This User Manual covers HMX-S10, HMX-S15, and HMX-S16 models.

- The HMX-S15 and HMX-S16 have a 32GB, and a 64GB built-in storage media (SSD) respectively with a built-in WIFI module but also use memory cards.
- The HMX-S10 models do not have built-in storage media (SSD) and use memory cards. Although some features of HMX-S10 models are different, they operate in the same way.
- Illustrations of model HMX-S10 are used in this user manual.
- The displays in this user manual may not be exactly the same as those you see on the LCD screen.
- Designs and specifications of the camcorder and other accessories are subject to change without any notice.
- In this user manual, the icon or symbol in the parenthesis appearing in a description of a submenu item indicates it will appear on the screen when setting the corresponding item.

Ex) Submenu item of "iSCENE" →page 61

 "Sports" (%): Recording people or objects in motion. (If set, the corresponding icon (%) will appear on the screen.)

The following terms are used in this manual:

- 'Scene' refers to the point where you press the Record Start/Stop button to start recording until you press again to pause the recording.
- The terms 'photo' and 'still image' are used interchangeably with the same meaning.

Before using this camcorder

- This camcorder records video in H.264 (MPEG4 part10/AVC) format and in High Definition Video (HD-VIDEO) or Standard Definition Video (SD-VIDEO).
- You can play back and edit the video recorded by the camcorder on a personal computer with the built-in software in this camcorder.
- Please note that this camcorder is not compatible with other digital video formats.
- Before recording important video, make a trial recording.
 - Play back your trial recording to make sure the video and audio have been recorded properly.
- Recorded contents may be lost due to a mistake when handling this camcorder or memory card, etc. Samsung shall not be responsible for compensation for damages due to the loss of recorded contents.


This CAMCORDER may be equipped with either a polarized 2-wire AC line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other) or a 3-wire grounding type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug still fails to fit, contact your electrician to replace your outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

19. POWER-CORD PROTECTION:

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords or plugs, convenient receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.

20. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING:

21. LIGHTNING:


You can record videos in H.264 format that are convenient to email and share with your friends and family. You can also take photos with your camcorder.

STEP1: Get ready

- 1. Attach the battery to the camcorder. →page 20
 - Align the battery grooves with the battery compartment, and then slide the battery into place in the direction of the arrow.

Installing the button type battery (CR2025) in the remote control

- 3. Place the battery holder back in the remote control. Match its (((iii)) mark with the ((iii)) mark on the remote control, and then turn the battery holder clockwise to lock it.

- The button battery has a expected lifetime of 5 to 6 months, depending on how much you use the remote control.

ATTACHING/DETACHING THE BATTERY

Purchase extra batteries to allow continuous use of your camcorder.



To attach the battery

Align the battery grooves with the battery compartment, and then slide the battery into place in the direction of the arrow.

To detach the battery

Slide the **Battery release** switch and pull out the battery.

• Gently slide the **Battery release** switch in the direction as shown in the figure.



- Samsung is not responsible for problems that are caused by using unapproved batteries. If you use batteries from other manufacturers, there is a danger of overheating, fire, or explosion.
- Detach the battery from the camcorder with care to prevent it from falling.

CHARGING THE BATTERY


You can charge the battery using the AC power adaptor or USB cable.


To charge the battery with the AC power adaptor

- 1. Press the Power (⊚) button to turn off the camcorder. → page 25
- 2. Open the jack cover and connect the AC power adaptor to the DC IN jack.
- 3. Connect the AC power adaptor to a wall socket.
 - The charging (CHG) indicator lights up and charging starts. After the battery is fully charged, the charging (CHG) indicator turns green.



To charge the battery with the USB cable

- 1. Press the Power (⊚) button to turn off the camcorder. →page 25
- 2. Open the jack cover.
- **3.** Connect the included USB cable to the USB jack on the camcorder and to a USB jack on a running PC.
 - The charging (CHG) indicator lights up and charging starts. After the battery is fully charged, the charging (CHG) indicator turns green.





- Please make sure that there are no foreign substances on plug and in the socket when you connect the AC power supply to the camcorder.
- Charging the battery at low temperature may take longer or the battery may fail to fully charge (green indicator will not turn on).



- The battery is not charged during the power saving mode, which may keep the mode indicator on or flashing. Start
 charging the battery after turning off the camcorder by pressing the Power (
) button.
- We recommend you charge the battery pack in a place with an ambient temperature of 10°C ~ 30°C (50°F~86°F).
- When charging, if both the USB cable and AC power adaptor are connected, the AC power adaptor will override
 the USB.
- The camcorder does not operate with USB power only. Use the power adaptor or battery to operate the camcorder.
- When charging using the USB jack, charging time may depend on the type of USB host (PC).



About the battery

· Battery Properties

A lithium-ion battery is small-sized and has a high capacity. Low ambient temperature (below 100°) may shorten its life-span and affect its function. Before recording in low temperatures, put the battery into your pocket to warm it, then install it in the camcorder.

· Make sure to store the battery separately after use.

- A small amount of battery power is consumed when the battery is stored in the camcorder even if the camcorder power is off.
- If the battery is installed and left in the camcorder for a long time, the battery discharges. If this occurs, you may not be able to use the battery, even if you charge it fully.
- Keep the battery out of reach of children.
- If the battery is not used for a long time, fully charge the battery and use it up on your camcorder once per 6
 months to maintain proper function.

· Charge an extra battery before using the camcorder outdoors.

