# Safety information

This manual describes how to properly use your new MP3 player. Read it carefully to avoid damaging the player and injuring yourself. Pay particular attention to the following serious warnings.

- Do not disassemble, repair, or modify this product on your own.

- Do not get the product wet or drop it in water. If the product gets wet, do not switch it on because you could get an electric shock. Instead, contact a Samsung Customer Service Center at 1-800-SAMSUNG.

# Connect to a PC and charge the battery

Connect your player to a PC and charge the battery before you use your player for the first time or when you have not used it for a long time.

- 1 Connect the smaller end of the USB cable to the USB connection port at the bottom of your player.
- 2 Connect the larger end of the USB cable to the USB port of a PC.



**Charging time** About 3 hours

- 3 When the battery is fully charged, unplug the USB cable from your player and the PC.

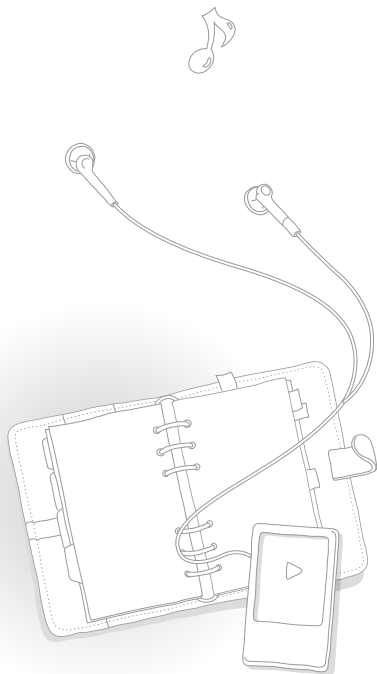
### About batteries

- Charge and store the battery at 41° F ~ 95° F (5° C ~ 35° C).
- Do not charge the battery for more than 12 hours or leave the battery fully discharged for a long time. Doing so may shorten the battery life.
- Depending on how you use your player, actual battery life may vary and may be shorter than specified.



#### Note

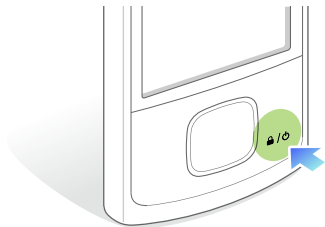
- The charging time may differ depending on your PC's capabilities.
- If you want to charge the battery on your laptop, make sure that the laptop's battery is full or the laptop is plugged into a power source.
- The player can only be charged by connecting to your PC with the USB cable. Do not use a separate USB AC Adapter as it may not charge the battery or allow proper operation of the player.



# Turn your player on and lock the buttons

## Turn your player on or off

Press and hold [🔒/🔌] to turn your player on or off.



### Note

If you do not use your player for 5 minutes, it will automatically turn off.

## Lock or unlock the buttons

Lock the buttons to prevent any unwanted operations while listening to music or playing videos. Press [🔒/🔌] to lock or unlock the buttons.

### Note

When the buttons are locked, 🔒 will appear at the top of the screen.

# Access menus from the main menu screen

Select menus from the main menu screen.

When you turn on your player, the main menu screen appears and you can access menus or functions from the main menu screen.



▲ Main menu screen


- 1 In the main menu, use [○] to scroll to a menu you want and press [⊙].
- 2 Press [○] to scroll to an item and press [⊙].
- 3 Use the menu you select.
- 4 Press [↶] to return to the previous screen.
  - Press and hold [↶] to return to the main menu screen.

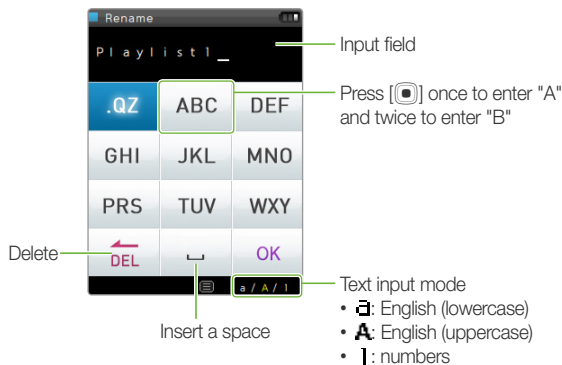


# Enter text

Enter text using the virtual keyboard.

To rename a playlist, for example:

- 1 Select a music playlist, and then press [☰] and select <Rename>. See page 29.
- 2 Select a button which has a character you want to enter.
  - To delete characters, select .
  - To change the text input mode, press [☰].



- 3 When you are finished, select <OK>.

## Download files with EmoDio

You can easily download various media files with EmoDio.



