

Introduction



Welcome, and thank you for choosing a SHARP BB-HC1 cordless phone! The BB-HC1 allows you to make both analog and digital phone calls.

Important: To use the BB-HC1 to make digital phone calls, you must subscribe to a digital phone service from your Internet service provider.

Important safety information

Do not disassemble this product or attempt any procedures not described in this manual. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord, and do not install the base where people may walk on the power cord.

The base must only be connected to a 120 V, 60 Hz outlet using the provided AC adapter. Connecting it to any other kind of outlet through any other adapter will damage the base and invalidate the warranty.

Never insert objects of any kind into slots or openings on the equipment. This could create a risk of fire or electric shock. If an object falls into the equipment that you cannot remove, unplug the base and consult a qualified service representative.

Never install telephone wiring during a lightning storm.

Never install telephone jacks in wet locations unless the jack is specifically designed for wet locations.

Never touch bare telephone wires or terminals unless the telephone line has been disconnected at the network interface.

Use caution when installing or modifying telephone lines.

Avoid using a telephone (other than a cordless type) during an electrical storm. There may be a remote risk of electric shock from lightning.

Do not use a telephone to report a gas leak in the vicinity of the leak.

Battery

Use only the battery specified in this manual. Use only the provided base unit to charge the battery.

Do not open or mutilate the battery pack. Corrosive fluid may leak out and cause injury or burns to the eyes and skin. The fluid may be toxic if swallowed. In case of contact with eyes, flush with clean water (do not rub), and seek medical attention immediately.

Do not store or carry the battery with other metal objects such as keys or pins. These may short the battery and cause it to overheat.

Do not allow the battery to become wet.

Do not dispose of the battery in a fire or heat the battery. The battery may explode.



Antenna

Display

This displays messages and prompts to help you use the cordless phone.

UP and DOWN arrow keys

Receiver volume: When talking on the cordless phone, press these keys to adjust the receiver volume. This also adjusts the volume when using a headset (purchased separately) connected to the cordless phone.

Ringer volume: When not talking on the cordless phone, press these keys to adjust the cordless phone ringer volume.

Scroll through numbers: Press these keys to scroll when searching for a phone number.

FUNCTION/FLASH key

Press this key to change one of the function settings. The key is also used for special services such as Call Waiting that require subscription from your phone company (contact your phone company for details).



TALK key

Press this key to make or answer a call.



REVIEW (left arrow) key

Press the **REVIEW** key and then the **UP** or **DOWN** key to scroll through your most recently received calls (only available if you have Caller ID). This key can also be used to move the cursor left when entering or editing an auto-dial number or name.



Number keys

Use these keys to dial numbers, and enter numbers and letters when storing auto-dial numbers.



DIRECT DIAL (SHIFT) key

Press this key to automatically dial the phone number stored in the **DIRECT DIAL** key. This key is also used to switch between upper and lower case when entering a name for an auto-dial number.



ENTER key

Press this key to select a setting after scrolling with the **UP** or **DOWN** key, and to store auto-dial numbers and names entered with the numeric keys.



SELECT LINE key

Press this key before making a phone call to select the line. Line A1 is for analog phone calls and line D2 is for digital phone calls.



OFF key

Press this key to end a call, or to exit a programming procedure.



SEARCH (right arrow) key

Press the **SEARCH** key and then the **UP** or **DOWN** key to scroll through your auto-dial numbers. This key can also be used to move the cursor right when entering or editing an auto-dial number or name.



HOLD (ERASE) key

Hold: Press this key during a call to put the other party on hold. **Erase:** Press this key to erase a phone number when searching through your auto-dial numbers. Press the key to delete a digit or character when storing or editing an auto-dial number.



REDIAL (PAUSE) key

Press this key to redial the last number dialed. When storing an auto-dial number, press this key to insert a pause between digits.



Headset iack

This jack lets you connect a headset (purchased separately) to the cordless phone.



Battery cover

Remove this cover to install or replace the cordless phone battery.

