



Safety Precautions and Conditions of Use

Your handset conforms to international regulations insofar as it is used under normal conditions and in accordance with the following instructions.

Electromagnetic waves




Battery

- Recommended temperature for using and storing batteries is approximately 20°C (68°F).



Camera Operation






THIS MODEL PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted level of RF energy for the general population.

The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health. The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg, * Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by FCC for each model. Body-worn Operation: This device has been tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone touching the body. 

Introduction

Your handset has been designed, manufactured and tested so as not to exceed the limits for exposure to electromagnetic fields recommended by the Council of the European Union. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines developed by independent scientific organizations. The guidelines include a

the handset user and others and to take into account variations in age and health, individual sensitivities and environmental conditions. European standards provide for the amount of radio frequency electromagnetic energy absorbed by the body when using a handset to be measured by reference to the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). 



Quick Setup gives you the basic information you need to start using your handset.

Step 1: Unpacking

Check that the following items are included:

- Handset (the battery cover attached)
- Rechargeable Li-ion battery
- AC charger
- Hands free EARphone & MIC (Stereo)
- Operation Manual

Purchase SD memory card separately.

Step 2:

Inserting the SIM Card and the **Battery**


In order to access the available services, do not forget to insert a SIM card and a battery. The SIM card carries the user's identity for accessing the network and also stores personal information such as the phone directory and SMS messages. Only use a 3V SIM card with your handset.




If you already have a mobile phone before purchasing this handset, you may use your previous SIM card with the new handset. In this case, refer to "If You Upgrade Your Handset" on page 3-21.




















Position the battery with the model name facing up. Insert its top end into slot (①) as illustrated and insert the other end into position (②).



Align the battery cover with the battery compartment as illustrated and slide it in the direction of the arrow until it clicks.



Removing the SIM Card

In step 3 on page 3-14, press the tab securing the card and slide it in the opposite direction from the SIM holder.

Step 3: Charging the Battery


The battery is not fully charged when you purchase the handset. Charge the battery for at least 2 hours before using. Use only the included AC charger.

Using the Charger


- 1 Insert the charger plug into an AC outlet.
- 2 Open the external connector cap and insert the charger (label facing up) into the USB/Charger connector. The battery indicator in the display () starts animating.






















3 When charging is complete, the Indicator stops animating.



- The standard charging time is approximately 2 hours.
- Charging time may vary depending on the state of the battery and other conditions. For information on the battery, refer to "Battery" on page 1-5.

Removing the charger

Disconnect the charger plug from the AC outlet and unplug the charger from the handset.

To charge using the cigarette lighter charger

The optional cigarette lighter charger (CE-CL30) supplies power for charging from the cigarette lighter socket of a car.

Battery Status

Check the battery indicator displayed in the upper left of the display to estimate remaining battery power. When the battery is empty, " papears on the display and an alarm sounds. The battery may only last for another 5 minutes. If you are using your handset, charge the battery immediately.








Using the Memory Card

Viewing Saved Video Clips

You can view saved video clips in "My videos."

- **1** At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create video"
- 2 Press ⊖ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- 3 Press ③ or ② to highlight "My videos" and press ②.
 The thumbnail index for saved video clips appears.
- **4** Press ⑤, ⊙, ⊙ or ⊙ to select the video clip you wish to playback and press ℚ.
 - Fress ②.

 The selected video clip is played back.

 To pause playback, press ③.

 To resume playback, press ③ again.

 To stop playback, press ⑤ [Back].




- When you save video clips, the assigned file names are "YMMDDnnn.3gp" (YMMDD is Y (Year), M (Month), D (Day) and nnn is a 3 digit number).
- The file name and size of your pictures are displayed in the thumbnail index.
- If the video clip has been recorded with sound, the volume can be adjusted by pressing ③ or
- The volume depends on the "Ringing Volume" setting (page 15-136). The volume is 0 when "Ringing Volume" is set to "Silent" or "Step Tone"



This section describes useful common functions you can use for both camera and video.

Selecting the Memory

If you use the memory card (page 3-18), you can select a memory (handset memory or memory card) before taking pictures or recording videos for the data storage.

- At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create photo" or "Create video."
- Press

 [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- Press o or to highlight "Save to" and press 0.
- **10** Press ③ or ② to highlight "Handset" or "Memory card" and press O.

Selecting Focus Mode

You can select a focus mode from the following three alternatives.

- At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera"

 "Create photo" or "Create video."
- Press

 [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- Press o or to highlight "Focus mode" and press O.
- Press (or (to highlight "Autofocus." "Semi-autofocus" or "Manual focus" and press **O**.