- The cold temperature may shorten the length of time you can use the battery before needing to recharge it.
- Carry the supplied AC power adaptor to charge the battery while travelling.
- Check whether the battery terminal is damaged if the battery falls or is dropped.
 - If you install a battery with the damaged terminal into the camcorder, you can damage the camcorder.
- Remove the battery and the memory card from the camcorder and disconnect the AC power adaptor after use.
 - Store the battery in a stable, cool and dry place.
 - (Recommended temperature: 59°F ~ 77°F (15C°~ 25C°), recommended humidity: 40%~ 60%)
 - Temperatures that are too high or too low shorten the battery lifetime.
 - The battery terminals can become rusty or malfunction if the battery is stored in a smoky or dusty location.

· Do not throw the battery into fire.

- Heating or burning the battery may cause an explosion.
- · Throw away the dead battery into a recycling bin.
- · The battery lifetime is limited.
 - Battery capacity decreases over time and through repeated use. If decreased usage time between charges becomes significant, it is probably time to replace the battery with a new one.
 - Each battery's life is affected by storage, operating, and environmental conditions.

Using an AC power source

We recommend that you use the AC power adaptor to power the camcorder from a household AC outlet when you set function settings, play back, or edit images, or use it indoors. Make the same connections as you do when charging the battery. →page 21




- Make sure to turn off the camcorder before disconnecting the AC power adaptor. Otherwise, you
 can damage the storage media or data.
- Use a nearby wall outlet when using the AC power adaptor. Disconnect the AC power adaptor from the wall outlet immediately if any malfunction occurs while using your camcorder.
- Do not use the AC power adaptor in a narrow space, such as between a wall and furniture.



- Be sure to use the specified AC power adaptor to power the camcorder. Using other AC power adaptors could cause electric shock or result in fire.
- The AC power adaptor can be used around the world. An AC plug adaptor is required in some foreign countries. If you need one, purchase it from your distributor.

TURNING YOUR CAMCORDER ON/OFF



- 1. Open the LCD screen to turn on the camcorder.
 - Your camcorder turns on automatically when you open the LCD screen.
 - The lens opens automatically when the camcorder turns on.


If you need to use camcorder for the extended time, setting the following functions prevents unnecessary energy consumption.

Quick On STBY Mode in the STBY mode

The camcorder switches to "Quick On STBY" mode when the LCD screen is closed.

Sleep Mode in the play mode (includes the thumbnail index view)

- The camcorder switches to the sleep mode when the LCD screen is closed, and then, if idle
 for more than 20 minutes, the camcorder turns off. However, if "Auto Power Off: 5 Min" is
 set, the camcorder turns off in 5 minutes.
- If you open the LCD screen during sleep mode, the sleep mode ends and the camcorder returns to the last operation mode used.






- The power saving mode does not work in the following situations:
 - When the camcorder has a cable connection. (Audio/Video, Mini HDMI, USB, or AC power adaptor, etc.)
 - While recording, playing back, or displaying a slideshow.
 - When the LCD screen is opened.
- The camcorder consumes less battery power in the power saving mode. However, if you plan to
 use the camcorder for an extended time, we recommend you turn off the camcorder by pressing
 the Power (③) button when not using it.

SETTING THE OPERATION MODES

USING THE TOUCH PANEL

The touch panel lets your playback and record with a simple touch of your finger. Place your hand on the rear side of the LCD screen to support it. Then, touch the items displayed on the screen.



Touch

Slightly touch the items to select or execute with your finger.



Drag the touch screen to left or right to select the desired items or files.







- Do not place a protective film on the LCD screen.
- If you leave a film attached for a long while, strong adhesion between the film and the surface of the screen may cause a malfunction of the touch panel.



- Be careful not to accidentally press the buttons near the LCD panel while using the touch panel.
- The tabs and indicators that appear on the LCD screen depend on the current recording/playback status of your camcorder.
- The camcorder does not recognize touches if you touch more than two points on the screen at the same time. Touch one point at a time.
- If you use a tool, such as a pen or pencil, the camcorder may not recognize the touch properly.

first time settings

SETTING THE TIME ZONE AND DATE/TIME FOR THE FIRST TIME

Set the date and time of your local area when turning on this camcorder for the first time.

- 1. Open the LCD screen to turn on the camcorder.
 - Your camcorder turns on automatically when you open the LCD screen.
 - The time zone ("Home") screen appears based on Lisbon, London (Greenwich Mean Time).
- 2. Select the time zone, then touch the () tab.

- 3. Set the date.
 - Set the date by touching the corresponding item or dragging it up or down.
- 4. Touch the time () tab, then set the time.
 - Set the time by touching the corresponding item or dragging it up or down.
- 5. Make sure the clock is correctly set, then touch the () tab.
 - The message "Date/Time Set" appears.









- You can set the year up to 2037, based on the "Home" item.
- Set "Date/Time Display" to On. →page 90
- You can change the time zone and date/time options in the setting menu. →pages 98~99
- Activating the (*) icon moves the time forward by 1 hour.

Q Built-in rechargeable battery

- Your camcorder includes a built-in rechargeable battery that retains the date and time settings even after the power is turned off.
- If the battery is depleted, the current date/time values are reset to the default values. If this occurs, you
 need to recharge the built-in rechargeable battery (see below), and then re-set the current date and time.

Charging the built-in rechargeable battery

- The built-in battery is always recharged while your camcorder is connected to the AC power or while the battery is attached.
- If the camcorder is not in use for about 2 weeks and you have not connected the AC power or the battery to it, the built-in battery fully discharges. If this occurs, charge the built-in battery by connecting the camcorder to the supplied AC adaptor for 24 hours.

SELECTING THE LANGUAGES

You can select the language in which the camcorder displays the menu screen or messages. The language setting is retained when the camcorder is powered off.





