

1. Tactile dot

There is a tactile dot on the left part of your Walkman. Use it to distinguish left from right when you operate it.

- 2. Neckband
- 3. Earbud
- 4. Headphone section
- 5. Bluetooth lamp
- 6. (Bluetooth) button

Press and hold for 2 seconds to turn the Bluetooth function on or off.

Press and hold for 7 seconds while the Bluetooth function is turned off to pair with a Bluetooth device.

7. VOL (Volume) + (*1)/- button

Press to adjust the music playback, ringtone, and call volumes.

8. MODE button

Press to switch the playback mode (All Song/Repeat/Shuffle).

Press and hold for longer than 1 second to switch the playback filter (Folder/Playlist/Album).

- 9. Terminals
- 10. C/>II (Call/Play) button (*1)

Press to start/pause playback or to answer/hang up a call.

Press and hold for 2 seconds to switch the sound source (Walkman/Bluetooth device) or to reject an incoming call.

Press and hold for 15 seconds to enter the formatting mode.

11. RESET button

Press the RESET button with a pen or a paper clip, etc., to reset your Walkman.

- 12. OPR (Operation) lamp
- 13. (Power) button

Press and hold for 2.5 seconds to turn your Walkman on or off.

14. Idea (Previous) button

Press to skip to the previous song.

Press and hold for longer than 2 seconds to skip to the beginning of the previous folder.

15. ►► (Next) button

Press to skip to the next song.

Press and hold for longer than 2 seconds to skip to the beginning of the next folder.

16. Built-in Bluetooth antenna

Do not cover the antenna part with your hands or other object when a Bluetooth connection is active. Doing so may interrupt the connection.

17. N-mark

Touch a Bluetooth device equipped with the NFC feature to this mark to connect it to your Walkman.

(*1) There is a tactile dot. Use it to help with button operations.



 Press and hold the button (1) on the right (3) side of your Walkman for 2.5 seconds. Your Walkman turns on and a startup sound will be heard. The lamp (2) blinks in orange quickly while the Walkman is turned on.

Hint

If there is no operation for an extended period, the lamp (2) turns off and your Walkman will be turned off automatically. In that case, press and hold the button (1) to turn on the Walkman.





Using the Remote Commander

The Remote Commander (supplied) employs the Bluetooth technology to operate your Walkman wirelessly. The Remote Commander and the Walkman are already paired at the factory, so just turn them on and they are ready to use without pairing.

The power of your Walkman has to be turned on before performing the procedures below.



- Press and hold the button (1) for 2 seconds to turn the Remote Commander on.
 Your Walkman and the Remote Commander are automatically connected with each other.
- 2. Press the desired button of the Remote Commander to operate your Walkman.


