Assembly

Before you can use your phone you need to:

- Insert the SIM card
- · Attach and charge the battery.

SIM Card and Battery Information

When you register as a subscriber with a service provider, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. The SIM card contains a computer chip that keeps track of your phone number, the services included in your subscription, and names and numbers in your contacts, among other things.



If you have been using a SIM card in another phone, make sure that your information is saved to the SIM card before you remove it from the other phone. For example, contacts may have been saved in the phone memory.



















To insert SIM card and battery



- Remove the battery cover by sliding it as shown in the picture.
- Insert the SIM card in the slot with the cut off corner first and the gold contacts facing down.
- Place the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- Place and slide the battery cover into place.

To charge the battery



- Connect the charger to the phone. The symbol on the charger plug must face upwards.
- It may take up to 30 minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen.
- Wait approximately 2.5 hours or until the battery icon indicates that the battery is fully charged. Press a key to activate the screen.
- Remove the charger by pulling it out.



















To remove the SIM card



Press the edge of the SIM card to release it from the slot

PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identity Number) to activate the services in your phone. The PIN is associated with your SIM card, and not with the phone. Your PIN is provided by your service provider. When you enter your PIN, each digit appears as *, unless your PIN starts with the same digits as an emergency number, for example 112. The reason for this is to always let you make emergency calls without entering a PIN.

If you make a mistake while entering your PIN, delete the number by pressing (C).

- ij- If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked and the message PIN blocked appears. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal

Battery

Some functions use more battery power than others and may cause a need for more frequent recharging. If talk time or standby time becomes noticeably shorter, you may have to replace the battery. Only use approved batteries from Sony Ericsson → 78 Battery Use and Care.

Turning on the Phone and Making Calls

Make sure that the phone is charged and your SIM card is inserted before you turn it on. When you have turned the phone on, you can use the setup wizard to quickly and easily prepare vour phone for use.



















Getting Started To turn on the phone



- Press and hold (1).
- Select whether you want to use the phone with all functionality or the WALKMANTM player only **→** 7 Startup Menu.
- Enter your SIM card PIN, if requested.
- At first startup, select the language you want for your phone menus.
- ▶ Yes if you want the setup wizard to help you get started, and follow the instructions that appear. You can start the wizard from the menu system at any time, ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ► Setup Wizard.


To open and close the phone



· To open the phone, rotate the top section up until it clicks into place.



· To close the phone. rotate the top section down in the opposite direction



Startup Menu

When the startup menu is activated, each time you turn on the phone, you can select to listen to music only, instead of using the phone with full functionality. This means all transmitters of the phone are turned























off, preventing disturbance of sensitive equipment, for example, in an aeroplane or in a hospital. You cannot make calls, receive calls, or send messages, etc. You can only use the WALKMAN player. If you have selected Music Only, you can still receive calendar and task reminders, and the alarm can still signal.

To deactivate the startup menu

- ► Settings ► the General tab ► Startup Menu.
- Select Don't Show

To make and receive calls

You can make and receive calls when the phone is open or closed.

- When open, enter the phone number (with international prefix and area code if applicable) ▶ Call to make the call. ▶ End Call to end the call.
- 2 When open or closed, ► Contacts and select the contact to call. Use @ or @ to select a number ▶ Call

When the phone rings ▶ Answer or ▶ Busy to reject the call. This can be done in either open or closed mode.

Stereo Handsfree Headset



You can connect compatible accessories using a 3.5 mm jack, such as headphones, to your stereo handsfree headset



You can still answer calls and use the microphone when other compatible accessories are in use.















Navigation

The main menus are shown as icons on the desktop. Some submenus include tabs that appear on the screen. Scroll to a tab by pressing the navigation key left or right and select an option.

Navigating the Menus



- Press , , , , , to move through the menus.
- Press <u>o</u>, <u>o</u> to move between the tabs.
- Press to select options shown immediately above these keys on the screen.
- Press to go back one level in the menus.
 Press and hold to return to standby or to end a function.

