Before you start using your phone, you need to insert a SIM card and the battery.

To insert the SIM card



- 1 Remove the battery cover.
- Slide the SIM card into its holder with the gold-coloured contacts facing down

- 2 Slide the battery cover into place.

Turning on the phone
