
Inserting the cassette (p. ••)


Slide OPEN/

2 Push the center of the cassette back to insert the cassette. Insert the cassette straight as far as possible into the cassette compartment with the window facing up.









To eject the cassette

Follow the procedures above, and take out the cassette after the cassette compartment opens completely in step 3.








Remove the lens cap.

When the LCD panel is closed, use the viewfinder with your eye against the eyecup.

Adjust the viewfinder lens to your eyesight (p. ••).

Press START/STOP. Your camcorder starts recording. To stop recording, press START/STOP again.








Insert the "Memory Stick" in the "Memory Stick" slot as far as it can go with the ▶ mark facing up as illustrated.

Do not shake or strike your camcorder because your camcorder is reading the data from the "Memory Stick" or recording the data on the "Memory Stick." Do not turn the power off, eject the "Memory Stick" or remove the battery pack. Otherwise, image data breakdown may occur.
