- Since this product uses radio waves, the possibility of communication intercepts by third parties cannot be eliminated. (Though the LTE/GSM/UMTS system has highly secure confidential communication features.)


#### Be considerate of people around you

# Safety Precautions (Observe Strictly)

- Before using the product, thoroughly read these safety precautions for proper use. After reading, store the precautions in a safe place.

# **Handling Precautions**

These precautions are provided to prevent product faults and to ensure that performance can be fully demonstrated.

Thoroughly read these precautions to ensure correct use.

#### Precautions common to the main unit, battery pack, back cover, charger, au Nano IC Card 04, peripheral devices

Do not apply excessive force to the product during use. Be sure not to put the product into a tightly packed bag or place a heavy object on the product in a bag. Sitting on the product in your pocket might damage the display or internal circuit board resulting in a malfunction.

Keeping an external device connected to the external connection jack might damage the connector resulting in a malfunction. Such damage and malfunction are not covered by the warranty, even if there is no external damage.

 To ensure waterproof/dustproof property (equivalent to IPX5, IPX7 and IP5X) of the product, use the product with a specified back cover tightly closed.

Note that the waterproof property is not guaranteed in every usage condition. Do not allow foreign matter (liquid, dust, etc.) to get inside the product or on the battery pack, charger, or optional accessories. Do not open/close the back cover in the rain or with any water on the surface of the product. Doing so might cause water intrusion resulting in internal corrosion.

Malfunctions determined to be caused by such water intrusion are not covered by the warranty.

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places. (Use within an ambient temperature range of 5°C to 35°C and humidity range of 35% to 85%.)

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places. (Use within an ambient temperature range of 5°C to 35°C and humidity range of 35% to 85%.)

- Do not use in places subject to lots of dust or vibration. Doing so might cause a fault.
- Clean the connection terminals with a dry cotton swab, etc. periodically. Soiled terminals may cause a poor connection. Do not push forcefully and bend terminals while cleaning.
- Clean the product with a soft dry cloth (such as the type used for eyeglasses). Forceful rubbing with a dry cloth may scratch the display. The display may be stained if splash or smear is left attached to the surface. Wiping the product using alcohol, thinner, benzene, detergent, glass cleaner, etc. might erase the printing on the outer casing or cause a fault.
- Use as far away as possible from fixed-line phones, TVs and radios. Use nearby might affect them.
- The product may become warm while charging or during other operations, depending on the situation, but this is not abnormal.
- Turn off the power of the product before removing the battery pack.
   If you remove the battery pack with the power on, saved data might be altered or lost.
- Do not place near corrosive chemicals or in places where corrosive gas is generated. Doing so might cause a fault.
- Do not use outside when you can hear thunder. Doing so might risk lightning strikes and electric shock.
- Be sure to use only the specified peripheral devices. Use of other peripheral devices might cause a fault.
- Do not put the product in a cooking apparatus such as microwave oven or a pressure vessel. Doing so might cause a fault.

- The customer is not allowed to disassemble, modify or repair the product. Doing so might cause a fault. Also, modification of the product is in violation of the Radio Law and/or the Telecommunications Rusiness Law
- To prevent short-circuiting of the charger terminal and external connection jack, do not allow your fingers or any other part of your body or conductive materials (metal, pencil lead, etc.) to come in contact with or enter these areas. Doing so might cause a fault.
- If equipment becomes wet during charging, immediately disconnect the power plug of the AC adapter.
- Do not use product while driving a car or riding a motorbike or bicycle or while walking. Doing so might cause a traffic accident. Use of a cell phone while driving a car or riding a motorbike is prohibited by law. Use of a cell phone while riding a bicycle may be punishable by some regulations.
- Do not use or charge the product in the bag or with it covered by bedding etc. Doing so might cause a fault.
- When using a charger or external device, insert/remove the connector straight to/from the jack.Inserting/removing in an incorrect orientation might cause a fault.
- Do not expose the camera lens to direct sunlight for an extended period. Doing so might cause a fault.
- Do not use, store or leave the product in places subject to direct sunlight (e.g.in automobiles), places that get hot, places that get extremely cold, and in humid or dusty places. Doing so might cause a fault
- Do not place the product on top of a wobbly table, sloped surface, or other unstable location. Be careful especially when the product is charging or set to vibrate. Doing so may allow the product to fall and cause injury etc.
- When charging the product, do not exceed the ratings given for outlets and wiring by multiple connections etc.
- When the product becomes warm during use, the screen brightness or part of its functions may be restricted.

