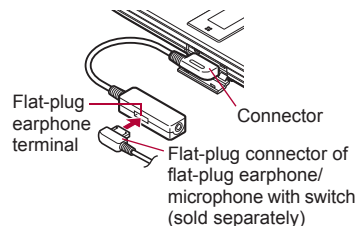
Component names and functions



Using earphone

Connect an earphone compatible with external connector terminal (sold separately). When using an earphone which does not support external connector terminal, connect with an earphone plug adapter for external connector terminal (sold separately).

※ Key illustrations are examples and may look different from actual keys.

1 Earpiece

- Listen to the other party's voice.
- Listen to Record message/Voice memo.

2 Brightness sensor (☞ P. 94)

- The sensor detects the light of the surrounding area and automatically adjusts the display brightness and turns on/off the keypad backlight.
- Do not cover the sensor area with your hand or a sticker. May interfere with the sensor.

3 Main display (☞ P. 27)**4 i-mode/Operation guidance key (☞) (☞)**

- Press to use i-mode (☞ P. 154).
- Press to execute the functions of the operation guidance (☞ P. 27).
- Press for 1+ seconds to display the i-appli software list screen (☞ P. 245).

5 Mail/Operation guidance key (☞)

- Press to use mail functions (☞ P. 122).
- Press to execute the functions of the operation guidance (☞ P. 27).
- Press twice to check new messages (☞ P. 132).
- Press for 1+ seconds to display a compose message screen (☞ P. 122).

6 Start/Hands-free key (☞)

- Press to make or receive a voice call.
- Press to use Hands-free (☞ P. 49).
- Press for 1+ seconds to set the Eco mode (Power saver) (☞ P. 93).

7 Dial/Text entry keys (☞) to (☞), (☞), (☞), (☞)

- Press to enter a phone number or text.
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to enable/disable the Public mode (Drive mode) (☞ P. 62).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to enable/disable the Manner mode (☞ P. 89).
- Press (☞) to (☞) for 1+ seconds to use assigned functions (☞ P. 351).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to set font size collectively (☞ P. 101).

- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to record Voice memos or play Voice memos/Recorded messages (☞ P. 66, P. 355).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to start to use 2in1 or switch modes (☞ P. 381, P. 382).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to reset Kisekae Tool settings or Font style setting (☞ P. 96, P. 101).

8 Multi/Quick search key (☞)

- Press to use Quick search (☞ P. 352).
- Press to use Multi Assistant (☞ P. 340).

9 Sub camera

- Use to shoot still pictures of yourself.
- Use to send images of yourself during a Videophone call.

10 Multi-guide key (☞) (☞)

- Move the cursor to select an item and execute or set (☞ P. 27).
- Press to display Menu, Redial list screen, Received calls list screen and Shortcut menu.
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to enable/disable Multi easy lock (☞ P. 111).
- Press (☞) to activate the function saved to the One-touch key (☞ P. 351).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to enable/disable Side Key guard (☞ P. 111).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to enable/disable IC card lock (☞ P. 268).
- Press (☞) for 1+ seconds to adjust the earpiece volume (☞ P. 86).

11 Camera/Operation guidance key (☞)

- Press to activate the camera (☞ P. 191).
- Press to execute the functions of the operation guidance (☞ P. 27).
- Press for 1+ seconds to activate 1Seg (☞ P. 211).

12 Phonebook/Operation guidance key (☞)

- Press to use the phonebook (☞ P. 75).
- Press to execute the functions of the operation guidance (☞ P. 27).
- Press for 1+ seconds to display the phonebook entry screen (☞ P. 75).

13 i-Channel/Clear key  (CH)

- Press to show the channel list (☞ P. 173).
- Press to return to the previous screen.
- Use to delete text or phone numbers.

14 Power/End key 

- Press for 2+ seconds to turn the power on/off (☞ P. 43).
- Use to end the function being used and return to stand-by display.

15 MAP key 

- Press to activate GPS compatible i-appli (☞ P. 279).
- Press for 1+ seconds to check your present location (☞ P. 278).
- Press to add location information to still pictures or display the added location information (☞ P. 191, P. 299).

16 Mouthpiece/Microphone

- Sends out your own voice.

17 microSD Card slot (☞ P. 314)**18 Light key** 

- Press for 1+ seconds with the FOMA terminal closed to turn on/off the picture light.
- Press with the FOMA terminal closed to scroll i-Channel ticker in the sub display from the beginning (☞ P. 174).

19 FOMA antenna

- An antenna is built in. To speak in better conditions, do not cover the antenna area by hand.

20 1Seg antenna (☞ P. 208)

- A 1Seg antenna is built in. To receive in better conditions, do not cover the antenna area by hand.

21 Called/Charging LED

- Flashes while receiving a call, etc (☞ P. 99).
- Illuminates while charging (☞ P. 39).

22 Sub display (☞ P. 27)**23 External connector terminal**

- Integrated terminal used while charging, connecting the earphone, etc.

- Connect to an external device such as AC adapter/DC adapter, FOMA USB Cable with Charge Function 01/02 (sold separately) (☞ P. 40, P. 322).

24 Strap ring**25 Speakers**

- Emits ring tones, music, etc.
- Emits the other party's voice during hands-free operation.

26 Main camera

- Use to shoot still pictures or movies (☞ P. 186).
- Use to send a camera image shot during a Videophone call to the other party (☞ P. 48).

27 Infrared port

- Use for the Ir communication (☞ P. 328).
- Use for the Ir remote control (☞ P. 332).


