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Getting started

SIM card and battery

To insert the SIM card and battery
1 Remove the battery cover.



2 Slide the SIM card into its holder.



3 Insert the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.




4 Slide the battery cover into place.




5 Connect the charger to the phone.



6 It may take up to 30 minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen.



7 Wait approximately 2.5 hours for the battery to be fully charged.



8 Remove the charger.



To open and close the phone



1 Rotate the top section up until it clicks into place.



- 2 Rotate the top section down in the opposite direction.
- Do not rotate the top section more than 180 degrees, in either direction, as the phone will be damaged.

To turn on the phone



- 1 Open the phone, press and hold ①. The first start-up may take a few minutes.
- 2 Select Start phone to use the phone with full functionality or Music only to use the WALKMAN™ player only.
- 3 Enter your SIM card PIN, if requested.
- 4 At first start-up, select the language for your phone menus. ▶ Yes if you want the setup wizard to help you get started. Follow the instructions to complete the setup.

Music only

Select to listen to music only, with phone network transmitters turned off. This prevents disturbance of sensitive equipment, for example, in an aeroplane where calls and messages are prohibited. Some limited phone functions are also available such as the alarm, calendar and task reminders

Always follow regulations and any flight crew instructions with respect to onboard use of electronic devices

To deactivate the start-up menu

- 1 ▶ Settings and scroll to the General tab ▶ Start-up menu.
- 2 Select Don't show.

Memory Stick PRO Duo™



Your phone supports Memory Stick PRO Duo™. To insert a Memory Stick, slide it into the slot as shown.

A Memory Stick adds more storage space to your phone to store, for example, music, ringtones, video clips and pictures.

Make and receive calls

You can make and receive calls when the phone is open or closed:

- When open, enter the phone number (with international prefix and area code if applicable)

 Call to make a voice call or press
 to make a video call.
 End call to end the call.
- When open or closed, ▶ Contacts and select the contact to call. Use ⊚ or ⊚ to select a number ▶ Call to make a voice call or press ④ to make a video call.
- When the phone rings ► Answer or ►
 Busy to reject the call. This can be
 done in either open or closed mode.

WALKMAN™ player

The WALKMAN™ player is an all in one music and video player. The following file types are supported: MP3, MP4, 3GP, AAC, AAC+, AMR, MIDI, IMY, EMY and WAV (16 kHz maximum sample rate) and Real®8.

You can also use streamed files that are 3GPP compatible.

To play music and videos

- 1 ► WALKMAN. The WALKMAN[™] player browser opens.
- 2 Browse for songs by artist or track, or in playlists. You can also browse for video clips. Select a list ▶ Open.
- 3 Highlight a title ▶ Play.

WALKMAN™ player controls

- Press and hold to open or minimize the WALKMAN™ player during playback.
- Press III to pause the playback.
 Press again to resume playing.

- Press
 or
 or to view and scroll files in the current playlist during playback.
- Press Play to select a highlighted file in a list.
- When a video clip is playing, press

 to play the video in slow motion.

 Play to resume normal playback.

- Press and hold (5) to exit.

Browsing files

Browse music files and video clips in lists:

- Artists lists music files you have transferred using Disc2Phone.
- Tracks lists all music files (not ringtones) in your phone and on the Memory Stick.
- Playlists create or play your own lists of music files.
- Call lists all video clips in your phone and on the Memory Stick.

Playlists

To organize the media files that are stored in the File manager, you can create playlists. Files in a playlist can be sorted by artist, title or by the order in which the files were added to the playlist. You can add a file to more than one playlist.

When you delete a playlist or a file from the playlist, the actual music or video file is not deleted from the memory, just the playlist reference to it. You can still add the file to another playlist.

To create a playlist

- 1 ► WALKMAN ► Playlists ► New playlist ► Add. Enter a name ► OK.
- 2 Select from the files that are available in the File manager. You can add several files at a time and you can also add folders. All files in the selected folders will be added to the playlist.

