC

Load music files onto your new mp3 player using Samsung Media Studio. Learn more about Media Studio on page 35.

- Press and briefly hold [➡] to move to the main menu screen.
- **2.** Tap [ $\langle \rangle$ ] to select **<Music>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
- 3. Use [∧ ∨] and [○] to select a music file of your choice.
- 4. Tap [ ].
  - The music file will begin playing.



- Tap [ つ ] to move to the previous screen.
- NOTE Press and briefly hold [ つ] to move to the main menu screen.



# CONTROLLING THE VOLUME

Tap [∧ ∨].

- You will see a volume control icon.
- The range of volume is set between 0 to 30.
- Tap [∧] to increase the volume or [∨] to decrease it.



#### DISABLING THE BUTTONS

The hold function disables all the other buttons on the mp3 player, so that if you accidentally bump one-while working out, for example-your music won't be interrupted.

- 1. Slide the o (HOLDE) in the direction of the arrow.
- 2. Slide the O(HOLDE) in the opposite direction of the arrow to release the Lock function.



## BROWSING FOR FILES USING "File Browser"

Search easily for files using the "File Browser" function.

- Press and briefly hold [➡] to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [ < > ] to select <File Browser> and tap [ ].
  - The <File Browser> folder list containing "Music, Playlists, Video, Pictures, Datacasts, Texts, Recorded Files, Games and Received Files "appears.
- 3. Tap [  $\land \ \ \lor$  ] to select a desired folder.
- 4. Tap [ ] to bring up the file list in the selected folder.
  - Tap [ ] to move to the previous screen.
- 5. Tap [ \( \ldots \)] to select a desired file.
- 6. Tap [ ].
  - The file will start playing.



# **DELETING FILES WITH (FILE BROWSER)**

- Press and briefly hold [5] to move to the main menu screen.
- **2.** Tap [ $\langle \cdot \rangle$ ] to select **<File Browser>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <File Browser> folder list containing appears.
- 3. Tap [∧ ∨] to select a desired folder.
- Tap [∴ √] to select the file that you want to delete and tap [□].
- **5.** Tap  $[\land \lor]$  to select **<Delete>** and tap  $[\bigcirc]$ .
  - The confirmation window will apear.
- 6. Tap [ < > ] to select < Yes > and tap [ ].
  - The file will be deleted

## CHANGING THE SETTINGS AND PREFERENCES

Your mp3 player comes with settings and preferences that were set up at the factory, but you can change these pre-set values to truly customize your player.



Tap [ ★] to move to the previous screen.
 Press and briefly hold [★] to move to the main menu screen.

# Menu Style Settings

You can change the menu design and font and delete the background image of the main menu.

- Press and briefly hold [5] to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [< >] to select <Settings> and tap [ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap [ $\land \lor$ ] to select **<Menu Style>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <Menu Style> menu appears.
- **4.** Use the [∧ ∨] and [○] to set functions.
  - Tap [ ] to move to the next item/select the menu.
  - Tap [∧ ∨] to move up or down through the current menu.

#### Menu Style Setting Options

- Menu Design: You can change the style of the main menu screen. Select from <Crystal>, <My skin>, <Stella>.
- Font: You can change the font type of the menu language. Select one from 3 font types.
- Reset My Skin: Initializes the background image of the screen display to its
  default image.



# **Sound Settings**

You can set the master EQ, beep sound, volume limit.

- Press and briefly hold [ to move to the main menu screen.
- **2.** Tap [ $\langle \cdot \rangle$ ] to select **<Settings>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap [ $\land \lor$ ] to select **<Sound>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <Sound> menu appears.
- 4. Use the [^ ∨] and [ ○] to set functions.



#### **Sound Setting Options**

- Master EQ: You can optimize sound settings. Tap [⟨⟨⟩⟩] to select the frequency you want to adjust. The frequency can be selected from <60Hz>,<125Hz>, <250Hz>, <500Hz>, <1KHz>, <2KHz>, <4KHz>, <8KHz>, and<16KHz>.Tap [⟨⟨√⟩] to adjust the selected frequency's level and then tap [⟨○⟩].
- Beep Sound: Sets the beep sound for button operations to on or off. Select from <Off> and <On>.
- Volume Limit: You can avoid hearing damage by setting the limit of the volume when using the earphone. <On> will limit the maximum volume level to 15. The maximum volume level when volume limit is set to <Off> is 30. Even if you have select <Off>, the volume will be set back to 15 to avoid hearing damage when you turn the player back on.

# **Display Settings**

Change the display off time, the screen saver and brightness of your screen.

- 1. Press and briefly hold [ to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [ < > ] to select <Settings> and tap [ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap [ $\land \lor$ ] to select **<Display>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <Display> menu appears.
- Use the [△ ∨] and [◎] to set functions.



