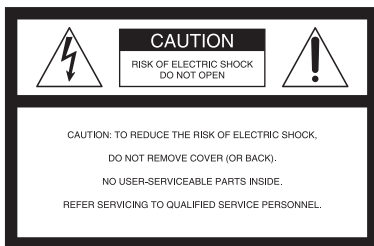

Use

Power Sources

This set should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of electrical power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company. For those sets designed to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

Polarization

This set may be equipped with a polarized ac power cord plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other).

This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to have a suitable outlet installed. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug by forcing it in.

Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords or convenience receptacles beyond their capacity, since this can result in fire or electric shock.

Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into the set through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the set.

Attachments

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer, as they may cause hazards.

Cleaning

Unplug the set from the wall outlet before cleaning or polishing it. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a cloth lightly dampened with water for cleaning the exterior of the set.

Installation

Water and Moisture

Do not use power-line operated sets near water – for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.

Route the power cord so that it is not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to the plugs, receptacles, and the point where the cord exits from the appliance.

Accessories

Ventilation

Internal memory and “Memory Stick Duo” back up

Do not turn off the camera or remove the battery pack or “Memory Stick Duo” while the access lamp is lighted, as the internal memory data or “Memory Stick Duo” data may be destroyed. Always protect your data by making a back up copy.

Notes on recording/playback

- Before you record one-time events, make a trial recording to make sure that the camera is working correctly.
- This camera is neither dust-proof, nor splash-proof, nor water-proof. Read “Precautions” (page 37) before operating the camera.
- Be careful not to get the camera wet. Water entering the inside of the camera may cause malfunctions which in some cases may not be repairable.
- Do not aim the camera at the sun or other bright light. It may cause the malfunction of your camera.
- Do not use the camera near a location that generates strong radio waves or emits radiation. The camera may not be able to record or play back properly.
- Using the camera in sandy or dusty locations may cause malfunctions.
- If moisture condensation occurs, remove it before using the camera (page 37).
- Do not shake or strike the camera. In addition to malfunctions and an inability to record images, this may render the recording medium unusable, or cause image data breakdown, damage or loss.
- Clean the flash surface before use. The heat of flash emission may cause dirt on the flash surface to become discolored or to stick to the flash surface, resulting in insufficient light emission.

Notes on the LCD screen

- The LCD screen is manufactured using extremely high-precision technology so over 99.99% of the pixels are operational for effective use. However, there may be some tiny black points and/or bright points (white, red, blue or green in color) that constantly appear on the LCD screen. These points are normal in the manufacturing process and do not affect the recording in any way.

Checking the accessories supplied

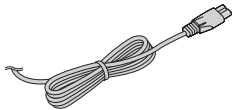

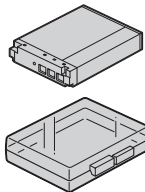

Attach the strap to prevent the camera from damage by being dropped, etc.



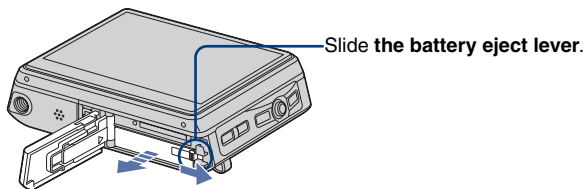
1 Inserting the battery pack



- 1** Open the battery/"Memory Stick Duo" cover.
- 2** Insert the battery pack.
- 3** Close the battery/"Memory Stick Duo" cover.

To remove the battery pack

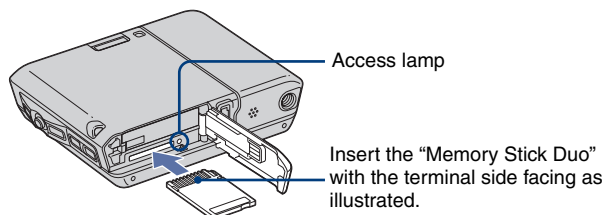
Open the battery/"Memory Stick Duo" cover and remove the battery pack.



- Be sure not to drop the battery pack.
- Never remove the battery pack when the access lamp is lit. The data may be corrupted.

When recording in a “Memory Stick Duo” (not supplied)

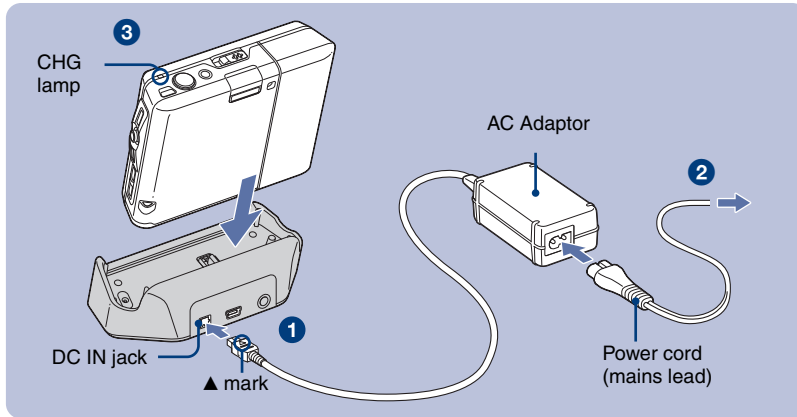
You can also record images in a “Memory Stick Duo” (not supplied) instead of the internal memory.