To add files to a playlist

- 1 ► WALKMAN ► Playlists select a playlist ► Open ► More ► Add media.
- 2 Select from the files that are available in the File manager.

To remove files from a playlist

- 1 ► WALKMAN ► Playlists select a playlist ► Open.
- 2 Select the file and press ©.

To delete a playlist

► WALKMAN ► Playlists select a playlist and press (c).

WALKMAN™ player options

- Now playing go to the Now playing view.
- Add media add files or folders to the playlist.
- Sort sort by artist, title or by the order in which files were added to the playlist.

- Delete remove a file from the playlist.
 In user-created playlists only the reference to the file is removed. In the Tracks list, the file is permanently deleted from the memory.
- Minimize minimize the WALKMAN™ player and return to standby with the music still playing.
- Rename rename user-created playlists.
- Delete playlist delete user-created playlists. Files are not deleted from File manager.
- Information view information about the current file or video.
- Play mode change the playback order of songs and videos. Select Shuffle to play the playlist files in random order, or Loop to restart the playlist when the last file has been played.
- Equalizer change treble and bass settings.
- Send send a music file or video clip.
- · Fullscreen play in fullscreen.
- Capture frame when a video clip is paused, capture a picture from it.

Transferring music

Disc2Phone computer software and USB drivers are included on the CD that comes with the phone. Use Disc2Phone to transfer music from

CDs or your computer to the phone memory or Memory Stick in your phone.

To install Disc2Phone

- 1 Turn on your computer and insert the CD that came with your phone. The CD starts automatically and the installation window opens.
- 2 Select a language and click OK.
- 3 Click Install Disc2Phone and follow the instructions. When the installation is complete, a Disc2Phone icon appears on the desktop.

To use Disc2Phone

- 1 Connect the phone to a computer with the USB cable that came with your phone 33 Transferring files using the USB cable.
- 2 ➤ Settings ➤ the Connectivity tab ➤ USB connection ➤ File transfer. The phone will turn off and prepare for transferral of files.
- 3 Start Disc2Phone by double-clicking the icon on the computer desktop.

- 4 For details on transferring music, please refer to Disc2Phone Help. Click in the top right corner of the Disc2Phone window.
- Do not remove the USB cable from the phone or computer during transfer, as this may corrupt the Memory Stick and the phone memory. You cannot view the transferred files in your phone until you have removed the USB cable from the phone.
 - 5 You can obtain CD information (artist, track, etc.) via Disc2Phone if you are connected to the Internet while extracting music from a CD.
- For safe disconnection of the USB cable in File transfer mode, right-click on the Removable Disk icon in Windows Explorer and select Elect.

HPM-80



With the radio portable handsfree, HPM-80, you can listen to the radio and control the WALKMAN™ player in the phone. If you receive a call when using the HPM-80, the music stops and you can answer the call. When the call is ended or if the call is rejected the HPM-80 continues to play. The HPM-80 can be used as a standard handsfree device for receiving and making calls even if it is turned off.

You can use the HPM-80 to:

- to manually or automatically search for radio broadcasting frequencies.
- · play and pause music.
- move between music files.
- fast forward or rewind.

- · increase or decrease the volume.
- mute the ear speakers or the microphone.

To use the HPM-80

- 1 Turn on your phone and connect the HPM-80.
- 2 Press and hold the MP/FM ON/OFF button to turn on the HPM-80.
- 3 Press the MP/FM ON/OFF button to switch between the radio and WALKMAN™ player.
- To save battery power, turn off the HPM-80 when it is not in use.


Camera

To take a picture or record a video clip

1 Close the phone. From standby, press and hold (a) to activate the camera. Use the navigation key to switch between camera and video recorder.



- 2 Press to take a picture or start recording. To end video recording, press again.
- To take another picture or record another clip, press (±) to return to the viewfinder.
- To deactivate the camera or the video recorder, press and hold (≤).





