

## 1. Grab a new Smartbrief, fold over the **front**



- Fold about 2” of the front edge outwards
- Makes sure black lines are straight
- Tabbed end goes on resident’s back side

## 2. If the transmitter was not in use, **wake it up** by attaching it to the new brief \*



- Align the transmitter lines with brief lines
- Hold tightly until the light flashes to wake it up
- No need to lock the latch
- Take the transmitter off afterwards

\* Skip this step if you are changing the brief

## 3. Put the brief on the resident & attach the transmitter



- Align the transmitter lines with brief lines
- Hold tightly until the light flashes once
- Push the latch down all the way to lock it
- Double-check the alignment

## 4. Confirm “**Dry**” status on the dashboard.