Keys and Buttons

Press to delete items, such as pictures, sounds and contacts.

During a call, press and hold to mute the microphone.

Press to open the browser.

Press to open or minimize the WALKMANTM player.

Press to take a picture or to record a video clip.

Press to launch the WALKMAN player or radio in a minimized mode and press again to close the WALKMAN player or radio.

Press and hold to call your voicemail service (if set).














Standby Icons

Tells you the strength of the GSM network signal.

Shortcuts

You can use keypad shortcuts to quickly go to a menu, and you can use predefined navigation key shortcuts to quickly reach certain functions. You can edit the navigation key shortcuts to suit vour own needs.

Using Keypad Shortcuts

Enter the menus by pressing (a) and then enter the number of the menu to which you want to go. For example, to reach the fifth menu item. press (5). To reach the tenth, eleventh and twelfth menu items, press (*a/A), (0 +) and (#=5) respectively. To go back to standby, press and hold ($\stackrel{\bullet}{\Box}$).

Using Navigation Key Shortcuts

In standby, press (6), (6), (6) or (6) to go to a shortcuts menu, or directly to a function.

To edit a navigation key shortcut

▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Shortcuts and select which shortcut you want to edit ▶ Edit.




















Phone Language

Select the language for phone menus or the languages that you may use when writing.

To change the phone language

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Language ▶ Phone Language. Select a language.
- From standby, you can also press: © 8888 © for automatic language (SIM) © 0000 © for English.



To select writing language

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Language ▶ Writing Language.
- Scroll to the language that you want to use and mark it ▶ Save to exit the menu

Entering Letters and Characters

When writing messages and notes there are two ways to enter letters and characters:

- · Multitap text input
- T9TM Text Input.

To enter letters using multitap input

- Press (2) (9) repeatedly until the desired character appears on the screen.
- Press (*a/A) to shift between capital and lower-case letters.
- Press and hold (0+) (9) to enter numbers.
- Press (C) to delete letters and numbers.
- Press 1 for the most common punctuation marks.
- Press (#=3) to add a space.

T9™ Text Input

The T9 Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary to recognize the most commonly used word for each sequence of key presses. This way, you press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key.

To enter letters using T9 Text Input

- For example, if you want to write the word "Jane", press (5), (2), (6), (3).
- If the word shown is the one you want, press (#=\\$) to accept and add a space. To accept a word without adding a space, press . If the word shown is not the one you want, press (6) or (9) repeatedly to view alternative words. Accept a word and add a space by pressing (#=\f3).





















3 Continue writing your message. To enter a full stop or other punctuation marks, press 1 and then ⑤ or ⑥ repeatedly. Accept by pressing (#--₱).

To add words to the T9 Text Input dictionary

- 1 While entering letters ► More ► Spell Word.
- 2 Edit the word by using multitap input.
 Use ⊚ and ⊚ to navigate between the letters.
 To delete a character, press ⓒ. To delete the entire word, press and hold ⓒ.

When you have edited the word Insert. The word is added to the T9 Text Input dictionary. Next time you enter this word using T9 Text Input, it will appear as one of the alternative words.

To switch between writing methods Before, or while entering letters, press and hold (***a/**a) to switch between writing methods.

Options When Entering Letters

▶ More to enter a list of options that offers different alternatives when writing a message.

File Manager

Files such as Pictures, Videos, Sounds, Themes, Games and Applications are saved in the folders in the phone memory. Create sub folders to move or copy files to. Unrecognized files are saved in the Other folder.

When handling files, you can select several or all files in a folder at the same time.

To use a file from the file manager

- Select a file in Pictures or Sounds.
- 2 ► More ► Use As and select an option.

To move a file to a folder

- File Manager and open a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a file, for example, a picture that you want to move ► More ► Manage Files ► Move.
- 3 Select the folder you want to move the file to, or select New Folder and name the folder ► OK.