- MMC (Multi Media Card) and MMC Plus are not supported.
- Compatible memory card capacity: SD 1GB ~ 2GB, SDHC 4GB ~ 32GB
- Use compatible memory card brands.
 Others are not guaranteed to work. A list of compatible brands is below:
 - SDHC/SD cards: Panasonic, SanDisk, TOSHIBA
- For video recording, use a memory card that supports faster write speeds (above SDHC Class 6 card).
- SD/SDHC memory cards have a mechanical write-protection switch.
 Setting the switch prevents accidental erasure of files recorded on the card. To enable writing, move the switch up in the direction of the terminals. To set write protection, move the switch down.



SDHC (Secure Digital High Capacity) cards

- SDHC (Secure Digital High Capacity) memory card
 - An SDHC card is a higher version (Ver. 2.00) of the SD card and supports capacities above 2GB.
 - SDHC cards cannot be used with current SD enabled host devices.

Common cautions for memory cards

- Damaged data may not be recoverable.
 We recommend you make a back-up of important data separately on the hard disk of your PC.
- Turning the power off or removing a memory card during an operation such as formatting, deleting, recording, and playback may cause data loss.
- After you modify the name of a file or folder stored in the memory card using your PC, your camcorder may not recognize the modified file.

Handling a memory card

- We recommend that you power off before inserting or removing the memory card to avoid data loss.
- We can not guaranteed that you can use memory cards formatted by other devices.
 When you format a card, be sure to format the memory card using this camcorder.
- You must format newly-purchased memory cards, memory cards with data that your camcorder cannot recognize, and cards with data saved by other devices. Note that formatting erases all data on the memory card.
- If you cannot use a memory card that has been used with another device, format it with your camcorder. Note that formatting erases all information on the memory card.
- A memory card has a certain life span. If you cannot record new data, you have to purchase a new memory card.
- Do not bend, drop, or subject the card to strong impacts.
- Do not place foreign substances on the memory card terminals. Use a soft dry cloth to clean the terminals if required.
- Do not paste anything other than the label provided with the card on the label pasting area of the card.
- Do not use a damaged memory card.
- Be careful to keep the memory card out of the reach of children, who might swallow it.

The camcorder supports SD and SDHC memory cards, giving you a wider choice of cards to choose from!

The data storage speed may differ, depending on the manufacturer and production system.

- SLC (single level cell) system: faster write speed enabled.
- MLC (multi level cell) system: only lower write speed is supported.

For best results, we recommend using a memory card that supports a faster write speed.

Using a lower write speed memory card for recording video may cause difficulties when storing.

You may even lose your video data during the recording.

In an attempt to preserve every bit of the recorded video, the camcorder forcibly stores the video on the memory card and displays a warning:

"Low speed card. Please record at a lower resolution."

If you are unavoidably using a low speed memory card, the resolution and quality of the recording may be lower than the set value. ¬page 62

The higher the resolution and quality, the more memory the camcorder uses.



- Samsung is not responsible for data loss due to misuse.
- We recommend using a memory card case to prevent data loss from motion or static electricity.
- After a period of use, the memory card may get warm. This is normal and is not a malfunction.

Adjust the length of grip belt so that the camcorder is stable when you press the **Recording start/stop** button with your thumb.






If you make the grip belt too tight and use excessive force to insert your hand, the grip belt hook of the camcorder may be damaged.

ADJUSTING THE LCD SCREEN

The wide LCD screen on your camcorder offers high quality image viewing.

- 1. Open the LCD screen with your finger.
 - The screen opens up to 90°.
- 2. Rotate the LCD screen towards the lens.
 - You can rotate it up to 180° towards the lens and up to 90° backward.
 To view recordings more conveniently, rotate the screen by 180° towards the lens, then fold it back to the body.





Excessive rotation may damage the connective hinge between the screen and the camcorder.



Clean fingerprints or dust on the screen with a soft cloth.

BASIC CAMCORDER POSITIONING

Use both hands while taking a video or photo to prevent the camcorder from shaking. Try to avoid any slight movement while shooting.

Adjusting the shooting angle

Aim the camcorder as shown in the illustration.

- 1. Hold the camcorder with your both hands.
- 2. Put your hand through the grip belt.
- Make sure your footing is stable and there is no danger of colliding with another person or object.
- 4. Aim and focus as shown in the illustration.







ATTACHING THE FERRITE CORE

Attach the ferrite core to the cables. The ferrite core reduces interference.

- To open the ferrite core, release the stoppers on both ends of the ferrite core.

- 3. Close the ferrite core until it clicks shut.








Using the external microphone (not supplied)

When you use the built-in microphone for recording, the microphone may record the mechanical noise of the camcorder. When you record in a quiet environment, we recommend that you use an external microphone.

Connect an external microphone (not supplied) to the external microphone jack of this camcorder.





- The internal microphone is automatically turned off when you attach an external microphone.
- Zoom MIC and Voice Reduction functions are automatically turned off.
- The sensitivity level may differ depending on the microphone. Use the MIC Level menu to find the
 appropriate recording sound level. Otherwise, loud sounds may produce distortion.



- · If power is interrupted or an error occurs during recording, the video may not be recorded/edited.
- Samsung is not responsible for any damage caused by a failure of normal recording or playback operation because of memory card error.
- Note that damaged data cannot be recovered.





User-friendly SMART AUTO optimizes your camcorder to the recording conditions automatically, providing beginners with the best performance.

- 1. Press the SMART AUTO button.
 - Smart Auto (≅/△) and Anti-shake (♠) indicators appear on the LCD screen.
 - In the photo recording mode, the smart flash (24) icon appears.
- 2. Align your subject in the frame.
 - The camcorder automatically detects the scene (Landscape, etc.) and adjusts the camcorder settings accordingly.
 - The appropriate scene icon appears on the LCD screen.



