

### WALKMAN Player Controls

- Press **⏏** to open the WALKMAN player or to minimize the WALKMAN player during playback.
- Press **▶||** to pause the playback. Press again to resume playing.
- Press **⏭** to go forward to the next music track or video clip.
- Press **⏮** to go back to the previous music track or video clip.
- Press and hold **⏭** or **⏮** to fast forward or rewind when playing music tracks or video clips.
- Press **⏪** or **⏩** to show a track-by-track view of the current list when playing music tracks.
- Press **⏪** or **⏩** to scroll through the playlist during playback. Files that are highlighted will not be selected until you press **Play**.
- When a video clip is playing, press **⏪** to play the video in slow motion. To resume normal playback, **▶ Play**.
- When a video clip is paused, press **⏪** to play the video one frame at a time.
- Press **⏪** to go to the WALKMAN player browser when in the **Now Playing** view.
- Press and hold **⏪** to exit the WALKMAN player when in the **Now Playing** view.

### Play/pause button

Press and hold **▶||** to start or pause music. Choose between using this button for the WALKMAN™ player or the **Radio**, or the most recently used of these.

### To change the play/pause button setting

▶ **Settings** ▶ the **General** tab ▶ **Play/Pause Button**.

### Browsing Files

In the WALKMAN player browser you can browse for music and video content in lists:

- **Artists** – lists of all available artists.
- **Tracks** – lists all music files (not ringtones) in your phone.
- **Playlists** – create or play your own lists of sound files.
- **Videos** – lists all video clips in your phone.

### Playlists

To organize the media files that are stored in the **File Manager**, you can create playlists. Files in a playlist can be sorted by artist, title or by the order in which the files were added to the playlist. You can add a file to more than one playlist.

## Entertainment

When you delete a playlist or a file from the playlist, it is not deleted permanently from the phone memory. You can add the file to another playlist.

### To create a playlist

- ▶ **WALKMAN ▶ Playlists ▶ New Playlist**  
▶ **Add** enter the name of the playlist ▶ **OK**.
- Select among the files that are available in the **File Manager**. You can add several files at a time and you can also add folders. All files in the selected folders will be added to the playlist.

### To add files to a playlist

- ▶ **WALKMAN ▶ Playlists** select a playlist  
▶ **Open ▶ More ▶ Add Media**.
- Select among the files that are available in the **File Manager**.

### To remove files from a playlist

- ▶ **WALKMAN ▶ Playlists** select a playlist  
▶ **Open**.
- Select the file and press **(C)**.

### To delete playlists

▶ **WALKMAN ▶ Playlists** select a playlist and press **(C)**.

### WALKMAN Player Options

- ▶ **More** for options:
  - **Now Playing** – go to the **Now Playing** view.
  - **Add Media** – add files or folders to the playlist.
  - **Sort** – sort the playlist by artist, title or by the order in which files were added to the playlist.
  - **Delete** – remove a file from the playlist. In playlists you have created, the file is only removed from the playlist. In the **Tracks** list, the file is permanently deleted from the memory.
  - **Rename** – rename the playlist. You can only rename user-created playlists.
  - **Delete Playlist** – delete the playlist. Only the playlist is deleted; the files are still listed in the **File Manager**. You can only delete user-created playlists.
  - **Information** – view information about the current track or video.
  - **Play Mode** – change the playback order of songs and videos. Select **Shuffle** to play the playlist files in random order, or **Loop** to restart the playlist when the last file has been played.

## Entertainment

- **Stereo Widening** – choose between on or off.
- **Equalizer** – change settings for treble and bass when playing music in the WALKMAN player.
- **Send** – send a sound or video clip.
- **Zoom In** – zoom in on a video clip.
- **Capture Frame** – when a video clip is paused, capture a picture from the video clip.

### Online Music and Videos

View videos and listen to music by streaming them to your phone from the Internet. If settings are not already in your phone ► *54 Settings*. For more information, contact your service provider or visit [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support).

### To select a data account for streaming

- *Settings* ► the *Connectivity* tab
- *Streaming Settings* and select the data account to use.