#### Main unit

- Do not forcefully press, tap or intentionally subject the display to strong impact. Doing so might cause scratching or damage.
- Do not forcefully press sharp objects or hard objects against keys or display surface. Doing so might cause scratching or damage.
- The product's keypad (touch area) can be operated with your fingers as a touchpad (Touch Cruiser EX). However, in the following cases, the touch area may not respond to touch operation. These may also result in malfunction.

     with fingernails
  - with another object placed on the operation area
  - · with a sticker adhered
  - · with any water or condensation on the touch area
  - · with wet or sweaty fingers
  - · Operation under water
- Do not remove the sticker printed with the IMEI number in the battery compartment visible when the battery pack is removed. This sticker bears a "Technical Conformity Mark &" certificating that the product and the communication module you are using comply with the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law.
- Never use a modified product. Use of a modified device violates the Radio Law and the Telecommunications Business Law. The product has acquired the certification of conformity with technical regulations for a specified radio station based on the Radio Law and well has been deemed to conform with technical regulations for a device based on the Telecommunications Business Law, and the "Technical Conformity Mark &" can be confirmed on the product nameplate sticker.
  - If the screws of the product are removed and modifications are made to the internal components, the certification of conformity with technical regulations will become invalid. If the modifications are made to the internal components, the certification of conformity with technical regulations will become invalid. Never use the product without the valid certification. Doing so violates the Radio Law and/or the Telecompruincations Rusiness Law.

- Take care not to place magnetized items such as magnetic cards, speakers and TV sets near the product, as it might cause malfunction.
  - Putting strong magnetism close to the product might cause false operation.
- Do not bring the product close to magnetic cards such as cash cards, credit cards, and prepaid cards. Doing so might result in loss of recorded information.
- When you put the product in your pocket or bag, take care so that the display does not come in contact with metal objects or other hard objects, as it might cause scratching or damage. - Putting a sticker, etc. on the main display or a key may cause malfunction or shortened usage time. Also, doing so may damage the product.

- Be careful not to pinch your fingers when opening/closing the product.
- If you put magnetized objects, metal straps, etc. close to the product, the speaker section sometimes emits sounds. This is not a fault.
- Bright places such as under the direct sunlight sometimes make it hard to see the display. This is not a fault.
- Do not use with the back cover removed. Do not leave or store in that manner. Doing so may allow dust or other foreign matter to enter and cause a fault.
- Do not allow liquids, metal objects, and other foreign matter to get inside the au Nano IC Card 04 tray slot or microSD memory card slot of the product. Doing so might cause a fault.
- Do not subject to strong impact to the product such as dropping, throwing or stepping it. Doing so might cause a fault.
- Do not put the product directly on sand at a beach, etc. Sand or other small particles might get inside the earpiece, mouthpiece, speaker or earphone/microphone jack causing the volume to drop. If sand gets inside the product, it might cause overheating or a fault.

#### OLED Display

- The product uses an OEL display in its sub-display. While OEL displays may experience lowered partial brightness if same images are displayed for a long time or if used for an extremely long time, this is due to the characteristics of the OEL display and is not a malfunction.
- OEL displays are manufactured with high-precision technology, and may experience very limited instances of pixels not lighting or being always on.
  - Brightness may also appear unevenly in bands depending on the angle. This is due the structure of the OEL display, and is not a malfunction.
- Leaving an OEL display under direct sunlight might cause malfunction. Use caution when placing near a window or outdoors.

#### ■ Battery pack



#### (The battery pack of the product is a lithium-ion battery.)

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Charge the battery before using the product. Also charge the battery after long periods of disuse before using the product.

- Use in very hot or cold environments, for example, when left in an automobile with the windows closed in summer, will cause the battery capacity to drop and shorten the available battery usage time. This will also shorten the battery pack's service life. Try to use the battery pack as much as possible at room temperature.
- When the battery pack is not to be used for a long time, remove the battery pack from the main unit, and store it away from hot and humid places.
- The battery pack is a consumable item. If the performance of a battery pack does not recover (e.g. the usable time after each charge has become extremely short), the battery pack is at the end of service life, so stop use and buy a new one of the specified type. Note that the length of service life varies depending on the usage condition, etc.
- Battery packs sometimes swell up as they approach the end of their service life depending on the usage condition.
   This is due to the properties of lithium-ion batteries, and is not a problem in terms of safety.
- Do not use a damaged or leaking battery pack. Doing so might cause a malfunction.