### Note

- For information about installing EmoDio on a PC, refer to the Quick Start Guide supplied with your player.
- EmoDio will be regularly upgraded for peak performance. Some features of EmoDio may change without prior notice.

### 1 Connect your player to a PC using the USB cable.

- See page 11 to connect the player to your PC.
- When the player is connected to your PC, EmoDio launches automatically on your PC.

### 2 Click <My PC> on the main screen of EmoDio.

### 3 Click <Add Folder> or <Add File> at the bottom of the My PC screen.

- The list of the files stored in your PC appears.

### 4 Select a folder or file you want.

### 5 Select a file you want on the My PC screen and click .

- The selected file is copied to your player.




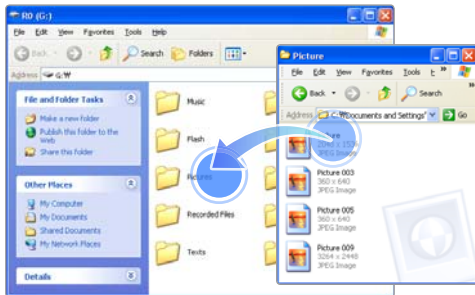
### Note

- You cannot use your player when connected to a PC.
- If you connect your player to a PC when the player's battery is low, the battery will be charged for a few minutes before your player will be connected to the PC.
- If you connect your player to a PC via a USB hub, the PC may not recognize your player. Connect your player directly into the USB port of a PC.
- When you format your player on a PC, use the FAT32 system. In Windows Vista, click <Restore device defaults> and then format your player.

## Download files using your player as a removable disk

If the USB connection is set to <MSC>, a PC will recognize your player as a removable disk when you connect your player to the PC.

- 1 To change the USB connection mode to <MSC>, in the main menu, select  → <System> → <PC Connection> → <MSC>.
- 2 Connect your player to a PC using the USB cable.
- 3 On your PC, open <My Computer> and then the <R0> folder.
- 4 Select a folder you want.
- 5 Copy files from the PC to your player.



### Note

- The order of files on your PC will differ from the order of files in your player.
- Your player restricts playback of files protected by a DRM (Digital Rights Management) system.

### What is DRM?

Digital Rights Management (DRM) is a technology and service to prevent illegal copies of the digital contents and protect the profit and rights of copyright holders or content producers.

### Disconnect your player from a PC

Carefully follow the steps below when disconnecting your player from a PC to avoid data loss or damage to your player.

- 1 Click  on the Windows taskbar.



- 2 Click the pop-up message.

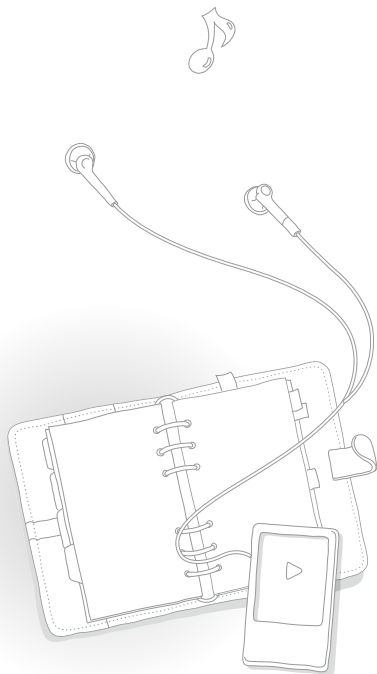


- 3 Unplug the USB cable from your player and the PC.



#### Caution

- To avoid damage to your player and corruption of your files, do not disconnect the USB cable while files are being transferred.
- Do not disconnect your player when playing files stored in your player on a PC. Make sure that you stop playback and then disconnect your player from a PC.

## Delete files

- 3 Select <Delete>.
- 4 Select <Yes> from the pop-up window.



## Play video and music

Transfer music and video files to your player using the EmoDio program or a removable disk, and then play high-quality video files and listen to music in excellent 3D surround sound.

- 1 In the main menu, select .
- 2 Select a video file from the list.
  - The screen changes to landscape mode.
- 3 Control playback using the following buttons. See "Video playback screen."

Search backward or forward in a file	Press and hold [  / 
Rewind 10 seconds	Press [

### Note

- When you download unsupported files to your player with EmoDio, EmoDio will automatically convert the file formats so you can play them in your player.
- You can play subtitle files (.smi) with video files in your player. Subtitle files must be saved with video files to play in the same folder and the file name must be the same as the video file.

## Play a video from a chapter

Press and hold [⏮] during video playback. Your player will split the video file into 15 chapters and capture still images from each chapter. When you select one of the still images, the video will begin playback from that point.