Autofocus: Focus automatically by pressing

Semi-autofocus: Once O is pressed, the focal length will be fixed. Press O

again to take the picture with fixed focus.


Manual focus: By pressing $^{\mathbf{A}}/_{\mathbf{V}}$, focal length


can be changed. Press O to take the picture with the focus

set manually.

Once you set "Semi-autofocus" in step 4. make sure that you have to press O twice to take a picture.

Using the Digital Zoom Function


- **1** At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create photo" or "Create video."
- 2 Press ⊚ to zoom in (the subject becomes larger) or press ⊚ to zoom out (the subject becomes smaller.)

The zooming ratio indicators appear automatically when \odot or \odot is pressed and disappear when the key is released.

The available zooming steps depend on the camera settings.

Using the Delay Timer

- At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create photo" or "Create video."
- **2** Press ⊖ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- **3** Press ^(h) or ^(h) to highlight "Delay timer" and press ^(h).

- 4 Press ③ or ② to highlight "On" and press ②.
 "②" appears and returns to "Create photo/video" mode.
- Press to start the delay timer.
 10 seconds after the timer starts, the shutter sounds and the camera takes a picture or starts recording video.

To cancel the delay timer

- Press ☐ [Options] while the delay timer setting is on.
 - The "Options" menu appears.
- Press ^⑤ or [⊙] to highlight "Delay timer" and press ^⑥.
- 3 Press ⑤ or ⊚ to highlight "Off" and press ⑤.
 The delay timer turns off.



- If you wish to stop taking pictures with the timer, press


 [Cancel] while the delay timer is operating.

















Using the Flash Light

When taking a picture or recording video in a dark place, you can use the Flash light.

- At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create photo" or "Create video."
- **2** Press ⊕ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- **3** Press ⑤ or ⊚ to highlight "Flash light" and press ⑥.
- **4** Press ⑤ or ⊚ to highlight "On" or "Off" and press ⑥.



Pressing also activates the Flash light.

Changing the View Finder

You can use the external display as the view finder. This function is convenient for taking a self-portrait or a group picture.

1 At the main menu, select in the following order: "Camera" → "Create photo" or "Create video."


- **2** Press [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- Press ^⑤ or [⊙] to highlight "Change viewfinder" and press ^⑥.


The main display is turned off and the image through the camera lens appears in the external display and focus mode is set to "Autofocus." When taking a picture or stopping a video recording, the view finder automatically switches to the main display.



You can also change the view finder by pressing **- (��) in "Create photo/video" mode.

















Shooting and Sending a Picture/Video **Function**

After taking a picture or recording video, you can send it directly from "Create photo/video" mode via MMS or E-mail message.

After taking a picture or recording video, press

The "Send to" list appears.

When recording a video clip, options appear when pressing (1) to stop recording.

The last address where a message was sent is at the top of the list.

Press o or to highlight the phone number or E-mail address of the recipient.

If you cannot find the phone number or E-mail address that you wish to send the picture to, select "Others..." and enter the necessary information.

Press O. Press ① or ② to highlight "Send" and press ②. The message is sent.

When attaching a photo/picture file to a message. the size of the file is automatically reduced if exceeding the maximum (295 kbytes) size to send



If the memory space becomes zero and when you try to take a photos again, "Memory full. You cannot take a picture!" ("Memory full. You cannot record a video!" in the "Create video" mode) appears.








This section provides information on how to enter text using the handset keypad for contacts list entries and messages, etc. Before you try to enter text, you should familiarise yourself with the different text input methods. In multi-tap input method, several characters are assigned to each key and you enter the desired character by pressing the key a few times.

Text Table for Multi-tap Input

The table indicates how many times you need to press a certain key to display the character you wish to enter. Pressing the key changes the character in order as shown in the table. When you reach the last character, it returns to the first one.

Example: Press appears. Press twice. "B" appears.

Selecting the Input Method

T9 Text Input

T9 text input method is a shortcut to enter text easily and quickly.

- In the text entry screen, press

 ⊙ [Options].
 The "Options" menu appears.
- **2** Press ③ or ℚ to highlight "Input method" and press ℚ.
- 3 Press ⑤ or ℚ to highlight the T9 mode (T9 Abc,T9 ABC, T9 abc) you wish to select and press ℚ.
 - "T9" appears at the top of the display.
- Press each key once for any letter on that key.