Entering letters

There are two ways of entering letters when writing a message or writing a name in contacts:

Multitap text input

Press each key as many times as needed to show the letter you want.

T9™ Text Input
 Press each key only once, even if the
 letter you want is not the first letter on
 the key.

To enter letters using T9™ Text Input

- 1 To enter text, you have to be in a function where text input is possible, for example, ▶ Messaging ▶ Write new ▶ Text message.
- 2 For example, to write the word "Jane", press (5), (2), (6), (3).
- If the word shown is the one you want, press (#_-B) to accept and add a space. To accept a word without adding a space, press (a). If the word shown is not the one you want, press (a) or (b) to view alternative words. Accept a word by pressing (#_-B).
- 4 Continue writing your message. To enter a mark, press 1 and then ⑤ or ⑥ repeatedly. Accept by pressing (#→3).

To select another writing method

and hold (**an) to select another writing
method

Activity menu

You can open the activity menu almost anywhere in the phone to view and handle new events, and access bookmarks and shortcuts.

To open and close the activity menu Press (♂).

Activity menu tabs

- New events such as missed calls and messages.
- My shortcuts and applications that are running in the background.
- Bookmarks your Internet bookmarks.
- If you want new events to appear as pop-up text instead of in the activity menu, ▶ Settings ▶ the General tab ▶ New events ▶ Popup.

File manager

Use the File manager to handle items such as Pictures, Videos, Sounds, Themes, Web pages, Games and Applications saved in the phone memory or on a Memory Stick.

Move and copy files between the phone, a computer and a Memory Stick. Create subfolders to move or copy files to. Games and applications can only be moved within the Games and Applications folders and from the phone memory to a Memory Stick. Unrecognized files are saved in the Other folder.

When handling files, you can select several or all files in a folder at the same time for all items except Games and Applications.

All files are automatically saved in the phone memory. If the phone memory is full and you have a Memory Stick inserted the files will automatically be saved on the Memory Stick. If both the phone memory and the Memory Stick are full, you cannot save any files until you have removed content.

File manager menu tabs

The file manager is divided into three tabs and icons are included to indicate where the files are saved

- All all content in the phone memory and on the Memory Stick.
- Memory Stick all content on the Memory Stick.
- Phone all content in the phone memory.

File information

Items that are downloaded, or received using one of the available transfer methods, may be copyright-protected. If a file is protected, you may not be able to copy or send that file. A DRM-protected file has a key symbol. View file information by highlighting it ▶ More ▶ Information.

To use a file from the file manager

- 1 ▶ File manager and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a file ▶ More.

To move or copy a file to a Memory Stick or to the phone memory

- 1 ► File manager and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a file ➤ More ➤ Manage files ➤ Move to move the file or ➤ More ➤ Manage files ➤ Copy to copy the file.
- 3 Select to move or copy the file to the Memory Stick or to the phone memory ▶ Select.

To move or copy files to a computer

To create a subfolder

- 1 ▶ File manager and select a folder.
- 2 ► More ► New folder and enter a name for the folder.
- 3 ▶ OK to save the folder.

To select several files

- 1 ▶ File manager and select a folder.
- 2 ► More ► Mark ► Mark several.
- 3 Scroll to select files and press Mark or Unmark.

To delete a file or a subfolder from the File manager

- 1 ▶ File manager and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a file or a subfolder ▶ More ▶ Delete.

Formatting a Memory Stick

You can format a Memory Stick to delete all information from it, or if it has been corrupted.

To format the Memory Stick

► File manager and select the Memory Stick tab ► More ► Format M.S.

Calling

Making calls

Before you can make or receive any calls, you must turn on the phone and be within range of a network.

To make a call

- 1 Enter the phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable).
- 2 ▶ Call to make a voice call or press

 1 to make a video call. (▶ More to view options.)
- 3 ▶ End call to end the call.

To change the ear speaker volume Press ▲ or ▼ to increase or decrease the ear speaker volume during a call.