Base





PAGE key

Press this key to locate the cordless phone in the event that you misplace it. When the key is pressed, the cordless phone will ring.



IN USE/CHARGE indicator (red)


This blinks when the cordless phone is in use, and lights steadily when the cordless phone is in the base and charging. When the cordless phone battery is fully charged, the indicator goes out.



Unpacking Checklist



Selecting a Location for the Base

To maximize the talking range of the cordless phone, we recommend installing the base in a high and central location away from obstructions such as walls.





Keep the base away from other electrical appliances such as TVs, microwave ovens, computers, and other cordless phones.



Do not place the base in direct sunlight.



Do not place the base near heaters or air conditioners.



Keep dust away from the base.

Raising the base antenna


Raise the base antenna to ensure clear communication with the cordless phone.



Connecting the AC Adapter and Telephone Line Cord

• Connect the AC adapter to the **AC Adapter** socket on the base, and then plug it into a 120-V, 60-Hz outlet.

2 Connect one end of the telephone line cord to the **Tel Line** jack on the base, and the other end to a standard (RJ11C) wall telephone jack.




Gateway setup

To use the cordless phone to make digital phone calls, your gateway must be properly connected and the power turned on. In addition, your gateway settings must be configured for use with the cordless phone. For details, see the gateway instruction sheet that accompanied the cordless phone.

Installing and Charging the Battery

- Connect the battery connector (●), and then place the battery pack in the cordless phone (●).
 - Place the wires as shown.



2 Place the battery cover on the cordless phone, making sure it snaps firmly into place.

• Make sure that the wires are not caught or pinched by the cover.

3 Place the cordless phone in the base with the dial pad facing forward.

- **Important!** The dial pad must face forward, or the battery will not charge.
- The battery charges automatically while the cordless phone is in the base. While charging, the display shows CHARGING.
- The cordless phone and base may feel warm while charging. This is normal.




Charge the battery at least **10** hours the first time!

Note: The battery cannot be overcharged. When not using the cordless phone, keep it in the base to ensure that it is always charged.

When the battery needs charging, LOW BATTERY will appear in the display and you will hear beeps during a phone conversation. Place the cordless phone in the base and let it charge.

Note: If the battery is extremely low, nothing may appear in the display during the first several minutes that the cordless phone is in the base. The battery will begin to charge normally after several minutes.



Talking range


The talking range of the cordless phone is approximately 900 ft. (300 m) (line of sight). If you hear noise or interference while talking, move closer to the base.

When outside the talking range, OUT OF RANGE appears in the display. If you move out of the talking range while talking, the phone will beep and you may hear interference.



Connecting a headset

You can connect a headset (purchased separately) to the headset jack. Remove the cap and insert the connector as shown.




Setting the dial mode for the analog phone line

The cordless phone is set to use tone dialing when you make a call on the analog phone line. If you are on a pulse dial line, you must set the cordless phone to use pulse dialing. Press the panel keys as follows:



Volume Adjustment



You can adjust the volume of the receiver and ringer using the up and down arrow keys.

Receiver volume




Ringer

Display: **1** When the cordless phone is not being **RINGER: HIGH** used for a phone call, press (\frown) or until the display shows the desired ringer volume level. **RINGER: MIDDLE** • The ringer will ring once at the selected level. **RINGER: LOW** RINGER: OFF OK ? 




Note: If line D2 cannot be selected, check your gateway to make sure it is connected properly and the power is turned on. In addition, make sure your gateway settings are configured as explained in the gateway instruction sheet that accompanied the cordless phone.

Making a Phone Call




When making a phone call, you dial the regular phone number (including the area code, if needed) no matter whether the phone call is a digital call or an analog call.



Temporarily issuing tones on a pulse-dial analog line

If your analog line is a pulse-dial line, you can press () during a call to make the cordless phone temporarily issue tones when the number keys are pressed.



Receiving a Phone Call

1 When the cordless phone rings, pick it up and press any key (except

) to answer. Talk to the other party.