### To stream video and audio

- 1 ► *Internet Services* ► *More* ► *Enter Address*.
- 2 Enter or choose the address to a Web page and select a link to stream from. The WALKMAN player opens automatically when a link is selected.

### To stream saved music and videos

- 1 ► *Internet Services* ► *More* ► *Bookmarks*.
- 2 Select a link to stream. The WALKMAN player opens and plays the music or video.

## Radio

Listen to FM radio with RDS (Radio Data System) functionality. You must connect the handsfree to your phone as it works as an antenna. The radio can also be used as an alarm signal ► *63 Alarm Clock*.

### To listen to the radio

Connect the handsfree to your phone ► *Radio*.

### Radio Control

- ► *Search* to find a broadcasting frequency.
- Press or to move 0.1 MHz.
- Press or to select preset channels.
- ► *More* to view options.

### Saving Radio Channels



Save up to 20 preset channels.

### To save radio channels

- *Radio set frequency* ► *More* ► *Save* or press and hold – to save in positions 1 to 10.



### To select radio channels



Use the navigation key or press  –  to select a saved channel in positions 1 to 10.

### Radio Options

► **More** for the following options:

- **Turn Off** – turn off the radio.
- **Minimize** – return to standby to use other functions while listening.
- **Save** – save the current frequency in a position.
- **Channels** – select, rename, replace or delete a preset channel.
- **Turn On Speaker** – use the loudspeakers.
- **Auto Save** – save tuned channels in positions 1 to 20. Previously saved channels are replaced.
- **Set Frequency** – enter a frequency manually. Press  to go directly to **Set Frequency**.
- **RDS** – set options for alternative frequency (AF) and station information.
- **Turn On Mono** – turn on mono sound.

## PlayNow™

Listen to music before you purchase and download to your phone.

### Downloading from PlayNow™

The total price appears when you select to download and save a music file. Your phone bill or prepay card is debited when a purchase is accepted. Terms and conditions are also provided in the phone kit.


## Entertainment

### To download a music file

- 1 When you have listened to a music file and agreed to accept the conditions ► Yes to download.
- 2 A text message is sent out to confirm payment and the file is made available to download. Music is saved in **File Manager** ► **Sounds**.

### Ringtones and Melodies

Your phone comes with melodies that can be used as ringtones. You can exchange melodies using one of the available transfer methods. You are not allowed to exchange copyright-protected material.

 *If you select an MP3 file as a ringtone, you cannot use voice answering ► 24 Voice Answering.*





### To select a ringtone

► **Settings** ► the **Sounds & Alerts** tab ► **Ringtone**.

### To turn the ringtone on or off

Press and hold **(#-3)** from standby. All signals except the alarm signal are turned on or off.

### To set the ringtone volume

- 1 ► **Settings** ► the **Sounds & Alerts** tab ► **Ring Volume** and press , ,  or  to decrease or increase the volume.
- 2 ► **Save** to save the setting.

### Caller-specific Ringtones

If your subscription supports Calling Line Identification (CLI) service, you can assign personal ringtones to contacts ► *21 To add a picture or a ringtone to a phone contact.*

### Sounds & Alerts Options

Select to use the vibrating alert or sounds.

### To set the vibrating alert

► **Settings** ► the **Sounds & Alerts** tab ► **Vibrating Alert** and select from the following options:

- **On** – all the time.
- **On if in Silent** – if ring volume is off or the phone is set to silent.
- **Off** – all the time.

### To set message alert

► **Settings** ► the **Sounds & Alerts** tab ► **Message Alert** and select an option.


### To Set the Key Sound

► Settings ► the Sounds & Alerts tab ► Key Sound and select an option.

### MusicDJ™

Compose and edit your own melodies to use as ringtones. A melody consists of four types of tracks – Drums, Basses, Chords, and Accents. A track contains a number of music blocks. The blocks consist of pre-arranged sounds with different characteristics. The blocks are grouped into Intro, Verse, Chorus, and Break. You compose a melody by adding music blocks to the tracks.

#### To compose a melody


- Entertainment ► MusicDJ™.
- Insert, Copy or Paste blocks. Use , ,  or  to move between the blocks. Press  to delete a block. ► More to view more options.