#### **Display Setting Options**

- Display Off: If no button is tapped within the time set shown below, the screen display will be automatically turned off. Select either <15 sec>,<30 sec>, <1 min>, <3 min>, <5 min>, or <Always On>. Press any button to turn it back on. However, Sliding the OCHODED in the opposite direction of the arrow when the HOLD condition is on will not turn on the display.
- Screen Saver: You can set an image to use as a screen saver. Select either
   <Analog Clock>, <Digital Clock>, <Animation 1>, <Animation 2>,<Animation 3>
   and set the wait time. You can select from <Off>, <15sec>, <30sec>, <1min>,
   <3min> and <5min>. If no button is tapped within the time set shown above, the
   player will display the screen saver image.
- Brightness: You can adjust the brightness of the display screen. Select a level from <0-10>, where 10 is the brightest.

# **Language Settings**

The menus on your new mp3 player can be set to appear in any one of multiple languages. You can change your preference language easily.

- 1. Press and briefly hold [ to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [ < > ] to select < Settings > and tap [ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap [ $\land \lor$ ] to select **<Language>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <Language> menu appears.
- Use the [∧ ∨] and [○] to set functions.



#### **Language Setting Options**

- Menu: Set the menu language. Select from <English>, <한국어>, <Français>, <Deutsch>, <Italiano>, <日本語>, <汉语(简体)>, <Español>, <繁體中文>, <Pyccкий>, <Magyar>, <Nederlands>, <Polski>, <Português>, <Svenska>, <'\nuı>, <čeština>, <Eλληνικά>, <Türkçe>, <Norsk>, <Dansk>, <suomi>, <Español (Sudamérica)>, <Português (América do Sul)>, <Indonesia>, <Tiếng Việt>, <Bulgarian>, <Romani>, <Українська>, <Slovenščina> or <Slovenský>.
- Contents: Set the language in which the track information and Text will appear. Select from <English>, <Korean>, <French>, <German>, <Italian>, <Japanese>, <Chinese(S)>, <Tranditional Chinese>, <Spanish>, <Russian>, <Hungarian>, <Dutch>, <Polish>, <Portuguese>, <Swedish>, <Thai>, <Finnish>, <Danish>, <Norwegian>, <Farsi>, <Afrikaans>, <Basque>, <Catalan>, <Czech>, <Estonian>, <Greek>, <Hrvatski>, <Icelandic>, <Romany>, <Slovak>, <Slovene>, <Turkish> or <Vietnamese>.

# **Time Settings**

Setting the time allows you to use the date/time set, date type and even time zone.

- 1. Press and briefly hold [ to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [< >] to select **<Settings>** and tap [ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap  $[\land \lor]$  to select **<Time>** and tap  $[\bigcirc]$ .
  - The <Time> menu appears.
- Use the [∧ ∨] and [○] to set functions.



#### **Time Setting Options**

- Date & Tme: You can set the current time and date. Tap [ ⟨ ⟩ ] to move to ⟨Year, Month, Date, Hour, Min, AM/PM> and tap [ ∧ ∨ ] to set each item.
- Date Type: You can set the time display type for the World Clock. Select from <YY-MM-DD>, <MM-DD-YY> and <DD-MM-YY>.
- Time Zone: You can change the current time by selecting an international city-specific time zone. You must set the time zone before you can display the world time information. See page 88.

# **System Settings**

Choose the sleep timer, start mode, auto power off, default setting that's right for you.

- 1. Press and briefly hold [ 5] to move to the main menu screen.
- 2. Tap [ < > ] to select **<Settings>** and tap [ ].
  - The <Settings> menu appears.
- 3. Tap [ $\land \lor$ ] to select **<System>** and tap [ $\bigcirc$ ].
  - The <System> menu appears.
- Use the [∧ ∨] and [○] to set functions.



#### **System Setting Options**

- Sleep: Turns off power automatically after the preset time. Select either <Off>,
   <15 min>, <30 min>, <60 min>, <90 min>, or <120 min>.
- Start Mode: You can set the start screen displayed when you turn on the player. Select from <Home> and <Last State>. Select <Home> to start the system with the main menu screen while <Last State> will use the last used menu screen.
- Auto Power Off: Automatically turns power off when there is no button operation after the preset time in the pause mode. Select either <15sec>, <30sec>, <1min>, <5min>, <5min> or <Always On>.
- Default Set: Returns all settings to the default value. Select either <Yes> or <No>. <Yes> initializes all settings to default. <No> cancels default settings.
- Format: Formats the internal memory. Select either <Yes> or <No>.
   Selecting <Yes> will format the internal memory and delete all files on the player. Selecting <No> does not format the internal memory.
   Check before formatting it.
- About: Checks the firmware version and memory capacity.
   Firmware Version> displays the current firmware version.
   Used> indicates the usage, <Available> indicates the remaining capacity and
   Total> indicates the total memory capacity.



# RESETTING THE SYSTEM

If your mp3 player won't turn on, won't play music, or isn't recognized by your computer when you connect it, you may have to reset the system.



Press the Reset hole at the rear of the player with a pointed object such as a safety clip.

- The system will be initialized.
- Your settings and files will not be affected.

Samsung Media Studio is the easy-to-use software application that helps you organize your files on your PC. With your files already sorted and organized in Media Studio, you can guickly transfer them to your mp3 without searching your entire hard drive for the right file.
