

## Name & function of parts



- Antenna
- Incoming call light

incoming call light/charging lamp - when the phone rings, the incoming call light flashes. Also, while the battery is charging the charging lamp stays

- Ear piece and speaker for listening to calls.
- Display

shows guidelines and instructions for using phone functions. Displays phone status, phone numbers, etc.

press this button to redial the last number last called out to. or to display the phone number of the last call you received.

- Send button
- for making and receiving calls.
- Dial buttons to enter phone numbers and letters.
- Microphone

to speak into. Your voice is received here and transmitted to the other party during the call. Also used to record your voice for certain functions.

- Hand strap attachment used to attach the hand strap (included)
- Sub-window

used to show guidelines for use with main display. It is a touch panel display that also shows explanations and setting options.

- Up and down search buttons press to adjust the volume or to scroll through stored information.
- Function button press to use the F-functions.
- Memory dial and "Short Mail"

#### buttor

shows the contents of memory dial or shows a short mail.


- Power/End button turn the power off and resets a function.
  - Ear-microphone jack

if needed, can be used to connect to an ear-microphone (not included)

Interface jack

connection terminal for various options.

# How to read the display



#### Sub-window (Touch panel display)

Shows various function pariels for each operation. Press desired panel with your finger. example: press "マナー"



To avoid damage.don't press the touch panel with sharp objects such as pens.etc.

You can see an explanation for each function on the display.



Press sub-window "ガイド" panel.

## **Getting started**

## charging the battery pack

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Make sure to charge it to full capacity before use.

When you use it for the first time or you haven't used it for a long time, make sure to charge it to full capacity before using it.

# How to charge the battery using the desktop Rapid Charger.

- 1. Insert the connector of the desktop Rapid Charge AC adapter firmly into the battery charging stand with the label facing upwards (see figure 1).
- 2. Connect the wall plug to an AC 100V outlet (see figure 2).
- 3. Place the cellular phone unit (with battery pack attached) into the battery charging stand. (The phone unit must lean backwards slightly,then it can be locked into place.)


The incoming call/charging lamp will light up in red, the "充電" sign will be displayed in the display area, and the battery will begin to charge. (see figure 3)

When you haven't used the battery pack for a long time or you haven't charged the battery for some time after the 'change battery' warning sign has been displayed, sometimes the battery won't charge. If the battery pack is too old or has been damaged, the incoming call/charging lamp will light up and the '元章 'sign in the display area will be displayed, then the battery will begin to charge.

4. When the battery finishes charging, the charging lamp will go out and the '充電'sign will disappear from the display area. The battery is now charged. (to remove the cellular phone the charging stand)

When the phone unit's Power is OFF ,the \* 充電 \* sign will disappear

When the phone unit's Power is ON .the \* @ \* sign will light up.



- You can charge the battery with the phone unit's power ON, but it will take longer.
- When you charge the battery in weak signal strength areas, it might take time for the charging lamp to light up after you set the phone unit into the desktop charger holder.
- ●Don't plug the desktop rapid charger directly into a 100 volt electrical socket always use the AC adapter that comes with the phone.


# 2 Extending the antenna

The radio waves cannot be transmitted or received well if the antenna is not extended. To facilitate transmission and reception of radio waves, use the phone by positioning the antenna vertically with respect to the ground.

# Extending the antenna.



Extend the antenna until it stops with a click.



Move it straight down by pulling on a lower part of the antenna.

To avoid damaging the antenna, never apply direct pressure to the top part of the antenna.

# 3 Turning the power on.

Press and hold • for more than one second.

When you turn the power on, you'll hear the wake up tone and the sign will be displayed (see figure right). After a few seconds the sign will change to standby. (the display remains lit for about 10 seconds).


- The function condition is shown with illustrations and letters/words (see figure right) when you turn the illustration function on.
- Illustration function is on at the time of purchase.
- •The key response tone and the wake up tone are connected.

#### ◆ Turning the power off.

Press and hold for more than one second.

Power is turned off.


There are 4 kinds of illustrations for power on/off, they are changed at random.





# 4 Checking the display screen

Check the display screen and make sure it is as shown in the figure below after you turn the power on. This will indicates if the phone is in good working order.



 Even in main service areas there are places that only receive weak signals. In this case, you might not hear well or your call may be cut off.

The above battery level figures show remaining battery strength. Certain charges in conditions may cause the battery level figures to fluctuate..(See example of figure right.)

# Displaying your own phone number.

- 1. While in standby mode or while making a call, press

# Calling a landline, a mobile, PHS phone.

1.Enter the phone number you want to call.

Area code - local code - subscriber's number.

example: 03-1234-5678

Always include the area code, even when calling to a number in the same area you are in.

