

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A Look at the Operation Panel



- Antenna
- Display
 This displays messages and prompts to help you use the cordless handset.
- 3 UP and DOWN arrow keys

Receiver volume: When talking on the cordless handset, press these keys to adjust the receiver volume. This also adjusts the volume when using a headset (purchased separately) connected to the cordless handset.

Ringer volume: When not talking on the cordless handset, press these keys to adjust the cordless handset ringer volume.

Scroll through numbers: Press these keys to scroll when searching for a phone number.

- FUNCTION/FLASH key
 - Press this key to change one of the function settings. The key is also used to access special services from your phone company that require subscription (contact your phone company for details).
- **TALK key**Press this key to make or answer a call.

REVIEW (left arrow) key

Press the **REVIEW** key and then the **UP** or **DOWN** key to scroll through your most recently received calls (only available if you have Caller ID). This key can also be used to move the cursor left when entering or editing an auto-dial number or name.


- Number keys
 Use these keys to dial numbers, and enter numbers and letters when storing auto-dial numbers.
- 8 DIRECT DIAL (SHIFT) key
 Press this key to automatically dial the phone number stored in the DIRECT
 DIAL key. This key is also used to switch between upper and lower case when entering a name for an auto-dial number.
- Press this key to select a setting after scrolling with the UP or DOWN key, and to store auto-dial numbers and names entered with the numeric keys.
- SELECT LINE key
 Press this key before making a phone call to select the line. L1(Line 1) is for digital phone calls and L2 (Line 2) is for analog phone calls.
- OFF key
 Press this key to end a call, or to exit a programming procedure.
- SEARCH (right arrow) key
 Press the SEARCH key and then the UP or DOWN key to scroll through your
 auto-dial numbers. This key can also be used to move the cursor right when
 entering or editing an auto-dial number or name.
- HOLD (ERASE) key
 Hold: Press this key during a call to put the other party on hold.
 Erase: Press this key to erase a phone number when searching through your auto-dial numbers. Press the key to delete a digit or character when storing or
- REDIAL (PAUSE) key
 Press this key to redial the last number dialed. When storing an auto-dial number, press this key to insert a pause between digits.
- Headset jack
 This jack lets you connect a headset (purchased separately) to the cordless handset.
- Battery cover
 Remove this cover to install or replace the handset battery.

1. Setting Up

Selecting a Location for the Base

To maximize the talking range of the cordless handset, we recommend installing the base in a high and central location away from obstructions such as walls.





Keep the base away from other electrical appliances such as TVs, microwave ovens, computers, and other cordless phones.



Do not place the base in direct sunlight.



Do not place the base near heaters or air conditioners.



Keep dust away from the base.


Raising the base antenna

Raise the base antenna to ensure clear communication with the cordless handset.




Connecting the AC Adapter and Telephone Line Cord

- Connect the AC adapter to the **AC Adapter** socket on the base, and then plug it into a 120-V, 60-Hz outlet.
- **2** Connect one end of the telephone line cord to the **Tel Line** jack on the base, and the other end to a standard (RJ11C) wall telephone jack.



Installing and Charging the Battery

- 1 Connect the battery connector (**0**), and then place the battery pack in the cordless handset (**2**).
 - Place the wires as shown.



- Place the battery cover on the cordless handset, making sure it snaps firmly into place.
 - Make sure that the wires are not caught or pinched by the cover.



- **3** Place the cordless handset in the base with the dial pad facing forward.
 - **Important!** The dial pad must face forward, or the battery will not charge.
 - The battery charges automatically while the cordless handset is in the base.
 While charging, the display shows CHARGING.
 - The cordless handset and base may feel warm while charging. This is normal.




Charge the battery at least **10** hours the first time!

Note: The battery cannot be overcharged. When not using the cordless handset, keep it in the base to ensure that it is always charged.

When the battery needs charging, LOW BATTERY will appear in the display and you will hear beeps during a phone conversation. Place the cordless handset in the base and let it charge.

Note: If the battery is extremely low, nothing may appear in the display during the first several minutes that the cordless handset is in the base. The battery will begin to charge normally after several minutes.




Talking range

The talking range of the cordless handset is approximately 1200 ft. (400 m) (line of sight). If you hear noise or interference while talking, move closer to the base.


When outside the talking range, OUT OF RANGE appears in the display. If you move out of the talking range while talking, the handset will beep and you may hear interference.

Large metal objects, metal structures, and thick walls reduce the talking range.




Connecting a headset

You can connect a headset (purchased separately) to the headset jack. Remove the cap and insert the connector as shown.




Setting the dial mode for the analog phone line

The cordless handset is set to use tone dialing when you make a call on the analog phone line. If you are on a pulse dial line, you must set the cordless handset to use pulse dialing. Press the panel keys as follows:



Volume Adjustment



You can adjust the volume of the receiver and ringer using the up and down arrow keys.

Receiver volume

When talking on the cordless handset, press or until the display shows the desired volume level.

Display:

RECEIVER: HIGH

RECEIVER: MIDDLE

Ringer

When the cordless handset is not being used for a phone call, press or will the display shows the desired ringer volume level.







Receiving a Phone Call

When the cordless handset rings, pick it up and press any key (except



) to answer. Talk to the other party.

- If the cordless handset is in the base, simply pick it up to answer (you do not need to press a key).
- **2** When you are ready to end the call, press of OFF.
 - You can also end the call by simply placing the cordless handset in the base.