Push the “Memory Stick Duo” in once to remove the “Memory Stick Duo”.

- Never remove the “Memory Stick Duo” when the access lamp is lit. The data may be corrupted.
- When the [Default Media] is set to [Internal Memory], the images are recorded in the internal memory, although the “Memory Stick Duo” is being inserted (page 24).

2 Charging the battery pack



- 1 Connect the cable of the AC Adaptor (supplied) to the DC IN jack of the Cyber-shot Station (supplied).**
- 2 Connect the power cord (mains lead) to the AC Adaptor and plug the adaptor into the wall outlet (wall socket).**
- 3 Attach the camera on the Cyber-shot Station.**

The CHG lamp lights on, and charging starts.

When the CHG lamp turns off, charging is finished (Practical charge).

If you continue charging the battery pack for about one more hour (until it is fully charged), the charge will last slightly longer (Full charge).

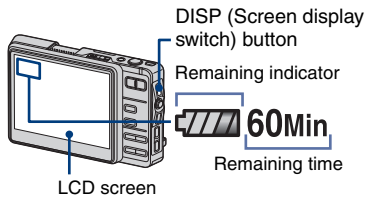

- Even if the CHG lamp is not lit, the camera is disconnected from the AC power source (mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet (wall socket). If any trouble occurs while using the adaptor, immediately shut off the power by disconnecting the plug from the wall outlet (wall socket).
- Do not use the AC Adaptor placed in a narrow space, such as between a wall and furniture.
- If you do not operate the camera for a long time, disconnect the AC Adaptor both from the DC IN jack of the Cyber-shot Station and from a wall outlet (wall socket).

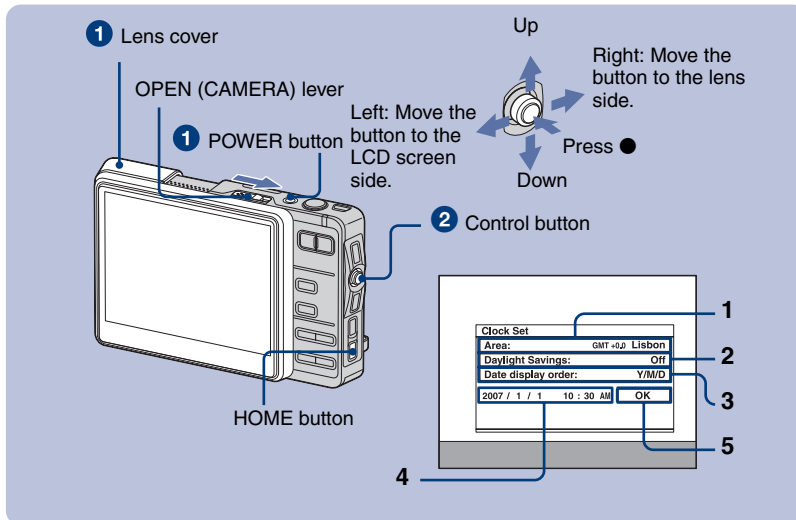
To check the remaining battery time

Open the lens cover or press the POWER button to turn on and check the time on the LCD screen. When the remaining battery time is not indicated, switch the display by pressing the DISP (Screen display switch) button.



- It takes about one minute until the correct battery remaining time appears.
- Only  is indicated, depending on a mode.
- The displayed time remaining may not be correct under certain circumstances.
- When you turn on the power for the first time, the Clock Set screen appears (page 15).

3 Turning the camera on/setting the clock



1 Press the **POWER** button or open the lens cover.

2 Set the clock with the control button.

- 1 -①Select [Area], then press ●.
-②Select the desired area, then press ●.
- 2 -①Select [Daylight Savings], then press ●.
-②Select [On] or [Off] of the daylight saving time, then press ●.
- 3 -①Select [Date display order], then press ●.
-②Select the desired order, then press ●.
- 4 -①Select each item and set the numeric value, then press ●.
-②Set up all the items.
- 5 Select [OK], then press ●.

I To change the date and time

Press the HOME button, and select [Settings] → [⌚ Clock Set] (page 26).

I When you turn on the power

- If the camera is running on battery power and you do not operate the camera for about three minutes, the camera turns off automatically to prevent wearing down the battery pack (Auto power-off function).

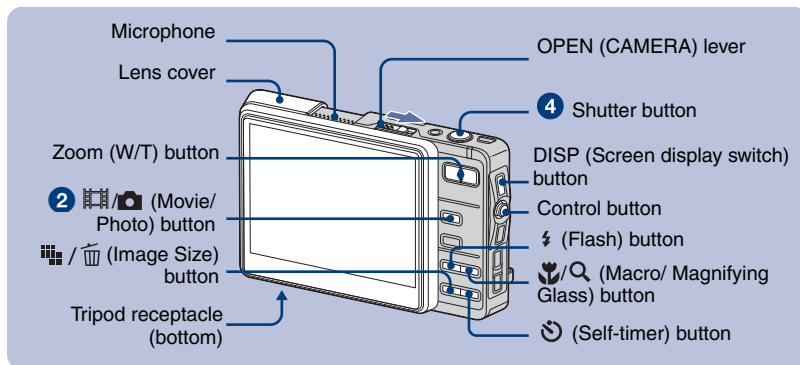
- 1 Turn on your computer, and insert the CD-ROM (supplied) into the CD-ROM drive.
The screen below appears.