 Example: To enter the word "How," press (4 on) (8 onc)
- If the word shown isn't the one you want, pressor o and highlight the correct one.
- **6** Press O to select the word.



If the correct word is not shown in step 5, enter the correct word again after switching to the multi-tap input method.



If you press <u>s</u> instead of step 6, a space is inserted next to the selected word.

Entering Symbols and Punctuation

To enter symbols or punctuation, press # 155.



You can select the input language in the text entry screen.



- 2 Press ^(a) or ^(a) to highlight "Input language" and press ^(a).
- 3 Press ⑤ or ۞ to highlight the language you wish to select and press ⑥.





















You can use the sentences registered in "Text templates" when entering text. For information on how to create the text templates, refer to "Saving Phrases to the Text Template" on page 11-81.

- 1 In the text entry screen, press ⑤, ℚ, ⊚ or ⊙ to move the cursor to the point you wish to insert the template.
- 2 Press ☐ [Options].
 The "Options" menu appears.
- 3 Press ^⑤ or [⊙] to highlight "Text template" and press ^⑥.
- 4 Press ⑤ or ⊚ to highlight the text template you wish to select and press ⑤.
 The selected text template is inserted.

Copying, Cutting and Pasting Text

The options help you complete editing smoothly.

Copying and Cutting

When you are editing text, press

⊙ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.

- Press ⑤ or ⊙ to highlight "Copy" or "Cut" and press ⑥.
- **3** Press ⑤, ⊙, ⊙ or ⊙ to move the cursor to the first letter to be copied or cut and press ℂ.
- **4** Press ③, ②, ⊙ or ⊙ to move the cursor to the last letter to be copied or cut and press ℚ.




"Cut" removes the information from its original location and relocates it when you use "Paste." "Copy" leaves the information in its original location and makes another copy of the information when you use "Paste."

Pasting

- After the "Copy" and "Cut" operation, press ③, ⊙, ⊙ or ⊙ to move the cursor to the point you wish to insert the letters and press ⊖ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- **2** Press ⑤ or ⊙ to highlight "Paste" and press ⑥.



















In the "Contacts list," you can store the phone numbers and E-mail addresses of your friends, family and colleagues, etc. Using "Contacts list," you can dial or send messages easily without entering a phone number or an E-mail address manually.

Contacts List Basics

The capacity of the "Contacts list" differs when storing in your handset memory and when storing in the SIM card. For example, you cannot store a thumbnail image in the "Contacts list" in the SIM card.

Viewing the Contacts List

Press O.

The main menu appears.

Press ∅, ℚ, ⊚ or ⊚ to highlight "Contacts" and press O.

Press 🕙 or 💿 to highlight "Contacts list" and press O.

The index view of the "Contacts list" appears.



You can also access the "Contacts list" by pressing @ while in standby mode.



The "Contacts list" stored in the handset is empty when you purchase the handset.























You can store new entries in the "Contacts list." Before saving new entries or viewing stored entries in the "Contacts list," you can select the handset memory or the SIM card memory.

Selecting the Memory for saving

- At the main menu, select in the following order: "Contacts" → "Contacts list"
- Press

 [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- Press o or to highlight "Advanced" and press O.
- Press (or (o to highlight "Save to" and press





Adding a Phone Number from Call Register Entries







- Fress ⑤ or ⊚ to scroll through the list for selecting the name you wish to call and press ⑤. The detail screen of the "Contacts list" appears.





Editing a Contacts List Entry





- Picture up to 150 kbytes can be added to entries as a thumbnail image.
- You cannot add thumbnail images to entries in the SIM Memory.

To change the thumbnail image in the "Contacts list" entry

Select "Change" after step 4 and select "My photos" or "My pictures."

To remove the thumbnail image in the "Contacts list" entry

Select "Remove" after step 4.

The "Options" menu items "Change" and "Remove" appear only when a thumbnail image is added to the selected entry.



If you delete an image added as a thumbnail in "My photos" or "My pictures," the corresponding thumbnail image is also removed.

Setting the Ringtone for a Contacts List Entry (for the handset entry only)

You can set a ringtone or the vibration to a "Contacts list" entry in the handset memory.



- **11** When setting is complete, press ⊖ [Back] and ⊖ [Save].

Copying Entries Between Memories

You can copy entries between the handset and SIM card memories. This function is useful when you wish to backup entries or organise your memory space. Before copying, make sure which memory's entries are displayed on the display.

- **1** At the main menu, select in the following order: "Contacts" → "Contacts list."
- 2 Press (5) or (2) to highlight the name which you wish to copy to another memory.