#### To edit a MusicDJ™ melody

► File Manager ► Sounds and select the melody  
► More ► Edit.

### Exchanging MusicDJ™ Melodies

Send and receive melodies using one of the available transfer methods. You are not allowed to exchange copyright-protected material.

 You cannot send a polyphonic melody or an MP3 file in a text message.

#### To send a melody

- File Manager ► Sounds and select a melody.
- More ► Send and select a transfer method.


#### To receive a melody via a transfer method

Select a transfer method and follow the instructions that appear.

### VideoDJ™

Compose and edit your own video clips by using video clips, pictures and text. You can also use trim to delete unwanted parts to shorten a video clip.

#### To create a video clip

- Entertainment ► VideoDJ™.
- Add ► Video Clip, Picture, Text or Camera  
► Select.
- To add more items press  ► Add.

**To edit a selected video clip**

► Edit for options:

- **Trim** – to shorten the video clip.
- **Add Text** – to add text to the video clip.
- **Replace** – to select a new video clip.
- **Delete** – to remove the video clip.
- **Move** – to move the video clip to another position.

**To edit a selected picture**

► Edit for options:

- **Replace** – to select a new picture.
- **Duration** – to select the screen time for the picture.
- **Delete** – to remove the picture.
- **Move** – to move the picture to another position.

**To edit a selected text**

► Edit for options:

- **Edit** – to change the text.
- **Background** – to set background.
- **Text Color** – to set font color.
- **Duration** – to select the screen time for the text.
- **Delete** – to remove the text.
- **Move** – to move the text to another position.

**VideoDJ™ options**

► More for options:

- **Play** – to view the video clip.
- **Send** – to send the video clip.
- **Soundtrack** – to add a soundtrack to the video clip.
- **Transitions** – to set transitions between video clips, pictures and text.
- **Save** – to save the video clip.
- **Insert** – to insert a new video clip, picture or text.
- **New Video** – to create a new video clip.

**To edit video clips in File manager**

- 1 ► **File Manager** ► **Videos** ► **Open** and select file.
- 2 ► **More** ► **VideoDJ™** ► **Edit**.

**Sending Video Clips**

You can send a video clip using one of the available transfer methods. Short video clips can be sent using picture messaging. If a video clip is too long, you can use the **Trim** function to make a video clip shorter.

▶ Edit ▶ Trim.
- 2 ▶ Set to set the start point and ▶ Start.
- 3 ▶ Set to set the end point and ▶ End.

### PhotoDJ™


Edit files using PhotoDJ™ or when viewing files.

### To edit and save a file

- 1 ▶ Entertainment ▶ PhotoDJ™ or ▶ File Manager  
▶ Pictures and select a file ▶ View ▶ More  
▶ Edit.
- 2 ▶ Tool and select an option.
- 3 After you have edited the selected picture  
▶ More ▶ Save Picture.

### Sound Recorder

With the sound recorder, you can record either your own memos or calls. Recorded sounds can also be set as ringtones. Recording of a conversation is stopped if a participant ends the call. Recording of all sounds stops automatically if you receive a call.

 *In some countries or states it is required by law that you inform the other person before recording the call.*

### To record a sound

- 1 ▶ Entertainment ▶ Record Sound.
- 2 Wait until you hear a tone. When the recording starts, Recording... and a timer appears.
- 3 ▶ Save to end, ▶ Play to listen or ▶ More for options: Record New, Send, Rename, Delete, Recorded Sounds.

### To listen to a recording

- ▶ File Manager ▶ Sounds and select a recording
- ▶ Play or ▶ Stop.

### Themes

Change the appearance of the screen, for example, colors and wallpaper, by using themes. Your phone has some predefined themes that cannot be deleted if they are protected. You can create new themes and download them to your phone. For more information, visit [www.SonyEricsson.com](http://www.SonyEricsson.com).

### To select or change a theme

- ▶ File Manager ▶ Themes and select a theme.



## Exchanging Themes

Exchange themes using a transfer method.

### To send a theme

### To receive and save a theme

- 1 Use a transfer method and open the message you received the theme in.

## Games

Your phone has several entertaining games. You can also download games and applications directly to the folders in your phone. Help texts are available for most games.