- If the cordless phone is in the base, simply pick it up to answer (you do not need to press a key).
- **2** When you are ready to end the call, press \overline{OFF} .
 - You can also end the call by simply placing the cordless phone in the base.

If calls come in on both lines at once

If calls come in on both the digital and analog lines at once, use O before

answering to select which call you wish to answer. If a call comes in on the other line during a call, you will hear ringing. To answer the other call, you must first end the first call.

Putting a Call on Hold

To put the other party on hold during a call, press (HOLD). When you are ready to


resume the call, press once again. Note that if you place the cordless phone in the base while a call is on hold, the call will automatically be resumed when you pick up the cordless phone.

Using the DIRECT DIAL Key

You can store a phone number in the **DIRECT DIAL** key. This allows you to dial the number by simply pressing the **DIRECT DIAL** key.

• Only one phone number can be stored in the **DIRECT DIAL** key.







Using the Phone Book

Storing numbers in the phone book

You can store up to 30 auto-dial numbers in the phone book.



3 Enter the number (up to 16 digits) by pressing the number keys. (Note: A space cannot be entered.)

- To clear a mistake, press (HOLD).
- If a pause is required between any of the digits to access a special service or an outside line, press PAUSE REDAL
 The pause appears as a hyphen (two seconds per pause). Several pauses can be entered in a row.

4 Press ENTER

5 Enter a name by pressing number keys for each letter as shown in the chart below. Up to 15 characters can be entered. (If you do not wish to enter a name, go directly to Step 6.)


Editing a number in the phone book

If you need to make changes to a previously stored auto-dial number, follow these steps:

1 Press ()_{SEARCH} once. SEARCH DIAL : SEARCH **2** Press (\frown) or (\frown) until the number you wish to edit appears in the display. **3** Press (INTER) twice. **4** Press the number keys to enter the new number. • To clear a mistake, press (100). If a pause is required between any of the digits to access a special service or an outside line, press PAUSE (REDIAL). • If you do not wish to change the number, go directly to Step 5. **5** Press (ENTER) 6 Press the number keys to enter the new name (see Step 5 on page 22). If you do not wish to change the name, go directly to Step 7. 7 Press (ENTER) The display briefly shows STORED.


Clearing a number from the phone book

If you need to clear a number from the phone book, follow these steps:



Deleting all numbers from the phone book

If needed, you can delete all numbers from the phone book.



Redial

You can automatically redial the last number dialed (regardless of which line was used).

Note: If the base is unplugged or a power failure occurs, the last number dialed will be erased.

1 Make sure the desired line is selected, and then press ∞ .

• Check the display to make sure the number that appears is the number you

wish to dial. (If the wrong number appears, press $\sqrt{0}$ to clear it.)

2 Press $(\mathbf{\hat{R}}_{\text{TALK}})$. The number is automatically dialed.

Note: You can also redial by pressing *(intermediate)* first and then *(intermediate)*. Note that this method does not allow you to check the number before dialing begins.

Changing the Flash Time

The **FUNCTION/FLASH** key is used to access special services from your phone company that require subscription. If you find that you cannot access a service when you press the key as instructed by the phone company, try a different flash time setting. Three time settings are available.

Locating the Cordless Phone

If you misplace the cordless phone, press the **PAGE** key on the base. The cordless phone will ring to help you to locate it. To stop the ringing, press any key on the cordless phone, or press the **PAGE** key on the base again.



3. Caller ID (Requires Subscription to Service)

If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, you can have the cordless phone display the name and number of the caller when you receive a call.

Important:

- To use this function, you must subscribe to a caller ID service. You must subscribe separately for both the analog line and the digital line.
- Your cordless phone may not be compatible with some caller ID services.



How Caller ID operates

When you receive a call, the name of the caller will appear next to the line (A1 or D2) in the cordless phone display, beginning just before the second ring. The information will continue to be displayed until the line is disconnected.

◆ To display the number in addition to the name, press (INTER). (To return to the



Note: Some caller ID services may not provide the name of the caller. In this case, only the phone number will appear.