To use the loudspeaker during a voice call

- ▶ More ▶ Speaker or Spkr. off.
- Do not hold the phone to your ear while using the loudspeaker. This could damage your hearing.

To turn off the microphone

- 1 Press and hold ©.
- 2 To resume the conversation, press and hold © again.

Receiving calls

To answer or reject a call

► Answer or ► Busy.

To check missed calls from standby

- If activity menu is set to default:
 Press ② and use ③ or ⑥ to scroll
 to the New events tab. Scroll ⑤ and
 ⑥ to select a number and ▶ Call to
 make a voice call.

Emergency calls

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 and 911. These numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a 3G (UMTS) or GSM network is within range.

In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your network operator may therefore have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SIM card.

To make an emergency call Enter 112 (the international emergency number) ► Call.

To view your local emergency numbers

► Contacts ► Options ► Special numbers ► Emergency nos..

Video call

See a contact live on screen during calls.

Before you start

To make a video call, both you and the person you are calling need a subscription that supports the 3G (UMTS) service, and you need to be within range of a 3G (UMTS) network. 3G (UMTS) service is available when the 3G icon appears in the status bar.

To make a video call

- 1 Press when 3G (UMTS) service is available.
- 2 Enter a phone number ▶ Call or ▶ Call... ▶ Contacts to retrieve a phone number and press ▶ Call or <a>(¶).
- 3 Camera to switch between the front camera and the back camera. Use the back camera to show the recipient a full image of your surroundings.

Video call options

Press and to select from the following options:

- Stop camera/Start camera turn the outgoing video camera on and off. An alternative picture is showed when the camera is off.
- Turn off speaker/Turn on speaker turn the incoming sound on and off during a video call.
- Mute microphone/Unmute mic. turn the microphone on and off during a video call (this option is available during calls).
- Save picture save the image in the large window.
- Switch pictures the incoming or the outgoing video in full size display.
- Hide small pic./Show small pic. hide or show the small picture.

- · Advanced:
 - ▶ Alternative pic. select a picture to show to the recipient when the camera is off
 - ► Answer mode select if the front camera should be on or off when you answer a video call.
 - Audio option select if microphone, speaker phone, or both should be on or off when making a call.
 - ▶ Brightness select brightness level of the outgoing message.
 - ➤ Video quality select the picture quality for outgoing video calls. Changes do not take affect during an ongoing video call.
 - ► Mirror image see the same outgoing video or picture you have selected to send to the recipient.
 - ▶ Night mode use when the lighting conditions are poor. This setting affects the outgoing video.
 - ▶ Contacts select to view contact information such as to check a number during a call.
 - ► Transfer sound transfer the sound to and from a handsfree equipment using BluetoothTM wireless technology.
 - ▶ Demo clip turn on or off.

Contacts

You can save your contact information in the phone memory as contacts, or on the SIM card as names and numbers. You can choose which contact information – Phone contacts or SIM contacts – is shown as default. For useful information and settings ▶ Contacts ▶ Options.

Default contacts

If you select to use Phone contacts as default, your contacts will show all the information saved in Contacts. If you select SIM contacts as default, the contacts will only show names and numbers saved on the SIM card.

To select default contacts

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Default contacts.
- Select Phone contacts or SIM contacts.

Phone contacts

Save contacts in the phone with names, phone numbers and personal information. You can also add pictures and ringtones to contacts. Use ③, ⑥, ⑥ and ⑥ to scroll between the tabs and their information fields.

To add a phone contact

- 1 ► Contacts ► New contact ► Add.
- 2 Enter the name ▶ OK.
- 3 Enter the number ▶ OK.
- 4 Select a number type.
- 5 Scroll between the tabs and select the fields to add information. To enter symbols such as @, ► More ► Add symbol and select the symbol ► Insert.
- 6 When all information is entered ► Save.

To automatically save names and phone numbers to the SIM card

▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ Advanced ▶ Auto save on SIM and select On.