To create a subfolder

- 1 ► File Manager and open a folder.
- 2 ► More ► New Folder and enter a name for the folder.
 - ▶ OK to save the folder.

To select all files in a folder

Items that are downloaded, or received using one of the available transfer methods, may be copyright protected. If a file is protected, you may not be able to copy or send that file. You can select to view information for the file.

Calling

Calls, contacts, voice control, call options.

Making and Receiving Calls

Before you can make or receive calls, you must turn on the phone and be within range of a network.

♦ 6 Turning on the Phone and Making Calls.

Networks

When you turn on the phone, it automatically selects your home network if this is within range. If it is not within range, you may use another network, provided your service provider has an agreement that allows you to do so. This is called roaming.

You can select the network you want to use, or you can add a network to your list of preferred networks. You can also change the order in which networks are selected during an automatic search.

To View Available Network Options

▶ Settings and use ⑤ or ⑥ to scroll to the Connectivity tab ▶ Mobile Networks.











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To make a call

- Enter the area code and the phone number.
- ► Call to make the call
- ► End Call to end the call

To make international calls

- Press and hold (0 +) until a + sign appears.
- Enter the country code, area code (without the leading zero) and phone number ▶ Call.

To redial a number

If a call connection fails and Retry? appears ▶ Yes.

-\(\docurredge Do not hold the phone to your ear while waiting. When the call connects, the phone gives a loud signal.

To answer or reject a call

► Answer or ► Busy.

Missed Calls

If you have missed a call, Missed calls: appears in standby, indicating the number of missed calls. To view the missed calls in the call list ▶ Yes If you want to view the missed calls later ▶ No.

To check your missed calls

- From standby ► Calls and use ③ or (6) to scroll to the Missed tab.
- Scroll (♠) or (♠) and ▶ Call to call a number.

To turn off the microphone

- Press and hold (C) to mute the microphone during a call.
- 2 Press and hold (C) again to resume a conversation

To use the loudspeaker during a call

More ► Turn On Speaker or Turn Off Speaker.

Do not hold the phone to your ear while using the loudspeaker. This could damage your hearing.

To change the ear speaker volume

Press (to increase or v to decrease the ear speaker volume during a call.

Emergency Calls

Your phone supports the international emergency numbers, for example, 112, 911 and 08. These numbers can normally be used to make emergency calls in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.


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To select default contacts

SIM Contacts

Save contacts on your SIM card with name and number.

To add a SIM contact

- ► Contacts ► New Contact ► Add
- Enter the name ▶ OK.
- Enter the number ▶ OK ▶ Save

Phone Contacts

Save contacts in the phone with names, phone numbers and personal information. You can also add pictures and ringtones to contacts. Use (a), (b), (d) and (e) to scroll between the tabs and their information fields.

To add a phone contact

- ► Contacts ► New Contact ► Add
- Enter the name ▶ OK.
- Enter the number ▶ OK
- Select a number type.

Contacts

You can save your contact information in the phone memory as contacts, or on the SIM card as names and numbers. You can choose which contacts information - Phone Contacts or SIM Contacts is shown as default. For useful information and settings ► Contacts ► Options.

Default Contact

If you select to use Phone Contacts as default, your contacts will show all information saved in Contacts If you select SIM Contacts as default, the contacts will only show names and numbers saved on the SIM card























- Scroll between the tabs and select the fields to add information. To enter symbols such as @. ▶ More ▶ Add Symbol and select the symbol
- When all information is entered ▶ Save

To delete a contact

▶ Insert

▶ Contacts and scroll to a contact and press (C).

To delete all phone contacts

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced
- ▶ Delete All Contacts ▶ Yes and ▶ Yes Names and numbers on the SIM card are not deleted

To automatically save names and phone numbers to the SIM card

Memory Status

The number of contacts you can save in the phone or on the SIM card depends on available memory.

Using Contacts

Contacts can be used in many ways. Below you can see how to:

- · call phone and SIM contacts.
- send contacts to another device
- copy contacts to the phone and SIM card.
- · add a picture or a ringtone to a phone contact.
- edit contacts
- · synchronize your contacts.

