Safety Instructions

Important Safety Instructions

Read all of the instructions in this section before using your printer. Also, be sure to follow all warnings and instructions marked on the printer.

When setting up your printer

Observe the following when setting up the printer:

- Do not block or cover the vents and openings in the printer.
- □ Use only the type of power source indicated on the printer's label.
- □ Use only the power cord that comes with this product. Use of another cord may result in fire or electric shock.
- □ This product's power cord is for use with this product only. Use with other equipment may result in fire or electric shock.
- □ Be sure your AC power cord meets the relevant local safety standard.
- □ Avoid using outlets on the same circuit as photocopiers or air control systems that regularly switch on and off.
- Avoid electrical outlets controlled by wall switches or automatic timers.
- Keep the entire computer system away from potential sources of electromagnetic interference, such as loudspeakers or the base units of cordless telephones.

- Do not use a damaged or frayed power cord.
- □ If you use an extension cord with the printer, make sure that the total ampere rating of the devices plugged into the extension cord does not exceed the cord's ampere rating. Also, make sure that the total ampere rating of all devices plugged into the wall outlet does not exceed the wall outlet's ampere rating.
- Do not attempt to service the printer yourself.
- □ Unplug the printer and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

The power cord or plug is damaged; liquid has entered the printer; the printer has been dropped or the casing damaged; the printer does not operate normally or exhibits a distinct change in performance.

□ If you plan to use the printer in Germany, the building installation must be protected by a10 or 16 amp circuit breaker to provide adequate short-circuit protection and over-current protection for this printer.

When choosing a place for the printer

Observe the following when choosing a place for the printer:

- Place the printer on a flat, stable surface that extends beyond the base of the printer in all directions. If you place the printer by the wall, leave more than 10 cm between the back of the printer and the wall. The printer will not operate properly if it is tilted at an angle.
- □ When storing or transporting the printer, do not tilt it, stand it on its side, or turn it upside down. Otherwise, ink may leak from the cartridges.

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- □ Leave enough space in front of the printer for the paper to be fully ejected.
- Avoid places subject to rapid changes in temperature and humidity. Also, keep the printer away from direct sunlight, strong light, or heat sources.
- □ Avoid places subject to dust, shocks, or vibrations.
- Leave enough room around the printer to allow for sufficient ventilation.
- Place the printer near a wall outlet where the plug can be easily unplugged.

When using the printer

Observe the following when using the printer:

- □ Do not insert objects through the slots in the printer.
- □ Take care not to spill liquid on the printer.
- Do not put your hand inside the printer or touch the ink cartridges during printing.
- □ Do not move the print head by hand; otherwise, you may damage the printer.
- □ Always turn the printer off using the ^(b) power button. When this button is pressed, the LCD panel goes blank. Do not unplug the printer or turn off the power to the outlet until the LCD panel goes blank.
- Before transporting the printer, make sure that the print head is in the home (far right) position and the ink cartridges are in place.

□ Leave the ink cartridges installed. Removing the cartridges can dehydrate the print head and may prevent the printer from printing.

When using a memory card

- □ Do not remove the memory card or turn off the printer while the computer and the memory card are communicating (when any one of the memory card lights is flashing.).
- □ The methods for using memory cards vary according to card type. Be sure to refer to the documentation packaged with your memory card for details.
- □ Use only memory cards compatible with the printer. Refer to Loading Memory Cards.

When using LCD panel or the optional Preview Monitor

- □ The LCD panel or optional Preview Monitor may contain a few small bright or dark spots. These are normal and do not mean that the LCD monitor is damaged in any way.
- Only use a dry, soft cloth to clean the LCD panel or the optional Preview Monitor. Do not use liquid or chemical cleansers.
- □ If the LCD panel on your printer's control panel or optional Preview Monitor is damaged, contact your dealer. If the liquid crystal solution gets on your hands, wash them thoroughly with soap and water. If the liquid crystal solution gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems remain after a thorough flushing, see a doctor immediately.

When handling the ink cartridges

Observe the following when handling the ink cartridges:

- □ Keep ink cartridges out of the reach of children. Do not allow children to drink from or otherwise handle the cartridges.
- Do not shake the ink cartridges; this can cause leakage.
- Be careful when you handle used ink cartridges, as there may be some ink remaining around the ink supply port. If ink gets on your skin, wash the area thoroughly with soap and water. If ink gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems remain after a thorough flushing, see a doctor immediately.
- Do not remove or tear the label on the cartridge; this can cause leakage.
- □ Install the ink cartridge immediately after you remove it from its package. If you leave a cartridge unpacked for a long time before using it, normal printing may not be possible.
- Do not use an ink cartridge beyond the date printed on the cartridge carton: otherwise, it may result in reduced print quality. For best results, use up the ink cartridges within six months of first installing them.