### To start and end a game

- 1 ▶ Entertainment ▶ Games, select game ▶ Select.
- 2 Press and hold  to end the game.

## Applications

Download and run Java™ applications. You can view information or set different permission levels.

### To view info for Java™ applications

- 1 ▶ File Manager ▶ Applications or ▶ Games.
- 2 Select an application or a game ▶ More ▶ Information.

### To set permissions for Java™ applications

- 1 ▶ File Manager ▶ Applications or ▶ Games.
- 2 Select an application or a game ▶ More ▶ Permissions and set options.

### Java Application Screen Size

Some Java applications are designed for a specific screen size and may not be able to adapt the application to the screen. For more information, contact the application vendor.

### To set the screen size for a Java™ application

- 2 Select an application or a game ▶ More ▶ Screen Size.
- 3 Select an option, for example, User-Defined ▶ Width: and Height: to edit values.

### Settings

Before you start using Internet, Messaging, My friends or PlayNow™, settings are required in your phone.

Settings may already be entered when you buy your phone. If not, make sure you have a phone subscription that supports data transfer (GPRS).

### Entering Settings

You can enter settings as follows:

- Receive settings from your network operator or service provider or from [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support).
- Enter or edit settings manually, which requires that you have the settings from your network operator or service provider available.

#### To stop browsing

## Connectivity

### Stored Information

When browsing, you can save information.

 *It is advisable to clear any sensitive information about previously visited Internet services. This is to avoid a security risk if your phone is misplaced, lost or stolen.*

The following information can be saved:

- Cookies – improve Web page access efficiency.
- Passwords – improve server access efficiency.

### To allow cookies

### To clear cookies

► Internet Services ► More ► Advanced  
► the Other tab ► Clear Cookies ► Yes.

### To clear the password list

► Internet Services ► More ► Advanced  
► the Other tab ► Clear Passwords ► Yes.



### Internet Security

Secure browsing is supported. When using an Internet profile you can turn on security in the phone.

### Trusted Certificates

Certain Internet services, such as banking, require certificates in your phone. Your phone may already contain certificates when you buy it or you can download new certificates.

### To check certificates in your phone

► Settings ► the Connectivity tab ► Internet Settings  
► Security ► TrustedCertificate.

### Synchronizing

Synchronize phone contacts, appointments, tasks and notes via Bluetooth, the infrared port, Internet services or the USB cable included with the phone.

Synchronization software for your computer is available on the CD included with the phone. You can also visit [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support) to download the software or Getting started guides for synchronization.

### To select sync order for contacts

► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced  
► Synchronize Order to select to order by first or last name.

### Remote Synchronization via Internet

#### To enter remote synchronization settings

- 3 Enter the following:
  - **Server Address** – server URL.
  - **Username** – account username.
  - **Password** – account password.
  - **Connection** – select an Internet profile.
  - **Applications** – mark applications to synchronize.

- **App. Settings** – select an application and enter a database name, and if required, username and password.
- **Sync. Interval** – set how often to synchronize.
- **Remote Initiation** – select to always accept, never accept or always ask when starting from a service.
- **Remote Security** – insert a server ID and a server password.

- 4 ▶ Save to save your new account.

#### To start remote synchronization

- ▶ Organizer ▶ Synchronization and select an account ▶ Start.

## Bluetooth™ Wireless Technology

Bluetooth makes it possible to connect wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices. You can:

- connect to several devices at the same time.
- synchronize information with other devices.
- use the remote control functionality.
- use a remote screen.
- exchange items and play multiplayer games.




*We recommend a range within 33 feet (10 meters) with no solid objects in between, for Bluetooth communication.*

## Connectivity

### Before You Start

- Turn on Bluetooth to communicate with other devices.
- Pair the Bluetooth devices with your phone that you want to communicate with.


 Please verify whether local laws or regulations restrict the use of Bluetooth. If Bluetooth is not allowed, you must ensure that the Bluetooth function is turned off. The maximum allowed Bluetooth radio output power in the phone is automatically adjusted according to possible local restrictions. This means that the range may vary.

### To turn Bluetooth on

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ Turn On.