Do not expose the battery pack to water, etc. Doing so might cause a malfunction. If you accidentally drop the product in water or other liquid, immediately turn the power off, remove the battery pack, and contact an au shop or the Keitai Guarantee Service Center. Do not recharge a wet battery pack.

#### Charger

- Do not wrap the power cord of the specified charger (sold separately) around the charger. Also, do not forcibly bend the charger's plug or the connection between the connector and power cord. Do not apply excessive force to cord of the charger (sold separately) such as placing a heavy object on it or pulling it. Doing so might cause a fault.
- When unplugging the power plug of the specified charger (sold separately) from an outlet or cigarette lighter socket, hold the power plug to do so. If you pull the cord, it might be damaged.

#### au Nano IC Card 04

- Do not forcibly remove or insert the au Nano IC Card 04. Be careful not to exert excessive force when inserting the card into your au cell phone.

#### Camera

- If the camera lens breaks, immediately discontinue use, and contact an au shop or Keitai Guarantee Service Center. Continued use may cause injury.
- When photographing important occasions etc., take a trial shot and check the shot image to make sure it is correctly shot in advance.
- Do not shoot in areas where shooting is prohibited.

- At the time of purchase, the PIN code is "1234", and entry requirement is "not required". You can change the PIN code to any 4- to 8-digit number and the entry requirement to "required" if necessary.

The product also achieves a shockproof property compliant with MIL standards \*4 (based on testing by the Company).





You can also sometimes press O.

#### ■ To Return to Previous Screen

You can press bur to go back one screen.

 You can also sometimes press ⊕, □, or □ to return to the previous screen.

#### ■ To Return to the Standby Screen

To return to the standby screen from any function, press .

- After a certain period of no key operation, the product may return to the standby screen automatically.
- . If activating a function while in a call, the call may be interrupted.
- · The function or application being used is ended.

#### ■ To Enter Numbers

You can press O to 9 to enter numbers.

If "▲" and "▼" are displayed above and below the number entry field, you can press \$\mathbb{O}\$ to increase or decrease the number.

#### ■ To Move to Previous or Next Data

While displaying mail, etc., you can press 6 to move to the next data or  $\boxtimes$  to move to the previous data.

# **Making Calls**

# Entering a Phone Number and Making a Call

# When the standby screen is displayed, enter phone number.

The dial screen is displayed and the number is entered.

- You can press in the standby screen to display the dial screen with no number entered.

You can select "Register to address book" to register a number in the address book that a call was made to.

· You can also fold the product to end a call.

- In functions including "Calc (Calculator)", "Timer", "Schedule (Calendar)", and "Alarm", you can also quote numbers entered in the dial screen. Follow the on-screen display after entering the number. Usable functions depend on the number that was entered.
- © Even when "In Call" is displayed, the other party may not have taken the call. Start talking after making sure that the other party has taken the call.
- © Call charges for calls made with "1401" added are subtracted from the registered balance on an au prepaid card that you have bought.
- Note that even if you cover the mouthpiece (microphone), the sound can be conveyed to the other party.
- © Even if "Airplane mode" is set, you can call to the emergency number (110, 119, 118) and Customer Service Center (157).
- You can press the dial keys during a call to send push signals for the entered number.
- © To return to the call screen after activating an application during a call, press [207] to end the application.

## ■ Emergency Call Location Notification

The product supports "Emergency call location notification" so that if you make an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, your current location (GPS information) will be transmitted to the agency receiving the emergency call.

- In this section, Police (110), Fire and Ambulance (119) and Regional Coast Guard Headquarters (118) are collectively referred to as the emergency call receiving agency.
- This feature may not yet be available at some emergency call receiving agencies.

- If you add "184" before the Japan emergency call number 110/119/118, the emergency call responding agency will not be notified of your location and phone number.
- O VoLTE (LTE network) by au is used when connecting with emergency responding organizations within Japan. You cannot connect using 3G (circuit-switched network).
- In places where signal reception from GPS satellites or a base station is relatively poor, such as in an underground mall, inside a building or behind a tall building, the emergency call receiving agency may be notified of some other place different from your actual location.
- When GPS cannot be used to notify of your location, base station signal is used instead.
- When making an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, always confirm where you are, and tell them your exact location on the phone. Note that depending on the area where you are calling, your call may not be connected to the agency having jurisdiction over that area.
- If the emergency call receiving agency determines that human lives and health are in danger, they will be able to acquire the caller's location information during the call or within a certain period of time after the call.