Display messages

One of the following messages will appear while the cordless phone rings if caller information is not available.

NO SERVICE	No caller information was received from your telephone company. Make sure that the telephone company has activated your service.
CALLER-ID ERROR	Noise on the telephone line prevented reception of caller information.
OUT OF AREA	The call was made from an area which does not have a caller identification service, or the caller's service is not compatible with that of your local phone company.
PRIVATE CALL	Caller information was not provided by the telephone company at the caller's request.

Viewing your received calls


If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the cordless phone will keep information on the most recent 30 calls you have received. You can view this information, which consists of the date and time the call was received and the name and number of the caller, in the cordless phone's display. You can automatically dial a number when it appears in the display.

- After you have received 30 calls, each new call will delete the oldest call.
- All calls will be erased if you unplug the base or a power failure occurs.

4. Maintenance and Troubleshooting

Replacing the Cordless Phone Battery


Like any other battery, the rechargeable battery will eventually wear out. The battery can normally be used for about two years, although this will vary depending on the conditions of use.


If you find that LOW BATTERY appears in the cordless phone display soon after the battery is charged, replace it with the following battery:

Replacement battery: Use only a Sharp UX-BA01 battery (3.6 V Ni-MH battery, capacity: 850 mAh)

Caution:

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the manufacturer. Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.






Battery disposal

The battery pack contains a Nickel Metal Hydride battery. The battery must be disposed of properly. Contact local agencies for information on recycling and disposal plans in your area.

Wiping the charger contacts

To ensure that the battery charges properly, wipe the charger contacts once a month with a cotton swab.



Problems and Solutions

If you have any problems with your cordless phone, refer to the following troubleshooting guide.

Problem	Solution
The cordless phone does not operate and nothing appears in the display.	• Make sure the battery is properly connected inside the cordless phone (see page 11).
	• The battery may be low. Place the cordless phone in the base and let it charge.
Calls cannot be made or received.	 Make sure the base is plugged into a power outlet and has power.
	 Make sure the telephone line is properly connected to the base and the wall jack (see page 10).
	• The battery may be low. Place the cordless phone in the base and let it charge.
	 Calls cannot be made or received during a power failure.
	 You may be outside of the talking range. Move closer to the base.
Digital calls cannot be made or received (the digital line (D2) cannot be selected).	• Make sure your gateway is connected properly and the power is turned on. In addition, make sure your gateway settings are configured as explained in the gateway instruction sheet that accompanied the cordless phone. The problem may also be due to a temporary interruption or other failure in your digital phone service.
You hear beeps during a call.	• You will hear beeps during a call and LOW BATTERY will appear in the display if the battery is low. Place the cordless phone in the base and let it recharge.
	 You will hear beeps during a call and OUT OF RANGE will appear in the display if you are outside of the talking range. Move closer to the base.

The battery does not charge.	• Make sure the cordless phone is placed in the base with the dial pad facing forward.	
	 Make sure the AC adapter is connected correctly to the base and the power outlet (see page 10).

Display Messages

CHARGING	The cordless phone is in the base and the battery is charging.	
HOLD	A call has been placed on hold by pressing the HOLD key. To resume the call, press the HOLD key again.	
IN CHARGER	The cordless phone is in the base and is fully charged (the cordless phone can be left in the base without damaging the battery).	
LOW BATTERY	The cordless phone battery is low. Place the cordless phone in the base and let it recharge. If this message continues to appear after recharging, the battery may need replacement (see page 32).	
OUT OF RANGE	The cordless phone is outside of the talking range of the base. When talking on the cordless phone, the phone will beep and you may hear interference. Move closer to the base. This message will also appear if the base is not properly plugged into the power outlet.	
PAGE	The PAGE key has been pressed on the base to locate the cordless phone. To stop the ringing and clear the PAGE message, press any key on the cordless phone, or press the PAGE key on the base again.	
TALK	The TALK key has been pressed to make a phone call.	

FCC Regulatory Information

But if advance notice isn't practical, the telephone company will notify the customer as soon as possible. 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
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