- 3 Press ♥ to display the detail screen and press ७ or ♥ to highlight the phone number you wish to copy.
- 4 Press ☐ [Options]. The "Options" menu appears.
- Fress ③ or ℚ to highlight "Copy to SIM" to copy the entry to the SIM card or "Copy to handset" to copy the entry to the handset memory and press ℚ.


The name and the phone number selected in step 2 are copied to the other memory.


If you select "Copy to SIM," the message "Some data may be lost. OK?" appears. Press ⊖ [Yes] to complete the operation.



Even if multiple phone numbers are registered to one name, you can copy only one phone number per name to the SIM card.

Copying All Entries from the SIM Card to the Handset Memory

You can copy all entries from the SIM card to the handset memory at once. This function is useful when you restore the handset memory with the backup copy in the SIM Card.

This section provides information on how to create, send, receive and read messages using the handset. With the handset, you can send and receive not only text messages but also messages with pictures, sounds or videos. Pictures taken and sounds and video clips recorded with the handset can be sent to other handsets or e-mail addresses for viewing if they have the same media playback capability.

Message Types Available with the Handset

With the handset, three types of messages are available. **SMS (Short Message Service):** This service enables you to send text only messages of up to 1024 characters to other users. You can send or receive messages even if you are talking on the handset. Also text templates are available to help you compose messages.

MMS (Multimedia Message Service): Your handset is already enabled to deal with file attached messages. You can send messages with graphical images, photographs, sounds or video clips attached, and receive Browser (WAP) alerts.

E-Mail: This function enables you to directly access the E-mail messaging service for your Internet service provider. You can also send or receive files through the

service. For information on how to set up your E-mail function, refer to "Setting an Account" on page 15-158.



- When sending an SMS message, messages exceeding 160 characters are divided during the sending process. If the recipient uses a compatible handset, divided messages are recombined and delivered as one message. If sent to a non-compatible handset, messages are divided into 152 character lots and delivered separately.
- When sending an MMS message, the size of the message that can be sent is up to 295 kbytes.
- Some messaging functions may not be available, depending on the network service you use. If you experience any problems using these services, contact your service provider for details

You can copy, cut, and paste notes by using the "Options" menu in the "Score input" screen.



If the capacity or memory in "My sounds" becomes insufficient, the message "Maximum capacity: 250 Not registered." or "Not registered. Memory full." is displayed. The display returns to the screen of step 12. Try again after deleting unnecessary items.



Specifying the pitch of the musical note

You can specify the pitch of a musical note and rest by pressing the keys shown below.



Pressing the keys above once specifies a crotchet (,) in middle scale (no mark).

Pressing the same key repeatedly shifts the note through the available octave range (▲ or ▼ added corresponding to octave range).




Pressing () or () while a note is selected causes the note to move a semitone higher or lower.




Pressing • enters a Crochet rest 3.

















Specifying the length of notes and rests

You can specify the length of each musical note and rest by pressing $\frac{*}{*}$ or $\frac{*}{*}$ \mathbb{B} repeatedly. Pressing $\frac{*}{*}$ \mathbb{B} changes the length of notes and rests in reverse to pressing $\frac{*}{*}$ \mathbb{B} .



If you wish to specify a dotted note or a triplet, press after selecting the target note.





- You cannot make a dotted semi quaver (dotted semi quaver rest) or a dotted semi breve (dotted semi breve rest).
- Three continuous notes are required for a triplet.

Specifying a tie

To specify a tie, press after selecting the target notes.

An underscore (_) is displayed next to the note and the note is tied with the next.

To enter the next note, press \odot and move the cursor to the right, then repeat the operation to input the melody. If the cursor is positioned next to a note, you can repeat the note immediately to the left of the cursor by pressing \odot or \odot .

Sample steps to input melody

To get used to inputting melodies, input the simple melody shown below.







Applications may be both localised (no connectivity) and network based (using the mobile Internet to update information/play games). You may be charged for using network-based applications. Please contact your service provider for more information



Before downloading games or applications, you are asked to confirm what you are about to receive. After checking the information on the confirmation screen, the game or application can be downloaded. User authentication may be required on some information screens.

- Press O. The main menu appears.
- Press ⊙, ⊙, ⊙ or ⊙ to highlight "My Media" and press O.

Press o or to highlight "Games & more" and press O.

The "Games & more" menu appears.

Press (or (to highlight "t-games" and press

The download channel to games or applications appears.

Starting a Game or an Application