- Do not dismantle the ink cartridges or try to refill them. This could damage the print head.
- □ After bringing an ink cartridge inside from a cold storage site, allow it to warm up at room temperature for at least three hours before using it.
- □ Store ink cartridges in a cool, dark place.
- Do not touch the green IC chip on the back of the cartridge.
 Doing so may prevent normal operation and printing.
- The IC chip on this ink cartridge retains a variety of cartridge related-information such as the amount of ink remaining, so that the cartridge may be removed and reinserted freely. However, each time the cartridge is inserted, some ink is consumed because the printer automatically performs a reliability check.
- □ If you remove an ink cartridge for later use, protect the ink supply area from dirt and dust and store it in the same environment as the printer. A valve in the ink supply port makes covers or plugs unnecessary, but the ink may stain items that come into contact with this area of the cartridge. Do not touch the ink supply port or the surrounding area.




Memory card slot (enlarged figure)



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Buttons

1. **LCD panel:** Shows the items and settings you change with the buttons on the control panel.

2. **Direct Save button:** Store the contents of memory card in an external storage device.

3. **Custom buttons:** Store the current settings on the LCD panel when held down for more than two seconds. Load the stored settings when pressed.

4. **Stop button:** Cancels print operations, or the settings on the LCD panel.

5. **Print button:** Starts printing with the settings on the LCD panel selected via the buttons on the control panel.

6. Maintenance button: Refer to the following table for details.

7. Power button: Refer to the following table for details.

8.Back button: Returns to the main menu on the LCD panel.

9. **Up/Down arrow buttons:** Move the cursor on the LCD panel. Increase and decrease numbers being entered.

10. **OK button:** Opens the setting menu and selects the item to be set on the LCD panel.

11. **Basic/Advanced mode switch button:** Switches between Basic mode and Advanced mode.

Direct Printing Basics

Introduction

This section provides information on how to print directly from a memory card using settings on the LCD panel and without the use of a computer.

The instructions below provide an example of how to make settings to print a selected photo directry from a memory card. Before you start, you need the paper used in this example (A4-size plain paper) and memory card containing suitable digital photo data.

Note:

D Before printing large jobs, print a single sheet to confirm quality.

Disconnecting the USB cable is recommended when printing directly from a memory card.

For printing from a computer, double click the ESPR310 Reference Guide icon on the desktop.

Loading Single Sheets of Paper

Follow the steps below to load paper into the printer.


- 1. Open the paper support, then slide out the extension.
- 2. Lower the output tray and slide out the extension.
- 3. Position the left edge guide so that the distance between the two guides is slightly wider than the width of your paper.

- 4. Fan a stack of plain paper, then tap it on a flat surface to even the edges.
- 5. Load the paper with the printable side up so it is against the right edge guide, and slide it into the sheet feeder. Then slide the left edge guide against the left edge of the paper. Make sure that the paper stack is loaded under the tabs inside the edge guides.



Note:

- □ *Leave enough space in front of the printer for the paper to be fully ejected.*
- □ *Always load paper into the sheet feeder short edge first.*
- □ Make sure that the paper stack fits under the arrow mark inside the edge guide.
- □ Make sure the CD/DVD tray is not inserted in the printer and the CD/DVD guide is up.



Inserting memory cards

Turn the printer on, open the memory slot cover, then insert a memory card as shown in the illustration. When the memory card is inserted correctry, the memory card light corresponding to the card comes on.

- □ Insert a memory card so that the top of the card faces the right side, as shown in the illustration.
- □ Loading a memory card in ways other than those shown here may damage the printer, memory card, or both.
- □ Use only one type of memory card at a time. Eject the loaded memory card before inserting another kind of memory card.
- □ Do not touch the memory card while it is in operation with the printer. Doing so may produce static electricity and cause the printer to malfunction.
- □ Before loading the Memory Stick Duo, mini SD Card and RS-MMC attach the adapter provided with it.

Basic Printing

This printer has two print modes, Basic and Advanced. Basic mode makes it easy to select photos, print or make copies. Advanced mode enables you to edit various settings. Refer to "Advanced Printing" on page 39.

Note:

When Basic Mode is selected, Paper Type, Paper Size and Layout are automatically set to Premium Grossy Photo Paper, 10×15 cm and Borderless or index.

Printing an index

You can print one or more copies of an index of all the photographs on a loaded memory card. An index can be helpful in selecting which photos you want to print.

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

This printer conforms to DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) version 1.10. DPOF lets you set the photo numbers and the number of copies for photos on the digital camera before you print. To create DPOF data that supports DPOF, you must use a digital camera that supports DPOF. For the details about DPOF settings, see your digital camera's documentation.

- 1. Load a memory card which contains DPOF data.
- 2. Select Select Photo, then select DPOF. The number of photos you selected on your digital camera is displayed.


Loading a CD/DVD

- 1. Make sure that the printer is on.
- 2. Open the paper support, then slide out the extension.
- 3. Open the output tray, then open the print cover.
- 4. Open the CD/DVD guide. The "Switching to CD/DVD print mode" message appears when you open the CD/DVD guide, and the print settings are automatically set to those for printing onto CD/DVDs.

Note:

An error occurs if the CD/DVD guide is opened while the printer is printing, or if paper is loaded in the sheet feeder.

- 5. Insert the memory card containing the photo data you want to print into the memory card slot.
- 6. Load a CD/DVD into the CD/DVD tray.
- 7. Insert the CD/DVD tray into the CD/DVD guide.