ZOOMING

Use the zoom function for close-up or wide-angle recording. This camcorder allows you to record using 15x optical power zoom, 18x Intelli-zoom, and digital zoom.

m out

To zoom in

Press the **T** (zoom) button on the LCD panel or slide the zoom lever towards **T** (telephoto).

- The distant subject is gradually magnified and can be recorded.
- The hightest zoom magnification ratio is 18x in the normal zoom-in.

To zoom out

Press the **W** (zoom) button on the LCD panel or slide the zoom lever towards **W** (wide angle).

- · The subject moves further away.
- The smallest zoom ratio is the subject's original size in the zoom-out.





When using the zoom function, you can decrease zoom speed by slowly moving the Zoom (W/T) lever. Moving it faster increases the zoom speed. However, you cannot adjust the zoom speed when using the Zoom (W/T) button on the LCD panel.



- Using the optical zoom does not degrade the image quality and clarity.
- Use the digital zoom when you want to zoom beyond the optical zoom range (Video recording mode only). → page 80
- Focusing may become unstable when you record with a fast zoom or zoom into a subject standing too far away. If this occurs, use the manual focus function. → page 70
- The minimum possible distance between camcorder and subject while maintaining sharp focus is about 1cm (about 0.4 inches) for wide angle and about 50cm (about 19.7 inches) for telephoto. If you want to shoot the object close to the lens at a wide angle, use the Tele Macro function. —page 76
- When using the zoom function while holding the camcorder in your hand, use Anti-shake (OIS) for stable recording.
 page 45
- Frequent use of the zoom function consumes more power.
- The camcorder can record the sound of the zoom mechanism.

SETTING THE ANTI-SHAKE (OIS: OPTICAL IMAGE STABILIZER)

Use the Anti-shake (OIS: Optical Image Stabilizer) function to compensate for unstable images caused by shaking movements when holding the camcorder.

Press the **Anti-shake (OIS)** () button to toggle the Anti-shake (OIS) mode between On and Off.





Q Use the Anti-Shake function in the following cases

- When recording while walking or when recording in a moving car.
- When recording with the zoom function.
- · When recording subjects of a small size.





- When turned on, the Smart Auto mode automatically sets Anti-shake (OIS) to On.
- Gross camcorder shake may not be entirely corrected even if Anti-shake is set to On.
 Firmly hold the camcorder with both hands.
- When this function is set to On, the actual movement of the subject and the movement displayed on the screen may be slightly different.
- When recording in dark lighting at high magnification while this function is set to On, after-images
 may stand out. In this case, we recommend using a tripod (not supplied) and turning Anti-shake to
 Off.

USING BACK LIGHT COMPENSATION MODE

When a subject is lit from behind, this function will compensate for the lighting so that the subject is not too dark.

Press the **Back light** (10) button to toggle the back light mode between On and Off.

Q Back lighting causes the the subject to be darker than the background

It typically occurs when:

- The subject is in front of a window.
- The person you want to record is wearing white or shiny clothes and is placed against a bright background. The person's face is too dark to distinguish his/her features.
- The subject is outdoors and the background is overcast.
- · The light sources are too bright.
- The subject is in front of a snowy background.



USING THE FLASH

Using the flash, you can capture clear and bright photos even in shadows, at night, or indoors which need more light.

PRECHECK!

Select the Photo record (mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

Press the ${\it Flash}$ (\odot) button repeatedly to select the flash mode you want.

• The selected flash mode is displayed.

Display	Meaning
3	Disables the flash.
₹ 9	Flash works automatically when the subject or background is dark.
•	If the object or background is dark, the camcorder flash operates automatically and flashes just before the picture is taken (pre-flash). This helps reduce the incidence of red eye.
F	Flash always works regardless of brightness. Light intensity is adjusted automatically.
₹5	Flash works when the shutter speed is slow. It is suitable for use around sundown or in dark places. We recommend you use a tripod (purchase separately) to prevent camcorder shake.
SAR EMARTI	In Smart Auto mode, the smart flash icon appears automatically. According to the brightness for subject and background, the flash automatically works.





- . Do not use the flash with a hand covered on it.
- Do not use a flash too close to the eves of a person.



- Select a flash mode and press the PHOTO button. The camcorder performs a pre-flash to make sure the recording conditions (distance from objects and amount of light) are acceptable. Do not move until the second flash occurs.
- As using the flash consumes more power, the more you use the flash, the shorter the battery time.
- The flash usually recharges within 5 seconds. However, it may take longer to charge the flash when the battery is low.
- You can capture bright and clear photos within the recordable range when you use the flash.
- When you record a strongly reflecting object or an object out of the recordable range, the camcorder can not capture bright and clear images.
- When you use the flash in a dark place, foreign substances such as dust can be reflected in the light from the flash, so that blur, white dots, round dots, or white circles may appear on the images. This is not a malfunction of the camcorder.
- You cannot use a flash under the following conditions:
 - when using the continuous shooting function
 - when capturing photos in the video record mode.

USING THE MANUAL DIAL

You can assign one frequently used function (focus, aperture, shutter speed, or exposure) to the Manual Dial and then use the Manual Dial to set that function during recording.



- You can assign only one function at a time to the manual dial. →page 103
- Even if a function would normally not be available because a second function is set to a value that
 would prevent it from functioning, you can still assign it to and set it with the manual dial, though
 not in the menu.

For example: The Aperture function can not be used if you set the shutter to Manual in the menu. However, if you assign the aperture function to the Manual Dial, the camcorder sets the shutter to Auto automatically and you can use the Manual Dial to set the aperture.

basic playback

CHANGING THE PLAYBACK MODE

- You can switch the record mode into the play mode by touching the Play () tab on the LCD screen.
- Recorded images are displayed in the thumbnail display and the most recently recorded file is highlighted.
- The camcorder will display the video or photo thumbnails, depending on which you recorded last.
- You can choose the thumbnail view display options by touching the HD (), SD (), or photo () tab on the LCD screen.