When you click the [Install] button, the “Choose Setup Language” screen appears.

- 2 Follow the instructions on the screen to complete the installation.
- 3 After the installation is complete, double-click the shortcut created on the desktop.

Shooting images easily (Auto adjustment mode)



1 Open the lens cover by sliding the OPEN (CAMERA) lever.

Open until it clicks.

2 Select a mode with the [Movie/Photo] button.

Each time you press the [Movie/Photo] button, the mode changes between Movie and Photo.

3 Hold the camera steady, keeping your arm at your side.



Position the subject in the center of the LCD screen.

4 Shoot with the shutter button.

Aside from an original image, a small size album image is recorded in the internal memory.

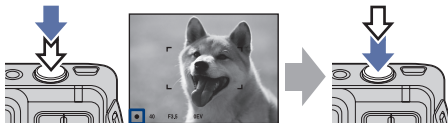
Still image:

1 Press and hold the shutter button halfway down to focus.

The ● (AE/AF lock) indicator (green) flashes, a beep sounds, the indicator stops flashing and remains lit.

2 Press the shutter button fully down.

The shutter sounds.



AE/AF lock indicator

Movie:

Press the shutter button fully down.


To stop recording, press the shutter button fully down again.

Using the zoom

Press the zoom button.


- When the zoom scale exceeds 3x, the camera uses the Digital Zoom function.


Flash (Selecting a flash mode for still images)

Press the  button repeatedly until the desired mode is selected.


 : Flash Auto

Strobes when there is insufficient light or backlight (default setting)


 : Flash forced on


 : Slow synchro (Flash forced on)


The shutter speed is slow in a dark place to clearly shoot the background that is out of flash light.


 : Flash forced off

Macro/Magnifying Glass (Shooting close-up)


Press the  button repeatedly until the desired mode is selected.


 : Macro off (Default setting)


 : Macro on (W side: Approx. 8 cm or farther (3 1/4 inches or farther), T side: Approx. 25 cm or farther (9 7/8 inches or farther))

 : Magnifying Glass on (Locked to the W side: Approx. 1 to 20 cm (13/32 to 7 7/8 inches))

Using the self-timer

Press the  button repeatedly until the desired mode is selected.

 : Not using the self-timer

 : Setting the 10-second delay self-timer



 : Setting the 2-second delay self-timer



Press the shutter button, the self-timer lamp flashes, and a beep sounds until the shutter operates.







To change the image size



Press the  /  (Image Size) button, then select the size using the control button.

To turn off the Image Size menu, press the  /  button again.

On the recordable number of still images and recordable time of movies

Recordable number of still images and recordable time of movies vary depending on the selected image size. Pressing the DISP (Screen display switch) button turns on the time indication.

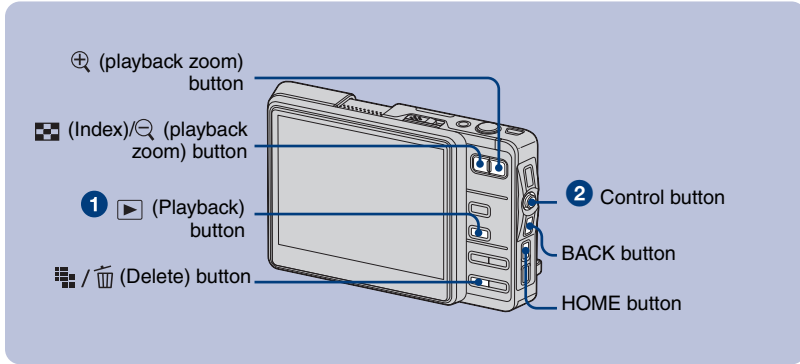

Viewing/deleting images



1 Press the (Playback) button.

- If you press (Playback) when the camera is powered off, the camera is turned on in playback mode. Pressing it again returns to the shooting mode.

2 Select an image by moving the control button to \leftarrow/\rightarrow .

Movie:

Press to play back a movie. (Press again to stop playback.)

Moving the control button to \leftarrow to rewind and to \rightarrow to fast forward. (Press to return to normal playback.)

Moving the control button to \uparrow/\downarrow to adjust the volume.

/ To delete images

- 1 Display the image you want to delete and press / (Delete).
- 2 Select [Original Image Only] or [Original & Album Images] with the control button, then press .

\leftarrow To view an enlarged image (playback zoom)

Press \leftarrow while displaying a still image.

To undo the zoom, press .

Adjust the portion: Moving the control button to $\uparrow/\downarrow/\leftarrow/\rightarrow$.

Cancel playback zoom: Press BACK.
