

Instructions for SBox_K_0012

This system is mainly used for locking or unlocking the doors of the vehicle.

The transmitter sends a radio wave signal while the button is pushed.

The receiver becomes active in response to the signal from the transmitter.

Button Functions



Using the Remote

Ensure you are within range of the vehicle before performing remote functions.

- Press "Lock" button to Lock all doors (horn will honk)
- Press "Unlock" button one (1) time to Unlock driver's door. Press "Unlock" button a second time within 5 seconds to unlock all doors.
- Press and hold "Panic" button to sound alarm
 - Press "Unlock" button to disable alarm

Note: Specific vehicle responses to remote interaction vary from vehicle to vehicle. Please check the vehicle manual for more information.