To call a phone contact

- ► Contacts and select the contact to call
- Use ⑤ or ⑥ to select a number ▶ Call.

To call a SIM contact

- If SIM Contacts is default ➤ Contacts and select the name and number from the list ▶ Call
- If Phone Contacts is default ➤ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ SIM Contacts and select the name and number from the list ▶ Call


To send a phone contact

- ▶ Send Contact and select a transfer method.






















To send all phone contacts

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced
- ► Send All Contacts and select a transfer method

To copy names and numbers to the SIM card

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ▶ Copy to SIM.
- Select one of the alternatives
- -☆- When copying all contacts from the phone to the SIM card, all existing SIM card information is replaced.

To copy names and numbers to phone contacts

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Copy from SIM.
- Select one of the alternatives

To add a picture or a ringtone to a phone contact

- ▶ Contacts and select the contact you want to add a picture or personal ringtone to ▶ More ▶ Edit Contact
- Select the relevant tab and then select Picture or Ringtone and ▶ Add.
- Select a picture or sound and ▶ Save.

To edit a phone contact

- ► Contacts and select a contact ► More
 - ▶ Edit Contact Scroll to the relevant tab and select the field
- to edit and ▶ Edit
- Edit the information and ▶ Save

To edit a SIM contact

- If SIM contacts is default ▶ Contacts and select the name and number to edit If phone contacts is default ▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ SIM Contacts and select the name and number to edit

Synchronizing Contacts

To synchronize contacts

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Sync. Contacts.

Call List

Information about the most recently dialed, answered and missed calls are listed in separate tabs.

To call a number from the call list

- 1 ► Calls from standby and select a relevant tab.
- 2 Scroll to the name or number to call ► Call.

To add a call list number to contacts

- 1 ► Calls from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the number to add ► More
 ► Save Number
- 3 New Contact to create a new contact, or select an existing contact to add the number to.

To clear the call list

► Calls and select the All tab ► More ► Delete All.

Speed Dialing

Save the phone numbers that you want to reach easily in positions 1-9 in your phone.

To speed dial

From standby, enter the position number ▶ Call.

To edit speed dialing numbers

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Speed Dial.
- Scroll to the position ► Add or ► Replace.

Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call.



Contact your service provider for your voicemail number or for more information.

To call your voicemail service

Press and hold 1. If you have not entered a voicemail number, ▶ Yes and enter the number.

To edit your voicemail number

► Messaging ► Settings ► Voicemail Number.

Voice Control

Manage calls with your voice by creating voice commands to:

- Voice dial call someone by saying the name.
- · Activate voice control by saying a "magic word".
- Answer and reject calls when using a handsfree.















Calling







Activate the voice dialing function and record your voice commands. An icon appears next to a phone number that has a voice command

To activate voice dialing and record names

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Voice Control
 - ► Voice Dialing ► Activate ► Yes
 - ▶ New Voice Cmd. and select a contact.
- If the contact has more than one number. use (a) and (b) to view the numbers. Select the number to add the voice command to Record a voice command such as "John mobile"
- Instructions appear. Wait for the tone and say the command that you want to record. The voice command is played back to you.
- If the recording sounds ok ▶ Yes. If not ▶ No and repeat step 3.

To record another voice command for a contact ▶ New Voice Cmd. ▶ Add again and repeat steps 2-4 above

Caller Name

Hear your recorded contact name when you receive a call from that contact

To turn the caller name on or off

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Voice Control
- ► Play Caller Name.

Voice Dialing

Start voice dialing from standby using the phone, a portable handsfree, a Bluetooth headset or by saving your magic word.

To make a call

- From standby, press and hold one of the volume buttons.
- Wait for the tone and say a recorded name, for example "John mobile". The name is played back to you and the call is connected.

To make a call with a handsfree

From standby, press and hold the handsfree button, or press the Bluetooth headset button

⇒ 59 To add a Bluetooth handsfree.