### Adding Devices to Your Phone

Enter a passcode to set up a secure link between your phone and the device. Enter the same passcode on the device when prompted. Devices with no user interface, such as a handsfree, will have a pre-defined passcode. Consult the device user guide for more information.

 Make sure that the device you want to add has Bluetooth activated and visible.

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### To add a device to your phone

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ My Devices ▶ New Device to search for available devices.
- 2 Select a device from the list.
- 3 Enter a passcode, if required.

### To organize your list of devices

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ My Devices and select a device from the list.
- 2 ▶ More to view a list of options.

### Power Save

Turn on to reduce power consumption by optimizing your phone for use with a single Bluetooth device. Turn off to connect with several Bluetooth devices at the same time.

### To save power

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ Powersave ▶ On.

### Phone Name

Enter a name for your phone to be shown to other devices when found.

## Connectivity

### **To enter a phone name**

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth
- ▶ Phone Name.

### **Visibility**

Choose to make your phone visible to other Bluetooth devices or not. If set to hide, other devices will not be able to discover your phone via Bluetooth.

### **To show or hide your phone**

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth
- ▶ Visibility ▶ Show Phone or Hide Phone.

### **Exchanging Items**

Send or receive items using Bluetooth as the transfer method. Choose a device from the list of found devices.

### **To send an item**

- 1 Select an item, for example ▶ **Contacts** and select a contact.
- 2 ▶ **More** ▶ **Send Contact** ▶ **Via Bluetooth**.
- 3 Select the device to send the item to ▶ **Select**.

### **To receive an item**

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth
- ▶ Turn On. Make sure the phone is visible,
- ➔ *59 To show or hide your phone*. When you receive an item, follow the instructions that appear.

### **To add a Bluetooth handsfree**

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ **Handsfree**.
- 2 ▶ **Yes** if you are adding a Bluetooth handsfree for the first time or ▶ **My Handsfree** ▶ **New Handsfree** ▶ **Add** if you are adding another Bluetooth handsfree. Ensure that your handsfree is in pairing mode. Consult the device user guide for more information.

### **Transferring Sound**

Transfer the sound for calls when using a Bluetooth handsfree. You can also transfer the sound for calls using the keypad.

### **To transfer sound when using a handsfree**

During a call, ▶ **More** ▶ **Transfer Sound** and select a device.

## Connectivity

### Directing Sound

Direct sound when answering a call with the phone keypad or the handsfree button.

#### **To direct sound when answering a call with a handsfree**

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Bluetooth ▶ Handsfree ▶ Incoming Call.
- 2 ▶ In Phone to direct to the phone or ▶ In Handsfree to direct to the handsfree.

### Remote Control

Use your phone as a remote control device to control computer applications such as a media player or Microsoft® PowerPoint® presentations. Your computer must support Bluetooth HID Profile.

#### **To select remote control**

- 1 ▶ Entertainment ▶ Remote Control.
- 2 Select an application to use and the computer to connect to.


### File Transfer

Use a computer equipped with Bluetooth to view and transfer files in the file manager. Use drag-and-drop functionality to:

- Transfer files between phone and computer.
- Move and organize files.
- Delete files from the phone.

### Infrared Port

Use the infrared port as a transfer method with compatible devices. You can, for example, synchronize calendar items ▶ *56 Synchronizing*, and send items such as pictures.

 *When connecting to a computer, refer to its user documentation. Make sure that computer infrared speed is set to 115200 bps.*

#### **To turn the infrared port on**

- ▶ Settings ▶ the Connectivity tab ▶ Infrared Port ▶ On or ▶ 10 Minutes to turn on for 10 minutes.

#### **To connect two devices**

- 1 Turn on infrared in both devices.
- 2 Make sure the infrared port on your phone is facing the infrared port on the other device with a maximum distance of 20 cm.




## Connectivity

### **To send an item using the infrared port (example: a contact)**

- 1 Make sure that infrared in both devices is on.
  - ▶ **Contacts** and select a contact.
- 2 ▶ **More** ▶ **Send Contact** ▶ **Via Infrared**.


### **Transferring Files Using the USB Cable**

Your phone comes with a USB cable and when you connect your phone to a computer using the USB cable, the phone memory will appear as a drive on the computer.