Putting a Call on Hold


To put the other party on hold during a call, press (HOLD). When you are ready to resume the call, press (HOLD) once again. Note that placing the cordless handset in the base while a call is on hold will break the connection.

Using the DIRECT DIAL Key

You can store a phone number in the **DIRECT DIAL** key. This allows you to dial the number by simply pressing the **DIRECT DIAL** key.

♦ Only one phone number can be stored in the **DIRECT DIAL** key.

If you need to make changes to a previously stored auto-dial number, follow these steps:



- **4** Press the number keys to enter the new number.
 - To clear a mistake, press (HOLD). If a pause is required between any of the digits to access a special service or an outside line, press (REDAL).
 - If you do not wish to change the number, go directly to Step 5.
- **5** Press (ENTER).
- 6 Press the number keys to enter the new name (see Step 5 on page 19).
 - If you do not wish to change the name, go directly to Step 7.
- 7 Press ENTER).

8 Press OFF to exit.


Clearing a number from the phone book

If you need to clear a number from the phone book, follow these steps:

1 Press () SEARCH once.



Deleting all numbers from the phone book

If needed, you can delete all numbers from the phone book.



Redial

You can automatically redial the last number dialed on the cordless handset.

- 1 Press (REDIAL).
 - Check the display to make sure the number that appears is the number you wish to dial. (If the wrong number appears, press of to clear it.)
- **2** Press TALK . The number is automatically dialed.

Note: You can also redial by pressing first and then REDIAL. Note that this method does not allow you to check the number before dialing begins.

Changing the Flash Time

The **FUNCTION/FLASH** key is used to access special services from your phone company that require subscription. If you find that you cannot access a service when you press the key as instructed by the phone company, try a different flash time setting. Three time settings are available.

Locating the Cordless Handset

If you misplace the cordless handset, press the **PAGE** key on the base. The cordless handset will make a ringing sound to help you to locate it.



3. Caller ID (Requires Subscription to Service)

If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, you can have the cordless handset display the name and number of the caller when you receive a call.

Important:

- ♦ To use this function, you must subscribe to a caller ID service. You must subscribe separately for both the analog line and the digital line.
- ♦ Your cordless handset may not be compatible with some caller ID services.

Turning on Caller ID

How Caller ID operates

When you receive a call, the name of the caller will appear by the line (L1 or L2) in the cordless handset display, beginning just before the second ring. The information will continue to be displayed until the line is disconnected. To

display the number in addition to the name, press (ENTER)



Note: Some caller ID services may not provide the name of the caller. In this case. only the phone number will appear.

Display messages

One of the following messages will appear while the cordless handset rings if caller information is not available.

NO SERVICE No caller information was received from your telephone

company. Make sure that the telephone company has

activated your service.

CALLER-ID ERROR Noise on the telephone line prevented reception of

caller information.

The call was made from an area which does not have a OUT OF AREA

caller identification service, or the caller's service is not

compatible with that of your local phone company.

PRIVATE CALL Caller information was not provided by the telephone

company at the caller's request.

Viewing your received calls

If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the cordless handset will keep information on the most recent 30 calls you have received. You can view this information, which consists of the date and time the call was received and the name and number of the caller, in the cordless handset's display. You can automatically dial a number when it appears in the display.

- ♦ After you have received 30 calls, each new call will delete the oldest call.
- ♦ All calls will be erased if you unplug the base or a power failure occurs.



4. Maintenance and Troubleshooting

Replacing the Cordless Handset Battery

Like any other battery, the rechargeable battery will eventually wear out. The battery can normally be used for about two years, although this will vary depending on the conditions of use.

If LOW BATTERY continues to appear in the cordless handset display after the battery has been charged for 10 hours, replace it with the following battery:

Replacement battery: Use only a Sharp UX-BA01 battery (3.6 V Ni-MH battery, capacity: 850 mAh)

Caution:

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the manufacturer.

Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.


1 Remove the battery cover by pressing on the indentation as shown.




2 Unplug the battery connector and remove the old battery.



3 Connect the battery connector **0** of the new battery, and then place the battery in the cordless handset, placing the wires as shown.



4 Place the battery cover on the cordless handset, making sure it snaps firmly into place.



- Place the cordless handset in the charger with the dial pad facing forward.
 - Let the new battery charge for at least **10** hours.




Battery disposal

The battery pack contains a Nickel Metal Hydride battery. The battery must be disposed of properly. Contact local agencies for information on recycling and disposal plans in your area.

Wiping the charger contacts

To ensure that the battery charges properly, wipe the charger contacts once a month with a cotton swab.

Display Messages

Note: If you have turned on the Caller ID function, see page 26 for display messages related to Caller ID.)

CHARGING	The cordless handset is in the base and the battery is charging.
HOLD	A call has been placed on hold by pressing the HOLD key. To resume the call, press the HOLD key again.
IN CHARGER	The cordless handset is in the base and is fully charged (the cordless handset can be left in the base without damaging the battery).
LOW BATTERY	The cordless handset battery is low. Place the cordless handset in the base and let it recharge. If this message continues to appear after recharging, the battery may need replacement (see page 29).
OUT OF RANGE	The cordless handset is outside of the talking range of the base. When talking on the cordless handset, the handset will beep and you may hear interference. Move closer to the base.
TALK	The TALK key has been pressed to make a phone call.