The Magic Word

Record and use a voice command as a magic word to activate voice control without pressing any keys. The magic word can only be used with a handsfree or a Bluetooth headset



Choose a long, unusual word or phrase that can easily be distinguished from ordinary background speech.



















To activate and record the magic word

- ► Settings ► the General tab ► Voice Control
- ▶ Magic Word ▶ Activate. 2 Instructions appear. ► Continue.
- Wait for the tone and say the magic word.
- ▶ Yes to accept or ▶ No for a new recording.
- Instructions appear. ▶ Continue and select the environments in which you want your magic word to be activated.

Voice Answering

Answer or reject incoming calls by using your voice, when using a handsfree.

You can only use a MIDI, WAV (16 kHz), EMY or IMY file as a ringtone with voice answering.

To activate voice answering and record voice answer commands

- Settings ➤ the General tab ➤ Voice Control ► Voice Answer ► Activate
- 2 Instructions appear. ► Continue. Wait for the tone and say "Answer", or another word.
- ▶ Yes to accept or ▶ No for a new recording.

- Instructions appear ▶ Continue. Wait for the tone and say "Busy", or another word.
- ▶ Yes to accept or ▶ No for a new recording.
- Instructions appear. ▶ Continue and select the environments in which you want voice answering to be activated.

To answer or reject a call using voice commands

When the phone rings, say:

- · "Answer" to connect the call or
- · "Busy" to reject the call.

To edit your voice commands

- ▶ Contacts select the contact ▶ More
- ▶ Edit Contact. Scroll to the relevant tab.

To rerecord a voice command

- ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ Voice Control
 - ▶ Voice Dialing ▶ Edit Names.
- Select a command ► More ► Replace Voice.
- Wait for the tone and say the command.


















Calling







Forward calls, for example, to an answering service.



Your phone has the following options:

- · Always Forward all calls.
- · When Busy if a call is ongoing.
- Not Reachable if turned off or unreachable.
- · No Reply if not answered in a specified time.

To activate a call forward

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ the Calls tab ▶ Forward Calls.
- Select a call type and forward option
 Activate
- 3 Enter the phone number to forward your calls to, or press Lookup to find a contact ▶ OK.

To deactivate a call forward

Scroll to the forward option ▶ Deactivate.

More Than One Call

Handle more than one call simultaneously.



Call Waiting Service

When activated, you hear a beep if you receive a second call.

To activate or deactivate the call waiting service

► Settings ► the Calls tab by using ⊚ or ⊚ and ► Manage Calls ► Call waiting.

To make a second call

- ► More ► Hold to hold the ongoing call.
- Enter the number to call ► More ► Call.

Receiving a Second Call

When you receive a second call, you can:

- Answer and put the ongoing call on hold.
- **Busy** to reject and continue the ongoing call.
- Replace Active Call to answer and end the ongoing call.



















Calling

Handling Two Calls

If you have calls ongoing and on hold, you can: • ► More ► Switch to switch between the two calls.

- More ➤ Join Calls to join the two calls.
- More ➤ Transfer Call to connect the two calls. You are disconnected from both calls
- ▶ End Call and ▶ Yes to retrieve the held call.
- ► End Call twice to end both calls (service provider dependent).

You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls or joining them into a conference call

Conference Calls

Start a conference call by joining an ongoing call and a call on hold. You then put the conference on hold to call and add up to five participants or just to make another call.

To join the two calls into a conference call

► More ► Join Calls

To add a new participant

- ▶ More ▶ Hold to put the joined calls on hold.
- ▶ More ▶ Add Call and call the next person vou want to include in the conference call.
- ► More ► Join Calls
- Repeat steps 1-3 to include more participants.

To release a participant

▶ More ▶ Release Part and select the participant that to release from the conference call

To have a private conversation

- ▶ More ▶ Talk to and select the participant that you want to talk to.
- More ▶ Join Calls to resume the conference call



Two Voice Lines