 *Only use the USB cable included with the phone and connect it directly to your computer.*

Use computer drag-and-drop functionality to:

- Transfer files between phone and computer.
- Move and organize files.
- Delete files from the phone.


 *All phone functions, except for alarms and alerts, will be turned off during the USB connection.*

### **To start a USB connection with the phone turned on**

- 1 Connect the USB cable to your phone and to your computer.
- 2 ▶ **Settings** and use  or  to scroll to the **Connectivity** tab.
- 3 ▶ **USB Connection** ▶ **Yes**.

### **To start a USB connection with the phone turned off**

Connect the USB cable to your phone and to your computer.

 *Do not remove the USB cable during the file transfer since it may damage your phone memory.*

### **To end a USB connection**

- 1 Exit the USB connection on your computer. In Windows, click the Safely Remove Hardware icon in the taskbar, and follow the instructions.
- 2 Remove the USB cable from your phone.

## Connectivity

### Update Service

Use Update service to keep your phone updated with the latest software. When a new software version is available, you can download and install it without affecting the content in your phone.

Choose one of the following methods to update your phone:

- over the air via your phone or
- online via the provided USB cable and an Internet-connected computer.



*The Update service requires data access (GPRS). Your service provider will provide you with a subscription with data access and with price information.*

- Press  $\text{C}$  to delete the figure.
- Press  $\text{*}00\text{A}$  to enter a decimal point.

### Code Memo

Save security codes, such as for credit cards, in the code memo. Set a passcode to open the code memo.

### Checkword and Security

To confirm that you have entered the correct passcode you must enter a checkword.

When you enter your passcode to open the code memo, the checkword is shown for a short time. If the passcode is correct, the correct codes are shown. If you enter the incorrect passcode, the checkword and the codes that are shown are also incorrect.

The time is always displayed in standby.

### SIM Card Lock

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not the phone itself, from unauthorized use. If you change SIM cards, your phone still works with the new SIM card.

Most SIM cards are locked at the time of purchase. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number) every time you turn on your phone.

If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. This is indicated by the message **PIN Blocked**. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key).

Your PIN and PUK are supplied by your service provider. You can edit your PIN and select a new four- to eight-digit PIN.

 *If the message Codes do not match. appears when you edit your PIN, you entered the new PIN incorrectly. If the message Wrong PIN. appears, followed by Old PIN:, you entered your old PIN incorrectly.*

### To unblock your SIM card

- 1 When PIN Blocked appears, enter your PUK ▶ OK.
- 2 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ▶ OK.
- 3 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ▶ OK.

### To edit your PIN

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Locks ▶ SIM Lock ▶ Change PIN.
- 2 Enter your PIN ▶ OK.
- 3 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ▶ OK.
- 4 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ▶ OK.

### To turn the SIM card lock on or off

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Locks ▶ SIM Lock ▶ Protection and select On or Off.
- 2 Enter your PIN ▶ OK.




## Phone Lock

Protect your phone against unauthorized use if it is stolen and the SIM card is exchanged. You can change the phone lock code (0000) to any four- to eight-digit personal code.

### Automatic Phone Lock

If the phone lock is set to automatic, you do not need to enter your phone lock code until a different SIM card is inserted in the phone.

 *It is important that you remember your new code. If you should forget it, you will need to bring your phone in to your local Sony Ericsson retailer.*

### To set the phone lock

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Locks ▶ Phone Lock ▶ Protection and select an alternative.
- Enter the phone lock code ▶ OK.

### To unlock the phone

## Keypad Lock

Lock the keypad to avoid dialing a number by accident.

### Automatic Keylock


In standby, automatic keylock means the keypad is locked a short while after you last press a key.

### To set the automatic keylock

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Locks ▶ Automatic Keylock.

### To lock the keypad manually

Slide the lock switch or open the phone and press  ▶ Lock Keys. You can still answer an incoming call and the keypad locks again after the call. The keypad remains locked until you unlock it manually.

To unlock the keypad, slide the lock switch or open the phone and press  ▶ Unlock.