Note:

Align the arrow mark on the CD/DVD tray with the arrow mark on the CD/DVD guide.

- □ If a memory card is inserted in the memory card slot, the printer does not recognize the external storage device; it prints out the photo data in the memory card.
- Select the folder in which the photo data you want to print out is registered using the Folder Selection menu if data in the external storage device has been backed up using the backup function of the printer. The Folder Selection menu is displayed when data in the external storage device is recognized and pressing the Back button.
- 3. Set the individual items using the same procedure as when printing from a memory card, and perform printing.

Replacing an Ink Cartridge

This printer uses ink cartridges equipped with IC chips. The IC chip accurately monitors the amount of ink used by each cartridge, so even if a cartridge is removed and later reinserted, all of its ink can be used. However, some ink is consumed each time the cartridge is inserted because the printer automatically checks reliability.

You can replace an ink cartridge using the printer's control panel . Refer to the appropriate section below for instructions.



Warning:

- Keep ink cartridges out of the reach of children. Do not allow children to drink from or otherwise handle the cartridges.
- Be careful when you handle the used ink cartridges, as there may be some ink around the ink supply port. If ink gets on your skin, wash the area thoroughly with soap and water. If ink gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems remain after a thorough flushing, see a doctor immediately.

Caution:

- Epson recommends the use of genuine Epson ink cartridges. Other products not manufactured by Epson may cause damage to your printer not covered by Epson's warranties.
- □ Leave the old cartridge installed in the printer until you have obtained a replacement; otherwise, ink remaining in the print head nozzles may dry out.
- Do not refill the ink cartridges. The printer calculates the amount of ink remaining using an IC chip on the ink cartridge. Even if the cartridge is refilled, the amount of ink remaining will not be recalculated by the IC chip and the amount of ink available for use will not change.


The illustration shows replacement of the black ink cartridge.



Improving Print Quality

Checking the Print Head Nozzles

If you find that the printout is unexpectedly faint or that dots are missing, you may be able to identify the problem by checking the print head nozzles.

Note:

- You cannot clean the print head if the message "ink out" is displayed or the ink icon flashes to show ink out or ink low on the LCD panel. Replace the appropriate ink cartridge first.
- □ Make sure the CD/DVD tray is not inserted in the printer and the CD/DVD guide is up before using the Nozzle check utility.

Using the control panel buttons

Follow the steps below to check the print head nozzles using the control panel buttons.

- 1. Check that no warnings or errors are displayed on the LCD panel.
- 2. Make sure that A4 or Letter size paper is loaded in the sheet feeder.
- 3. Press the ◊- maintenance button.
- 4. Press the ▼ button to position the cursor at Nozzle Check and press the OK button.
- 5. Follow the instructions displayed in the LCD panel and press the OK button.



If the nozzle check page does not print satisfactorily (for example, if any segment of the printed lines is missing), there is a problem with the printer. This could be a clogged ink nozzle or a misaligned print head.

Cleaning the Print Head

If you find that the printout is unexpectedly faint or that dots are missing, you may be able to solve these problems by cleaning the print head, which ensures that the nozzles are delivering ink properly.

- Print head cleaning consumes some ink. To avoid wasting ink, clean the print head only if print quality declines; for example, if the printout is blurry or the color is incorrect or missing.

- You cannot clean the print head if the message "ink out" is displayed or the ink icon flashes to show ink low on the LCD panel. 



Cleaning the Printer

To keep your printer operating at its best, clean it thoroughly several times a year as follows.

- 1. Unplug the printer's power cord.
- 2. Remove any paper from the sheet feeder.
- 3. Use a soft brush to carefully clean away all dust and dirt from the sheet feeder.
- 4. If the outer case or the inside of the sheet feeder is dirty, wipe it with a soft, clean cloth dampened with mild detergent. Keep the printer cover closed to prevent water from getting inside.
- 5. If the inside of the printer accidentally gets soiled with ink, wipe it off with a damp cloth.
- 6. If ink have leaked inside the printer, wipe the inside of the printer with a soft, clean cloth.





Warning: Be careful not to touch the gears or rollers inside the printer.

- Do not apply grease to the metal parts under the print head carriage.
- □ Never use alcohol or thinner to clean the printer, as these chemicals can damage the components as well as the case.
- □ Be careful not to get water on the printer mechanism or electronic components.
- Do not use a hard or abrasive brush.
- Do not spray the inside of the printer with lubricants. Unsuitable oils can damage the mechanism. Contact your dealer or a qualified service person if lubrication is needed.

Transporting the Printer

If you need to transport your printer, carefully prepare and repack it as described below using the original box (or a similar box that the printer fits snugly into) and packing materials. Follow the steps below.




- When storing or transporting the printer, do not tilt it, stand it up vertically, or turn it upside down. Otherwise, ink may leak from the cartridge.
- □ Leave the ink cartridges installed. Removing the cartridges can dehydrate the printer head and may prevent the printer from printing.
- 1. Plug in the printer, then turn on the printer. Wait until the print head returns to the home position, then close the printer cover. Turn off the printer, and then unplug the printer.
- 2. Disconnect the interface cable from the printer.