#### Using P (Pause) Dialing and Making a Call

Enter the push signals to send beforehand and then select "Yes" during the call to send the push signals. This is a convenient feature when using information services and automatic reservation services.

Example: To dial "03-0001-XXXX (bank phone number)" and send the branch "22X" and the account "123XX"

- Enter bank phone number "030001XXXX".

You can enter P (pause) between numbers to enter several push signals at the same time.

After the destination answers the call, a confirmation screen is displayed. A push signal is sent each time you select "Yes" and press .

## Using Call Histories and Making a Call

- When the standby screen is displayed, press ⊙ (Outgoing)/ ⊙ (Incoming).
  - Press ⊕ to toggle the outgoing and incoming call histories.



     \* The time that SMS is delivered may differ with international SMS.

## **Before Using the Camera**

- Fingerprints and smudges on the lens prevent capture of clear still pictures/video. Before capturing images, wipe the lens clean with a soft cloth. Rubbing forcefully may scratch the lens.
- Avoid fingers, hair, strap, etc. from covering the lens or mobile light during image capture. Hold the strap if it interferes with capture.
- If capturing images with the mobile light on, its light reflecting from fingers, a cover, etc. around the lens can cause captured still pictures/video to turn out whitish.
- When capturing video, avoid covering the microphone with fingers.
   Loudness of voices and surroundings during video capture may affect the sound quality of the microphone.
- When using the self-timer for image capture and the product is placed on an unstable surface, the product vibrating such as when a call arrives or other conditions may cause the product to fall.
- Even in manner mode, the focus lock beep and shutter click for still
  pictures and start and stop beeps for video sound. The volume
  cannot be adjusted.
- Exposure of the lens for extended periods to direct sunlight or other sources of strong light may discolor the internal color filter and cause discoloration in still pictures/video.
- Capturing or saving still pictures/video after the product has been left in a warm place for an extended period may affect the still pictures/video.
- The camera comprises high-precision components, and includes pixels that are always on or that do not light. Image capture in extremely dark conditions will result in blue, red, and white dots, etc.
- Release the shutter after confirming that the subject is properly displayed in the main display. Moving the camera while releasing the shutter may cause still pictures to be blurry.
- When capturing images indoors under fluorescent lighting, faint stripes may be visible on the screen from fluorescent light flickering (very faint, invisible to the human eye), but is not a malfunction.

- The color of still pictures/video captured with the product camera may differ from the actual subject. Images may appear partially darker or brighter due to the characteristics of the lens and depending on the subject and illumination when capturing. Subjects may also appear partially distorted.
- Subjecting the product to shock while capturing images may cause the camera to lose focus. If focus is lost, activate the camera again.
- . Focusing may not be possible for the following types of subjects.
  - · Low-contrast subjects such as plain walls
  - · Subjects with strong backlighting
  - · Shiny subjects that reflect light brightly
- · Subjects with a pattern that repeats horizontally such as blinds
- $\cdot$  Several subjects with differing distances from the camera
- · Subjects in dark conditions
- · Fast-moving subjects
- Do not shine the mobile light near eyes. Do not look directly into shining mobile light. Do not shine mobile light at other persons' eyes.
   Doing so may affect vision or cause other impairment.
- Faint sound may audible when using the camera such as when activating the camera. This is from the internal components and is normal.
- Directly capturing the sun, a lamp, or other strong source of light may cause still pictures/video to be dark or noise may appear.
- The screen may appear momentarily white or dark when capturing a moving subject or when moving from light to dark conditions. Noise may also momentarily appear.
- Noise may increase and result in grainy still pictures when capturing in dark conditions.
- Immediately after switching camera modes or changing camera settings, it may take time for brightness, color, etc. to be displayed optimally.
- Creating a public nuisance with use of the product camera may be punishable by law.
- If the battery level is less than (about 10%), the camera cannot be activated

- · It may not be possible to use the camera in the following instances.
- When the temperature of the product is high after using for an extended period
- · When using the product in extremely low temperatures such as outdoors in the winter





- While displaying the 1Seg screen, the product may become warm and cause low-temperature burns, etc. if used in contact with the skin for an extended period.
- Listening at a volume that is loud to the ears continuously for an extended period may affect hearing.



# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of Cell Phones

This model [SHF33] cell phone complies with Japanese technical regulations for exposure to radio waves and international guidelines on radio wave protection.