28 Picture light

- Illuminates while activating the camera (☞ P. 186).
- Illuminates/Flashes during shooting (☞ P. 191, P. 193).

29 Back cover (☞ P. 38)

- A radio frequency-preventing sticker is attached on the back of the back cover. Do not peel off this sticker.

30  mark

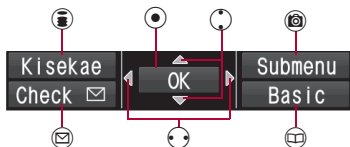
- The IC card is included (The IC card cannot be removed). Use Osaifu-Keitai holding the  mark up to the scanning device (☞ P. 267).
- Use to send and receive data via the iC communication (☞ P. 333).

31 Charger terminal (☞ P. 41)

- Terminal for charging with the desktop holder.

Using Multi-guide key and Operation guidance key

Use to select or execute the menus that appear in the operation guidance. The following shows the keys allotted to select or execute the menu items that appear in the operation guidance.



■ Operation guidance menu

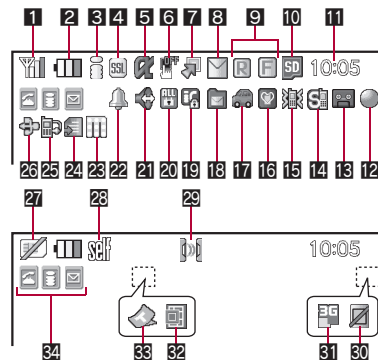
In the operation guidance, menus appear according to the used function and situation.

The following table describes examples of the main operation guidance menus that appear.

OK	Sets the selected item
Submenu	Displays the Submenu
Agree	Checks selected image, music, etc.
Back	Returns to the previous screen
Play/Stop	Plays/Stops i-motion, music, etc.
Full	Displays selected images, etc. in full screen
Show all	Displays sorted files, etc. as a list
1/1 or Zoom↓	Displays selected images, etc. in actual/reduced size
Mail	Displays the compose message screen
Send	Sends a message
Cancel	Cancels the operation such as receiving a message
SelAll/ClrAll	Selects/Disables all selectable items (Up to 50 items can be selected/disabled depending on the function)
Page ▲/Page ▼	Scrolls the display by page
Close	Closes the Submenu, etc.

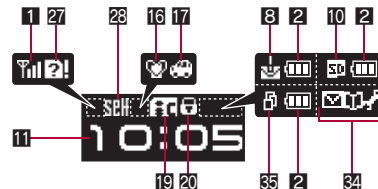



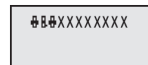

- The display for the FOMA terminal is manufactured using high-precision technology, but it may occasionally contain dots that fail to light or that remains permanently lit. This is not a malfunction.
- The display time of sub display follows the light duration setting.

1 In stand-by, a stock icon appears

2 Select the stock icon .

- After the details are checked, the stock icon and message disappear.

- Stock icons do not appear while the i-motion set as stand-by is played or the i-αpli stand-by is being activated.

Setting and selecting menu

Set, change or save functions from the menu screens.

The explanations in this manual are based on how to retrieve a function from the Custom menu.

Setting start menu <Menu priority>

Set the start menu that displayed when is pressed while displaying the stand-by.

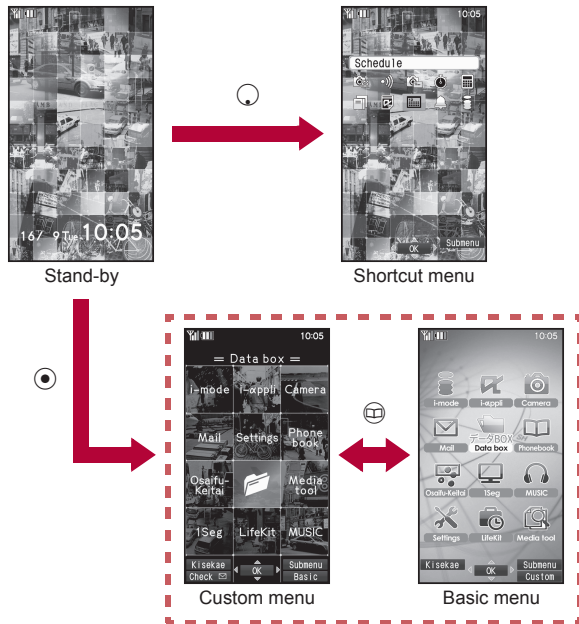
1 In stand-by, press **[Settings]** **[Disp/LED/Power saver]** **[Menu priority]**.

- In the Custom menu/Basic menu: Press **[Menu priority]**.

2 Select the start menu **[Yes]**.

■ Switching set start menu temporarily

Switch the start menu temporarily. When the stand-by display reappears, the start menu returns to the one set in Menu priority. Use the Shortcut menu to retrieve saved functions quickly. Other functions can also be saved in the Shortcut menu (☞ P. 351).



■ Retrieving a function from each start menu

- Use \odot in all menus.
- Press the dial key corresponding to the menu item number (1, 2, 3, etc.) to select a function. However, in the Custom menu, a function may not be selected by using the menu item numbers.
- The method for selecting functions may differ depending on the Kisekai Tool set for the Custom menu.
- Press \square to re-select a function, and the previous screen reappears. Press \square to return to stand-by.

When a stock icon (☞ P. 31) appears in stand-by, select **MENU** to show the start menu.