Understanding how to change the operation modes

You can easily change the operation modes by touching the LCD screen or using the buttons as shown in the following figures:



Q To change thumbnail display type

You can choose the thumbnail display type you want by touching the 3x3 () tab or the date () tab on the LCD screen, and then pressing the **Zoom** (W/T) lever.

To play back videos

Q Using the Touch Screen

Drag the image left or right on the LCD screen to go to the previous or next file.



Touch a point or drag the pointer left or right in the playback progress bar on the LCD screen to move directly to the section of the video you want.







Do not power off or eject the memory card during photo playback. Doing so may damage the recorded data.



- It may take some time to start playback, depending on the size and quality of the selected video.
- The camcorder may not play the following video files:
- A video whose file format is not supported on the camcorder
- You can use various play options during the video playback. →page 52
- The recorded videos can be played on a TV or PC. →pages 121~124, 128~134
- If you touch the Menu () tab during playback, play is paused and the menu screen appears.
- If you turn on the background music while playing a video, its audio is muted and the background music starts to play. At that moment, the video goes back and starts from the beginning.

To adjust the volume during video playback

You can hear the sound through the built-in speaker of the camcorder while the video is playing back on the LCD screen.

- 1. Touch the Volume () tab on the LCD screen.
- Adjust the volume by dragging the volume control dial toward the desired direction on the LCD screen.







The sound level is adjusted between "0~19." When the level is at "0," you cannot hear sound.

Various playback operations

Playback / Pause / Stop

- Playback and pause alternates when you touch the Play () / Pause () tab during playback.
- Touch the Return () tab to stop playback and return to the thumbnail.

Search playback

During playback, each touch of the Reverse search (■) / Forward search (■) tab increases the play speed:

 RPS (Reverse Playback Search)/FPS (Forward Playback Search) rate: x2 → x4 → x8 → x16 → x32 → x2





Skip playback

Touch the Reverse skip () / Forward skip () tab during playback.

- Touching the Forward skip(→) tab plays the next video.
- Touching the Reverse skip(() plays the beginning of the scene.
 If reverse skip (() is touched within 3 seconds from the start of the file, the previous video is played.
- Place and hold your finger on the Reverse skip () / Forward skip () 1 tab to search for a video quickly. When you lift off your finger, the selected video is played.

Slow playback

When playback is paused, touching the Reverse slow (\blacksquare) / Forward slow (\blacksquare) tab reduces the playback speed:

• Reverse/forward playback slow rate: $x1/2 \rightarrow x1/4 \rightarrow x1/8 \rightarrow x1/2$

Frame by frame playback

 When playback is paused, touching the Reverse frame advance (■) / Forward frame advance (■) tab makes play go reverse or forward one frame at a time.



- Various playback operations are available using the same buttons on the remote control.
- Touch the Play (▶) tab to play back in normal speed.
- You can hear sound only when the playback is in normal speed.

You can view a photo slide show with background music.

Touch the Slide Show () tab during photo playback.

) indicator is displayed. The slide show starts from the current selected photo.
- All photos are played back continuously in the set slide show option. → pages 87~88
- If you select the thumbnail display by date (
), photos only taken on the corresponding date play back in a slide show.
- You can adjust the background music's volume level using the Volume () tab while playing back the slide show with music.
- To stop the slide show, touch the Return () tab.

Zooming during photo playback

You can magnify a playback image.

Video recording time (Per second)

You can record video at a maximum of 600 frames per second.



- You can record a video in slow motion for a maximum of one minute. When you record in slow
 motion, the recording stops after 1 minute, but when you playback the same recording, it plays
 back for the following time:
 - 300 Frame/Sec: 5 minutes
 - 600 Frame/Sec: 10 minutes
- The camcorder does not record sound while recording in slow motion.
- The image quality of slow motion video may be lower than normal speed video.

White Balance

The color of your image depends on the type and quality of the light source. If you want the color of your image to be realistic, select an appropriate lighting condition to calibrate the white balance.

PRECHECK!

Select the record (♣4/10) mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- - You can move to the desired item by touching the < / > tab.
- Touch the () tab or selected submenu item again to complete the setting.
- 3. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.



Submenu items

- Auto: Adjusts the white balance automatically according to the recording conditions.
- Daylight (4): Use outdoors in normal daylight. Adjusts the white balance according to outdoor lighting conditions.
- Cloudy (△): Use when recording in the shade or cloudy weather.
- Fluorescent (::): Use when recording under white fluorescent lights.
- Tungsten (♣): Use when recording under halogen lamps and incandescent lights.
- Custom WB (♠): Lets you manually adjust the white balance to match the light source or situation.

Q Understanding White Balance

White balance (WB) is the process of removing unrealistic color casts, so that objects which appear white are rendered white in your image. Proper white balance has to take into account the "color temperature" of a light source, which refers to the relative warmth or coolness of white light.

To set the white balance manually

- 1. Touch the Menu (way) tab → "White Balance" → "Custom WB."
 - The "(Set White Balance" indicator is displayed.
- 2. Fill the screen with a white object, and touch the (ok) tab.
 - The white balance setting is stored.
- 3. To exit the menu, touch the Return () tab.
 - The stored white balance setting will be applied the next time you record.





- When setting the white balance manually, the subject must be white, otherwise, your camcorder may not detect an appropriate setting value.
- The adjusted setting remains until you set the white balance again.
- During normal outdoor recording, setting to "Auto" may provide better results.
- Cancel the digital zoom function for clear and precise setting. ⇒page 80
- Reset the white balance if light conditions change.