To add a picture or a ringtone to a phone contact

- 1 ► Contacts and select a contact to add a picture or personal ringtone to ► More ► Edit contact.
- 2 Select the relevant tab and then select Picture or Ringtone and ▶ Add.
- 3 Select a picture or sound and ▶ Save.

Calling contacts

You can call one of your contacts, or a number on your SIM card.

If Phone contacts is set as default, you can choose to call from contacts or from the SIM card.

If SIM contacts is set as default, you can only call numbers on the SIM card.

To call a phone contact

- 1 ➤ Contacts. Scroll to, or enter the first letter or letters of the contact.
- 2 When the contact is highlighted, press ⊚ or ⊚ to select a number ▶ Call or press (a) to make a video call.

Sending contacts

You can send contacts using one of the available transfer methods

To send a contact

► Contacts and select a contact ► More ► Send contact and select a transfer method.

Call list

The most recent numbers called are saved in the call list

To call a number from the call list

- 1 ► Call from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Use ⊚, ⊚, ⊚ and ⊚ to scroll to a name or number ▶ Call or press ⑤ to make a video call.

To add a number from the call list to contacts

- 1 ▶ Call from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to a number ➤ More ➤ Save number.
- 3 New contact to create a new contact, or select an existing contact to add the number to

Messaging

Picture messages (MMS)

Picture messages can contain text. pictures, video clips, camera pictures, sound recordings and signatures. You can send picture messages to a mobile phone or an email address.

Before you start

Both you and the recipient must have subscriptions that support picture messaging.

Before sending a picture message, make sure that:

- 1 The address of your message server is set ► Messaging ► Settings ► Picture message ▶ Message server.
- 2 You have entered the correct settings ▶ Messaging ▶ Settings ▶ Picture message ▶ Internet profiles. If no Internet profile exists, you can automatically receive all the settings for MMS in a message from your network operator or from www.SonvEricsson.com/support.

Creating and sending picture messages

Select to write text, Add picture, Add sound, Add video, Add page, Add signature and Attachments. You can add an already existing file or use camera pictures and videos, or the sound recorder to record sounds.

To create and send a picture message

- 1 ► Messaging ► Write new ► Picture msg ► More to view a list of items to add to your message. Select an item.
- 2 More to add more items to the message. For specific item options, select items in the message and press the left selection key.
- 3 When ready to send ▶ Continue.
- 4 ▶ Enter email addr. or ▶ Enter phone no. or ▶ Contacts look-up to retrieve a number or group in Contacts.
- 5 Select from the last used recipients list ▶ Send.
- To send a message to an email address, you need to set an email gateway number, ▶ Messaging ▶ Settings ▶ Text message ▶ Email gateway. The number is supplied by your service provider.

To save items from a picture message

When you have viewed a picture message ► More ► Save items and select an item from the list that appears.

Text messaging (SMS)

Text messages can contain simple pictures, animations, melodies and sound effects.

If you send a text message to a group, you are charged for each member.

Before you start

Make sure that the number of your service centre is set. The number is supplied by your service provider and is usually saved on the SIM card.

To set the service centre number

- 1 ➤ Messaging ➤ Settings ➤ Text message ➤ Service centre. If the service centre number is saved on the SIM card, it is shown in the list.

Please read this information before using your mobile phone.

Recommendations

- Always treat your product with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.
- Do not expose your product to liquid or moisture or humidity.
- Do not expose your product to extreme high or low temperatures.
- Do not expose your product to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not drop, throw or try to bend your product.
- Do not close your product with an object inserted between keypad and display; this may damage your product.
- Do not paint your product.
- Do not use your product near medical equipment without requesting permission.
- Do not use your product when in, or around aircraft, or areas posted "turn off two-way radio".
- Do not use your product in an area where a potentially explosive atmosphere exists.
- Do not place your product or install wireless equipment in the area above your car's air bag.

Antenna

Efficient use

Radio frequency (RF) exposure and SAR

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields).

Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection) and IEEE (The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Inc.), through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies.