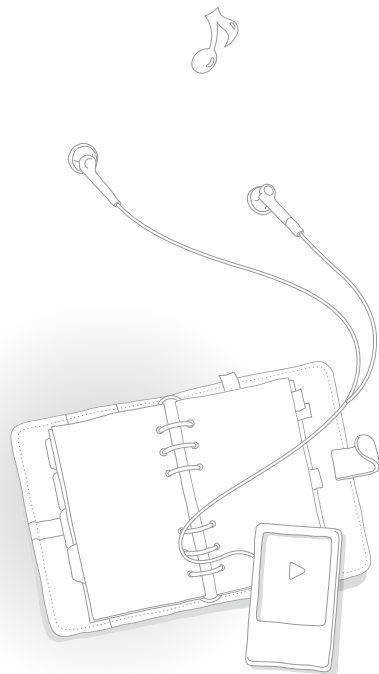

- 2 Customize the following options.

Option	Description
Brightness	Adjust the brightness of the screen.
DNSe	Select appropriate sound effects for videos.
Mosaic Search	Divide a video file into 15 chapters. You can select one of the chapters and start playback from that chapter.

If the file library is updated, your player will clear the list of files displayed in <Recently Added> and <Most Played>.

## Listen to music


Music files are categorized in folders by type. You can easily find a music file you want.





Music category	Function
<a href="#">Artists</a>	Display files by artist.
<a href="#">Albums</a>	Display files by album.
<a href="#">Songs</a>	Display files by file name (in the order of special characters, numbers, and alphabets).
<a href="#">Genres</a>	Display files by genre.
<a href="#">Playlists</a>	Display playlists you created.
<a href="#">Recently Added</a>	Display files you recently downloaded.
<a href="#">Most Played</a>	Display files you play most often.
<a href="#">Music Browser</a>	Display all files in the Music folder.
<a href="#">Unknown</a>	Display files that have no track information (ID3 tag).

### What is ID3 tag?

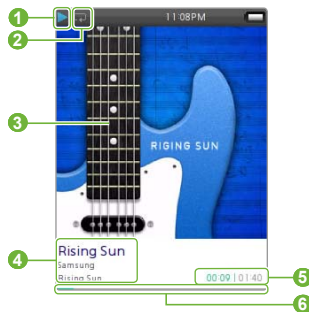
ID3 tag is a metadata container attached to MP3 files. It includes information for the music, such as the title, artist, album, or track number, which can be displayed on a music player's screen during playback.

## Play music files

- 1 In the main menu, select .
- 2 Select a music category.
  - To play the file you last played, select <Now Playing>.
- 3 Select a file to play.
- 4 Control playback by using the buttons. See "Music playback screen."

**Repeat a section of a track**

You can select a section of a track to repeat.

- 1 Press [**•••**] at the beginning of the section you want to repeat.
  - <A →> displays at the top of the screen.
- 2 Press [**•••**] at the end of the section you want to repeat.
  - <A ↔ B> displays at the top of the screen. Your player repeats the marked section.
- 3 To cancel repeating, press [**•••**] again.

**Note**

You can set the end point 3 seconds after the start point.

**Apply a sound effect (DNSe)**

- 1 During music playback, press [**≡**].
- 2 Select <DNSe>.
- 3 Select a sound effect you want.
  - You can select from <Auto>, <Normal>, <Studio>, <Rock>, <Classical>, <Jazz>, <Ballad>, <Club>, <Rhythm & Blues>, <Dance>, <Café>, <Concert Hall>, and <Church>.
  - If you select <Auto>, your player will search the track information (ID3 tag) and automatically select an appropriate effect.
  - To select your own equalizer, select <myDNSe 1> or <myDNSe 2>. See "myDNSe" on page 44.

**What is DNSe?**

Digital Natural Sound Engine (DNSe) is a group of sound effects for MP3 players, developed by Samsung. It provides various sound settings to enhance the music you are listening to.

## Create your own playlists

You can create your own playlist by adding music files you want. There are 5 default playlists.

### Add music files to a playlist

- 1 From the music category list, select a file you want to add to a playlist and press [≡].
- 2 Select <Add to Playlist>.
- 3 Select a playlist to add the file.



#### Note

To add the currently playing file to a playlist, press [≡] and select <Add to Playlist>.

### Delete music files from a playlist


- 1 From the music category list, select <Playlists>.
- 2 Select a playlist that has a file you want to delete.
- 3 Select a file you want to delete and press [≡].
- 4 Select <Delete from Playlist>.
  - To delete all files, select <Delete All from Playlist>.
  - The file will not be deleted from your player even if it is deleted from the playlist.