ISO

ISO sensitivity function sets the light sensitivity of the camcorder's image sensor. A higher ISO setting increases light sensitivity and allows the camcorder to select a higher shutter speed, thus reducing image-shake when recording without flash under dim conditions.

PRECHECK!

Select the Photo record () mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- Touch the Menu (tab → "ISO" → touch the desired submenu item.
- 2. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.

Resolution White Balance Who are the stance Aperture Aperture

Submenu items

- · Auto: Sets Aperture to Auto.
- 50(89): Record in a bright place at low sensitivity.
- 100(₩): Record in a normal situation at normal sensitivity.
- 200(): Increases the shutter speed and minimizes noise in images recorded in a dim place.
- 400(ﷺ)/1600(ﷺ)/2400(ﷺ): Record in dim or dark places at high sensitivity. The recorded images may have noise.



High ISO values may cause noise in images.

Aperture

The aperture controls the amount of light reaching the image sensor. The camcorder adjusts the aperture automatically depending on the subject and recording conditions. You can also manually adjust the Aperture to your preference.

PRECHECK!

Select the record (♣4/10) mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- 2. Touch the () tab to complete the setting.
- 3. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.



Submenu items

- · Auto: Sets the aperture value automatically.
- Manual: Drag the aperture dial toward the desired direction on the LCD screen to adjust the setting values.
 The setting values are as follows:

F1.8. F2. F2.8. F3.3. F4. F5.6. F8. F11. F16. F22



Q Understanding Aperture

The lower the aperture value, the wider the aperture. The wider the aperture, the more light reaches the image sensor. Adjusting the aperture value controls the amount of light reaching the image sensor. Typically, the camcorder adjusts the aperture value in the following cases:

- When shooting against the light or when the background is too bright.
- When shooting on a reflective natural background such as at the beach or when skiing.
- When the background is overly dark (for example, night scenery).
- You can also adjust the aperture manually.



- When you specify "Aperture: Manual," the iSCENE mode is cancelled, "Super C.Nite" is set to "Off" automatically, and "Shutter" is set to "Auto" automatically. (Manual Aperture priority)
- Minimum available aperture values depend on zoom magnifications. (wide: 1.8, telephoto: 3.3)

Shutter

The camcorder automatically sets the shutter speed depending on the scene's brightness. User high shutter speeds to record fast moving objects and low shutter speeds to record slow or stationary objects or objects in dimmer light.

PRECHECK!

Select the record (≅/ (๑) mode by pressing the MODE button. ⇒page 27

- Touch the Menu (<u>see</u>) tab → "Shutter" → then the desired submenu item.
- 2. Touch the () tab to complete the setting.
- 3. To exit the menu, touch the Return () tab.



Submenu items

- Auto: The camcorder automatically sets the appropriate shutter speed value.
- Manual: Drag the shutter dial toward the desired direction on the LCD screen to adjust the setting values.

The setting values are as follows:

- Video: 1/30, 1/60, 1/100, 1/250, 1/500, 1/1000, 1/2000, 1/4000, 1 /10000
- Photo: 1/8, 1/15, 1/30, 1/60, 1/100, 1/250, 1/500, 1/1000





- The image may not seem smooth when you set a high shutter speed.
- When recording with a shutter speed of 1/1000 or higher, make sure the sun is not directly shining into the lens.
- When you specify "Shutter: Manual," the iSCENE mode is cancelled, "Super C.Nite" is set to "Off" automatically, and "Aperture" is set to "Auto" automatically. (Manual Shutter priority)

EV

Depending on the intensity of the ambient light, your videos and photos may be too bright or dark. In these cases, you can adjust the exposure to get a better videos and photos.

PRECHECK!

Select the record (♣4/ 🔾) mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- 1. Touch the Menu (www) tab → "EV."
- 2. Drag the exposure value dial toward the desired direction on the LCD screen to adjust the setting values.
 - The setting values range from -2.0 to +2.0
- 3. Touch the () tab to complete the setting.
- 4. To exit the menu, touch the Return () tab.



Q Understanding EV (Exposure Value)

Exposure value is the total amount of light allowed to fall on the photographic medium (Image sensor) during the process of taking photos or videos.



Super C.Nite

The camcorder adjusts the shutter speed to get bright images without losing color when recording a slowly moving subject or in a dark place.

PRECHECK!

Select the Video record (♣) mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- 2. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.



Submenu items

- · Off: Disables the function.
- Normal (III): The shutter opens for 1/60 of a second in the normal mode and automatically switches to open for 1/30 of a second in a dark place. Use this function to get bright images in a dark place.



When you set the Super C.Nite to Super, the video resolution changes automatically as listed below:

- 1080/60i, 1080/30p → Automatically set to 1080/30p
- 720/60p → Automatically set to720/30p
- 480/60p → Automatically set to480/30p

Focus

The camcorder usually focuses on a subject automatically (auto focus). When the camcorder is turned on, the Focus function will always be set to auto-focus. You can also set the Focus function to manual and focus on a subject manually.

PRECHECK!

Select the record (♣4/10) mode by pressing the MODE button. →page 27

- 1. Touch the Menu (tab → "Focus" → then the desired submenu item.
- 2. Touch the () tab to complete the setting.
- 3. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.

Submenu items

- · Auto: Focus is set automatically.
- Manual () You can set the focus manually if the auto focus function has difficulty setting the focus. On the LCD screen, drag the focus dial in the desired direction to adjust the setting values.
- Touch Point (□): You can set the focus by touching a specific point of the subject on the LCD screen. (Available only in video record mode. Magic Touch performs the same function for photos. → page 72)

This camcorder automatically focuses a subject from close-up to infinity. However, it may not always obtain the correct focus, depending on the recording conditions. If the camcorder does not focus correctly, use the manual focus mode.