## Troubleshooting

*Why doesn't the phone work the way I want?*

This chapter lists some problems that you might encounter while using your phone. Some problems require you to call your service provider, but you can easily correct most of the problems yourself.

However, if you need to hand in your phone for repair, please note that you may lose information and content that you have saved in your phone. You are advised to make a copy of such information before handing your phone in for repair.

### ***I have problems with memory capacity or the phone working slowly***

*Possible cause:* The phone memory is full or the memory contents are not properly organized.

*Solution:* Restart your phone every day to free memory and increase the capacity of your phone. You also have the option to do a **Master Reset**. Some of your personal data and settings you have made will be lost when doing this

► 73 *Master Reset*.

## Troubleshooting

### **No battery icon appears when I start charging the phone**

*Possible cause:* The battery is empty or has not been used for a long time.

*Solution:* It may take up to 30 minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen.

### **Some menu options appear in gray**

*Possible cause:* A service is not activated or your subscription does not support the function.

*Solution:* Contact your service provider.

*Possible cause:* Since you cannot send themes, pictures and sounds that are copyright-protected, the **Send** menu is sometimes unavailable.

### **I do not understand the language in menus**

*Possible cause:* The wrong language is set in the phone.

*Solution:* Change the language ➔ 15 Phone Language.

### **I cannot turn on the phone**

*Possible cause:* The battery is discharged.

*Solution:* Recharge the battery ➔ 5 To charge the battery.

*Solution:* Turn the phone on with the charger attached. If the phone starts, restart the phone with no charger attached.

### **I cannot charge the phone or battery capacity is low**

*Possible cause:* The charger is not properly connected to the phone.

*Solution:* Make sure that the charger connector clicks properly into place when connected ➔ 5 To charge the battery.

*Possible cause:* The battery connection is bad.

*Solution:* Remove the battery and clean the connectors. You can use a soft brush, cloth or q-tip, soaked with alcohol. Make sure that the battery is completely dry before you put it back. Check that the battery connectors in the phone are undamaged.

*Possible cause:* The battery is worn out and needs to be replaced.

*Solution:* Try another battery and charger for the same phone model, or visit your retailer and ask them to verify if the battery and charger are working properly.

## Troubleshooting

### **The phone turns itself off**

*Possible cause:* The **⓪** button has been pushed unintentionally.

*Solution:* Turn on the automatic keylock, or lock the keypad manually ➤ **69 Keypad Lock**.

*Possible cause:* The battery connection is bad.

*Solution:* Make sure the battery is inserted correctly ➤ **5 To insert SIM card and battery**.

### **I cannot use SMS/text messages on my phone**

*Possible cause:* Settings are missing or incorrect.

*Solution:* Contact your service provider to find out the correct SMS service center setting ➤ **30 Text Messaging (SMS)**.

### **I cannot use MMS/picture messages on my phone**

*Possible cause:* Your subscription does not include data capability.

*Solution:* Please contact your service provider.

*Possible cause:* Settings are missing or incorrect.

*Solution:* Go to [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support), choose your phone model, then choose “Phone setup – MMS” and follow the instructions ➤ **54 Settings**.

### **I cannot use the Internet**

*Possible cause:* Your subscription does not include data capability.

*Solution:* Please contact your service provider.

*Possible cause:* Internet settings are missing or incorrect.

*Solution:* Go to [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support), choose your phone model, then choose “Phone setup – WAP” and follow the instructions ➤ **54 Settings**.

### **The phone cannot be detected by other users via Bluetooth**

*Possible cause:* You have not turned Bluetooth on.

*Solution:* Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and that your phone is visible to other users ➤ **59 To show or hide your phone**.

### **I cannot synchronize or transfer data between my phone and my computer, when using the included USB cable**

*Possible cause:* The cable has not been properly detected and installed on your computer.

The software that came with your phone has not been properly installed on the computer.

*Solution:* Go to [www.SonyEricsson.com/support](http://www.SonyEricsson.com/support), choose your phone model, then choose “Product

information” – “Getting started”. The guide “Synchronizing the phone with a computer” contains installation instructions and a troubleshooting guide, that may assist you in solving the problem.


### Master Reset

The changes that you have made to settings and the content that you have added or edited, will be deleted.

