Congratulations on your purchase of the Sony Ericsson Bluetooth™ Car Handsfree HCB-150.

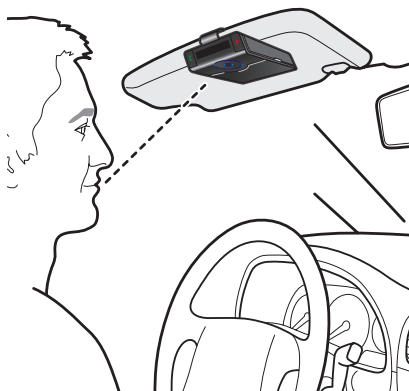

This User guide focuses on usage with a Sony Ericsson phone. For an

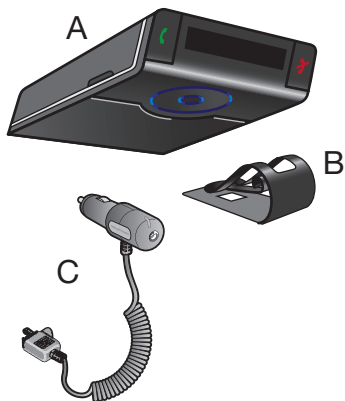

Getting started


Charging

Make sure the car handsfree battery is fully charged.

To charge the handsfree in a car




- 1 Connect the cigarette lighter adapter to the car handsfree, with the symbol on the adapter facing up.
- 2 Connect the cigarette lighter adapter to the power outlet in your car.
- 3 Charge the car handsfree for about 2 hours or until the battery icon indicates a full charge. Then remove the adapter.


 You can also charge your car handsfree with a CLA-60 or CST-75 phone charger.

Turning on and off

To turn on the car handsfree

- Press and hold down  until you hear the power-on sound.

To turn off the car handsfree

- Press and hold down  until you hear the power-off sound.

Pairing

Before you can use the car handsfree with a phone, it first has to be paired with the phone. You can pair the car handsfree with up to five phones.

If pairing is successful, the car handsfree and phone will automatically connect.



To pair the car handsfree with your phone



- 1 Turn on the Bluetooth function in your phone. For instructions, see the phone User guide.
- 2 Place the phone within 20 cm (8 inches) from the car handsfree.

- 3 Turn on the car handsfree. The first time you turn on the car handsfree, it automatically enters pairing mode and tries to pair with your phone.

! *If auto pairing is not supported by your phone, or not successful, follow the first two steps above. Then turn on the car handsfree and add it to your phone as described in the phone User guide. The passcode is 0000.*

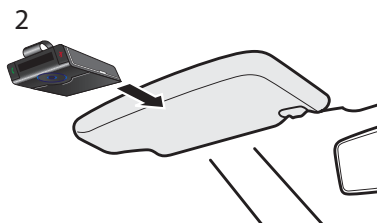
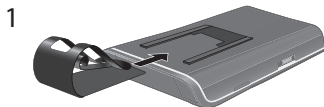
To pair the car handsfree with an additional phone

- 1 Turn on the Bluetooth function in the phone. For instructions, see your phone User guide.
- 2 Place the phone within 20 cm (8 inches) from the car handsfree.
- 3 Turn on the car handsfree.
- 4 Press and hold down the Bluetooth key  on the side of the car handsfree until the pairing mode icon  appears. If the pairing is successful a beep sounds and the name of the paired phone appears.

! *When  appears you can briefly press the Bluetooth key  and select a specific pairing slot for the phone.*

Mounting the car handsfree

To mount the handsfree in your car




- 1 Turn the car handsfree upside down and attach the sun visor clip as shown in the image.
- 2 Attach the car handsfree to the sun visor.

Calling

When you have paired the car handsfree with your phone you can make and receive calls as long as the car handsfree is turned on and within 10 metres (33 feet) of the phone, with no solid objects in between.

To make a call

- 1 Press the menu key on the car handsfree.
- 2 Scroll to **Phonebook** and press the menu key (or **⏏**).
- 3 Scroll to the first letter of the contact you want to call and press the menu key (or **⏏**).
- 4 Scroll to the desired contact and press the menu key (or **⏏**).
- 5 Scroll to the desired phone number and press the menu key (or **⏏**).

 You can alternatively open the phonebook by double-pressing the phonebook key **☰** on the side of the car handsfree.

To go back in the phonebook

- To return one step at a time, press **⏏**.
- To return to idle mode, press and hold down **⏏**.

To end a call

- Press **⏏**.

To answer a call

- Press **⏏**.

To reject a call

- Press **⏏**.

To redial the latest number

- Press **⏏** twice.

To use the call list

- Press the call list key **☰** on the side of the car handsfree, and scroll to the desired number.

To turn off the microphone (mute)

- During an ongoing call, press the menu key. Repeat to turn on the microphone again.

Handling a second call

If you are busy with an ongoing call, and another person calls you, you will hear two beeps and **☰** appears.

To answer a second call

- 1 To answer a second call, press **⏏** and answer the call.
- 2 To switch between two ongoing calls, press **⏏**.
- 3 To end an ongoing call, press **⏏**. The active call will end.

To reject a second call

- Press **⏏**.

Adjusting volume

To adjust the ring volume

- In idle mode, turn the scroll wheel.


To adjust the speaker volume

- During an ongoing call, turn the scroll wheel.

Voice dialling

To use voice commands, you first have to activate voice control in your phone and record voice commands. See your phone User guide for more information.

To make a call using a voice command


- 1 Press **(C)**. The icon  appears.
- 2 After the tone, say the name of the contact you want to call.

Settings

After the first pairing you will automatically be asked which language to use in the car handsfree. You can later change this language.



To change the selected language

- 1 Press the menu key.
- 2 Scroll to **Settings** and press the menu key (or **(C)**).
- 3 Scroll to **Language** and press the menu key (or **(C)**).
- 4 Scroll to your preferred language and press the menu key (or **(C)**).
- 5 To return one step at a time, press **(F)**. To return to idle mode, press and hold down **(F)**.



 *When you change the language, the menu language is changed, including the pronunciation. But the names in your phonebook and call list are still pronounced in English.*

To adjust the display light

- 1 Press the menu key.
- 2 Scroll to **Settings** and press the menu key (or **(C)**).
- 3 Scroll to **Display light** and press the menu key (or **(C)**).

- 4 Select **Manual** or **Automatic**. If you select **Automatic**, the car handsfree automatically selects the most appropriate setting due to the surrounding light. If you select **Manual**, you have to select the light intensity yourself – **Dim**, **Normal** or **Bright**.
- 5 To return one step at a time, press . To return to idle mode, press and hold down .

To view the car handsfree software version

- 1 Press the menu key.
- 2 Scroll to **Settings** and press the menu key (or ).
- 3 Scroll to **Service info** and press the menu key (or ). The software version appears.

No connection to the phone


- 1 Make sure the car handsfree is charged and within range of the phone.
- 2 Check or redo the Bluetooth settings in the phone.
- 3 Try to pair the car handsfree with your phone once again.

Resetting the car handsfree

There are two ways to reset the car handsfree:





- Hardware reset – if the car handsfree behaves unexpectedly
- Master reset – to restore the factory settings

To perform a hardware reset

- 1 Make sure the car handsfree is turned on.
- 2 Press and hold down  until the car handsfree is turned off (after about 10 seconds).

To perform a master reset

- 1 Make sure the car handsfree is turned on.

- 2 Press and hold down the Bluetooth key  until the icon  appears.
- 3 Press and hold down  and  simultaneously until the car handsfree is turned off.