Focusing in a nearer subject

Q Scenes to set focus manually for

- Scenes containing several objects, some close to the camcorder, others further away.
- Scenes with a person enveloped in fog or surrounded by snow.
- · Very shiny or glossy surfaces such as a car.
- · Scences with people or objects moving constantly or quickly such as an athlete or a crowd.

Using the touch point function

Using the Touch Point function, you can focus on a small section of the picture. To focus on the particular point, touch the point on the LCD screen. The Touch Point function is available only in the video record mode. For photos, use Magic Touch to perform the same function. ⇒page 72





You can activate the touch point by pressing a particular point on the LCD screen for about 2 seconds



- The Auto Focus (AF) setting is useful when you operate the zoom function because you might not be able to keep accurate focus manually after the zoom ratio has been changed.
- When the Touch Point function is enabled, you can touch the AF(M) tab on the LCD screen to set the "Focus" to "Auto."
- When you specify "Focus: Manual or Touch Point," "Face Detection" is set to "Off" automatically.

Face Detection

Your camcorder detects a subject's face and automatically adjusts the brightness and image quality to the optimal settings. Record faces more vividly.

Tele Macro

Using the Tele Macro function, you can get close up images which are created by focusing on a small portion of a large object at a wide angle. It is useful to get close up images of flowers or insects etc.

- 2. To exit the menu, touch the Return (5) tab.



- · Off: Disables the function.
- On (\$\tilde{\pi}\$): You can focus on a small portion of a large object at a wide angle.



- When recording in Tele Macro mode, the focus speed may be lowered.
- Use a tripod (not supplied) to prevent hand shake in the Tele Macro mode.
 - Avoid shadows when recording in the Tele Macro mode.
- As the distance to the subject decreases, the focusing area narrows.
- When you can not get proper focus, use the Zoom (W/T) button or Zoom (W/T) lever to adjust the focus.
- For best results, use the Tele Macro function between. 4 inches (1cm) and 19.5 inches (50cm) from your subject.

Cont. Shot

This function allows you to capture photos rapidly, in succession to give you more photo-taking opportunities when recording moving subjects.

- Zoom microphone is not available when you use an external microphone.
- When using the Zoom microphone or Voice Reduction function, do not close the LCD screen or cover the internal zoom microphone on the left of the camcorder.
- When you specify "Zoom MIC: On", "Voice Reduction" is set to "Off" automatically.

Voice Reduction

When you are recording a scene, you are usually close to the internal microphone. As a result, your voice on the video may be too loud. You can reduce the loudness of your voice and reduce the loudness of other noise occurring near the internal microphone by using the Voice Reduction function.

Time Lapse REC

Using the Time Lapse feature, you can program your camcorder to create a time lapse video by recording a series of frames over a set period of time with a set time interval between each frame. The Time Lapse feature lets you create time lapse videos of blooming flowers and similar subjects.

To record in the Time Lapse REC mode, you must set the recording interval between frames (Interval) and the total time the camcorder will record in Time Lapse (Duration), using the menu.



Example of Time Lapse Recording





- Time lapse recording mode is released once recording has been finished. To start another Time Lapse Recording, repeat steps 1-5.
- 30 captured images compose a video of 1 second length. Since the minimum length of a video to
 be saved by your camcorder is one second, the interval defines how long the time lapse recording
 should be. For example, if you set the interval to "30 Sec," time lapse recording should be set to at
 least 30 minutes to record a minimum video length of 2 seconds (60 images).
- Once time lapse recording finishes recording for the specified recording time, the camcorder switches to the standby mode.
- Press the **Recording start/stop** button if you want to stop time lapse recording.
- · Audio is not recorded during time lapse recording.

Using the Intelli-studio program built into your camcorder, you can transfer video and photo files to your PC using a USB cable and edit them on your PC screen. Intelli-studio offers the most convenient way for you to manage your video and photo files.



Step 1. Connecting the USB cable

- 1. Set "USB Connect: Mass Storage" and "PC Software: On."
 - These are the default settings.
- 2. Connect the camcorder to a PC with the USB cable.
 - A new file saving screen appears with the Intelli-studio main window.
 - Depending on your version of Windows, the removable disk window also appears.
- 3. Click "Yes." The uploading procedure starts. Click "Yes" to confirm.
 - If you do not want to save a new file, select "No."





Q To disconnect the USB cable

To disconnect the USB cable after completing the file transfer, you must follow these steps:

- 1. Click the "Safely Remove Hardware icon" icon on the taskbar.
- 2. Select "USB Mass Storage Device," and then click "Stop."
- 3. If the "Stop a Hardware device" window appears, click "OK."
- 4. Disconnect the USB cable from the camcorder and PC.





- Use the provided USB cable. (Supplied by Samsung)
- Make sure you insert the USB plug into the USB jack with the plug facing in the correct direction.
- Use the AC power adaptor to power the camcorder when transferring files to your computer.
- When the USB cable is connected, turning the camcorder on or off may cause the PC to malfunction.
- If you disconnect the USB cable from the PC or the camcorder while transferring, the data transmission will stop and the data may be damaged.
- If you connect the USB cable to a PC via a USB HUB or simultaneously connect the USB cable along with other USB devices, the camcorder may not work properly. If this occurs, remove all USB devices from the PC and reconnect the camcorder.
- Intelli-studio may not automatically run. If this occurs, access My Computer or Windows Explorer, open the
 drive that corresponds to your camcorder, find Intelli-studio, and then run IStudio.exe.
- While Kies is executing, the Intelli-studio does not run automatically.

Step 2. About the Intelli-studio main window

When the Intelli-studio starts up, video and photo thumbnails are displayed in the main window.

Thumbnails: Displays video and photo thumbnails.

- **10.** Show directories of Contents Manager and My Computer.