2.Press (a) to place a call.

If you enter a wrong number:

- Press briefly the last dialed digit will be deleted.
- Press and hold the entire phone number will be deleted.



- example: to call the United States (country code 1). New York City (area code 212), number 123-4567.
- 1. Pressing ( ) (DDI access code)
- 2. Pressing ( (country code)
- 3. Pressing 2: (area code)
- 4. Pressing 1. 2° 3° 4° 5° 6° 7° (subscriber's number)
- 5. Press (a) to place the call.
- example: to call an Iridium phone.
- 1. Pressing ( CDI access code)
- 2. Enter the Iridium phone number you want to call.
  - 87871.60 or 87871.70, and XXXXXXXX
- 3. Press **(a)** to place a call.

# Answering a call

1. the ring tone sounds/vibrator buzzes, and the incoming call lamp flashes.

2.Press ( to answer the call.

An incoming call can also be answered by pressing any of the  $\odot$   $\odot$   $\odot$  buttons.


If you do not answer the call or the caller disconnects before the call is answered.

# Registering Memory Dials.

You can register the numbers and names you call often. Once you register them, you can call them with fewer operations. You can store up to 500 phone numbers and names in the phone's memory. Numbers 000 to 499.

How to store a name and a phone number into memory.

There are 5 steps to enter a phone number into Memory Dial.

1. Enter the phone number

2. Enter the name



3. Enter the Memory Dial code number.

The next available number will automatically blink in the display. You can assign this number as your Memory Dial number by pressing OK, or you can enter a number of your choice from 000 to 499 and press OK.



4. Enter the kind of phone

- 0 .....other
- (1.)....for a landline phone
- (2°).....for a mobile phone
- (3")-----for a PHS
- (4°)······for a beeper
- 5.....for a fax.



5. Enter the Group Number

You can register 10 kinds of Group Numbers. Each Group Number will have an index.






#### One Touch Dialing


Press and hold @

# Making a call with Memory Dial.

You can call by using phone numbers saved in Memory Dial. There are 8 ways to recall numbers saved in Memory Dial.

- ① Dial Memory Dial numbers by using the number pad.
- ② Dial by Japanese phonetic symbols, i.e. hiragana or katakana.
- 3 Dial by letters.
- 4 Dial by telephone book order.
- (5) Dial by type of phone.
- **(6)** Dial by group number.
- ⑦ Dial by phone number fragment.
- ® Dial by memory number order.



# Dialing Memory Dial numbers by using the number pad:

Listed according to the first letter of the name you registered in the memory dial.

- 1. Press and hold one button from - for more than one second example: to find a name beginning with + - A. B. C. a. b. c. 2. press -
- 2. Press and hold (2°) or press (2°) several times to scroll through and display the name you want.
- 3. Press 🕙

# Dialing by Japanese alphabetical order:

- 1. Press and hold (\*\*\*)
- 2. Use (\*\*\*) to scroll through and display the name you want.

# Dialing by letters:

- 1. Use sub-window and press the マナー録音文字 panel twice.
- 2. Enter the letters you want.
- 3. Use (\*\*\*) to scroll through and display the name you want.

# Dialing by stored telephone book order:

- 1. Press (\*\*\*\*)
- 2. Press (国家) to access the telephone book.
- 3. Use (\*\*\*) to scroll through and display the name you want.

### Dialing by kind of phone:

- 1. Press (TREA) 3 times.
- 2. Press (人) (本) to select the kind of phone.
- 3. Use (vana) to scroll through and display the name you want.

## Dialing by group number:

- 1. Press (\*\*\*\*) 4 times.
- 2. Press <u>间别</u> to select the group you want to call.
- 3. Use (\*\*\*) and scroll through and display the name of the person in the group you want to call.
- 4. Press 🕥

- 1. Enter the first few digits of the phone number.
- 2. Press and hold
- 3. Use (\*\*\*\*) to scroll through and display the name you want.
- 4. Press 🕥

# Dialing by memory number order:

- 1. Press
- 2. Use (\*\*\*) to scroll through and display the name you want.
- 3. Press 🕥



# Checking the contents of Memory Dial:

When the contents (phone numbers or names) of Memory Dial are not displayed entirely, the missing information can still be accessed in full.

#### Displaying phone numbers:

- 1. Call up Memory Dial.
- 2. Press X-

The entire phone number you registered will be displayed. Press again and the display will return to its previous state.

#### Displaying names:

- 1. Call up Memory Dial.
- 2. Press #

The entire name will be displayed.

# **Specifications**

 For body-worn hands-free operation, the antenna should be kept at least 1 cm from the body when transmitting.