- If you select **Reset Settings**, the changes that you have made to settings will be deleted.
- If you select **Reset All**, in addition to your changes to settings, all contacts, messages, personal data, and content that you have downloaded, received or edited will also be deleted.

### To reset the phone

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Master Reset.
- 2 ▶ Reset Settings or ▶ Reset All.
- 3 When instructions appear ▶ Continue.

 If you select **Reset All**, content such as melodies and pictures that you have downloaded, received or edited is also deleted.

## Troubleshooting

### Error Messages

#### Insert SIM.

*Possible cause:* There is no SIM card in the phone or you may have inserted it incorrectly.

*Solution:* Insert a SIM card ▶ 5 To insert SIM card and battery.

*Possible cause:* The SIM card connectors need cleaning.

*Solution:* Remove the SIM card and clean it.

Also check that the card is not damaged in a way that may prevent connection to the phone connectors. In that case, contact your service provider for a new SIM card.

#### Insert correct SIM card.

*Possible cause:* The phone is set to work only with certain SIM cards.

*Solution:* Verify whether you are using the correct service provider SIM card for your phone.

#### Wrong PIN./Wrong PIN2.

*Possible cause:* You have entered your PIN or PIN2 incorrectly.

*Solution:* Enter the correct PIN or PIN2 ▶ Yes ▶ 68 SIM Card Lock.

## Troubleshooting

### **PIN Blocked/PIN2 blocked.**

*Possible cause:* You have entered your PIN or PIN2 code incorrectly three times in a row.

*Solution:* To unblock ➡ **68 SIM Card Lock.**

### **Codes do not match.**

*Possible cause:* The two codes that you have entered do not match.

*Solution:* When you want to change a security code (for example your PIN) you have to confirm the new code by entering exactly the same code again.

➡ **68 SIM Card Lock.**

### **No netwk coverage**

*Possible cause:* Your phone is not receiving any radio signal, or the received signal is too weak.

*Solution:* Contact your service provider and make sure that the network has coverage where you are. If so, try to do a new search.

*Possible cause:* The SIM card is not working properly.

*Solution:* Insert your SIM card in another phone. If you still get the same or a similar message, please contact your service provider.

*Possible cause:* The phone is not working properly.

*Solution:* Insert your SIM card in another phone. If this works, it is probably the phone that is causing the problem. Please contact the nearest Sony Ericsson service location.

### **Emerg. Calls Only**

*Possible cause:* You are within range of a network, but you are not allowed to use it. However, in an emergency, some service providers allow you to call the international emergency number 112.

*Solution:* You have to move to get a signal that is strong enough. Contact your service provider and make sure your subscription is ok ➡ **18 Emergency Calls.**

### **Phone locked.**

*Possible cause:* The phone is locked.

*Solution:* To unlock the phone ➡ **69 Phone Lock.**

### **Phone lock code:**

*Possible cause:* The phone lock code is required.

*Solution:* Enter the phone lock code. Your phone comes with the default phone lock code 0000 ➡ **69 Phone Lock.**

### **PUK blocked.**

*Possible cause:* You entered your personal unblocking key code (PUK) incorrectly 10 times in a row.

*Solution:* Contact your service provider.

### **Charging - Non-standard battery.**

*Possible cause:* The battery that you are using is not a Sony Ericsson approved battery.

*Solution:* ➡ **78 Battery Use and Care.**

### Radio Frequency (RF) Exposure and SAR

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields).

Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection) and IEEE (The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Inc.), through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines establish permitted levels of radio wave exposure for the general population. The levels include a safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health, and to account for any variations in measurements.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) is the unit of measurement for the amount of radio frequency energy absorbed by the body when using a mobile phone. The SAR value is determined at the highest certified power level in laboratory conditions, but the actual SAR level of the mobile phone while operating can be well below this value. This is because the mobile phone is designed to use the minimum power required to reach the network.

Variations in SAR below the radio frequency exposure guidelines do not mean that there are variations in safety. While there may be differences in SAR levels among mobile phones, all Sony Ericsson mobile phone models are designed to meet radio frequency exposure guidelines.

The tests are performed in positions and locations (that is, at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.