### Rename a playlist


- 1 From the music category list, select <Playlists>.
- 2 Select a playlist you want to rename and press [≡].
- 3 Select <Rename>.
- 4 Change the name of the playlist. For entering text, see page 15.

## Use the music options

- 1 During music playback, press [≡].
- 2 Customize the following options.

Option	Description
Add to Playlist	Add the currently playing music file to the playlist.
DNSe	Select appropriate sound effects for music. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– &lt;Play Mode&gt;: Change the repeat mode.</li> <li>– &lt;Play Speed&gt;: Change the playback speed.</li> <li>– &lt;Skip Interval&gt;: Set the interval when you press [⏮] during music playback.</li> </ul>

## View pictures

- 1 In the main menu, select .
- 2 Browse pictures.



- 3 Select a picture you want. The picture displays on the full screen.

## 4 View the picture.

Move to the previous or next file	Press [◀/▶]
Zoom in	Press [⋮] • Press [◻] to move on the enlarged picture • Press [↵] to exit the zoom mode

 Note

- If the picture size is large, it may take some time to display.
- If you press [≡] on the picture screen while a music file is playing or paused, the mini player will appear. If you were listening to the FM radio, the FM radio will start automatically when the mini player appears.

## Play a slideshow

You can create and play a slideshow with your pictures.

- 1 From the file list, press [≡].
- 2 Select <Start Slideshow>.
- 3 View pictures in a slideshow.
- 4 To stop slideshow, press [↵].

## Set a picture as a wallpaper

- 1 From the file list, select a picture and press [≡].
- 2 Select <Set as My Skin>.
- 3 Select <Yes> from the pop-up window.




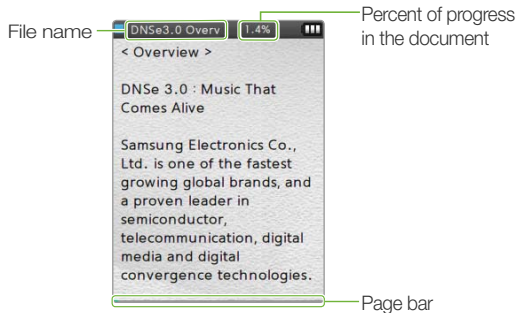



### Note

If you press [] on the text screen while a music file is playing or paused, the mini player will appear. If you were listening to the FM radio, the FM radio will start automatically when the mini player appears.

## Insert a bookmark

You can insert a bookmark on the page you want and go to the bookmark to view that page of a document.

- 1 Go to the page you want to bookmark and press [≡].
- 2 Select <Bookmark> and then <Add Bookmark>.
  - A bookmark is inserted to the top left of the screen.



### Note

- You can insert one bookmark per text file.
- To go to a bookmark, press [≡] and select <Bookmark> and then <Go to Bookmark>.
- To delete a bookmark, press [≡] and select <Bookmark> and then <Delete Bookmark>.

## Change the background style

You can change the background style of the text viewer.

- 1 On the text screen, press [≡].
- 2 Select <Viewer Theme>.
- 3 Press [⊙] to change the background style.



# FM RADIO







You can listen to the FM radio as well as save radio stations.

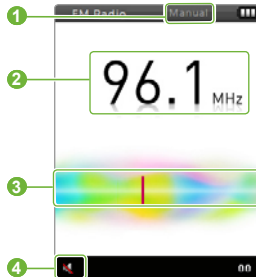



## Note

You must connect the earphones to your player to listen to the FM radio. The earphones serve as a radio antenna.

## Listen to the FM radio

- 1 In the main menu, select .
- 2 Press [] to scan the radio stations.
  - Press []/[] to scroll through radio frequencies.
  - Press and hold []/[] to scan the available stations automatically.
- 3 Listen to the FM radio.



- 1 Radio mode (Manual mode/Preset mode)
- 2 Frequency for the current station
- 3 Frequency bar
- 4 Mute indicator  
– Press [] to mute or unmute the FM radio



## Note

The FM radio may not tune frequencies for stations correctly depending on the signal status of your current region.

## Save radio stations

You can save your favorite radio stations to easily access them.

### Save the current radio station

- 1 In Manual mode, press [≡].
- 2 Select <Add to Preset>.

### Save radio stations automatically

You can automatically search for available radio stations and save them as your favorites. You can save up to 30 radio stations.

- 1 In Manual mode, press [≡].
- 2 Select <Auto Preset>.
- 3 Select <Yes> from the pop-up window.
  - Automatic tuning begins. The radio stations located are saved in your favorites.