Contents Manager: You can classify and manage videos and photos on your computer.

My Computer: You can view videos and photos saved in selected directories of your computer.

- 11. Shortcut icons
 - = : Navigates files (previous and next).
 - : Prints selected photo(s).
 - : View location of selected photo(s) with GPS information.
 - : Registers to Contents Manager.
 - : Manages the registry of faces in the selected photo.



Intelli-studio is a program commonly used in Samsung camcorders or digital cameras. Some functions may not work depending on the product you purchased.

Step 3. Playing back videos or photos

You can play back the recordings conveniently using the Intelli-studio application.

- 1. Run the Intelli-studio program. →page 129
- 2. Click the desired folder to display your recordings.
 - Video (or photo) thumbnails appear on the screen, depending on the folder you selected.
- **3.** Choose the video or photo that you want to play.
 - You can view the file information by moving the mouse over the file.
 - If you click a video thumbnail once, the video plays back inside the thumbnail frame, allowing you to search for a desired video with ease.



- 4. After you select the video or photo you want, double-click to play back.
 - Playback starts and playback controls appear.



Intelli-studio supports the following file formats:

- Video formats: MP4 (Video: H.264, Audio: AAC), WMV (WMV 7/8/9)
- Photo formats: JPG, GIF, BMP, PNG, TIFF

Step 4. Editing videos or photos

With Intelli-studio, you can edit the videos or photos in various ways. (Change Size, Fine-Tuning, Image Effect, Insert Frame, etc.)

 Before editing a video or photo in Intelli-studio, make a backup copy of the video or photo file and store it on your computer for safe-keeping using My Computer or Windows Explorer.

Step 5. Sharing the videos/photos online

Share your contents with the world by uploading photos and videos directly to a web site with one click.

- 1. Select the videos or photos you want to share.
- 2. Click "Share" on the Intelli-studio browser.
 - The selected file appears on the sharing window.
- 3. Click the web site you would like to upload files to.
 - You can choose "YouTube," "Fickr," "Facebook," or another web site you want to set for your uploading management.
- 4. Click "Upload" to start uploading.
 - A pop up window appears asking for your ID and password.
- **5.** Enter your ID and the password to access.
 - Access to the web site contents can be limited depending on your web access environment.





 - Select "Open folders to view files using Windows Explorer", and then click "OK."
- **5.** The folders in the storage media appear.
 - Different file types are stored in different folders.
- **6.** Select the desired folder or files to copy, then drag and drop them into the destination folder.
 - The folder or files are copied from the storage media to the PC.



- A new folder is created when the file number has reached 9.999.
- The folder names are given in the following order: 100VIDEO, 101VIDEO, etc. The maximum number of the folders is 999.
- The camcorder can create a maximum of 9,999 files in a storage media.

Photo file ②

- As with video files, the file number used in the file name automatically increases when you create a new photo file.
- Photos have a SAM ####.JPG name format.
- The folder names are given in the following order: 100PHOTO, 101PHOTO, etc.



File format

Video files

- Video files are compressed in H.264 format. The file extension is ".MP4."
- Refer to page 62 for the video resolution.

Photo files

- Photo images are compressed in JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) format. The file extension is ".JPG."
- Refer to page 62 for the photo resolution.



The name of a video file recorded by the camcorder should not be modified. For proper playback, the camcorder requires that files have their original folder and file names.

- When sending files from the other device to Kies, you need a folder to save them. Set the folder to download files.





- When enabling the "Backup to PC" function in HMX-S15/S16, operate the 'Setting' menu in Kies' Allshare, and then set S15/16 to 'Allow' from the 'Device Settings.'
- If you can't find the name S15 or S16 in 'Device Settings' of the Kies' Allshare 'Settings' menu, set the Windows firewall to 'Off' and try again.

MAINTENANCE

Your camcorder is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years.

Cautions when storing

- For safekeeping, turn off the camcorder.
 - Remove the battery and AC power adaptor. → pages 20, 21
 - Remove the memory card. →page 32

LCD screen

- Do not push the LCD screen too hard or strike it with anything.
- When using the camcorder in cold conditions, afterimage may appear on the LCD screen. This is not a malfunction.
- If you leave the power on for a long time, the surface around the LCD screen becomes hot.
- An LCD screen is manufactured using advanced technology which creates screens with pixel failure rates
 of less than 0.01%. However, a black or bright spot (red, blue, white) may appear in the center of the LCD
 screen and up to two spots may appear outside the center. These spots, which are normally incurred
 during the manufacturing process, do not affect the recorded images.

Lens

- Use an optional air blower to blow out dirt and other small objects. Do not wipe the lens with cloth or your fingers.
- When the lens gets frosty, turn the power off and leave it off for approximately an hour. When the
 temperature of the lens is similar to the ambient temperature, the frost will disappear.

When there is dew condensation, put the camcorder aside for a while before using

- · What is dew condensation?
 - Dew condensation happens when a camcorder is moved to a location where there is a significant temperature difference from the previous location. The dew condenses on the external or internal parts of the camcorder, and on the reflection lens. If there is dew on or in your camcorder, it may cause the camcorder to malfunction or damage the camcorder when you turn the power on.
- · Exactly when does dew condensation occur?
 - When you move the camera to a location with a higher temperature than the previous location, or when you move it to a hot area suddenly. Examples:
 - You record outside in cold weather during the winter and then move the camera in indoors.
 - You record outside in hot weather after being indoors or inside a car where the A/C was running.
- What can I do?
 - Turn the power off, detach the battery, and leave the camcorder in a dry area for 1~2 hours before using it.



- Use the camcorder only after dew condensation has completely disappeared.
- Be sure to use the recommended accessories supplied with the camcorder. For service, contact