### Listen to a favorite radio station

- 1 In Manual mode, press [≡].
- 2 Select <Go to Preset Mode>.



— Saved favorite radio stations

- 3 Select a radio station you want.

## Use the FM radio options

You can change options for using the FM radio.

- 1 From the FM radio screen, press [≡].
- 2 Customize the following options.

Add to Preset*	Save the current radio station.
Delete from Preset**	Delete a saved radio station.
Auto Preset	Search for and save available radio stations automatically (up to 30).
	Re-tune frequencies according to your region.

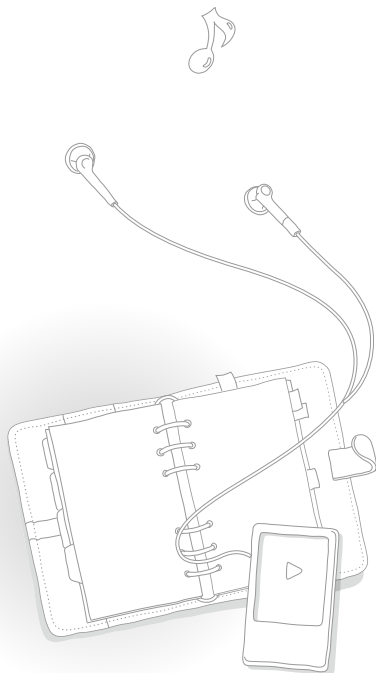

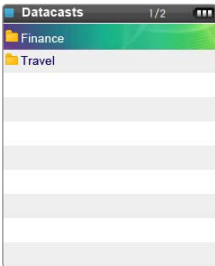

### What is RSS?

RSS is a standardized XML file format used to publish and deliver to users or readers frequently-updated works, such as news or blog entries.

- 1 In the main menu, select .
- 2 Select a channel folder you want.



- 3 Select the content you want to view.
- 4 View the content.

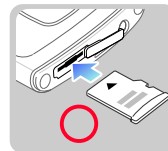
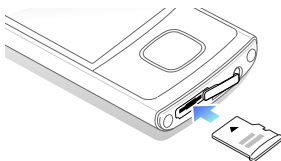



## MICRO SD

To store additional files, you must insert a memory card. You can search for files in the memory card and delete files from the memory card.

### Insert a memory card (optional)

- 1 Open the cover of the memory card slot and insert a memory card.
  - Insert the memory card with the label side facing up.



- 2 Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
  - When the memory card is correctly inserted,  will appear at the top of the main menu screen.

#### Caution


- Your player accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards from 1 GB to 16 GB. (Use only memory cards compatible with your player. Depending on the manufacturer, some memory cards may not be compatible with your player.)
- Do not insert a memory card in the wrong direction.
- Do not remove a memory card from your player while in use.
- Remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on memory cards. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data that results from user actions.

#### Remove a memory card

To remove a memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the player, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

- 1 Insert a memory card.

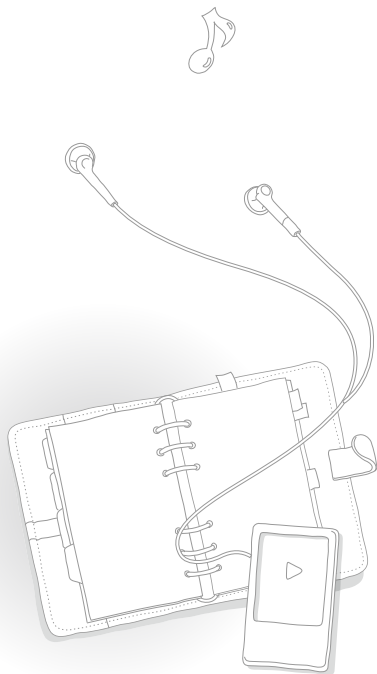

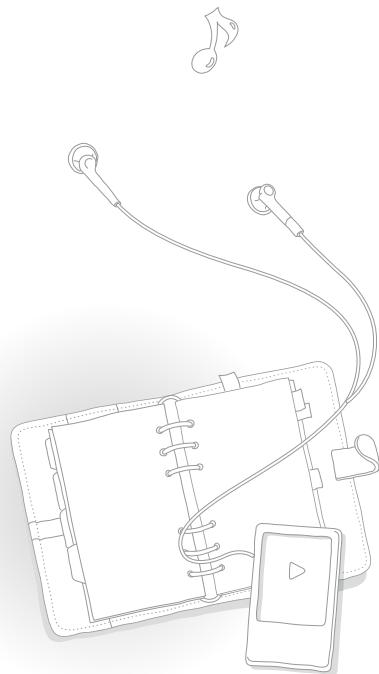
